"MAN WITH A GUN CALL".

A FRIEND THAT THE SUBJECT LANGLEY HAD A HIGH POWERED TRANSMITTER

WHICH HAS REPEATEDLY INTERFERED WITH LOCAL RECEPTION. [REDACTED] SAID HE WENT TO THE LANGLEY RESIDENCE TO SPEAK WITH HIM, AND LANGLEY BRANDISHED A SHOTGUN AT HIM.

WHEN DEPUTIES RIVAS AND COX ARRIVED AT THE RESIDENCE, [REDACTED] IT WAS DARKENED WITH NO ONE IN THE IMMEDIATE AREA. HAVING SUSPICION OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES, AND CONCERN FOR THEIR SAFETY, DEPUTIES RIVAS AND COX MADE A PLAN. DEPUTY RIVAS REMAINED IN A POSITION OF COVER, IN FRONT OF THE HOUSE, BEHIND A PARKED CAR TO COVER FOR DEPUTY COX, WHILE COX CAUTIOUSLY APPROACHED THE FRONT DOOR. AS COX MADE HIS WAY UP THE DRIVEWAY TOWARDS THE FRONT DOOR, THE SUSPECT, LATER IDENTIFIED AS WALTER LANGLEY, CAME OUT THE DOOR WITH SHOTGUN IN HAND. BOTH DEPUTIES COX AND RIVAS REPEATEDLY YELLED AT LANGLEY TO PUT THE GUN DOWN, AS THEY ATTEMPTED TO IDENTIFY THEMSELVES AS POLICE OFFICERS. AS DEPUTY COX RETREATED DOWN THE DRIVEWAY, LANGLEY PROCEEDED TO STALK HIM WHILE HE MADE SUCH STATEMENTS AS "YOU SONS OF A BITCHES, I'M TIRED OF YOU GUYS TELLING ME WHAT TO DO, I'LL SHOOT AND KILL YOU BASTARDS". DEPUTY RIVAS YELLED "WE'RE THE POLICE", BUT LANGLEY REPLIED "I DON'T BELIEVE YOU, I'LL KILL YOU SON OF A BITCHES!, I'LL BLOW YOUR ASSES OFF". LANGLEY RAISED HIS SHOTGUN TOWARDS DEPUTY RIVAS, AND RIVAS OPENED FIRE AT LANGLEY WITH HIS

HANDGUN. AS LANGLEY CONTINUED TO YELL THREATS, HE POINTED THE SHOTGUN AT DEP. COX, AND DEPUTY RIVAS CONTINUED TO SHOOT AT LANGLEY WITH HIS HANDGUN. DEPUTY COX ALSO BEGAN TO SHOOT AT LANGLEY, AND EVENTUALLY LANGLEY PUT THE SHOTGUN DOWN AND RETREATED INTO THE HOUSE.

ADDITIONAL SHERIFF'S DEPUTIES ARRIVED TO ASSIST AND LANGLEY WAS ARRESTED WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. ALTHOUGH LANGLEY HAD POINTED THE SHOTGUN AT BOTH DEPUTIES RIVAS AND COX, HE NEVER FIRED A ROUND. NUMEROUS ROUNDS WERE FIRED BY DEPUTY RIVAS, AND COX FIRED A SINGLE ROUND. THE SUSPECT LANGLEY WAS STRUCK BY ONE ROUND IN HIS UPPER LEFT ARM.

WHEN LANGLEY WAS INTERVIEWED HE DENIED KNOWING THAT THE SUBJECTS IN FRONT OF HIS RESIDENCE WERE POLICE OFFICERS. LANGLEY SAID HE THOUGHT THEY WERE THE SUBJECTS FROM BEFORE (DANIEL DESHANE), AND HE FEARED FOR HIS SAFETY. LANGLEY SAID HE FIRST REALIZED WHO THEY WERE (OFFICERS), WHEN HE SAW POLICE CARS PARKED DOWN THE STREET. LANGLEY SAID HE THEN PUT THE GUN DOWN AND WENT INTO THE HOUSE.

ON 10 JULY 1991 I PRESENTED THIS CASE TO DEPUTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY RICHARD HOLMES FOR A COMPLAINT REVIEW. MR. HOLMES TOLD ME THAT HE

WOULD NOT BE ASKING THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT TO CONDUCT ANY FURTHER INVESTIGATION, AS HIS OFFICE WANTED TO CONDUCT AN INDEPENDENT INVESTIGATION OF THEIR OWN.

ON 9 MARCH 1992 I RECEIVED A FIVE PAGE "COMPLAINT REQUEST EVALUATION" FROM MR. HOLMES, IN WHICH HE REJECTED THE CASE FOR PROSECUTION. MR. HOLMES EXPLAINS THAT THERE IS A REASONABLE DOUBT THAT MR. LANGLEY DID NOT KNOW THAT IT WAS POLICE OFFICERS IN HIS FRONT YARD. MR. LANGLEY HAD A CONFRONTATION WITH [REDACTED] IN HIS FRONT YARD JUST SHORTLY BEFORE THE OFFICERS ARRIVED. MR. LANGLEY IS 70 YEARS OLD, WHILE MR. [REDACTED] IS 23 YEARS OLD, AND IS 6'3", 260 LBS. THE OFFICERS HAD BEEN GIVEN MISLEADING INFORMATION FROM MR. [REDACTED]. HE DESCRIBED A DRUNKEN MAN POINTING A GUN AT HIM. A BLOOD SAMPLE TAKEN FROM MR. LANGLEY AFTER HIS ARREST WAS NEGATIVE FOR THE PRESENCE OF ALCOHOL. OTHER INFORMATION FROM LANGLEY'S NEIGHBORS INDICATES THAT MR. [REDACTED] MAY HAVE PARTICIPATED IN SEVERAL HOURS OF HARRASSING THE LANGLEYS BY DRIVING UP AND DOWN THEIR STREET HONKING THEIR HORNS IN FRONT OF HIS RESIDENCE.

DEP. D.A. HOLMES GOES ON TO WRITE THAT "WHILE THE OFFICERS WERE COMPLETELY JUSTIFIED IN FIRING WHEN THEY DID, BASED ON THEIR KNOWLEDGE AT THE MOMENT, THIS DOES NOT NECESSARILY NEGATE MR.

LANGLEY'S ASSERTION THAT HE ACTED IN SELF-DEFENSE." MR. HOLMES GOES ON TO DESCRIBE THAT "MR. LANGLEY HAS RECENTLY SUFFERED SEVERAL HEALTH PROBLEMS. ON NOVEMBER 21, 1991, HE UNDERWENT EMERGENCY SURGERY FOR A RUPTURED ABDOMINAL AORTIC ANEURYSM. DURING THE PROCEDURE, HE WENT INTO FULL ARREST THREE TIMES AND HAD TO BE RESUSCITATED. POSTOPERATIVELY, HE SUFFERED A STROKE. AT THIS TIME, IT IS UNCERTAIN WHETHER HE WILL EVER BE ABLE TO WALK NORMALLY OR ACQUIRE FULL BOWEL AND BLADDER FUNCTIONS."

MR. HOLMES WRITES "EVEN THOUGH MR. LANGLEY'S CONDUCT CAUSED THE INITIAL CONFRONTATION WITH MR. [REDACTED] AND CAUSED THE POLICE TO BE CALLED IN, HE IS NONETHELESS ENTITLED TO DEFEND HIMSELF WHEN CONFRONTED WITH PERCEIVED THREATS WHEN HE IS ON HIS OWN PROPERTY".

IN CONCLUSION MR. HOLMES WRITES "HOWEVER, WE NEED NOT DECIDE WHETHER WE COULD OVERCOME THE SELF-DEFENSE ISSUE, THE DEFENSE MIGHT CONTEND AGAINST A CHARGE OF EXHIBITING A FIREARM (PENAL CODE SECTION 417, A MISDEMEANOR). IN LIGHT OF MR. LANGLEY'S PRESENT HEALTH AND PROGNOSIS, I RECOMMEND THAT WE NOT PROCEED WITH THIS CASE. THE ACTIONS MR. LANGLEY SO UNWISELY ENGAGED IN ARE UNLIKELY TO REOCCUR, AND THERE SEEMS LITTLE POINT IN PROCEEDING AGAINST HIM ON A MISDEMEANOR AT THIS TIME."



INTRODUCTION

This case was presented to the District Attorney's Office to consider charges of 245(c) and 245(d) of the Penal code against Walter Langley. We have concluded that such charges should not be filed at this time.

A wide range of information from a variety of sources has been considered in arriving at our conclusion. Included in that are 118 pages of reports from the Ventura Sheriff's Office, five tape recordings of interviews by the Sheriff's Office and police dispatch tapes, 282 photographs of the scene taken after the incident in question, one videotape of the scene taken shortly after the incident, and personal and telephonic interviews conducted by District Attorney staff of 13 citizens.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The genesis of this incident lies in Mr. Langley's propensity to use his powerful radio transmitter improperly. On numerous occasions in the past, Mr. and Mrs. Langley's broadcasts have interfered with the TV, phone, and radio reception of both their immediate neighbors and others in the Camarillo area. We have interviewed a number of individuals who state that the Langleys' misuse of their powerful transmitter has interfered with their communication systems (especially televisions and portable phones). To say the least, the Langleys' conduct is quite notorious in the Camarillo area for producing such problems.

On the night of July 5, 1991, Mr. Langley pinned his microphone down and was continually broadcasting on Channel 22 in violation of various regulations. His conduct both interfered with the rights of others to use that public CB channel and interfered with TV sets of a number of people in the area.

A Camarillo resident named [REDACTED] was one of those whose TV reception was interrupted. He and others conducted a search for the source of their problem and found Walter L. Langley at [REDACTED], in Camarillo. Mr. [REDACTED] states that he confronted Mr. Langley about the problem. Mr. [REDACTED] states that Mr. Langley was extremely hostile to him, and refused to alter his conduct. Mr. [REDACTED] further states that Mr. Langley threatened [REDACTED] with a shotgun. It should be noted that no one is able to confirm this version of the incident. Mr. [REDACTED] named one witness who has left the state and cannot be located. As a result of Mr. Langley's conduct, Mr. [REDACTED] contacted the Ventura Sheriff's Office and registered a complaint.

According to several neighbors, a red truck resembling that driven customarily by Mr. [REDACTED], as well as other vehicles, were in the area late in the evening honking their horns and shouting unpleasantries as they passed Mr. Langley's house.

After interviewing Mr. [REDACTED] about his meeting with Mr. Langley, Officers Cox and Rivas drove to [REDACTED] to obtain Mr. Langley's version of the events and to attempt to resolve the situation. The officers arrived at [REDACTED] at 1:16 a.m. on July 6, 1991.

Officers Rivas and Cox drove to the Langley residence in a marked Ventura Sheriff's Office patrol unit. They were in uniform at the time. The street was very dark as the area has no street lights. The officers parked their vehicle away from the Langley residence and approached the Langley residence from an easterly direction. It appears that Mr. Langley could not see the police car from his location. It should be noted that Mr. Langley had and

still has a large fifth-wheel trailer parked in his driveway, somewhat obscuring the officers' vision of the house.

Both Officers Rivas and Cox state that they announced their presence by shouting, "Sheriff's Department!" None of the neighbors we interviewed stated they heard this announcement. Several neighbors were awake after 1:00 a.m. when the officers arrived. Although none of the citizens heard the officers identify themselves, all of the citizens stated they did hear the officers' commands to Mr. Langley to put the shotgun down.

The arriving officers soon spotted Mr. Langley emerging from the area of his home with a shotgun in his hands. Both officers shouted warnings to "Put the gun down!" This warning was repeated loudly at least three to four times according to witnesses. In fact, everyone who was awake in the area heard this latter warning.

Officers Rivas and Cox state that Mr. Langley responded to this announcement by stating, "I don't believe you," and "Bullshit, I'm going to fucking kill you." Mr. Langley then chambered a round into his shotgun and raised the shotgun to his shoulder level. The warnings continued as Mr. Langley did this and then pointed the shotgun at Officer Cox, then at Officer Rivas. During this, Langley inquired, "Who are you?" When met with the response that they were from the Sheriff's Department, Langley repeated his earlier statement.

The officers, believing that their lives were in danger, fired numerous rounds at Mr. Langley. Mr. Langley was struck once in the left bicep area. Mr. Langley retreated into his house, but later came out and was arrested at [REDACTED].

None of the neighbors actually saw the officers and Mr. Langley in the critical moments before the shots were fired. According to the officers' report, Mr. Langley chambered a round into his shotgun and began to point the shotgun in their direction. Despite their repeated commands, when Mr. Langley did not cease his aggressive display of the shotgun and even pointed it in their direction, the officers fired at Mr. Langley.

The Sheriff's Office was substantially misled about the circumstances which occurred prior to their presence at [REDACTED] Avenue in Camarillo. [REDACTED], the reporting party, reported Mr. Langley's egregious conduct, but did not relate all of the circumstances surrounding it.

On the night of July 5-6, 1991, Mr. [REDACTED] not only made his displeasure known to Mr. Langley, he may have engaged in unwarranted harassment between the time he reported the problem to the police and the officers' discussion with him. According to Mr. Langley's neighbors, various individuals

(especially one driving a red truck) drove up and down [redacted] Street for several hours honking their horns as they passed the Langley residence and shouting unpleasant remarks. It should be noted that Mr. [redacted] denies such conduct, even though he does admit driving a red truck. None of the above information was related to the police dispatcher or to the officers before they arrived at 1:16 a.m. on July 6, 1991.

Moreover, Mr. [redacted] misled the police with his statements prior to their arrival. Mr. [redacted] told the police dispatcher that Walter Langley was drunk when he pointed a shotgun at [redacted]. This latter statement is a substantial distortion, to say the least. According to our investigation, Mr. Langley never drinks. Mr. Langley was raised as a Southern Baptist (his pastor relates that Southern Baptists are enjoined to abstain from alcohol), and none of his neighbors can ever recall Mr. Langley imbibing alcoholic beverages. A blood sample taken from Mr. Langley after his arrest was negative for the presence of alcohol.

Nevertheless, the conduct reported to the police by Mr. [redacted] was that of a drunk man who was brandishing a shotgun at people who were complaining about his broadcasting improprieties. Mr. DeSchane also informed the police that he told Mr. Langley that there would be other complainers and Mr. Langley said, "Bring them on, I'll take care of them." Mr. DeSchane further stated that Mr. Langley threatened to kill him and a companion at the time he brandished a shotgun at DeSchane.

Mr. Langley has recently suffered several health problems. On November 21, 1991, he underwent emergency surgery for a ruptured abdominal aortic aneurysm. During the procedure, he went into full arrest three times and had to be resuscitated. Postoperatively, he suffered a stroke. At this time, it is uncertain whether he will ever be able to walk normally or acquire full bowel and bladder functions.

ANALYSIS

There is no doubt that the officers were completely justified in their actions that night. Given what had been reported, it is little wonder that the police approached Mr. Langley's house with great caution.

I believe we would face a difficult issue in rebutting a claim of self-defense on Mr. Langley's behalf. All the neighbors who heard the initial police approach say they did not hear the police identify themselves. However, other facts contradict this. During the confrontation with police, Mr. Langley shouted he did not believe the people who were approaching his house were policeman. Thus, it seems crystal clear that the police did, in fact, identify themselves to Mr. Langley and Mr. Langley heard that identification. The fact that the neighbors say they did not hear it can be

explained by their distance from the area and/or the possibility that they do not remember the announcement which may have alerted them to the incident.

One thing is certain -- a warning was given to Mr. Langley. All the neighbors who were awake before the shots were fired clearly heard the officer shout, "Put the gun down!" at least three or four times. This clear warning was followed by gunfire.

While the officers were completely justified in firing when they did, based on their knowledge at the moment, this does not necessarily negate Mr. Langley's assertion that he acted in self-defense. The problem lies in the fact that the two had different bases of information. Mr. Langley asserted at the time that he did not believe the announcement that those approaching him were police officers. In fact, the street outside Mr. Langley's home is unlit and the police cars may not have been in his line of sight. Thus, a charge of 245(c) of the Penal Code would not be warranted because it cannot be proven that Mr. Langley, in fact, believed he was dealing with police officers.

As to the issue of self-defense, Mr. Langley, age 70, had been approached earlier by a 23-year-old man who is 6'3", 260 pounds. Mr. Langley had been harassed for the preceding two hours, according to neighbors, and it was after 1:00 a.m. at the time the police approached him.

Even though Mr. Langley's conduct caused the initial confrontation with Mr. [REDACTED] and caused the police to be called in, he is nonetheless entitled to defend himself when confronted with perceived threats when he is on his own property.

However, we need not decide whether we could overcome the self-defense issue the defense might contend against a charge of exhibiting a firearm (Penal Code section 417, a misdemeanor). In light of Mr. Langley's present health and prognosis, I recommend that we not proceed with this case. The actions Mr. Langley so unwisely engaged in are unlikely to reoccur, and there seems little point in proceeding against him on a misdemeanor at this time.



NARRATIVE

At approximately 0120hrs, 7-6-91, I heard one of the Camarillo County units asking for all Camarillo units to respond to their location reference shots being fired. I immediately activated the lights and siren and followed Sr. Dep. W. Flannigan's unit to the scene on [REDACTED] arriving at the same time as he did.

We both got out and walked down the street to the scene while trying to maintain some type of cover until we knew what the situation was.

Arriving at the front of the house I could see several deputies in the street behind cover of parked cars with their weapons drawn and pointed at the residence of [REDACTED]. There was a large, long house trailer, commonly referred to as a '5th wheel', parked in the driveway and it was blocking my view of the front of the house.

Suddenly I heard Dep Rhods shouting commands toward the front of the house. "Get down on the ground! Get down now!" His weapon was pointed toward the front of the house and he began to move forward with his partner Dep. L. DeAnda. When they reached the front of the driveway I

came around the trailer and saw a male subject lying face down in the driveway and bleeding from the left upper arm. We all moved up and the scene and subject were secured. A woman standing in the doorway () was handcuffed initially for officer safety and secured in the back of a unit. I saw a shotgun laying on the concrete driveway next to the semi-circular hedge about 3 to 5 feet from the garage door and there was blood droplets on the concrete surrounding the gun and leading into the house. Since we did not yet know if there might be other suspects in the immediate area I picked up the shotgun and handed it to Dep Arthur to be secured in the back of a police unit. The house was checked for further suspects and the scene was then secured.

Somehow during the conversations that occurred immediately after securing the scene I was able to determine that one of our deputies had fired several shots at the suspect now lying in the driveway awaiting an ambulance. I walked away from the house with Dep. Brett Cox and I asked him to tell me what happened.

Dep Cox told me very briefly that he and Dep Joe Rivas (the county units) had received a call of a subject threatening others with a shotgun at . He said when they arrived there was nobody outside and they were initially hesitant to make contact at the front door for reasons of office safety. They paused in the street for a few moments and Dep. Cox started up the driveway on the left side of the trailer in full view of the front of the house. Dep Rivas was still in the street behind a pickup truck covering the area for Cox.

Cox told me he was halfway up the driveway when the front door suddenly opened and out came an older man holding a shotgun in his hands. Cox says he started 'scrambling' backwards toward the trailer for cover

and he thinks he remembers hearing Rivas yelling at the suspect. Cox does remember seeing the suspect bring the shotgun up to his shoulder and point it directly at him as he continued to back away. Cox said he then heard shots fired by Rivas and he thinks, but can't be sure, the suspect fired the shotgun at him and missed. Cox told me he can't remember if he fired or not. The suspect dropped the shotgun and went back into the house. At that time Cox and Rivas both made radio transmissions concerning shots fired and Camarillo units responded to the scene.

WHILE WORKING PATROL IN THE 8 ADAM AREA, I HEARD ONE OF THE COUNTY UNITS (DEP. COX #2045 OR RIVAS #1992) ASK FOR A 1033 (EMERGENCY TRAFFIC ONLY). THEY ADVISED THAT SHOTS HAD BEEN FIRED. AFTER 8R31 (SR. DEP. FLANNIGAN) REPEATED THE REQUEST TO DISPATCH, THE 1033 WAS PUT OUT. DISPATCH TOLD THE CLOSEST AVAILABLE UNIT TO RESPOND CODE 3. DEP. RIVAS REQUESTED ALL UNITS RESPOND CODE 3.

WHEN I ARRIVED, THERE WERE APPROXIMATELY 5 DEPUTIES ON SCENE. THEY WERE DEPS. COX#2054, RIVAS#1192, AMBARIAN#2203, FLANNIGAN#1225, AND RHODS#1438. THE DEPUTIES WERE APPROACHING THE DRIVEWAY OF A-WALTER LANGLEY AND ORDERING HIM TO LAY DOWN ON HIS STOMACH. WHEN I APPROACHED THE DRIVEWAY, LANGLEY WAS PRONED OUT ON HIS STOMACH. A SHOTGUN WAS LYING ON THE DRIVEWAY APPROXIMATELY 3 FEET IN FRONT OF HIM. I SAW AN ELDERLY FEMALE STANDING IN THE DOORWAY. WE WERE STILL UNSURE IF ANYONE WAS STILL IN THE HOUSE OR IN WHAT CAPACITY THE FEMALE WAS INVOLVED. I HANDCUFFED THE FEMALE, LATER IDENTIFIED AS VIVIAN LANGLEY. THEY STARTED AROUND 8 PM. ██████████ SAID THEY USUALLY TALK ON THE SIDEBAND CHANNELS, WHICH ARE CHANNELS 31-40. ██████████ SAID THEY WERE TALKING ON CHANNEL 38.

MAGNUM". ██████ SAID HIS FIRST NAME IS PAT AND HE LIVES AT ██████ IN CAMARILLO.

I SPOKE TO ██████ (██████) WHO LIVES AT ██████ CT. HIS PHONE # IS ██████. HE LIVES APPROXIMATELY TWO STREETS OVER. HE TOLD ME THE FOLLOWING: HE WAS IN HIS ROOM WHEN HE HEARD A FEW ROUNDS GO OFF. SEVERAL SECONDS LATER, HE HEARD 4 OR 5 MORE ROUNDS GO OFF. HE SAID IT SOUNDED LIKE A SMALL GUN.

HE BEGAN TO EXPLAIN THE SITUATION TO ME, AND THEN SAID, "HERE, LET

ME WALK YOU THROUGH IT". HE TOLD ME ABOUT THE ORIGINAL CALL TO THE HOUSE, AND THAT THE SUSPECT HAD BRANDISHED A SHOTGUN TO THE "RP" OF THE CALL. HE SAID THAT HE WAS NOT COMFORTABLE WITH APPROACHING THE HOUSE BECAUSE THE SUSPECT REPORTEDLY HAD A SHOTGUN, AND THE SURROUNDINGS WERE DARK.

HE SAID THAT HE WAITED ON THE STREET, IN FRONT OF THE HOUSE, WHILE DEP. COX BEGAN TO APPROACH THE HOUSE (BY WALKING UP THE DRIVEWAY). TOWARD THE FRONT DOOR OF THE HOUSE (THE CAR WAS PARKED FACING SOUTHBOUND, WITH IT'S RIGHT WHEELS ADJACENT TO THE CURB. THE REAR OF THE CAR WAS EVEN WITH THE PORTION OF THE CURB THAT LOWERS FROM CURB HEIGHT TO STREET HEIGHT: WHICH IS WHERE THE DRIVEWAY BEGINS).

DEP. RIVAS' SAID THAT AS DEP. COX WAS APPROACHING THE HOUSE, THE SUSPECT WALKED OUT OF THE HOUSE, WITHOUT WARNING, AND CARRYING A SHOTGUN. HE SAID THAT THE MUZZLE FLASH OF THE FIRST ROUND BLINDED HIM, BUT HE CONTINUED TO FIRE IN THE DIRECTION OF THE SUSPECT. AFTER HE EMPTIED HIS WEAPON, HE MOVED FROM HIS POSITION, AND TOOK COVER BESIDE A PICK-UP TRUCK (CA. LIC. # [REDACTED]) THAT WAS PARKED JUST AHEAD (3 1/2 FEET) OF THE DODGE DART, AND RELOADED. HE THEN CONTINUED TO FIRE ON THE SUSPECT.

AFTER THIS COVERSATION WITH DEP. RIVAS, I FELT THAT I HAD A BASIC UNDERSTANDING OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE SHOOTING, AND ENDED OUR DISCUSSION. I TOLD DEP. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT DEP. RIVAS APPEARED VERY CALM, AND COMPOSED DURING OUR CONVERSATION. HE RELATED THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE SHOOTING VERY WELL.

I THEN RETURNED TO THE SCENE AND MET WITH DEP. COX.

I ASKED DEP. COX TO TELL ME WHAT HAPPENED. HE SAID THAT AS HE APPROACHED THE HOUSE, THE SUSPECT CAME OUT (OF THE HOUSE) CARRYING A SHOTGUN. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT IT APPEARED TO ME THAT DEP. COX WAS SLIGHTLY SHAKEN BY THE INCIDENT.

LT. GILES ARRIVED AT THE SCENE SOMETIME LATER, AND ASSUMED CONTROL OF BOTH DEPUTIES RIVAS AND COX, AND MADE ARRANGEMENTS FOR THEIR TRANSPORTATION BACK TO THE STATION.

ONCE WE WERE DIRECTLY ACROSS FROM LANGLEYS HOME, I TOLD DEPUTY COX THAT I WAS VERY UNEASY ABOUT THE SITUATION. I TOLD DEPUTY COX THAT I FELT THAT THE SUSPECT WAS WATCHING AS WE APPROACHED AND MAY POSSIBLY BE HIDING IN THE FIFTH WHEEL TRAILER WHICH WAS PARKED IN THE DRIVEWAY. AS WE STOOD ACROSS THE STREET, WE ILLUMINATED THE FRONT PORTION OF THE HOME USING OUR MAG-LITE FLASHLIGHTS BUT WERE UNABLE TO SEE ANYONE. BEFORE WE BEGAN CROSSING THE STREET, I AGAIN EXPRESSED MY THOUGHT THAT I DID NOT LIKE THE CIRCUMSTANCES DUE TO OUR NOT HAVING ANY LIGHTING OR COVER TO HIDE BEHIND IF THE SUSPECT WERE TO STEP OUT OF THE HOME WITH A WEAPON.

AS WE STOOD ON THE EAST CURB ACROSS THE STREET, I UNHOLSTERED MY COLT 45 AUTOMATIC AND HELD IT ALONG MY SIDE AS WE CROUCHED DOWN AND APPROACHED A FULL SIZE PICK-UP TRUCK PARKED DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF THE HOME. NOT SEEING ANY FORM OF MOVEMENT, WE MOVED TO THE RIGHT AND USED A SMALL CAR FOR COVER. AS WE CROUCHED BEHIND THE SMALL CAR, I ILLUMINATED THE FRONT DOORWAY OF THE HOUSE AND WAS ABLE TO SEE A FEMALE FIGURE WEARING A PINK TOP WALK TO THE FRONT DOOR AND STOP. THE PERSON WEARING PINK PRESSED HER FACE AGAINST THE WINDOW AS IF TO LOOK OUT, THEN WALKED AWAY VERY QUICKLY. I IMMEDIATELY YELLED AT DEPUTY COX THAT A FIGURE HAD JUST LOOKED OUT THE FRONT DOOR WINDOW. DEPUTY COX ACKNOWLEDGED ME BUT HAD ALREADY STARTED TO WALK ACROSS THE DRIVEWAY TOWARDS THE FIFTH WHEEL TRAILER.

AS DEPUTY COX HAD STARTED WALKING UP THE DRIVEWAY ALONG THE FIFTH WHEEL TRAILOR, THE FRONT DOOR QUICKLY OPENED AND OUT EMERGED AN ELDERLY MAN CARRYING A SHOTGUN AT AN "AT REST POSITION", POINTING DOWNWARD. BOTH DEPUTY COX AND I IMMEDIATELY BEGAN YELLING "SHERIFFS DEPARTMENT PUT THE GUN DOWN!" AS I YELLED, I SET MY FLASHLIGHT DOWN

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ON THE WINDSHIELD PORTION OF THE CAR AND MOVED TO THE FRONT IN ORDER TO GIVE FALSE SENSE OF LOCATION TO LANGLEY.

WHILE WE CONTINUOUSLY YELLED IN ATTEMPT TO IDENTIFY OURSELVES, LANGLEY WALKED OUT TOWARDS THE FRONT YARD AND BEGAN YELLING SOMETHING TO THE EFFECT OF "YOU SONS OF A BITCHES, I'M TIRED OF YOU GUYS TELLING ME WHAT TO DO, I'LL SHOOT AND KILL YOU BASTARDS!" BY THIS TIME DEPUTY COX HAD BEEN CORNERED NEAR THE FIFTH WHEEL TRAILER AND A YARD. WE BOTH CONTINUED YELLING AT LANGLEY BUT NOTHING SEEMED TO BE WORKING. AT ONE MOMENT I YELLED "WE'RE THE POLICE!" AND LANGLEY REPLIED "I DON'T BELIEVE YOU, I'LL KILL YOU SON OF A BITCHES!, I'LL BLOW YOUR ASSES OFF!"

DEPUTY COX HAD MADE HIS WAY TO A CORNER OF THE FIFTH WHEEL WHERE HE ATTEMPTED TO GAIN COVER BUT NONE WAS AVAILABLE. AS WE BOTH YELLED AT LANGLEY HE BECAME ENRAGED AND CONTINUED YELLING THAT HE WAS GOING TO KILL US. LANGLEY THEN BEGAN WALKING OUT TOWARDS ME, THEN NOTICED DEPUTY COX WHO WAS CORNERED WITH NO CONCEALMENT OFF TO HIS LEFT. LANGLEY YELLED AT ME FOR A MOMENT, THEN WAS DISTRACTED BY DEPUTY COX WHO HAD MADE SOME NOISE IN ATTEMPT TO LEAVE THE AREA. AS LANGLEY HEARD DEPUTY COX STANDING OFF TO HIS LEFT, THE SLIGHT DISTRACTION ALLOWED ME TO GRAB MY FLASHLIGHT AND MOVE TO THE PICK UP TRUCK AND GAIN A BETTER VANTAGE POINT. AT THIS POINT I YELLED AT LANGLEY AND AS HE LOOKED AT ME I COULD SEE HIM PUT HIS RIGHT HAND INTO THE TRIGGER GUARD AREA AND BEGIN TO RAISE THE SHOTGUN AS IF TO SHOOT ME. ONCE THE SHOTGUN BROKE AN IMAGINARY PLANE WHICH I HAD FOCUSED ON, I BEGAN TO FIRE MY HANDGUN NUMEROUS TIMES. I DID NOTICE THAT THE SECOND ROUND FIRED STRUCK HIS LEFT ARM WHICH CAUSED LANGLEY TO STAGGER AND RELEASE THE SHOTGUN WITH HIS LEFT ARM BUT NEVER COMPLETELY DROPPING IT. THE SOUND OF THE SHOTGUN BARREL STRIKING THE GROUND WAS VERY OBVIOUS.

LANGLEY FELL FORWARD ONTO THE DRIVEWAY THEN SLOWLY BEGAN TO RECOVER. AS LANGLEY LAY THERE, I YELLED AT DEPUTY COX TO PUT OUT A 10-33 EMERGENCY TRAFFIC. AS DEPUTY COX DID SO, I CROUCHED DOWN BEHIND THE TRUCK AND RELOADED WHILE MOVING TO THE REAR OF THE TRUCK TO TAKE UP A NEW POSITION. AS LANGLEY RECOVERED AND STOOD BACK UP, HE LIFTED THE SHOTGUN WITH HIS RIGHT HAND AND BEGAN LOOKING FOR ME NEAR THE FRONT OF THE TRUCK BED. UNABLE TO LOCATE ME NEAR THE FRONT OF THE TRUCK, LANGLEY BEGAN WALKING TOWARDS DEPUTY COX WHO WAS IN AN OPEN FIELD OF FIRE. LANGLEY COULD NOW SEE DEPUTY COX EXPOSED IN THE OPEN AREA. AS LANGLEY BEGAN WALKING TOWARDS DEPUTY COX, HE BEGAN RAISING THE SHOTGUN TO HIS STOMACH AREA YELLING "I'M GONNA KILL YOU!". AS LANGLEY DID SO, I YELLED IN ORDER TO DISTRACT HIM. IT NOW APPEARED THAT LANGLEY WAS ABOUT TO SHOOT DEPUTY COX AS HE (LANGLEY) BEGAN TO SHOULDER THE SHOTGUN. AT THIS POINT IN FEAR OF DEPUTY COX'S LIFE, I BEGAN TO OPEN FIRE WITH MY HANDGUN. AS I BEGAN TO FIRE, I YELLED TO DEPUTY COX TO RUN TOWARDS ME WHILE I MADE LANGLEY FALL TO THE GROUND IN SEARCH OF COVER. AS I LAID A PROTECTIVE FIELD OF FIRE AT LANGLEY, DEPUTY COX BEGAN TO RUN TOWARDS ME. AS I BEGAN TO CROUCH DOWN IN ORDER TO RE-LOAD, I HEARD A LOUD NOISE AS IF LANGLEY OR DEPUTY COX HAD FIRED A ROUND OFF. AS DEPUTY COX MADE IT SAFELY TO ME, I RE-LOADED

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AGAIN AND PEERED OVER THE BED OF THE TRUCK LOOKING FOR LANGLEY BUT WAS UNABLE TO SEE HIM. AS I LOOKED FOR LANGLEY, I TOLD DEPUTY COX THAT WE NEEDED TO GET BACK TO OUR PATROL CARS FOR COVER AND THE SHOTGUNS. WE THEN PEERED OUT OVER THE BED OF THE TRUCK AND AGREED THAT IT WAS CLEAR TO RUN ACROSS THE STREET. AS WE BEGAN TO RUN, I LOOKED BACK AND SAW LANGLEY LOOKING TOWARDS US RAISING THE SHOTGUN AS IF TO SHOOT US. I STOPPED FOR A MOMENT AND FIRED AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF ROUNDS WHICH CAUSED HIM TO CROUCH VERY LOW, SLOWLY RUN INTO HIS HOME AND SLAM THE FRONT DOOR. AS LANGLEY RAN INTO THE HOME, I COULD SEE HIM DRAGGING AN OBJECT IN HIS HANDS WHICH APPEARED TO BE THE SHOTGUN.

DEPUTY COX AND I THEN TOOK COVER BEHIND ANOTHER VEHICLE AND NOTIFIED DISPATCH AND THE RESPONDING UNITS OF THE THE DANGERS. AN AMBULANCE WAS THEN SUMMONDED AND ADVISED TO STAND BY AT LAS POSAS AND LANTANA.

MOMENTS LATER, THE ASSISTING UNITS ARRIVED AND I POSITIONED THEM ACCORDINGLY. AS DEPUTY COX AND I RAN BACK TO THE PICK UP TRUCK, I COULD HEAR A MALE VOICE YELL "YOU SON OF A BITCHES SHOT ME!" THE NEXT THING I SAW WERE SOME OFFICERS PRONING OUT A MALE SUSPECT ON THE DRIVEWAY. THE SUSPECT WAS THEN CUFFED AND GIVEN FIRST AID. WHILE DOING SO, THE WIFE EXITED THE HOME AND WAS ALSO TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. WE THEN CLEARED THE HOME FOR ANY ADDITONAL SUSPECTS WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS.

SGT WEAVER, SENIOR DEPUTY B. FLANNIGAN AND SENIOR DEPUTY PLACE THEN BEGAN SEALING THE CRIME SCENE AT WHICH POINT DEPUTY COX AND I WERE SEPARATED AND REMOVED FROM THE SCENE. DURING THE ISOLATION, I WAS ACCOMPANIED BY SGT WEAVER AND SGT. J. WILBURN (3S7).

AFTER THE ARRIVAL OF THE SHERIFFS DEPARTMENT SHOOTING INVESTIGATION TEAM AND MAJOR CRIMES, I RETURNED TO THE CAMARILLO POLICE STATION INORDER TO BE INTERVEIWD BY MAJOR CRIMES. WHILE AT CAM PD, I MET WITH LT S. GILES AND SGT.R COOK, AT WHICH TIME MY WEAPON WAS RELINQUISHED TO LT GILES AS EVIDENCE.

LT GILES AND SGT. R. COOK THEN TRANSPORTED DEPUTY COX AND I TO PLEASANT VALLEY HOSPITAL WHERE WE SUBMITTED TO BLOOD AND URINE SAMPLES.

UPON RETURNING TO THE CAMARILLO POLICE STATION, DEPUTY COX AND I MET WITH OUR LEGAL ADVISOR. NO STATEMENTS WERE GIVE TO MAJOR CRIMES.

ON 07-06-91 AT 0046 HRS. WHILE WORKING UNIFORM PATROL IN A MARKED PATROL CAR, DEPUTY J. RIVAS #1992 AND I WERE DISPATCHED TO A DISTURBANCE CALL AT [REDACTED] IN CAMARILLO. WE WERE ADVISED TO CONTACT THE RP AT 84 PASEO ESPLINDIDO. DISPATCH HAD ADVISED THAT THE DP (A-LANGLEY) AT [REDACTED] HAD THREATENED THE RP (DESHANE) WITH A SHOTGUN AND WAS WALKING AROUND THE YARD WAVING THE SHOTGUN. THE RP HAD LEFT THE AREA AND WAS NOW AT HOME AT [REDACTED].

DEP. RIVAS AND I ARRIVED AT [REDACTED] AT ABOUT 0100 HRS. WE CONTACTED THE RP-[REDACTED] IN THE STREET IN FRONT OF HIS HOME. HE TOLD US THAT HE IS A CB RADIO ENTHUSIAST AND HAD BEEN SITTING HOME TRYING TO WATCH TV WHEN HIS TV AND STEREO BECAME DISTORTED DUE TO SOMEONE TRANSMITTING WITH A HIGH POWER CB RADIO IN THE AREA. [REDACTED] HAD HEARD THE CB OPERATOR'S (DP A-LANGLEY) HANDLE AND CALLED A FRIEND WHO TOLD HIM WHO THE OPERATOR WAS AND WHERE HE LIVED. [REDACTED] AND A FRIEND DROVE TO THE DP'S HOME AT [REDACTED] TO ASK HIM TO STOP TRANSMITTING. AS WE PREPARED TO APPROACH THE HOUSE, DEP. RIVAS AND I SELECTED A SAFE ROUTE OF APPROACH AND USED CAUTION DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE SUSPECT MAY POSSIBLY BE ARMED. WE WALKED NORTH ON THE EAST SIDEWALK ON THE OPPOSITE SIDE OF THE STREET FROM THE DP RESIDENCE. WE FOUND COVER BEHIND A SMALL PICKUP

WHICH WAS PARKED ALONG THE CURB DIRECTLY ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE HOUSE. AS WE STOOD BEHIND THE P/U, WE ILLUMINATED THE YARD OF [REDACTED] WITH OUR FLASHLIGHTS CHECKING FOR THE SUSPECT. THE YARD APPEARED CLEAR AND THE HOUSE WAS DARK. WE CROSSED THE STREET AND REMAINED BEHIND COVER BEHIND A SMALL CAR PARKED IN FRONT OF THE HOUSE. WE AGAIN CHECKED THE AREA AND VEHICLES AND DID NOT LOCATE ANYONE OUTSIDE. WE NOTICED A LARGE FIFTH-WHEEL TRAILER PARKED IN THE DRIVEWAY ON THE NORTH SIDE OF THE YARD. THE TRAILER WAS ALSO DARK AND NO NOISE WAS HEARD FROM THE TRAILER OR HOUSE. DEP. RIVAS AND I WERE CONCERNED ABOUT THE DARKNESS AND LACK OF ANY NOISE FROM THE HOUSE AND THE POSSIBILITY OF AN ARMED SUSPECT HIDING IN THE TRAILER, ALL OF WHICH OFFERED NO SAFE ROUTE OF APPROACH TO THE FRONT DOOR. WE MADE A PLAN OF APPROACH LEAVING DEP. RIVAS IN A COVER POSITION WHILE I SLOWLY WALKED UP THE DRIVEWAY. WE THEN DECIDED TO APPROACH THE HOUSE (FRONT DOOR) TO CONTACT THE OCCUPANTS TO INVESTIGATE THE BRANDISHING/ ADW INCIDENT INVOLVING RP-DESHANE.

FOR OUR SAFETY, DEP. RIVAS STAYED BEHIND THE CAR TO COVER MY APPROACH AS I WALKED UP THE NORTH SIDE OF THE DRIVEWAY ALONG THE TRAILER AVOIDING A DIRECT PATH TO THE FRONT DOOR. AS I WAS ABOUT HALFWAY UP THE DRIVEWAY AND BEGAN WALKING IN THE OPEN AREA OF THE DRIVEWAY TOWARD THE FRONT DOOR, I HEARD NOISE FROM THE FRONT DOOR IN THE RECESSED PORCH. DEP. RIVAS CALLED TO ME THAT HE SAW A FEMALE SUBJECT DRESSED IN PINK LOOKING OUT THE WINDOW NEXT TO THE FRONT DOOR. IMMEDIATELY AFTER, WE HEARD THE FRONT DOOR OPENING. I STOPPED WALKING AS THE FRONT DOOR QUICKLY SWUNG OPEN AND AN OLDER MALE SUBJECT EMERGED FROM THE HOUSE. AS THE SUBJECT STEPPED FORWARD OUT OF THE PORCH AREA, DEP. RIVAS AND I BOTH SAW THAT HE WAS HOLDING WHAT APPEARED TO BE A SHOTGUN POSITIONED IN BOTH HANDS HELD NEAR HIS WAIST WITH THE BARREL POINTED IN OUR GENERAL DIRECTION TOWARD THE FRONT OF THE YARD. WE BOTH DREW OUR HANDGUNS FROM OUR HOLSTERS AND YELLED TO THE SUBJECT IDENTIFYING OURSELVES AS SHERIFF'S DEPUTIES AND TOLD HIM TO PUT DOWN THE GUN. THE SUBJECT WAS STANDING IN THE DRIVEWAY NEAR THE PORCH AND BEGAN WAVING THE GUN TOWARD OUR POSITIONS. I BEGAN QUICKLY BACKING OUT OF THE DRIVEWAY KEEPING THE SUBJECT IN VIEW AND CONTINUED SHOUTING "SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT, PUT DOWN THE GUN. POLICE, DROP THE GUN NOW." I ALSO HEARD DEP. RIVAS SHOUT SEVERAL TIMES, "SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT, DROP THE GUN." I HEARD THE SUBJECT YELLING AT US, "GET OUT OF HERE. I'M GOING TO KILL YOU BASTARDS." WE CONTINUED YELLING SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AND ORDERING THE SUBJECT TO PUT DOWN THE WEAPON. THE SUBJECT SHOUTED "WHO ARE YOU?" WE AGAIN SAID THAT WE WERE THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AND WANTED TO TALK TO HIM. HE REPLIED, "BULLSHIT, I'M GONNA FUCKING KILL YOU." THE SUBJECT THEN BEGAN QUICKLY APPROACHING ME AND POINTING THE SHOTGUN AT ME AS I WAS ATTEMPTING TO GET OUT OF THE DRIVEWAY AND FIND COVER. AS I REACHED THE END OF THE TRAILER NEAR THE END OF THE DRIVEWAY, THE SUBJECT RAISED THE SHOTGUN TO HIS SHOULDER AND I HEARD WHAT APPEARED TO BE THE SOUND OF THE SHOTGUN PUMP ACTION CHAMBERING A ROUND AND SAW HIS HAND MOVEMENTS WHICH ALSO APPEARED THAT HE HAD JUST CHAMBERED A ROUND INTO THE SHOTGUN READYING TO FIRE. HE CONTINUED QUICKLY WALKING TOWARD ME AS I DUCKED INTO A DARKENED AREA BY THE TRAILER. BOTH DEP. RIVAS AND I WERE CONTINUALLY SHOUTING "SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT" AND ORDERING HIM TO DROP THE WEAPON. 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AT A BRICK PILLAR ALONG THE FENCE OF THE NORTH SIDE NEIGHBOR'S FRONT YARD. I HAD HEARD SEVERAL GUNSHOTS BUT WAS NOT SURE IF THE SUBJECT HAD FIRED THE SHOTGUN AS HE WAS NOW OUT OF MY VIEW. I USED MY HAND-HELD RADIO AND BROADCAST THAT WE NEEDED A "10-33" (EMERGENCY RADIO TRAFFIC ONLY) THEN BROADCAST THAT WE HAD SHOTS FIRED AND NEEDED ASSISTANCE. HE SAW ME MOVING AND AGAIN SHOULDERED THE SHOTGUN AIMING AT ME. DEP. RIVAS AGAIN BEGAN FIRING AS I RAN TO COVER BEHIND THE REAR WHEEL OF THE CAR IN FRONT OF THE HOUSE. AS DEP. RIVAS STOPPED FIRING AND BEGAN TO RELOAD HIS HANDGUN, I LOOKED UP AND SAW THE SUBJECT MOVING TOWARD HIM AND AIMING THE SHOTGUN TOWARD DEP. RIVAS. I ILLUMINATED THE SUBJECT WITH MY FLASHLIGHT AND FIRED ONE SHOT WITH MY HANDGUN. IMMEDIATELY AFTER I FIRED THE SHOT, THE SUBJECT BENT OVER FORWARD AND LOWERED THE SHOTGUN AND BEGAN WALKING TOWARD HIS FRONT DOOR. BEFORE REACHING THE PORCH, THE SUBJECT AGAIN TURNED TOWARD US AND POINTED THE SHOTGUN FROM HIS WAIST. WE DECIDED TO MOVE TO A POSITION OF COVER ACROSS THE STREET BEHIND THE SMALL PICKUP. AS WE MOVED INTO AN EXPOSED AREA CROSSING THE STREET, DEP. RIVAS FIRED TWO MORE SHOTS TOWARD THE SUBJECT. WE THEN SAW THE SUBJECT WALK INTO THE PORCH AND APPEARED TO GO INTO THE HOUSE.

ONCE WE REACHED THE PICKUP AND TOOK POSITIONS OF COVER BEHIND EACH WHEEL, WE VISUALLY SCANNED THE FRONT YARD AND WERE UNABLE TO LOCATE THE SUBJECT. DEP. RIVAS USED HIS RADIO AND REQUESTED ALL UNITS TO RESPOND CODE-3. HE DIRECTED THE UNITS INTO THE AREA AND REQUESTED FIRE AND AMBULANCE TO RESPOND AND STANDBY AT THE CORNER OF LAS POSAS AND LANTANA. WE STILL DID NOT KNOW IF THE SUSPECT HAD BEEN SHOT AND WANTED TO HAVE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE CLOSE BY IF NEEDED. I MAINTAINED VISUAL CONTACT WITH THE HOUSE WHILE UNITS BEGAN TO ARRIVE. I SAW THAT THE FRONT DOOR APPEARED TO BE CLOSED AND THE SUSPECT WAS NOWHERE IN VIEW. I MOVED DOWN THE STREET AND RETRIEVED DEP. RIVAS' AND MY SHOTGUNS FROM OUR UNITS THEN RETURNED TO OUR POSITION OF COVER BEHIND THE P/U. WE CONTINUED VIEWING THE HOUSE AND MAINTAINED OUR POSITION UNTIL THE ASSISTING UNITS HAD ARRIVED AND WERE POSITIONING AROUND THE RESIDENCE. AS ALL DEPUTIES BEGAN SURROUNDING THE YARD, DEP. RIVAS AND I MOVED BACK ACROSS THE STREET TOWARD THE RESIDENCE BEHIND THE SMALL CAR AND TRUCK PARKED IN FRONT OF THE HOUSE. DEP. RHODS BEGAN CALLING TO THE SUSPECT TO STEP OUT. I SAW THE FRONT DOOR OPEN AND THE SUSPECT STARTED WALKING OUT INTO THE DRIVEWAY HOLDING HIS LEFT UPPER ARM. HE DID NOT APPEAR TO BE ARMED AS HE WALKED INTO THE DRIVEWAY. DEP. RHODS ORDERED THE SUSPECT TO LIE DOWN AND PRONE OUT. THE SUSPECT SHOUTED, "YOU SONS OF BITCHES SHOT ME." HE THEN WALKED INTO THE DRIVEWAY IN FRONT OF THE PORCH AND LAY DOWN ON HIS FACE WITH HIS ARMS EXTENDED IN FRONT OF HIM OVER HIS HEAD. WE COVERED THE HOUSE FOR POSSIBLE ADDITIONAL SUSPECTS AS DEP. RHODS AND DEP. DEANDA APPROACHED THE SUSPECT. DEP. DEANDA HANDCUFFED THE SUSPECT'S HANDS OVER HIS HEAD AS HE LIE ON THE DRIVEWAY. A FEMALE SUBJECT THEN WALKED OUTSIDE FROM THE HOUSE AND WAS LED AWAY FROM THE SCENE BY DEP. J. ARTHUR. DEP. RIVAS, SGT. WEAVER, AND SR. DEP. FLANNIGAN THEN SEARCHED THE HOUSE FOR ADDITIONAL SUSPECTS AND WE SECURED THE SCENE. DEP. DEANDA AND I STAYED WITH THE SUSPECT IN THE DRIVEWAY AND ATTENDED TO HIS INJURED LEFT UPPER ARM. THE

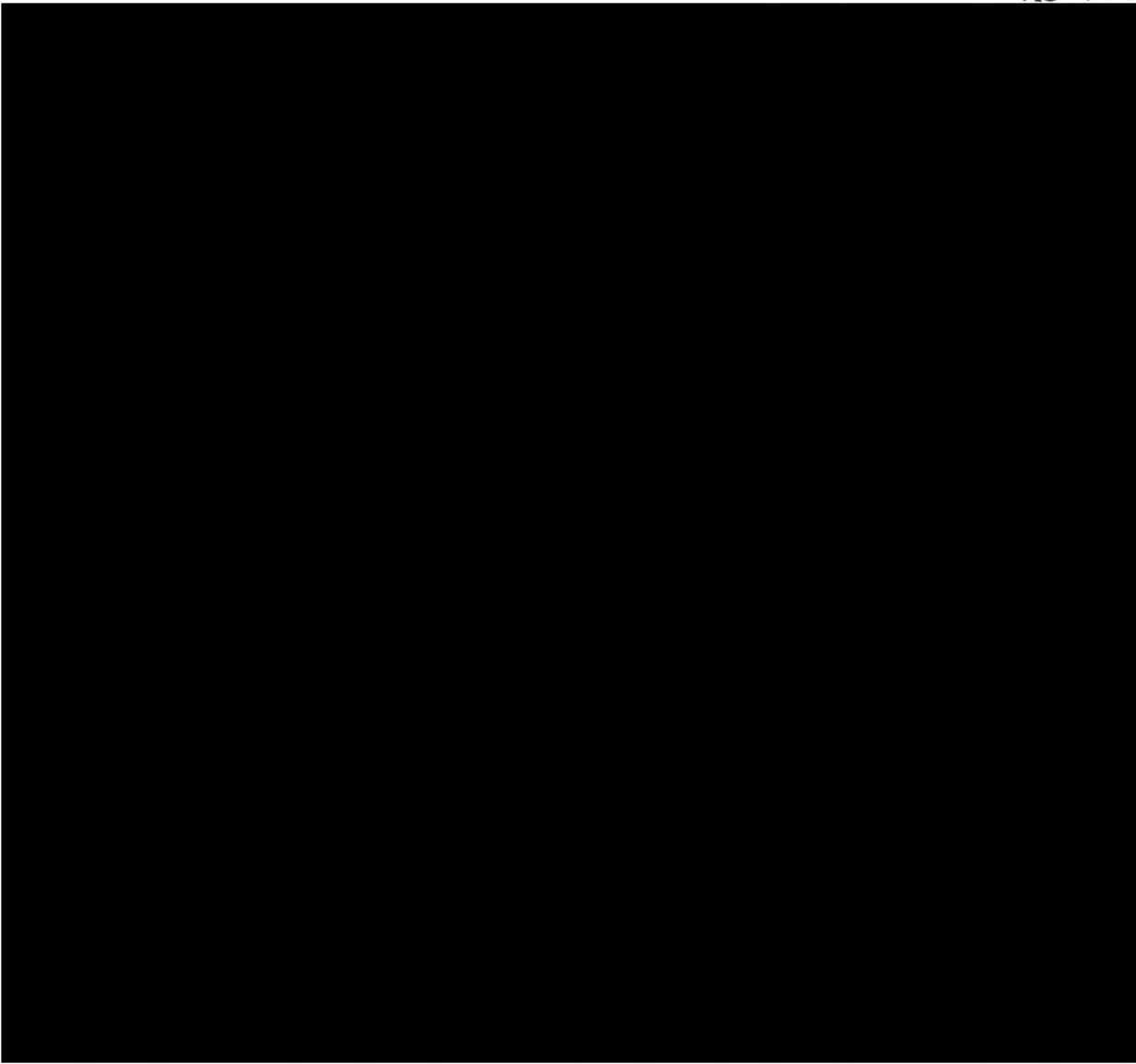

NARRATIVE

The following report is a supplemental interview of witness [REDACTED] regarding the events that occurred on 7-6-91 in front of her house.

[REDACTED] is the wife of Walter Langley and they both live together at [REDACTED] St. in the north end of Camarillo.

[REDACTED] and Walter are avid Citizen Band radio enthusiasts and have large antennas outside connected to their transmission equipment inside the home. [REDACTED] likes to talk on the radio every night on a regular basis but occasionally other Citizen Band enthusiasts transmit on the same channel using vulgarity and foul language. [REDACTED] told me that this sort of behavior really bothers her and Walter.

On the night of 7-5-91, at around 2000hrs, [REDACTED] started talking on the radio to different people in the city. Between 2030hrs and 2100hrs some unknown individuals came on the channel and started using foul language. [REDACTED] told me she made some comments to the person(s) on the

other end of the transmission about their language and then decided to 'lock up' the channel. She described a 'lock up' as pressing the microphone key down and securing it in place and then playing some music over the channel. This ties up the channel and nobody else can use it unless their radio puts out a stronger signal. [REDACTED] told me she put on some music and just let it play over channel 22 for about an hour.

[REDACTED] and Walter went out into the garage and sat there with the large garage door open (in the upright position) and waited to see if any of the CBers trying to use the channel were going to drive by their house. She told me they have had some problems with this happening before but there have never been any altercations arising out of those contacts. She said that there is a very active group of CB enthusiasts in the Camarillo area that regularly play some sort of hide and seek using the radios. The group is predominantly composed of young people and many of them seem to know who the Langleys are. Although Vivian could not elaborate about why these people know them my impression is that similar incidents have occurred in the past where the Langleys have locked-up a channel creating animosity between everyone involved.

While Walter and [REDACTED] waited outside in the garage Walter took his shotgun from an unknown location in the garage and sat with it in the garage. At approximately 2130hrs a single pick-up truck (no further description) drove up the street and stopped in the road in front of the Langley's house. [REDACTED] said two men got out and started to approach the driveway when Walter stood up with the shotgun and said "Don't do nothing foolish now, boys. Don't come on the property." [REDACTED] told me she thinks Walter was holding the shotgun in both hands with the barrel pointing down at the ground. The two men in the street argued about the CB channel

lock-up for a moment and then got into their truck and drove away. Walter sat down again and waited while Vivian went in and out of the house.

About 15 to 20 minutes later two pick up trucks drove up and two men got out again (unknown if the same individuals) and another argument took place between them all with Walter still holding the shotgun in both hands and still pointed down. The men got back in their trucks and left after a few moments. Walter sat down again for about another 15 minutes and then he and Vivian closed the big garage door and went into the house.

Walter took the shotgun inside with him and set it down on the dining room table. He sat down in a chair near the table and in view of the dining room window with the drapes open so he could see outside to the street. Vivian told me she went to the bathroom and changed into a nightgown and robe while Walter remained sitting in the dining room.

A short time later (estimated as 15 to 20 minutes) about three or four vehicles started driving past the Langley home and on one pass a car horn was blown in front of the residence and some vulgarity was shouted in their direction. [REDACTED] thinks the vehicles drove past the house about four or five times.

A little while later ([REDACTED] could not be specific about the time) a car pulled partially into the Langley driveway and [REDACTED] heard Walter say "Looks like we're going to have it again" and he stood up, picked up the shotgun, and walked out the door, closing it behind him. [REDACTED] remembers that Walter was gone only about a minute when she heard three or four shots and it sounded like they were coming through the house. She said she ducked down low and ran to the telephone and dialed 911. She said she told the dispatchers "There's some shooting here at [REDACTED]"

██████████. Come quick!" and hung up the telephone. Walter came walking into the house holding his left arm with his right and ██████████ saw that he was bleeding from the upper part of the bicep. He said "I got hit in the arm". She ran and got him a white towel and pressed it to his arm. After a few moments Walter said "There's police out there." Walter walked back outside and ██████████ heard shouting from the front yard ordering Walter to lay down on the driveway (the commands given by the officers in the driveway). She stepped outside and saw the police standing over Walter and she was handcuffed and led to the police car and put into the back seat.

I asked ██████████ if she or Walter had been drinking at all tonight and she told me that neither one of them drinks due to their health problems. I asked her if she heard any shouting or commands being given before she heard the shots being fired and she said she did not but the front door was closed so it would have been difficult to hear anything. I asked her if Walter had ever threatened anybody with the shotgun before and she said he has not.

I questioned ██████████ a couple of times about the events of the evening and each time the specifics would change a little, such as the number of trucks present or the number of times the vehicles drove past the house but the basics of her story remained consistent. It was apparent throughout my interviews that she does not know who shot her husband.

I concluded my interview and called her daughter in Moorpark to come pick her up at the scene.

When [redacted] daughter [redacted] arrived I took her aside and asked her if she could tell me a little bit about Walter.

[redacted] said Walter had open heart surgery about 14 years ago and takes medication regularly. She said that Walter is under a lot of stress and anxiety because of his wife's medical problems. He had a nervous breakdown several years ago and was seeing a psychologist for emotional stress. She said that Walter has not seen the doctor in about five years and seems to be acting normally now. She also told me that Walter and [redacted] do not drink.

The following is the transcribed dispatch tape of the officer involved shooting at [REDACTED] Avenue, Camarillo on the morning of July 6, 1991.

Male voice: We've already had a couple of calls from other people, it's the citizens band radio. We've got a guy out there who's really whopping out the power on the citizen's band and he's at [REDACTED]. He's bleeding over phones, televisions, everything.

Dispatch: You know who he is and where he is?

Male voice: No, but get this. I went over to the guys house with some people. Alright we hunted him down, a bunch of us. There's alot of people out there getting mad. We're all trying to talk and he's out there blowing us out with his radio.

Just two (2) people have gone by and tried to talk to him. He's got a shotgun, he's setting out in front of his house, out on the, um he's walking around on the driveway with the shotgun.

His wife and him are both drunk. They're just totally...

Dispatch: And he lives at [REDACTED]?

Male voice: Yea, [REDACTED]. There's alot of people who are really mad right now. They're driving by there.
(laughter)

Dispatch: OK

Male voice: And ah

Dispatch: In Camarillo. What's your last name sir?

Male voice: [REDACTED]

Dispatch: And your first name?

Male voice: [REDACTED] I'll file a complaint too. In the past, this is what makes me mad. I've got a license to operate and ah he's over exceeded his limit by six (6) hours. We're allowed to transmit for twenty (20) minutes. He's on the radio for six (6) hours, blarring over the televisions, everthing.

Dispatch: What's your address, Mr. [REDACTED]?
