SOURCE OF ACTIVITY: I WAS ASKED BY SGT ROUSE, ON-SCENE SUPERVISOR, TO COMPLETE A FACTUAL DIAGRAM OF THE AREA. ALL MEASUREMENTS WERE TAKEN WITH A ROLL-A-TAPE.

SCENE: THE AREA INVOLVED IS LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF VENTURA KNOWN AS OAK PARK. THE APARTMENT/CONDO COMPLEX IS LOCATED OFF OF BOWFIELD. LINDERO CYN RD BORDERS THE WESTSIDE OF THE COMPLEX. THE AREA IS A PRIVATE DRIVE, "OAK PARK LANE", THAT HAS COVERED CARPORT AREA. IT IS A WELL MAINTAINED ASPHALT DRIVE-WAY.

THERE WAS NO PERMANENT REFERENCE POINT TO TAKE THE MEASUREMENTS FROM. I USED DIFFERENT CURB LINES WITHIN THE COMPLEX WHICH WILL BE REFERRED AS "REFERENCE LINES".

DIAGRAMS: DIAGRAM #1 IS THE PARKING AREA FOR THE APARTMENT COMPLEX W/O ANY VEHICLES.

DIAGRAM #2 SHOWS THE PATH OF THE SUSPECT VEHICLE TOOK AND THE AREA OF IMPACTS.

AOI #1: V1 (BLK FORD BRONCO, [REDACTED]) COLLIDED WITH A SUPPORT BEAM SEPARATED STALLS 133/134

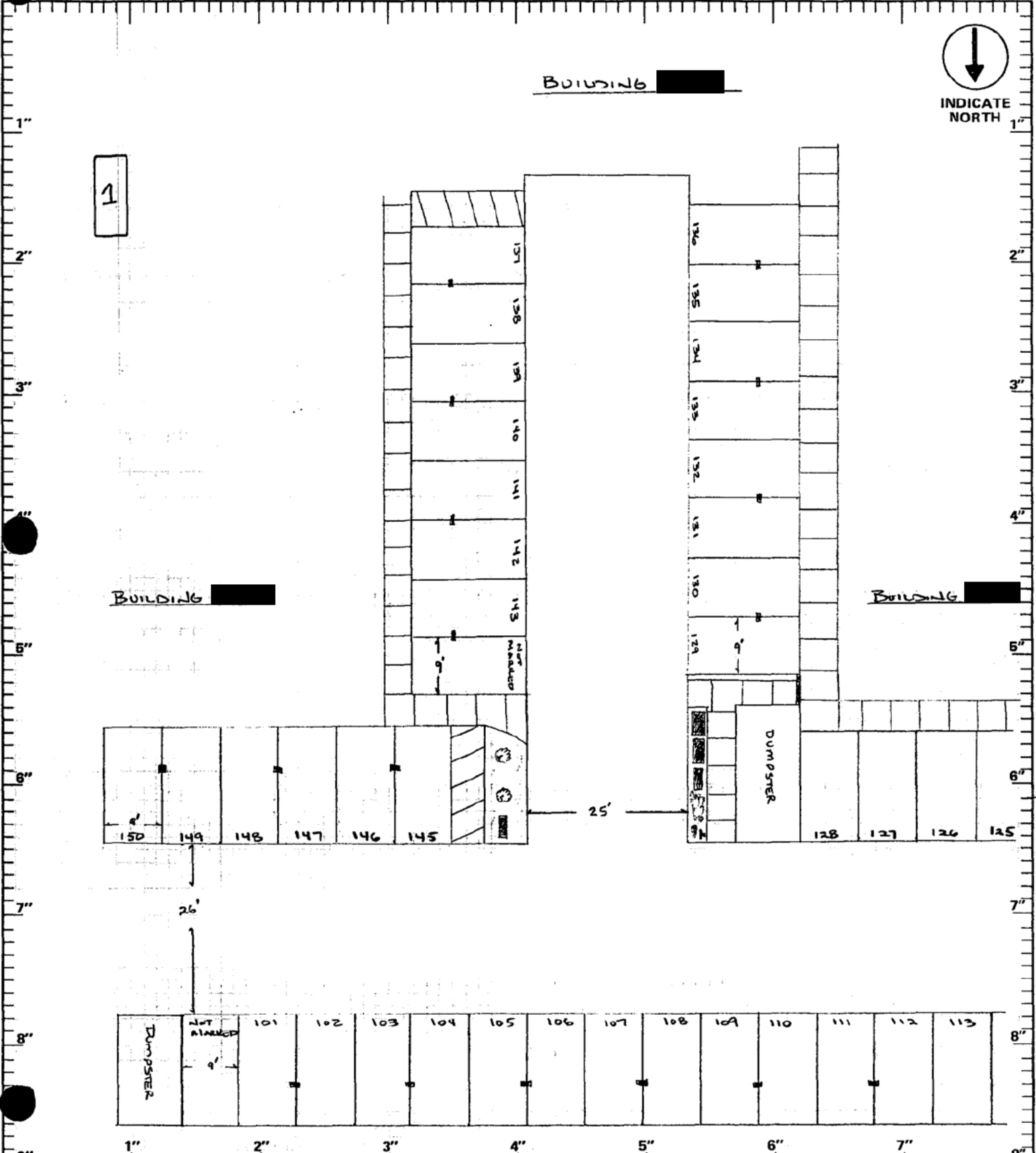

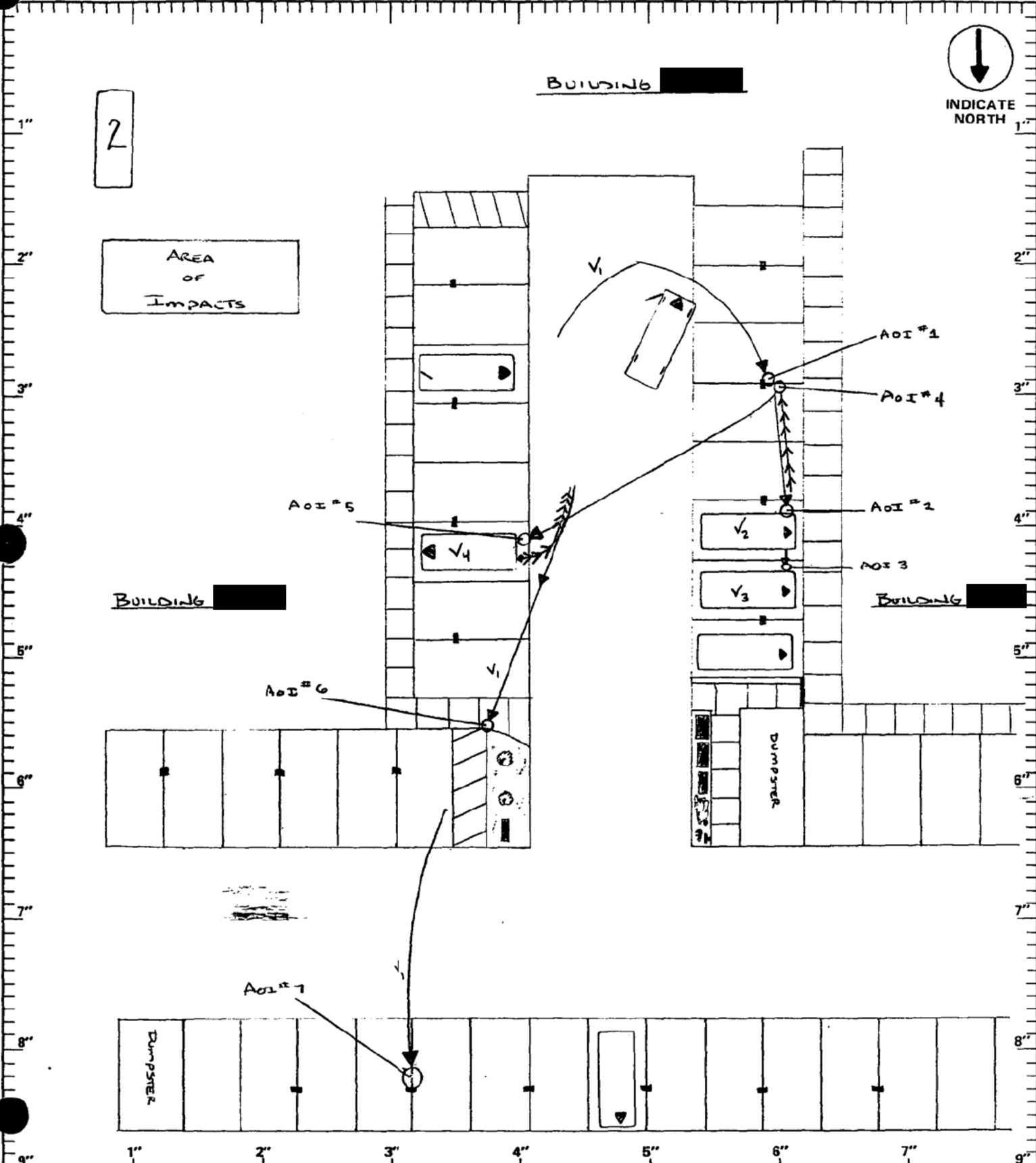

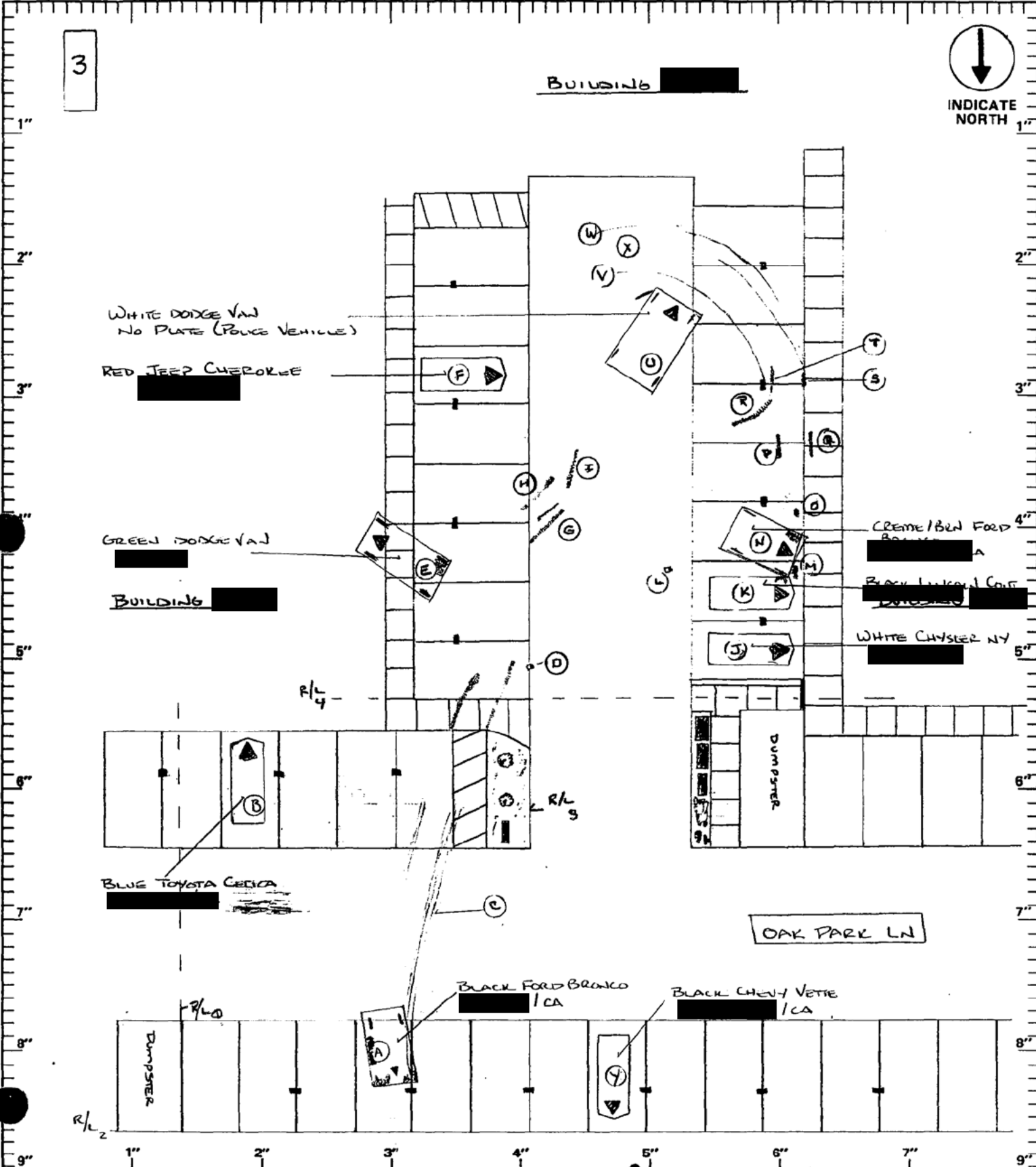

DETECTIVE DAIN HAD A SUSPECT NAMED SHAWN MORA UNDER SURVEILLANCE FOR 10851 V.C. AND IT WAS ASSUMED THAT HE WAS INSIDE ONE OF THE APARTMENTS. THE STOLEN VEHICLE WAS PARKED IN A PARKING STALL TOWARDS THE REAR OF THE APARTMENTS. BACK-UP UNITS WERE STATIONED IN THE IMMEDIATE AREA.

DETECTIVE DAIN ASKED THE APARTMENT MANAGER TO CONTACT MORA AND SEE IF HE WOULD COME OUTSIDE AND MOVE HIS CAR FROM THE PARKING STALL. PERSONNEL. I TOLD DETECTIVE DAIN TO KEEP THE SUSPECT AT GUN POINT AND I WOULD HANDCUFF HIM. I PLACED THE SUSPECT (LATER IDENTIFIED AS MORA) UNDER ARREST FOR 10851 CVC (POSSESSION OF A STOLEN VEHICLE). I HANDCUFFED HIM AND REMOVED HIM FROM THE VEHICLE. I COMPLETED A PAT DOWN SEARCH OF MORA FOR WEAPONS AND BEGAN TO TREAT THE BULLET WOUND ON HIS LEFT SIDE.

Det. Dain and I decided to try and trick the suspect out of the apartment. I contacted [redacted] in the office and she called Mora's apartment to tell him that he would have to move his vehicle so that maintenance could be preformed on the wall next to it. She only got the answer phone.

We then decided that Det. Dain would knock on the door posing as a maintenance man and ask him to move it. I provided close cover for Det. Dain while he attempted contact. Noone would answer the door. We then returned to Bowfield St.

Sgt. Cozzens, Det. Dain, and I discussed maintaining the stakeout. I had to leave for court. It was decided that I would arrange for relief for Sgt. Cozzens as well as a replacement for myself.

I contacted Det. Seeba at E/Vly and he agreed to respond to the stakeout to replace me. SED Sgt. Carpenter was contacted and he agreed to have his unit come in early to take over the stakeout.

During our discussions Det. Dain and I agreed that we did not have a case unless Mora physically got in the truck.

During the stakeout we were both concerned with a street pursuit and agreed that I would block the suspect vehicle in the parking lot with my unit if at all possible.

- (a) When an arrest is made without a warrant by a peace officer or private person, the person arrested, if not otherwise released, shall, without unnecessary delay, be taken before the nearest or most accessible magistrate in the county in which the offense is triable, and a complaint stating the charge against the arrested person shall be laid before such magistrate.
- (b) Any peace officer may release from custody, instead of taking such person before a magistrate, any person arrested without a warrant whenever:
 - (1) He is satisfied that there are insufficient grounds for making a criminal complaint against the person arrested.
 - (2) The person arrested was arrested for intoxication only, and no further proceedings are desirable.
 - (3) The person was arrested only for being under the influence of a narcotic, drug, or restricted dangerous drug and such person is delivered to a facility or hospital for treatment and no further proceedings are desirable.
- (c) Any record of arrest of a person released pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (3) of subdivision (b) shall include a record of release. Thereafter, such arrest shall not be deemed an arrest, but a detention.

Penal Code Section 849.5 provides:

In any case in which a person is arrested and released and no accusatory pleading is filed charging him with an offense, any record of arrest of the person shall include a record of release. Thereafter, the arrest shall not be deemed an arrest, but a detention only.

Penal Code Section 851.6 provides, in part:

- (a) In any case in which a person is arrested and released pursuant to paragraph (1) or (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 849, the person shall be issued a certificate, signed by the releasing officer or his superior officer, describing the action as a detention.

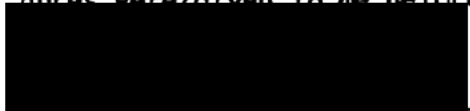

TRANSMISSION SELECTOR WAS IN REVERSE AND THE BACK-UP LIGHTS WERE ILLUMINATED. ON THE FLOORBOARD AREA, NEAR THE DRIVER'S DOOR, WAS A MAJOR PORTION OF A SPENT .45 AUTO BULLET. A LARGE LEAD PORTION OF A BULLET WAS OBSERVED LYING ON THE FLOORBOARD NEAR THE ACCELERATOR PEDAL. THERE WAS A BULLET HOLE THROUGH THE BOTTOM OF THE WINDSHIELD, JUST TO THE LEFT OF THE STEERING WHEEL (AS YOU VIEW IT FROM THE OUTSIDE). THIS BULLET APPEARED TO HAVE TRAVELED ALMOST PERPENDICULAR THROUGH THE WINDSHIELD, HITTING THE DASH, THEN TRAVELING BEHIND THE DASH, DOWNWARD TOWARDS THE FLOORBOARD.

THE SECOND BULLET HOLE I SAW WAS THROUGH THE DRIVER'S SIDE DOOR, JUST LEFT OF THE DOOR HANDLE. THE BULLET PUNCHED THROUGH THE DOOR, THROUGH THE ARM REST, AND STOPPED BEFORE HITTING ANYTHING ELSE IN THE TRUCK. I SAW A SMALL AMOUNT OF BLOOD ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE DRIVER'S SEAT, INDICATING THAT THE DRIVER HAD STOPPED THE BULLET WHICH PENETRATED THE DRIVER'S DOOR, OR HAD BEEN INJURED BY SHRAPNEL.

THE CARPORT WAS RESTING ON TOP OF THE TRUCK. THERE WERE APPROXIMATELY 10" OF SCRATCHES ON THE TOP OF THE TRUCK, AS IF THE TRUCK HAD MOVED BACKWARDS AFTER THE CARPORT FELL ON IT.

I LEFT THE CRIME SCENE AT 1540 HRS, LEAVING DET. GATLING TO SUPERVISE THE FINAL STAGES OF THE CRIME SCENE. I DROVE TO THE EAST VALLEY SHERIFF'S STATION, WHERE I FOUND DET. DAIN AND SGT. WATLINGTON. REFER TO A SEPARATE REPORT FOR MY INTERVIEW WITH DET. DAIN.

DET. PATRICK DAIN INTERVIEW

ON 4-10-92 @ 1605 HRS, I CONDUCTED A TAPE RECORDED INTERVIEW WITH DET. DAIN. THE INTERVIEW WAS CONDUCTED IN AN OFFICE AT THE EAST VALLEY SHERIFF'S STATION. AT DET. DAIN'S REQUEST, SGT. WATLINGTON SAT IN ON THE INTERVIEW. THE FOLLOWING IS A SYNOPSIS OF THE INTERVIEW:

THEY WERE ON A SURVEILLANCE OF A STOLEN VEHICLE THAT WAS STOLEN IN FEBRUARY FROM KEMP FORD. THE TRUCK'S WINDOW WAS BROKEN, THEN THE LOCK BOX KEY WAS USED TO DRIVE IT AWAY. HIS INVESTIGATION IDENTIFIED SHAWN MORA AS THE PERSON WHO HAD STOLEN THE TRUCK AND WAS STILL IN POSSESSION OF THE TRUCK. THIS PERSON ALREADY HAD THE BROKEN WINDOW REPLACED IN THE TRUCK, THEN STOLE THE TRUCK FROM THE GLASS SHOP WITHOUT PAYMENT, WHEN THEY WOULDN'T ACCEPT HIS CHECK.

AN INFORMANT HAD TOLD JEFF KEMP WHERE THE TRUCK AND SUSPECT WOULD BE. PAT WAS DRIVING THE WHITE CRIME PREVENTION VAN AND WAS INSIDE THE COMPLEX NEAR THE STOLEN TRUCK, WHILE UNITS WERE POSITIONED

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OUTSIDE THE COMPLEX TO BOX IN ANY ESCAPE.

DET. EHRLICH HAD THE COMPLEX MANAGER CALL THE SUSPECT TO MOVE THE TRUCK FROM THE UNMARKED STALL WHICH WAS EAST OF THE INCIDENT AREA. EHRLICH HAD TO LEAVE FOR COURT, COZZENS HAD TO RETURN TO THE STATION, SO DET. SEEBA CAME TO ASSIST. WHILE ALL OF THESE PERSONNEL CHANGES WERE OCCURRING, MORA CAME OUT OF THE COMPLEX AND GOT INTO THE BRONCO. PAT SAID THAT MORA LOOKED LIKE AN OK GUY, THAT IT WOULD BE SIMPLE AND QUICK, SO THE NEW PLAN WAS TO BLOCK THE BRONCO WITH HIS VAN AFTER MORA FINISHED REPARKING IT.

MORA MOVED THE BRONCO, STOPPING UNDER THE CARPORT WHERE THE WHITE CRIME PREVENTION VAN WAS UPON OUR ARRIVAL. PAT FELT HE'D BLOCKED THE BRONCO AND GOT OUT OF THE VAN AND APPROACHED THE DRIVER. PAT HAD HIS GUN OUT AND HIS SHIRT UNBUTTONED SO HIS BADGE ON HIS BELT WOULD BE VISIBLE. PAT WAS NOT SURE IF HE WAS IDENTIFYING HIMSELF AND TELLING MORA THAT HE WAS UNDER ARREST, AT THIS POINT. THE BRONCO'S DOOR WAS OPEN AND IT LOOKED LIKE MORA WAS LOOKING AT HIM THROUGH THE REAR VIEW MIRROR OR SIDE MIRRORS.

MORA BEGAN TO MAKE HIS U-TURN TO THE RIGHT. PAT YELLED OUT, "SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT...YOU'RE UNDER ARREST...STOP, OR STOP IT!" OR WORDS TO THAT EFFECT. MORA "T-BONED" THE TAN/BROWN BRONCO. PAT WAS STILL YELLING TO MORA, " SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT... YOU'RE UNDER ARREST...!". PAT FELT MORA MADE SOME MISTAKES, BUT HE WASN'T GETTING OUT.

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PAT IS STILL BETWEEN HIS VAN AND THE STOLEN BRONCO, TRYING TO MOVE TOWARDS THE DRIVER'S SIDE WINDOW, IN AN ATTEMPT TO COMMUNICATE FURTHER WITH MORA. MORA BACKED-UP, MADE A RIGHT TURN (DUE EAST) AND FLOORED THE BRONCO. PAT FELT HE MAY HAVE HAD TO JUMP OUT OF THE WAY AT THAT POINT, AS MORA ACCELERATED, RUNNING INTO THE GREEN VAN PARKED IN THE STALLS TO THE EAST.

PAT WAS STILL YELLING AT MORA, IDENTIFYING HIMSELF AND TELLING HIM THAT HE WAS UNDER ARREST. PAT WAS YELLING AT MORA, " MORA...GIVE UP...THIS IS IT...YOU'RE UNDER ARREST... STOP!", AS HE TRIED TO APPROACH THE DRIVER'S SIDE DOOR.

MORA BACKED UP, TURNING IN A SOUTHERLY DIRECTION. PAT FELT HE WAS NOW LOCATED IN THE MIDDLE OF THE PARKING AREA. MORA STOPPED, PLACING PAT ALMOST DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF THE BRONCO, FACE-TO-FACE. PAT WAS FACING SOUTH, WITH MORA FACING NORTH. PAT WAS STILL TELLING MORA TO GIVE IT UP, THAT HE WAS UNDER ARREST. PAT SAID, " AND HE LOOKED AT ME, LIKE, YOU'RE HISTORY JACK! YOU ARE GONE!".

MORA CROUCHED DOWN BY THE STEERING WHEEL, LOOKED AT HIM, AND GUNNED THE ENGINE. PAT SAID, " I'M HISTORY...I'M GONE!".

PAT FIRED ONE ROUND, AIMING AT THE BOTTOM OF THE WINDSHIELD, WHEN MORA WAS ABOUT 6'-10' AWAY (BEST GUESS). MORA KEPT COMING AT HIM. PAT SAID, "I THOUGHT I WAS DEAD...HERE'S A TON OF BRONCO THAT'S GONNA KILL ME...THIS IS IT!".

AS THE BRONCO WAS COMING AT HIM, PAT WAS TWISTING OUT OF THE WAY.

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THE BRONCO HIT HIM IN THE LEFT LEG. AS HE WAS TWISTING AROUND, HE FIRED ANOTHER ROUND THROUGH THE DOOR. HE FELT THAT DURING THE SECOND SHOT, HIS PISTOL BARREL WAS TOUCHING THE BRONCO'S DOOR OR LESS THAN A FOOT AWAY. PAT WASN'T SURE IF HE WAS KNOCKED TO THE GROUND, BECAUSE IT ALL HAPPENED SO FAST. PAT WAS SURPRISED TO FIND THAT HE WASN'T DEAD.

THE BRONCO BARRELED STRAIGHT PAST HIM AND LANDED UNDER THE CARPORT, CRASHING INTO IT, ON THE NORTH SIDE. PAT RAN TO THE DRIVER'S SIDE, STILL POINTING HIS GUN AT MORA.

PAT WAS YELLING AT MORA, " MORA, DON'T DO IT...YOU ARE A DEAD MAN IF YOU TRY TO DO IT AGAIN!...BECAUSE THERE WAS NO DOUBT IN MY MIND THAT HE WAS TRYING TO KILL ME! ". MORA LOOKED AT HIM AND GAVE HIM A LOOK LIKE HE WAS GOING TO DO IT AGAIN. THE ENGINE WAS STILL RUNNING AND MORA WAS TRYING TO PUT THE TRUCK INTO REVERSE, BUT FOR SOME REASON, HE COULDN'T GET IT INTO REVERSE.

PAT YELLED AT A COUPLE PEOPLE TO CALL THE COPS, AS HE HELD MORA AT GUNPOINT. PAT WAS ABOUT SIX FEET AWAY FROM THE DRIVER'S SIDE WINDOW POINTING HIS GUN AT MORA. MORA GOT THAT LOOK AGAIN AND KEPT LOOKING AT THE CONTROLS OF THE TRUCK. PAT TOLD MORA, " YOU DO IT AND YOU ARE A DEAD MAN, I GUARANTEE IT!...YOU ARE GONE! ". MORA SHOOK HIS HEAD, OK, AND TURNED THE ENGINE OFF.

PAT ASKED MORA IF HE WAS HIT. MORA SHOOK HIS HEAD IN THE AFFIRMATIVE, SO PAT LET HIM TAKE HIS HANDS OFF OF HIS HEAD AND PUT

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THEM ON THE STEERING WHEEL. DAVE WAREHAM AND STEVE ADAMS ARRIVED AND REMOVED MORA FROM THE BRONCO, HANDCUFFED HIM, AND BEGAN FIRST AID TREATMENT FOR MORA.

WHEN ADAMS ARRIVED, PAT TOLD HIM TO GET AN AMBULANCE. HE ALSO HAD ONE OF THE CITIZENS GET HIM HIS PORTABLE RADIO FROM THE VAN, AS HE WAS WAITING FOR ASSISTANCE.

PAT WAS VERY POSITIVE MORA AIMED DIRECTLY AT HIM, BECAUSE THERE WAS ROOM FOR MORA TO GO AROUND HIM IN THE PARKING LOT. PAT SAID, "HE'S GUNNED IT, HE'S UP TO ME AND I'M THINKING, I'M NOT GETTING OUT OF THE WAY OF THIS IN TIME...AND I REMEMBER THE LEFT FRONT OF THE VEHICLE COMING UP IN HERE (SHOWING HIS LEFT THIGH AREA)...AND ME TRYING TO DO THE BEST SPIN OF MY LIFE TO SPIN OUT OF IT."

PAT FELT THAT THE FIRST SHOT, SPINNING, CONTACT, AND THE SECOND SHOT WERE ALL CONNECTED IN SOME KIND OF EXTENDED MOTION AT HIGH SPEED. I BEGAN TO WRAP UP THE INTERVIEW AND TOLD PAT WHAT TO EXPECT FROM THE SYSTEM. PAT ENDED THE INTERVIEW WITH, " WHEN HE WAS COMING AT ME, I THOUGHT I WASN'T GOING HOME ANYMORE. I THOUGHT ABOUT MY WIFE AND KIDS ".

THE INTERVIEW WAS TERMINATED AT 1635 HRS.

INTERVIEW OF SENIOR DEPUTY PAT DAIN, BY SERGEANT PAT BUCKLEY ON
APRIL 10, 1992

PD = PAT DAIN
PB = PAT BUCKLEY

PB: It's April 10th at 1605 in the afternoon. Uh, present in the interview are Sergeant Bruce Watlington. Interview is Patrick Dain and I'm Sergeant Buckley. And if you would, Pat, uh, just tell me what happened.

PD: Well, we were, uh, on a surveillance of a stolen vehicle, I, in the area of Oak Park, it was on Oak Park Lane. Uh, this is a stolen vehicle investigation that's been going on for a while. The vehicle was stolen I believe it was in early February from ^{Kemp} Camden Ford. Uh, uh, it had been outstanding up to now. The vehicle had been, uh, uh, after it had been stolen, a vehicle similar to it -- it's a brand new 19, uh, 92 Ford Bronco, black. Um, after the vehicle had been stolen, there was one that was seen down at a glass shop down in the valley.

PB: Uh-huh.

PD: Okay? Uh, it didn't have any plates on it and the, um, vehicle, um, that was stolen didn't have any plates on it either, okay? The guy went down into the valley to have the driver's window replaced, okay? A suspect. Uh, the lock box was broken off the car when it was stolen.

PB: Okay. Which --

PD: It would be in the driver's window usually.

PB: Uh-huh.

1 PD: Okay? Uh, the suspect that, uh, uh, got the window fixed,
2 they wouldn't accept their check down there. There was a
3 problem with payment, they wanted cash, and he left, uh,
4 without paying 'em. Okay? He drove over a vacuum cleaner
5 or something when he left. He got out of there. Anyways,
6 uh, then the investigation was rather stagnant for a while
7 until, like, about a week, week-and-a-half ago, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]
8 from Kemp Ford called me up and he said, told me, "I've
9 received an anonymous phone call from a female and she told
10 me that a Shawn ^{MORA} Wa who lives at this address," uh, near
11 where, same parking lot area, same apartment complex we were
12 in, uh, "has your Ford Bronco that he stole from you guys
13 and, uh, it doesn't have any license plates on it. And he
14 always parks it away from it, the, his apartment, um, for
15 obvious reasons, okay?

16 PB: Uh-huh.

17 PD: So, anyways, uh, I gave that information to ^{SED}PCDS and ^{ASKED THEM}Santa
18 ^{TO SET UP ON IT.}Paula. Uh, we hadn't had any progress with, with the car in
19 this instance. ^{TODAY}Then we went out there, uh, and I was
20 sitting in the, uh, a van watching the suspect's car --

21 PB: That white --

22 PD: The white -- ^{VAN}

23 PB: It's, what do you call, that crime prevent --

24 PD: Crime Prevention van, okay? Do, do you want all those, all
25 the details of what, or --

26 PB: Whatever you want to tell me.

27 PD: Well, we had, uh, unit's, uh, sitting out on peripheral
28 streets, okay? We had two games plans. Uh, let 'em get up

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sometime today and drive the car out of the complex and we'd been sitting there quite a while and nothing had happened. So we had the manager place a call to, we had his phone number. The snitch earlier gave us the guy's phone number.

PB: And this was that lady, lady manager?

PD: No, I --

PB: The lady --

PD: I don't know. I didn't talk to the manager.

PB: Oh.

PD: Dave Erlich did.

PB: Oh, okay.

PD: So, I didn't even talk to the manager. Anyways, she placed a call into the answering machine that, uh, was a phone, uh, the suspect's phone and, uh, uh, for him to move his car.

PB: Just a second. Okay, I'm sorry. Okay, you, Erlich called the manager to dupe in a call to him.

PD: Dupe in a call to him and have him move it from where it was parked. It was parked in an unmarked stall not too far away from his apartment but an unmarked stall. Um, anyways, Dave Erlich had to go to, uh, Ken ^{COZZENS} Cousins and Dave Erlich and Steve Adams were assisting in a Code 5 at that time. Uh, Dave had to break off the Code 5 and go to court. Ken ^{COZZENS} Cousins stayed there, uh, ^{GRAY} Rick Ceva ^{SEEB} and ^{SEEB} Dave ^{WAREHAM} Whereham, um, brought up the Code 5, came over to Code 5 locations and Ken ^{COZZENS} Cousins had to leave, come back to the station. Uh, anyways, uh, the, the second game plan was, instead of, you know, the first one was to let him leave and we'll stop him on the street.

1 PB: Yeah.

2 PD: Okay? And the second one was, as he's moving, reparking the
3 car, we'll take him down in the parking lot. We'll arrest
4 him in the parking lot with the car. So, uh, you're
5 familiar with what the scene looks like out there, okay?
6 Uh, from the final resting point of the Ford Bronco that you
7 saw --

8 PB: Uh-huh.

9 PD: -- east, it was parked well east of there originally.

10 PB: Right. Okay.

11 PD: Okay? And I was parked even further east.

12 PB: Right.

13 PD: Okay? But I had a visual on him. Well, I, uh, I've had a
14 DMV Soundex of the suspect, okay? Uh, new, so, just a black
15 and white but it was a fairly good representation.
16 Basically had a photo lineup done. Not positive ID because
17 the witness didn't like the guy's --

18 PB: Sure.

19 PD: --didn't like the complexion of the guy in the photo -----
20 --- so we got a, we got some good information, we got good
21 probable cause. Anyways, uh, the guy comes out -- most
22 people in the parking lot were moving kind of slow but he
23 came out pretty good, pretty good pace. To, I guess he got
24 his phone call to move the Ford Bronco. And, uh, you know,
25 I was telling Bruce here, you know, I'm a, I got a real
26 quick shot at him through the ^{binos} ~~vinyls~~ and I thought, "This
27 looks like a nice guy." I'll let him park it, I'll park the
28 van behind it so he can't get out, you know, so he doesn't

1 have to run over the vacuum cleaner again.

2 PB: Yeah.

3 PD: And, you know, we'll come back to the station, do a nice
4 little interview and we'll be out of here.

5 PB: Uh-huh.

6 PD: Well, he moved from where he had been parked, went down the
7 parking isle, ^{where you} we saw the Crime Prevention van --

8 PB: Right.

9 PD: Okay? And he had stopped right in front of the Crime
10 Prevention van, okay? Which looked to me like it was boxed
11 in, you know what I'm saying?

12 PB: Yeah.

13 PD: Okay. And as I'm ^{Gettin'} hitting, I'm getting out of my van -- (and
14 I don't remember if at this ^{Point} time in time I'm saying,)

15 "Sheriff's Department, stop. You're under arrest" or
16 anything like that. I know I'm getting out. His door is
17 open, he's, he, his body in moving in such a, looks like
18 he's looking in the rearview mirror, side mirrors, or
19 wherever. I might have taken a shot behind his back. I
20 drove up, uh, a little bit faster than you normally would to
21 park your car. Uh, he just did a U-turn to the right, or to
22 the west, and I don't know if he went up over the grass or
23 if he cut it that short or, you know, stayed on the pavement
24 or what, but he was getting out of there, okay? Now, as he
25 drive -- doing his U-turn to the west, okay --

26 PB: Do you want to draw? Would that be easier for you?

27 PD: Pardon me?

28 PB: Would it be easier for you to draw it or just say it?

1 PD: Just say it.

2 PB: Okay.

3 PD: That's fine. You've got a mental --

4 PB: Uh-huh.

5 PD: --picture of it. Okay. My feelings at this time is I know
6 who he is, he knows who I am, the game's over with, you
7 know, he's doing his U-turn and I thought, "Son of a gun, he
8 can't do a U-turn and get out of here." Anyways, he's doing
9 it and I yelled out words to the effect -- I don't know what
10 word or whatever, "Sheriff's Department, you're under
11 arrest. Stop." You know, "Stop it." The next thing I
12 know, that tan and brown Ford pickup --

13 PB: The Bronco.

14 PD: The other, is that another Bronco?

15 PB: Yeah. It was a tan and brown Bronco.

16 PD: Was that a Bronco?

17 PB: Used to be. Well --

18 PD: ----- some kind of weird Ford pickup truck.

19 PB: Yeah.

20 PD: Looks live a Chevy Blazer and it's a Ford. Anyways, I guess
21 he ~~-----~~ ^{T-Boxed That} left.

22 PB: Okay. Uh-huh.

23 PD: Okay. Um, and I'm yelling, "Hey," you know, "Sheriff's
24 Department. Under arrest." All this good stuff. And I
25 thought, "Okay, he did a U-turn, he did a stupid, he ain't
26 getting out now." That's all I, I'm on to -- outside of the
27 van.

28 PB: Uh-huh.

1 PD: Right? And I'm trying to get over to basically the driver's
2 window ^{to} and communicate further with him. Uh, I believe he
3 backed up and right here now is we're getting real fast. I
4 mean --

5 PB: Uh-huh.

6 PD: -- real fast and, and, and ~~lousy~~.

7 PB: Okay.

8 PD: He backs up and, uh, made a right turn like he's getting out
9 of the parking ^{STALL} cell area. Okay, like he's going due east.

10 PB: Right.

11 PD: And he did. He went due east, man. He floored it and --
12 now, I don't know if I had to jump out of the way or how
13 much I had to move out of the way or what. I know I'm not
14 in the way 'cause I didn't get run over. Okay? But he
15 jammed it and he's off and hits the green van that's parked
16 on the east, the east --

17 PB: Okay, what side of his truck were you on at that time? Were
18 you approaching the driver's side or were you coming around
19 --your

20 PD: I was trying to get over to the driver's side. I think I
21 was on the passenger side.

22 PB: Okay, you got out of your van --

23 PD: Right.

24 PB: Behind it or in front of it?

25 PD: (No, I went -- I went around the front of my van as he's
26 crashing into the pickup truck.)

27 PB: Trying to make his U-turn, okay?

28 PD: Trying to make his U-turn.

1 PB: Okay.

2 PD: He didn't really make, he crashed into the tan and brown.

3 Okay? And now I'm somewhere between my van, which I hope

4 wasn't wrecked at all.

5 PB: No, it looks okay.

6 PD: Okay. I'm between --

7 PB: It's the only one in the whole parking lot but it's okay.

8 PD: -- my van and his, where his car had hit, okay?

9 PB: Okay.

10 PD: The Bronco. Alright?

11 PB: Okay.

12 PD: He backed up -- and I think I pretty much stayed in that

13 area. Don't ask me how close or how far I was from him.

14 Okay? Uh, then he, he backed up from it, okay? And did

15 another, uh, did his right turn going due east, and now, uh,

16 ^{WENT}
~~with~~ due east and then hit that green van.

17 PB: Okay.

18 PD: Okay? The van was hit.

19 PB: Right, and pushed it up on the sidewalk.

20 PD: Yeah, oh, I mean --

21 PB: Okay.

22 PD: And so, uh, at this point in time -- as far as I know as

23 this is going on, I'm, "Sheriff's Department, hi. You're

24 under arrest." All this stuff.

25 PB: Is your gun out at that time yet?

26 PD: Oh, yes. Oh, yes.

27 PB: Okay.

28 PD: Uh, my shirt was open so the badge on my belt would be

1 visible, okay? Uh, I didn't have a whole lot of time, uh,
2 to give him ^{my} business card.

3 PB: Sure.

4 PD: Uh, he hit that, uh, that green van and, once again, I'm
5 trying to move over to the driver's side, okay? Uh, and I'm
6 yelling at him, "Mora, give up. This is a, you know, you're
7 under arrest. Stop." You know. He backs up, comes out of
8 there -- I'm basically right, I'm gonna say basically in
9 the, kind of the middle of that parking --

10 PB: Okay.

11 PD: --driveway.

12 PB: Between the two sides.

13 PD: Between the two sides.

14 PB: Okay.

15 PD: Okay? Where exactly, I don't know.

16 PB: Alright.

17 PD: Alright? ^{THIS IS LIKE A DREAM.} Okay. Uh, he backed up and I was right in front.
18 Basically right in front of him.

19 PB: Okay.

20 PD: Okay? 'Cause I was trying to --

21 PB: So, now you're -- I'm the green van, that's the red, or the
22 blazer, the Bronco --

23 PD: The bronco.

24 PB: And he's in front of you. Okay, so you're almost --

25 PD: Oh, wait, well, you're talking tan and brown. Yeah, and
26 he's right here.

27 PB: Okay.

28 PD: Okay?

1 PB: Okay.

2 PD: Right?

3 PB: Got it.

4 PD: And he's pointing --

5 PB: And you're facing at him. Okay.

6 PD: And I'm like this. I've got him gunned down and I said,

7 "You're under arrest. Give it up." You know, "This is it.

8 Stop" or whatever.

9 PB: Sure.

10 PD: Or words to that effect. And he looked at me like, "You're

11 history, Jack. You are gone." And he -- let's say this is

12 the visor or the dash --

13 PB: The dash?

14 PD: The dash of the Bronco -- any other day I know ^{The name of it?} my English,

15 right? He went like this. So I could just see one of his

16 little eyes and he gunned that son of a bitch. It was,

17 like, I'm history. I'm gone.

18 PB: Yeah.

19 PD: I, uh, I fired one round into the, aimed at the bottom of

20 the windshield. Uh, and he -- he's still coming for me and

21 I thought I was dead. You know, here's a ton of Bronco that

22 is going to kill me. It's not even a cheap little one.

23 PB: (Laughs.)

24 PD: I thought, "This is it." And, uh, as he's coming at me, I'm

25 twisting out of the way and he, he hit me in this area here.

26 PB: Okay.

27 PD: And I'm twisting around. I fired another round through the

28 door.

1 PB: Okay. And then what happened?

2 PD: And it happened real fast.

3 PB: Yeah?

4 PD: Um, I don't know if I hit the ground. I don't remember

5 hitting the ground or not. Everything was going very fast.

6 This all happened very quickly. Uh, I was kind of shocked I

7 wasn't dead. I mean, I thought I was, I was seeing gurneys.

8 You know --

9 PB: Yeah.

10 PD: --hospital gurneys. ^{He,} I don't know, barrelled straight and

11 went and landed underneath that carport on the north side.

12 PB: Okay.

13 PD: Okay? Uh, I ran over there and I gunned him through the,

14 uh, the driver's window. My backup hadn't arrived yet. I

15 had radio -- oh, when he had moved, I -- did I tell you? I

16 radioed for everybody to move in on him.

17 PB: Okay.

18 PD: Did I tell you that?

19 PB: No.

20 PD: Oh, okay. I forgot that.

21 PB: That's okay.

22 PD: Um, uh, I'm still, I'm waiting for my backup to get in

23 there. He crashed into the carport, uh, I gunned him

24 through the window, and I'm yelling at him. "Mora, you're -

25 - DON'T DO IT! You, you, I, you are a dead man if you try

26 to do it again!" Because there is no doubt in ^{my} mind he is

27 trying to kill me.

28 PB: Right.

1 PD: You know. And I had a gun and he looked at me like, "You
2 son of a bitch, I'm gonna get you again." I couldn't --
3 just one of those looks. And he, the engine was running and
4 he's jamming it. Looks like he's trying to jam it into
5 reverse. Okay? Uh, I don't know if it had a column shift,
6 I think it did. He was jamming something, okay? It was
7 running but he couldn't get it into reverse, okay? And, uh,
8 uh, some, couple people came out, okay? And I yelled at
9 'em, "Call ^{the} my cops" 'cause I didn't have my portable on me.
10 Okay? I didn't have time to grab it. Um, and, uh, so they,
11 they said, "Okay, we are" or somebody said, "I did" you
12 know, all this good stuff. And now I've got a gun through
13 the driver's, uh, window and I'm only about six foot away.
14 I told him, "Get your hands ^{on your head.} ~~out here.~~ Get your hands on
15 your head, take one hand, turn off" -- I think I told him,
16 "Take your left hand, turn off that engine." Okay? Um, I
17 told him again. He kept getting that look in his eyes like
18 he's gonna run me over again. I said, "You do it, Mora.
19 You try" -- 'cause he keeps, kept looking at the controls of
20 the car. I said, "You do it and you are a dead man. I
21 guarantee it. You are gone." And then he shook his head,
22 okay, like it's, ^{up} ~~uh~~, then I, then, okay. I, I can't really
23 remember if it was, he's got his hands on his head at that
24 time. I think he did. Anyways, uh, he turned the engine
25 off with his hand. Okay? Uh, some people are coming out.
26 I'm trying to keep on eye on people in the area. I know
27 I've only got one suspect in the car but, you know, you
28 gotta kind of try to watch your back a little bit.

1 PB: You bet.

2 PD: And see what's going on. Uh, uh, I know somebody has called
3 the police. I know my backup's in route. Okay? Uh, I've
4 got him gunned, I don't think he's going anywhere, I don't
5 think he's gonna do anything again 'cause he can't get that
6 car in gear again and I asked him, I said, "Are you hit?"
7 And he shook his head. I said, "I'm going to tell you what.
8 You may take your hands" -- this is through the window --
9 "You may take your hands off your head and put them on that
10 steering wheel, okay? But don't you dare move 'em off that
11 steering wheel. That's gonna be the last thing you're gonna
12 do if you move them off that" ^{steering wheel,} -- just to relieve the pain in
13 his, if he was hit, it looked like it was a low hit
14 somewhere, possibly the abdomen. Uh, just to relieve some
15 of the pain while he's there.

16 PB: Okay.

17 PD: Um, 'cause if he's bleeding, I don't want him stressing out.
18 You know --

19 PB: Sure.

20 PD: Whatever I can do.

21 PB: Sure.

22 PD: But not too much 'cause I don't trust him a bit.

23 PB: Yeah, okay. Then what happened?

24 PD: Um, I can't -- okay, uh -- Dave ^{WAVEHAM} Whereham, Stevie Adams
25 showed up. We got him out of the car --

26 PB: Okay.

27 PD: They got him out of the car. I just covered him through the
28 windshield.

1 PB: Which way did he go out? The passenger?
2 PD: The driver's.
3 PB: The driver's door?
4 PD: Took him out the driver's door. Um, they very nicely layed
5 him on the ground. They were very good with him. They did
6 a real good job. Um, still handcuffed him and then made
7 sure he didn't have any weapons on him.
8 PB: Okay.
9 PD: And then they, uh, they did first aid to him. Uh, ^{Minow}Minow
10 showed -- I'm not saying his name right.
11 PB: Minow or?
12 PD: Or Menow. Menow.
13 PB: ^{Minow}Menow. Okay.
14 PD: I always call him Minow. (Laughs.) Okay, ^{Minow}Menow had shown
15 up. Uh, I told him, "Get witnesses. Anybody that heard or
16 saw anything. Get them, try to get statements." Uh, ^{Grey}Rich
17 ^{Seba}Ceva showed up. David Brantley showed up. It was, those
18 guys were pretty well organized between themselves. Uh,
19 from there on out, as far as what order of people showing
20 up, I can't really tell 'ya. I do know, uh, the, uh,
21 suspect was stabilized. Uh, I told somebody to get some
22 fire, or streamers up around the whole area.
23 PB: Uh-huh.
24 PD: Uh, oh, I made sure somewhere in there that on the radio,
25 had 'em, uh, advise 'em of the situation that we had the
26 suspect injured, no officers injured, keep the ambulance
27 coming, Code 3. Well, I think I told, uh, I think I told
28 Adams when he pulled up, "Get an ambulance."

1 PB: Okay.

2 PD: And I think he did that before we got him out of the car
3 'cause he wasn't moving his hands.

4 PB: Yeah.

5 PD: Might as well get the, make sure the --

6 PB: Get everything going.

7 PD: Make sure the -- I also told, earlier than that, before they
8 showed up, I had yelled at the citizens in the area, you
9 know, "Get an ambulance." You know, "Call the police, get
10 an amb --." You know, I just did it a couple of times. Uh,
11 I even had one of 'em go to my van to get the portable out
12 of it 'cause people, for me, they weren't showing up fast
13 enough.

14 PB: Oh, yeah. Forever.

15 PD: You know what I'm saying? So --

16 PB: It took forever, yeah.

17 PD: Um, we were doing that. Uh, everything was pretty well
18 stabilized, uh, the Fire Department had shown up. I had,
19 some point in time, I went and used this one gal's phone to
20 call the watch commander and just tell ^{her} him what's going on.
21 And then I came out and ~~STAYED WITH BRUCE AFTER THAT~~ stayed
22 where he is.

23 PB: Okay. When you first got out of the van and you, obviously,
24 he, you had your six frank subject there you needed to
25 arrest, you were wearing what you're wearing, had your gun
26 out, your badge on your belt loop.

27 PD: Right.

28 PB: Okay.

1 PD: My shirt, which would normally cover my badge, gun, and
2 everything --
3 PB: Uh-huh.
4 PD: -- but I had it open.
5 PB: Okay. Yeah, I've seen you work before.
6 PD: Yeah.
7 PB: Uh, when you shot the first time in the center, when he's
8 coming at you, can you flash it back in your mind, kind of
9 roll it back, how far or close, whatever, ~~ADJECTIVE YOU~~ ^{WHAT TO USE} would
10 you say he was when you put that one in the windshield?
11 Best guess. I realize everything is probably -- or you may
12 even slow it down in your mind and see it in slow motion.
13 That's what I did --
14 PD: Well --
15 PB: --right before I wrecked my car. I watched my hood roll up.
16 Best guess.
17 PD: To the best of my memory -- this is hard. I know he's --
18 the Bronco is moving towards me and I'm in the way and he's
19 got that look in his eyes, "You are history, sucker."
20 PB: Did it look like he was aiming at you?
21 PD: Fuckin' A! There's no fucking doubt in my mind! He wanna -
22 YOU'RE GONE! That's the look on his face! He could have
23 driven around me! There was, there's room in that thing to
24 go, he's already gone over the curbs and everything! I'm
25 history. I mean -- I'm just a little, another curb to him.
26 PB: Another fly on the hood, huh?
27 PD: Yeah. He's got that look on his face and I'm gonna say,
28 hey, I'm gonna say -- God, you know, I hope I'm not wrong.

1 I wanna say six, ten feet maybe.

2 PB: Okay.

3 PD: But he's moving at me.

4 PB: Sure.

5 PD: Yeah.

6 PB: Okay. Yeah, you were the only one there. I don't -- I
7 don't know.

8 PD: I, no, I --

9 PB: Best guess.

10 PD: I can't tell you.

11 PB: Yeah.

12 PD: I'm gonna just put it this way. Too close for comfort.

13 PB: Yeah. It's just like, remember when we describe people in
14 robberies. "What did the gun look like?" "Well, the barrel
15 was this big."

16 PD: "It was like this big."

17 PB: Yes. Same thing. I, I understand. Okay, and then when he
18 clipped you and you were spinning or maybe going down and
19 you fired the second time, how close would you say were to
20 the side of his, his truck?

21 PD: Right next to him.

22 PB: Foot, two feet? Less?

23 PD: I thought I touched the door --

24 PB: That's your part of it.

25 PD: -- with the gun barrel. I thought. It, it could have been
26 a foot but everything was reflex and instinct.

27 PB: Uh-huh.

28 PD: Uh, somebody was trying to kill me. I'm gu -- I have to do

1 what I have to do to protect myself. And, uh --

2 PB: You realize the resale value of that truck has gone way

3 down.

4 PD: Yes, I know that. Uh, it could have, it could have even

5 been a foot-and-a-half. I don't know.

6 PB: Yeah.

7 PD: It, it could have been that much. Uh, all I know is he's

8 gunned it, he's up to me, and I'm, I'm thinking I'm not

9 getting out of the way of this in time. And I remember the

10 left front of his vehicle coming up in here and me trying to

11 do the best spin of my life to spin out of it. And I'm

12 spinning out of it and at the end, uh, I mean, this is

13 happening real fast. This is not, you know, slow, you know,

14 as, as I'm, at the end of the spin, I fired another one

15 through the door.

16 PB: Okay. So it was all almost kind of like, uh, simultaneous.

13 PD: You know. But it didn't.

16 to the hospital, you're okay.

17 PD: Yeah.

18 PB: You look okay. You gave a blood --

19 PD: Gave a blood.

20 PB: Okay. Was any coercion or threats or promises made at, at

21 any time?

22 PD: No, no.

7 sitting there. I assume the other one is in, in him

10 PB: Uh, did he say anything? Okay, when you guys got him out,
11 uh, did he say anything? Did he make any spontaneous
12 statements or anything that you can think of?
13 PD: None that I heard.
14 PB: Okay.
15 PD: Uh, you know, like I, I said. He sounded like a real nice,
16 I mean, looked like a nice guy. You know, looks aren't
17 everything, right?
18 PB: Uh-huh.
19 PD: Okay. Uh, but when this all started happening, you know, I
20 thought I was dealing with Al Capone. Mr. Con. You know,
21 he just, he had that bearing about him. These are the cops,
22 fuck them. They're not doing me. You know? I, nobody's
23 taking me alive.
24 PB: Yeah, he crossed the line from being a rabbit to a --
25 PD: He was just -- I knew what he was gonna do and he tried to
26 do it, you know? And I was, you know, that's the way the
27 situation, it happened so quickly. It's like, you know, how
28 do you prepare for that? Boom, boom, boom.

1 PB: That's what training's for and hopefully your reflexes work
2 at work. Um, you ~~said~~ ^{should know} no, that, uh, it's in reverse, the
3 reverse lights are on underneath the carport.

4 PD: Walter Kidding.

5 PB: It's in reverse but I, he probably snapped something --
6 well, he may have broken something. Looked like he got it
7 out about nine inches and then whatever, for, maybe he
8 decided that it was time to get out.

9 PD: The look on his face was like, "I'll throw this puppy in
10 reverse and run you over backwards."

11 PB: Yeah, 'cause the lights -- in fact, when I came here, the
12 lights, the reverse lights were still on and it's in
13 reverse.

14 PD: (Mumbles.)

15 PB: Some -- we have, it may, from jumping curb. I mean, he had
16 to destroy the undercarriage. It flattened all those tires
17 and stuff. So, uh -- well, I'm gonna enter, end this
18 interview unless there's anything else that you think I need
19 to go, know as a criminal investigator?

20 PD: No, I can't really think of anything right now.

21 PB: Okay.

22 PD: It's just, uh, when he was coming at me, I thought I wasn't
23 going home. I thought about my wife and my kids.

24 PB: No doubt. Okay. It's 1635 in the afternoon and I'm gonna
25 terminate the interview.

ONCE WE ARRIVED, I NOTICED THE AREA WITHIN THE COMPLEX HAD BEEN CORDONED OFF BY YELLOW CRIME SCENE TAPE. LT. GEORGE CONAHEY, SGT. RAY NAGEL, SGT. MARTY ROUSE, AND B.I. OFFICER JUNE SEERY WERE PRESENT ALONG WITH OTHER PATROL OFFICERS WHO HAD BEEN ASSIGNED TO PROTECT THE CRIME SCENE AND TAKE STATEMENTS. (REFER TO THEIR REPORTS)

SGT. MARTY ROUSE BRIEFED LT. INGLIS, DET. SGT. BUCKLEY AND I ON WHAT HAD HAPPENED. HE TOLD US THE FOLLOWING.

SGT. ROUSE SAID THAT DET. PAT DAIN HAD BEEN INVESTIGATING THE CASE OF A STOLEN FORD BRONCO FROM A LOCAL DEALERSHIP. SGT. ROUSE SAID AN INFORMANT HAD CALLED IN AND GIVEN THE NAME OF THE SUSPECT AS SHAWN MORA WHO WAS EITHER LIVING AT OR STAYING AT THIS CONDOMINIUM COMPLEX.

SGT. ROUSE TOLD US THAT DET. DAIN HAD SAID HE HAD BEEN STAKED OUT BEHIND A TRASH DUMPSTER IN THE CARPORT AREA OF THE CONDOMINIUM COMPLEX, AND THAT ANOTHER INVESTIGATOR FROM THE SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT DETAIL WAS AT ANOTHER LOCATION. (NOTE: THE INVESTIGATOR TURNED OUT TO BE DEP. WAREHAM)

ACCORDING TO SGT. ROUSE, DET. PAT DAIN SAID HE KNEW WHERE THE SUSPECT WAS STAYING IN THE COMPLEX AND HAD WANTED TO GET THE SUSPECT OUT OF HIS HOUSE AS A PLOY SO THAT AN ARREST COULD BE MADE FOR 10851 C.V.C. DET. DAIN WAS ABLE TO DO THIS BY HAVING THE MANAGER OF THE COMPLEX GET HOLD OF THE SUSPECT.

SGT. ROUSE SAID AFTER DET. DAIN SAW SUSPECT SHAWN MORA GET INTO THE STOLEN BLACK FORD BRONCO, DET. PAT DAIN BEGAN TO FOLLOW THE VEHICLE ALONG THE DRIVEWAY OF THE CARPORT AREA. DET. DAIN FOLLOWED THE BLACK FORD BRONCO TO THE DEAD END OF OAK PARK LANE IN A PLAIN WHITE SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT VAN AND ATTEMPTED TO BOX THE VEHICLE IN SO THAT SUSPECT MORA COULD NOT FLEE THE SCENE.

HOWEVER, SUSPECT MORA ACCELERATED THE STOLEN BLACK FORD BRONCO AND WAS ABLE TO MAKE A U-TURN THROUGH A PARKING STALL. DET. PAT DAIN, WHO HAD GOTTEN OUT OF HIS WHITE VAN RAN TOWARDS THE SUSPECT VEHICLE, IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS A POLICE OFFICER AND ORDERED SUSPECT

MORA TO FREEZE. INSTEAD OF OBEYING DET. DAIN'S LAWFUL ORDER, SUSPECT MORA DROVE TOWARDS DET. DAIN. SGT. ROUSE SAID DET. DAIN TOLD HIM HE THOUGHT THE DRIVER OF THE SUSPECT VEHICLE WAS GOING TO RUN HIM DOWN SO HE ENDED UP FIRING OFF A TOTAL OF 2 ROUNDS AT THE SUSPECT VEHICLE. SGT. ROUSE TOLD US THAT AT ONE POINT WHILE DET. DAIN WAS ATTEMPTING TO STOP THE BLACK FORD BRONCO, THE BRONCO RAN INTO THE SIDE OF HIS LEG.

SGT. ROUSE SAID THAT DET. PAT DAIN ENDED UP APPREHENDING SUSPECT MORA AFTER HE CRASHED THE STOLEN VEHICLE INTO A CARPORT BEAM.

DURING THE BRIEFING GIVEN BY SGT. MARTY ROUSE, HE POINTED OUT TO DET. PAT BUCKLEY AND I WHERE THE SUSPECT HAD DRIVEN HIS VEHICLE INTO SEVERAL OTHER VEHICLES WITHIN THE PARKING AREA OF THE CONDOMINIUM COMPLEX. DURING THE INCIDENT, SUSPECT MORA ENDED UP CLIPPING A SUPPORTING BEAM UNDER SPACE NUMBER 133 AND 134 AND RAN INTO ANOTHER FORD BRONCO (LIC. [REDACTED]) WHICH HAD BEEN PARKED UNDER CARPORT SPACE NUMBER 131. WHEN MORA DROVE THE BLACK FORD BRONCO INTO THE WHITE AND BROWN FORD BRONCO IT STRUCK A BLACK MARK IV FORD CONTINENTAL (LIC. [REDACTED]) WHICH WAS PARKED IN SPACE NUMBER 130. SUSPECT MORA ALSO DROVE ACROSS THE CARPORT AND RAN INTO THE BACK OF A GREEN VAN (LIC. SGT. ROUSE TOLD US THAT HE BELIEVED DET. PAT DAIN WAS TAKEN TO LOS ROBLES HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT.

SGT. MARTY ROUSE POINTED OUT WHERE TWO .45 CALIBRE SHELL CASINGS HAD BEEN FOUND. ONE SHELL CASING WAS FOUND IN THE AREA JUST EAST OF CARPORT NUMBER 129 AND 130 AND ANOTHER .45 CALIBRE SHELL CASING WAS FOUND JUST WEST OF CARPORT SPACE NUMBER 144.
