On Monday April 7, 1997, at approx. 2145 Hours, I contacted (R-P) [REDACTED] at the above residence, and she told me the following: (R-P) [REDACTED] has been taking care of her brother, (V-1) Huynh, for the past seven (7) years due to his 'partially' schizophrenic mental condition. ((V-1) Huynh sometimes hears voices and needs to take his medication, Zyprexa). On 4-2-97, at approx. 0400 Hours, (V-1) Huynh drove (R-P) [REDACTED] vehicle (1991 Toyota Camry) to Texas without (R-P) [REDACTED] knowledge. On 4-2-97, at approx. 2330 Hours, (R-P) Hai was notified, by a Texas Police Dept. (unknown dept.name), that they found (V-1) Huynh but had no reason to detain him. (R-P) [REDACTED] called the Sheriff's Dept. and had (V-1) Huynh entered into the system.

On 4-3-97, at approx. 0700 Hours, (R-P) [REDACTED] husband, [REDACTED] flew to El Paso, Texas in an attempt to find (V-1) Huynh. [REDACTED] could not locate (V-1) Huynh and flew home later that night. On 4-6-97, at approx. 2100 Hours, Tucson P.D. (Arizona) called (R-P) [REDACTED] and advised her (V-1) Huynh was found sleeping in his vehicle, in front of a 'cafe', for the past two (2) days. On 4-7-97, at approx. 0730 Hours, [REDACTED] flew to Tucson, Arizona, picked up (V-1) Huynh and drove back to Camarillo. (R-P) [REDACTED] called the Sheriff's Dept..

**OBJECTIVE:** Determine if the bullets were fired from the submitted pistols. Determine if the discharged cartridge cases were fired in the submitted pistols. Determine if the submitted pistols are in normal working condition.

**RESULTS:**

The following is a summary of the analytic findings:

The two pistols, #6 and 7, were examined and test fired. The pistols were found to be in normal operating condition. Though failure to eject when firing #6 into the vertical water tank was experienced no failures to eject were experienced when the pistol was given a proper platform during horizontal fire, the magazine of #25 was used in this testing.

The bullet, #21, was fired from the 45 Auto Caliber Sig Sauer P220 Pistol, #6. The bullet fragments, #19 and 24, could have been fired from the 45 Auto Caliber Sig Sauer P220 Pistol, #6, and could not have been fired from the 9mm Caliber Sig Sauer P226 Pistol, #7.

The bullets, #20, 22 and 23, were fired from the 9mm Caliber Sig Sauer P226 Pistol, #7.

The discharged 9mm caliber cartridge cases, #8 through 15, were fired in the 9mm Caliber Sig Sauer P226 Pistol, #7.

The discharged 45 Auto caliber cartridge cases, #16 through 18, were fired in the 45 Auto Caliber Sig Sauer P220 Pistol, #6.

White fibers were observed on several cartridge cases and bullets. Because the white fibers were similar in appearance and observed on both bullets identified as removed at autopsy and items identified as from the scene of the incident a possible source could be cotton packing known to be in the type boxes used as delivered from the supplier.

6. EXIT WOUNDS WERE NOTED. TWO EXIT WOUNDS IN THE LEFT FOREARM, TWO IN THE LEFT CHEST AREA, ONE IN THE LEFT HIP AND ONE IN THE NOSE. 5 BULLETS REMAINED IN THE BODY AND WERE REMOVED AT AUTOPSY. TWO BULLETS WERE RECOVERED FROM THE LEFT LEG, ONE FROM THE UPPER LEFT BACK/SHOULDER, ONE FROM THE LEFT FOREARM AND ONE FROM THE UPPER LEFT CHEST NEAR THE ARM PIT.

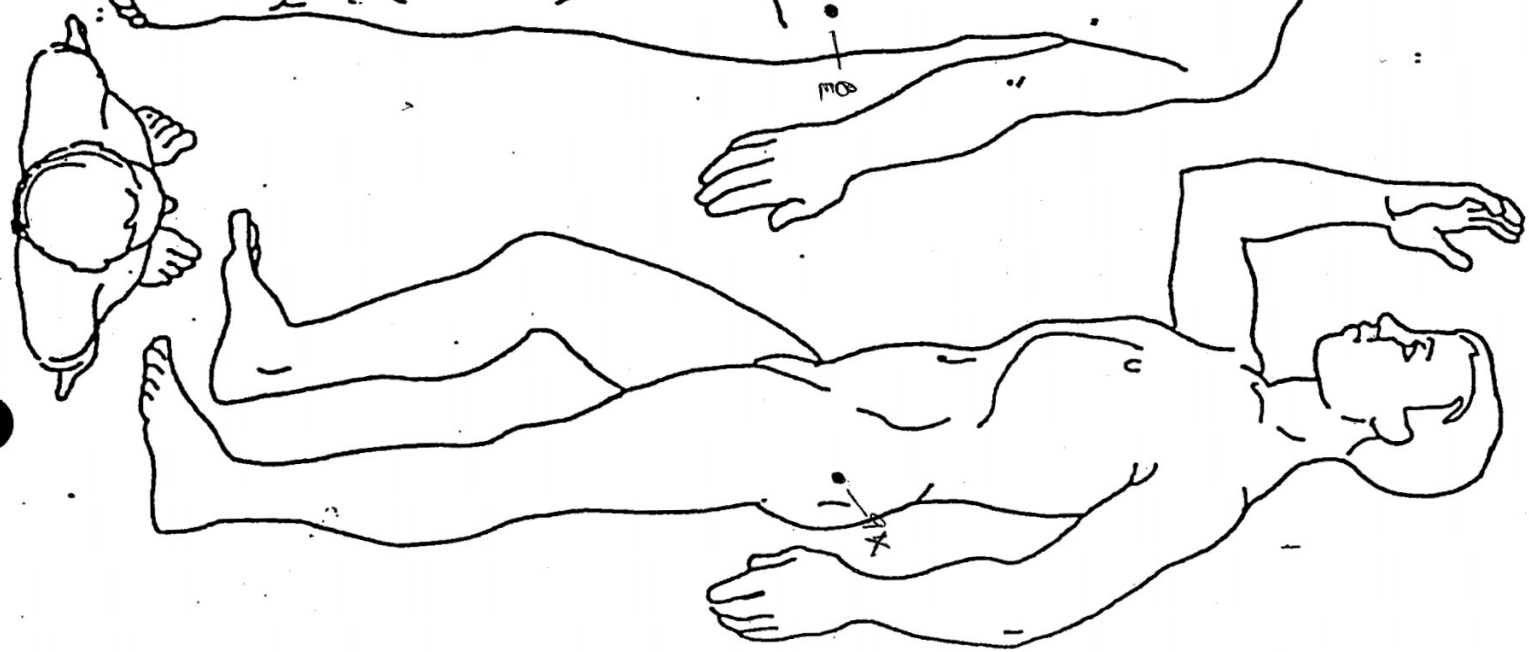
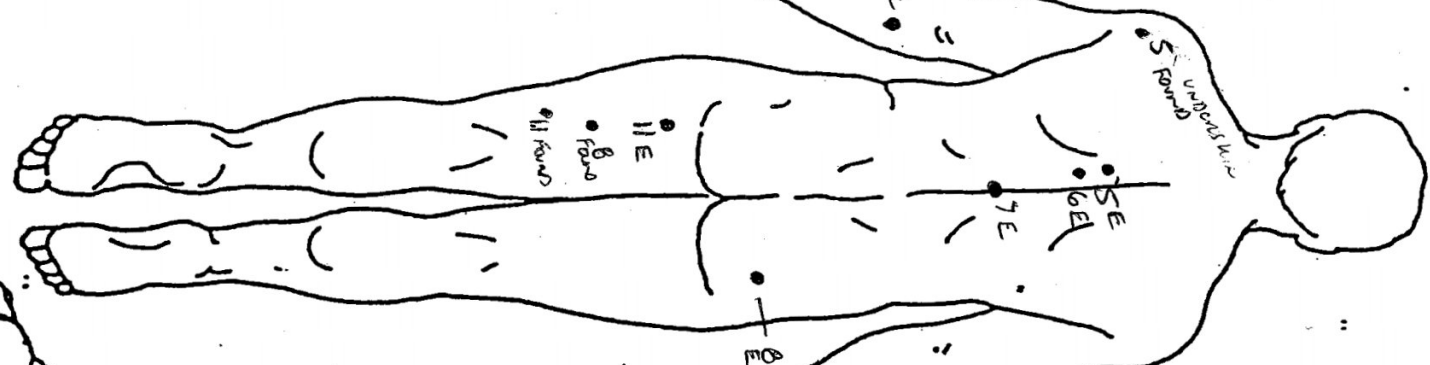
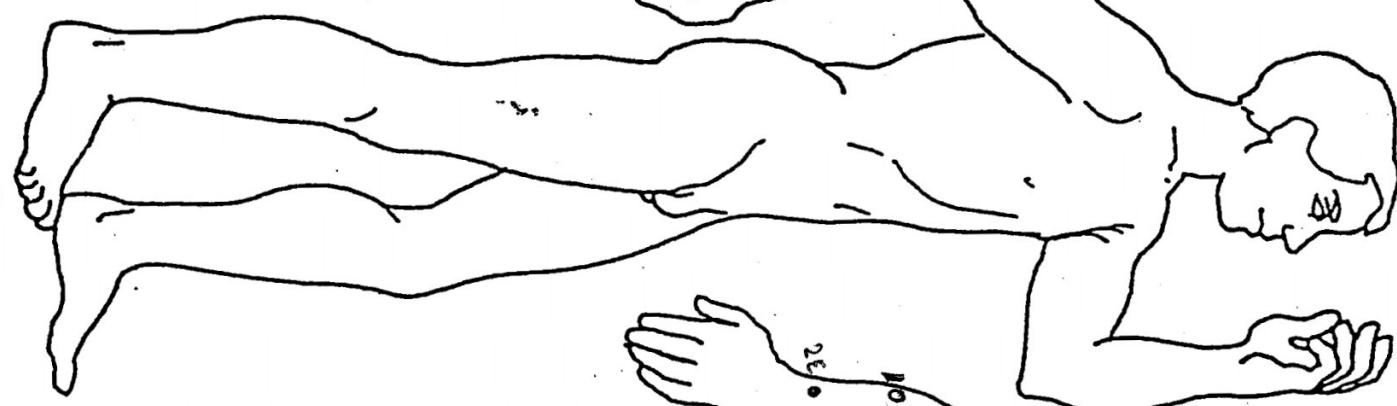
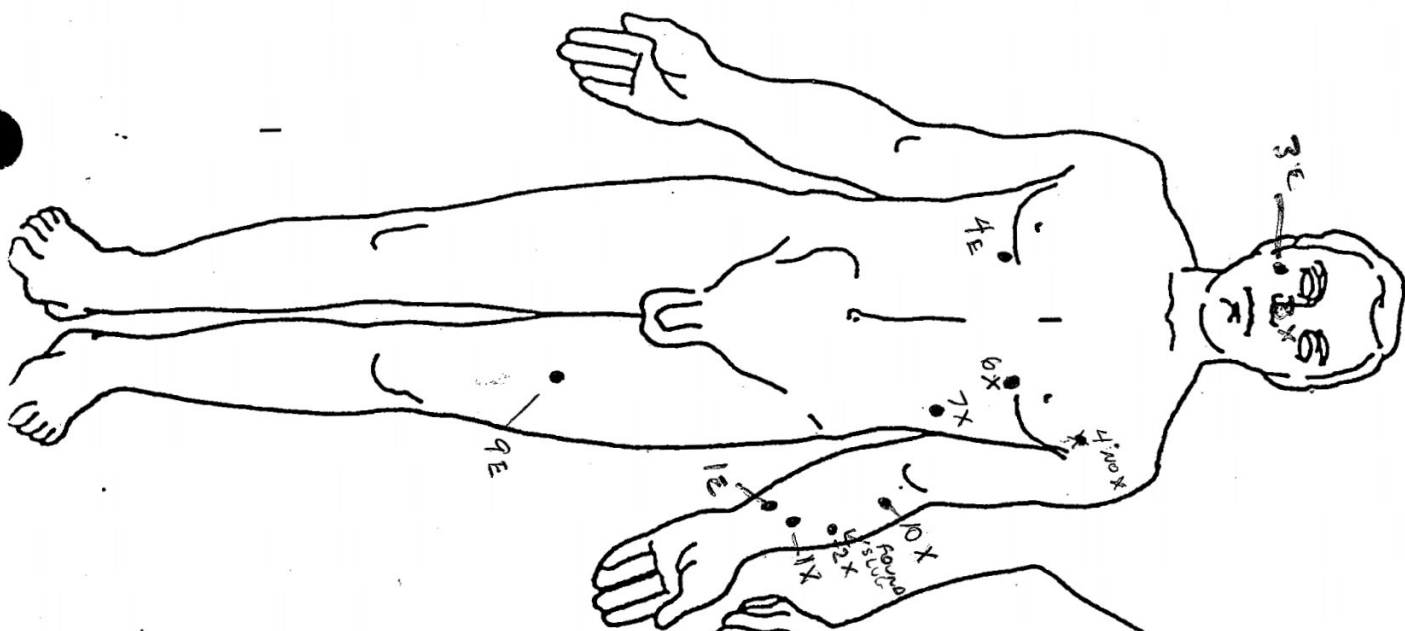

SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION

On 9-22-98 at approximately 2045 hours I was contacted by Capt. Diaz of the Ventura County Sheriff's Office. He reported the death of Han Huynh, age 29. As the death was the result of a deputy involved shooting I responded to the scene.

Upon arrival at the scene I was contacted by Commander Montijo. Also present were members of the Ventura Co. Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Division and other numerous sheriff personnel. I received information from several of the Major Crimes Personnel.

A neighbor in the area had called the sheriff's department and reported a suspicious person. A sheriff's unit containing two deputies had responded to the scene. Upon arrival at the scene at approximately 1808 hours the decedent was located and the decedent withdrew a knife from his clothing and confronted the officers. The decedent was shot numerous times by the sheriffs deputies.

An ambulance from American Medical Response was called to the scene and the decedent was pronounced dead by Paramedic on 9-22-98 at approximately 1830 hours.

The location of the incident was on a lawn in front of in Thousand Oaks.  
The scene is described as a middle class neighborhood

The sheriff deputies involved in the shooting had not made a statement pending a meeting with an attorney of their selection which is standard procedure.

I was directed to the aforementioned lawn. The decedent was in a supine position with his hands handcuffed behind his back.. His legs were extended.

He had long black hair and a black mustache. The decedent's eyes were brown and the pupils of the eyes were fixed and equally dilated. The body was warm to the touch. Blanching lividity was present and consistent with the position of the body. Rigor mortis was present in the jaw only.

The decedent was dressed in a white pull over shirt with black stripes, brown pants, white socks, and black athletic shoes. Jewelry present consisted of a citizen wrist watch with a black leather band.

In the decedent's clothing was a black comb, blue lighter, a white metal safety pin, and \$5.39 in cash. The decedent's personal property and the watch was taken into the custody of the coroner's office. For a complete description of the property see the property inventory in the decedent's file. Near the decedent was a partial pack of Marlboro cigarettes and a knife. These items were taken into the custody of the sheriff's office.

No prescription or illicit drugs or narcotics were found in the decedent's clothing.

Trauma noted consisted of multiple gun shot wounds. These wounds were not examined at the scene. For a complete description of the body see autopsy protocol # 1800-98.

The body was placed on in a blue body bag on a sheet. The body bag was secured with seal number 016633 at 2250 hours. The body was transported to the medical examiner's office by Cathedral Mortuary Associates.

Near the decedent in a cloth bag was a black suit coat, a white shirt with black stripes, and some brown dress shoes. The clothing was taken into the custody of the sheriff's office.

While at the scene I was given a copy of a missing persons report by sheriff personnel. The decedent had been reported missing by his sister, [REDACTED]. He had resided with his sister, mother, and other family members at [REDACTED]. It was noted on the report that the decedent was mentally unstable and had left the residence without his medications. The decedent had a history of leaving the residence without notice in the past and missing persons reports had been filed on the decedent in the past. The missing persons report matched the decedent.

After leaving the scene I responded to the decedent's residence and notified the family of the death and the circumstances of the death. Present with me at the residence was Deputy Edwards and two other deputies. Deputy Edwards had taken the recent missing person file on the decedent and was familiar with the family. The family identified the decedent by looking at his watch and glasses and from the description of the clothing that the decedent was wearing and the clothing that was found in the bag near the decedent.

The decedent's sister related that the decedent had left without notice in the past and when he left he would normally take a small knife with him to cut up fruit and other food items that he would purchase at various grocery stores. They related the decedent did not have a history of violence or past alcohol, drug, or narcotic abuse.

I asked the family for the prescribed medications the decedent had in the residence and was given a container of Lithonate, and Depakote. The medications did not appear to have been abused. The medications were taken into the custody of the coroner's office. For a complete description of the medications see the medication inventory in the decedent's file. The medications were destroyed on the morning of 9-23-98. The sheriff's office later received other medications from the family which were Seroquel, Clonazepam, other containers of Lithonate, and Depakote.

On 9-23-98 I contacted Pat [REDACTED] M.H.A. of the Ventura Co. Mental Health Department. The decedent had been in treatment since 8-27-91 and had last been seen on 9-18-98. The primary diagnosis was a Schizo affective bi polar disorder. She was aware of the decedent leaving his residence in the past without notifying his family. She stated the decedent spoke limited English and to her knowledge did not have a history of violence but did have mood swings.

**IDENTIFICATION:**

The body is received in a blue vinyl pouch, with a medical examiner's tag attached to the zipper and inscribed with the name John Doe. The pouch is locked with seal No. 016633. The body is additionally partially wrapped in a blood stained white sheet. The pouch is opened at 0800 hours for the purpose of obtaining x-rays.

**CLOTHING:**

The following items are on the body:

1. A V-neck white sweater with black and red striped trim is on the upper body. There is heavy blood staining on the back of the sweater and the left front of the sweater. A roughly round hole in the right front of the sweater measures 1.0 cm and can be superimposed over a wound of the chest which will be described later. An additional ragged hole in the left front of the sweater measures approximately 1.0 X 0.7 cm and can be roughly superimposed on a second wound on the anterior chest. Two roughly round holes are in the back of the sweater at the level of the uppermost stripe and each measures approximately 1.0 cm in diameter. An additional hole is in the right back of the sweater in the mid portion of a wide area of striping and measures 1.0 cm in diameter. A large roughly round hole in the lower portion of the sweater to the left of midline measures approximately 3.0 cm in diameter.

- An additional roughly round hole in the left front of sweater in the area of the broad colored band measures approximately 1.0 cm in diameter.
2. Brown pants are in place about the waist and are buttoned in front. The zipper is partially unfastened. A dark brown leather-type belt is threaded through the belt loops and is buckled. A roughly round defect in the left leg of the pants in the area of the mid thigh measures approximately 0.6 cm in diameter. An irregular ragged tear in the left knee of the pants measures 8.0 cm in length by 2.5 cm in width. An additional small tear in the left knee of the pants is 2.0 X 1.0 cm. There is heavy blood staining on the left side of the pants, the back of the pants, and the mid lower portion of the right leg of the pants. A ragged hole in the left lower buttock area of the back of the pants measures approximately 0.6 cm in diameter. A round hole is over the right hip pocket of the pants and measures 0.5 cm in diameter. There is a small amount of gray residue at the margin of the hole. An oval defect at the left back of the pants is just below the waistband and approximately 2.5 cm posterior to the side seam of the pants and measures 0.4 by approximately 1.0 cm in diameter. One dollar in change is in the right front pocket and two pennies are lying on the sheet underneath the body.
  3. Patterned Boxer underbriefs. The Boxer shorts are backwards on the body. A roughly round hole in the right side of the shorts just behind the side seam measures approximately 0.5 X 1.0 cm in maximum diameter and corresponds roughly in position to a wound of the left leg which is to be described. A second round hole in the Boxer shorts is in the left front and measures 0.6 cm in diameter. It is surrounded by a small amount of blood staining.
  4. White Jockey-type underbriefs. The underbriefs are on the body inside out. An oval defect in the left lateral front of the briefs measures approximately 1.0 cm in maximum diameter. The fabric of the briefs is heavily saturated with blood in this area. A second defect is in the right buttock of the briefs and measures 1.0 cm in diameter. There is a small amount of blood staining around this hole.
  5. Black suede low topped shoes with white laces
  6. White sport type socks
  7. A handcuff is about the right wrist and the other end of the handcuff is attached to the back of the belt.

EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL THERAPY:

EKG monitor pads are on the right and left upper anterior chest.

**EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:**

The body is that of a well-developed, well-nourished Asian male who appears consistent with the listed age of 29 years. The length is 65 inches and the weight is 135 pounds. The body has not been embalmed and is well preserved. Rigidity is moderately well developed in the extremities and lividity is faint and posterior. The body has been refrigerated and is cold to the touch.

The scalp is covered by straight dark brown-black hair which measures up to 10 inches in length. The corneas are clear and the irides are brown. There are right lower palpebral conjunctival petechial hemorrhages but none in the left eye. There is minimal conjunctival congestion. The nose contains coagulated blood. The lips are intact and the teeth are natural and in an extremely poor state of repair, with black discoloration of the right upper central and lateral incisor. The left central incisor is missing. There is a small amount of blood in the mouth. A 1.0 cm black moustache and sparse goatee-type beard are in place. The remainder of the beard area is clean shaven. The ears are normally formed. The neck is straight and symmetrical and the trachea is midline.

The chest is symmetrical and the breasts are those of a normal adult male. The abdomen is flat, without palpable organomegaly. The genitals are those of a normal uncircumcised adult male, with the testicles bilaterally descended into the scrotum.

The arms and hands are normally formed. The nailbeds are slightly cyanotic and the fingernails extend up to 0.2 cm beyond the fingertips. There is a small amount of soil beneath many of the fingernails. There are no needle tracks or needle marks. There are no tattoos. The legs are normally formed, without edema. The feet and toenails are unremarkable. There is some callus formation on the plantar surfaces of the feet, with some scaling. There is prominence of the right tarsometatarsal joint just above the instep of the right foot. Two tan nodules are on the dorsal surface of the right foot and measure 0.5 cm in diameter.

The back is straight and symmetrical and the anus is without injury.

**EVIDENCE OF INJURY:****GUNSHOT WOUND #1, LEFT FOREARM:**

Entrance - Labelled "A" on the diagram, on the left anterior forearm 3 inches proximal to the wrist, is a round 0.6 cm in diameter gunshot entrance wound surrounded by a symmetrical margin of abrasion which measures approximately 0.2 cm in width. There is no gunpowder residue on the skin around this wound.

**Path** - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues the bullet travels upward through the left forearm, producing comminuted fractures of both the left radius and ulna and perforating muscle.

**Exit** - Labelled "S" on the diagram, on the left posterior forearm approximately 3 inches proximal to the wrist, is a slit-like gunshot exit wound which measures 1.0 cm in length.

**Direction of Fire** - The bullet passes from front to back.

**GUNSHOT WOUND #2, LEFT FOREARM:**

**Entrance** - Labelled "C" on the diagram, on the left anterior forearm 3 1/2 inches proximal to the wrist, is a slightly irregular gunshot entrance wound which measures 1.0 cm in maximum diameter. It is surrounded by asymmetric marginal abrasion which is maximal medially and reaches a width of 0.2 cm. There is a small amount of contusion around the wound.

**Path** - After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the left forearm, the bullet produces a comminuted fracture of the left radius and ulna. Associated with the wound is a laceration on the posterior left forearm through which fractured bone protrudes. The laceration measures 3.5 cm in length.

**Exit** - Labelled "D" on the diagram, on the upper left anterior forearm, is a slit-like partial exit wound which measures 1.5 cm in length.

**Bullet** - A severely deformed, flattened, partially jacketed bullet is recovered from the wound.

**Direction of Fire** - With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from right to left and upward.

**GUNSHOT WOUND #3, FACE:**

**Entrance** - Labelled "E" on the diagram, on the right cheek just below the zygomatic arch, centered 6 inches from the top of the head and 4 inches to the right of anterior midline, is an ovoid tangential gunshot entrance wound which measures 0.5 cm in diameter. Marginal abrasion on the lateral aspect of the wound measures 1.0 X 1.0 cm in its maximum dimensions and exhibits slight drying of the edges of the abrasion.

**Path** - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the face, the bullet traverses a 1 1/2 inch subcutaneous course and then emerges in the right cheek approximately 3/4 inch from the right side of the nose. It then continues across the face, producing tangential laceration of the remainder of the cheek and crosses the nose where it ultimately leaves the body on the left

side of the nasal tip. Associated with this wound is fracture of the nasal cartilage.

Exit - Labelled "F" on the diagram, on the left side of the nose, is an irregular lacerated wound produced by the exiting bullet.

Direction of Fire - Right to left and slightly back to front, without significant vertical deviation

#### GUNSHOT WOUND #4, RIGHT CHEST:

Entrance - Labelled "G" on the diagram, on the right anterior chest, centered 9 1/2 inches from the top of the head and 2 3/4 inches to the right of anterior midline, is a diagonally oriented, ovoid gunshot entrance wound which measures 1.5 X 1.0 cm in its maximum dimensions. Marginal abrasion at the 7-8 o'clock position on the wound is 0.5 cm in width.

Path - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues, the bullet travels across the anterior chest outside the rib cage and produces comminuted fractures of left and right costal cartilages and sternum.

Exit - None

Bullet - A deformed large caliber bullet is recovered from soft tissues in the area of the left anterior axillary fold. The position of this bullet is labelled "R" on the diagram.

Direction of Fire - The bullet passes from right to left, slightly front to back, and upward at an angle of approximately 45-60°.

#### GUNSHOT WOUND #5, LEFT UPPER BACK:

Entrance - Labelled "H" on the diagram, on the left upper back, just below the free edge of the scapula, centered 14 inches from the top of the head and 1 3/4 inches to the left of posterior midline, is a diagonally oriented gunshot entrance wound which measures 0.6 cm in diameter. Marginal abrasion at the 4-5 o'clock position measures 0.3 cm in width. There is a small amount of subcutaneous hemorrhage surrounding this wound.

Path - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues, the bullet travels upward and to the left across the scapula where it produces a fracture of the posterior aspect of the acromion.

Exit - None

Bullet - A deformed bullet is recovered from soft tissues in the posterior left shoulder approximately 2 inches from the top of the shoulder and 8 inches to the left of posterior midline. The skin



over the palpable bullet is slightly contused with a 0.5 cm superficial laceration. The location of this bullet is labelled "I" on the diagram.

Direction of Fire - Right to left and upward

**GUNSHOT WOUND #6, LEFT MID BACK**

**Entrance** - Labelled "J" on the diagram, on the left mid back, centered 16 inches from the top of the head and 1 inch to the left of posterior midline, is a round 0.7 cm in diameter gunshot entrance wound which is surrounded by symmetric marginal abrasion measuring 0.2 cm in width.

**Path** - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the left back, the bullet enters the left thoracic cavity through the 7th intercostal space adjacent to the spine, perforates the left lower lobe of the lung, passes through the lung hilum, enters the left lateral pericardial cavity, and produces a perforating wound of the left atrium and right ventricle of the heart. It then perforates the anterior pericardium and exits the chest cavity, producing comminuted fractures of the anterior second and third ribs and costal cartilages. The bullet exits the body as described below. Associated with this injury is approximately 1300 cc of blood within the left pleural cavity.

**Exit** - Labelled "Q" on the diagram, on the left anterior chest slightly below the level of the nipple, centered 18 1/2 inches from the top of the head and 1 inch to the left of anterior midline is an irregular 1.5 cm in diameter gunshot exit wound.

Direction of Fire - The bullet passes from back to front, slightly left to right, and slightly downward.

**GUNSHOT WOUND #7, RIGHT POSTERIOR CHEST:**

**Entrance** - Labelled "K" on the diagram, in the right posterior lower thorax, 20 1/2 inches from the top of the head and 1/2 inch to the right of posterior midline, is a slightly tangential 0.8 cm in diameter gunshot entrance wound which exhibits marginal abrasion from the 1-3 o'clock position that measures 0.3 cm in width.

**Path** - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right back, the bullet travels toward the left, producing tiny fractures of the left 10th and 11th thoracic vertebra, and enters the left chest cavity at the level of the 10th rib. It perforates the left lower lobe of the lung and exits the thoracic cavity through the left lateral 6th intercostal space, producing a fracture of the left lateral 6th rib.

**Exit** - Labelled "P" on the diagram, on the left lateral chest, 21 inches from the top of the head and 7-8 inches to the left of

anterior midline, is an irregular 1.0 cm in diameter gunshot exit wound.

**Direction of Fire** - The bullet passes from back to front, right to left, and slightly downward.

**GUNSHOT WOUND #8, RIGHT BUTTOCK:**

**Entrance** - Labelled "N" on the diagram, on the right mid buttock, 32 1/2 inches from the top of the head and 4 1/2 inches to the right of posterior midline, is a round 0.7 cm in diameter gunshot entrance wound which exhibits asymmetrical marginal abrasion measuring 0.3 cm in width at the 11-3 o'clock position and 0.1 cm in width at the 5-10 o'clock position.

**Path** - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the buttock, the bullet passes toward the left below the bony pelvis, producing hemorrhage around the bladder. The bullet enters the soft tissues of the left lateral thigh.

**Exit** - None

**Bullet** - A deformed medium caliber bullet is recovered from muscle in the left upper lateral thigh.

**Direction of Fire** - The bullet passes slightly back to front, right to left, and downward.

**GUNSHOT WOUND #9, LEFT ANTERIOR THIGH:**

**Entrance** - Labelled "O" on the diagram, on the left mid anterior thigh, is a 0.7 cm in diameter slightly ovoid gunshot entrance wound which exhibits asymmetric marginal abrasion which is widest inferiorly.

**Path** - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the anterior thigh, the bullet travels upward and to the left through muscle and grazes the anterior hip bone, producing slight fragmentation of the bone.

**Exit** - Labelled "L" on the diagram, on the left lateral thigh, 31 inches from the top of the head and 8 inches to the left of midline, is a slightly shored gunshot exit wound which measures 1.5 cm vertically by 1.2 cm horizontally. Marginal abrasion produced by the shoring is primarily located on the superior portion of the wound.

**Direction of Fire** - The bullet passes from front to back, right to left, and upward.

**GUNSHOT WOUND #10, LEFT POSTERIOR FOREARM:**

Entrance - Labelled "T" on the diagram, on the left posterior forearm, approximately 1 1/2 inches distal to the elbow, is a round 0.7 cm in diameter gunshot entrance wound which is surrounded by symmetric marginal abrasion measuring 0.2 cm in width.

Path - The bullet passes through soft tissue only.

Exit - Labelled "B" on the diagram, on the left anterior forearm, approximately 1 1/2 inches below the elbow, is an irregular lacerated gunshot exit wound which measures approximately 1.0 cm in maximum diameter.

Direction of Fire - With the arm in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from back to front without significant left to right or vertical deviation.

**GUNSHOT WOUND #11, LEFT POSTERIOR THIGH:**

Entrance - Labelled "M" on the diagram, in the left posterior thigh, approximately 3 inches below the gluteal crease, is a round gunshot entrance wound which measures 0.8 cm in diameter and is surrounded by slightly irregular marginal abrasion.

Path - After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues, the bullet travels through muscle of the thigh.

Exit - None

Bullet - A slightly deformed, medium caliber, partially jacketed bullet is recovered from soft tissues of the left lateral thigh, approximately 3 inches above the knee.

Direction of Fire - The bullet passes from back to front, right to left, and downward.

**ADDITIONAL INJURIES:**

A superficial abrasion and contusion is located approximately 1/2 inch above the right eyebrow and measures 1.0 cm in maximum size. Contusion and abrasion is on the left forehead above the eyebrow and measures between 0.6 - 1.0 cm in maximum size. A contusion and abrasion of the right leg just above the knee cap is 1.5 cm in maximum size.

**INTERNAL EXAMINATION:**

The body is opened through an abdominal fat layer of 1.0 - 2.0 cm and a muscle layer of 1.0 cm at the level of the umbilicus. The internal organs are found in their normal positions and are covered

by glistening serosal surfaces. Left hemothorax has been described. There is no abnormal accumulation of fluid within the right chest cavity. There is a small amount of blood within the pericardial cavity. There is no abnormal accumulation of peritoneal cavity fluid. Internal injury has been described.

**SYSTEMS REVIEW:**

**CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:** The heart weighs 380 grams and is covered by glistening epicardium, with a moderate amount of epicardial fat. The coronary arteries arise normally and follow a right dominant course, without atherosclerosis. Sections of the myocardium are red-brown and finely fibrillar, without evidence of recent or old ischemic injury. Injuries to the left atrium and right ventricle have been described. The heart is lined by glistening endocardium. The cardiac valves have their normal structure and the leaflets are thin and translucent, without calcification or vegetations. The coronary ostia are patent. The aorta follows a normal course through the chest and into the abdomen and exhibits no atherosclerosis or injuries. The blood vessels contain scant quantities of liquid blood.

**RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:** The right and left lungs together weigh 670 grams. Both are covered by glistening pink to purple pleural surfaces, with a small amount of subpleural anthracotic pigment deposition. The bronchi are patent and are lined by tan mucosa which is coated with blood. There are no pulmonary thromboemboli. Cut surfaces of the lungs exhibit a checkerboard pattern of aspiration of blood as well as hemorrhage along the perforating wound paths in the left lower lobe of the lung. There is no evidence for consolidation or other focal lesions.

**HEPATOBIILIARY SYSTEM:** The liver weighs 1,170 grams and is covered by a glistening red-brown capsule. Cut surfaces are firm and red-brown, without lesions. The bile ducts are patent and the gallbladder contains approximately 3 cc of bile and no stones.

**GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM:** The intact esophagus is lined by tan mucosa. The stomach contains a small amount of tan opaque fluid, without identifiable food or medication particles. The gastric mucosa is unremarkable. The pylorus is patent and the duodenal contents are bile-stained. The remainder of the small intestine and large intestine are normal to inspection and palpation. The appendix is normal.

The pancreas is of normal size and shape and cut surfaces are pink and lobulated, without lesions.

**HEMATOPOIETIC SYSTEM:** The spleen weighs 70 grams and is covered by a glistening maroon capsule. Cut surfaces are soft, with inconspicuous white pulp areas. Lymph nodes within the neck,

chest, and abdomen are unremarkable. The thymus is partially replaced by fat.

**GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:** The right and left kidneys together weigh 200 grams. The capsules strip with ease from both to reveal glistening tan cortical surfaces. Cut surfaces show clear demarcation between cortical and medullary areas. The renal calyces and pelves are not dilated and drain into ureters of normal caliber which follow a normal course to the urinary bladder. The bladder contains a small amount of clear yellow urine and is lined by tan mucosa. Pericyclic hemorrhage has been described.

The prostate is normal to sectioning. The testicles are normal to palpation within the scrotum.

**ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:** The thyroid is of normal size and shape and cut surfaces are maroon and finely lobulated, without lesions. The adrenal glands are of normal size and shape and cut surfaces show unremarkable golden cortical and maroon medullary areas. The pituitary is normal.

**NECK:** There is no hemorrhage within the strap muscles, thyroid, or posterior pharyngeal constrictors. The bony and cartilaginous structures of the larynx, and the hyoid bone, are intact. The larynx and trachea are patent and are lined by tan mucosa. There is no abnormal mobility or crepitation of the cervical vertebrae.

**MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:** The muscles are normally developed and consistent with those of an adult male. The skeleton is normally developed and consistent with that of an adult male. Fractures have been described.

**HEAD:** Reflection of the scalp reveals no subgaleal hemorrhage. The calvarium is intact. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage. Removal of the dura from the base of the skull reveals no hemorrhage or fractures. The pituitary and proximal spinal cord are intact.

**CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:** The fresh brain weighs 1,400 grams and is covered by glistening transparent leptomeninges. The gyri are normally oriented and exhibit no significant flattening. Examination of the base of the brain reveals an intact circle of Willis, without atherosclerosis or aneurysms. The cranial nerves are intact. There is no uncus or cerebellar tonsillar herniation. There is no subarachnoid hemorrhage. The brainstem and cerebellum have their normal external appearance.

Sections of the cerebral hemispheres reveal an intact cortical ribbon and underlying white matter. The basal ganglia and thalamus have their normal appearance. The ventricles are not dilated and are lined by glistening ependyma, without intraventricular hemorrhage. Sections of the brainstem and cerebellum reveal an

intact internal structure. The spinal cord is not removed.

TOXICOLOGY: The following specimens are retained: central blood and urine.


HISTOLOGY: Representative tissues are retained.

PHOTOGRAPHS: 35 mm photographs of the injuries are obtained.

X-RAYS: AP x-rays of the head, chest, abdomen and legs are obtained.

EVIDENCE: All of the clothing is submitted to Ventura County Sheriff's Department BI, as well as 5 bullets recovered from the body. Tubes of blood are also submitted to the Ventura County Sheriff's Office.

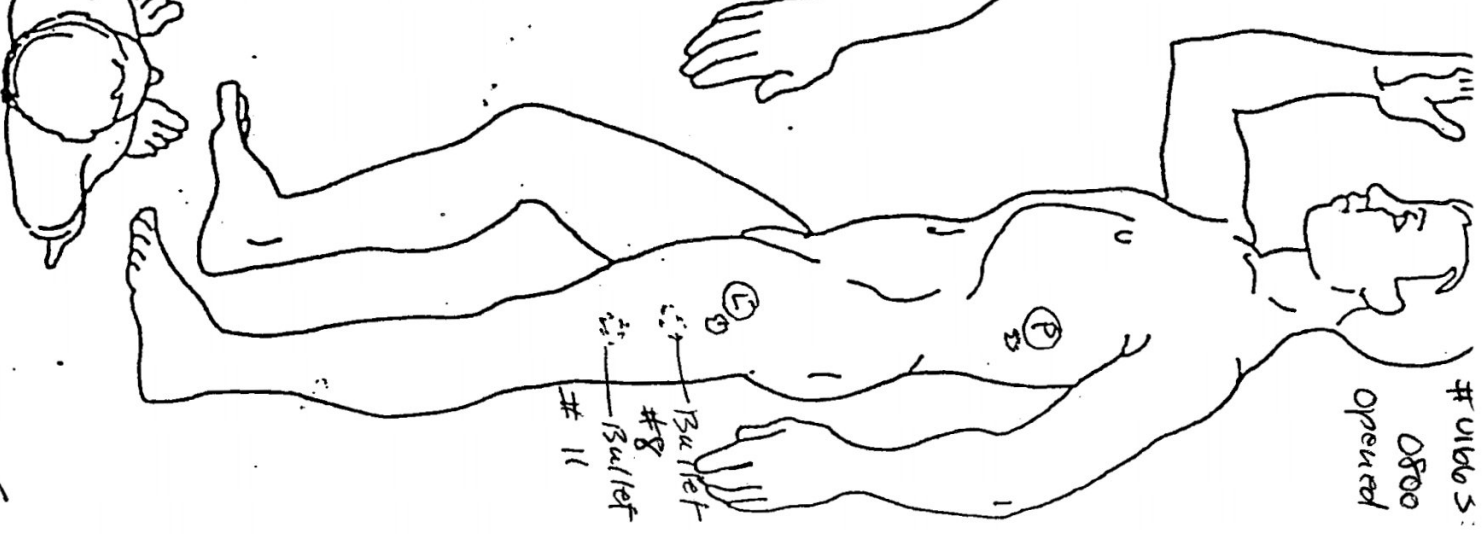
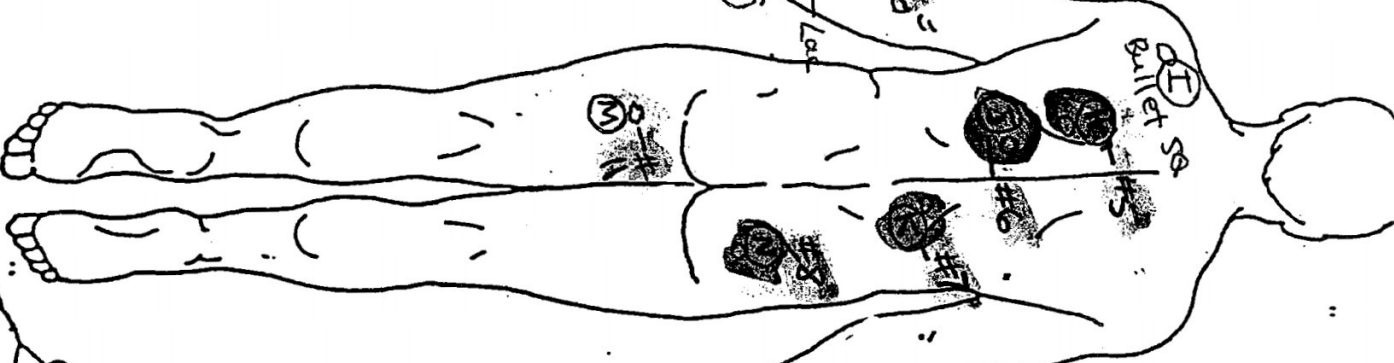
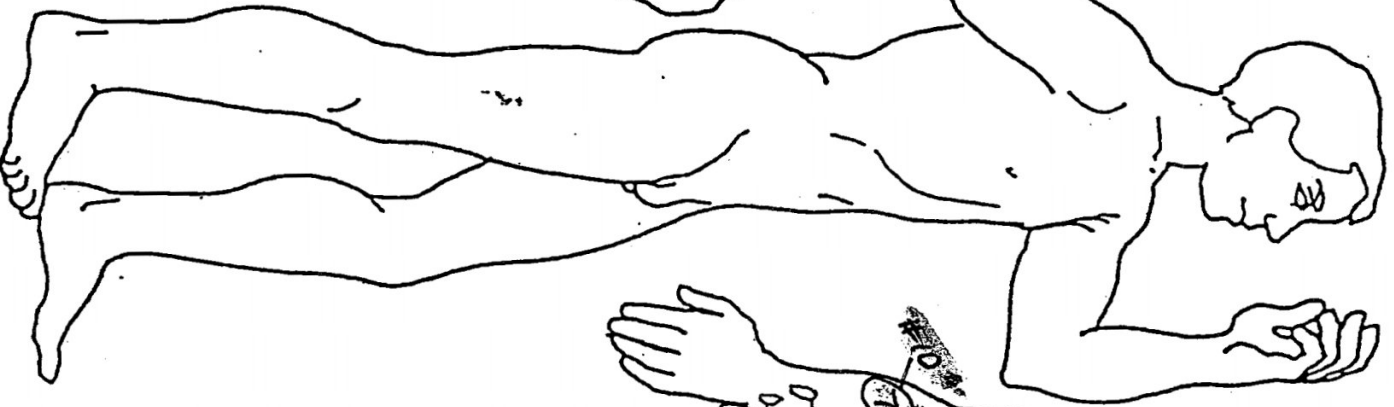
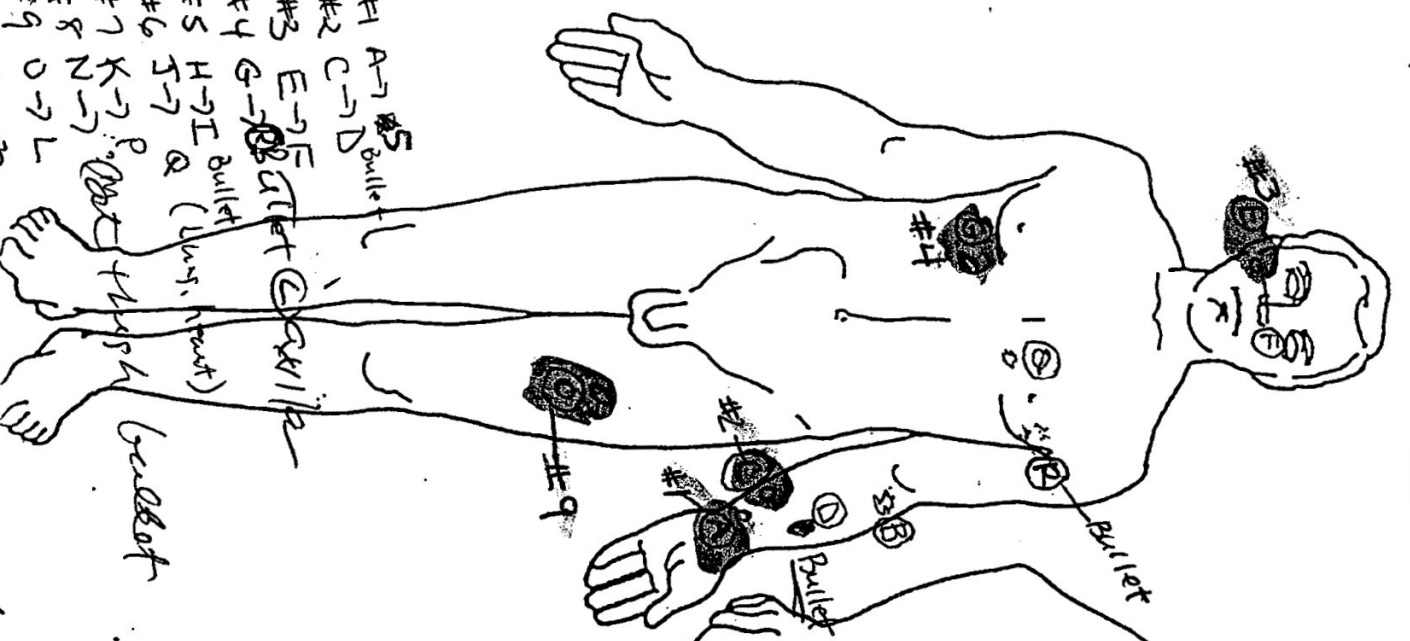

**Narrative:** Shortly after 6:00 pm, patrol deputies responded to a call of a suspicious subject in the 800 block of Lynnmere Drive, a residential neighborhood. The first officer contacted the reporting party, who pointed out the subject standing in a neighbor's driveway and indicated he was not known in the area. The officer approached the subject and asked what he was doing. According to witnesses, the subject was uncooperative with the deputy. The subject tried to force his way past the deputy. A second patrol deputy arrived, joining the first officer. Both officers became involved in a physical struggle with the subject. Both deputies stepped back and sprayed the subject with pepper spray. Witnesses stated the pepper spray did not appear to have any affect on the subject, who then drew a knife and brandished it at the two deputies. According to witnesses, both officers issued numerous commands to the subject to stop and drop the knife. The subject advanced toward one of the deputies and lunged in an apparent attempt to stab the officer. Both officers then fired their handguns at the subject.

Emergency rescue personnel were called, and Huynh was pronounced dead at the scene. An autopsy is being conducted today by the Medical Examiner's Office.

Huynh, a former Moorpark College student, was described by family members as suffering from mental illness and had been reported as a missing person numerous times since 1995. He has been treated for schizophrenia and depression.

Huynh was brandishing a knife, approximately 8" long, at the time he was shot. A second similar knife was found in a coat Huynh had been holding. Prior missing person reports on Huynh indicated that he had taken knives from his family's home in the past.

The officers involved in the shooting are Dep. Mark Correia, 36 years old, and Dep. Michael Rowland, 32 years of age. Correia joined the Sheriff's Department in 1991 and has worked out of the East County Police Services Station for four years. Rowland was hired in 1994 and has worked at East County for almost three years. As in any situation where an officer is involved in a critical incident like this, both deputies have been placed on Administrative Leave with pay, pending the completion of the investigation.

# Physical Lag Times and Their Impact on the Use of Deadly Force

by Michael R. Hillmann

## Introduction

**R**outinely, law enforcement supervisors, administrators, use-of-force review boards and civilian jurors are required to evaluate police officers and their application of deadly force. Oftentimes, from an evaluator's perspective, the task of deciding whether an officer acted appropriately or not is a difficult one at best. In all cases, individual state of mind of the officer serves as the foundation for determining "appropriateness of actions," while the law and policy represent key precepts that guide police officers in making their decision to shoot or not shoot. Add to this decision-making criteria, human factors, such as perception time, brain lag and reaction time, and the problem of incident evaluation becomes considerably more complex.

It is recognized that the time lags involving perception time, brain lag and reaction time are not an excuse for improper tactics or poor judgment. Police officers must avoid, when possible, placing themselves in positions of jeopardy where they are left with no other alternative than to shoot. However, in order to balance "no action" with "the duty to perform," one must remember that police officers are trained and practiced to protect the public and are expected to be proactive in pursuit of their duty. Therefore, police officers may find themselves in perilous positions where the decision to utilize "deadly force" is predicated on the circumstances created by the suspect, "it is the suspect who initiates the action and the officer who responds."<sup>1</sup>

It is the intent of this article to focus on the physical time lags involving perception time, brain lag, and reaction time, their definitions, and how they affect a police officer's decision to utilize deadly force.

## Statement of the Problem

Occasionally, conflicts will arise during post-incident analysis of incidents involving the use of deadly force between an officer's recollection, statements, and certain physical evidence. Please consider the following situations:

1. "The police officer shot an assault-

with-a-deadly-weapon (ADW) suspect after he made a movement consistent with arming himself. The suspect was determined not to have a gun (after the fact). At the time, however, the officer *reasonably believed* the suspect was armed with a gun and about to inflict great bodily injury or death upon him."

2. "The officer shot an assault-with-a-deadly-weapon (ADW) suspect who, moments prior, was observed to be armed with a pistol. After discarding the pistol, the suspect ran a few feet from the officer's position toward an unsecured area. At the time, the officer believed an additional firearm could have been retrieved and utilized against he or other officers present."
3. "The officer stated he discharged his weapon when the suspect's front chest was facing him, however, the evidence indicated the bullet entered the back of the suspect's upper body."

## Physical Time Lag Studies

Before an analysis of the above situations can take place, certain parameters must be established in order to understand the impact of "physical time lags" affecting police officers. Therefore, for the purpose of discussion only, assume the following facts to be true: (1) Police officers generally attempt to utilize proper tactics, are trained in the law, deadly force policy, and are proficient in the use of their firearm; (2) Police officers are lawfully entitled to be where they are under the circumstances, and (3) Police officers are honest and forthright in reporting

their observations and actions.

Consider a Department of Transportation, Federal Aviation Administration, Civil Aeromedical Institute Physiological Operations study conducted regarding collision avoidance.<sup>2</sup>

"Inherent in the body are three physical time lags which are critical in high-speed flight.

### **Perception Time (0.1 second)**

The time required for an impulse to be generated in the eye and transmitted to the brain.

### **Brain Lag (0.1 second or more)**

The time required for a decision.

### **Reaction Time (0.4 to 0.8 second)**

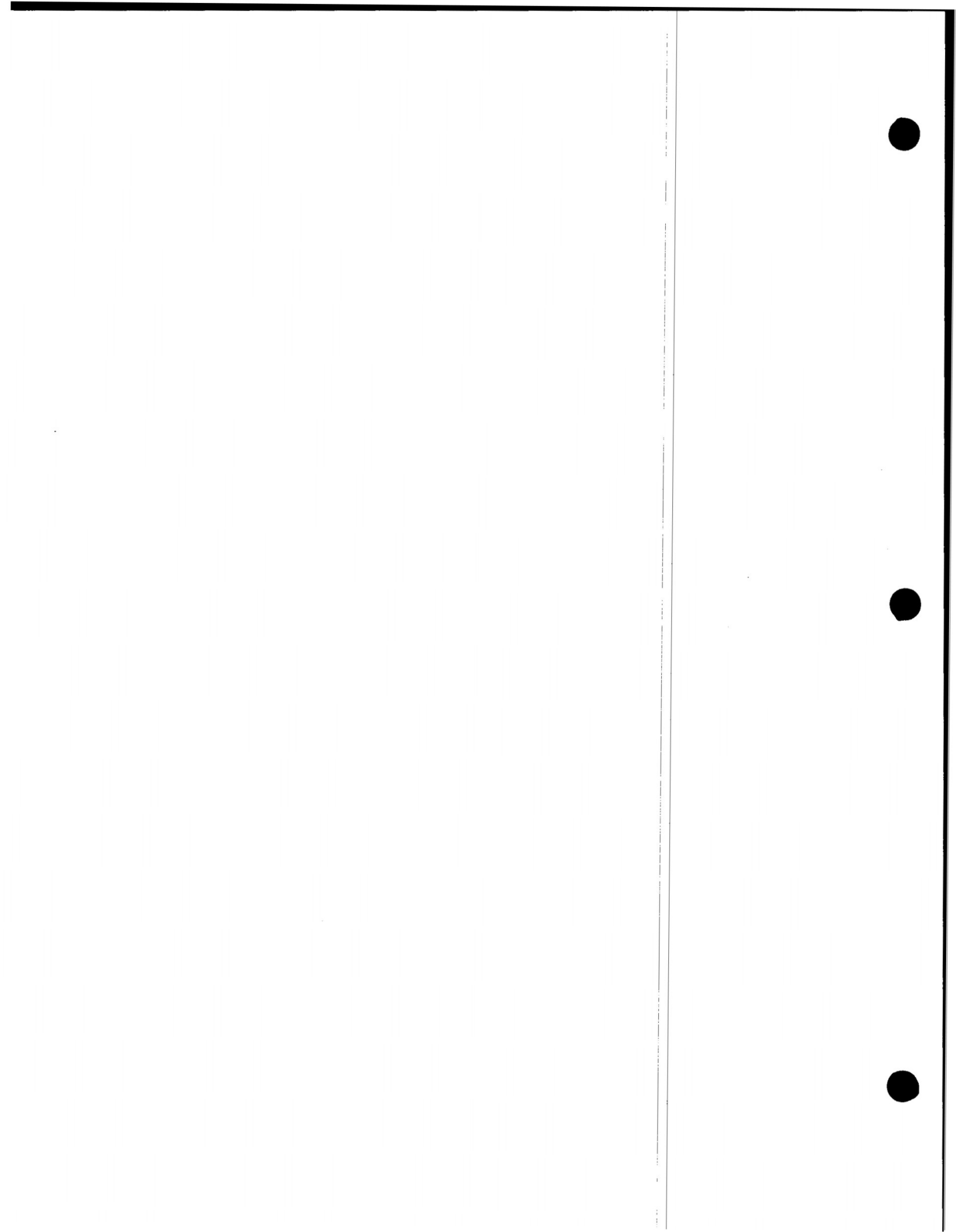
The time required for an impulse to travel from brain to hand, feet, etc., which triggers some physical reaction to the original eye stimulus. It is not unusual to take up to *five seconds* before the aircraft begins evasive action (considering collision avoidance)."

There have been other studies regarding physical time lags, specifically relating to driver training. For example, the Los Angeles Police Department's, Driver Training Unit, Lesson Plan<sup>3</sup> has defined "reaction time" as follows:

"The time that elapses between the driver's perception/decision and the time the brakes are applied or the steering wheel turned. The average human reaction time, under these circumstances, is 0.75 of a second."

It is significant to note, the conclusions of both independent studies arrived at an average *reaction time* of between 0.75 to 0.8 of a second.

The Federal Aviation Administration "High-Speed Flight" physical time lag study in particular is applicable to a law enforcement use-of-force setting. For example, a police officer, believing he is confronted with a life-threatening situation, waits to see the suspect's gun before he draws and discharges his service pistol. Under these circumstances, if we apply the above physical time lags, we would see that the officer would probably be shot *before* he could remove his weapon from his holster. In this specific case, the officer's time for



reaction starts after the suspect's weapon is observed. The suspect, already committed to action, is able to draw and shoot before the officer can effectively respond. The officer's reactive measures, e.g., "return fire," could be as much as 1.0 second or more behind the suspect's discharge of two rounds.

Whether a police officer's pistol is holstered or unholstered makes little difference in the above situation. When the officer's pistol is unholstered and in a properly sighted, shooting position, we may see a slight reduction in reaction time. Unfortunately, the best that can be expected is a "tie" between the officer and the suspect. Considering both the suspect and police officer would be shooting at each other, in all probability both will be shot.

Next, factor into the above situation the following: The officer (1) must be accurate in target acquisition, (2) is only allowed to continue applying deadly force long enough to stop the threat, (3) must continuously assess the threat, then (4) consciously decide to stop shooting when the threat stops. This entire process involves all of the aforementioned physical time lags of perception time, brain lag, and reaction time in order to be accomplished. Simply stated, the officer perceives that the threat has been stopped, transmits that observation to the brain, decides to cease shooting, then physically must stop pulling the trigger.

#### The Law

A police officer is not required by law or policy to wait to see a gun before he discharges his firearm in self-defense or defense of others when he reasonably believes, based upon the circumstances, that he is facing an imminent threat of great bodily injury or death. Whether or not it is determined after the fact that the suspect actually was reaching for a gun does not invalidate the officer's actions, based upon the reasonable belief that he was about to be shot, and his personal knowledge of the physical time lags involved.

In recent years, the problems associated with use-of-force decisions by police officers have not gone unnoticed by the courts. It is acknowledged that police officers are forced to be able to quickly assess situations and make split-second decisions involving the use of deadly force, as reflected in the U.S. Supreme Court case, *Graham v. Connor*.<sup>4</sup>

"The reasonableness of a particular

use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene and its calculus must embody an allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force necessary in a particular situation."

#### Other "Time" Factors

In the course and scope of employment as a police officer, supervisor and manager, the author has had the opportunity to review several hundred officer-involved shooting situations for training, officer safety, administrative use-of-force review boards, courtroom presentations, and internal discipline. Following these examinations, involving hundreds of investigative hours, personal experience, evaluation of suspects' actions and interviews of "shooting" police officers, it has been the author's observation that:

1. A suspect armed with a pistol, secreted in his waistband, can draw and fire at least two shots within 1.0 to 1.5 seconds.
2. Approximately 90% of all officer-involved shooting incidents take place within a three-second time period.

#### Post-Incident Analysis

As mentioned initially, during post-incident analysis, oftentimes conflicts arise between an officer's statement and the actual evidence. Please consider the following additional scenarios and explanations.

1. An officer stated during the officer-involved-shooting interview he discharged his firearm in defense of himself when the suspect was facing him. The forensic evidence indicated, however, the bullet tract was posterior to anterior (back to front). Under the specific circumstances, perception time, brain lag, and reaction time of the officer, combined with *continued movement of the target (suspect)*, may have accounted for the inconsistency between the officer's initial statement and the actual evidence.
2. A suspect believed to be armed with a handgun is chased by a police

officer. The suspect stops, turns to his right, and partially faces the officer. The suspect removes what appears to be a handgun from his waist and extends his right arm, while turning to his right. He then makes a movement consistent with assuming a shooting position. The police officer, in pursuit, perceives the threat (0.1 second), stops, assesses that he is in imminent danger of being shot, decides on the appropriate use of force, and makes the decision to shoot (0.6 to 0.8 or more seconds). At this point, the suspect is continuing to move, turn, bend, squat, run, climb, throw, stop, etc. In the beat of a heart, the officer makes the decision to shoot, based upon the belief of imminent threat to life. He acquires the target, aligns his front and rear sight, and squeezes the trigger twice in rapid succession (1.0 second or more). The suspect falls to the ground, shot in the back. Under the circumstances, the officer's perception of the threat, decision to shoot, plus actual shooting time, required at least 1.0 second or more to implement. During this period of time, the officer observed certain facts and decided on a course of action while the suspect's movement continued. In closer examination, at the time the officer actually commenced shooting, one would probably find that the suspect was turning back, toward his left, when the bullet(s) impacted. During the post-incident officer interview, however, the officer may have recalled he discharged his weapon while the suspect was facing him, when in reality, the suspect actually was in the process of turning away from him.

This discrepancy does not mean the officer was being untruthful at the time of the interview. Quite the contrary, the physical time lags affecting the officer, his recall of the suspect's position at the moment he decided to shoot, combined with the continuous movement of the suspect after he started shooting, may have accounted for the discrepancy between the officer's belief as to the position of the suspect when he shot and the actual physical evidence. In other words, the officer's reaction lagged behind the actions of the suspect.

It is also recognized that many factors can affect the above examples: tactics, positioning, movement of the

officer, accuracy and availability of cover, etc. The point is, the physical time lags (perception time, brain lag, and reaction time) combined with the movement of both officer and target must be equally considered prior to formulating opinions of what occurred.

As indicated previously, "crisis decisions," i.e., the use of deadly force, require time (perception, brain lag, and reaction time) in order to implement. Just as it takes time for the police officer to perceive, decide and react to an impending threat, it also takes time for the officer to perceive, decide and actually stop his reactive measures. It has been the author's experience to note that criticism has occasionally arisen regarding an "alleged" excessive number of rounds being fired by a single "shooting officer."

An officer who is shooting to stop the actions of the suspect is required to continuously assess the threat throughout the event, and when, in his opinion the threat is stopped, must "de-escalate" his force. Under these circumstances, the sequence of de-escalation requires time to implement. It is not unusual to find that an officer may have attempted to cease fire after 2 to 4 shots (depending upon the weapon) but, in reality, discharged 10 shots or more. In the final analysis, this alleged "excessive" number of rounds discharged may not have been excessive at all, and may be attributed to the physical time lags involved in the officer's deciding to de-escalate response. In short, the officer may have been unable to immediately discontinue shooting after the initial 2 to 4 shots, due to the perception time, brain lag, and reaction time required to stop the action.

### Physical Time Lags and Distance

A suspect's proximity from a deadly weapon, e.g., arm's reach, and a police officer's distance from a suspect (lunging distance), coupled with the physical time lags required for defensive reaction, can impact the decision to utilize deadly force. Under specific conditions, a police officer may have no other tactical options, e.g., cover, concealment, position, etc., and the threat of serious bodily injury is "reasonably" present. The officer may be forced into a deadly force situation in order to stop the suspect, e.g., movement toward arming himself with a weapon. Officers are not expected to allow suspects to arm

themselves and then set about physically engaging and disarming them. The law and use-of-force policies do not require officers to use the same or lesser amounts of force to overcome a suspect's resistance. Police officers are required to utilize that amount of force which is "reasonable" to overcome resistance. "Grappling" with an armed suspect not only increases the risk to the police officer, but tends to exacerbate and escalate the situation.

### Summary of Technical and Tactical Points

1. The components of physical time lags are:
  - Perception time 0.1 second
  - Brain lag 0.1 second or more
  - Reaction time 0.4 to 0.8 seconds
2. The sum total of physical time lags (perception time, brain lag, and reaction time) is generally between 0.75 and 1.0 second.
3. An armed subject with a firearm secreted in his waistband can draw and discharge a minimum of 2 shots within 1.0 to 1.5 seconds.
4. Physical time lags, combined with continuous movement of a suspect, can account for discrepancies between an officer's account of events and the actual post-incident evidence.
5. A police officer's perception time, brain lag, and reaction time all begin after the suspect's actions are already underway.
6. A police officer's decision to de-escalate the use of deadly force is subject to the same physical time lags as the decision to use deadly force.
7. Proximity of a suspect from a potential weapon (distance of a police officer from the suspect), coupled with physical time lags, can affect the decision to utilize deadly force.
8. The existence of physical time lags, perception time, brain lag, and reaction time does not justify the use of poor or inappropriate tactics.
9. Under life-threatening conditions, waiting to see a suspect's gun before a police officer utilizes deadly force can result in injury and/or death to the officer.

### Conclusion

In conclusion, the post-incident analysis of an officer-involved shooting is complex at best. It is hoped that those who sit in review of police officers' actions consider the "fast-moving circumstances" of the situation, the impact of physical time lags and the officer's overall "state of mind" at the

moment he decided to shoot. The issues involving "physical time lags" are present, to some degree, in most officer-involved shooting situations. Additionally, it is this author's opinion that in some cases, these time lags have been given little consideration when analyzing the totality of the involved police officer's actions. The most stressful, emotionally impacting and permanent decision a police officer can ever make is the decision to utilize deadly force. The best those of us sitting in judgment can do is understand the totality of the circumstances, the concept of physical time lags and their impact on the use of deadly force.

AN AUTOPSY REVEALED THE SUSPECT HAD BEEN HIT BY ALL 11 ROUNDS FIRED. 5 ROUNDS STRUCK THE SUSPECT ON THE POSTERIOR SIDE. 3 ROUNDS STRUCK THE LEFT FOREARM, 1 GRAZING WOUND ACROSS THE RIGHT CHEEK AND NOSE, 1 IN THE RIGHT CHEST AND 1 IN THE LEFT THIGH. 6 OF THE BULLETS PASSED THROUGH THE BODY. 5 BULLETS WERE RECOVERED FROM THE BODY, (2) .45 CALIBER, (3) 9MM. THE ANGLE AND WOUND TRACKS ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE WITNESS STATEMENTS AND SHELL CASING LOCATIONS. WITNESS [REDACTED] DESCRIBED THE SUSPECT'S FINAL LUNGE AS A STABBING LUNGE AS SOMEONE WHO IS FENCING. THIS MOVEMENT BY THE SUSPECT WOULD EXPOSE THE SUSPECT'S BACK TO DEPUTY CORREIA. THE WOUND TO THE LEFT THIGH TRACKED UP TO THE LEFT HIP AREA WHERE THE 9MM BULLET WAS RECOVERED. IT IS POSSIBLE THIS ROUND WAS FIRED AS THE SUSPECT WAS FALLING TO HIS BUTTOCKS OR WAS ON HIS BUTTOCKS. THIS WOULD BE CONSISTENT WITH [REDACTED] BELIEVING SHE HEARD THREE SHOTS AFTER THE SUSPECT WAS ON HIS BUTTOCKS. TWO RAPID SHOTS HEARD AFTER THE INITIAL VOLLEY ON DEPUTY ROWLAND'S TAPE RECORDING ALSO LEND CREDENCE TO THIS.

WITNESS STATEMENTS AND THE O.C. CANISTER AT THE CRIME SCENE INDICATE BOTH DEPUTIES USED THEIR O.C. SPRAY ON THE SUSPECT. PHOTOGRAPHS TAKEN AT THE SCENE SHOW THE ORANGE TINT OF O.C. SPRAY ON THE SUSPECT'S FACE. BOTH O.C. CANISTERS WERE LATER TESTED BY SHERIFF'S CRIME LAB. BOTH WERE FOUND TO BE FUNCTIONAL.

ON 9-20-98 HAN HUYNH, A 29 YEAR OLD MALE OF CHINESE DESCENT, LEFT HIS HOME IN CAMARILLO WHERE HE LIVED WITH HIS SISTER, [REDACTED] AND HER FAMILY. HAN WAS REPORTED MISSING TO THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT BY [REDACTED] ON 9-21-98 AT 1500 HRS. DEPUTY EDWARDS TOOK THE MISSING PERSON REPORT FROM [REDACTED] IN THE REPORT [REDACTED] DESCRIBED HER BROTHER AS MENTALLY UNSTABLE AND DELUSIONAL. THE DEPUTY WROTE THAT HAN WAS DIAGNOSED AS SCHIZOID AND WAS PRESCRIBED SEVERAL ANTI PSYCHOTIC MEDICATIONS. [REDACTED] TOLD THE DEPUTY, HAN HAD NOT TAKEN HIS MEDICATION AND AS A RESULT WOULD BECOME DELUSIONAL AND "SOMEWHAT VIOLENT". [REDACTED] EXPRESSED FEAR FOR HAN'S SAFETY AS HE DID NOT HAVE HIS MEDICATION WITH HIM.

IN THE MORE RECENT MISSING REPORTS HAN HAD LEFT THE FAMILY HOME ON FOOT AND HAD BEEN FOUND IN MOORPARK AND
