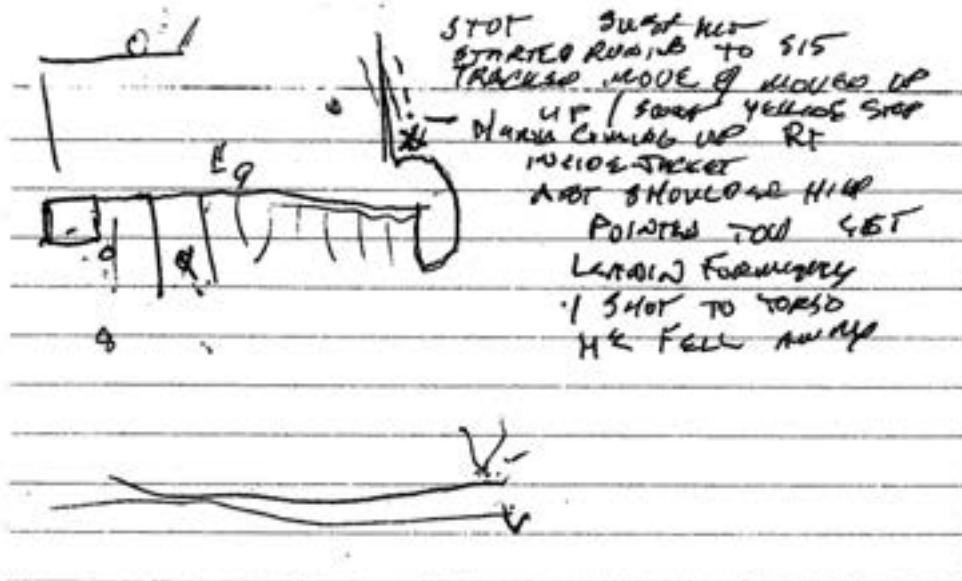

Response

On 9-7-99, at 0540 hrs, Sgt. Hoelker called me at home and informed that there had been an officer involved shooting in the City of Fillmore. He requested that I responded to assist with the investigation. Sgt. Hoelker said the scene was at 704 Ventura Street, Fillmore. I responded and arrived at 0714 hrs. I then attended the end of a briefing that was being given by Sgt. Howe. The briefing was being held in the southwest end of the Von's shopping center parking lot. The address for Vons is 636 Ventura Street.

After the briefing ended, Sgt. Lorenzen requested that I search the eastside of the parking lot for any evidence related to the shooting. I checked the lot and was not able to find any evidence. Sgt. Lorenzen then requested that I contact the employee from the "Ultramar" gas station who called the Sheriff's Department and made a report on the suspect, Jose Jaramillo. I called the Sheriff's Dispatch Center and requested the name of the employee who had called to report the incident. The dispatcher told me that it was a subject by the name of [redacted] h [redacted] h. I arrived at the "Ultramar" station and contacted the manager, [redacted]

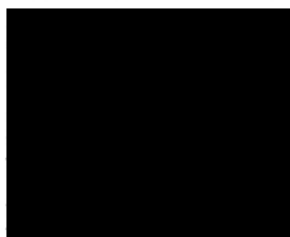

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I identified myself to [REDACTED] and explained to her why I was here. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was still in the station. [REDACTED] told me that [REDACTED] finished his shift this morning at 0500 hours. I asked if she could call him and ask if I could speak to him. [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] at home. [REDACTED] asked if I could meet him at his house. I said I would meet with him in a few minutes. I asked [REDACTED] if the store had a surveillance camera that records the activity around the store. She told that they have a camera that records the inside of the store.

[REDACTED] inserted a tape in the tape player. She said it was the surveillance tape from this morning. She told me that they had watched it earlier and saw Jaramillo walking in the store and leaving a short time later. [REDACTED] played the tape for me. I watched as Jaramillo walked into the store and walk to the counter located at the west-end of the station. As he entered the station, Jaramillo had a dark colored coat draped over his right shoulder. The coat covered his right shoulder, arm and hand.

I could see Jaramillo talking to someone who was out of the camera's view. Jaramillo then walked back towards the front door. As he walked to the door, I could see Jaramillo say something to the other subject. Jaramillo then walked out the door and out of the camera's view. During the time Jaramillo was in the store, he did not expose his right hand from under the dark colored coat. There was no sound to the video. The subject who Jaramillo was talking to was [REDACTED]. I took the tape as evidence and then drove to [REDACTED]'s house where I interviewed him. Refer to my supplemental report with [REDACTED]'s interview.

Scene

When I arrived at the scene, the weather was cool and overcast. There was a slight breeze blowing. This incident occurred in the City of Fillmore, southeast of the intersection of Ventura Street and "A" Street. Ventura Street, also known as State Highway 126 travels

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east and west through the City of Fillmore. It is a four-lane highway with left turn lanes in both directions located at the intersection of Ventura Street and "A" Street.

"A" Street, also known as State Highway 23, travels north and south. It is a two-lane highway with left turn lanes traveling in both directions at the intersection of "A" Street and Ventura Street.

The Chevron Gas Station is located at 704 Ventura Street. It is on the southwest corner of the Ventura Street and "A" Street intersection. The station has three entrance/ exits. The first entrance/ exit is located on the northwest side of the property. The second is on the northeast side of the property. The third is on the southeast side of the property. The gas pumps are located under an awning on the center of the property. The station (store) is on the south side of the property. The front entrance to of the station faces north. It has glass windows on the north and east side of the building.

There is a planter located on the northeast corner of the property. It is raised about four inches from the ground and has a lawn in it. A second planter is located between the second and third entrance of the property. The planter is also raised approximately four inches from the ground and has a lawn and two trees in it. The planter is directly to the east of the gas pumps.

There are two telephone booths on the southeast corner of the property. This is to the south of the third entrance/ exit of the property. On the same corner, directly to the west of the telephone booths is another planter similar to the other ones. It has grass, a tree and several small shrubs in it.


To the south of the station is a tract of houses. The tract is fenced by a six foot concrete block wall. The wall runs east and west between the station property and the houses and south along "A" Street.

On the southeast corner of Ventura Street and "A" Street is the "USA" gas station. The address of the station is 660 Ventura Street. The station has two gas pump islands. One is located on the north side of the property and the other is on the west side. The property is fenced on the south and east side by a chain link that is approximately four feet in height.

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Parked behind the USA station is a light colored, four-door sedan. This car was parked along the south side of the station and was facing west.

Directly to the south, parallel to the light colored sedan, is a marked Ventura County Sheriff's patrol vehicle. It is painted black and white and has Sheriff's insignias on the right, left and the rear side of the patrol unit that identified it as a Ventura County Sheriff's vehicle. It also has emergency lights on the top of the roof of the vehicle. It has the numbers "149" in large black digits affixed to the roof of the car directly behind the emergency light bar. The vehicle also has the numbers "3149" in small yellow colored digits affixed to the left and right front fenders and to the left side of the rear bumper. This unit was parked facing in a southeast direction. The right side of the unit was parallel to the chain link fence on the south side of the property. The passenger side door of the patrol unit was in the open position and the rest of the doors were closed. Behind the unit there is a light green metal trash dumpster.

To the east of the USA station property there is a large square grass area. On the east side of the grass area, there are ten painted parking spaces. On the south side, there is an asphalt cut out with five painted parking spaces.


On the south side of the USA station property, there is another large square area of grass. On the north side of the grass area, there is a dark green electrical box. It is along the fence line and parallel to the police unit parked behind the USA gas station. On the west side there is a wooden sign erected in the grass. Several items were found in the grass that was taken as evidence. On the east side of the grass area, there is an asphalt cut out with seven painted parking spaces. On the south side of the grass area, there is a square asphalt parking area. In this parking area, several items were found that were taken as evidence. Refer to the Field Evidence Technician's reports for further details as to the location where the evidence was located.

This asphalt parking area has nine painted parking spaces on the north side and eight painted parking spaces on the south side. The entrance/ exit to the parking area is located on the east side. On the northwest corner of the parking area there is a square, concrete block, trash dumpster storage area. The door to the storage area faces south. A red plastic expended shotgun casing was found to the east of the storage area. On the south side of this parking area there is a planter with several trees, shrubs and ground cover. There is a light post in the middle of the planter. On the southwest corner, there is a large, lighted,

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monument sign on top of two pillars. The sign faces north and south and has the following words. "BALDEN TOWN PLAZA," "VONS," "RITE AID PHARMACY," "BURGER KING," and "PAYLESS SHOE SOURCE."

On the southeast corner of this parking area, there is a marked Ventura County Sheriff's patrol unit. The unit is black and white in color and has "086" in large black digits affixed to the roof of the unit. The unit has Sheriff's insignias on the left and front door, and rear trunk that identify it as a Ventura County Sheriff's vehicle. It also has the digits "3086" in small yellow digits affixed to the right and left fenders, and the right side of the rear bumper. The unit also has an emergency light bar attached to the roof. The driver's side door was in the open position and the rest of the doors were closed. The unit was facing in a northwest direction toward the parking lot's exit.

On the east side of the patrol unit, there are painted, angled, double row of parking spaces. The spaces angled toward the northeast. There are approximately twelve painted spaces on each side. There is a raised concrete planter between spaces seven and eight, counting the spaces from south to north. There was also a pie shaped planter at each end of the row. On the east side of this parking area, parked in space number two, was a black Ford Mustang. The car was facing in a northeast direction. This parking area has two light posts. One on the north side and the other on the south side.

To the east of this parking area there are two more similar rows of parking spaces. Each row has twelve parking spaces. These spaces also face a northeast direction. There is a raised planter between spaces seven and eight and a "pie" shaped planter at the end of the rows. In this parking area there are several cars parked on it. On the west side of this parking area, there is a red colored vehicle parked facing northeast. In space eight, there is a white car with a tan top parked facing southwest. In space eleven, there is a full size white GMC pick up truck facing southwest. In space twelve, there is a red car-facing northeast.

On the east side of the parking area there was a gray car parked in space two, a dark green car in space six, a gray car in space seven, a black car in space eight, and a red truck in space nine. I counted the spaces from south to north.

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To the south of the parking areas is an asphalt road that travels east and west through the shopping center. To the south of this road are the storefronts. The store fronts all face north.

The stores located to the south of the scene and running west to east, are as follows:

- “Auto Zone,” 658 Ventura Street.
- “Launderland Coin Laundry,” 648 Vetura Street.
- (vacant space) 646 Ventura Street.
- “Diamond Nails,” 644 Ventura Street.
- (vacant space) 624 Ventura Street.
- “A-1 Discount,” 640 Ventura Street.
- “Vons,” 636 Ventura Street.

There are several more stores to the east of the Von’s Store. The ones I have identified directly face the scene.

Found on the roadway, directly in front of the Vons entrance, was a black rubber projectile. Found on the sidewalk, between the Vons and A-1 Discount stores was a small circular piece of black rubber.

There was yellow crime scene tape extended from the southwest corner of the USA station to the east side of the station’s property. From the southeast corner of the property to the front of the Vons store. From the front of the Vons Store to the front of the Auto Zone. From there it extended to the southwest corner of the USA gas station.

A patrol officer was stationed on the southwest entrance/ exit of the shopping center. Several officers were at the Vons Store and another patrol officer was at the southwest corner of the USA station.

SUMMARY OF OFFENSE:

Source: San Jose Police Department crime report #86-273-0443 and a review of the Preliminary Hearing transcript dated December 1, 1986.

On September 30, 1986, at approximately 11:05 a.m., 23-year-old [redacted] a [redacted] was kidnapped from her brother's home and raped. She told police she was standing in the kitchen and turned around to find the defendant in the living room walking toward her. She was confused because she did not know who he was, or how he got into the house. He said someone in the back called him in. He was waving a piece of paper at her, telling her he needed her parents' signature for the sale of tires. The victim had no idea what he was talking about as her parents did not live at that residence. She thought briefly perhaps her brother had ordered the tires, but, before she could see the paper, the defendant grabbed her with his arms and she started to scream. He told her to be quiet, and they struggled. He grabbed a knife that was sitting on the kitchen counter. They struggled more and the victim scratched the defendant's face. He pushed her down to a corner of the kitchen and put his hand over her mouth, telling her not to scream. Although he had the knife to her side, he told he was not going to hurt her.

The defendant then forced the victim to go into the bedroom and ordered her to lie down on the bed facing the wall. He started rummaging through her dirty laundry and pulled out some nylons, a belt, and a sock. He tied the victim's hands with the belt and tied her feet with the nylons. While he was doing this, he kept saying, "All you had to do was sign the paper. That's all you had to do." The victim offered to sign the papers so he could leave, but he pretty much ignored her. The defendant then tied the victim's hands and feet together behind her back. The defendant began pacing the living room and bedroom and began asking the victim where her parents were. She tried to mislead him into believing they lived there, but, before she could do so, the smoke alarm went off in the kitchen. The victim indicated she had been cooking French fries for lunch when the defendant entered the house. They began to burn as they were unattended and that's what made the smoke alarm go off. The defendant went into the kitchen and dismantled the smoke alarm. When he could not get the one in the hallway dismantled, he broke it.

The defendant then took the victim from the bedroom to the kitchen and from there carried her to the trunk of his car. He told her to close her eyes, but the victim reports she was frightened and did not want to do so. When he entered the garage, she saw the trunk door was already open. He put her inside and closed it.

The victim reports the defendant took \$28 she had sitting on her dresser inside a Kleenex box, before he left the residence.

The victim believes they drove between fifteen and twenty minutes before the defendant stopped the car and asked her if she was all right. He then continued for a few more minutes and stopped again. As he opened the trunk, he said, "I want to take you out. Just walk straight ahead and don't look back." He tried to cover her with a brown plastic bag, but because of its large bulky size, was unable to do so. Thus, he picked her up and untied her feet from her hands and carried her inside a house.

The victim described the house as small and abandoned with "junk" inside. There was no glass in the windows. He took her into the bedroom where she observed a mattress on the floor. He told her to sit down on the mattress and started talking about leaving tied and calling the police. He also mentioned driving her someplace else and letting her out on the street. He warned her that he might just be telling her this and hide somewhere for a few minutes. He warned her not to yell or scream because he might be around the corner and could hear her.

The victim indicates the defendant did leave the house, and she heard the car drive away. She was still tied up, and a short time later, heard some voices which sounded like two distinct people. She stood up and tried to peak out of the door, but was afraid to go too far as she feared it might be the defendant and she did not want him to see her. A short while later, he walked back into the house, still carrying the knife with him. The knife was in his pants, stuck in the waistband area. As he entered, he said, "You are a good girl. You did what I told you to do."

The defendant left the room for a short time, returning with some rags and a little thin mattress and a sofa chair. He started to board up a door that led into the room, telling the victim not to be afraid. She told him she was afraid and he said, "There's nothing I can do to hurt you." She said, "Yes, you could kill me or rape me." He said, "No, I'm not going to do that." After a few moments, he said, "Since you brought it up, you know, I guess I will." The defendant told the victim to take her clothes off. As the door was boarded up, and the defendant still had the knife, the victim complied with his demands. The defendant then took off his clothing and then began pacing the floor, saying he did not know what he was doing and spoke of taking drugs the night before. He then laid down on the mattress and instructed the victim to lie beside him. He said, "Stick my penis in your mouth." Victim [redacted] said this happened twice with the defendant telling her to tighten her mouth around his penis, telling her to, "Pull the skin back." Once he obtained a full

The victim described the defendant as pacing around the room and looking out the window. He then had sexual intercourse with the victim a second time, telling her not to worry that he had been "clipped" (had a vasectomy). After the second act of intercourse was completed, the defendant cleaned himself and the victim and tied her hands behind her back down to her feet using the nylons and a telephone wire with a phone jack attached. The victim indicates the defendant had the knife at the right or left-hand corner of the mattress during the sexual assault. He warned her that it would be nearby in case he needed to use it, stating if there was any trouble he would not hesitate to stick her with a knife.

After they dressed, the defendant wiped off all the fingerprints where he had touched around the window and the door and dusted off the victim's fingernails. He moved aside the things he used to block the door and asked the victim to forgive him. He asked for a few minutes to get away and then he left.

The victim was worried he might be tricking her again so she waited with her hands and feet tied together for approximately ten minutes. At that time her hands were tied in front of her and they were beginning to hurt and starting to turn blue. She tore apart the nylon with her teeth and then untied her feet with her hands and went for help. The victim states she walked out onto the dirt road and was taken to a nearby 7-Eleven by a woman whom she met at a nearby trailer. The woman gave her money to telephone the police, which she did.

After a couple of months of investigation, the defendant was arrested on October 16, 1986. He waived his rights per Miranda and initially adamantly denied any wrongdoing. Eventually, he told police he had taken his girlfriend to work and then turned into Almaden Plaza. A guy he had met at a party drove by and offered to share a BCP cigarette with him. He described driving under the influence and visions he had. He insisted he could not remember the details of the assault. Defendant Jaramillo said he was not in his right mind and asked to speak to the victim. He then requested to speak to a reporter about what he had done.

After a couple of hours of speaking to the police, the defendant said he did remember the assault, but he said it was not him, that he was "loaded." He questioned the police, stating, "If my mind worked, how can I be so nice, how can I be so kind, how can I be so good to so many people and do something like that."

That's beyond me." He said he does not carry a knife, but he remembers he had a knife. He does not know how he got it, but said he had no intention of hurting the victim.

The defendant elaborated, stating he did not mean to rape the victim, but, "She made it too easy for me, I guess." He stated, "She made it easy to where it wasn't a rape; I didn't tear her clothes off; I know I did not hurt her; we talked, because she kept telling me 'don't kill me.'" She told him she was scared of him. He said he was still "loaded," and after he left the victim, he drove by and parked on a side street and sat there for hours. He said his head was down and nothing was really sinking in, but his head was "beeping and popping." After a moment of reflection, defendant Jaramillo said again that it was not a rape and stated, "We actually made passionate love, in a sense." He said the victim enjoyed it. He said they laid talking for a while after they made love, and he told her his life's story, other than his name.

Prior to leaving the victim, the defendant told her he was sorry and told her he was on drugs and not thinking right. He told the victim, "Darn it -- I was not going to rape you, you know, why did you offer yourself like that?" She replied she was trying to save herself, but she thought he was going to kill her.

VICTIM'S STATEMENT: (Appearance Unknown)

Written correspondence was mailed to the victim, advising her of the date and time of sentencing and her right to be present and heard. Although the letter was not returned, there has been no response. The District Attorney file reveals the victim has moved to San Francisco, but the address is unknown. Attempts to contact the victim through her family have been unsuccessful. Should contact be effective prior to sentencing, this officer will forward the victim's statement to the court via memorandum.

DEFENDANT'S STATEMENT: (Requested - Not Received)

When interviewed, the defendant told this officer he thinks about what he did every day of his life. He said, "I wish I could see her and hug her and tell her I'm sorry. It would make me feel better." He denied hitting her, stating, "I've never even hit my kid." The defendant describes himself as a "compassionate man who loves mankind and constantly performs acts of human kindness." He said he even said "please" when he asked the victim not to scream. The defendant feels the victim sort of enticed him. He explained she took off her blouse and said, "Is this what you want, you S.O.B.?" Defendant Jaramillo said that

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he "blended into the scene" and satisfied the woman; "being the man I am, I accommodated her."

It is the defendant's statement that he knows he did wrong and deserves to be punished. In fact, he "wants" to be punished. But, he wants the court to see "where my heart is," to look at him as an individual and realize that 28 years would be the rest of his life.

Throughout the interview, the defendant spoke disparately about his attorney. He feels she lied to him and has never really had his interest at heart.

INTERESTED PARTIES:

On January 2, 1970, in Tulare County, the defendant was granted two years probation and 180 days in county jail following the conviction for Section 10851 CVC (Drive or Take Vehicle), Court Docket #16480.

DISCUSSION:

The defendant has admitted two separate acts within the meaning of Section 12022(b) PC (Personal Use of a Dangerous Weapon), thereby potentially enhancing the period of confinement by one year for each count.

The defendant has admitted four separate acts within the meaning of Section 12022.3(a) PC (Use of a Dangerous Weapon During the Commission of a Sex Offense) thereby potentially enhancing the period of confinement by three years for each count.

The defendant has committed four separate acts within the meaning of Section 667.8 PC (Kidnapping to Commit Felony Sex Offense) thereby potentially enhancing the period of confinement by three years for each act.

Evaluation:

Appearing before the Court, having pled guilty to nine felony offenses is 36-year-old Jose Luis Jaramillo. The defendant has several misdemeanor convictions and one prior felony.

The defendant is a married man who has been separated from his wife for the past two years. He is father of three children who all reside with the mother. The defendant completed 11 years of formal education, discontinuing his studies prior to earning a diploma. He is currently unemployed and has a history of short-term employment with no particular trade.

The defendant reports he has used heroin, methamphetamine, and cocaine for the past three years. He indicates he was under the influence of these drugs in addition to PCP when he committed these crimes.

Defendant Jaramillo portrays himself as a gentle man who is induced to commit these ghastly acts because of another person who lives inside him, a man he calls, "Richard." He is willing to be punished for his illicit conduct, but asks the court for leniency based on his prior acts of kindness to mankind.

The defendant seems to give no thought to the terror [REDACTED] a [REDACTED] experienced when he walked into her home, bound her, put her in the trunk of her car, and drove her to a deserted house to rape her. He feels she is responsible for the rape for putting the idea in his head. The defendant ignores the knife he held to threaten [REDACTED]'s life, pretending it did not exist. He totally denies the acts of oral copulation, stating he is "deformed" and does not like women to see his penis. Finally, the defendant denies he robbed the victim of her \$28.

All indications tend to support the fact that the defendant poses a serious threat to the community and will continue to remain a threat for many years to come. His actions show he cannot place limitations and control on his behavior that are necessary to live in a free society. He must be confined for the protection of present and potential victims.

Consecutive sentencing has been recommended as the crimes involved are separate acts of violence and were committed at different times and places. Further, the victim was particularly vulnerable and the acts showed criminal sophistication (Judicial Council Rule 425).

No information is provided on his behavior while he was in the above institution.

CRIMINAL HISTORY:

Dates from 1969 with a juvenile arrest for contributing to the delinquency of a minor. His other offenses include auto theft, battery, being under the influence of controlled substance, and the present offenses.

EVALUATION:

Subject is a 36-year-old, first term, received 10-14-87 from Santa Clara County following a conviction by plea to Rape With Force With Use of Deadly Weapon, two counts, Oral Copulation With Use of Force, two counts, Robbery of an Inhabited Dwelling and Burglary First Degree. He is serving a 23 year term. The POR reflects that Subject kidnapped the victim from her brother's home at approximately 11:00 a.m. He used the ruse of trying to get her to sign for some tires and grabbed her. After a struggle, he tied her up and put her in the trunk of a car. During the time he was struggling with her, he had a knife in his hand. He drove the vehicle to a different house and placed her on a mattress. There he raped her and forced her to perform fellatio on him. After he finished, he wiped the area of his fingerprints and left. The victim waited a while and then untied herself by using her teeth. She went to a convenience type market and phoned the police. After investigation, Subject was arrested for the offense.

Subject states he does not remember the assault; claims he was loaded on PCP and other drugs. He went further to blame the victim for the rape, stating that she even suggested it. Other than being incarcerated, he does not appear to be remorseful concerning his actions.

Subject appears to have sufficient academic education and being a jewelry maker by trade. In addition, he claims to have attended an auto mechanic's trade school and has worked at that trade. As a result, no further training is deemed necessary.

During the interview, Subject was alert, courteous, polite and cooperative. He states he intends to take advantage of the drug treatment program or whatever is offered in CDC while he is incarcerated and, if possible, have his case overturned. He is a mature male, appears to be physically fit, and should not have any problems performing his assignments.

During the early morning hours of September 7, 1999, the on-duty dispatch sergeant, John Hoelker, called me at my home. He advised me that there had been an officer-involved shooting at the 700 block of Ventura Street of Fillmore. He then requested that I respond to the location to assist the assigned investigators.

Upon my arrival, I met with Captain Fadler, the Major Crime's manager. Shortly after this time, the suspect's brother, [Redacted] [Redacted] arrived at the scene. Apparently, [Redacted] told the field deputies who were at the perimeter of the scene, that he had some information concerning the incident, and wanted to talk to an investigator. Captain Fadler assigned me to interview him.

The following is a summary of the tape-recorded interview.

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After being introduced to [redacted] by Sergeant Zermeno, I was told that [redacted] had received a phone call from his brother, suspect-Joe, earlier this morning with information related to this incident. Armed with this information, I then began interviewing [redacted].

[redacted] said he received a phone call earlier this morning at his home, which he thought was around 3:00 A.M., from his brother Joe. [redacted] remarked that he believed the length of the call was "one minute." [redacted] then continued by saying that Joe told him, "he wasn't guilty of what they accused him of. And, no matter what happened, he wasn't going back to prison. Either way, he said they gonna, there going to kill him in prison, either way. He said he wasn't going to go back." [redacted] then remarked that Joe had told about his desire not to go back to prison once before.

At the time, I wasn't very familiar with the allegations involved in the sex charge that Joe was currently wanted for by Oxnard P.D. In this regard, I asked [redacted] what he knew about this matter, for the purpose of seeing if Joe made any incriminating statements to [redacted]. [redacted] related the following: Unsure exactly when the incident occurred, [redacted] said at the time his brother Joe was living at their mother's home in Oxnard. [redacted] Oxnard. Phone number of [redacted]. During that time, his mother's next door neighbor (elderly female) alleged that Joe either attempted to rape her, or had raped her. [redacted] said it was in regard to this that Joe professed his complete innocence to him during the phone call. To his knowledge, [redacted] said Joe made any admissions to others that [redacted] was aware of. Unable to handle the possibility of going back to prison, Joe has been on the "run" since these allegations surfaced.

[redacted] then continued relating to me what Joe said during their brief phone call. [redacted] said, "He was tired of running. He said he doesn't want to hide. He doesn't want to steal. He's not like that. He's not guilty. He said...he's not going back no matter what." [redacted] added that Joe told him, "If I have to... I'll have a shoot out before I go back to prison."

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█████n said he pleaded with his brother not to get involved in a shoot-out, but rather suggested that he just give himself up. Joe responded by again expressing the fact that he wasn't going back to prison. I asked ██████n if he knew where Joe was calling from. ██████n said, "He said he was calling from Fillmore. He said Joe also said "he loved everybody, and to tell everybody that he loved them." Then he hung up and that was all."

In response to this call, ██████n got up from bed and drove into Fillmore from his home in Ventura. When he got to the area of the incident and saw the scene with the police there, he inquired by asking if there had been a "shoot-out." When he was told that there had been, ██████n asked if it involved his brother, Joe Jaramillo. When he was told that it did, he drove down the street to a pay phone and called his boss, ██████. After telling ██████ what had happened, ██████ responded and met with ██████n, where they then drove over together to the scene so he could tell the deputies about his earlier phone call he had with Joe.

This concluded the interview.

Later I spoke with Mr. ██████ which was also tape-recorded. His address is provided in the Additional Names' Report. He basically corroborated ██████n's story which involved him.

On 09-07-99, at approximately 0545 hours, I received a phone call from Sergeant Hoelker. Hoelker told me that an officer involved shooting had occurred in the city of Fillmore, and requested that I respond to the shopping center located near the intersection of Ventura Street and 'A' Street. I arrived at approximately 0645 hours and met with other detectives from the major crimes bureau. Sergeant Howe, who is a Less Than Lethal team leader and was present during the shooting, briefed us on the incident. After the briefing, Sergeant Lorenzen directed me to interview A-1 Jaramillo's former parole agent, Boris Romanowsky, who is a witness to this incident. I began my interview with Romanowsky at approximately 0750 hours and he told me in summary the following:

Romanowsky told me that he was assigned as Jaramillo's parole agent from approximately January of 1999 until about 08-12-99. On 07-12-99, Jaramillo's parole was suspended and a warrant for his arrest was

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
issued. Romanowsky retained the case for about thirty days after Jaramillo's parole was suspended (07-12-99), before turning the case over to the Fugitive Apprehension Team (approximately 08-12-99). Parole agent Bill Flores is currently assigned as Jaramillo's parole agent.

Romanowsky told me that Jaramillo was released from prison and placed on parole on 05-09-98, and was initially assigned to parole agent Clara Serrano, before being transferred to agent Romanowsky in January of 1999. Romanowsky told me that Jaramillo is a 290 PC registrant.

I asked Romanowsky if he knew of Jaramillo making any suicide threats in the past, or if he had any other problems with Jaramillo. Romanowsky replied by saying, "No. He was a relatively stable case from the time he paroled on 05-09-98 until an incident that occurred on or about 07-11-99. Up until then he had stable housing, he was reporting, he was testing clean, he was attending our parole outpatient clinic, and living with his parents on [REDACTED] Street in Oxnard". Romanowsky went on to tell me that on approximately 07-11-99, Jaramillo was named as a suspect in a case involving a sexual battery and an attempted rape of a 72 year old woman who lived near him. Jaramillo has been "on the run" since that crime occurred. The woman specifically named Jaramillo as the suspect in that case, which is being investigated by the Oxnard Police Department. Romanowsky said there was a parole hold warrant for Jaramillo, however he is not sure whether the Oxnard Police Department obtained a warrant for Jaramillo's arrest.

Romanowsky said that since Jaramillo has been "on the run", Romanowsky received several phone calls from him. Jaramillo told Romanowsky that he was ready to surrender. Romanowsky told Jaramillo that he needed to come to the office. Jaramillo told Romanowsky that he would think about it and call him back, however Jaramillo never turned himself in.

Romanowsky said that on 09-07-99, at about 0342 hours, he received a phone call from Cal ID (Sacramento warrants), and the phone call was transferred to Ventura County Sheriff's Sergeant Hoelker. Hoelker told Romanowsky what was happening in Fillmore, and told Romanowsky that Jaramillo wanted to speak with Deputy Max Pina and with Romanowsky. Romanowsky called his supervisor, then drove to McDonalds (actually Carl's Jr.) in Fillmore where he met with the Sheriff's Less Than Lethal team at about

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0415 hours. Sergeant Howe briefed Romanowsky on the incident. Romanowsky said that Jaramillo does not know his case was transferred to the fugitive unit, and that Jaramillo believes Romanowsky is still his parole agent.

Romanowsky walked to the area where Jaramillo was. Romanowsky took up a position of cover behind some electrical utility boxes, located northwest of the parking lot, on the south side of the USA gas station. Deputy Pina was talking with Jaramillo as Romanowsky walked up. Romanowsky estimated that he and Pina were approximately 40' way from Jaramillo. I asked Romanowsky what Pina had been talking to Jaramillo about. Romanowsky said that he could not remember hearing anything specific, and that when he arrived Pina told him to talk with Jaramillo.

Romanowsky began talking with Jaramillo. Jaramillo told Romanowsky "good morning" and apologized for bothering him at such an early hour. Jaramillo told Romanowsky that Pina was a good guy and that he (Romanowsky) should get to know him. Jaramillo told Romanowsky that he also thought Romanowsky was a fair person and that he wanted him there. Jaramillo asked Romanowsky what he was specifically wanted for. Romanowsky told Jaramillo that he had a parole warrant, and that he was "under investigation only" for the incident involving his neighbor. Jaramillo told Romanowsky something to the effect of, "I didn't do that. I'm innocent. I don't want to go back to prison. It's gonna end here. I don't trust the system".

Romanowsky tried to calm Jaramillo down and told him he needed to "close it down at the lowest possible level". Romanowsky at one point told Jaramillo to take the jacket off his right side and to keep his hands exposed. Romanowsky estimated he talked with Jaramillo for less than five minutes, trying to talk him into surrendering. Jaramillo had a jacket draped over his right shoulder and right arm. Romanowsky could not tell if Jaramillo's right hand was in his pocket or just under the jacket. Romanowsky described the jacket as a light to medium weight windbreaker, but could not specifically remember the color.

I asked Romanowsky if Jaramillo had mentioned having a weapon underneath the jacket. Romanowsky said that Jaramillo did not say anything about having a weapon, and Romanowsky did not ask him if he had a

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weapon. Romanowsky did not want to mention anything about weapons to Jaramillo, because he did not want Jaramillo to think about an additional charge he would face for being an ex-convict in possession of a weapon. I asked Romanowsky if he believed Jaramillo had a weapon. Romanowsky said his feeling during his conversation with Jaramillo was that "It was highly likely that he had a weapon under there". Romanowsky added that, "As the incident progressed I thought he certainly had a weapon". I asked Romanowsky why he was more convinced Jaramillo had a weapon as time progressed. Romanowsky replied something to the effect of, "Because as he was taking shots from the, I think it is the SL-6, the rubber round, he didn't change his attitude, he did not expose his hand, and the jacket actually became more wrapped around his hand as though there was a weapon in it. It appeared to me that there was enough coverage on his hand that there was probably a weapon in there. And the fact that he was taking rounds and not, which would had to be painful, and not saying 'I surrender' or anything to that effect, I thought at that time he certainly, there was a high likelihood that he had a weapon under there".

I asked Romanowsky if he heard Jaramillo tell any of the deputies that he had a weapon. Romanowsky told me that when he arrived on scene he was told that Jaramillo had a weapon. During Romanowsky's conversation with Jaramillo, Romanowsky never mentioned anything about weapons. Romanowsky did not remember hearing Jaramillo say anything about having a weapon.

I confirmed with Romanowsky that he had talked with Jaramillo for less than five minutes before the shooting took place. Romanowsky estimated that he talked with Jaramillo for 3-4 minutes before the shooting. I asked Romanowsky what Jaramillo's response was after Romanowsky told him what he was wanted for. Romanowsky replied by saying something to the effect of, "He said that he didn't do it. He didn't do anything. He didn't violate his parole. He wasn't more specific than that to the best of my recollection". Romanowsky said that Jaramillo also made some type of comment about his distrust for the criminal justice system.

I asked Romanowsky if he remembered anything else about his conversation with Jaramillo besides what he already told me. Romanowsky said that he told Jaramillo they needed to resolve the incident at the lowest level. Jaramillo then told Romanowsky something to the effect of, "It's gonna end here. I'm gonna end it here". Romanowsky told Jaramillo to calm down so that they could end it peacefully. I asked Romanowsky

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if Jaramillo mentioned that he was going to shoot himself, or if he wanted the police to shoot him. Romanowsky replied, "No. He didn't say anything. He said 'It's gonna end here' something to that effect".

I asked Romanowsky to explain when the first shots were fired. Romanowsky said that he was speaking with Jaramillo when he saw Jaramillo get hit with a "rubber round", that hit him "almost dead center". Romanowsky said he was not sure where that round was fired from, but believes it came from a Less Than Lethal team member who was standing to the right side of him (Romanowsky). Jaramillo was facing Romanowsky at that time, and the round hit him (Jaramillo) in the chest area. Jaramillo went to the ground after being struck with the first round.

Jaramillo got back up and began yelling something to the effect of "fuck you guys!". The deputies repeatedly told Jaramillo to stay down, keep his hands up, and to take the jacket off his hand. Jaramillo continued to get up and yell "fuck you!". Jaramillo got hit with a second "rubber round" and started running south, towards the stores and other officers who were staged on the south side of the parking lot in the shopping center. Romanowsky estimated about 5-6 seconds elapsed between the first and second "rubber rounds" being fired. Romanowsky said that he heard a flashbang go off about this time and said "there was a lot of noise". Romanowsky said that he did not see who fired the second "rubber round", but that he believes it came from the same area as the first. I asked Romanowsky where the flashbang came from. Romanowsky said that he was not sure, but that "it appeared to be a big flash right in front of him".

Romanowsky said that after the first two "rubber rounds" were fired and he heard the flashbang, he took a better cover position behind the utility boxes and lost sight of Jaramillo for a period of time. Romanowsky heard additional rounds being fired. He did not know if they were "rubber rounds", 9mm, or shotgun rounds. When Romanowsky looked out from his cover position again he saw that Jaramillo was down. Romanowsky believes he saw Jaramillo get shot a couple more times with "rubber" before standing up again. Jaramillo then continued to walk south in the parking lot, towards the stores and the other officers. As Jaramillo had begun to stand up, Romanowsky and the other officers were yelling at Jaramillo to stay down and put his hands up. Jaramillo continued to get up and was saying "fuck you guys!". Jaramillo still had the

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jacket covering his right hand. Romanowsky estimated Jaramillo to be about 55' away from his cover position at this time.

Romanowsky again said that when he heard all the firing he was unable to tell what type of weapons were being fired. He also thought there was a good possibility that Jaramillo had begun firing. When Romanowsky looked out from his cover position and saw Jaramillo proceeding south, Romanowsky heard more shots and saw Jaramillo go down again. The officers then converged on Jaramillo, held him down, pulled the jacket away, and handcuffed him. Romanowsky did not remember specifically which officers apprehended Jaramillo, but did say it was members of the Less Than Lethal team. Romanowsky did not see anybody shoot a shotgun or a 9mm gun. Romanowsky said he saw Jaramillo get hit with four "rubber rounds". A deputy later told Romanowsky that Jaramillo had been shot with six "rubber rounds".

Romanowsky said that the paramedics were staging in the area. They arrived shortly after Jaramillo was apprehended and treated Jaramillo. Jaramillo was then transported in the ambulance.

The interview with Romanowsky was tape-recorded. The cassette tape will be retained in the case file.

Sergeant Lorenzen and I later conducted individual walk-throughs of the crime scene with Sergeant Howe, Sr. Dep. Norris, Deputy Nickels, and Deputy Stephens. I tape-recorded the walk-throughs while Field Evidence Technician Joy Self videotaped them.

On 09-07-99, at about 0835 hours, we began our walk-through with Sergeant Howe. This time was also used as an interview with Howe. Howe told us in summary the following:

Howe said that he walked from the parking lot of Carl's Jr. to the shopping center where the patrol deputies had Jaramillo surrounded. Howe walked with Sr. Deputy Scott Norris and Sr. Deputy William Schierman, who are both fellow Less Than Lethal team members. Howe said that parole agent Romanowsky also walked with them. When they left the parking lot of Carl's Jr., they crossed Ventura Street to the area of Super A grocery store. They crossed 'A' Street on the north side of Ventura Street. They then crossed Ventura Street to the USA gas station. They took up a position of cover behind some electric utility boxes located on the south side of the USA gas station, which is just northwest of the parking lot. When they arrived at their position of cover there were three patrol deputies there. The only deputy that Howe recognized was Max Pina.

Sr. Deputy Mike Macias and Deputy David Nickels, both of whom are Less Than Lethal team members, had been deployed and were maneuvering through the residential area that is south of the Chevron station, and would eventually take up a position on the southwest portion of the parking lot.

Howe said that he, Norris, Schierman, and Romanowsky relieved the patrol deputies that were present where they took up their cover position. Howe took up a position behind one of the utility boxes. (Refer to videotape for his estimated position.) Howe said that Schierman took a position to his right, and Norris took up a position to his left. Howe saw Jaramillo in the parking lot, and pointed out a bottle to us that was on a curb in the parking lot. Howe said that Jaramillo was standing near that bottle and was facing him, as he (Jaramillo) talked with Pina and Romanowsky. The bottle appeared to be approximately 40' south of where Howe was standing.

Howe said that he was armed with an MP-5 that has a light attached to it. Schierman also was armed with an MP-5 that has a light attached. Norris was armed with a SL-6, which is a Less Than Lethal weapon that fires 37mm baton rounds. Norris also had a light on his weapon.

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Lorenzen asked Howe if he had received any information on Jaramillo prior to being deployed. Howe said that he was told Jaramillo was a parolee at large, he had served 11 or 12 years of a 23 year prison sentence for rape and kidnapping, that he was currently wanted for another rape, and possibly was involved in a homicide in Oxnard. Howe said that he was also told Jaramillo was threatening to shoot and threatened to have a gun, but that nobody had seen a gun. Howe said that he was given this information at the Less Than Lethal team briefing. Howe also received information that Jaramillo was going to start shooting just to prove that he had a gun. Howe believes this information was broadcast over the radio.

Romanowsky started talking with Jaramillo. Jaramillo stated that he "can't go back" and said he was not going to do what Romanowsky asked him to. Howe could not remember exactly what was said, but told us that Romanowsky started a "general conversation" with Jaramillo. Romanowsky asked Jaramillo to put down the jacket, and to put down the gun if he had one. Jaramillo would not comply at all with Romanowsky's requests. Jaramillo was moving around, fidgeting, and moving to his left and right. Jaramillo was standing at this time.

Howe turned on the light of his weapon and obtained a good sight picture on Jaramillo. Norris told Howe that he had a good sight picture with his weapon also. Howe then saw his other team (Mike Macias, David Nickels, and John Wright) "come across the face of the stores" (on the southwest portion of the parking lot). Howe said at that point, "I know that my arrest/rescue team and my alternate less lethal team is in position so I know that we're set to go".

Howe said that he did not think Jaramillo initially saw the other team come up, but at some point he thinks Jaramillo saw them. Howe said that Schierman made an announcement over the radio that flashbangs were going to be deployed, so that patrol deputies would be aware of what was happening. Howe also said that Sergeant DeLosSantos initiated a patrol roll call to ensure the patrol deputies knew what was going on. Howe also said that in the briefing they talked about "sympathetic shooting", to make sure that everybody maintained good weapon control if somebody else fired any rounds.

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Howe said that Jaramillo kept telling them to get the light out of his face. Howe told Norris to fire a round whenever he could. Howe said that he alerted the arrest/rescue team (Nickels and Macias) of this. Howe said that Macias and Nickels were by a patrol car that he pointed out to us, on the southwest portion of the parking lot. Howe told us that Wright was somewhere on the west side of the parking lot. Howe also said that Deputy Volpe, who is another Less Than Lethal team member, was on the east side of the perimeter covering Deputy Orr, the K-9 handler.

Howe said that Jaramillo had a light windbreaker over his right shoulder and "full length arm". Howe said that Jaramillo lit a cigarette, but never exposed his right arm or hand. Howe said that all Jaramillo's movements indicated he was concealing something underneath the jacket.

Howe said that Norris took a shot at Jaramillo and that it was a "good clean shot". The force of the baton round forced Jaramillo to the ground. The arrest/rescue team (Nickels and Macias) started to move towards Jaramillo. Jaramillo got up and was still near the bottle, standing on the asphalt. Jaramillo started to turn, at which time Norris struck him with a second baton round. Jaramillo went down and got up again. Jaramillo was, "yelling and screaming like he was in pain but he was also upset".

Jaramillo started moving towards Nickels and Macias, and he still had his right arm and hand concealed. Howe then heard the sound of a 9mm being fired and indicated he heard two shots. Howe also heard flashbangs and a shotgun being fired. He was unable to remember the exact sequence of the weapons being fired and said it all happened very fast. Howe began to yell for the people to cease-fire. Howe and Schierman moved to their right to go through an opening in the chain-link fence. Norris climbed the fence. All three of them began moving towards Jaramillo. Jaramillo started to get back up and Norris hit him again with baton rounds. Jaramillo was on the ground and said something to the effect of, "I'll shoot, I'll shoot". Jaramillo still had the jacket around his wrist and hand at this point. Jaramillo put the jacket near his chin, at which time Norris fired another baton round, striking Jaramillo in the buttock area. Howe said that they then "swarmed him". Jaramillo was still refusing to follow directions and was struggling. Howe believes that either Schierman or Wright handcuffed Jaramillo.

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Lorenzen asked Howe if he had accounted for the rounds that were fired. Howe said that he asked his team members who fired rounds. Macias told Howe that he fired two rounds from his MP-5. Howe said he saw two holes in Jaramillo's hip. Norris told Howe that he had fired all six baton rounds from his SL-6. All of the other Less Than Lethal team members told Howe they did not fire their weapons. One of the team members pointed out to Howe that patrol Deputy Pettit had fired at least one round from a shotgun.

I asked Howe if he noticed what Jaramillo was doing when he (Howe) heard the 9mm rounds being fired. Howe replied, "He was up and he was moving towards Nickels and Macias". I asked Howe if he saw what movements Jaramillo had made just prior to being shot. Howe said that Jaramillo still had his hand covered with the jacket, his hand was up, and he was moving towards Nickels and Macias. Howe said at that point Jaramillo had his back turned to him, Schierman, and Norris. Howe said at that point every indication was that Jaramillo had a weapon.

Lorenzen and I confirmed with Howe that the first two baton rounds were fired from behind the chain link fence, and that the last four were fired from the side of the fence that Jaramillo was on. Howe said that was correct. Howe made no indication that he actually saw a 9mm or a shotgun being fired.

The interview with Howe was tape-recorded. The cassette tape will be retained in the case file.

Lorenzen and I then conducted a walk-through of the crime scene with Sr. Dep. Norris at approximately 0903 hours. The walk-through was also used as an interview with Norris and was videotaped by Field Evidence Technician Joy Self. Norris told us in summary the following:

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**Interview of Sr. Dep. Scott Norris**

Norris said that on 09-07-99, at about 0334 hours, he received a page from Sergeant Howe to activate the Less Than Lethal team. The message that Norris received was that there was a subject with a gun, and he was to respond to Carl's Jr. in Fillmore. Norris arrived and met with the rest of the team. They were told in a briefing of an adult Hispanic male, who is a parolee at large, who supposedly had a gun. They were told that the subject was a "third striker" and was very distraught. They were also told that the subject was "not going to go down easy" and that he was "either going to take his own life out or he's gonna take someone with him". Norris said that Sergeant Howe conducted the briefing.

Norris was told to use an SL-6 and was designated as one of the shooters. David Nickels was designated as another shooter with an SL-6. Norris described the SL-6 as a Less Than Lethal weapon, that holds six polyurethane baton rounds. Norris said that the SL-6 is listed as a "Category three" weapon, and is considered the same level as a standard baton in the force continuum. Norris described the weapon as "a baton used at an extended range".

Norris said that he was deployed to the parking lot where the subject was, along with Sr. Dep. Schierman and Sergeant Howe, both of whom are fellow Less Than Lethal team members. Parole agent Romanowsky was also with them. They walked from Carl's Jr., east on highway 126 (Ventura Street). When they got to the area where IHOP (International House of Pancakes) was, Norris could see across 'A' Street to where the subject was standing. In order to keep themselves concealed, they crossed highway 126 towards Super A Foods. They continued eastbound to the Texaco Express Lube. They crossed highway 126 to the USA gas station. They continued to the rear of the USA gas station and took up a position of cover behind some electric utility boxes located on the south side of the gas station. This position is just northwest of the parking lot. Norris said that there were three deputies at that location when they arrived. Norris recognized Deputy Wiggins and Deputy Pina, but did not know the name of the third deputy.

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Norris noticed Jaramillo standing in the parking lot with "the jacket draped over him". Norris said that Jaramillo was standing near a juice bottle that he pointed out to us, and said Jaramillo was smoking and moving around a lot. Norris also said that Jaramillo was not showing his right side. Norris at first deployed to Howe's right side, but then decided he would be in a better position on Howe's left side. At this point Norris heard Romanowsky talking with Jaramillo. Romanowsky was telling Jaramillo that they could talk about the case, and requested Jaramillo take off the jacket and show his hands. Jaramillo was not responding to Romanowsky's requests. Jaramillo repeatedly complained about the lights in his face.

After about five or ten minutes, Howe asked Norris if he had a clear shot and Norris told him that he did. Howe told Norris to let him know when he was ready. Norris was aware that the other Less Than Lethal team members were in position at that time. Norris was unable to tell if Jaramillo actually had a weapon at that point. Norris noticed that whatever Jaramillo did, such as bending over to get a cigarette, he would only use his left hand. When Norris had a clear shot at Jaramillo, he fired one baton round, striking him in the abdomen area and knocking him down.

About three to five seconds later Norris noticed the arrest team (Macias and Nickels) approach Jaramillo. About this same time Norris noticed Jaramillo get up. Jaramillo still had his right hand covered. Jaramillo ran westbound onto the grass area at this point. Norris fired a second baton round and believes that round struck Jaramillo on his right side. Norris did not remember if the second baton round knocked Jaramillo to the ground. Norris said that Schierman deployed a flashbang about the time he (Norris) fired the second shot. Jaramillo then turned away from Norris and began to run towards the patrol car on the south side of the parking lot, where Macias and Nickels were positioned.

Norris then heard what he described as, "a distinct sound of a gun going off which I thought to be the MP-5". Norris then added, "I heard the two pops, heard another flashbang go off, and then he went down in the fetal position probably where that wet spot is". Norris gave no indication that he saw an MP-5 being fired. He also gave no indication that he saw or heard a shotgun being fired. Norris then pointed out the area he was talking about which can be shown in the videotape. Norris heard Howe yelling for everyone to cease fire.

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Norris said he climbed the chain link fence at that point and started running across the grass towards Jaramillo. Norris said that Jaramillo was lying on his back with his knees bent and his feet on the ground, and that he was "in the sit up position". Jaramillo was positioned with his head to the east and his feet to the west. Jaramillo was yelling and screaming something to the effect of, "finish it, finish it, do me, do me!". Norris noticed that Schierman had also approached Jaramillo at that point. Schierman was yelling at Jaramillo, telling him to show his hands, however Jaramillo was not complying. Norris knelt down and fired a third baton round at Jaramillo, striking him on the right side. Jaramillo continued to ignore the commands and still had his right hand covered. Norris fired a fourth baton round at Jaramillo, striking him in the buttocks area. Norris and Schierman started to move around to the left of Jaramillo, and Jaramillo was still ignoring the commands and not showing his right hand. Norris fired a fifth baton round, striking Jaramillo on the right side. Jaramillo still would not respond to the commands, and Norris fired a sixth and final baton round at him, striking him on the right side.

By this time several deputies had "dogpiled" on Jaramillo and forced his hands out. Norris said there was a lot of yelling going on at this point, and he could not hear if Jaramillo was saying anything. Jaramillo was taken into custody at that point.

Detective Lorenzen had Norris position Field Evidence Technician Ian Farrell where he (Norris) first saw Jaramillo. Norris then directed Farrell where to move, to show the movements of Jaramillo during the course of the incident. This re-enactment was videotaped to show Jaramillo's actions, to the best of Norris' recollection.

The interview with Norris was tape-recorded. The cassette tape will be retained in the case file.

Sergeant Lorenzen and I then conducted a walk-through of the crime scene with Deputy Nickels at approximately 0934 hours. The walk-through was also used as an interview with Nickels and was videotaped by Field Evidence Technician Joy Self. Nickels told us in summary the following:

Nickels said that he had received a message on his pager that there was a subject in a parking lot with a gun in Fillmore. Nickels responded to Carl's Jr., where Sergeant Howe conducted the Less Than Lethal briefing. One of the patrol deputies gave the Less Than Lethal team a basic layout of the scene. Deputy Wright talked to parole agent Romanowsky to obtain background information on Jaramillo, which Wright passed on to the Less Than Lethal team. Part of the information that the Less Than Lethal team received was that Jaramillo had stated he had a handgun and thought he was a "third striker". Sr.Dep. Macias, Deputy Wright, and Deputy Nickels were assigned to cover the south side of the parking lot.

Nickels, Macias, and Wright tried to get to their assigned position by walking through the Chevron station. They realized that this was "way too close to the problem". They then climbed some walls and got to their position by cutting through a residential area located south of the Chevron station.

Nickels and Macias went to their assigned position at the south end of the parking lot. Deputy Wright went to the west side of the parking lot to relieve the patrol deputies by the trash dumpsters. Nickels and Macias were assigned as the arrest team. Nickels was carrying an SL-6 and Macias was carrying an MP-5. Macias was Nickels's cover officer. There was a patrol car at the south end of the parking lot. Patrol Sergeant Larson was standing next to the patrol car. Nickels and Macias initially took up a position near the front driver's side of the patrol car. Sergeant Larson was standing behind the open driver's door.

Nickels said that Jaramillo was standing in the parking lot near the curb where the bottle was. (Refer to videotape) Jaramillo was engaged in a conversation with the deputies and the parole agent on the other side of the electric utility boxes. Nickels had a flashbang on the pinky finger of his strong hand. Nickels heard the SL-6 go off from the area behind the electric utility boxes. He then saw Jaramillo fall to the ground near the curb by the bottle. (Lorenzen had Nickels direct Field Evidence Technician Farrell to stand where Nickels

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remembered seeing Jaramillo during the incident. Refer to videotape for estimated positions of Jaramillo's movements.)

Deputy Macias said, "Go", which is their key to move in and make the arrest. Nickels and Macias started moving towards Jaramillo. Jaramillo then stood up and started walking towards Nickels and Macias. Nickels noted that they were previously instructed not to let Jaramillo reach the stores. As Jaramillo continued towards Nickels and Macias, Nickels deployed the flashbang by throwing it underhanded towards Jaramillo. Nickels said that prior to the flashbang going off, he saw Jaramillo falling to the ground. Nickels remembered wondering why Jaramillo was falling down before the flashbang had gone off.

Nickels and Macias had a prior plan that after they started their approach from behind the patrol car, they would move towards the left (west) to avoid any crossfire. Nickels started to move to his left, keeping his SL-6 on Jaramillo. Jaramillo was on his stomach at one point, before rolling over onto his back. Jaramillo was "fumbling with his hands down at his waist area with the jacket". Nickels could not see if Jaramillo had any weapons at that point, but he was concerned about not being able to see what was in Jaramillo's hands. Nickels then stated, "I continued moving left this way. The subject then was still fumbling with his hands but started coming up with his arms as he was laying on his back and rolling onto his, kind of like, left side towards us. At that point I said 'I don't want to go any farther this way' because his legs were pointing west and it was, it appeared to me as if he was gonna bring his arms up towards me and I didn't want to continue into that area that he was bringing his arms up". Lorenzen had Nickels show on videotape how Jaramillo had his arms at the time. Nickels said that Jaramillo's movements indicated "He possibly could have had a weapon".

Nickels then started moving back to his right (east) and "hooked back up with Macias", who had taken "more of a straight approach as opposed to a circular". Nickels and Macias then approached Jaramillo. Nickels added, "The subject was rolling around on the ground doing the thing with his arms the whole time and we were yelling at him, ya know, 'Show us your hands! Show us your hands!' and he's like 'No! Fuck you guys! Fuck you! No I'm not going to do it!' yelling all the time and plus you had the commotion from the other team approaching with the other SL-6 going off."

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Lorenzen asked Nickels if he remembered how many times the other SL-6 (that Norris had) had been fired. Nickels replied by saying, "I couldn't give you a specific. It went off a bunch of times. I was, I didn't have what I felt was a clear shot from here with my SL-6. The curb, and being slightly lower than him and him laying on his back didn't give me that great of a shot. All I can see for the most part was his knees, his hands coming up every once in a while and his head, and none of those are real good targets for the SL-6, so I never took a shot with the SL-6".

Nickels and Macias continued towards Jaramillo. Both teams eventually converged on Jaramillo and took him into custody.

I asked Nickels where Macias was when he (Macias) shot at Jaramillo. Nickels replied, "I don't recall hearing his shots go off to tell you the truth. Between the flashbangs and the SL-6, and all the commotion that was going on, I don't remember hearing a nine millimeter go off". Nickels also said he did not remember hearing a shotgun being fired and said, "I just remember hearing bangs". Nickels remembered hearing the SL-6 being fired numerous times and said that the sound of the SL-6 is "very distinctive".

The walk-through with Nickels was terminated. The cassette tape of the walk-through / interview will be retained in the case file.

Sergeant Lorenzen and I then conducted a walk-through of the crime scene with Deputy Stephens at approximately 0951 hours. The walk-through was also used as an interview with Stephens and was videotaped by Field Evidence Technician Joy Self. Stephens told us in summary the following:

Deputy Stephens said that on 09-07-99, at about 0300 hours, he received a radio call of a man who wanted to turn himself in to deputies at Vons. The information received from dispatch was that the man had an outstanding warrant and possibly had a gun.

Deputy Stephens responded to the back of Vons with Deputy Hendren. They were unable to locate the suspect (Jaramillo) at that time. All of the Fillmore patrol units arrived on scene to search for Jaramillo. Stephens parked on River Street to view the back of Vons.

A few minutes later dispatch advised that Jaramillo was at the Chevron station. Stephens drove his car to 'A' Street and parked approximately 200' south of the Chevron station on the west side of 'A' Street. Stephens got out of his car and began walking towards Chevron. Stephens then saw Jaramillo walking across the parking lot of Chevron. Jaramillo had a jacket wrapped around his right hand. One or two more units pulled up on the north side of Jaramillo. Deputy Arnold yelled at Jaramillo to show his hands. Several other deputies also began yelling at Jaramillo for him to show his hands.

Jaramillo then walked across the street to the parking lot of the Vons shopping center. Stephens could tell that Jaramillo was saying something, but Stephens could not hear Jaramillo's exact words. Several deputies took cover behind some electric utility boxes behind the USA gas station. Stephens took cover behind a trash dumpster area on the west side of the parking lot. Jaramillo stopped in the parking lot and said something about wanting to see Max Pina. Jaramillo lit a cigarette. Deputy Petitt arrived and stood near Stephens. Stephens was armed with his service pistol and Petitt was armed with a shotgun.

Petitt moved a distance forward and crouched down. Dispatch advised that Pina had been contacted and was on the way. Jaramillo also mentioned wanting to see his parole agent. Stephens was unable to tell

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what Jaramillo was saying, but believes Jaramillo was conversing with Deputy Arnold. Stephens told Petitt to move back towards him, which Petitt did.

Deputy Pina arrived a short time later. Sergeant Larson arrived and parked on the south side of the parking lot. Pina started talking with Jaramillo, however Stephens could not hear what was being said. Pina walked out and laid some paper down near Jaramillo. Jaramillo retrieved the paper and began writing on it. Pina later came out and retrieved the paper, which Jaramillo had placed on the ground and walked away from. Other deputies started blocking off traffic in the area. The Less Than Lethal team was called out and arrived. Jaramillo's parole agent arrived and had a conversation with Jaramillo, however Stephens was unable to hear what was being said from his position.

One of the members from the Less Than Lethal team (Deputy Wright) arrived and took over Stephens's position. Stephens was told that he was to back off, and that the Less Than Lethal team was going to handle the situation.

A short time later Stephens heard a "loud bang" sound, "maybe two loud bangs". Stephens then heard a "real loud bang", which he thought was a flashbang. Lorenzen asked Stephens if he saw Jaramillo get hit. Stephens replied by saying something to the effect of, "I had backed off when the shooting started so I didn't see the initial hit. When I looked back he was up and walking to the south. He still had his arm wrapped up in the jacket, whatever it was, and he's holding it and they shot him several times. I heard bangs with the non-lethal".

Jaramillo walked south in the parking lot towards the deputies positioned on the south side. Jaramillo raised his hand as if he was going to shoot at the deputies near Sergeant Larson's patrol unit. Stephens then heard Petitt's shotgun go off and saw Jaramillo go down. Stephens showed us where he remembered Petitt being positioned at the time. (Refer to videotape) Several "SWAT guys" approached Jaramillo from all angles, ordering Jaramillo to show his hands. Stephens added, "I think they shot him a couple more times with the SL-6". Petitt moved up a distance and crouched down, aiming at Jaramillo. Stephens told Petitt, "Marty back up here, back up here, let the SWAT guys do it". Petitt then moved back to where Stephens was positioned. The

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"SWAT guys" approached Jaramillo and took him into custody. Jaramillo had refused to comply with any orders and continued to keep his right hand concealed. Jaramillo was yelling something, but Stephens could not understand what he was saying. The ambulance that was staging at "Super A Foods" arrived and the paramedics treated Jaramillo, who was later transported by the ambulance. Deputy Wiggins rode in the ambulance with Jaramillo.

The cassette tape of the walk-through and interview with Deputy Stephens will be retained in the case file.

On 9-7-99, Sgt. Lorenzen requested that I contact ██████████ ██████████ I at his residence and interview him reference the shooting that took place earlier this morning. ██████████ I was working at the Chevron Gas station during the time of the shooting incident. The station is located at 704 Ventura Street. I contacted ██████████ I at his residence and interviewed him.

██████████ I said he started his shift on 9-6-99, at 2200 hrs and it ended this morning at 0600 hrs. ██████████ I said he was working by himself. I asked him about Jaramillo. ██████████ I said Jaramillo walked into the station at about 0330 hrs. ██████████ I said he was cleaning the coffee machine when Jaramillo walked in. ██████████ I told me that Jaramillo said, "Don't I know you?" ██████████ I told him that he did not know. Jaramillo told ██████████ I, "I think I know you." ██████████ I told me that he recognized Jaramillo vaguely, but did not know his name.

Jaramillo told ██████████ I, "I have a problem." ██████████ I asked what his problem was and Jaramillo said, "The cops are looking for me and I got a gun." ██████████ I said that by this

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time he had walked back behind the counter. He said he normally goes behind the counter when someone walks into the station in case he has to push the alarm. [REDACTED] I said he was getting ready to push the alarm when Jaramillo said, "You don't have to worry I'm not going to do anything to you." [REDACTED] I said he was scared and concerned because he was standing there with a cash register full of money.

Jaramillo told [REDACTED] I that the police were chasing him because he was being accused of a rape he did not do. Jaramillo mentioned something about the "Von's" shopping center and [REDACTED] I told me that he remembered seeing a patrol car driving around the center's parking lot. Jaramillo also told [REDACTED] I that he wanted to turn himself in to a Fillmore Police Sergeant and a parole officer. [REDACTED] I said he could not remember the sergeant's or parole officer's name.

[REDACTED] I said that Jaramillo wanted him to call the police dispatcher. [REDACTED] I said he called the dispatcher and told her that Jaramillo was in the station. [REDACTED] I also told the dispatcher that Jaramillo told him he had a gun. [REDACTED] I told me he never saw the weapon because Jaramillo had his hand under a coat. [REDACTED] I said that while he was talking with the dispatcher, Jaramillo asked to speak with the dispatcher. [REDACTED] I said he handed the telephone to Jaramillo. Jaramillo told the dispatcher what he wanted and hung up the telephone.

At that time, [REDACTED] I said he saw the police cars coming. [REDACTED] I asked Jaramillo not to start a "firefight" around here because of the gas pumps. Jaramillo told [REDACTED] I, "You don't worry, I'm going over to Von's." Jaramillo was walking toward the front door when he said this. [REDACTED] I said he followed Jaramillo out of the station. [REDACTED] I said that he wanted to make sure that Jaramillo left the station.

As Jaramillo walked out to the lot, a couple of police car arrived and stopped. [REDACTED] I said the officers got out of the cars and drew their guns in Jaramillo's direction. [REDACTED] I felt that this was what the officers were supposed to do. [REDACTED] I said that Jaramillo walked across "A" Street and onto the grassy area located directly to the east of the station.

I asked [REDACTED] I if Jaramillo had on a jacket when he walked into the station. [REDACTED] I said Jaramillo had a coat draped over his right arm and was holding something underneath it. [REDACTED] I said that it was either his fist or something else. [REDACTED] I said he could not

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get a real good look from the angle he was standing at. Jaramillo told [REDACTED] that he had a pistol so [REDACTED] took his word for it. I asked [REDACTED] if it appeared to him that Jaramillo had a weapon. [REDACTED] said Jaramillo told him he had a weapon and that he did not have to be concerned about it. Jaramillo also said the police were chasing him because he was accused of a rape. Jaramillo was concerned that the police were going to kill him and he wanted to "turn himself in" to a particular police officer. Jaramillo told him, "He was not going to have it any other way, even if he had to shoot it out with them and that he did not even mind dying if he had too." [REDACTED] felt that Jaramillo was possibly suicidal. [REDACTED] said that he thought that Jaramillo might "be on something." [REDACTED] said he got the feeling that Jaramillo was asking to be shot.

I asked him if Jaramillo mention the officer's name he wanted to turn himself in to. [REDACTED] said he did, but could not remember the name. [REDACTED] said he has heard the officer's name before, but could not remember. Jaramillo told the dispatcher the name of the officer so, it should be recorded on tape. Jaramillo told him the only way he was going to turn himself in was to this particular officer or parole officer. Jaramillo called the parole officer by name. [REDACTED] could not remember the name of the parole officer. [REDACTED] said Jaramillo told him, "he was not going to be taken any other way." [REDACTED] said Jaramillo made these statements before he had him call the dispatcher. [REDACTED] said Jaramillo made the statements again after he hung up the telephone. [REDACTED] said he called the dispatcher back after Jaramillo left the station and told him what he said about shooting it out and about dying. [REDACTED] told the dispatcher for the officers to use caution.

I asked [REDACTED] if Jaramillo told him that it did not matter to him if he got into a "shoot out." [REDACTED] said, "yea, more or less he implied that." "He said he was not going to be taken in even if he had to shoot his way out of it." I asked [REDACTED] if Jaramillo had a conversation with the dispatcher. [REDACTED] said he handed the telephone to Jaramillo and Jaramillo then spoke to the dispatcher. I asked [REDACTED] if he remembered the conversation Jaramillo had with the dispatcher. [REDACTED] told me that he was on the telephone with the dispatcher. He told the dispatcher that the subject they were looking for was standing with him and that the subject stated he had a gun. [REDACTED] said that while he was on the telephone, Jaramillo asked to talk to the dispatcher. [REDACTED] said he handed the telephone to Jaramillo. Jaramillo told the dispatcher that he wanted a particular person to turn himself in to and he was "not going to have it any other way." [REDACTED] said the conversation did not last very long. [REDACTED] said Jaramillo handed him

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back the telephone and [REDACTED] I hung it up. At about that time, [REDACTED] I told me that Jaramillo said that he was not "going any other way." Jaramillo looked up and out the window that was located behind [REDACTED] I. Jaramillo then said, "Here they are." Jaramillo then walked around the counter and walked out the station. [REDACTED] I said that he followed him out.

[REDACTED] I said that before Jaramillo walked out of the station, Jaramillo asked him for some cigarettes. [REDACTED] I said he had a damaged pack so, he reached over and handed him the pack. Jaramillo then asked for a soda. [REDACTED] I said he went over and selected a bottled drink. [REDACTED] I said Jaramillo took the drink and did not drink it until he was on the grassy area across the street.

[REDACTED] I told me Jaramillo was not hostile toward him because he knew Jaramillo's brother. Jaramillo said he knew [REDACTED] I, but [REDACTED] I did not know how he recognized him after so many years. I asked [REDACTED] I if Jaramillo kept his arm covered with the jacket the entire time he was in the station. [REDACTED] I said he kept it covered the entire time and never brandished a weapon. [REDACTED] I said, "he had his jacket over his right arm and whatever it was he holding underneath that." I asked him if he followed him outside.

[REDACTED] I said he just followed him to the front door. [REDACTED] I said he stopped at the door and Jaramillo walked outside. As Jaramillo walked outside, [REDACTED] I said, "three squad cars hit him from every direction." "The one car that was over by the pumps, they both came out with there guns drawn on him." "They kept telling him to 'stop and raise your arms in the air' like they were supposed to." [REDACTED] I told me this occurred right on the station property.

[REDACTED] I said that Jaramillo ignored the officers and walked down the driveway toward the "23." Jaramillo looked both ways and walked across the road and walked to the grassy knoll. The grassy knoll is located behind the USA gas station on the southeast corner of Ventura Street and Central Avenue. Jaramillo stopped on the grass and turned around. [REDACTED] I said the officers that followed Jaramillo across the street stayed about 15 feet away from him until Jaramillo got across the street. Once they got across the street, [REDACTED] I said that the officers positioned their patrol cars. [REDACTED] I said that the officers went over to the USA gas station and had them to turn off the station's lights. [REDACTED] I told me that he did not see everything that was going on because he had things to do around the station. [REDACTED] I said that an officer came into the station and got a soft drink that Jaramillo had asked for.

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██████████ I said that the station lights were on until the SWAT team arrived a short time later. ██████████ I told me that he saw the SWAT team moving through the gas station so, ██████████ I walked to the door and one of the SWAT team members told him not to come outside. ██████████ I asked the SWAT team member if they wanted him to turn off the station lights. The SWAT team member told him "yes" so, ██████████ I walked back inside the station and turned off the lights.

I asked ██████████ I if he last saw Jaramillo on the grassy knoll. ██████████ I told me that he did not have anything to do after he had turned off the station lights so he watched what was going on from inside the station. ██████████ I said he saw the SWAT team and canine unit position themselves around Jaramillo. ██████████ I also told me that he saw the officers use several percussion devices to subdue Jaramillo.

I asked ██████████ I if Jaramillo said anything to the officers. ██████████ I said that Jaramillo spoke to them constantly. He told me Jaramillo would not "shut up." ██████████ I told me that Jaramillo asked one of the officers for something, but ██████████ I could not make out what Jaramillo asked for. ██████████ I said he was too far away. ██████████ I said he saw a deputy walk over to Jaramillo and put something down in front of him. The officer then backed away from Jaramillo.

██████████ I said he had seen Jaramillo light a couple of cigarettes while he was standing on the grassy knoll. ██████████ I told me that he saw Jaramillo "ranting and raving" and throwing his arm up in the air. ██████████ I told me, "he kept this one always covered like he had the gun in his hand." ██████████ I motioned to his right arm. I asked him if it was Jaramillo's right hand and he said, "right." ██████████ I added that the officers "were keeping their cool, they did a really good job."

I asked ██████████ I about the percussion grenade. Michell said he saw the first one being deployed from the area of the USA gas station. ██████████ I saw Jaramillo drop to the ground and roll over about two or three times after the grenade activated near him. Jaramillo then "jumped back onto his feet and started running toward his left, running south toward what used to be Chief Auto Parts." "He had his arm stuck out toward one of the officers standing there, like he was armed and ready to shoot." "Why they did not drop him dead, I don't know, but they decided they were not going to." ██████████ I said another percussion grenade was deployed by an officer from the other direction. The grenade went off a few feet away from Jaramillo. The device stunned Jaramillo and knocked him down to the

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ground. [REDACTED] I said that Jaramillo was going "crazy and flopping around on the ground." [REDACTED] I said that the SWAT team had Jaramillo surrounded and were slowly closing in on him. [REDACTED] I said the SWAT team then subdued Jaramillo.

I asked [REDACTED] if he heard any other gunshots. [REDACTED] I said he was not really sure, but it sounded like four or five shots were fired. [REDACTED] I said it might have just been the percussion grenades going off. [REDACTED] I said that a couple of customers, who live nearby, came into the station later this morning and told him that they heard more than one shot fired. I asked him if the officers were able to restrain Jaramillo after the second percussion grenade was deployed. [REDACTED] I said, "oh yeah, he was not going any place after the second one." "He was down on the ground and he was still moving, but there were about five of them and they had him surrounded." "They had M-16's or whatever they were carrying." "They got close to him and one of them reached down and put his foot on him or whatever and when they did that, they just nailed him." I asked [REDACTED] if Jaramillo still had the jacket over his arm. [REDACTED] I said, "yeah, because when he was running, the second time when he got up, he still had something in his hand." "Whether the jacket was actually there or not, I was too far away and too dark to see, but he did have something in his hand and he was pointing at whoever was on the other side." I asked [REDACTED] if he saw Jaramillo raise his hand and point it. [REDACTED] I told me, "I saw him raise his hand and point it like he was going to fire." [REDACTED] I said that when he saw Jaramillo do that, he was just waiting for the "machine guns to go off and take him down." [REDACTED] I said he did not see the guns go off. He said he just saw the percussion grenades going off.


I asked [REDACTED] if he saw the officers pick up Jaramillo. [REDACTED] I said Jaramillo stayed on the ground while the paramedics and fire department personnel arrived and attended to him. [REDACTED] I said that the medical personnel were waiting by Taco Bell and all of them came over to attend to him. [REDACTED] I said that Jaramillo was placed on a stretcher. He did not see what happened after that because he was busy turning all of the station's equipment back on. [REDACTED] I said that the incident looked like it was properly handled. He added that he was not an expert, but that no one "lost their heads."

I asked [REDACTED] what time Jaramillo came into the station. [REDACTED] I said it was approximately between 0330 and 0400 hours. He said it was about 0520 hours when the percussion grenades started being deployed. I asked him about if he remembered Jaramillo from the past. [REDACTED] I said he just remembered the face from many years ago.

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██████████ I said he remembered Jaramillo's brother. ██████████ I thinks that his brother last name is ██████████ and said he was a "straight arrow" type of person.

I went over ██████████'s account of the incident with him a second time. ██████████ I said Jaramillo entered the station at about 0330 hours. ██████████ I said he was cleaning the coffee machine when Jaramillo walked in. ██████████ I asked Jaramillo if he needed help. Jaramillo told him that the police were looking for him. Jaramillo then asked ██████████ I to do him a favor. ██████████ I said that was when Jaramillo told him that he was being accused of the rape and that he was innocent. Jaramillo added that once he was accused he was a "goner." ██████████ I said Jaramillo did not go into anymore detail about the rape.

Jaramillo asked ██████████ I for some cigarettes and a soda. ██████████ I gave him the items. Jaramillo then asked ██████████ I to call the dispatcher. ██████████ I said he called the dispatcher and told her what was going on. Jaramillo also spoke to the dispatcher. After speaking to the dispatcher, Jaramillo walked outside. I asked ██████████ I how many patrol units arrived at the station. ██████████ I said he saw about five to six cars all together. He said there was about three units on the property. He said one unit came in from "126" on the north side of the property, another unit came in through the driveway on the right side of the property and third unit came from the back of the property.

I asked him if the officers gave Jaramillo orders when they got out of their patrol cars. ██████████ I said, "They gave him orders to drop the coat and to raise his hands up, 'stop and get your hands up.' I asked him how many times he heard the officers give Jaramillo these orders. ██████████ I told me, "half a dozen, a dozen times." "They kept telling him that all the way down the driveway, all the way across the street." ██████████ I said that Jaramillo ignored the officer's orders. ██████████ I said that Jaramillo mumbled something to the officers, but he could not make out what he said. ██████████ I said that by this time, he was taking cover because he was afraid there was going to be shots exchanged.

██████████ I said that the officers were talking to Jaramillo and were trying to get him to stop. ██████████ I said the officers did not try to "tackle" Jaramillo. He said the officers kept their distance to protect themselves and anyone else who might be in the area. ██████████ I said the officers took positions of cover around Jaramillo.

██████████ I said that about an hour later, the SWAT team arrived so, he went back to cleaning the machines. ██████████ I kind of figured that Jaramillo was possibly suicidal

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because he was dragging it out for so long. [REDACTED] I thought that Jaramillo might not have a gun underneath the coat and that everything was just "procedure type thing" and that they would eventually take him down and be "done with it." [REDACTED] I said he started to watch the incident after the SWAT team showed up and asked him to turn off the station lights. [REDACTED] I said he did not have anything to do so he just watched what was going on from inside the station.

I asked [REDACTED] I about the shots he heard. [REDACTED] I told me he heard the one percussion grenade go off and then heard three separate shots after that. [REDACTED] I said he was not sure if it was actual gunfire or the rubber bullets bouncing off. [REDACTED] I said he was inside the station and it sounded like "something firing." [REDACTED] I saw Jaramillo get back up onto his feet. [REDACTED] I said he did not see anyone fire a pistol or rifle at Jaramillo. I asked him at what point he heard the shots. He said it was possibly after the first percussion grenade went off.

I asked [REDACTED] I if he was afraid that Jaramillo had a gun with him while he was inside the station with him. [REDACTED] I said Jaramillo told him that he was not going to hurt him. Since Jaramillo knew him by name, [REDACTED] I did not feel concerned that Jaramillo was going to brandish or use a weapon against him. [REDACTED] I said that Jaramillo appeared to be "doped up." [REDACTED] I said that Jaramillo was all "hyped up" about being in trouble. He told [REDACTED] I that he was a "felon" so that made [REDACTED] I fear for his safety. I asked [REDACTED] I if Jaramillo appeared nervous to him. [REDACTED] I said Jaramillo was very nervous and all "keyed up." [REDACTED] I said that you don't know what a person like that might do. I asked [REDACTED] I if Jaramillo appeared agitated or angry. [REDACTED] I said, "Yeah, he was agitated and was angry that he was being accused of this crime he said he did not do." [REDACTED] I said he was "keyed up" and was very nervous.

[REDACTED] I said that Jaramillo never raised the "gun" up toward his direction. He said he always kept it pointing down and out of the way. [REDACTED] I said that he felt it helped that he cooperated with Jaramillo and he did not aggravate him and did not do anything to "piss him off." I asked [REDACTED] I which number he called when he telephoned the dispatcher. [REDACTED] I said he call the "233" number. I asked [REDACTED] I if there is a surveillance camera in the store. [REDACTED] I said there was a camera. He told me to contact the owner, Bob Brown at the station. [REDACTED] I said the store is equipped with ten color cameras. [REDACTED] I said there was a camera outside the station, but he did not know what angle the camera recorded. I concluded my interview with [REDACTED] I at this time.

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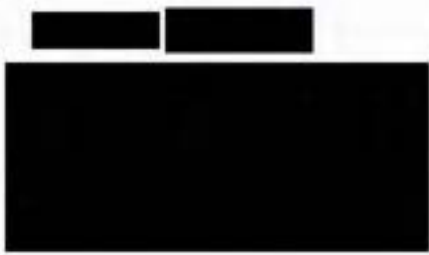

On 9-7-99, At 0745, Sgt. Lorenzen requested that I contact an employee from the "Ultra Mart" gas station. The employee had called the Sheriff's Department after being contacted by the suspect, Jose Jaramillo. I called Sheriff's Dispatch and asked for the name of the employee. The dispatcher told me that the reporting party's name was [REDACTED] [REDACTED]h. I went to the "Ultra Mart" and spoke to the manager, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]z. I told her that I needed to speak with [REDACTED]h and asked if he was still working. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED]h ended his shift and went home. I asked [REDACTED] if she could call [REDACTED]h at home and tell him that I needed to meet with him. [REDACTED] called and [REDACTED]h requested I meet with him at his residence. [REDACTED]h lives at [REDACTED] in the City of Fillmore.

I reviewed the store surveillance tape at the time Jaramillo walked into the store. I could see him clearly on the video as he walked in. I could see that he had a dark colored jacket draped over his right shoulder. The jacket covered his shoulder and his entire right arm and hand. Jaramillo walked in and walked to his left. He walked up to the counter and had a conversation with someone. The other person was not visible in the video. After

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talking to the person at the counter, Jaramillo began to walk to the door. As he walked to the door, Jaramillo turned and said something to the person at the counter. He then raised his left arm parallel with his chest. His left hand appeared to be clenched in a fist. Jaramillo then walked out the door and out of view of the camera. During the time Jaramillo was in the station he did not remove his right hand or arm from under his jacket. There was also no sound to the video. I collected the videotape as evidence.

I met with ██████ at his residence and questioned him about the contact he had with the suspect, Jose Luis Jaramillo. ██████ is a clerk at the "Ultra Mart" gas station. He said his work shift started at 2100 hours on 9-6-99 and ended this morning at 0500 hrs. I asked him what time Jaramillo came into the station. He said it was a few minutes before 0200 hours. ██████ said he was the only one in the station when Jaramillo came in. No other employees or customers were in the station at the time.

█████ said he was placing hot dogs on the grill when Jaramillo walked in. ██████ said he thought Jaramillo was a customer so ██████ walked over to the counter to help him. ██████ said that Jaramillo told him, "Don't trip, I need you to get a piece of paper" Jaramillo then told him to write down some information. Jaramillo told him that he wanted him to call the police. ██████ thought that something happened to Jaramillo because he appeared nervous. Jaramillo then told ██████ to tell the police he needed Officer Max Pina and a parole officer to meet him at the Von's shopping center. Jaramillo told ██████ to tell the police that he had a gun with him and that he just wanted to talk. Jaramillo said he also wanted them to know that "if they got crazy, he could get crazy." ██████ said he wrote everything down. Jaramillo spelled out his name for ██████ and told him not to worry because he was born and raised in Fillmore. ██████ told me that he did not know what he meant by that. Jaramillo then walked out and ██████ called the police.

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I asked [redacted] if Jaramillo told him exactly what to write and he said, "Yeah." I asked him if Jaramillo asked for Max Pina and another subject. [redacted] said he did. Jaramillo told him the other person was a parole officer. I asked [redacted] if he saw Jaramillo with a gun. [redacted] said he did not see one. I asked him which shoulder Jaramillo had the jacket draped over. He said it was his right shoulder. I asked [redacted] if Jaramillo was holding anything in his other hand (left). [redacted] said he did not recall seeing anything in his hand. I asked [redacted] if Jaramillo told him to tell the police not to "trip" and that he had a gun. [redacted] said, "Yeah." I asked [redacted] if Jaramillo wanted them to meet him at Von's and if they got "crazy." [redacted] interrupted and said, "He would get crazy too." I asked him if Jaramillo said anything else to him. [redacted] said Jaramillo told him that "he was born and raised here." [redacted] said that Jaramillo raised his left arm about chest height and clenched his fist as he said this.

I told [redacted] that I viewed the videotape and could see that Jaramillo said something to him as he walked toward the door. [redacted] said that was when Jaramillo told him he was from Fillmore. I told [redacted] that it looked like Jaramillo was holding something in his left hand. [redacted] said he did not notice anything. I asked [redacted] about Jaramillo's demeanor and attitude. [redacted] said Jaramillo looked nervous and scared which made him feel that he might have just been robbed. I asked him if he noticed any injuries on Jaramillo and he said he did not see any. I asked [redacted] what Jaramillo was wearing. [redacted] said Jaramillo had on a gray tee shirt, unknown type or color of pants, dark blue jacket that he wore draped over his shoulder. Jaramillo was not wearing any headwear.

I asked [redacted] if Jaramillo drove to the station in a car. [redacted] said, "No." I asked him if he saw which direction Jaramillo left in after walking out of the station. [redacted] said he just saw Jaramillo walk out the door. I asked [redacted] if Jaramillo told him that he was going to the Von's Supermarket right away. [redacted] said Jaramillo made no mention of it. Jaramillo told him to have them meet him there. I asked [redacted] if he had ever seen Jaramillo before. [redacted] said, "No." I concluded my interview with him at this time.


During the interview, [redacted] told me that he had forgotten about Jaramillo's jacket until he reviewed the videotape. [redacted] told me that after he viewed the videotape he remembered Jaramillo had the jacket draped over the right shoulder. The jacket covered Jaramillo's right arm and hand. He said he did not know if Jaramillo had his gun under the jacket.

**OBJECTIVE:**

Determine if the firearms are functional and what relationship the other evidence has to the firearms.

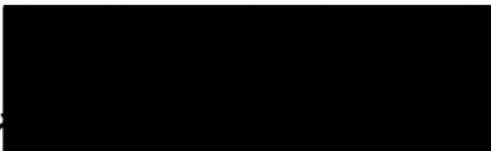
**RESULTS:**

The following is a summary of the analytic findings:

The firearms were examined and test fired. The Shotgun and submachine gun were found to be in proper working order. The baton gun fired the first test round normally then did not fully advance the second round until the weapon was opened and closed. The round indexed to then position normal to "before trigger pull," but did not advance on trigger pull. When opened and closed it then fired the round normally. On further lab testing to observe pin retraction that would allow this final cylinder movement the trigger failed. It should be noted that the arm worked normally in pre fire testing and fired the first round normally. Failure was during testing in this laboratory. The failure is in the trigger, sear, hammer train, the hammer is not being lifted (cocking). It is recommended that the arm be submitted to a factory-trained armorer for this type of weapon to determine the cause of these failures and repair the arm.

The shot shell, #22, was fired in the shotgun, #49. The wad, #31, is 12 gauge fiber (spacer) wad, which is consistent with Winchester Buckshot loads and exhibits some grex present. (Grex is a buffer material also consistent with Winchester buckshot loads.) The pellet, #40, is an OO Buckshot pellet. It should be noted that #22 is labeled to contain OO Buckshot. The metal fragments, #27 and 28, are lead fragments, one surface is consistent in texture with buckshot pellet surfaces, their weight (13.2 and 9.6 gr. respectively) is greater than birdshot weights (up to BB) but less than buckshot weights.

The two discharged cartridge cases, #23 & 24, were fired in the HK MP-5 sub-machinegun, #50.

## Deputies Shoot, Injure Wanted Man

■ **Standoff:** Before incident, the convicted rapist had told his brother he would kill himself 'or get a cop to do it,' a sheriff's spokesman says.

FILLMORE—A convicted rapist sought in the beating and attempted sexual assault of a 70-year-old Oxnard woman was hospitalized after being shot by sheriff's deputies early Tuesday during a standoff at a Fillmore grocery store parking lot, authorities said.

Shortly before he was shot, 42-year-old Joe Jaramillo had called his brother and said he wanted to die, said sheriff's spokesman Eric Nishimoto.

"He called his brother and said he was tired of running and that he didn't want to go back to jail," Nishimoto said. "He threatened suicide and said he would either kill himself or get a cop to do it."

During the standoff, Jaramillo said he had a gun and threatened to shoot himself or deputies, authorities said.

But Nishimoto said later that Jaramillo was armed only with a 10-inch butcher knife. "We had every reason to believe he had a gun," Nishimoto said. "He was acting like it and telling us he had one."

Jaramillo, an Oxnard resident, was in critical but stable condition Tuesday night in the intensive care unit at Santa Paula Memorial Hospital. A nursing supervisor said he had undergone surgery for gunshot wounds.

Nishimoto refused to say how many times Jaramillo was shot, but a statement issued by authorities indicates that more than one deputy fired at Jaramillo.

During the standoff, deputies were armed with department-issued shotguns and 9-millimeter pistols, Nishimoto said.

The incident started when employees at two gas stations in Fillmore called 911 between 3:30 and 3:45 a.m., saying Jaramillo had walked into their businesses and claimed to be a wanted man.

Authorities later learned from Jaramillo's brother about the suspect's phone call to him.

Deputies found Jaramillo in front of a Vons grocery store on the east end of Fillmore off Cali-

fornia 126.

At 5 a.m. after more than an hour of keeping deputies at bay, Jaramillo was shot several times with less-than-lethal rubber bullets, Nishimoto said.

The rubber rounds knocked Jaramillo to the ground, but he got up and continued to threaten deputies, Nishimoto said. More rubber rounds, as well as live rounds, were then fired at Jaramillo, Nishimoto said.

Deputies who were at the scene were being questioned by detectives Tuesday, and Nishimoto said those involved would be placed on paid administrative leave, as is standard in incidents involving shooting.

Jaramillo will stay at Santa Paula Hospital until he is well enough to be transferred to the County Jail's medical facility in Ventura.

He is under arrest on suspicion of attempted rape and will be arraigned when he is healthier, authorities said, adding that there may be additional charges stemming from the standoff.

Jaramillo, who was paroled from prison last year after serving 11 years of a 22-year sentence for rape, forcible oral copulation and burglary, was the subject of an arrest warrant that was issued after an attempted rape on July 10, state and local authorities said.

On that date, Jaramillo allegedly went to the victim's house in Oxnard and told her that a garden hose was flooding her backyard, said Oxnard Police Det. Bruce Reed.

While the victim checked the hose, Jaramillo slipped inside the house, Reed said. When the woman returned inside, she was attacked in her bedroom, Reed said.

The woman suffered choke marks on her neck and bruising on her face and arms, Reed said. She was able to break free and escape before the rape occurred.

"He took off, and we've been looking for him ever since," Reed said.

Reed said Jaramillo had been living with his parents in Oxnard since being paroled, but left the area in recent weeks.

# Man shot by police may have been suicidal

## They subdue him with rubber bullets, but registered sex offender is wounded when deputy fires revolver

Desperate to avoid returning to prison, a man being sought in an attack on an Oxnard woman might have been attempting a "suicide by cop" when he was shot by sheriff deputies in Fillmore early Tuesday.

Investigators said they think 50-year-old Joe Jaramillo, a registered sex offender who was released from prison last year, provoked a pre-dawn confrontation outside a Vons market on Ventura Street in hopes that he would be killed.

He was unfazed when deputies peppered him with nonlethal rubber bullets, but was wounded at least once by an

unidentified deputy's revolver when the 90-minute standoff ended about 5 a.m., Sheriff's Department spokesman Eric Nishimoto said.

Jaramillo, who claimed to be armed and kept one hand in a pocket as if he had a gun, was rushed to Santa Paula Memorial Hospital, where he underwent surgery, Nishimoto said.

He was listed in stable condition in the intensive care unit Tuesday afternoon.

Deputies were called about 3:30 a.m. after clerks at two nearby businesses, an Ultramar convenience store and a Chevron service station, reported a man had told them he was a fugitive.

Officers found a man matching the

callers' description as soon as they arrived.

But as they moved to surround him in the supermarket parking lot, Nishimoto said, the man claimed he was armed and repeatedly threatened the deputies and himself.

No weapon was found after the confrontation.

Backup officers with guns that fire rubber bullets were called. Nishimoto said seven to 10 deputies were involved, but investigators were still trying to determine who fired the real bullets and what prompted that decision.

The confrontation ended, Nishimoto said, in a volley of real and rubber bullets.

While they were trying to persuade Jaramillo to surrender, deputies said, his brother told them Jaramillo had said he was tired of running and could not face going back to prison.

He said he was either going to kill himself or provoke police into doing it, the brother told deputies.

Jaramillo was named in an arrest warrant charging him with burglary, attempted rape and felony sexual battery and indecent exposure in a July 10 attack on a 70-year-old south Oxnard woman who lives near his parents, said Oxnard Detective Bruce Reed.

Jaramillo knew police were looking for him, Reed said, because detectives had searched his parents' home and

asked people at a job he had recently quit if they knew where he was.

"He's been evading us for some time," said Reed.

"He moved to Fillmore and then, we think, he went to Mexico for some time."

Jaramillo was released from state prison last year, Reed said, after serving 10 years for the kidnaping and rape of a San Jose-area woman.

He was a registered sex offender, he added.

Once investigators learn which deputy fired the shot that wounded Jaramillo, he will probably be put on paid administrative leave and offered psychological counseling, Nishimoto said.

## Officials: Man shot in Fillmore standoff armed

**INQUIRY: Suspect had butcher knife, says Sheriff's Department spokesman.**

A man wounded by sheriff's deputies in what investigators believe was an attempted suicide was armed with a 10-inch butcher knife during the confrontation, a Ventura County Sheriff's Department spokesman said Wednesday.

Joe Jaramillo of Oxnard, 50, remained in stable condition with three wounds from bullets fired by two deputies during the Tuesday morning standoff outside a Von's supermarket in Fillmore.

A registered sex offender wanted in the July 10 attack on a 70-year-old South Oxnard woman, Jaramillo is believed to have provoked the predawn confrontation in the hope that deputies would kill him, said sheriff's spokesman Eric Nishimoto.

At one point, he reportedly told a brother he would either kill himself or get deputies to do it because he did not want to run anymore and could not face returning to prison, deputies said.

The Sheriff's Department remained tight-lipped Wednesday about details of the 90-minute standoff that began about 3:30 a.m. after clerks at two Fillmore businesses reported that a man had told them he was a fugitive.

Though Jaramillo repeatedly told deputies he had a gun and kept his hand in a pocket as if holding one,

no weapon was seen until after the incident ended and deputies found the butcher knife in his jacket, Nishimoto said.

Fourteen deputies were involved in the standoff: seven from the Fillmore substation, six members of the department's hostage-negotiation team and a canine officer, Nishimoto said.

The negotiators tried to subdue Jaramillo with guns firing nonlethal rubber bullets, but he was unfazed. Investigators would not say Wednesday exactly what provoked two deputies to fire a total of three real rounds at him and refused to identify the deputies who shot him.

Investigators have the information, but won't release it until the inquiry is complete, Nishimoto said.

Jaramillo was released from state prison a year ago after serving a 10-year sentence for the kidnapping and rape of a San Jose-area woman, Oxnard police said. He was named in an arrest warrant charging him with burglary, attempted rape and felony sexual battery and indecent exposure in the July incident.

The victim in that case is a neighbor of his parents, Oxnard Police Detective Bruce Reed said.

Jaramillo underwent surgery at Santa Paula Memorial Hospital after the shooting.

He was transferred Wednesday afternoon to Ventura County Medical Center, Ventura, where he was listed in stable condition in the intensive care unit, a nursing supervisor said.

Sheriff's deputies have thus far refused to say exactly where Jaramillo was wounded.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT WHEN THE ROOM WAS PHOTOGRAPHED THERE WERE SEVERAL ITEMS ON THE NORTH SIDE OF THE BEDROOM FLOOR THAT HAD BEEN THROWN FROM INSIDE OF THE DRESSER DRAWERS LOCATED IN THE NORTH-EAST CORNER OF THE BEDROOM.
