CAUSE OF DEATH: MULTIPLE GUNSHOT WOUNDS

MANNER OF DEATH: HOMICIDE

AUTOPSY FINDINGS:

- I. Gunshot wound upper lateral back
 - A. Entrance – right upper lateral back
 - B. Path – passes through posterior ribs, right diaphragm, right lower liver, thoracic spine, left diaphragm, left lower lobe of lung, and left ninth intercostal space
 - C. Bullet – recovered from left lateral chest soft tissues
 - D. Direction of fire – right-to-left, back-to-front and upward

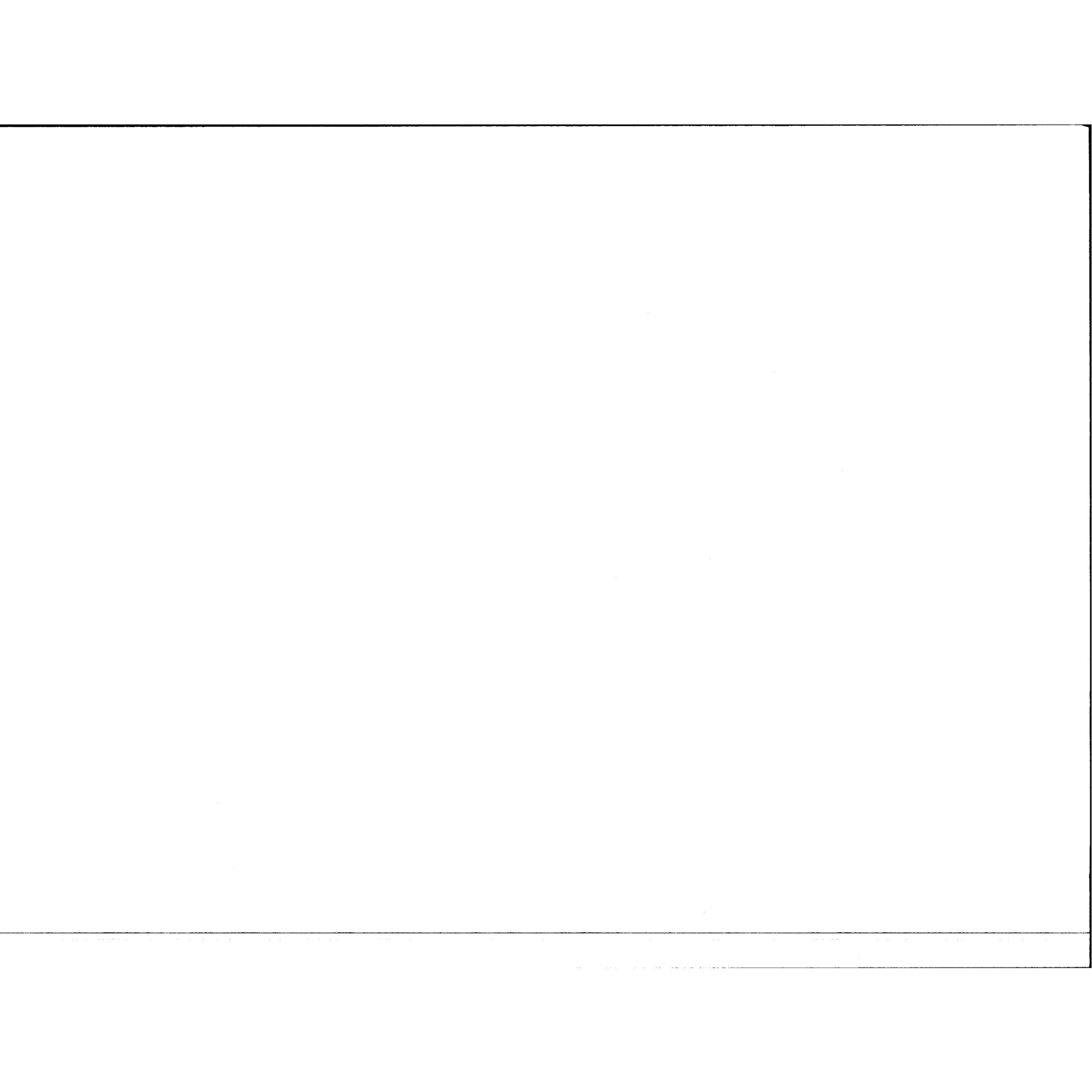
- II. Gunshot wound of right mid back
 - A. Entrance – right mid back
 - B. Path – perforates right lower posterior ribs, passes behind lumbar spine and penetrates left kidney
 - C. Bullet – recovered from left kidney
 - D. Direction of fire – right-to-left and back-to-front

- III. Shotgun wound of right flank
 - A. Entrance – right flank
 - B. Path – perforates right kidney, inferior vena cava, and lumbar spine
 - C. Bullet – shotgun slug recovered from lower left flank soft tissue
 - D. Shotgun wad - recovered from left lumbar spine
 - E. Direction of fire – right-to-left and downward

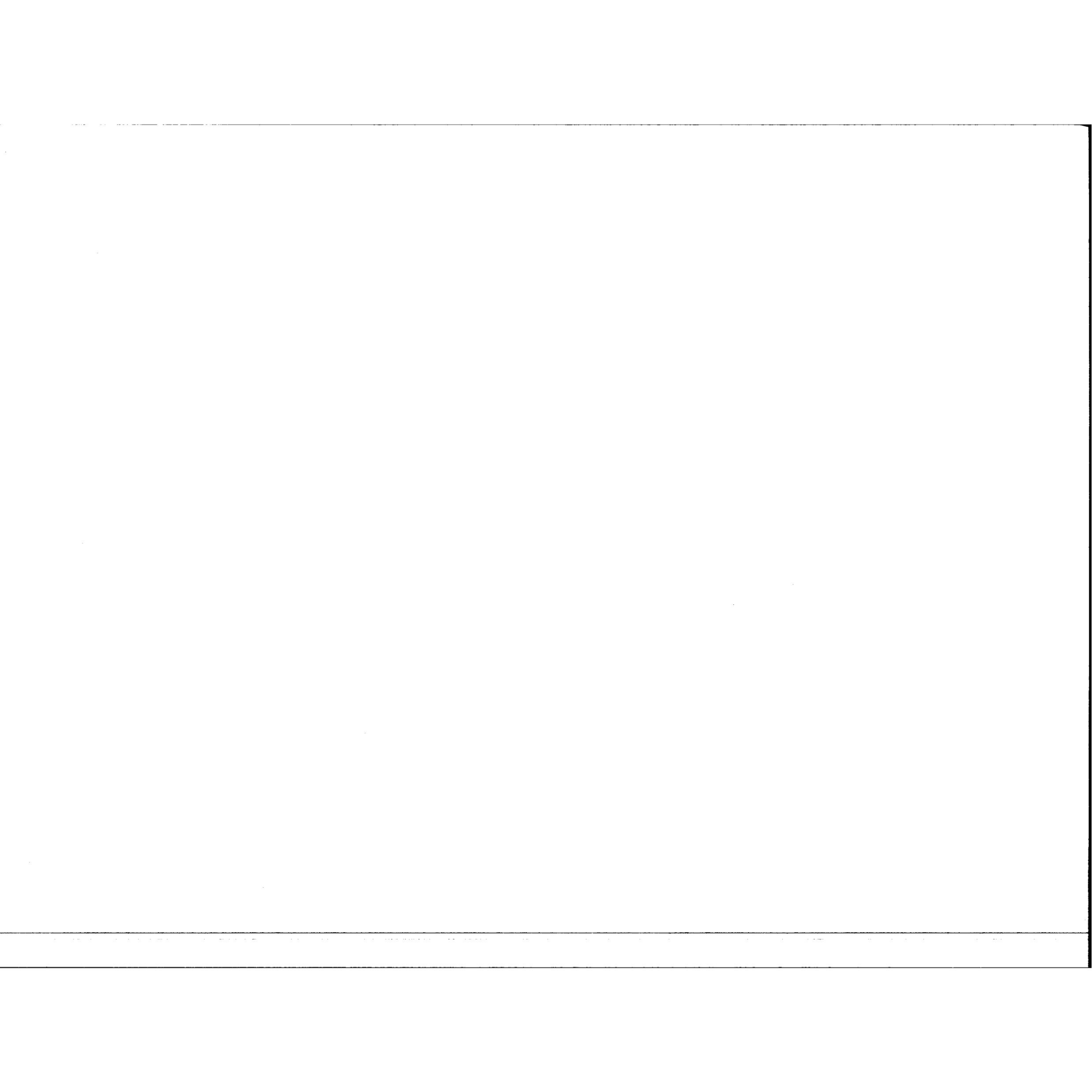

 - A. Entrance – right posterior upper thigh



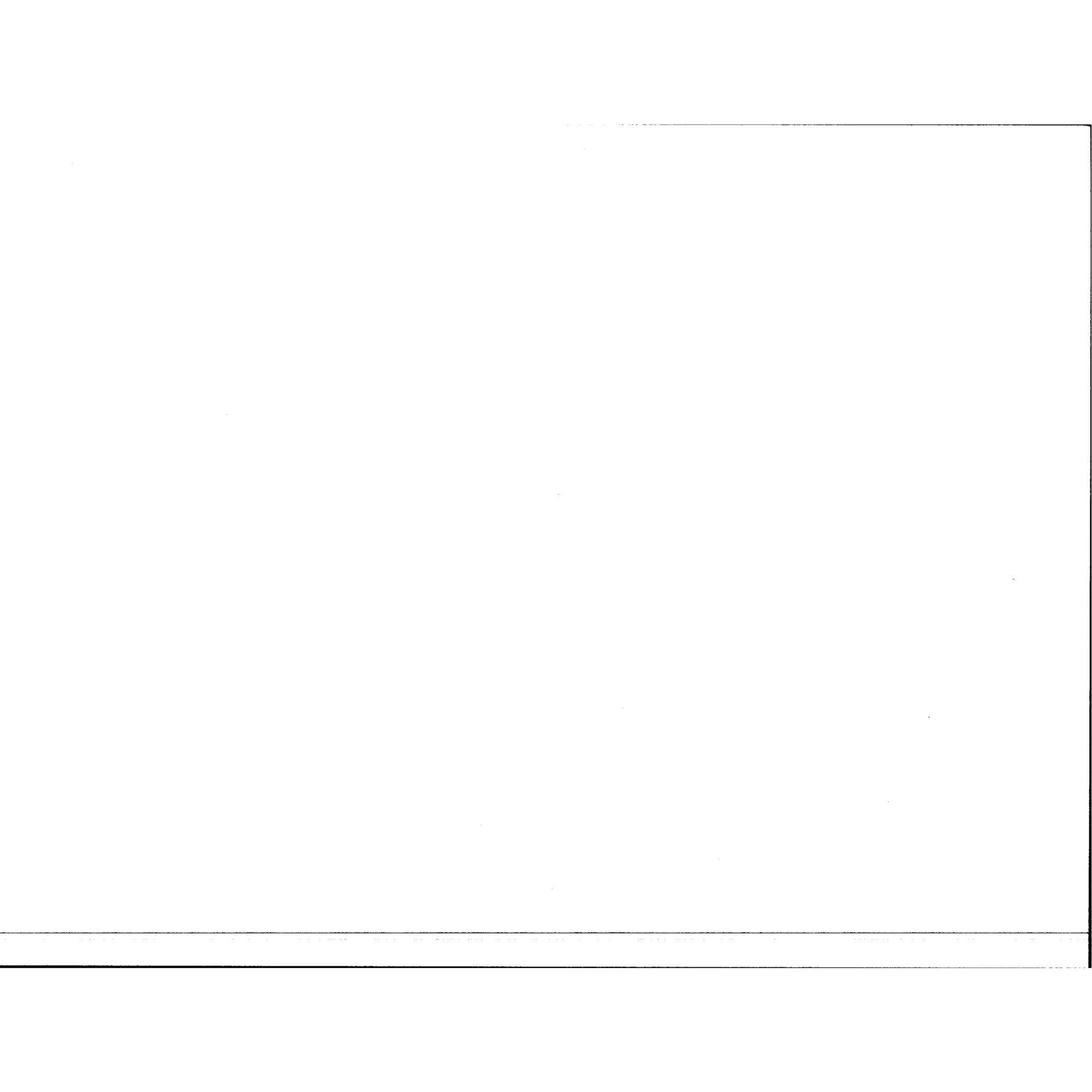
- B. Path – passes through soft tissue

- A. Entrance – right mid posterior thigh
 - B. Path – perforates muscle

 - D. Partial re-entry – left upper medial thigh
 - E. Bullet – none recovered
 - F. Direction of fire – right-to-left, back-to-front and upward
- VI. Gunshot wound of left medial posterior thigh
- A. Entrance – left medial posterior thigh
 - B. Path – perforates muscle, impacts pelvis
 - C. Bullet – recovered from left lateral hip soft tissue
 - D. Direction of fire – back-to-front, right-to-left and upward
- VII. Gunshot wound of right anterior chest
- A. Entrance – right upper anterior chest
 - B. Path – perforates left fourth intercostal space, anterior right middle lobe of lung, right diaphragm, right lobe of liver, small intestine and left tenth rib
 - C. Bullet – recovered from soft tissue, adjacent to left tenth rib
 - D. Direction of fire – right-to-left, front-to-back and downward
- VIII. Gunshot wound of right upper lateral thigh
- A. Entrance – right upper lateral thigh
 - B. Path – perforates right pelvis and penetrates lumbar disc L2-3
 - C. Bullet – lodged in L2-3 disc
 - D. Direction of fire – right-to-left and upward
- IX. Gunshot wound of right lower lateral thigh
- A. Entrance – right lower lateral thigh
 - B. Path – perforates right pubic ramus, enters pelvic cavity, perforates sigmoid colon
 - C. Bullet – lodged in left posterior ileum
 - D. Direction of fire – right-to-left, front-to-back and upward
- X. Gunshot wound of right anterior mid thigh
- A. Entrance – right anterior mid thigh
 - B. Path – passes through subcutaneous soft tissues
 - C. Exit – right lower abdomen



- D. Direction of fire – right-to-left and upward
- XI. Gunshot wound of left medial thigh
- A. Entrance – left medial thigh
 - B. Path – passes through muscle
 - C. Exit – left lateral thigh
 - D. Direction of fire – right-to-left, front-to-back and upward
- XII. Gunshot wound of left anterior thigh
- A. Entrance – left anterior thigh
 - B. Path – perforates muscle of thigh
 - C. Bullet – recovered from soft tissue, left lateral thigh
 - D. Direction of fire – right-to-left, front-to-back and upward
- XIII. Gunshot wound of left deltoid
- A. Entrance – left anterior deltoid
 - B. Path – passes through muscle
 - C. Exit – left posterior shoulder
 - D. Direction of fire – front-to-back
- XIV. Gunshot wound of left wrist
- A. Entrance – left radial upper wrist
 - B. Path – fractures distal radius and ulna, and proximal carpals
 - C. Exit – left ulnar upper wrist
 - D. Direction of fire – left-to-right
- XV. Gunshot wound of left posterior upper forearm
- A. Entrance – left posterior forearm, below elbow
 - B. Path – fractures left proximal ulna
 - C. Bullet – recovered from soft tissue, left upper arm
 - D. Direction of fire – left-to-right and upward
- XVI. Gunshot wound of left posterior forearm
- A. Entrance – left posterior forearm
 - B. Path – fractures radius and ulna
 - C. Bullet – recovered from left triceps
 - D. Direction of fire - upward
- XVII. Gunshot wound of left posterior forearm
- A. Entrance – left posterior forearm
 - B. Path – fractures radius and ulna



- C. Bullet – recovered from left triceps soft tissue
 - D. Direction of fire - upward

 - B. Path – perforates soft tissue and distal carpals

 - B. Path – perforates muscle
 - C. Exit – left upper lateral calf

- A. Entrance – left lower abdomen
 - B. Path – penetrates abdominal cavity, fragments spleen, passes through left diaphragm, left lower lobe of lung, and left seventh intercostal space
 - C. Bullet – recovered from left flank soft tissues
 - D. Direction of fire – right-to-left, front-to-back and upward
- XXI. Gunshot wound of left upper abdomen
- A. Entrance – left upper abdomen
 - B. Path – subcutaneous
 - C. Exit – left upper abdomen
 - D. Direction of fire – left-to-right and upward
- XXII. Gunshot wound of left lower leg
- A. Entrance – graze wound of left lower leg
 - B. Direction of fire – right-to-left and upward

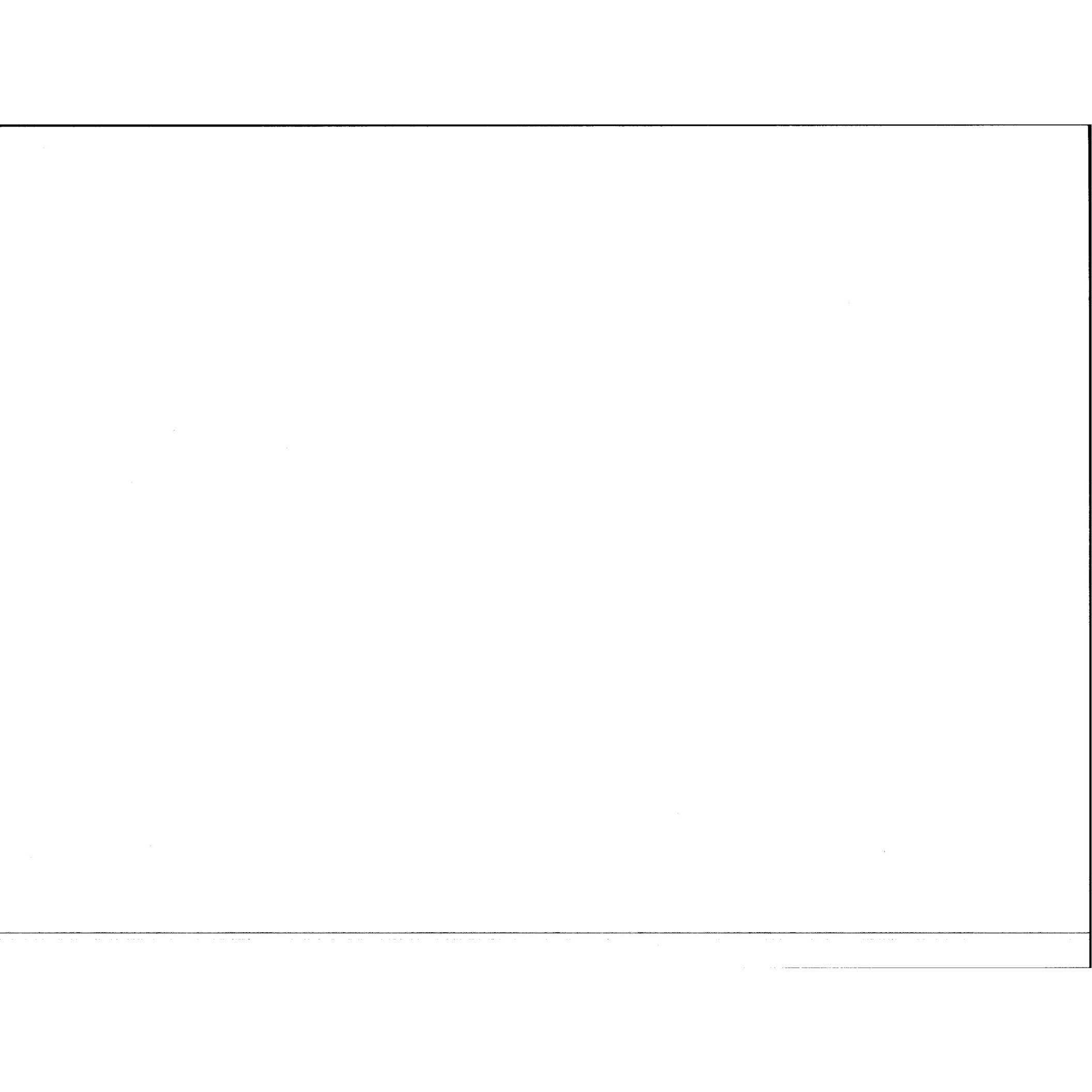

IDENTIFICATION:

The body is received in a blue vinyl pouch, with a medical examiner's tag attached to the zipper and inscribed with the decedent's name. The pouch is locked with seal #000932. The body is lying on a rigid board, which is on top of a green hospital sheet. Paper bags are over the hands.

CLOTHING:

1. A green, with blue and white stripes, knit short sleeve polo shirt has been cut from body. The left sleeve is over the left arm, and the left side of the shirt is tucked underneath the left shoulder. There is bloodstaining on the front of the shirt, and the following defects are observed: A large ragged round defect is on the left anterior shoulder of the shirt, centered approximately 3" below the shoulder seam. The defect measures approximately 1" in diameter. Above and slightly lateral to this are two to three additional small defects in the shirt that measures approximately 1.4" in diameter each. There is bloodstaining around the defects. A ragged irregular defect on the left front of the shirt, just above the lateral top corner of the chest pocket, measures approximately 1" in maximum diameter. A portion of torn fabric partially bridges this defect, but is detached from the inner edge of the main defect. There is bloodstaining on the shirt anterior to the defect. A number of defects are grouped at the cut front edge of the shirt, just medial to the bottom of the placket. These range in size from ¼" - ½". Below these, opposite the medial bottom edge of the pocket are two to three roughly round, slightly irregular defects, which measure between ¼" - ½" in diameter. An oval defect ½" below the left chest pocket, measures approximately 1" x ½". A ragged defect on the lower portion of the pocket itself has edges that are outwardly curved and measures ½" in diameter. A small sliver of tan foreign material is clinging to the frayed threads of the defect. A small round hole is on the medial edge of the pocket, over the seam, and approximately 1" above the bottom of the pocket. This hole measures ¼" in diameter.

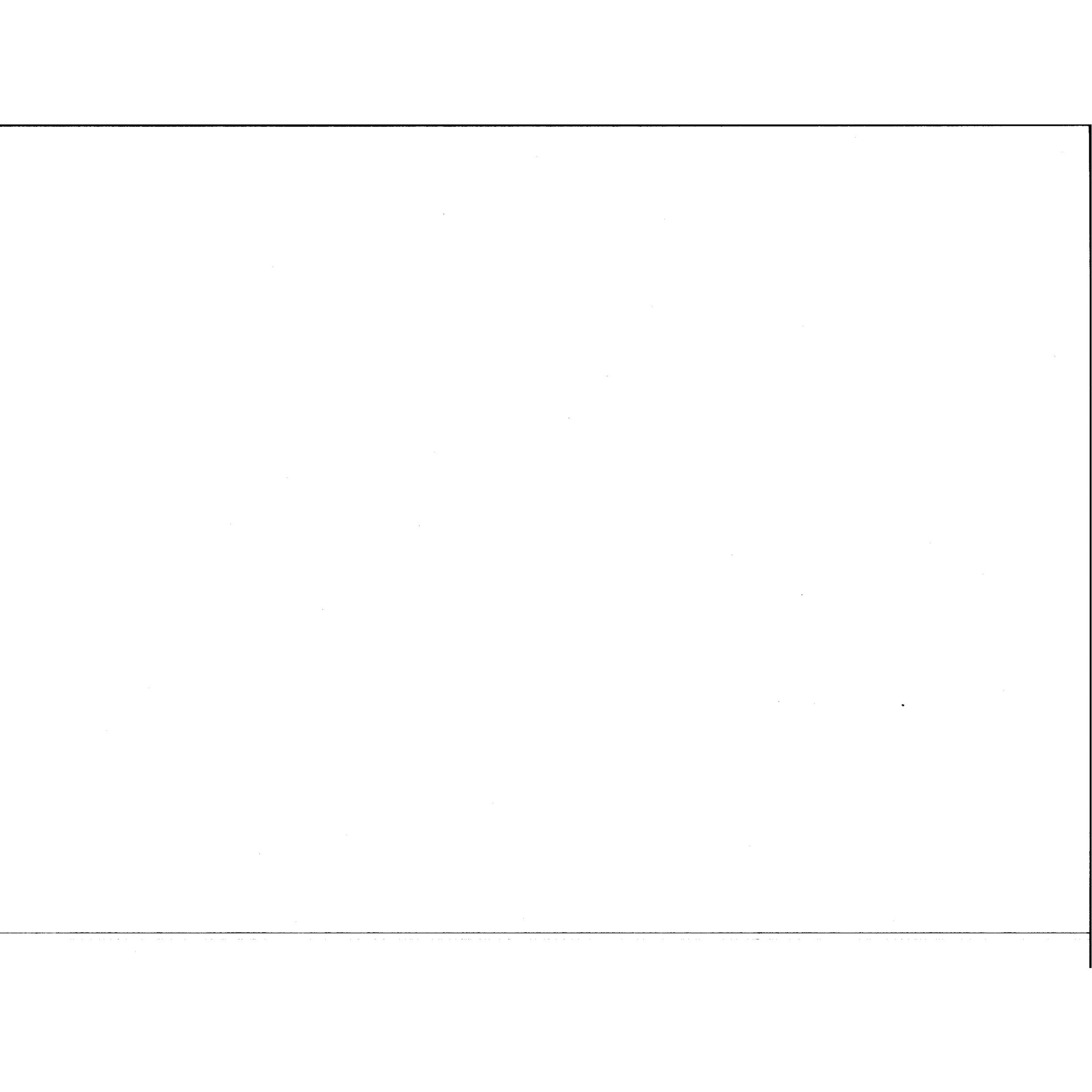
A diagonally oriented oval defect, located 3 ½" below the lateral bottom corner of the pocket measures 1" x ½". A round defect located 6" below the pocket and more medial to the oval defect, measures ¼" in diameter. A very irregular defect on the left side of the shirt, just to the left of midline, located approximately 10" above the bottom hem, measures approximately 2.0 x 1.0 cm. Lateral to this is an irregular oval defect, which is approximately ½" in maximum diameter. Medial to the large defect is another slightly oval-shaped defect that measures 1" x ½". On the left lower front of the shirt, centered approximately 5 ½" above the bottom hemline is a group of four irregular round defects, which are arranged in an open S-shape and measure up to ¼" in maximum diameter. An irregular defect on the right front of the shirt, just to the right of midline and 3" above the bottom hem, measures approximately 1 ¼" x ¾".



A downwardly curved defect in the mid portion of the front of the shirt, approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ " above the hem, measures $\frac{1}{2}$ " transversely. An L-shaped fragment of copper jacketing, with attached green threads, is stuck to the lower front of the shirt and is located approximately 5" above the bottom hem, in the midline. On the left posterior shoulder area, adjacent to the shoulder seam, is a transversely oriented defect, which measures $\frac{1}{4}$ ". A group of irregular defects on the more lateral posterior shoulder, located $2\frac{1}{4}$ " below and behind the shoulder seam, covers an area measuring approximately 1" in maximum diameter. The smallest hole is approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter. There is a small smear of blood on the fabric, adjacent to these defects. A folded deposit ticket, with the name "Thomas Patton" and the date "10/12/01" is in the pocket of the shirt. The deposit indicated on the ticket is one hundred dollars. There is a ragged defect at the bottom of the deposit slip that corresponds in shape to the defect in the pocket of the shirt.

The other half of the polo shirt was not with the body and was not recovered at the scene.

2. Red Jockey-brand bikini underbriefs. The briefs have been cut across the waistband on both sides and are lying underneath the pelvis. The front of the briefs is heavily saturated with blood, and there is heavy bloodstaining on the right and left backs of the briefs as well. The following defects are observed: An irregular hole in the left posterior hip area measures approximately 1" in diameter. A curved notch is out of the right side of the waistband, just in front of the side seam, and measures approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter. A vertically oriented interrupted tear is along the front edge of the right side seam and measures approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ " in length. A round hole on the right side of the briefs, just below the waistband and 1" behind the side seam, measures $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter.
3. A pair of green Bermuda shorts was recovered at the scene. The shorts have been cut up the front of both legs. There is bloodstaining on the front of the shorts. The following defects are observed: A series of irregular tears is vertically oriented on the left side of the shorts, extending from 5" below the top of the waistband to the mid thigh. The largest tear is over the lower portion of the pocket and measures approximately $1\frac{3}{4}$ " in length. An irregular tear on the left leg of the shorts, centered approximately 7" above the bottom hem, measures 1". The edges of the tear are frayed. A smaller, slightly frayed defect on the left leg of the shorts, is located 6" above the bottom hem and medial to the previously described tear. This measures $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter. An irregular defect on the right waistband of the shorts, just above the right side of the zipper, is partially folded back and measures approximately 1.0 cm. There is blood and a small amount of soft tissue clinging to the surface around the defect. A ragged, roughly round hole on the right leg of the shorts is located $\frac{3}{4}$ " above the hem, and measures $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter.



An oval frayed defect on the right side of the shorts, over the lower portion of the pocket, measures approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " in maximum size. A transversely oriented tear inside the right pocket of the short, extends from the seam into a hidden portion of the pocket, and tears through the watch pocket. This large defect measures approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3". Two round to oval defects on the right back leg of the shorts are located 8" and 11" below the top of the waistband. The higher defect is below the lateral side of the hip pocket, and measures $\frac{3}{8}$ " in diameter. The lower defect is on a level with the mid portion of the pocket, and measures $\frac{5}{8}$ " x $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Two additional defects on the right back of the shorts are aligned with the medial edge of the hip pocket, and are located approximately 12" and 13" from the top of the waistband. The defects are aligned and measure $\frac{3}{4}$ " and $\frac{1}{4}$ " in their maximum diameters. An L-shaped defect in the left back of the shorts, located approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ " above the hem, measures $\frac{1}{4}$ " x $\frac{1}{4}$ " on a side. There is a heavy deposit of clotted blood and a small amount of soft tissue on the hem of the shorts near this defect. A slightly frayed round defect on the right waistband of the shorts is approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter. There is also a round frayed defect over the right tab of the shorts that passes through the tab and through the waistband. These two superimposed defects measure approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter.

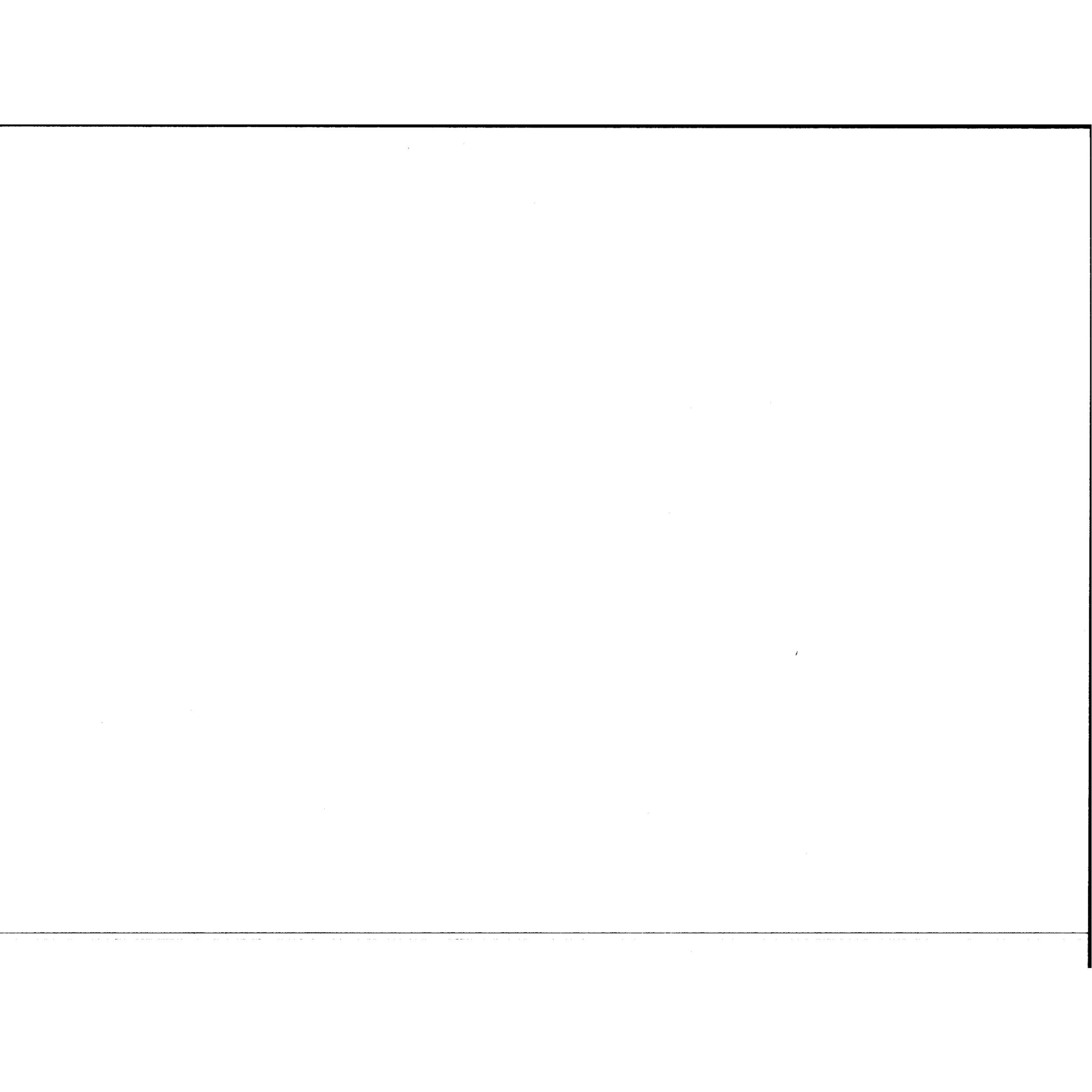
EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL THERAPY:

1. An endotracheal tube is strapped in the mouth.
2. EKG monitor pads are on the anterior torso.
3. A vascular line is in the right side of the neck.
4. Two rolls of gauze, taped to a syringe attached to a catheter at one end and a piece of rubber at the other end, are lying next to the head.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is that of a well-developed, well-nourished Caucasian male, who appears consistent with the listed age of 56 years. The length is 68" and the weight is 213 pounds. The body has not been embalmed and is well preserved. Rigidity is well developed on the extremities, and lividity is posterior and fixed. The body has been refrigerated and is cold to the touch.

The intact scalp is covered by straight gray hair, which measures up to 4" in length. The corneas are clear, and the irides are blue. The conjunctivae are pale, and without petechial hemorrhage. The nose is intact, without secretions. The lips are intact and the jaws are edentulous. A small amount of regurgitated gastric contents are in the mouth. A red-gray 2.0 cm. moustache is in place.



The remainder of the beard area is covered by very short stubble. The ears are normally formed. The neck is straight and symmetrical and the trachea is midline.

The chest is symmetrical and the breasts are those of a normal adult male.

The abdomen is flat, without palpable organomegaly. The genitals are those of a normal circumcised adult male, with the testicles bilaterally descended into the scrotum.

The arms and hands are normally formed. The nailbeds are cyanotic and the fingernails are of varying lengths. A moderate amount of soil is beneath the fingernails, and there is ground-in soil on the palmar surfaces of the hands. The legs are normally formed, without angularity or edema. The feet and toenails are unremarkable.

The back is straight and symmetrical and the anus is without injury.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

The gunshot wounds are numbered for the purposes of description, without reference to chronology.

GUNSHOT WOUNDS:

I. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT UPPER LATERAL BACK:

Entrance – Labeled "A" in the diagram, centered 22 ½" from the top of the head and 6" to the right of posterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures 0.8 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion around the wound is circumferential, and measures approximately 0.1 cm. in width.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right lateral upper back, the bullet enters the right thoracic cavity, producing fractures of right posterolateral ribs eight and nine. The bullet then passes through the right diaphragmatic leaf, perforates the lower portion of the right hepatic lobe, perforates the thoracic spine at approximately the T10 level, perforates the left leaf of the diaphragm, and the lower lobe of the left lung. It then exits the left thoracic cavity through the ninth intercostal space.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A medium caliber deformed, partially jacketed slug is recovered from soft tissue in the left lateral chest wall.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, slightly back-to-front, and very slightly upward.



II. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT MID BACK:

Entrance – Labeled "B" in the diagram, on the right mid back, centered 24" from the top of the head and 3 ½" to the right of posterior midline, is a gunshot wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter. The entrance is surrounded by circumferential margin abrasion, which measures approximately 0.1 cm. in width.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right mid back, the bullet fractures right lower posterior ribs, passes posterior to the upper lumbar spine, and enters the left abdomen, where it penetrates the left kidney.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A medium caliber, partially jacketed, deformed slug is recovered from left kidney parenchyma.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left and back-to-front, without significant vertical deviation.

III. SHOTGUN WOUND OF RIGHT FLANK:

Entrance – Labeled "C" in the diagram, on the right flank, centered approximately 26" from the top of the head and 9" to the right of anterior midline, is a shotgun entrance wound, which has a smooth uninterrupted margin, and measures 3.0 cm. in diameter. There is slight marginal abrasion at the superior edge of the wound, which measures approximately 0.2 cm. in width.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right flank, the slug enters the abdominal cavity and fragments the right kidney, perforates the inferior vena cava, fragments the lower lumbar spine, and lodges as described below.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A deformed shotgun slug is recovered from soft tissues in the left lower flank. The shotgun wad is recovered from the left side of the lumbar spine.

Direction of fire – The projectile passes from right-to-left and slightly downward, without significant anterior or posterior deviation.

IV. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT UPPER POSTERIOR THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "D" on the diagram, on the right posterior upper thigh, 27" above the right heel, is a gunshot entrance wound,



which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter, and has marginal abrasion located primarily on its inferior edge, where it measures 0.2 cm. in width.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous tissue, the bullet passes through the muscle and left tissue and lodges as described below.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A deformed partially jacketed slug is recovered from the pelvis, medial to the right lesser trochanter.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from back-to-front and upwad.

V. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT MID POSTERIOR THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled “E” in the diagram, on the right mid posterior thigh, centered 24 ½” above the bottom of the right heel, is a round gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.8 cm. in diameter, and exhibits marginal abrasion on its inferior margin.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the thigh, the bullet passes through muscle, behind the proximal femur, and exits as described below.

Exit – Labeled “M” on the diagram, on the right upper inner thigh, is an irregular gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.5 x 1.0 cm. in its largest dimensions.

PARTIAL RE-ENTRY:

Re-entry – Labeled “K” on the diagram, on the left upper medial thigh, 30” above the left heel, is a V-shaped atypical superficial gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 1.0 cm. on each side.

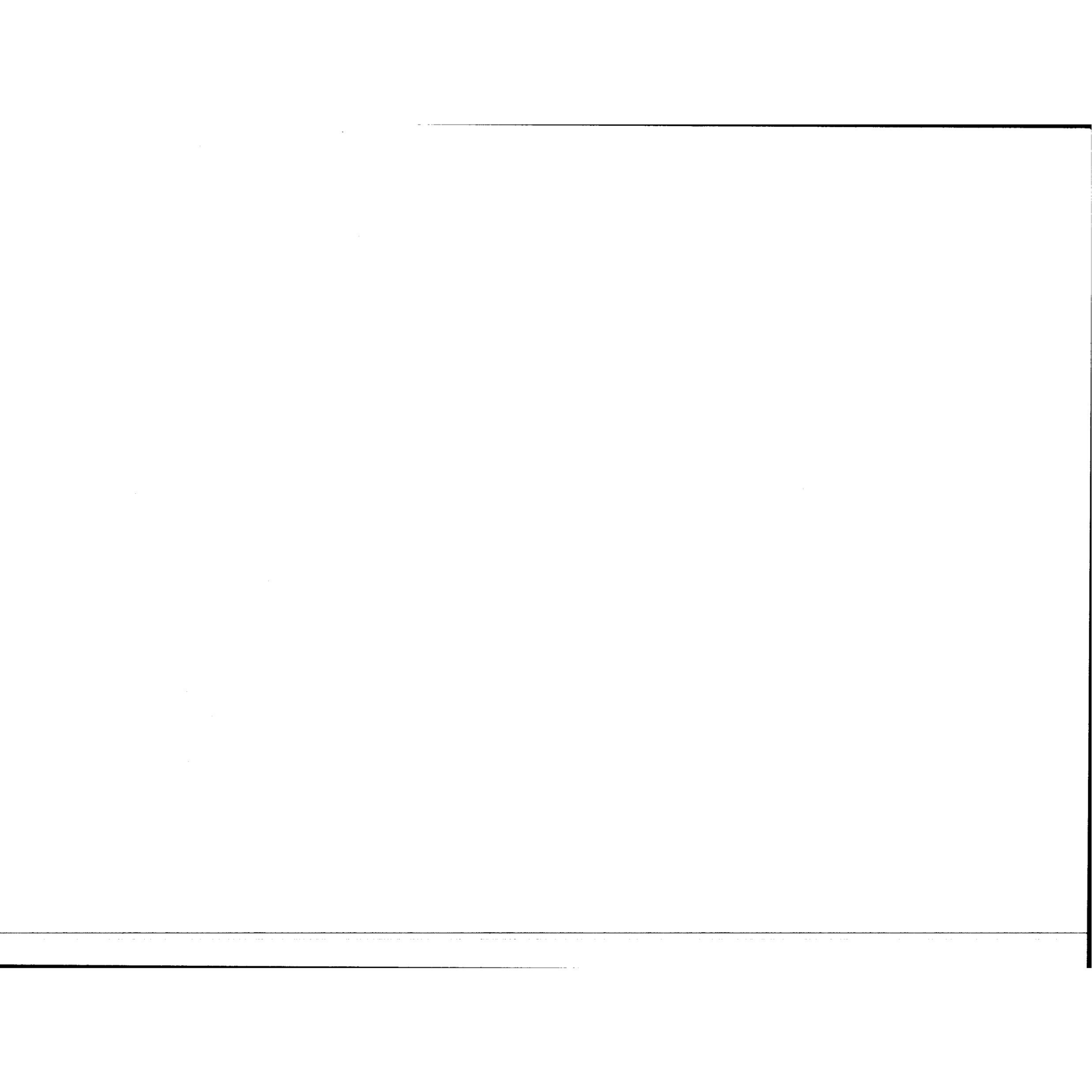
Path – The bullet penetrates for a very short distance into subcutaneous fat.

Bullet – Not recovered.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, back-to-front and upward.

VI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT MEDIAL POSTERIOR THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled “F” in the diagram, on the left posteromedial thigh, centered 27” above the bottom of the left heel, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter. Subcutaneous hemorrhage is located at its inferolateral margin.



Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the left posterior thigh, the bullet passes through muscle of the thigh, strikes the pelvis, and lodges as described below.

Exit – None.

BULLET – A projectile is recovered from soft tissue in the left lateral thigh.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from back-to-front, right-to-left, and upward.

VII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT ANTERIOR CHEST:

Entrance – Labeled "G" in the diagram, on the right upper anterior chest, centered 16" from the top of the head and 6" to the right of anterior midline, is a tangential gunshot entrance wound, which measures 1.8 cm. transversely, by 1.0 cm. vertically. Marginal abrasion is located primarily superiorly and laterally, where it measures up to 0.5 cm. in width.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right anterior chest, the bullet follows a subcutaneous course for a short distance through pectoral muscle, and then enters the right thoracic cavity through the fourth anterolateral intercostal space. The bullet perforates the anterior edge of the right middle lobe of the lung, perforates the right diaphragm and perforates the right lobe of the liver. It then perforates the small intestine and fractures the left tenth rib.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A projectile is recovered from soft tissue adjacent to the left tenth rib.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes right-to-left, front-to-back and downward.

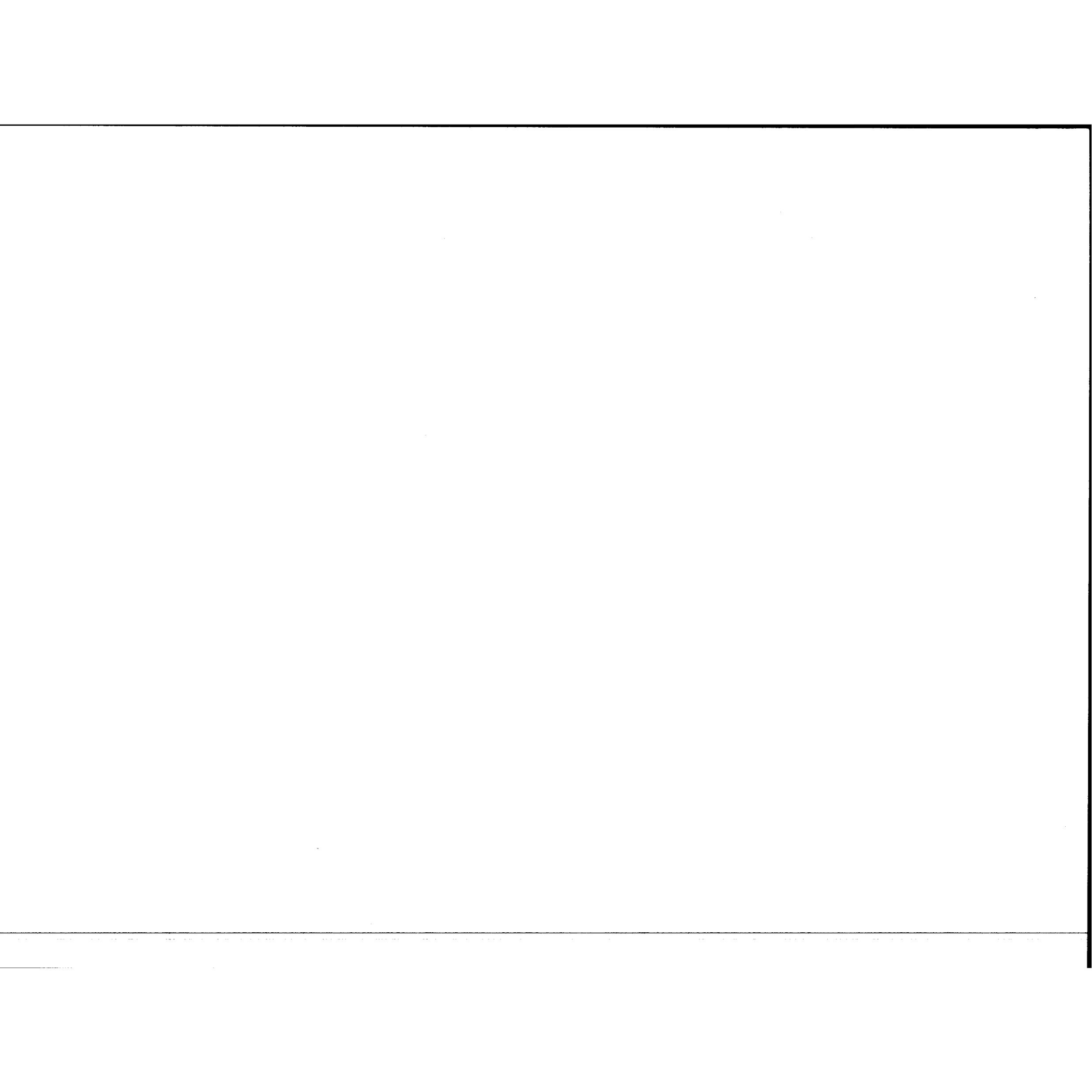
VIII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT UPPER LATERAL THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "H" in the diagram, on the right upper lateral thigh, 35" above the bottom of the right heel, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter, and has marginal abrasion located primarily at its inferior edge.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right thigh, the bullet passes upward through the thigh and enters the pelvic cavity through the right ileum. The bullet then strikes the lumbar spine and lodges as described below.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed medium caliber projectile is recovered from the L2-3 disc.



Direction of fire – The bullet passes right-to-left and upward.

IX. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT LOWER LATERAL THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "I" in the diagram, 34" above the right heel, in the right lower lateral thigh, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.6 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion around the wound measures up to 0.2 cm. in width.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the thigh, the bullet fractures the right pubic ramus and enters the pelvic cavity, where it passes behind the urinary bladder, perforates the sigmoid, and lodges in bone as described below.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed projectile is recovered from the left posterior ileum.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

X. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT ANTERIOR MID THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "J" in the diagram, on the right anterior thigh, centered 30" above the bottom of the right heel, is a tangential gunshot entrance wound, which measures 1.0 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion is primarily inferior, where it measures up to 0.5 cm. in width.

Path – The bullet follows a subcutaneous and soft tissue course upward through the thigh, across the anterior surface of the right pubic ramus and into the abdominal wall.

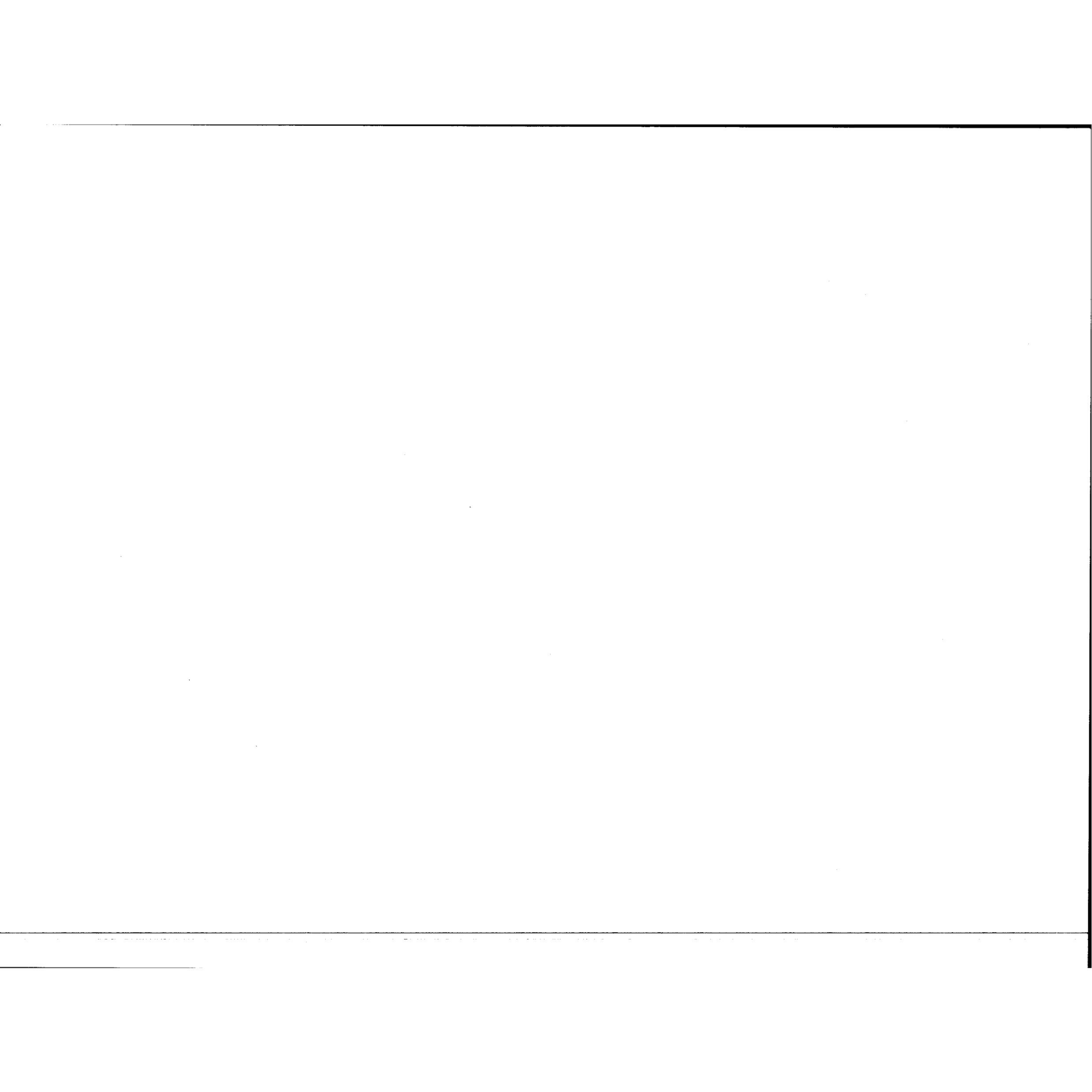
Exit – Labeled "N" on the diagram, on the right lower abdomen, 34" from the top of the head and approximately 1" to the right of midline, is a gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.8 x 1.0 in its largest dimensions. The ovoid wound is diagonally oriented and is surrounded by contusion.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left and upward.

XI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT MEDIAL THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "L" on the diagram, on the left medial thigh, 27" above the bottom of the left heel, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter.

Path – The bullet passes through muscle.



Exit – Labeled "FF" on the diagram, on the left upper posterior thigh, just below the gluteal crease, centered approximately 33" above the bottom of the left heel, is an irregular gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.5 cm. in maximum dimension.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

XII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT ANTERIOR THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "O" on the diagram, on the left anterior thigh, is a tangential shotgun entrance wound, located 31 ½" above the left heel.

Path – The bullet passes through soft tissue.

Exit – None.

Bullet – The bullet is recovered from soft tissue of the left lateral thigh.

Direction of fire – The projectile passes right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

XIII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT DELTOID:

Entrance – Labeled "U" on the diagram, on the left anterior deltoid, centered 4" below the top of the left shoulder, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures 1.5 cm. vertically by 0.7 cm. transversely. A broad area of marginal abrasion is on the anterior edge of the wound and measures up to 1.0 cm. in width.

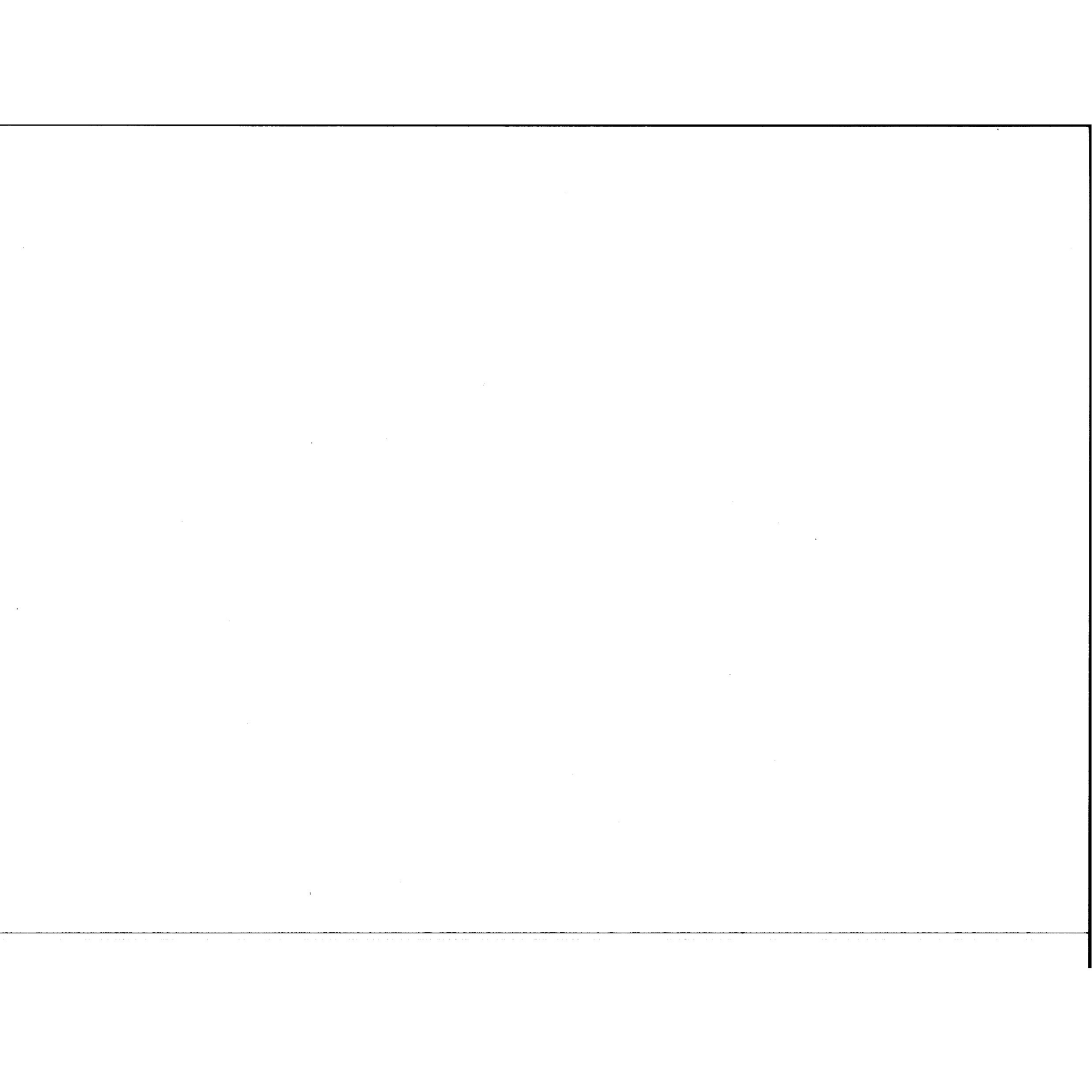
Path – The bullet perforates skin, subcutaneous soft tissues and muscles of the left shoulder.

Exit – Labeled "V" on the diagram, on the left posterior shoulder, 4" below the top of the shoulder, is a slit-like gunshot exit wound, which measures 1.2 cm. in length.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from front-to-back, without significant right-to-left or vertical deviation.

XIV. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT WRIST:

Entrance – Labeled "W" on the diagram, on the radial aspect of the left upper wrist, is a gunshot entrance wound, with severe disruption of soft tissues. There is a focus of marginal abrasion on the wound.



Exit – Labeled "X" on the diagram, on the ulnar aspect of the left wrist, is a severely disrupted gunshot exit wound. A fragment of jacketing material is recovered from soft tissues within this wound.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet travels from left-to-right.

XV. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT POSTERIOR UPPER FOREARM:

Entrance – Labeled "Y" on the diagram, on the left posterior upper forearm, is a tangential gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 2.0 cm. in length.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissues, the bullet produces a comminuted fracture of the left proximal ulna, and enters the soft tissues of the left upper arm.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed slug is recovered from soft tissues, just above the left elbow.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from left-to-right and upward.

XVI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT POSTERIOR FOREARM:

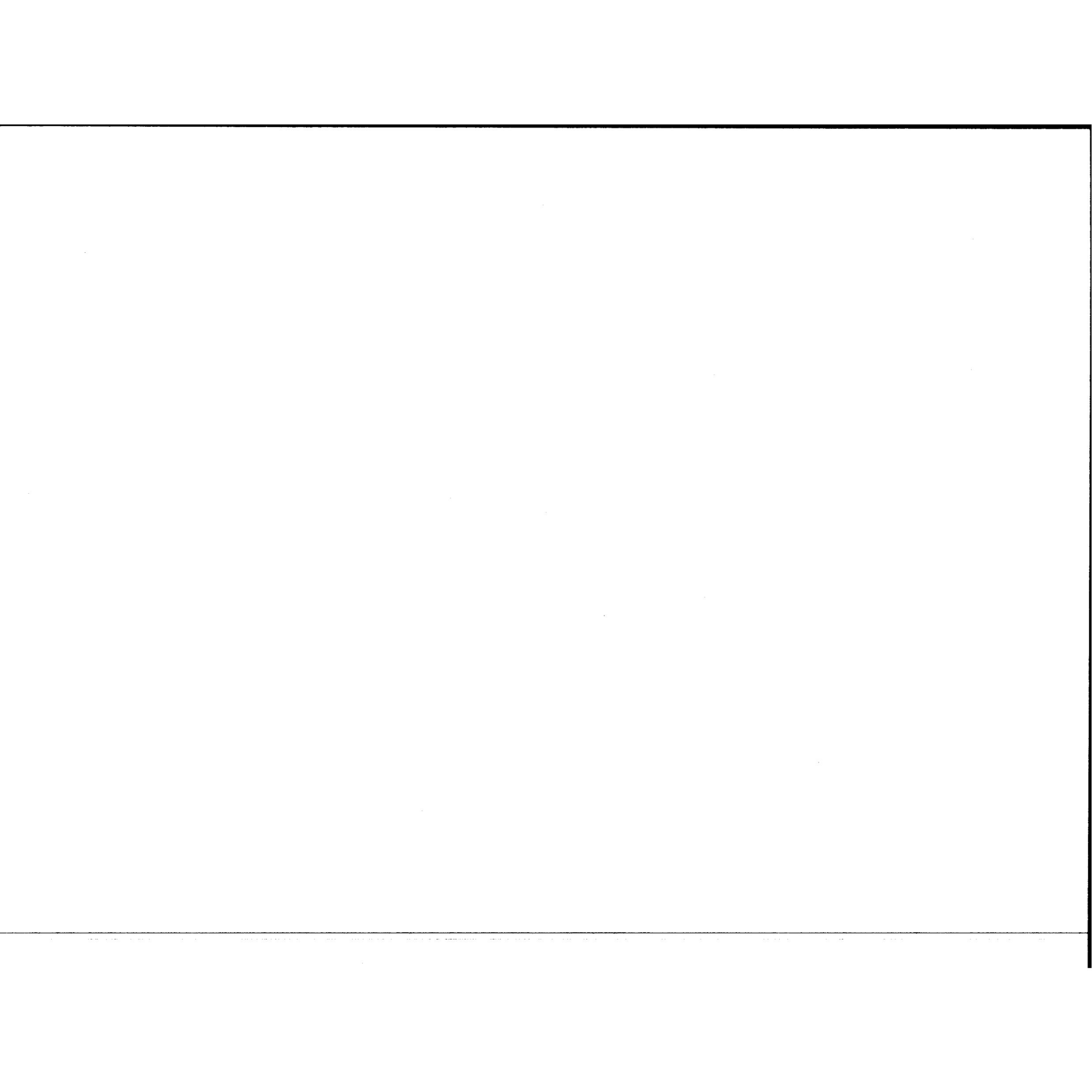
Entrance – Labeled "Z" on the diagram, on the posterior left forearm, is a widely gaping and complex gunshot entrance wound. There is dark gray deposit on some of the inferior edges of the lacerated skin and subcutaneous soft tissue.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues, the bullet passes into the forearm, producing comminuted fractures of the radius and ulna, and then travels upward across the elbow into the upper arm.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed slug is recovered from soft tissues in the area of the left triceps muscle.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet travels upward, without significant anterior-posterior or right-to-left deviation.



XVII. SECOND GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT POSTERIOR FOREARM:

Entrance – Labeled "Z" on the diagram, on the posterior left forearm, is a widely gaping and complex gunshot entrance wound. There is dark gray deposit on some of the inferior edges of the lacerated skin and subcutaneous soft tissue.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue, the bullet passes into the forearm, producing comminuted fractures of the radius and ulna, and then travels upward across the elbow into the upper arm.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed slug is recovered from soft tissues in the area of the left triceps muscle.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the anatomical position, the bullet travels upward, without significant anterior-posterior or right-to-left deviation.

XVIII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT DORSAL WRIST:

Entrance – Labeled "AA" on the diagram, on the ulnar aspect of the dorsal left wrist, is a lacerated irregular gunshot entrance wound.

Path – The bullet follows a subcutaneous course across the dorsum of the wrist, producing chip fractures of the distal carpal bones.

Exit – Labeled "BB" on the diagram, on the radial aspect of the dorsal left wrist, is an irregular gunshot exit wound.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from right-to-left, without significant vertical or anterior-posterior deviation.

XIX. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT LOWER LEG:

Entrance – Labeled "CC" on the diagram, on the left anterior lower leg, just lateral to the tibia, 14" above the bottom of the left heel, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.8 cm. in diameter.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the anterior lower leg, the bullet passes through muscles of the lateral lower leg and exits as described below.



Exit – Labeled "DD" on the diagram, 19" above the bottom of the left heel, on the left lateral calf, is an irregular gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.5 cm. in maximum size.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

XX. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT LOWER ABDOMEN:

Entrance – Labeled "Q" in the diagram, centered 28 ½" from the top of the head and ½" to the left, and above the umbilicus, is a gunshot entrance wound which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter.

Path – The bullet enters the abdominal cavity and travels upward, fragmenting the spleen. It passes through the left diaphragmatic leaf and perforates the anterior edge of the left lower lobe of the lung. It exits the left pleural cavity through the left seventh intercostal space.

Exit –None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed projectile is recovered from soft tissues in the left flank, 21" from the top of the head and 13" to the left of anterior midline.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

XXI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT UPPER ABDOMEN:

Entrance – Labeled "R" on the diagram, on the left abdomen, centered 29" from the top of the head and 3" to the left of anterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures 0.8 cm. in diameter.

Path – The bullet pursues a subcutaneous course through the abdominal wall soft tissue.

Exit – Labeled "P" on the diagram, 28" from the top of the head and 1 ½" to the left of anterior midline, above the umbilicus, is a gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.0 cm. in maximum dimension.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from left-to-right and slightly upward.

XXII. GRAZE WOUND OF LEFT LOWER LEG:

Entrance – Labeled "EE" on the diagram, on the left lower leg, immediately above gunshot wound "CC", is a superficial graze wound, which is diagonally oriented and measures approximately 3.0 cm. in length.



Direction of fire – The bullet passes from slightly right-to-left and upward.

XXIII. GRAZE WOUND OF LEFT LATERAL ABDOMEN:

Entrance – Labeled "S" on the diagram, on the left lateral abdomen, just above the anterior iliac crest, 30" from the top of the head and 5 ½" to the left of midline,

is a complex superficial graze wound, which is slightly diagonally oriented and measures approximately 5.0 cm. in length.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left and slightly upward.

XXIV. GRAZE WOUND OF LEFT CHEST:

Entrance – Labeled "T" on the diagram, on the left anterior chest, 23" from the top of the head and 3" to the left of anterior midline, is a transversely oriented superficial graze wound, which measures approximately 3.0 cm. in length.

Direction of fire – Could not be determined.

XXV. GRAZE WOUND OF LEFT MID LATERAL ABDOMEN:

Entrance – Labeled "GG" on the diagram, on the left mid lateral abdomen, approximately 32.0 cm. from the top of the head and 7.0 cm. to the left of anterior midline, is a vertically oriented dark red graze-type wound, which measures 3.0 cm. vertically by 1.0 cm. transversely. The wound is located directly above the lateral edge of gunshot wound "S".

Direction of fire – Could not be determined.

XXVI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT FLANK:

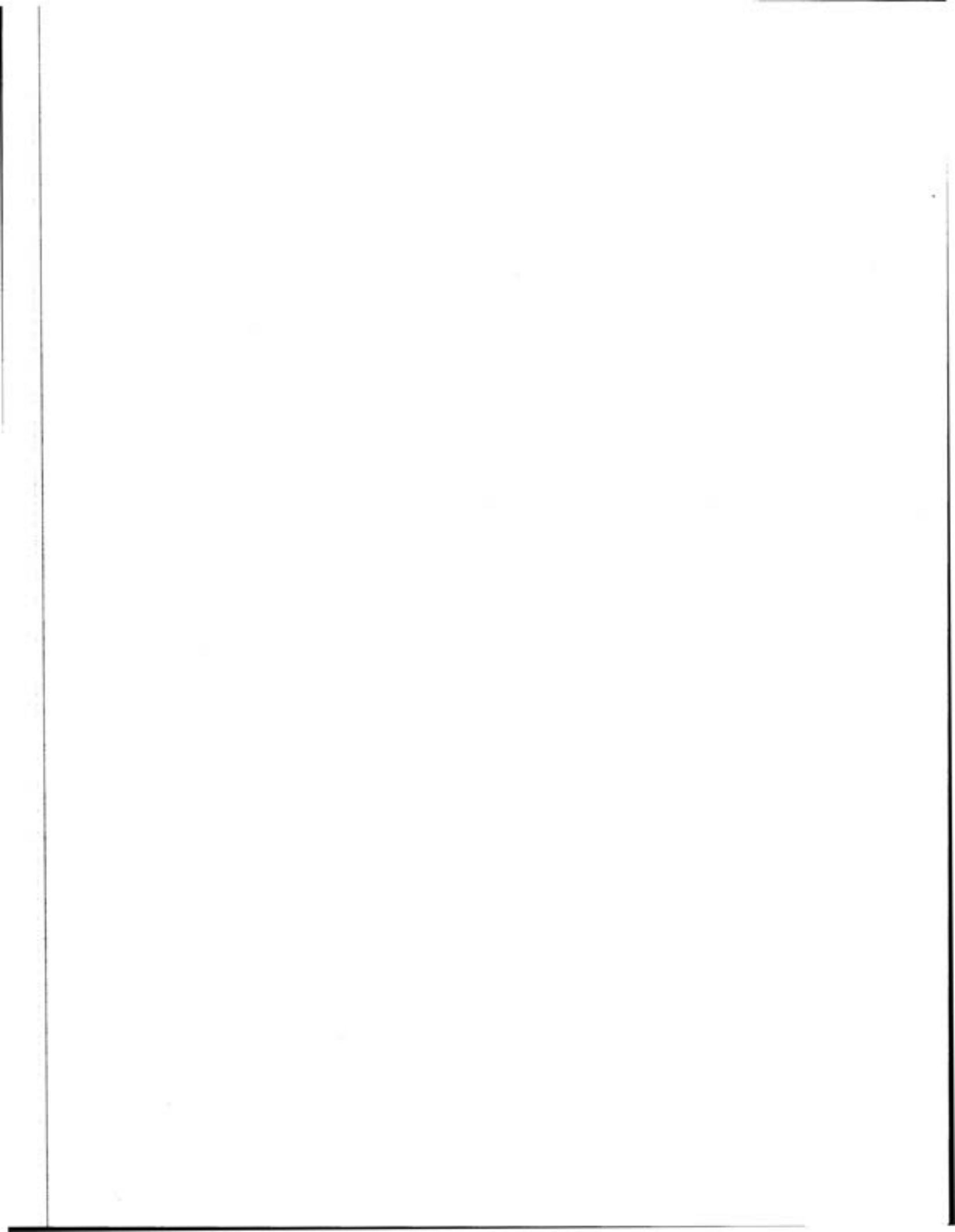
Entrance – Superimposed over shotgun wound "C" on the diagram, and obliterated by entrance wound "C", is a gunshot entrance wound on the right flank, located approximately 26" from the top of the head and 9" to the right of anterior midline

Path – The bullet enters the abdominal cavity, strikes the lower lumbar spine.

Bullet – A mushroomed, partially jacketed, slug is recovered free within the pelvic cavity.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes right-to-left.

OTHER INJURIES:



1. Multiple small scattered abrasions are on the mid abdomen and measure up to 0.5 cm. in maximum size.
2. A linear abrasion over the right scapula measures 3.0 cm. in length.
3. A curvilinear abrasion over the left scapula measures approximately 5.0 cm. in length.
4. A dry dark red abrasion on the right posterior forearm is vertically oriented and measures 8.0 x 1.0 cm.
5. A light red abrasion on the right medial elbow measures 2.0 x 1.0 cm.
6. Dark red irregular abrasion is on the ulnar aspect of the right wrist, and measures 1.0 x 2.0 cm. There is slightly angulated circumferential contusion around the right wrist that measures approximately 0.5 cm. in width. The position of the contusion is consistent with injury from a handcuff.
7. A light red abrasion over the right fifth PIP joint measures 1.0 x 0.5 cm.
8. A light red abrasion over the right third MP joint measures 1.0 x 2.0 cm.
9. A contusion over the right fifth DIP joint measures 1.0 x 1.0 cm.
10. A round to oval deep abrasion is on the radial aspect of the right thumb IP joint, and measures 1.2 cm. in diameter.
11. Dark blue contusion is over the dorsum of the right thumb, extending from the MP joint to the cuticle. Incision of the area reveals hemorrhage down to tendon.
12. Slightly angulated light blue contusion is about the left wrist, and measures 0.5 cm. in width. The position of the contusion is consistent with the position of a handcuff.
13. Multiple nonpatterned irregular abrasions are on the left deltoid area, around the gunshot entrance wound, and measures up to 1.0 cm. in maximum size.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is opened through an abdominal fat layer of 2.0-3.0 cm. and a muscle layer of 1.0 cm. at the level of the umbilicus. The internal organs are found in their normal positions and are covered by glistening serosal surfaces. There is marked atelectasis of the right lung, and the right pleural cavity contains approximately 50 cc. of blood. The left pleural cavity contains approximately 400 cc. of liquid blood.



There is no abnormal accumulation of pericardial cavity fluid. The abdominal organs are heavily coated with blood, and approximately 100-200 cc. of blood has accumulated within the abdominal cavity. Internal injuries have been described.

SYSTEMS REVIEW:

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM: The heart weighs 460 grams and is covered by glistening epicardium, with a large amount of epicardial fat. The coronary arteries arise normally and follow a right-dominant course.

There is focally calcific atherosclerosis of the left anterior descending coronary artery, with up to 50% narrowing of the vessel lumen. The circumflex and right coronary arteries exhibit minimal atherosclerosis. Sections of the myocardium are firm, red-brown and finely fibrillar, without evidence of recent or old ischemic injury. The heart is lined by glistening endocardium. The cardiac valves have their normal structure and the leaflets are thin and translucent, without calcification or vegetations. The coronary ostia are patent. The aorta follows a normal course through the chest and into the abdomen, and exhibits calcific atherosclerosis throughout its length. Blood vessels contain scant quantities of liquid blood.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: The right and left lungs together weigh 830 grams. Both are covered by glistening tan to purple pleural surfaces, with very large quantities of subpleural anthracotic pigment deposition. The bronchi are patent and are lined by tan mucosa, which is coated with thick tan mucus. There are no pulmonary thromboemboli. Cut surfaces of the lungs are atelectatic and severely anthracotic, without areas of consolidation or other focal lesions. Injury has been described.

HEPATOBIILIARY SYSTEM: The liver weighs 1910 grams and is covered by a glistening red-brown capsule. Gunshot wounds have been described. Cut surfaces are firm and red-brown, without lesions. The bile ducts are patent and the gallbladder contains approximately 1 cc. of bile and no stones.

GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM: The intact esophagus is lined by tan mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 200 cc. of thick unidentifiable liquid. The gastric mucosa is unremarkable. The pylorus is patent and the duodenal contents are bile-stained. The remainder of the small intestine and large intestine are normal to inspection and palpation, aside from gunshot wound injuries of the small intestine and sigmoid colon. The appendix is normal.

The pancreas is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are tan and lobulated, without lesions.



HEMATOPOIETIC SYSTEM: The spleen weighs 160 grams and is covered by a glistening purple capsule. Massive injury has been described. Cut surfaces are very soft, with inconspicuous white pulp areas. Lymph nodes within the neck, chest and abdomen are unremarkable. The thymus is replaced by fat.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM: The right and left kidneys together weigh 280 grams. The capsules strip with ease from both, revealing glistening purple cortical surfaces. Injury has been described. Cut surfaces show clear demarcation between congested cortical and medullary areas. The renal calyces and pelves are not dilated and drain into ureters of normal caliber, which follow a normal course to the urinary bladder, which contains approximately 60 cc. of clear yellow urine. The bladder is lined by unremarkable tan mucosa. The prostate is normal to sectioning. The testicles are normal to palpation within the scrotum.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM: The thyroid is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are maroon and finely lobulated, without lesions. There is a 1.0 cm. nodule in the right thyroid lobe. The adrenal glands are of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces show unremarkable golden cortical and maroon medullary areas. The pituitary is normal.

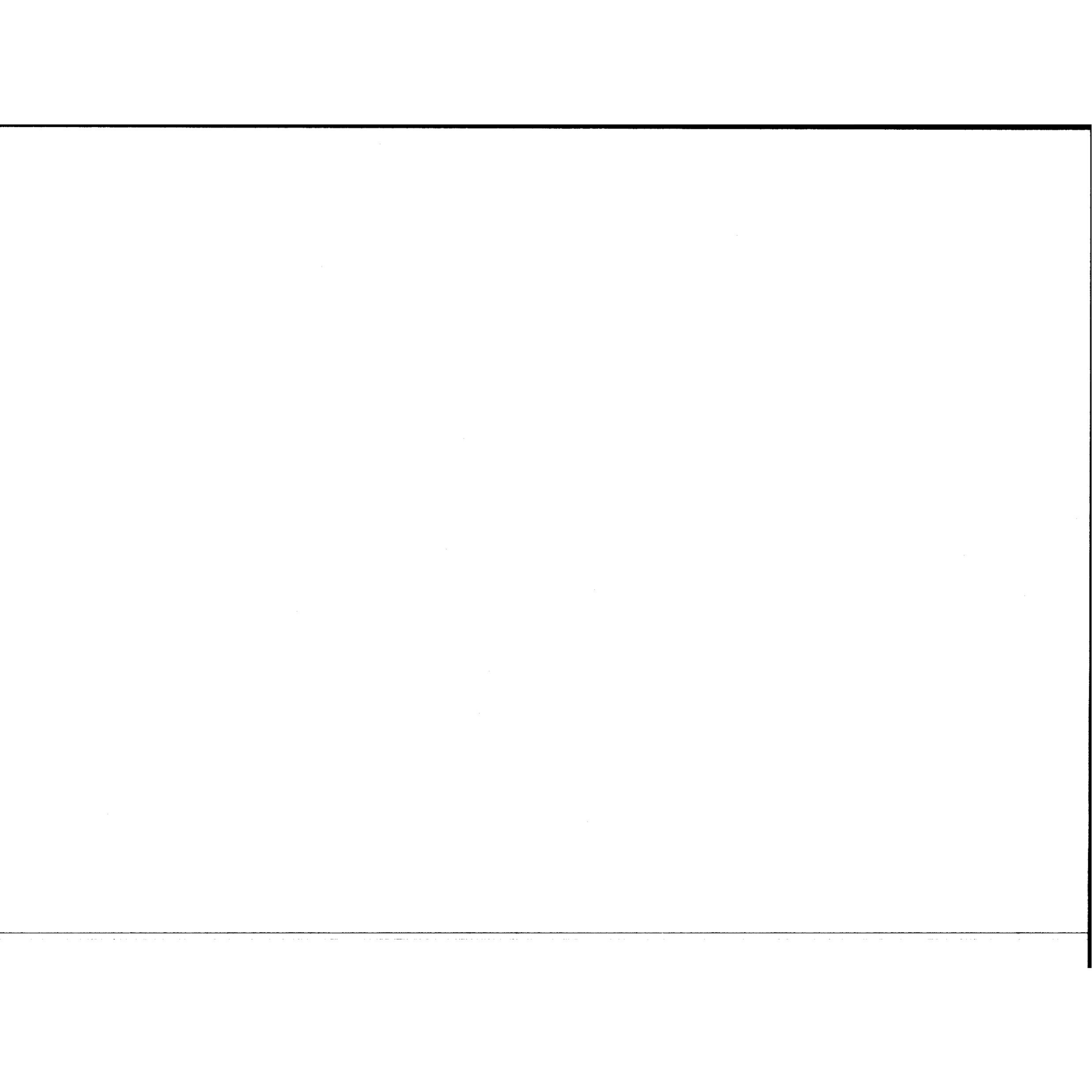
NECK: There is no hemorrhage within the strap muscles, thyroid or posterior pharyngeal constrictors. The bony and cartilaginous structures of the larynx, and the hyoid bone, are intact. The larynx and trachea are patent and are lined by tan mucosa. There is no abnormal mobility or crepitation of the cervical vertebrae.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM: The muscles are normally developed and consistent with those of an adult male. The skeleton is normally developed and consistent with that of an adult male. Multiple fractures have been described.

HEAD: Reflection of the scalp reveals no subgaleal hemorrhage. The calvarium is intact. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage. Removal of the dura from the base of the skull reveals no hemorrhage or fractures. The pituitary and proximal spinal cord are intact.

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM: The fresh brain weighs 1430 grams and is covered by glistening transparent leptomeninges. The gyri are normally oriented and exhibit no significant flattening. Examination of the base of the brain reveals an intact circle of Willis, without atherosclerosis or aneurysms. The cranial nerves are intact. There is no uncus or cerebellar tonsillar herniation. There is no subarachnoid hemorrhage. The brainstem has a normal external appearance. There is firmness to the posterior aspects of both the right and left cerebellar lobes.

Sections of the cerebral hemispheres reveal an intact cortical ribbon and underlying white matter. The basal ganglia and thalamus have their normal appearance. The ventricles are not dilated and are lined by glistening ependyma, without intraventricular hemorrhage.



Sections of the cerebellum show firm areas within the central white matter of both right and left lobes.

TOXICOLOGY: The following specimens are retained: Central blood, urine and gastric contents.


HISTOLOGY: Representative tissues are retained.

PHOTOGRAPHS: 35 mm. photographs are obtained.

X-RAYS: Multiple x-rays are available for examination.

EVIDENCE: A purple top tube of blood, clothing and the recovered bullets are submitted to the sheriff's office B.I. Swabs of the face are obtained by sheriff's B.I., as are fingerprints from the right hand.

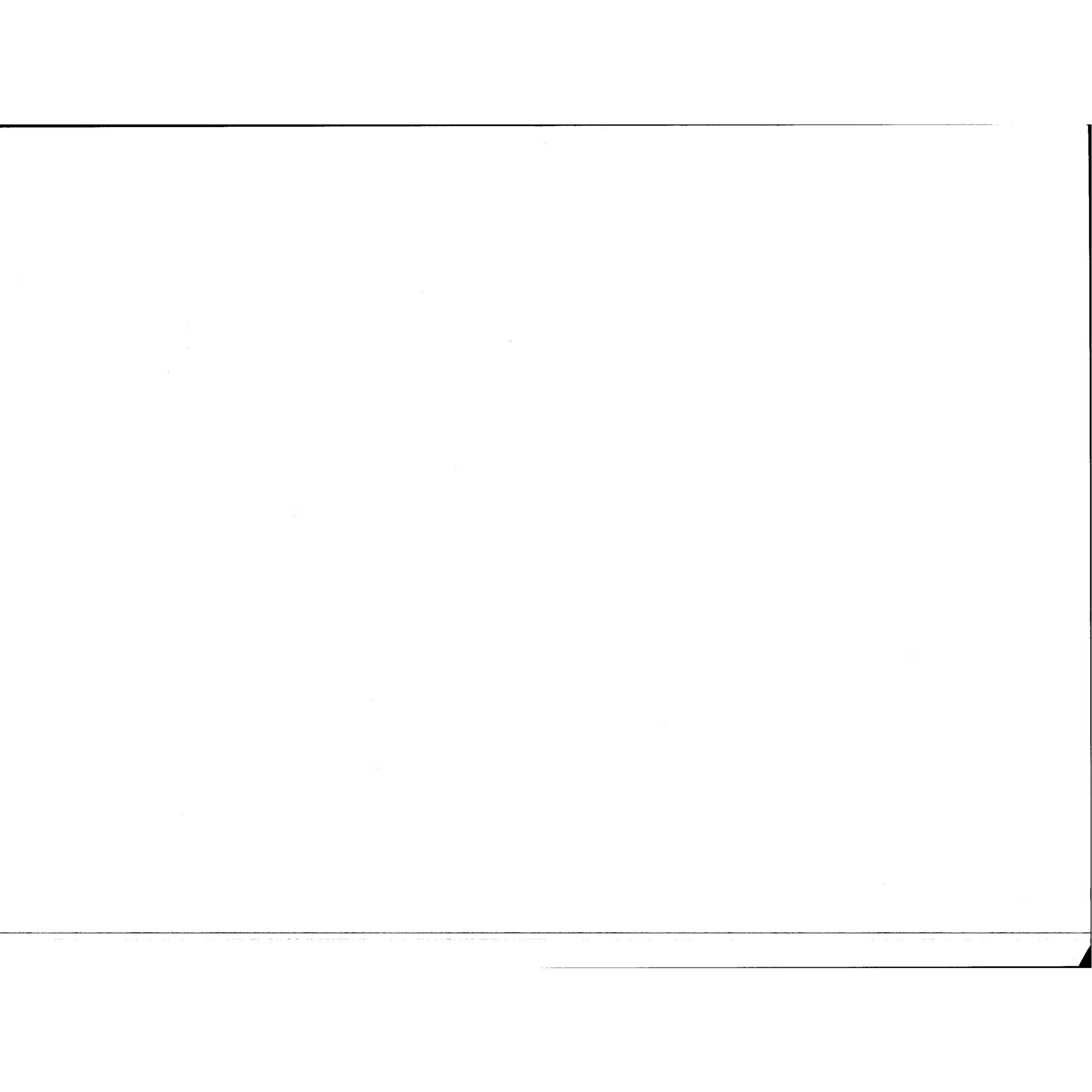
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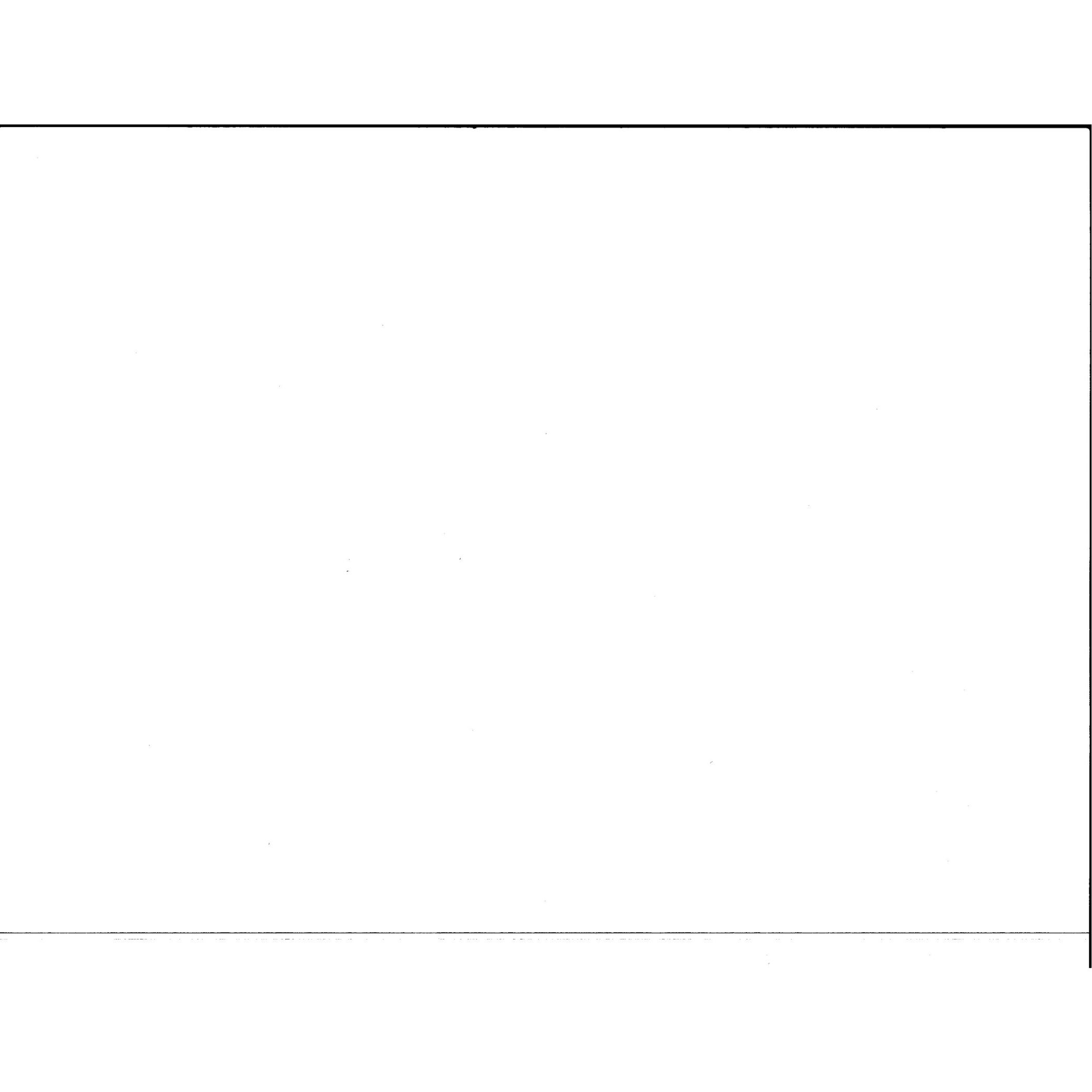


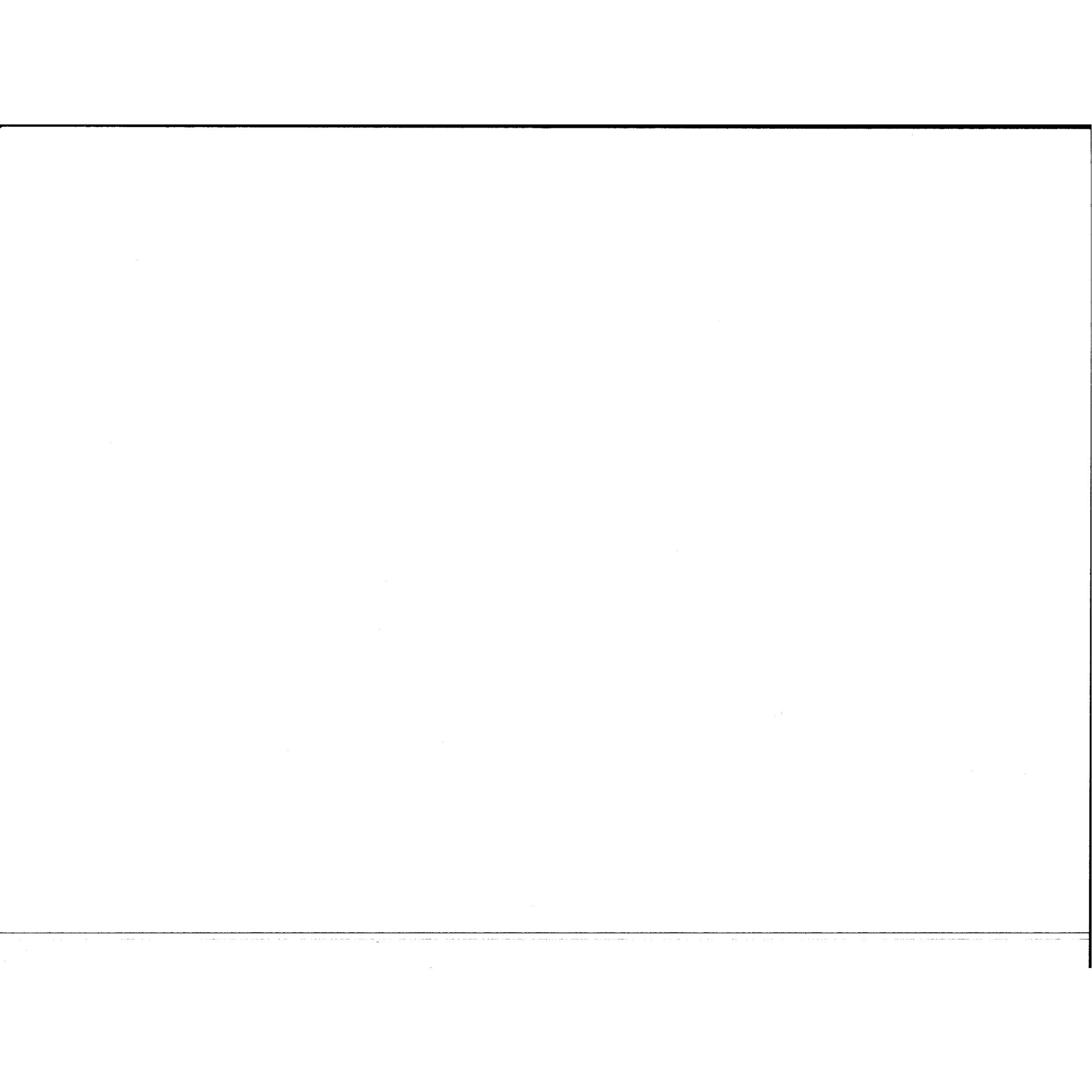

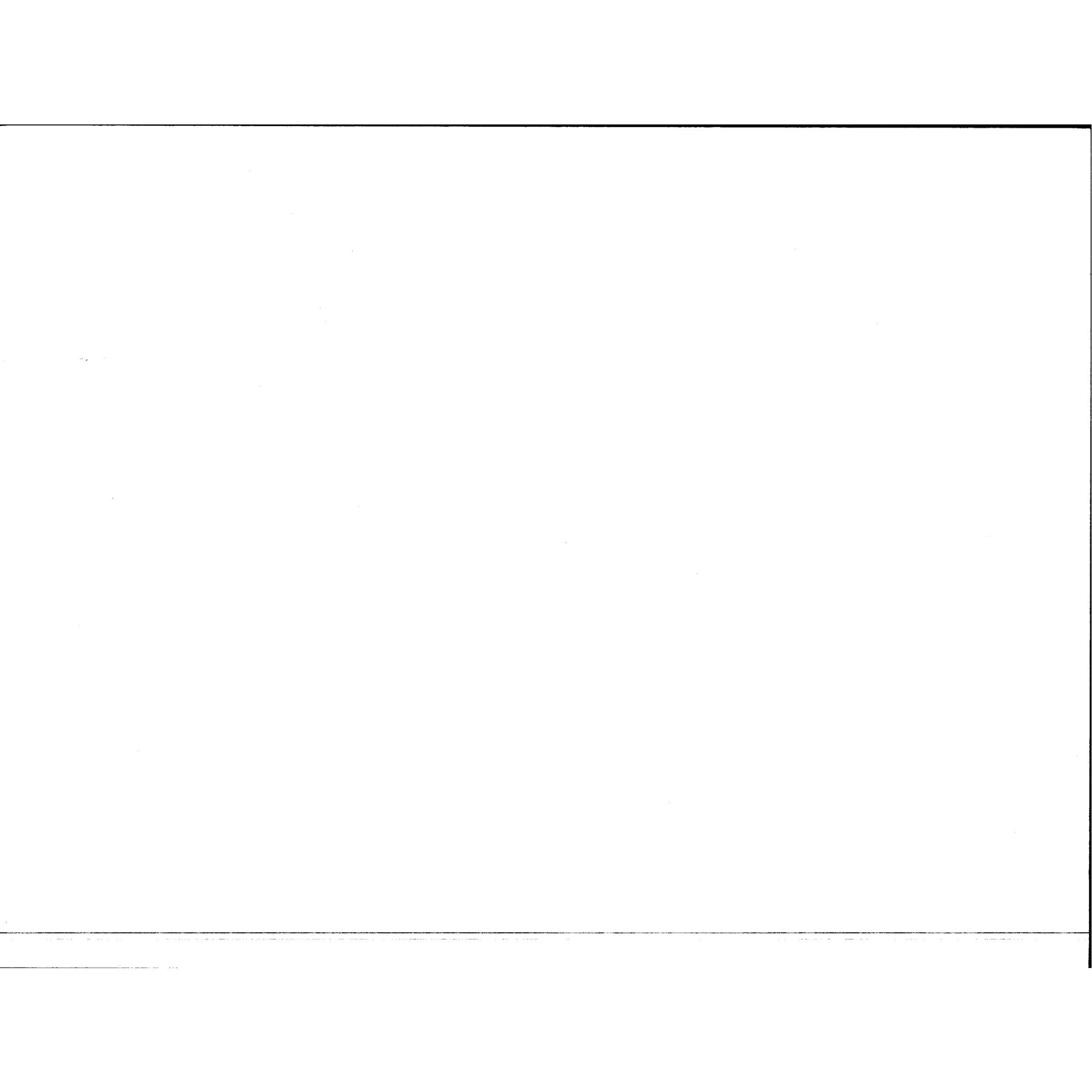


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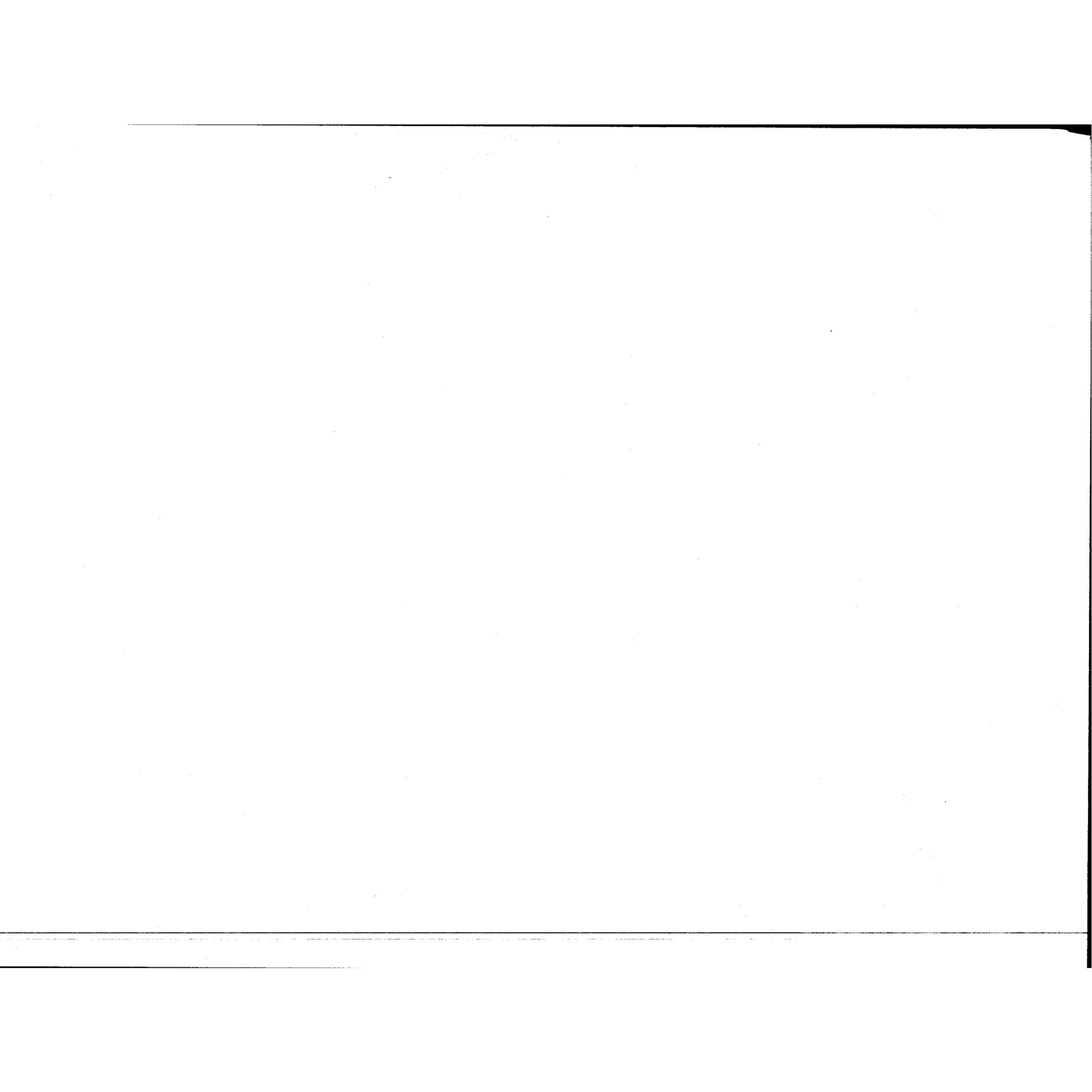








**DIAGRAM

Witness Interview

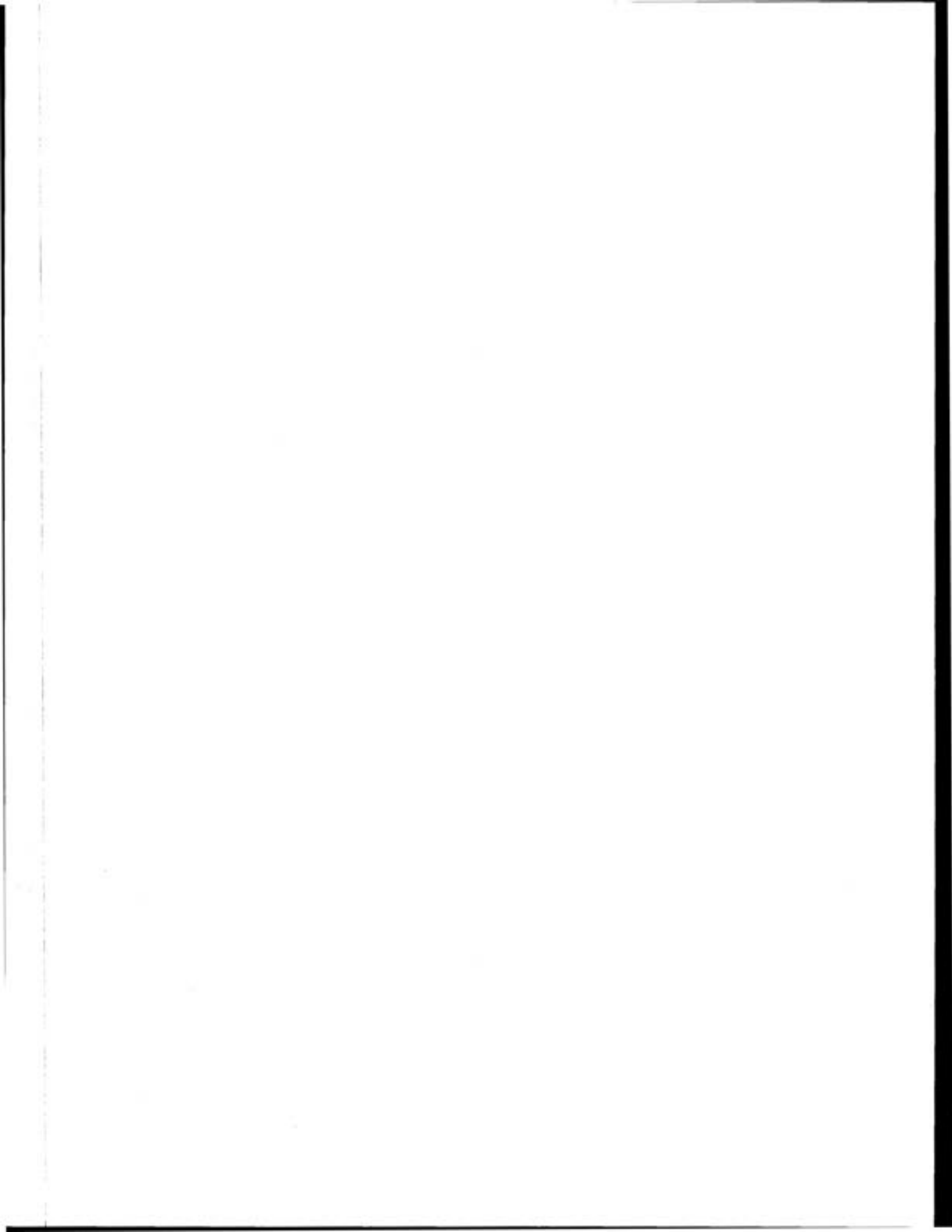


On October 13, 2001 at approximately 1906 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] while we were seated in the backyard of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is a witness to this investigation, and she resides at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and Thomas Patton reside at [REDACTED]

Earlier on this date, [REDACTED] and Thomas were involved in a domestic disturbance at their residence. Deputies from the Sheriff's Department responded to this call, and eventually contacted Thomas at his residence to arrest him for domestic violence. This contact led to an officer involved shooting at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Thomas was mortally wounded during the shooting.

This interview was tape-recorded. The following is a summary of the interview. Refer to the audiotape for additional information:

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It should be noted that before I began this interview, [REDACTED] was very upset and distraught. She told me she had taken Valium in order to calm herself. Once [REDACTED] was able to control her emotions, she agreed to this interview.

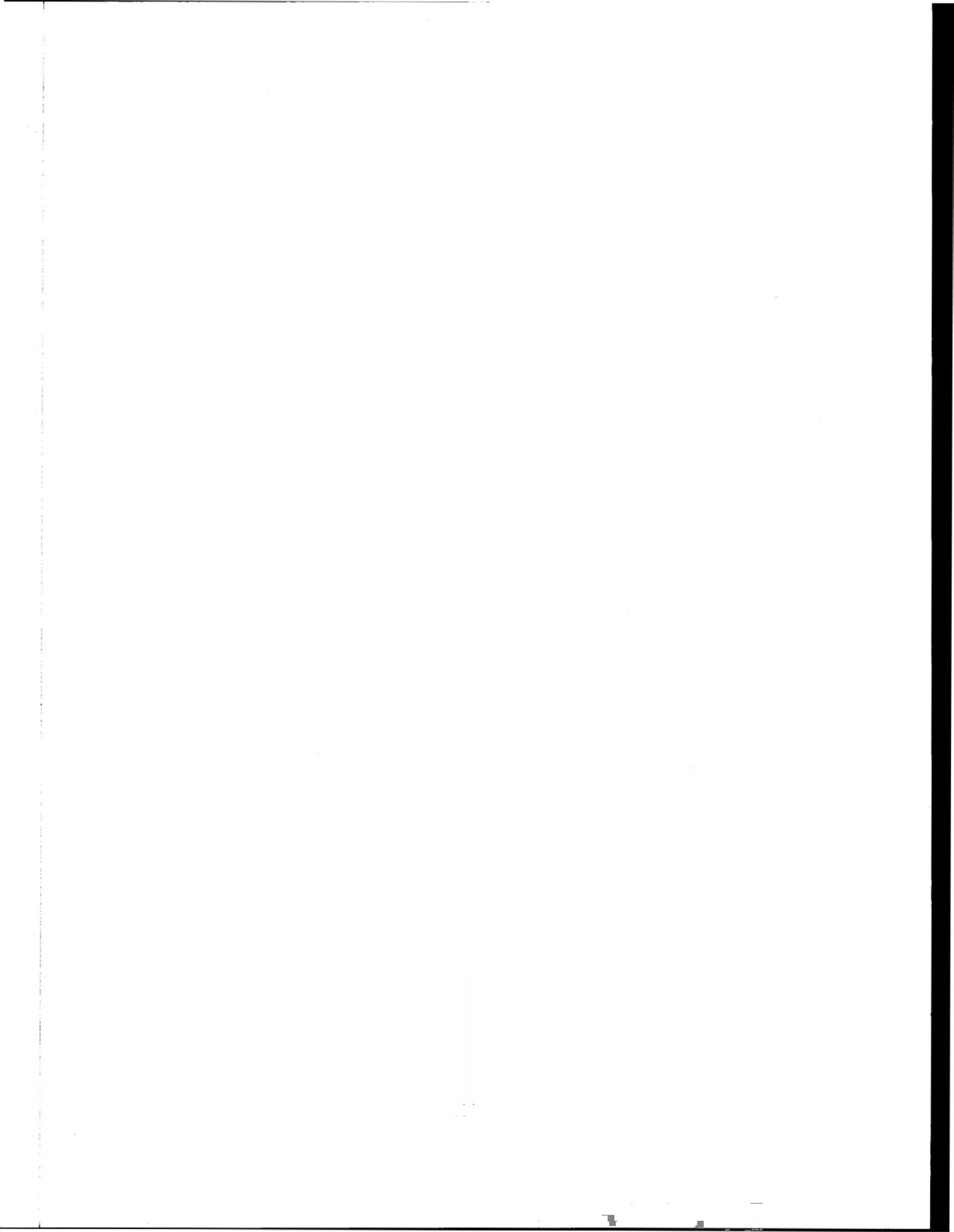
[REDACTED] resides at [REDACTED]. She has lived there for approximately one year. [REDACTED] has known [REDACTED] and Thomas for approximately eight or nine months. She considers herself to be a friend of [REDACTED] however, she does not feel the same toward Thomas. [REDACTED] said she has taught [REDACTED] that she is a friend, and not "somebody that Tom has playing her as a friend." I asked [REDACTED] what she meant by this statement. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] does not "trust anybody," because she has trusted Thomas' friend's in the past, and these friends would tell Thomas that [REDACTED] said she was abused by him. This would cause [REDACTED] to get in "more trouble" from Thomas.

I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] has ever told her about past problems she has had with Thomas. She said [REDACTED] has told her that Thomas has physically abused her for 32 years. [REDACTED] said the abuse was worse when Thomas was a "severe alcoholic." [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that Thomas was arrested (for an unknown charge) and they ([REDACTED] and Thomas) "lost everything." Thomas had to attend counseling, however during the last three months, Thomas has physically abused [REDACTED] on an increased level.

I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] has ever told her if Thomas has ever been arrested for domestic violence in the past. She said [REDACTED] has called law enforcement concerning Thomas on several occasions. Thomas has also said this to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said the deputies who respond to the calls assume she is an "alcoholic" or a "drug addict" based on her appearance, and the fact she has difficulty remembering her personal information. Because of this, the deputies believe [REDACTED] is on something," and they blame her for what occurred. [REDACTED] added that Thomas has never been arrested for domestic violence.

I asked [REDACTED] why [REDACTED] has the aforementioned problems she told me about. She said she believes that [REDACTED] has "battered wife's syndrome." Thomas makes [REDACTED] feel "so negative"

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that she cannot do everyday errands by herself. I asked [redacted] if she was aware of [redacted] problems being caused by any medical condition. She said that Thomas told her that he has probably caused [redacted] brain problems," because he would "beat" [redacted] on her head so he would not leave "marks."

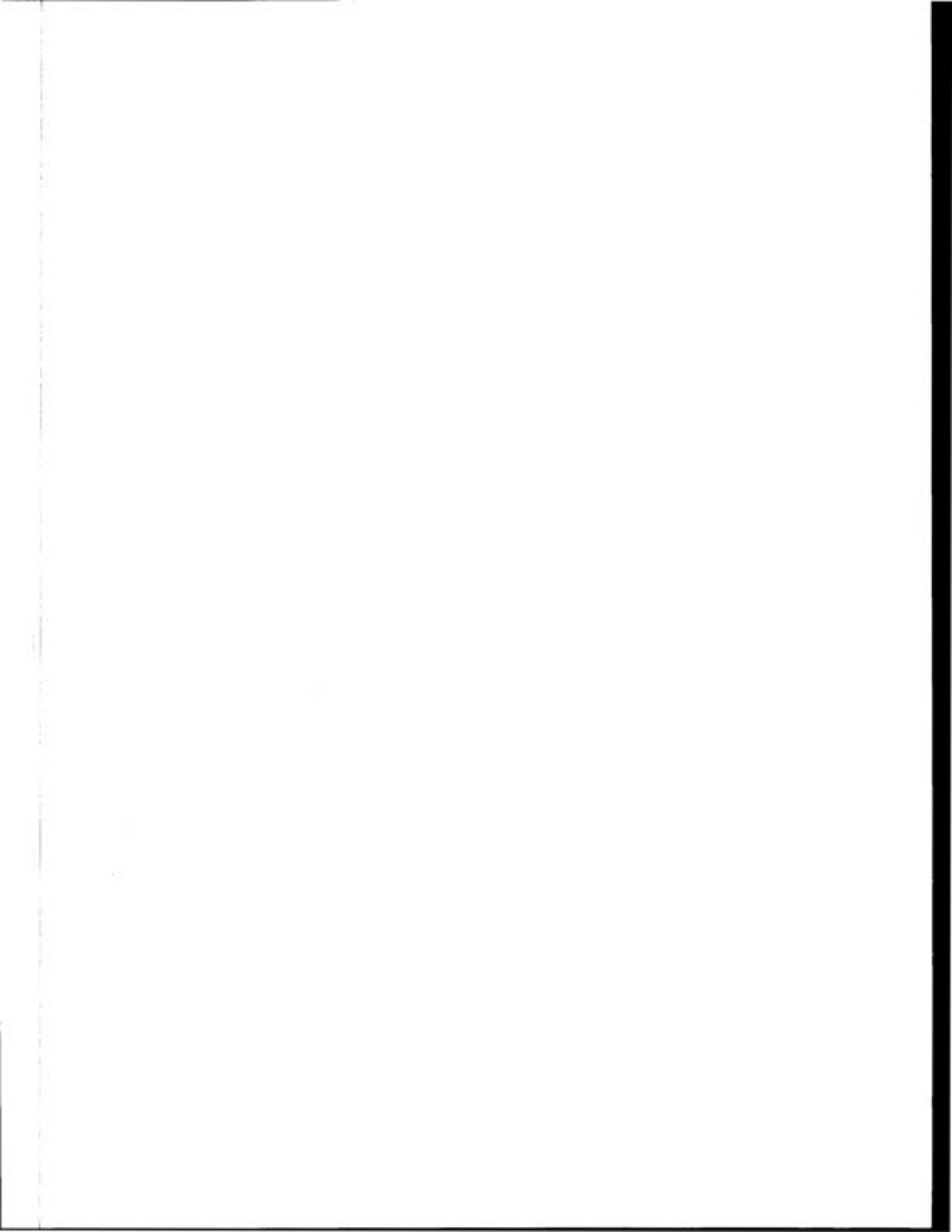
[redacted] said on four occasions she has confronted Thomas about the abuse he does to [redacted]. I asked [redacted] what led up to her confrontations with Thomas. She said, "Because it's not right. I don't care what a woman does, love's not supposed to hurt. And for her to always be in pain and to not be able to walk or think is not right. It's not a way for her to be living. She doesn't sleep at night. All she does is smoke cigarettes. She doesn't eat food."

I asked [redacted] if her confrontations with Thomas occurred after Thomas had an altercation with [redacted]. She said this was true. [redacted] added, "After [redacted] comes over, like the one time she had claw marks here and like a thumb mark here." [redacted] used her hands to her neck to show where [redacted] was injured. [redacted] said [redacted] had a thumb mark on the front of her throat, and "nail marks" toward the back of her throat. [redacted] asked [redacted] what happened, but [redacted] did not like to tell her what happened. [redacted] told [redacted] it was "her problem." [redacted] then went to Thomas' residence and confronted him. She said this incident occurred approximately two months ago.

Thomas told [redacted] that [redacted] had "pissed him off by turning off the fan." [redacted] told Thomas that his behavior could not continue, and if it did, she would call the police. Thomas told [redacted], "Well, you know, if she would just stay out of my face." [redacted] again warned Thomas that she would call the police. The Sheriff's Department was not notified about this incident.

[redacted] said the second time [redacted] was abused by Thomas, [redacted] came to her residence and she had "finger marks" on her bicep. [redacted] used her hand on her arm to indicate that [redacted] had injuries on the upper and lower portion of her left bicep. [redacted] added that [redacted] also had "marks on her ribs." [redacted] asked [redacted] what happened. [redacted] said she stood in front of the television and asked Thomas a question. Thomas got mad because he could not see the football game on the television. [redacted] added, "So, he physically removed her." [redacted] went to Thomas'

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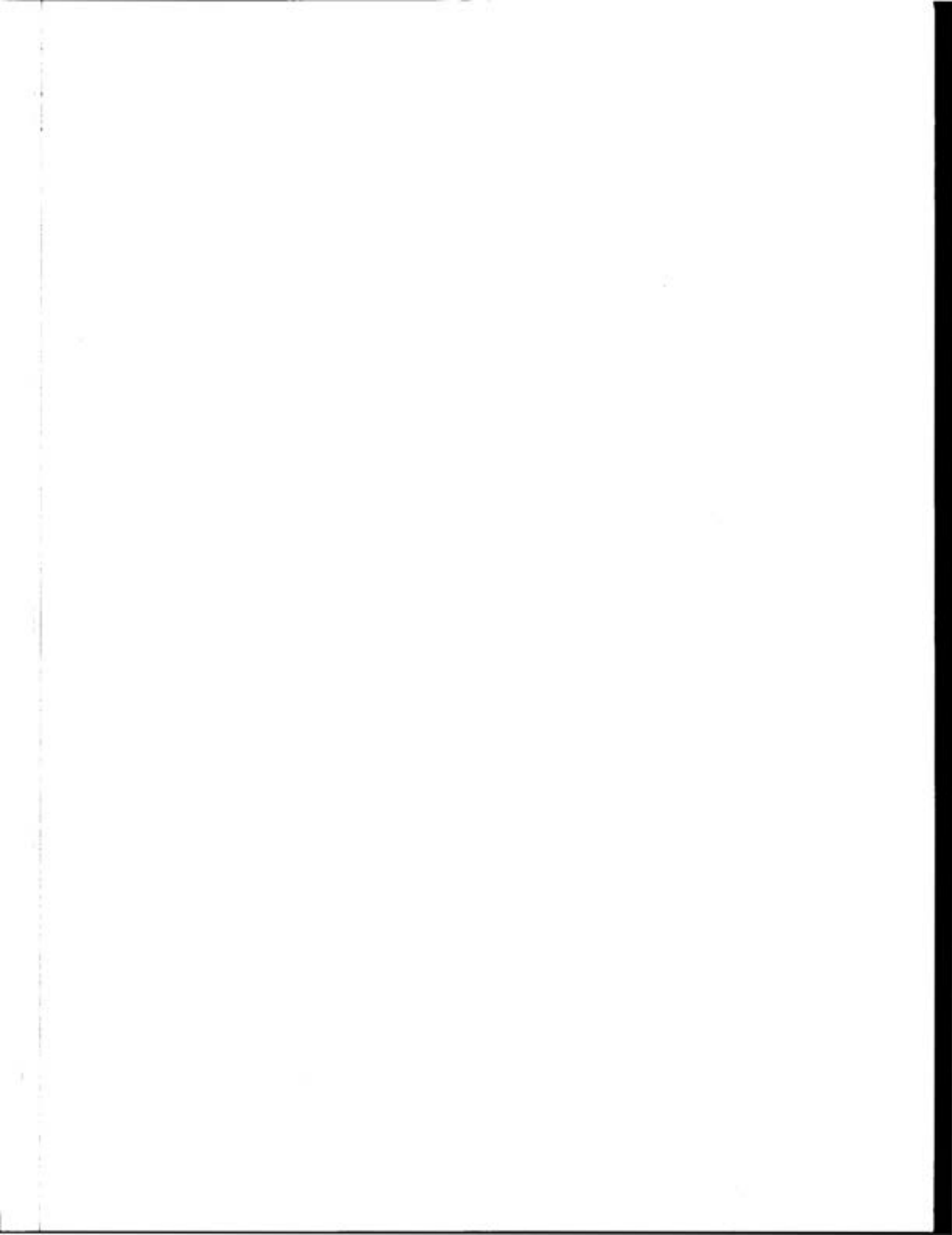
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residence and confronted him about his abuse to [REDACTED]. Thomas told [REDACTED] "She's lucky he hadn't done worse to her. And that she just needed to stay the hell out of his way." The Sheriff's Department was not notified about this incident.

[REDACTED] said approximately three weeks to one month ago, she was in her front yard with her father. [REDACTED] exited her house screaming, "Help me. Help me. Help me." [REDACTED] ran over to [REDACTED]. She said Thomas had "shoved" [REDACTED] into a wall "so hard it had knocked the wind out of her." Thomas also choked [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] if she saw this incident, or is this what [REDACTED] told her occurred. She said, "No, he -- that -- that's what she told me. And he had admitted it to me with his own mouth. And I told him, Tom I am not lying to you. [REDACTED] doesn't want me to call. But I will call, it's not right. And then the daughter says, "Well if da- -- mom wouldn't make dad upset and just not talk at all, then she would -- this wouldn't be happening." [REDACTED] said the daughter's name is [REDACTED] and she is [REDACTED] years old. [REDACTED] lives with [REDACTED] and Thomas.

I asked [REDACTED] if she had any additional information she could provide me about [REDACTED] and Thomas and their past problems. She said two days ago she went to Thomas' residence and talked to him because he had hurt [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] how she found out about this incident. She said, "Well, I can tell when [REDACTED] has been abused, because she goes to go take her dog for a walk, and she won't look. When [REDACTED] doesn't look at me, or say hi, then I know something has happened. And I stopped her." [REDACTED] could not remember what Thomas did to [REDACTED] on this day (two days ago). Later, [REDACTED] remembered that [REDACTED] had "marks" on the lower portion of her left bicep. [REDACTED] used her hand on her arm to indicate where [REDACTED] was injured. The following day, [REDACTED] talked to Thomas at his residence. She added that [REDACTED] "begs" her not to talk to Thomas. [REDACTED] told Thomas that she can see where [REDACTED] had been abused, and [REDACTED] was not "tattle tailing." [REDACTED] also told Thomas that [REDACTED] would not tell her what happened to her arm. Thomas said, "Well, if she would just stay out of my damn face, I wouldn't have to do it." [REDACTED] asked Thomas what he did to [REDACTED]. Thomas said, "It doesn't matter what I do. I could kill her tomorrow and nobody would know." Thomas added, "I'd dispose of the body, and I'd be much better off." [REDACTED] told Thomas she did not want him to "touch" [REDACTED] again.

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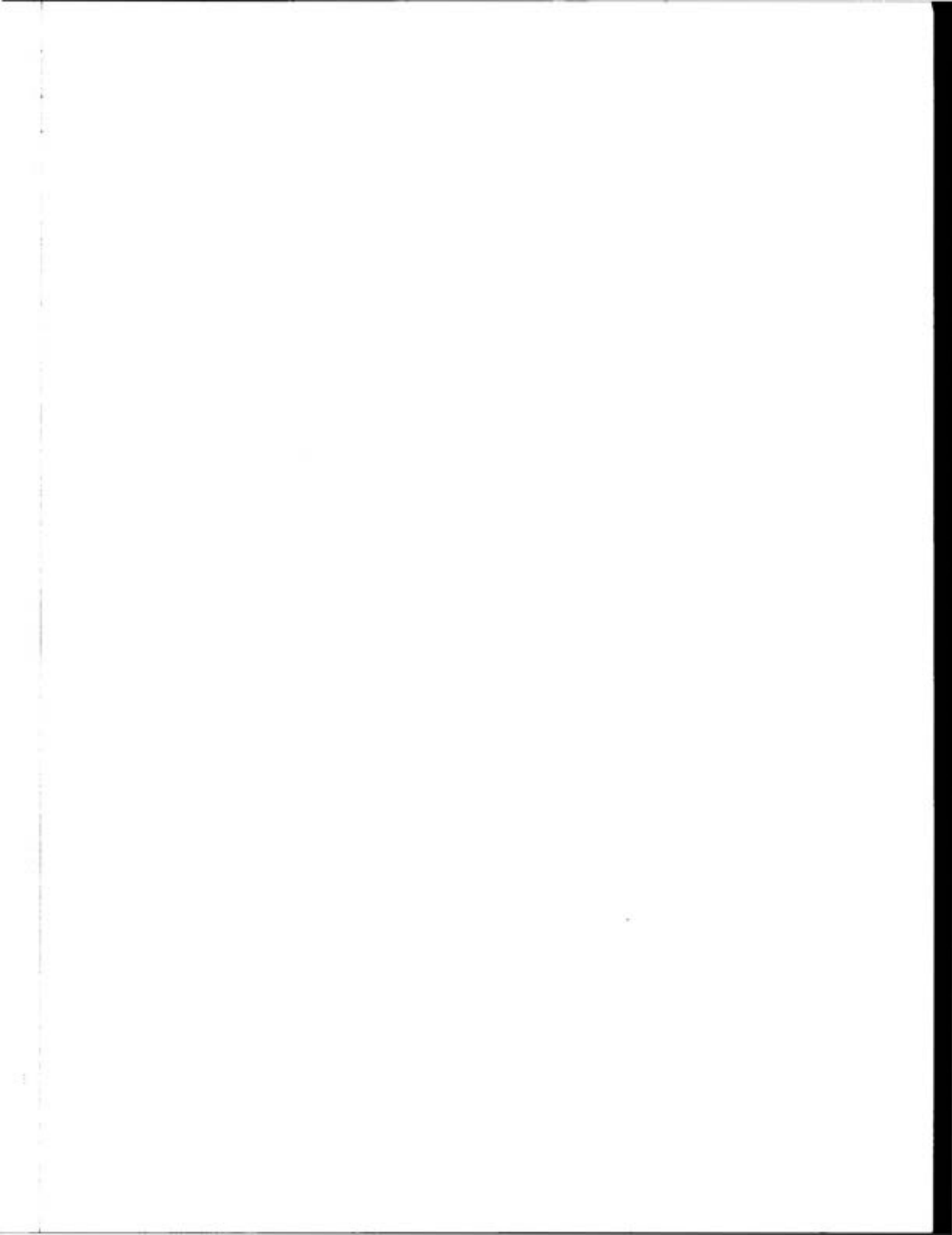
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█████ said █████ has many problems. █████ cannot think on her own, she is very nervous and she sleeps only two hours each night. █████ said █████ cannot walk to the store because "she cannot think enough to go."

At this time, I began to interview █████ about the events that occurred earlier in the day. I asked █████ what was the approximate time she saw █████. She saw █████ at approximately 1600 hours. █████ was seated on the "park bench" in the front yard of her residence when she saw █████ walking her dog eastbound in front of her house. █████ said hello to █████ and █████ would not look at her. █████ continued to walk her dog. █████ told █████ to stop, but █████ did not. █████ told █████ "█████ honey, I love you. Please stop. Don't make me have to run." █████ stopped and "turned around." █████ saw a "very large welt" on the left side of █████ forehead. █████ said she and her father, who was outside with her, believed they had seen the injury when they first saw █████. █████ also believed this is why █████ turned her head and would not look at her.

█████ stopped at the top of █████ driveway and █████ went to her. █████ asked █████ what happened. █████ had tears "streaming" down her face. █████ said, "If I just wouldn't of." █████ told █████ please stop. It's not right. This can't happen to you all the time. It's getting worse. It's more frequent. Tom's doing it." █████ also told █████ "At first it was like every month," and that it was occurring more frequently and Thomas was getting angrier. █████ added she could hear █████ and Thomas at night "at 1 o'clock in the morning out there screaming at her." █████ told █████ that Thomas was going to kill her. █████ told █████ that Thomas said he would kill her, and she knew this. █████ said she could not live without Thomas because she does not have money, and Thomas takes care of all the bills. █████ said, "I have nobody." █████ told █████ she would "support" her, but if she did not call Thomas' "bluff," he would kill her. █████ added that █████ had all of Thomas' guns "shipped out" because she is "in fear of her own life." █████ did not know when █████ had the guns "shipped out." She knew █████ got rid of the guns because Thomas asked for them "two days ago." █████ was with █████ when Thomas told █████ "I want my damn guns back from your mother."

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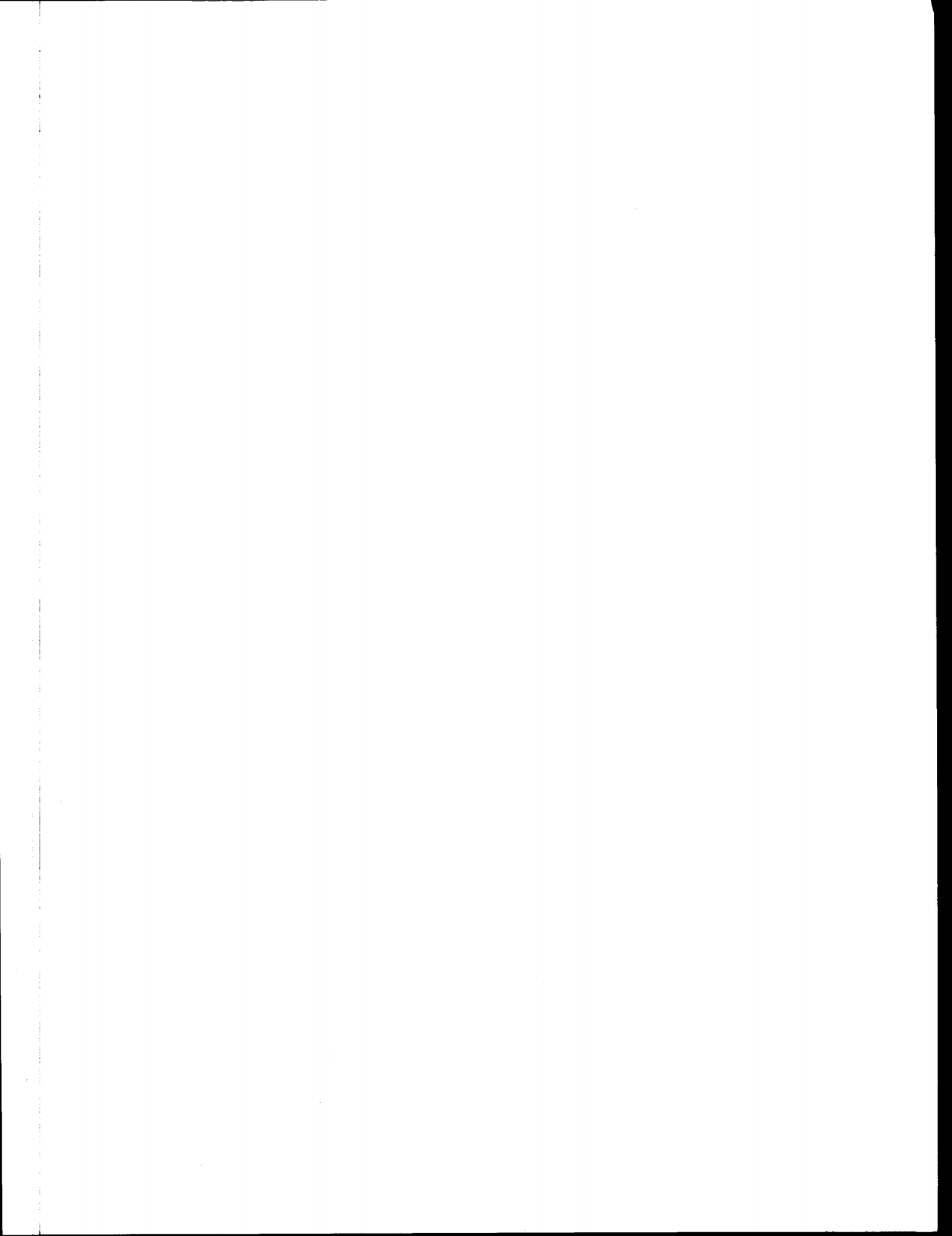
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I asked [redacted] what happened after her conversation with [redacted] at the top of her driveway. She said she convinced [redacted] to come into her house and either call the "spousal abuse line" to talk to a counselor, or the police. [redacted] told [redacted] either she was going to make a decision, or I was going to make a decision in five minutes." [redacted] also told [redacted] it was time to call Thomas' "bluff," because he did not believe "anybody." [redacted] asked [redacted] if "they" would talk to Thomas. [redacted] told [redacted] they would talk to Thomas. [redacted] asked [redacted] if Thomas would be taken to jail. [redacted] told [redacted] "That's out of your hands. Maybe a night in jail would do him good. But if you never do anything about it, he's never, he's gonna keep doing it to you [redacted] father, who was seated on a bench in the front yard, agreed with [redacted]

[redacted] asked [redacted] what she wanted to do. [redacted] said she would make a telephone call. [redacted] asked her father to watch [redacted] dog, and she took [redacted] into her bedroom in her residence. [redacted] called the Sheriff's Department. [redacted] told the dispatcher that [redacted] was with her, but [redacted] could not "comprehend" what was happening. [redacted] told the dispatcher what had occurred, and then she gave the telephone to [redacted] [redacted] told [redacted] to tell the dispatcher "what was really going on." [redacted] told the dispatcher what had happened. [redacted] talked to the dispatcher for approximately two to three minutes.

After the telephone call, [redacted] and [redacted] went to the kitchen. While they were in the kitchen, [redacted] heard her father say, "They're here." [redacted] and [redacted] went to the front yard. They sat down and began talking to the two deputy's who had arrived. [redacted] said one of the deputy's was "rude" to her. [redacted] was attempting to explain to the deputy what had happened. She added that the deputy was treating [redacted] as if "something was wrong with her." The deputy asked [redacted] about alcohol and if she was using drugs. [redacted] said she tried to explain to the deputy that when [redacted] "confronted," she gets "confused" and she "can't handle it." The deputy "yelled" at [redacted] and said to "stay out of it." [redacted] went and talked to the other deputy who was also present. She tried to explain to the deputy that she was not "trying to butt in, this is just what's going on." [redacted] said the deputy listened to her. The deputy's told [redacted] and [redacted] to remain at [redacted] residence, and they would go to Thomas' house and talk to him.

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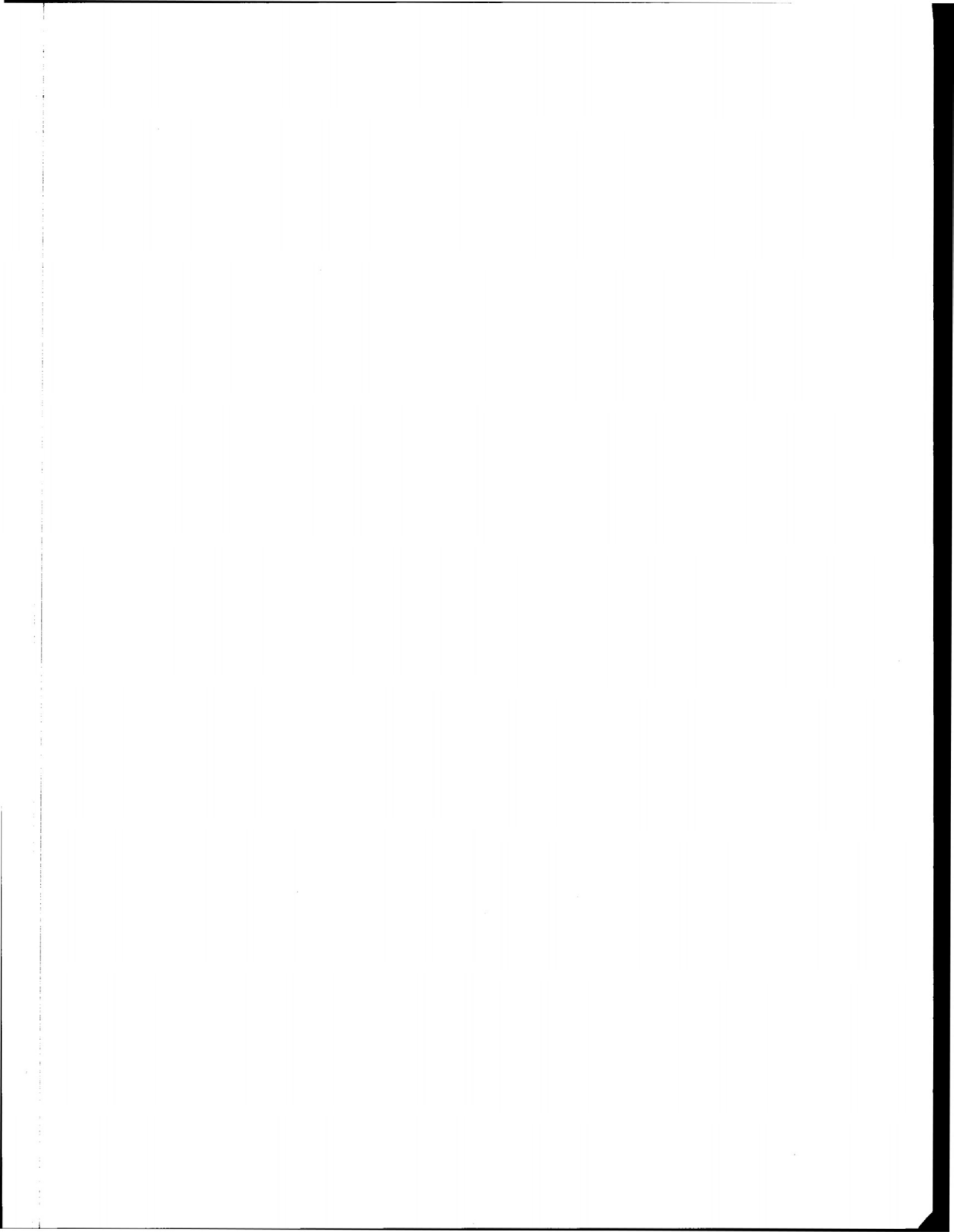
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█████ said she was sitting in the front yard of her residence and she could hear people "yelling" from an unknown location. She believed she heard two or three people yelling. The people were yelling, "Stop. Stop. Stop. Don't. Don't." █████ looked toward █████ residence at █████ █████ residence is across the street from █████ house. █████ saw Thomas with a "big knife." I asked █████ where Thomas was coming from. She said Thomas was coming from his "front yard." █████ said the deputy's had their guns "drawn" and pointed at Thomas. I asked █████ to again tell me what Thomas had with him. She said, "It was a knife. He had a big knife at his chest." █████ demonstrated to me that Thomas was holding the knife in front of his chest with both his hands grasping the knife handle. The blade of the knife was pointed at his chest.

I asked █████ if Thomas was wearing clothing. She said Thomas was wearing a green shirt and green shorts. I asked █████ if Thomas yelled or said anything. She said, "He was saying █████ - or how -- it was just screaming something about █████ I asked █████ what she and █████ did when Thomas began running toward them. She said, "I tried to tell Tom -- because he would listen to me. I was trying to tell him, please just drop it. We can work this out. And that off- -- officer -- the same one that yelled at me and told me to shut my mouth and get back in. But I really feel Scott, if he would have let me talk to him a little bit, it would have helped."

I asked █████ where Thomas stopped in her front yard. She said, "He didn't. He kept running. So I grabbed █████ and opened the gate and I pu- -- pul- -- hav- -- I pulled her into my house." █████ opened the gate leading to the backyard of her residence. This gate is located on the northeast corner of the residence near the driveway. I asked █████ if she and █████ went through this gate. She said, "Yeah, because Tom was running at us. And the police officers had their guns out." I asked █████ when she first saw Thomas running toward her, were her and █████ standing next to the gate. She said they were seated on the park bench in the front yard. I asked █████ if she and █████ moved to the gate as Thomas approached them. She said, "Tom was running and I was trying to run faster." I asked █████ where the deputy's were located. She said, "Behind him." I asked █████ what the deputy's were doing. She said, "I don't -- I have to think. He was running at us like -- oh no -- he was on the side of our house. No, it --

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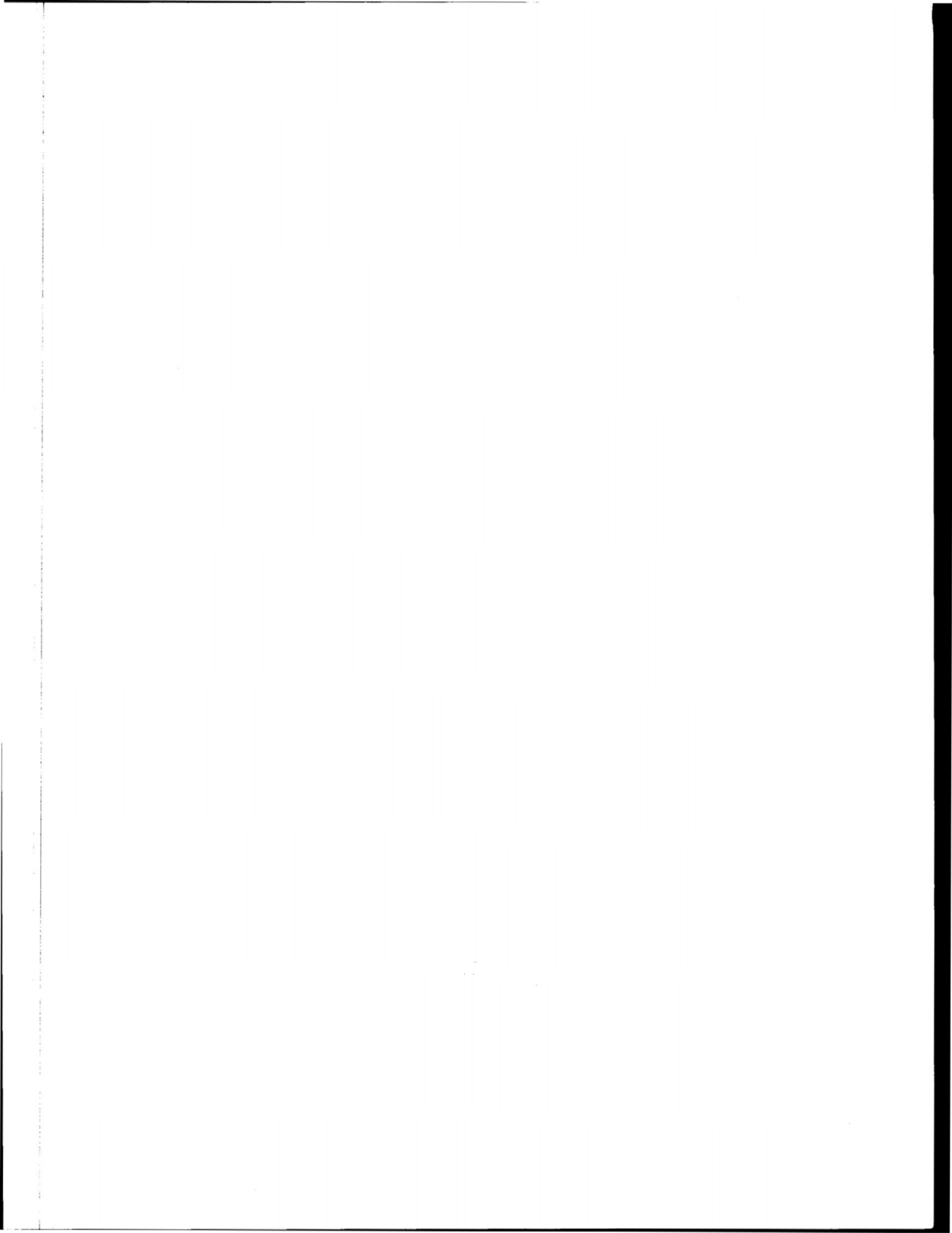
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that was after. We were outside the gate and then he was out -- he was up -- he was on -- then he went to the side of our gate. Like on the op- -- opposite side. On the -- the gate unlocks -- on Montgomery.' I confirmed with [REDACTED] that the gate she and [REDACTED] went through was on the east side of her residence. [REDACTED] said, "And he was on the opposite side facing Montgomery, at the other gate." I asked [REDACTED] when Thomas was running toward her and [REDACTED] if he went to the front of her residence, or did he stop on the side of her house. She said, "No, he came down. And then he turned around and ran." [REDACTED] added that she "screamed," and pushed [REDACTED] inside the gate.

[REDACTED] said her father and husband were inside her residence standing at the kitchen window. [REDACTED] said, "Where is he? Where is he?" [REDACTED] was inside her house when she screamed this. Her father and husband said the deputy's had Thomas on the side of the house. [REDACTED] took [REDACTED] to her bedroom and made her lay on the floor. I asked [REDACTED] when Thomas was running toward her, where were the deputy's, and what were they doing. She said, "They were -- this is Tom here ([REDACTED] uses her hands to indicate the positions of Thomas and the deputy's) say Tom was in the front. And there was one officer to the left side, slightly behind him. And one officer to the right, slightly behind him." I asked [REDACTED] if the deputy's said anything to Thomas. She said, "Telling him to drop it, drop it, drop it." I asked [REDACTED] if the deputy's had anything in their hands. She said, "They had their guns drawn." [REDACTED] said the deputy's had their weapons pointed at Thomas. I asked [REDACTED] to tell me again what the deputy's said to Thomas. She said, "To drop it. Just drop it. And I said please, let me talk to him. Please. He couldn't have hurt me with the knife if they had their guns on him. I just wanted to talk to him through the window. And that -- that's gonna be, you know." At this time, I explained to [REDACTED] that the deputy's most likely did not want to place her in a position of danger.

[REDACTED] began crying and was very upset. She began telling me about the death of her mother, and the fact she has been attending counseling. At approximately 1927 hours, I turned off the tape recorder to give [REDACTED] the opportunity to calm down. While the tape recorder was turned off, I did not discuss the details of this incident with [REDACTED]. At approximately 1928 hours, I turned the tape recorder back on because [REDACTED] said she wanted to continue with the interview.

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█████ said Thomas came into her front yard, and the deputy's were still with him in the aforementioned positions she had earlier related to me. █████ said she was watching this take place from her kitchen window. I asked █████ the exact position where Thomas was located at the front of her house. She said, "Tom was now at the end of our walkway." I asked █████ to tell me a better location where Thomas was located. She said, "He was in -- but like on our walkway. But enough of where you could see him. He wasn't down towards the house where you couldn't." I asked █████ if Thomas was located on the walkway in front of the front door to her residence. She said, "Correct." I asked █████ if Thomas was facing the deputy's, or turned toward her house. She said Thomas was turned toward her house.

I asked █████ what the deputy's were doing while Thomas was at her residence. She said, "Telling him to stop." She confirmed that the deputy's still had their weapons pointed at Thomas. █████ began crying and said, "And he ran towards the front door, and then I heard three gunshots." I asked █████ when Thomas ran toward the front door, what was he doing with the knife. She said, "I don't know. He still had the knife out in his chest when he was running towards the door, but I couldn-- you know, but you can't see, cause the way it goes in. But then I heard the three gunshots." I asked █████ if she saw who fired their weapons. She said, "There were two officers. Then you could see 'em." I asked █████ if she heard a total of three shots. She said, "I believe it was three. But I started screaming."

I asked █████ what happened next. She said, "And then I thought okay, it's gonna be over. He's down, he's down. And then I hear-- then, you know, more officers and more officers started coming." I asked █████ what she was doing at this time. She said, "Freaking out." I asked █████ where she was inside her residence. She said, "I went into the bedroom with █████ and I was crying on the bed with her. Holding her." █████ said, "Then I heard screaming in the backyard. And Tom's up in the backyard." █████ confirmed that Thomas was in her backyard. I asked █████ if she could see Thomas from the room she was in. She said, "Yes, and he was trying to get in." █████ said the deputies were also in the backyard with Thomas. I asked █████ how many deputies were in her backyard. She said, "A guesstimate would be at least six." I asked █████ what the deputies were doing. She said, "They had their guns drawn." I asked █████ what the

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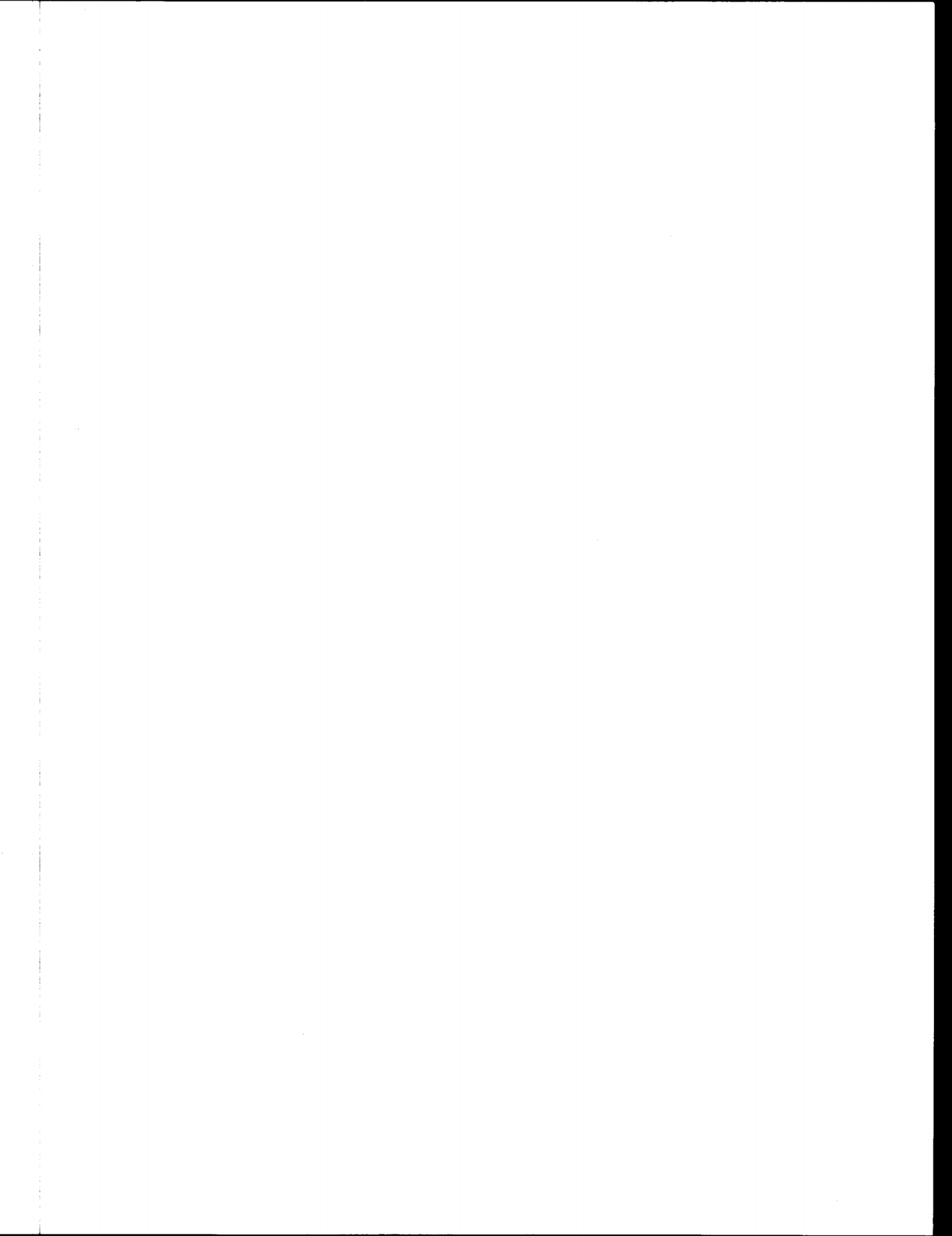
deputy's were saying. She said, "Give it up and I don't know. Give it up and a bunch of other stuff."

I asked [redacted] if she saw that Thomas had been injured. She said, "Yes, he had blood pouring out of his stomach." I asked [redacted] if she knew where Thomas entered her backyard from. She said, "The gate. We heard the gate shut." I asked [redacted] when Thomas was in the backyard, if she and [redacted] were in her bedroom. She said, "I left [redacted] in my bedroom and, when they were in the backyard, because I wanted my husband. So I ran to go my hu- -- husband, and then they were all in the backyard, and I started freaking out even more." I asked [redacted] where she ran to find her husband. She said, "To the kitchen. Because they were still in the kitchen." [redacted] said her father and her husband were in the kitchen. [redacted] had [redacted] on the floor of her bedroom, and then she moved [redacted] to her father's bedroom and had her lay at the end of the bed. [redacted] did this before she went to the kitchen. [redacted] said the deputies were in her backyard, and Thomas still had the knife. [redacted] said, "Thomas still had the knife and he was pouring out blood and running around in circles."

I asked [redacted] what Thomas was doing with the knife. She said, "He was like this up against his chest like this ([redacted] used her hands to demonstrate that Thomas was holding the knife with both his hands in front of his chest, and the blade of the knife was pointed at his chest). I asked [redacted] how long she watched Thomas while he was in the backyard. She said, "Awhile." I asked [redacted] what Thomas was saying. She said, "He wanted [redacted] I asked [redacted] if she could remember the exact words that Thomas said. She said she could not remember. I asked [redacted] what the deputies were saying. She said, "Just drop it, drop it. Yo- -- you know."

[redacted] said she went into the kitchen and she heard "pounding" on the glass door leading to the backyard. She said the deputies were at the door and they had their "guns out." [redacted] continued, "And they were at the front door with their guns dra- -- we let them inside." I asked [redacted] if there was "pounding" at both the front door and the glass door. She said, "Yea, because we had locked the door because we were afraid Tom was gonna come in." [redacted] confirmed there was "pounding" at both the front door and the glass door. [redacted] said, "And then the officers

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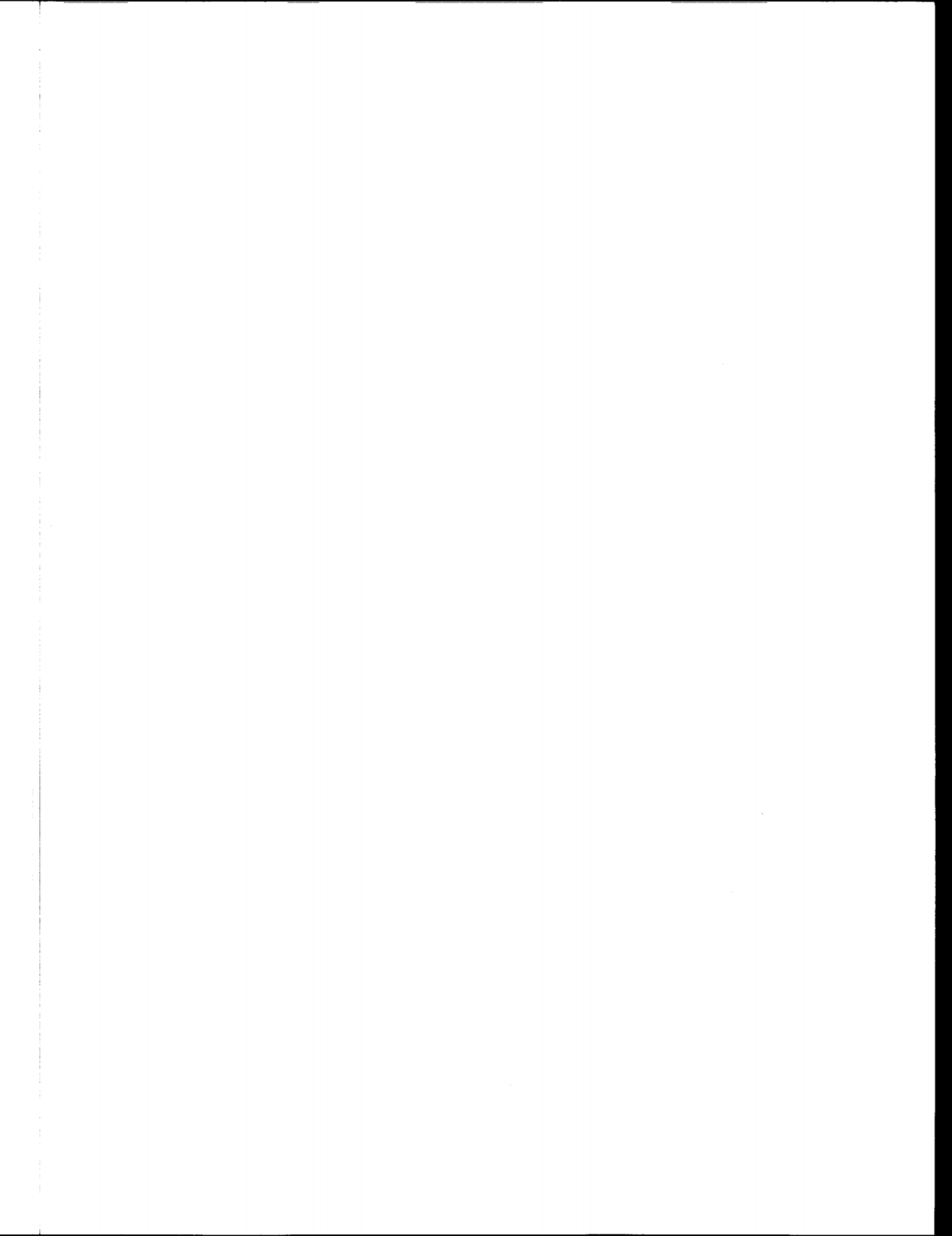
were screaming, "Get out of the way. Get out of the way." And I was trapped because I was up against the aquarium and the T.V. And they were running through the house with their guns drawn, back and forth, and up and over stuff." [redacted] was crying and continued, "And somebody - - and somebody was trying to get inside the front door and I was trapped and I was trying to hide underneath the table because there was afraid. I was afraid Scott. I'm sorry. I was so afraid. And then they di- -- then he must have run back around. So they ran back around." I asked [redacted] where "they" ran. She said, "Through my house. And around through the gate. And I was laying on the floor."

I asked [redacted] if the deputies that were inside her house left the residence. [redacted] was crying and said, "They would run back -- back and forth. And we would lock the door." I asked [redacted] where "they" were running through. She said, "Through my house. From the backyard through the front yard and then back -- back from the front yard to the backyard. Through the living room and stuff. And I was trying to hide underneath the table. Because I was afraid that Tom would kill me because he knew I called."

I asked [redacted] what happened next. She said, "I went into the bedroom and I hugged [redacted] and I told I'm so sorry. I'm just sorry. And then -- and then, I'm sorry. And then [redacted] -- [redacted] like started to pass out on the floor. And I hugged her and stuff and then we heard about fifteen shots go off. And I looked out the window and I could see all the officer's over there with their guns down on Tom." [redacted] clarified that she was in her father's bedroom with [redacted] when she heard the gunshots. I asked [redacted] to tell me what she saw when she looked out the window. She said, "I heard it, like a one shot, so I jumped up and when I looked out I hear pop, pop, pop, pop, pop, pop, pop, pop." I asked [redacted] to tell me what she saw. She said, "I saw the officers over there with their guns drawn. And people running around." I asked [redacted] where the deputies were pointing their weapons. She said, "Down at the ground where Tom was."

I asked [redacted] if she heard the deputies say anything. She said, "You could hear them screaming the whole time. "Just please drop it, please stop." I asked [redacted] if she could see what Thomas was doing. She said, "He was holding the knife. He wasn't gonna give up." I asked [redacted] if she

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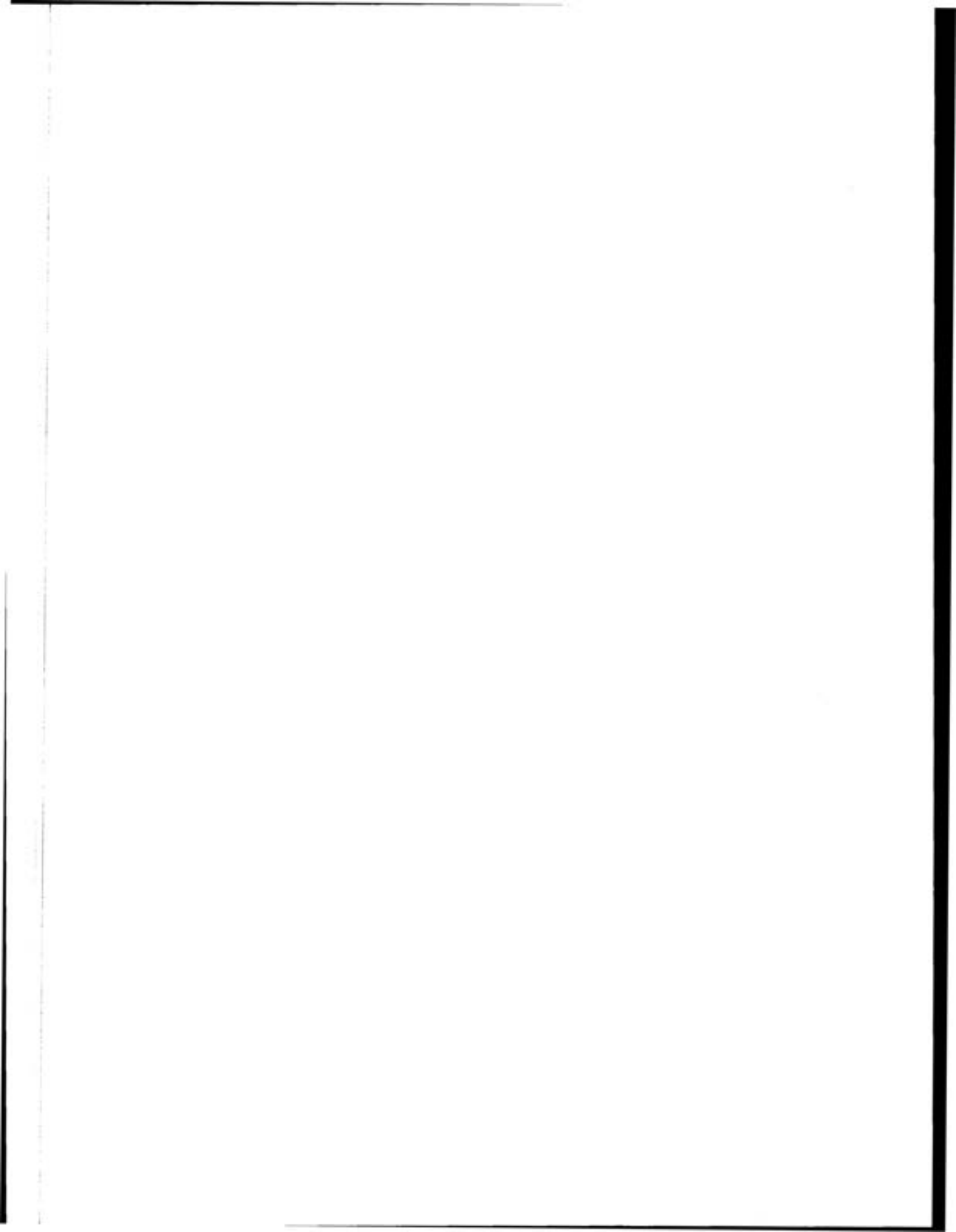
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saw Thomas take the knife and point it toward the deputies when he was in front of his residence. She said, "No." I asked [REDACTED] before the shots occurred, did she actually see Thomas with the knife and the deputy's pointing their weapons at him, or did she not look until the shots were fired. She said, "No, I saw them the whole time running around with the knife pointed at his chest. At his chest. And the officer's had their guns drawn." I asked [REDACTED] if she saw Thomas doing this in front of his residence. She said, "Yes." She saw this from her father's bedroom window, and from the kitchen window. I asked [REDACTED] the height of the window in her father's bedroom. She said, "I have no idea. I was standing on the bed." I asked [REDACTED] if she could "easily see" the front yard of Thomas' residence from the window, or was it difficult to see the yard. She said, "If you just push your head up against there, there you can. And then I went straight out the front door though, and I looked over there." I asked [REDACTED] if she went out her front door after the shots were fired. She said, "It was af- -- like yeah." I clarified with [REDACTED] that she was standing on the bed looking out the window. I asked [REDACTED] if it was "easy" to see Thomas' front yard. She said, "I can't see by the front door, I'm not gonna lie to you. I can't see by the front door. You can see like up." I asked [REDACTED] where Thomas was located when she looked out the window. She said, "I couldn't see Tom. From the window." I asked [REDACTED] if it was from her position at the window that she heard the shots being fired. She said, "Yes, and then I took off out the front door." I asked [REDACTED] what she saw when she got to the front door. She said, "I ran outside. I could see Tom laying there and the officers with their guns drawn. I'm sorry. And people just running around in circles."

I asked [REDACTED] if anyone was giving Thomas first aid, or doing anything to him. She said, "No, nobody was -- nobody was doing anything at first." I asked [REDACTED] the time span from when she heard the shots being fired, until she ran out to the front yard. She said, "Just seconds. Because they were still going off when I walked out front. It was a lot of shots fired." I asked [REDACTED] what happened after she went to the front yard and looked over toward Thomas' residence. She said, "They're just -- the police were running around everywhere and stuff." I asked [REDACTED] what the deputies were doing. She said, "I don't know. Just talking to people or saying what had happened. And one guy had a shotgun, and there was a K-9 unit." I asked [REDACTED] if anyone else came to the scene. She said, "The paramedics came finally -- finally. But I

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don't think the police meant that it would turn out to be like that. So they didn't have them on standby or whatever."

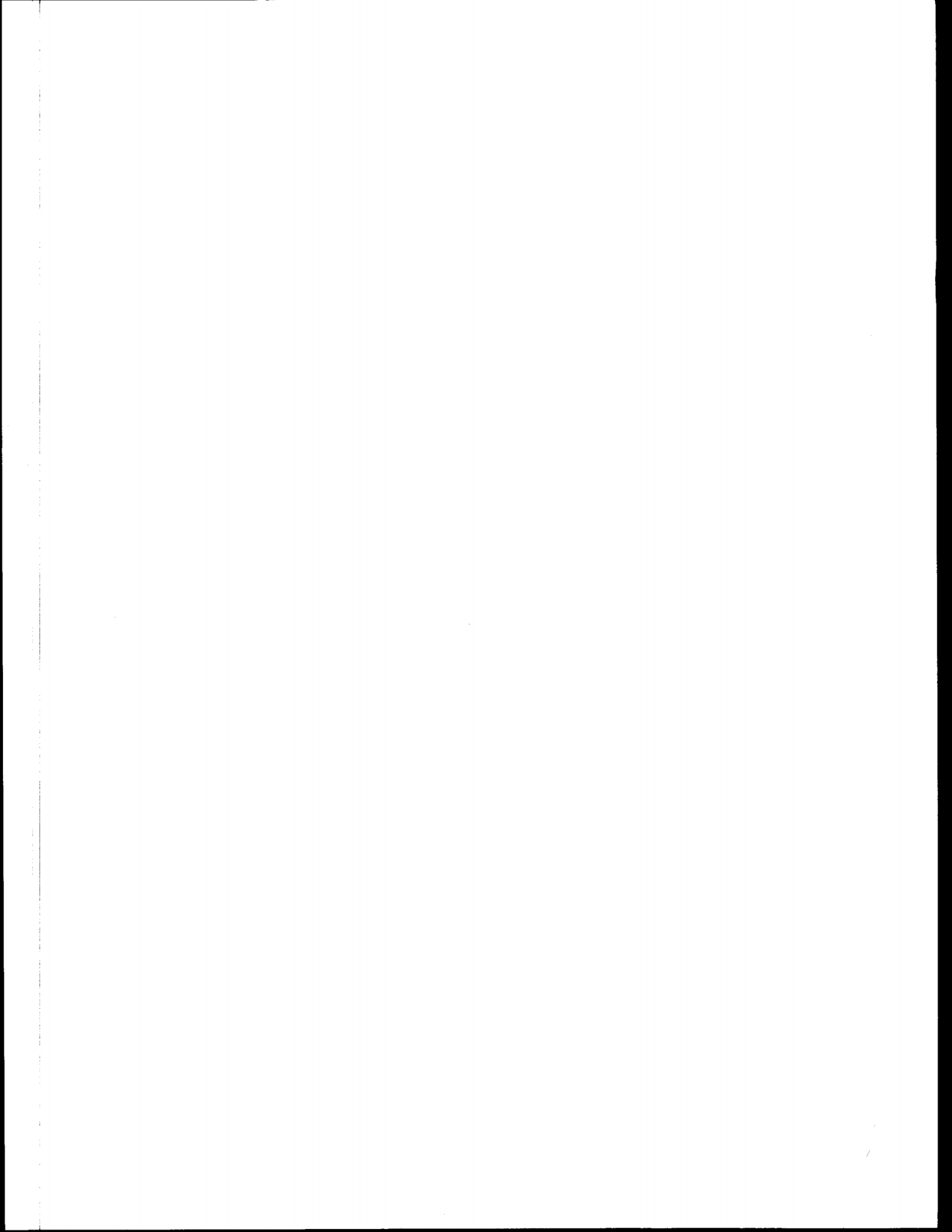
I asked [redacted] before I began interviewing her, did she take medication. She said she did. I asked her what medication she took. She said, "Valium and my Lipitor." She added, " And my anti-depressant pills." I asked her what kind of anti-depressant pill she took. She said, "Eferex." I asked [redacted] if she was feeling the effects of the medication that she took. She said, "No, not really. Just enough to calm me down because I don't take enough to be drugged down. I don't like that. I'm clear headed, trust me."

[redacted] asked me, "They're supposed to have like that non-lethal stuff. I mean he must have been irate though to get shot in his belly all that, and be able to run. But it just seems like." I told [redacted] I could not comment on what the deputy's did because I was not there. [redacted] said, "I know. But to me that what hurt's me."

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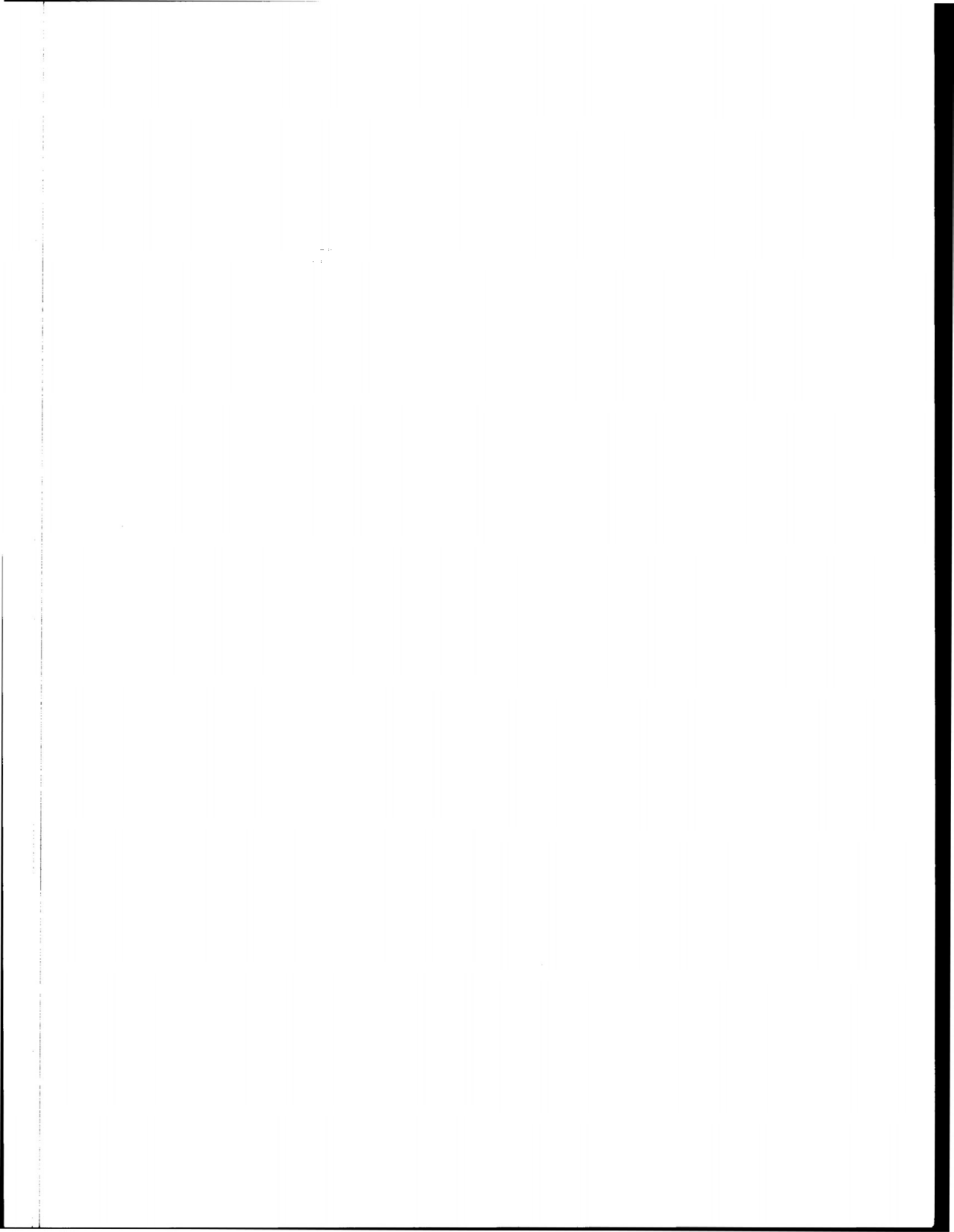
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NORTH SIDE OF THE RESIDENCE

For ease of reading, I am describing the front of the residence from east to west. At the east side of the residence is a converted garage attached to the main house. There were three windows within the converted garage area. North of the garage area was a concrete driveway that slopes downward from the street to the garage area. At the east edge of the driveway was a planter constructed with large pieces of wood similar to railroad ties. There were shrubs and plants in the planter. There were two vehicles parked in the driveway. The first vehicle was a red Hyundai [REDACTED] facing south. The second vehicle was a gold colored Toyota [REDACTED] facing north. There was a large area of grass along the west edge of the driveway.

West of the garage area was a concrete walkway between the house and front yard. The walkway ran west from the driveway area to the front door and then continued west to the west side of the residence. There were two windows within the wall west of the garage area and west of the windows was the front door area. The front door faced north and was in a recessed entry way. There was a concrete walkway that ran north from the front door area and continued north to the sidewalk and street. West of the front door was a concrete walkway that bordered the house and ran west to the property line. This portion of the house west of the front door had two windows within the wall.

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The front yard consisted of two areas of grass, plants, Halloween decorations and dirt. The first area was between the driveway and eastside of the front door walkway. The second grass area was west of the front door walkway and continued west to the west property line.

WEST SIDE OF THE RESIDENCE

There was a wooden fence in the area of the northwest corner of the residence. The fence was recessed slightly from the northwest corner and ran south to the south property line. The fence had a gate within the fence which allows access to the rear yard of [REDACTED]

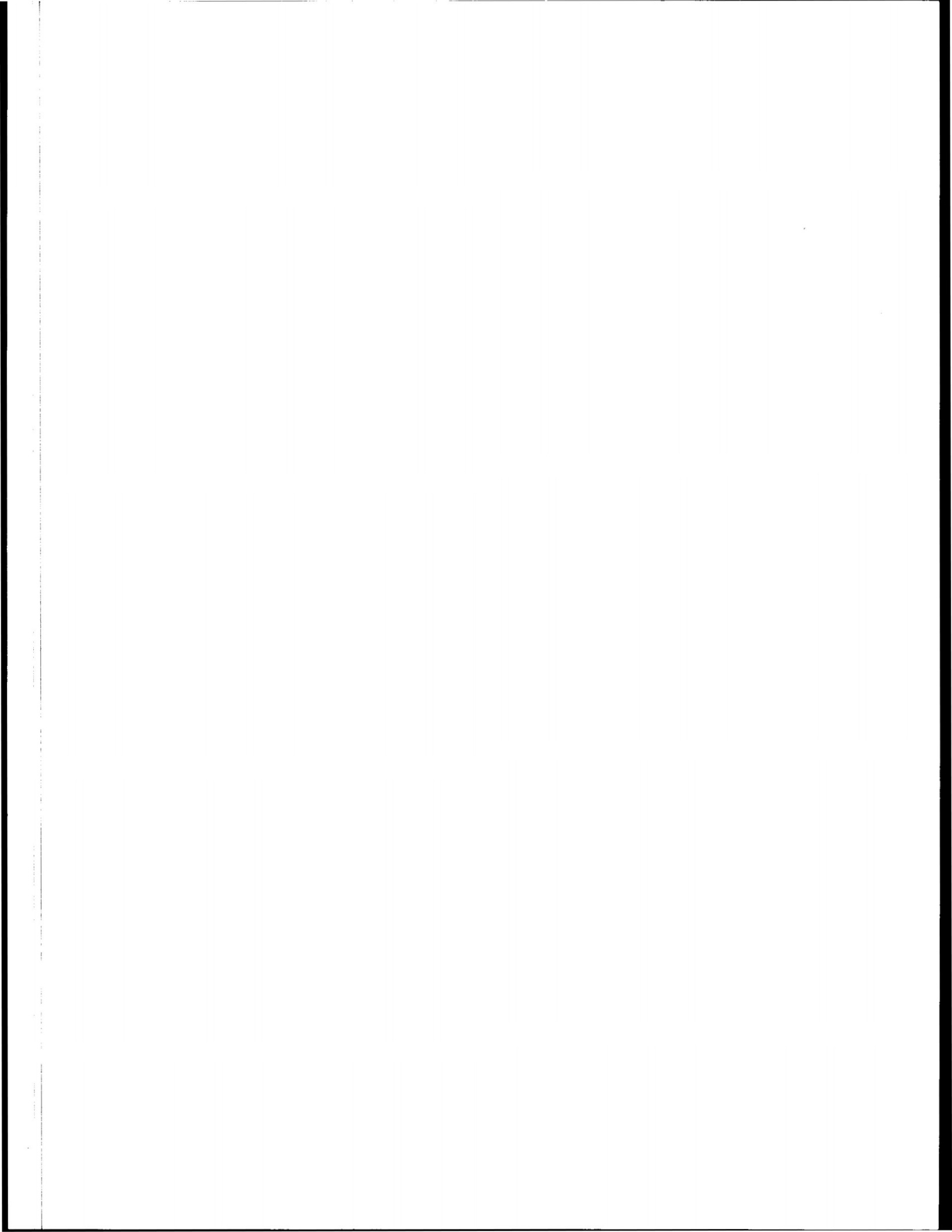
[REDACTED] There was grass area west of the fence that ran from the yard to a second driveway area at the rear of the residence.

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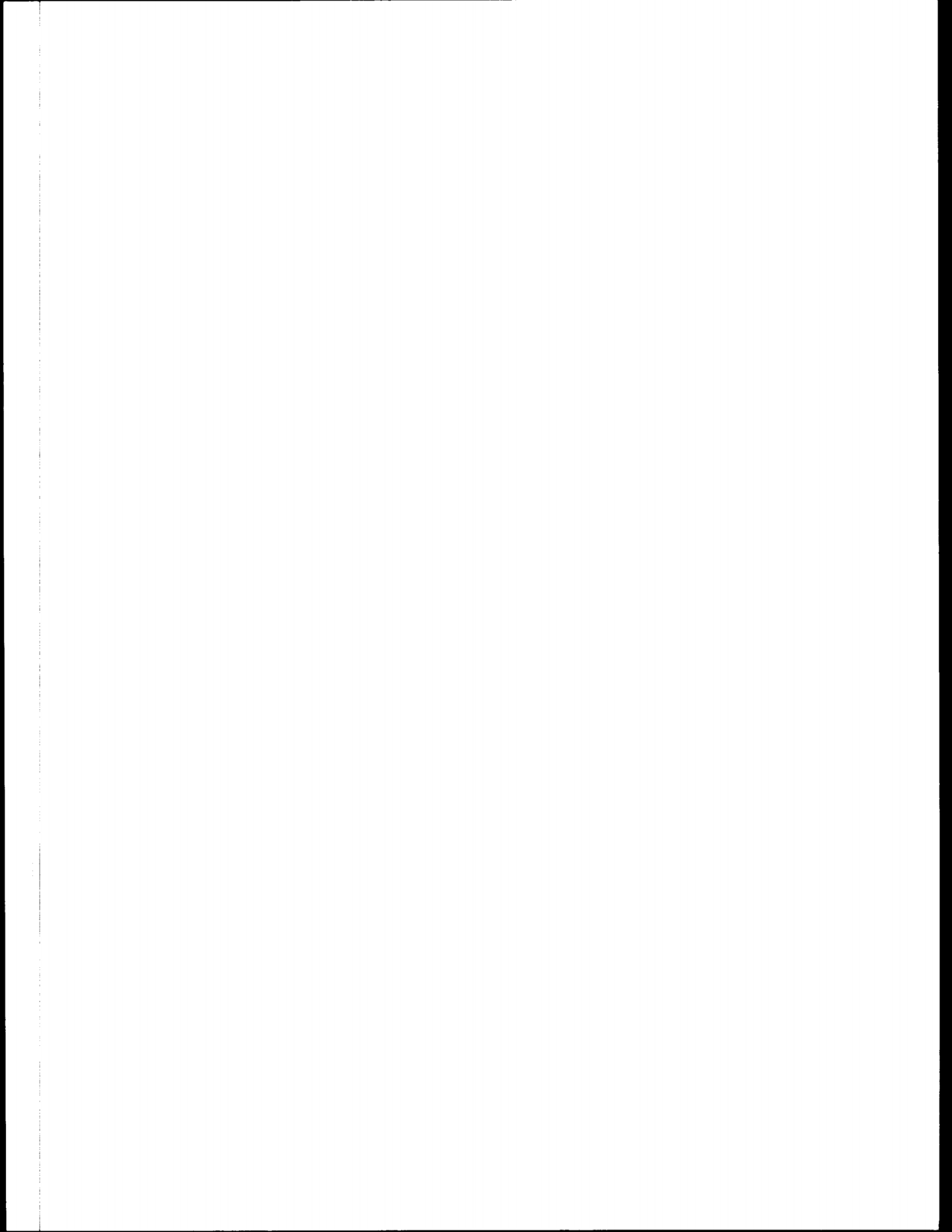

There were several drops of blood on the top inside area of the gate and near the gate latching mechanism. The blood drops continued south along the east side of the residence and then west into the rear yard near the porch area.

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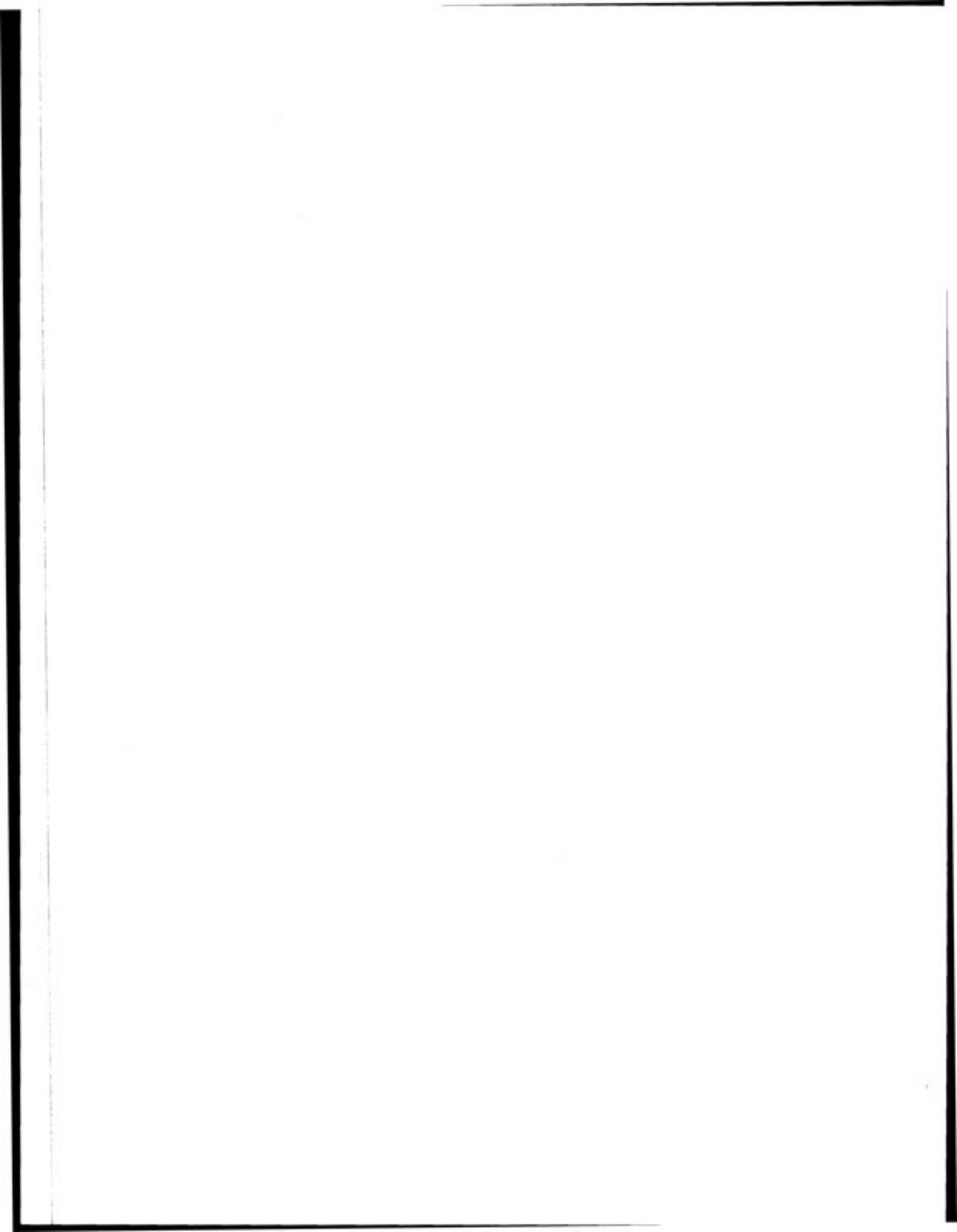

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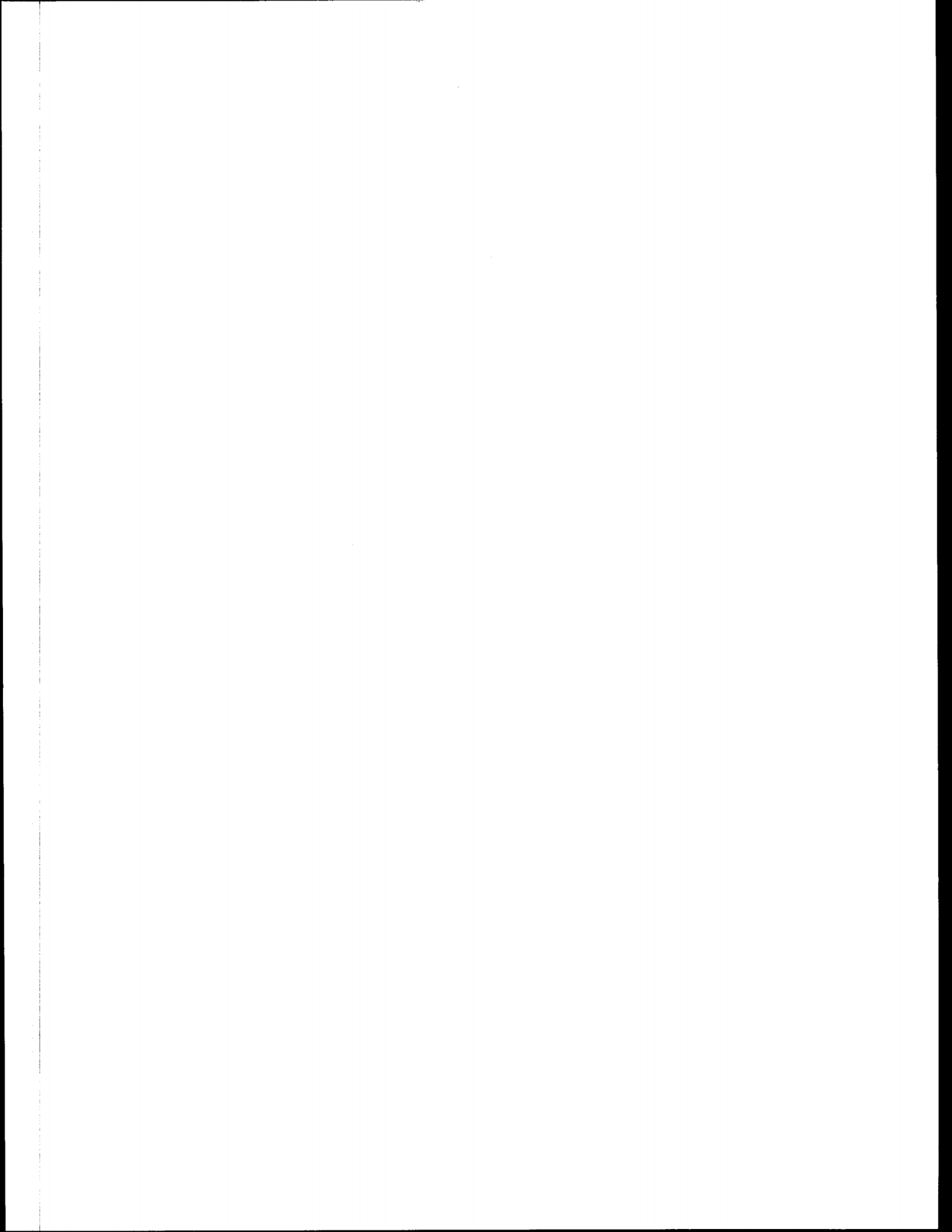
WESTSIDE OF THE RESIDENCE

There was a detached room south of the garage area. The exterior of the room was white in color. There were several trees, a storage shed, lawn chairs and a barbeque in the rear yard area.

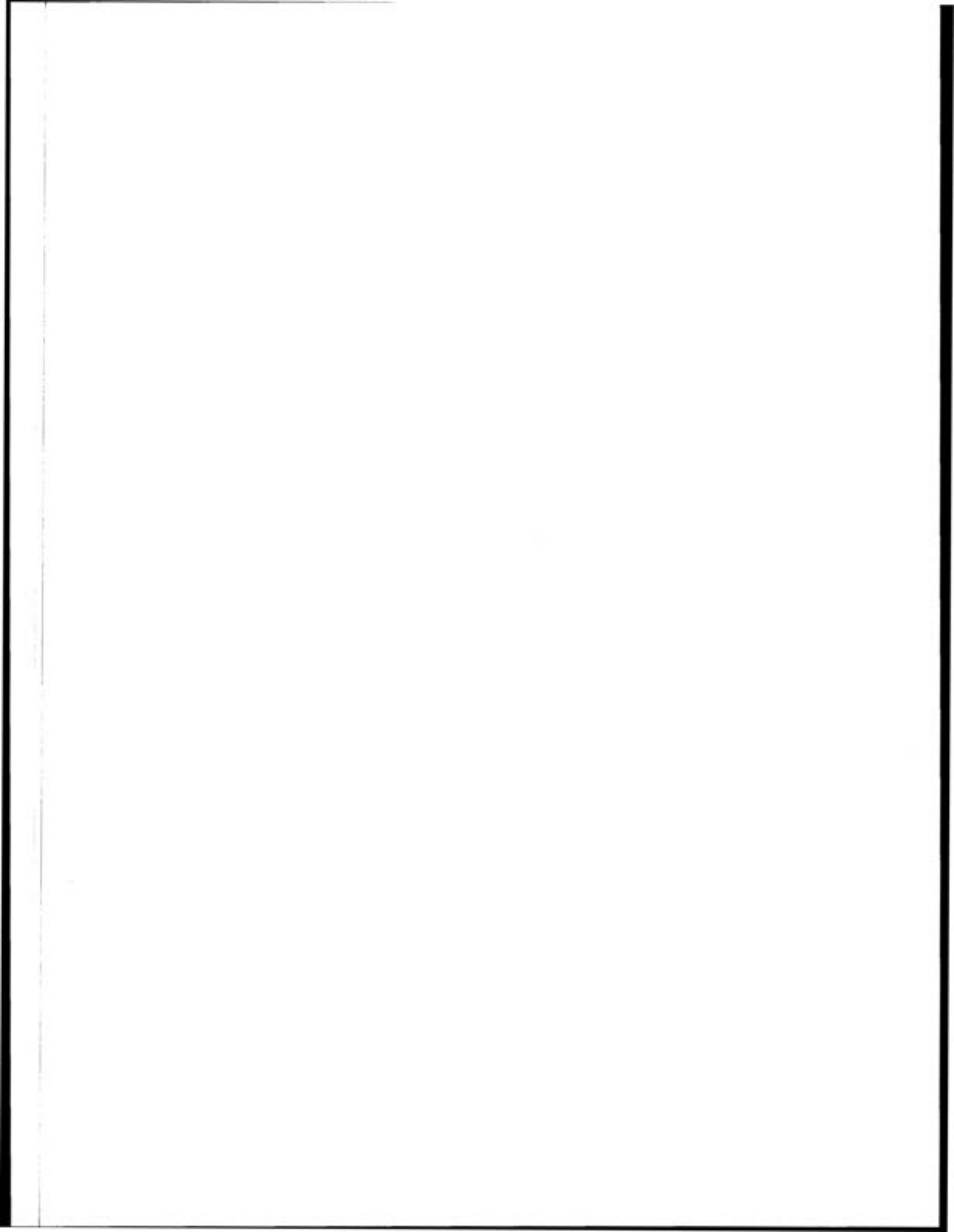
INTERIOR

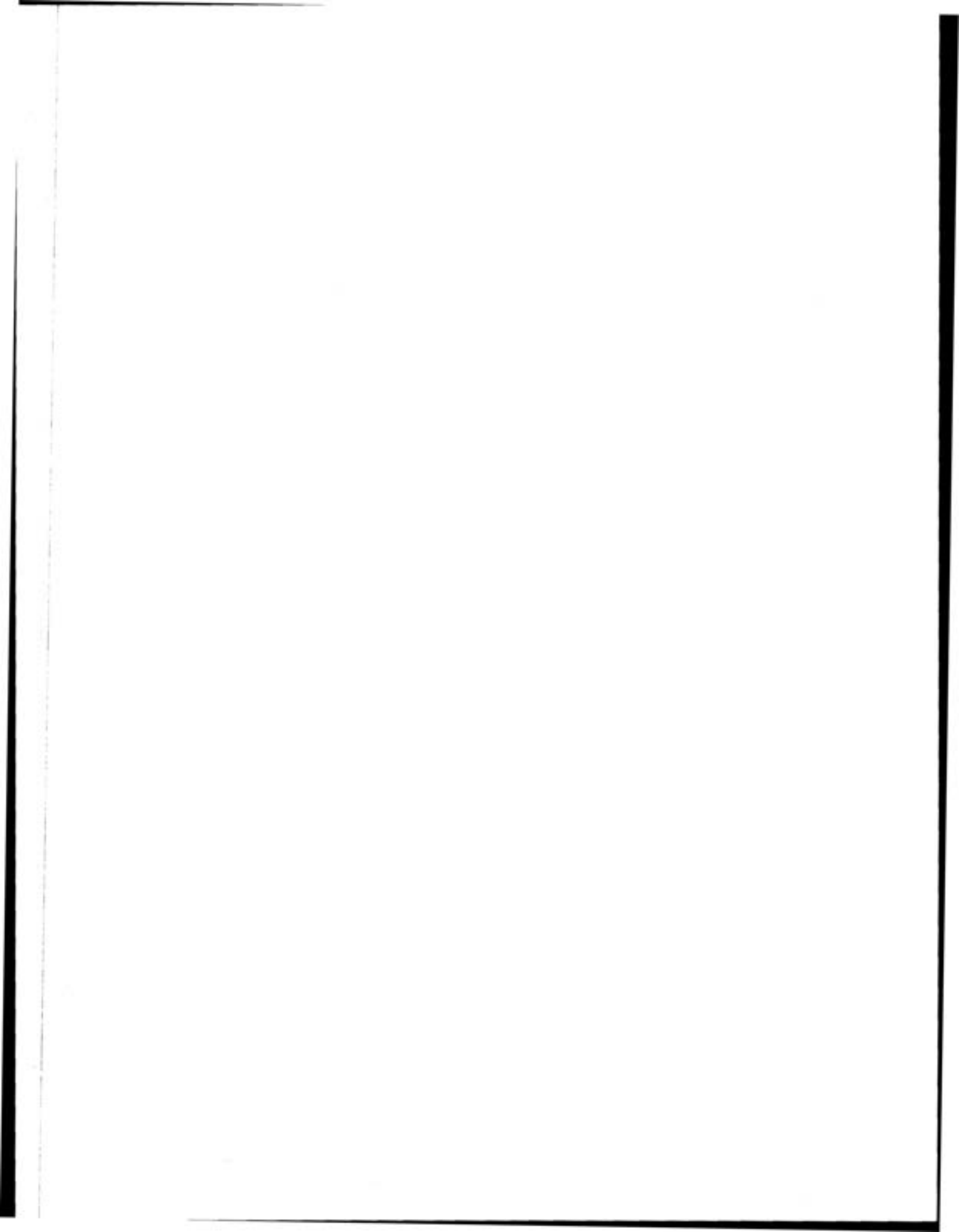

On 10-13-01, I assisted with the investigation of an officer involved shooting that occurred in the City of Thousand Oaks. During the initial investigation, I was told that there were two separate shootings. The first was in front of [REDACTED] The second was in the front of [REDACTED] I spoke to Deputy John Stubblefield. At the time of the interview, both crime scenes had been secured, but there was not a signed search warrant for the locations. We did not walk into the crime scene. We spoke near a patrol unit parked in the street and Deputy Stubblefield motioned to and described areas as he spoke about the incident.

Later, after the initial interview, Deputy Stubblefield came up to me and told me that during the incident he was wearing his motorcycle helmet and his radio ear piece broadcasts in the helmet. Deputy Stubblefield felt that wearing his helmet might be the reason why he did not hear everything the suspect was saying. Deputy Stubblefield was wearing a sheriff's department uniform with black motorcycle boots.

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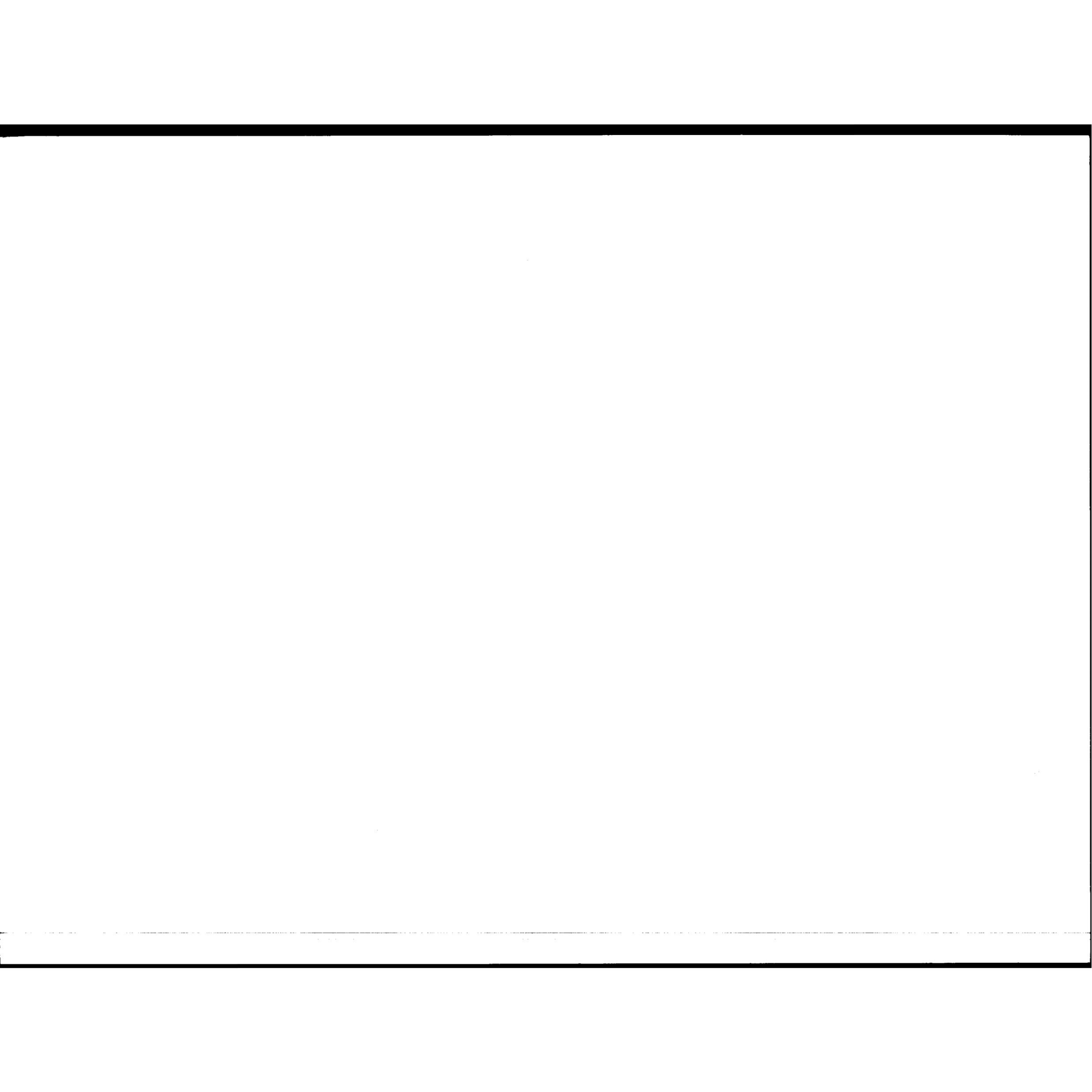
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The following is a synopsis of our tape-recorded conversation.

Deputy Stubblefield was driving his traffic motorcycle north on Moorpark (Moorpark Road) at Gainsborough (Gainsborough Road). When Deputy Stubblefield plugged into his motorcycle radio, he forgot to switch over from his portable radio to his regular radio. Deputy Stubblefield heard someone ask for back-up and dispatch told "nine ocean" (9021) to respond code-three. Deputy Stubblefield switched his box over (radio control unit) to regular radio, so he could hear better and asked for the location. Deputy Stubblefield was told the address was [REDACTED]. Deputy Stubblefield realized he was right around the corner and responded code (code three) to help the officers that were at the location.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where he parked his motorcycle. Deputy Stubblefield parked near the front of a house. (Deputy Stubblefield did not know the address of the location, but pointed to [REDACTED]. Deputy Stubblefield explained he was traveling north on Moorpark and turned east on Flores (Avenida De Las Flores). As he drove, Deputy Stubblefield asked for a cross street and thought one of the officers said, "Montgomery." As Deputy Stubblefield came closer, he saw the units parked on the south side of the road and saw the officers in front of [REDACTED] (south east corner). Deputy Stubblefield parked in front of the house.

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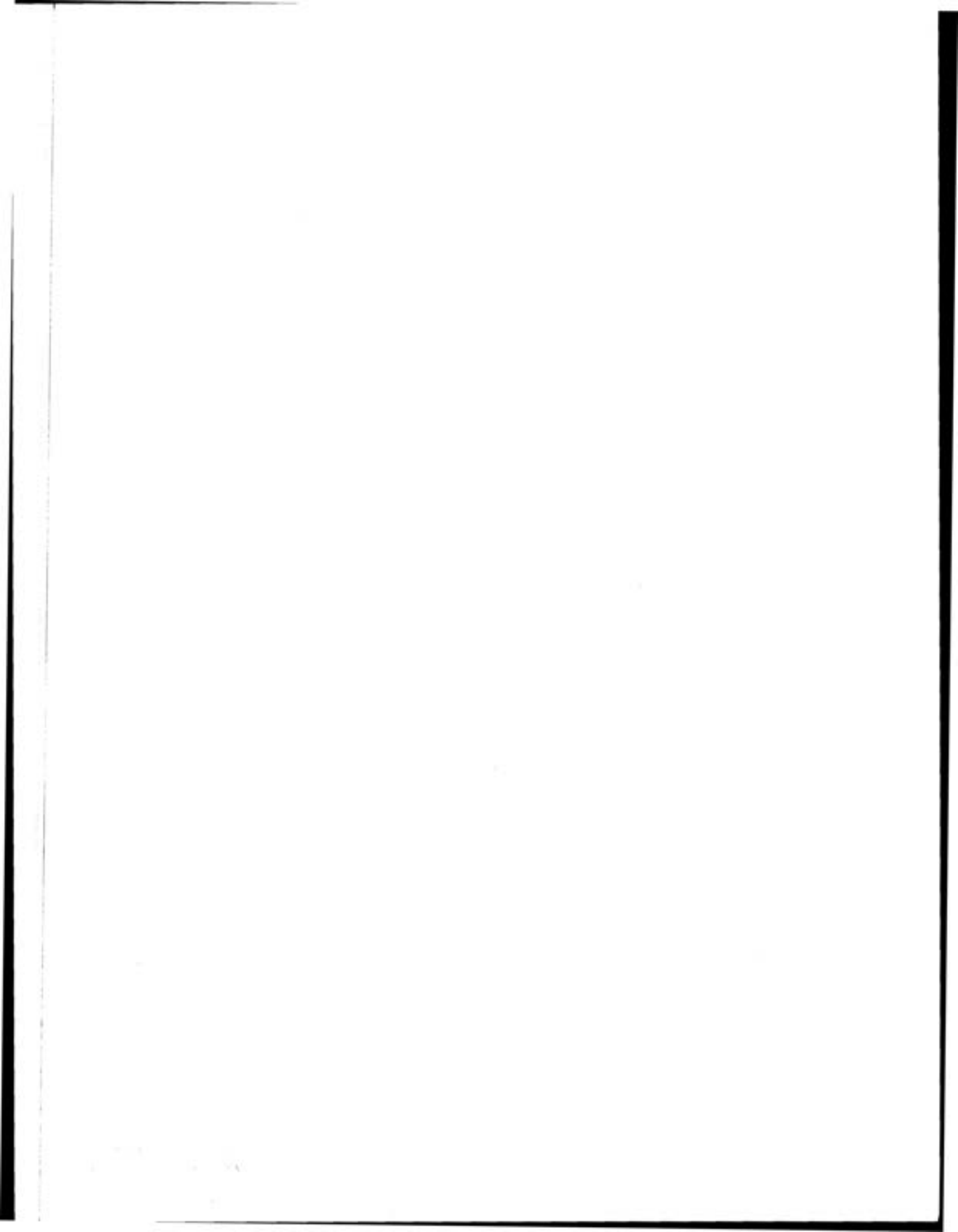
I asked Deputy Stubblefield what officers he saw in front of the house. Deputy Stubblefield said he saw Deputy Hutchinson and Deputy Sabio. Deputy Stubblefield then said he was the first one there (third officer on scene). Deputy Stubblefield was referring to the units who were responding to assist Deputy Hutchinson and Deputy Sabio.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what happened. I was referring to when he arrived. Deputy Stubblefield said when he pulled-up, he heard shots fired. Deputy Stubblefield did not know who fired the shots. Deputy Stubblefield put out "10-97" (arrived at scene), shots fired and suspect down.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what was the distance between the suspect, Hutchinson and Sabio. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was near the front door area on the porch. Deputy Hutchinson and Deputy Sabio were east on the walkway. Deputy Stubblefield estimated the distance at between five to ten feet.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield who had their weapons drawn and what stance they were in. Deputy Stubblefield explained that when he drove up he saw their weapons were out. Deputy Stubblefield again said the weapons were out and shots were fired.

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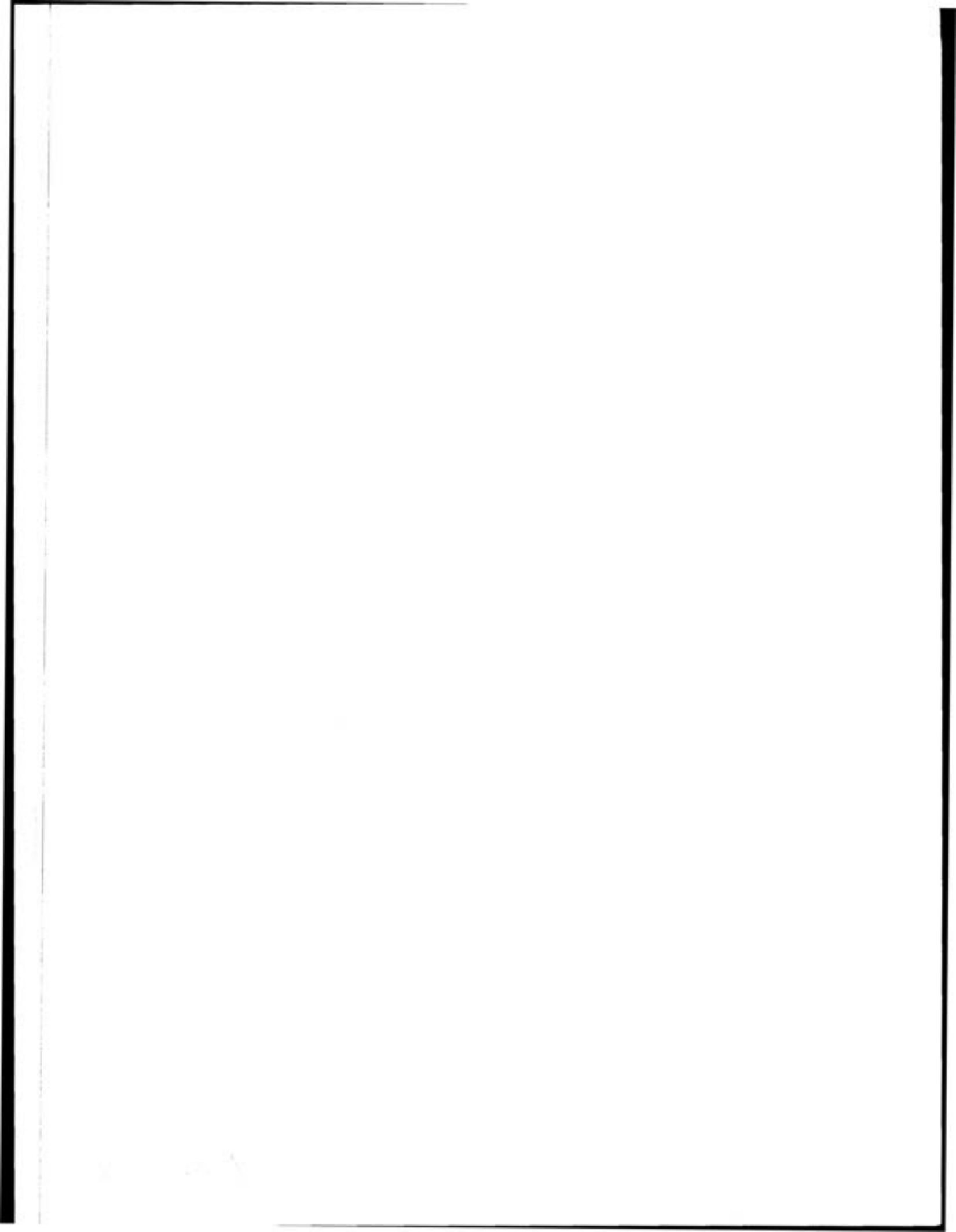
I asked Deputy Stubblefield if he heard the shots being fired. Deputy Stubblefield said he saw the shots being fired. Deputy Stubblefield explained that when he pulled-up he heard shots as he was parking. Deputy Stubblefield was not sure if the suspect went to the ground or doubled over, but he knew the suspect had been shot.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield how far the suspect was from Deputy Hutchinson. Deputy Stubblefield estimated he (Deputy Hutchinson) was between five to ten feet from the suspect.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield how far the suspect was from Deputy Sabio. Deputy Stubblefield said Deputy Sabio was right next to Deputy Hutchinson. Deputy Stubblefield said they were side-by-side and Deputy Sabio was behind Deputy Hutchinson. Deputy Stubblefield was on the sidewalk and estimated he was about twenty-five feet away from the incident. Deputy Stubblefield then motioned to a blue van [REDACTED] parked in front of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and said he parked in front of the van and jumped off of his bike (motorcycle).

Deputy Stubblefield explained that after he got off of his motorcycle, he drew his weapon and saw the suspect get up. Deputy Stubblefield said he was not sure if the suspect went to the ground or just doubled over, but said the suspect never dropped the knife. Deputy Stubblefield said they repeated commands like "drop the knife, drop the knife." Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was saying, "I'm not going back to jail, I'm not going to do it."

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Deputy Stubblefield also said the suspect was yelling at someone in the house and said, "Why did you do this to me, why did you call." Deputy Stubblefield thought he heard the suspect say, "We've been married thirty years." The suspect then tried to go back inside the house.

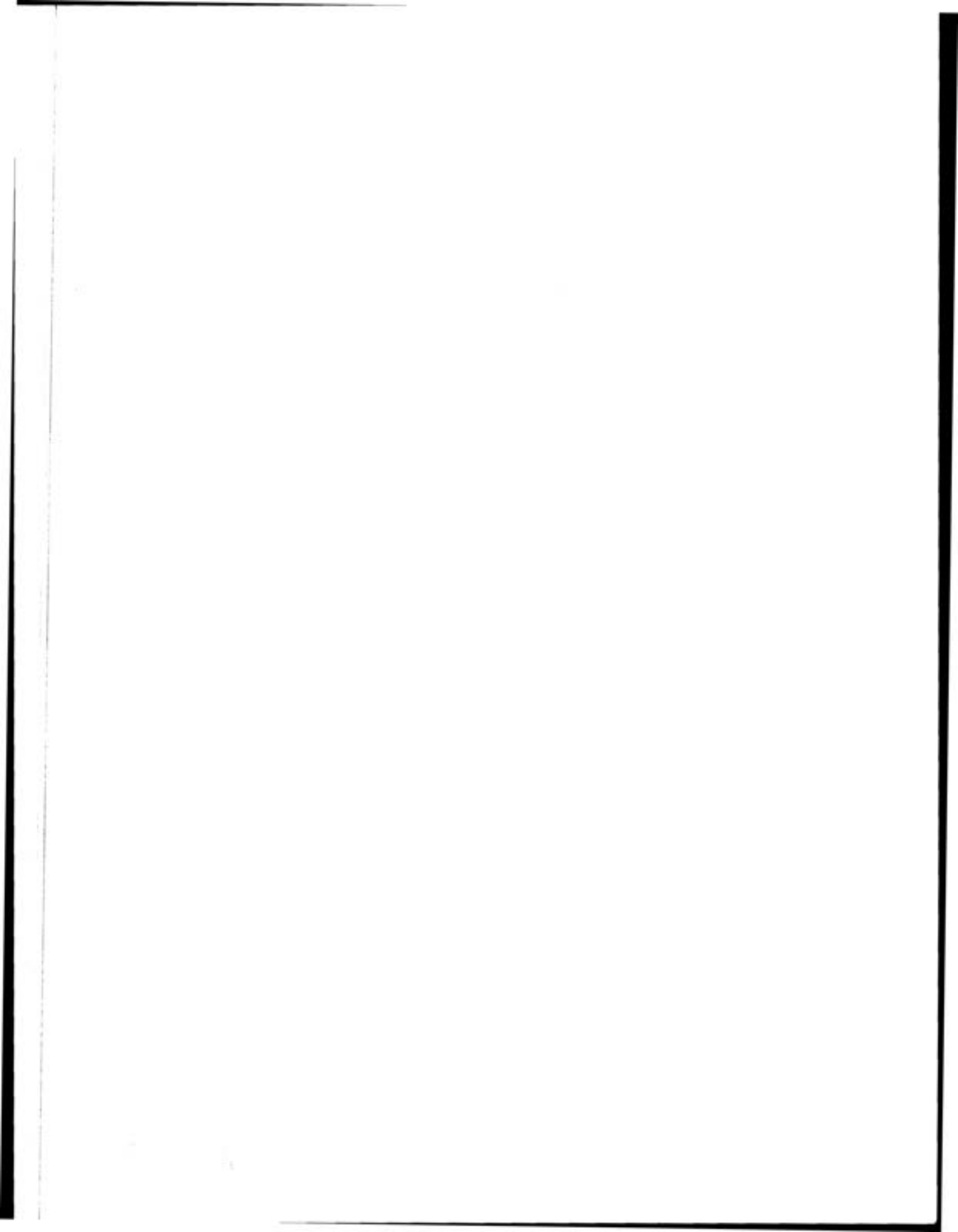
Someone told the suspect he was not going inside and they were yelling at him to drop the knife. The suspect walked to the side gate (Deputy Stubblefield motioned to the east side of the residence) and went into the backyard. They (deputies) tried to open the gate, and the suspect was standing there. The suspect would lunge the knife at them and would say, "Stay away" and "get away from me." Deputy Stubblefield saw Deputies Sedgewick and Alvarez arrive and go to the other side yard and look over the fence. (Deputy Stubblefield motioned to the area east of [REDACTED])

At this time Deputy Stubblefield received a call from his wife and there was a brief break in the interview.

When the conversation resumed, Deputy Stubblefield again said they (deputies) tried to open the gate and one time he (the suspect) lunged his knife out.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield who the suspect lunged the knife toward. Deputy Stubblefield thought it was Deputy Hutchinson who opened the gate and the suspect lunged with the knife.

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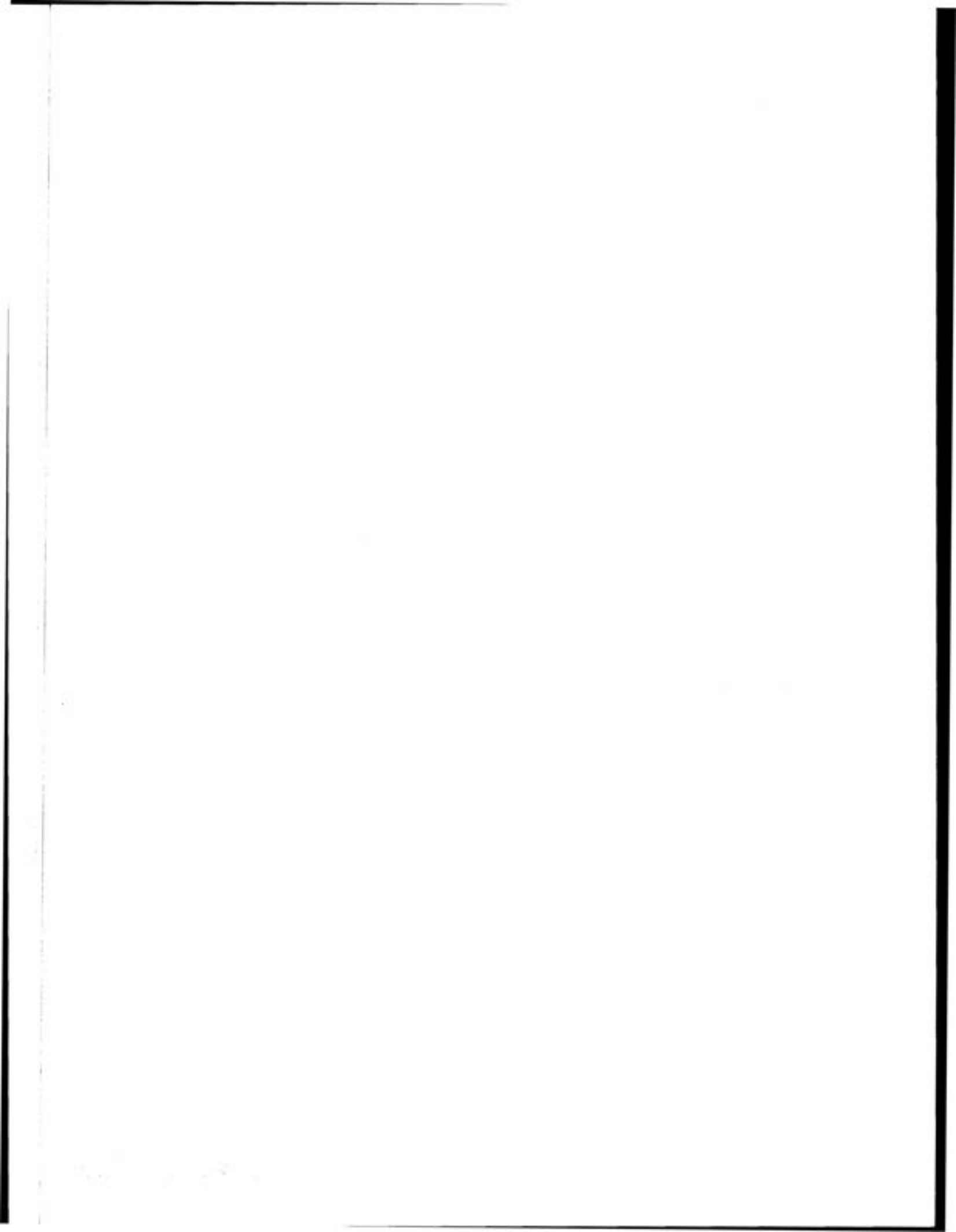
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Deputy Stubblefield clarified that the suspect walked east, near the front of the residence, and entered the back yard from the side gate. Deputy Stubblefield then said they didn't want him to get back into the house, so they tried to open the side gate to follow the suspect. At that time the suspect was still at the gate, and lunged his knife at a deputy. Deputy Stubblefield thought it was Deputy Hutchinson.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where he was. Deputy Stubblefield said some other deputies had arrived and he was about five feet from the front of the gate, covering the gate. They opened the gate and the suspect was at the gate and pulled it back. (Deputy Stubblefield made the motion as if the gate were pulled closed.) Deputy Sedgewick and another deputy were yelling "put your knife down" over the fence. They tried to open the gate again and the suspect was holding the gate.

Deputy Hutchinson said he needed someone to go into the back yard with him. Deputies Hutchinson and Stubblefield entered the residence through the front door and went into the back yard. The suspect came into the backyard. They confronted the suspect again and told him to "drop the knife." The suspect was saying, "I can't do that, I'm not going back to jail, I can't go back to jail."

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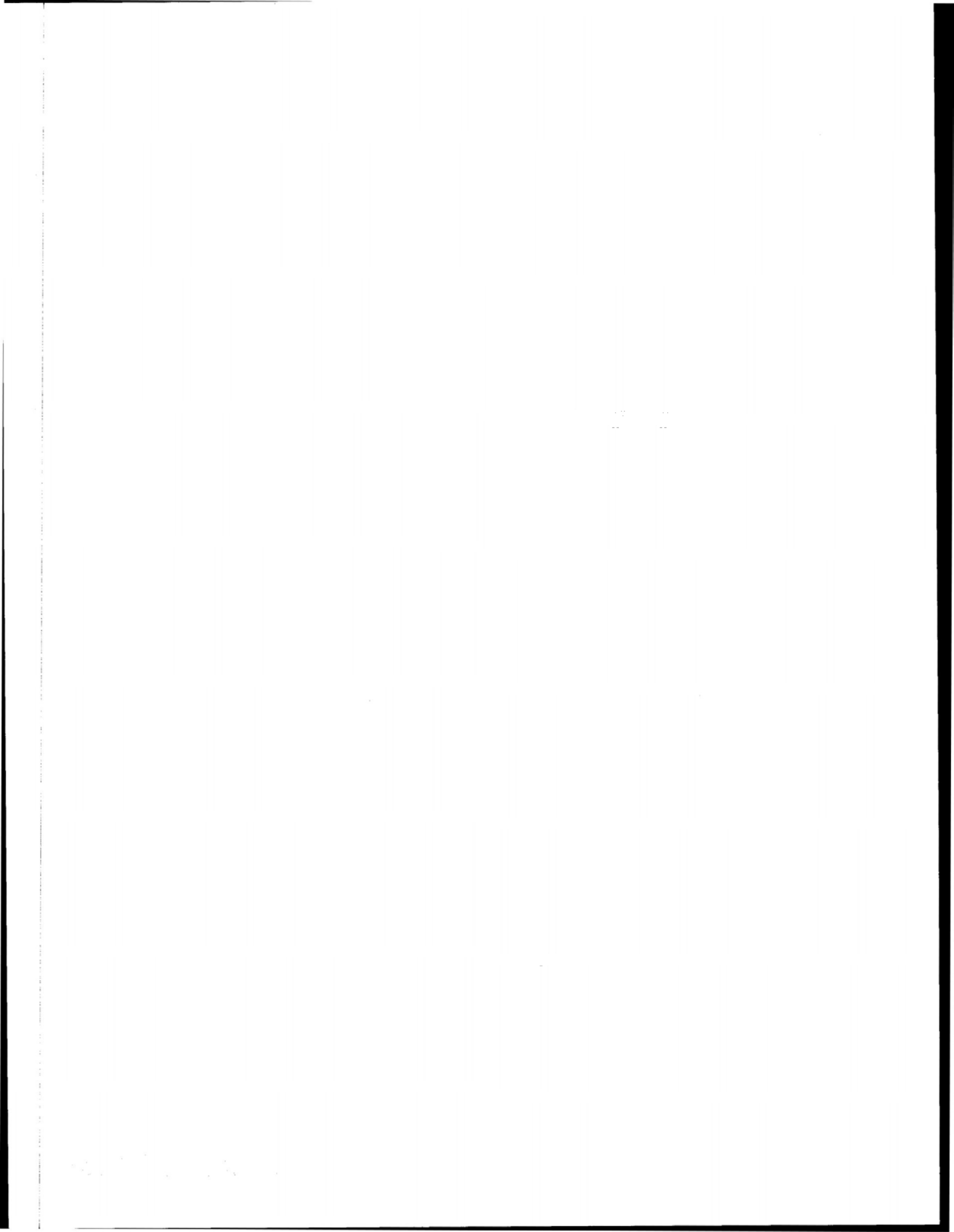
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I asked Deputy Stubblefield what hand the suspect was holding the knife in. Deputy Stubblefield said the knife was in the suspect's right hand. I asked if the suspect had any injuries. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect had been shot and was bleeding in the abdominal area.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what the suspect's state of mind was. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was "agitated" and did not want to go back to jail and was not going to be arrested. Deputy Stubblefield continued to say that they blocked his way into the house and the other deputies had come to the back yard from the side gate. The suspect was circling around and was not standing still. Deputies were talking to each other and made sure there was no cross fire situations. The suspect was able to get around to the side yard on the east side of the house and someone tried to pepper spray the suspect. The suspect then ran east and north on the east side of the house back out to the front.

Deputy Hutchinson and Stubblefield went through the house and went out the front door to the front yard. At that point Deputy Stubblefield pulled out his baton. Deputy Stubblefield explained the suspect was looking around and he thought he might be able to get a strike on the hand with the knife, because the suspect was turning the knife in his hand so he could stab. At one point the suspect pointed the knife at Deputy Stubblefield and said, "Put that thing away" as he

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was walking backwards. Deputy Stubblefield saw Deputy Sedgewick hit the suspect in the hand. The suspect ran away from Deputy Sedgewick but never dropped the knife. The deputies formed a semi-circle around the suspect and the suspect began walking west bound across Montgomery (Montgomery Road).

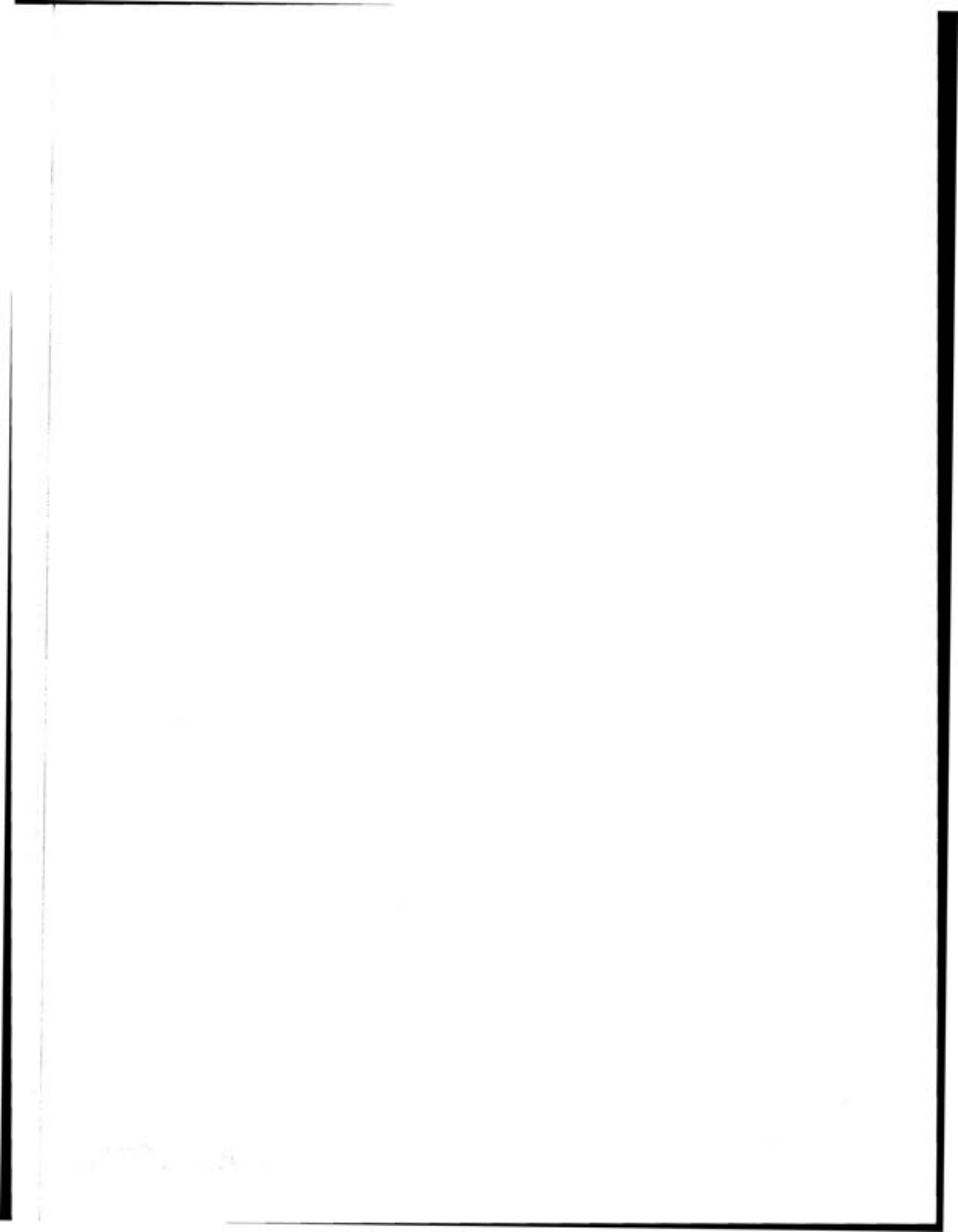
I clarified if the suspect was out in the front yard. Deputy Stubblefield explained that the suspect was in the grass area, east of the front door. After Deputy Sedgewick struck the suspect with the baton, the suspect tried to get into the house, but deputies were there and he could not get in the house. The suspect then walked westbound in the yard and the deputies formed a semi-circle around the suspect.

The suspect started to cross Montgomery (Montgomery Road). Deputies were saying, "Drop the knife or you will be shot." The suspect said, "I've already been shot, I don't care." The suspect also repeatedly said, "I'm not going back to jail" and was yelling at his wife. The suspect then walked to the front yard. Deputy Stubblefield motioned to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The deputies surrounded the suspect and the suspect made it to the doorway.

At this point, Deputy Stubblefield was north of the suspect, near the front door. Deputy Stubblefield saw people in a yard. (Deputy Stubblefield motioned to an area near the driveway of [REDACTED]) At this time, Deputy Stubblefield turned his attention to the citizens and told them to get back. When Deputy Stubblefield turned around, the deputies had

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closed in on the suspect so they were in front of him. Deputy Stubblefield was now a secondary officer and was between five and ten feet from the suspect.

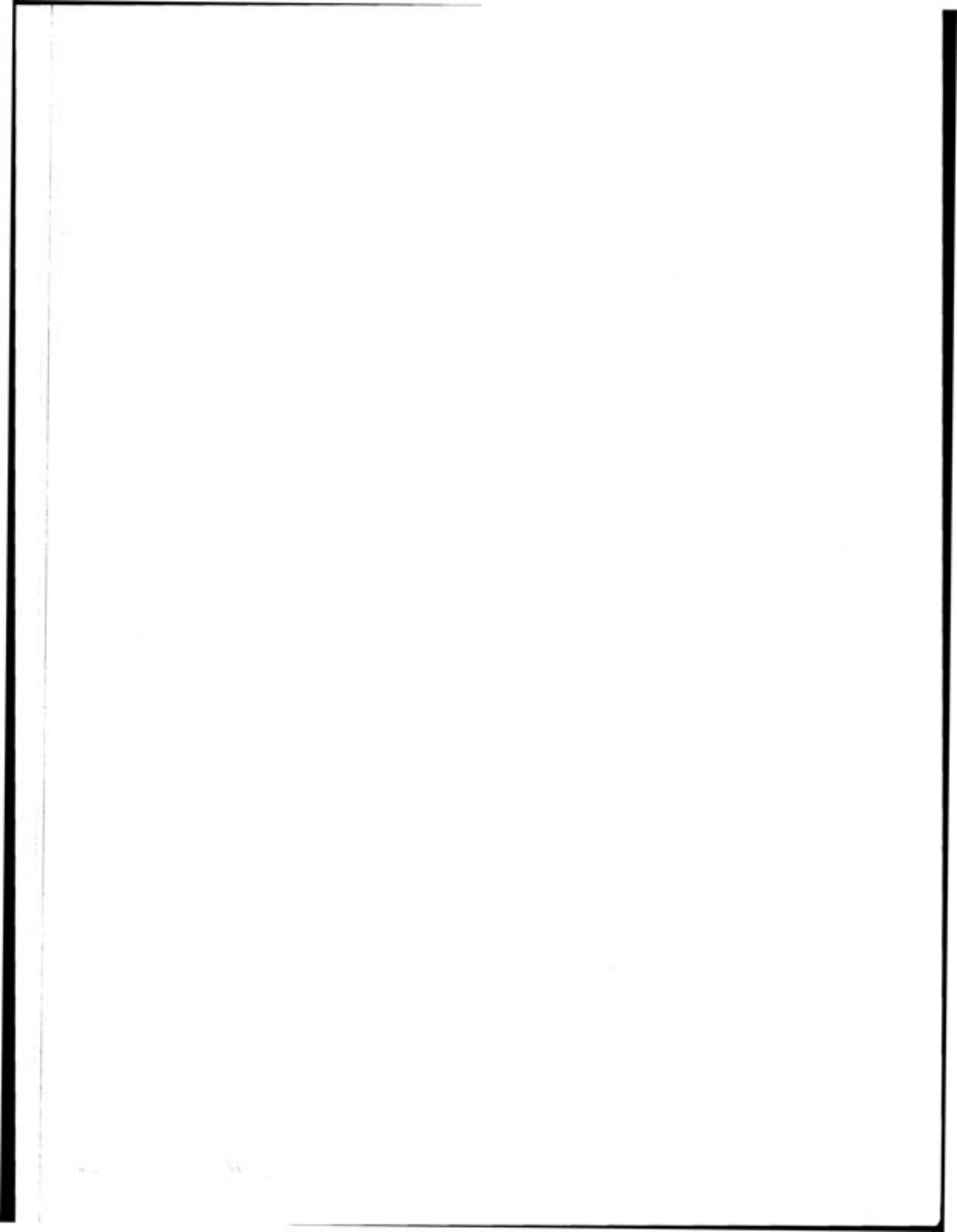
I asked Deputy Stubblefield what deputies were with him. Deputy Stubblefield saw Deputies Vaden, Waters, Sedgewick, Coulter and Hutchinson.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where this was occurring. Deputy Stubblefield said it was at the doorway and the suspect was trying to go inside the house.

I asked if the suspect was making any statements. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was talking and all he could remember was that the suspect was talking about his wife and not going back to jail. All the deputies were yelling don't let him in the house and don't go into the house. Deputy Stubblefield could not remember what was specifically said.

Deputy Stubblefield saw the suspect was trying to open the screen door. As the suspect was trying to go in the door, Deputy Stubblefield thought it looked like a deputy grabbed the suspect to pull him back , the suspect had the knife and shots were fired.

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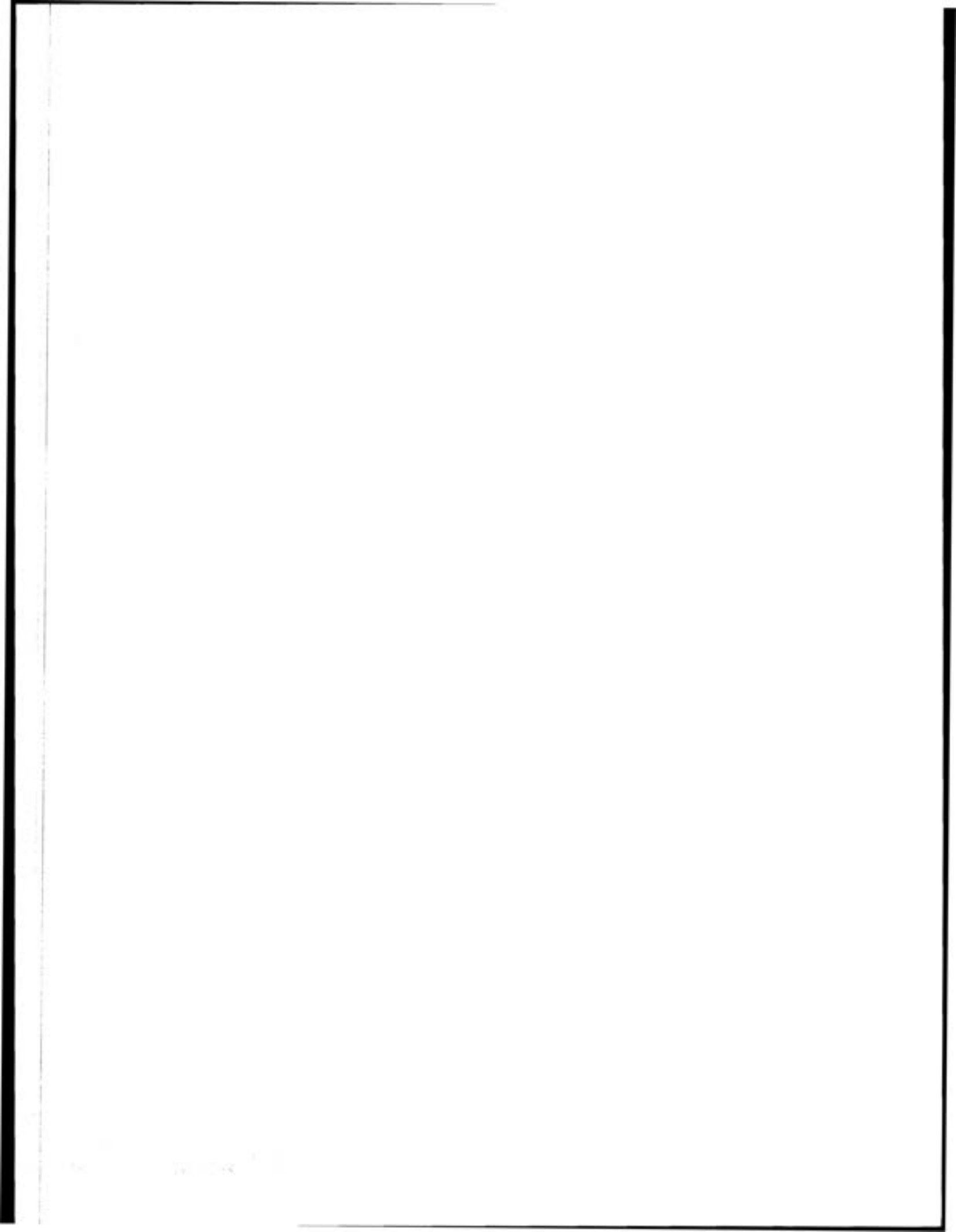
I asked Deputy Stubblefield how the suspect held the knife. Deputy Stubblefield said the knife was always up. Deputy Stubblefield described the knife as being above the suspect waist, and out in front of him. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was moving the knife around in front of him and would not let anyone get close to him. Deputy Stubblefield gave an example and said if you were in front of the suspect, he would not charge you, but he would hold the knife out in front of him. Deputy Stubblefield made a hand motion similar moving your hand up and forward from his body.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield to describe the manner how the suspect was holding the knife. Deputy Stubblefield said it was "aggressive" and "assaultive."

I asked Deputy Stubblefield to describe the knife. Deputy Stubblefield described the knife as a butcher knife with a twelve inch blade. Deputy Stubblefield said it was a long kitchen knife with a brown or dark handle.

At this point, I began to review the circumstances at the time when the suspect came back out from the backyard ([REDACTED]) and walked westbound across Montgomery. I asked Deputy Stubblefield what direction he was facing and what were his actions. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect walked out of the yard (rear yard) and walked north in the grass. At that point, Deputy Stubblefield had his baton out and confronted the suspect in front of the car. (Deputy Stubblefield motioned to one of the two vehicles parked in the driveway of [REDACTED])

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[REDACTED]) The suspect had the knife raised at Deputy Stubblefield and said, "Put that thing away." Deputy Sedgwick was able to strike the suspect's hand. The suspect turned and walked westbound toward the front door of [REDACTED]

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where Deputy Sedgwick was in relation to him. Deputy Stubblefield said Deputy Sedgwick was to his left. Deputy Stubblefield thought Deputy Sedgwick came from the area near the front of the car in the driveway.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield if the baton strike had any effect. Deputy Stubblefield said, "It hurt him." Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect bent and ran to the front door. Deputy Stubblefield said it was in a southwest direction toward the front door, but there were a lot of deputies there to try to corral him in. Deputy Stubblefield also heard one of the deputies say they needed "less than lethal" over the radio.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what pace the suspect was walking. I was referring to crossing Montgomery Road from [REDACTED] Deputy Stubblefield said it was a quick pace, but mentioned that the pace changed. Deputy Stubblefield said that when a deputy tried to spray the suspect with O.C., the suspect ran and when the suspect was struck with the baton his pace quickened, he tried to get away. Deputy Stubblefield said the baton strike hurt the suspect, but he did not drop the knife.

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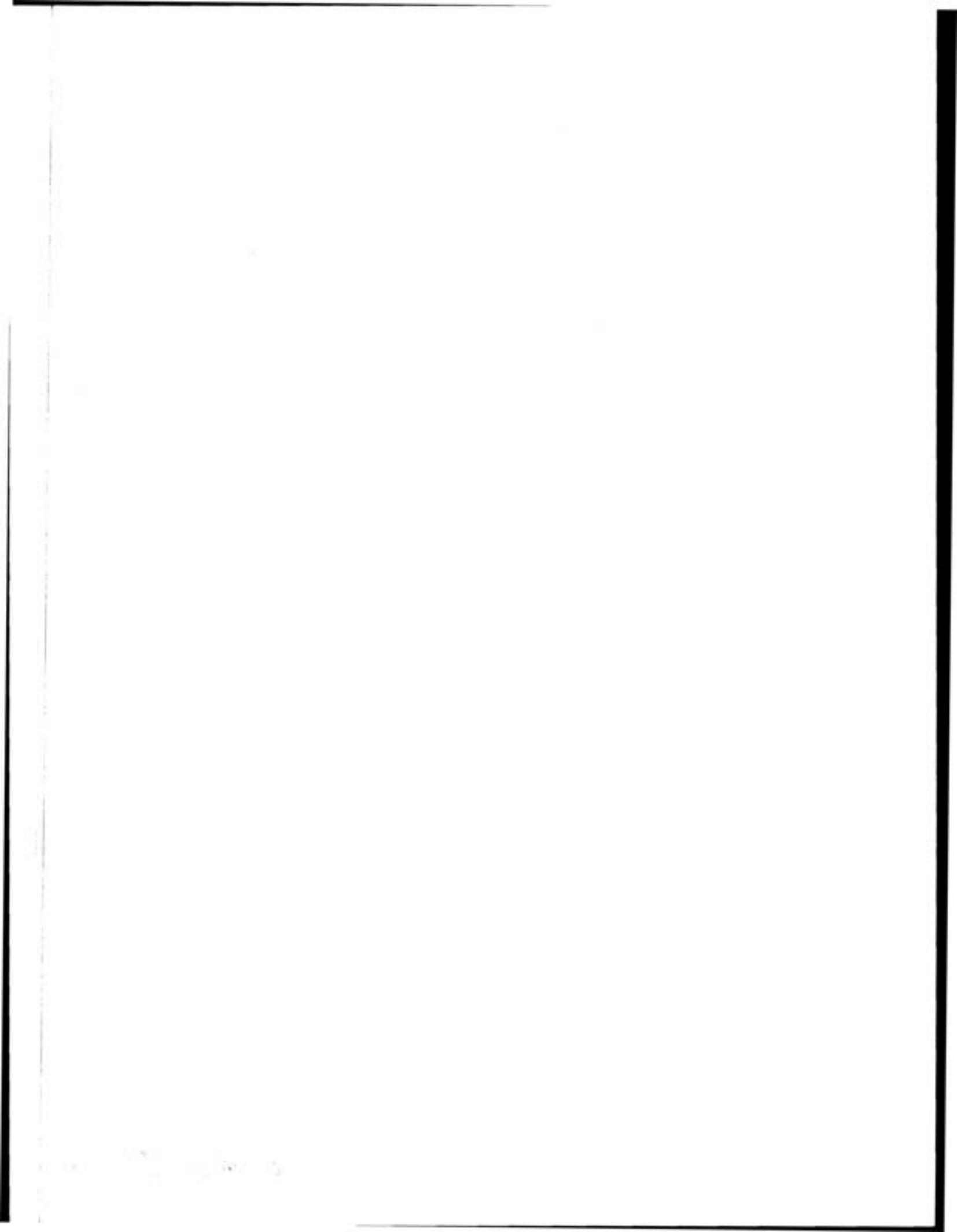
I asked Deputy Stubblefield if he knew how many times the suspect was sprayed with O.C. Deputy Stubblefield said he only saw the one time. Deputy Stubblefield thought it might have been Deputy Sedgewick, but he was unsure.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where Deputy Sedgewick struck the suspect. Deputy Stubblefield said it was the right arm near the wrist or hand. Deputy Stubblefield said it was a downward strike at the hand where the knife was. The baton strike doubled the suspect over and the suspect grabbed his hand with his other hand and ran.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what the suspect was doing and saying when he walked across [REDACTED] Deputy Stubblefield said everyone was yelling at the suspect to "drop the knife, drop the knife, put the knife down." Deputy Stubblefield said it was hard to hear what he (the suspect) was saying, but the suspect did hear a deputy say, "Put the knife down or you're going to get shot" and the suspect replied, "I already been shot, I don't care." Deputy Stubblefield did not know who made the initial statement, but it came from his right.

Deputy Stubblefield again mentioned he heard the suspect yell, "Why did you do this to me", "why did you call", and "we've been married thirty years." Deputy Stubblefield said that occurred at the house where the people were inside. (Deputy Stubblefield was referring to [REDACTED])

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I asked Deputy Stubblefield to describe the yell. Deputy Stubblefield described the yell as a stern talk, not a scream yell.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield to clarify what happened after the point when they were at [REDACTED] and he ordered the citizens out of the area. Deputy Stubblefield saw the suspect trying to get into the house. Deputy Stubblefield saw the front door open but the screen door was closed. Deputies were yelling "don't go in" and the suspect was trying to go into the house and then shots were fired.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield if he saw who fired shots or in what sequence. Deputy Stubblefield said it was a loud volley of shots from different deputies.

I asked how far the deputies were from the suspect. Deputy Stubblefield estimated the deputies were between five and ten feet from the suspects.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what deputies were present at that time. Deputy Stubblefield saw Deputies, Waters, Coulter, Vaden, Sedgwick, and Hutchinson. Deputy Stubblefield thought Deputy Vaden, Waters and Hutchinson were to his right.

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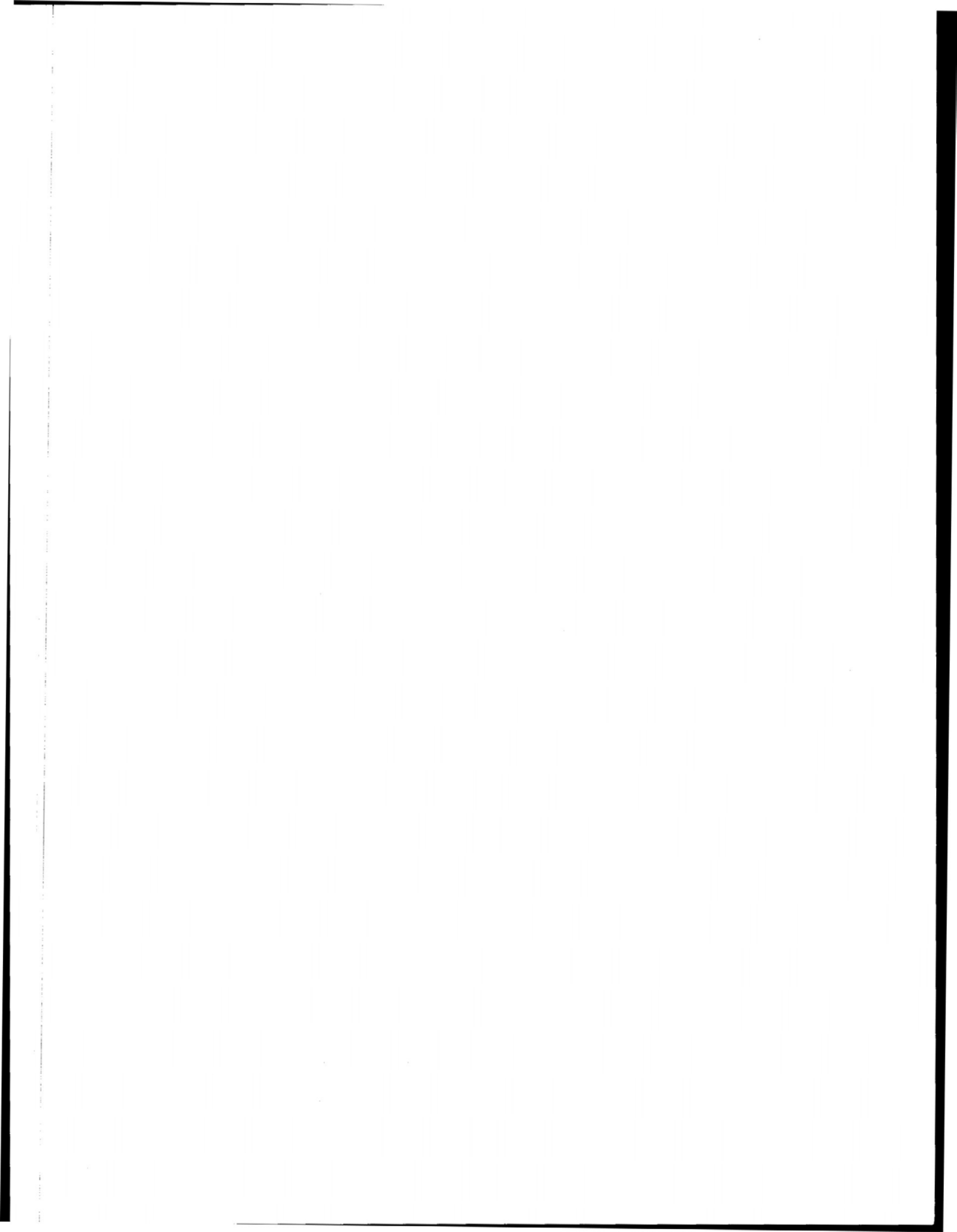
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I asked Deputy Stubblefield how the suspect was holding the knife at that time. I was referring to the time of the shooting at [REDACTED] Deputy Stubblefield said the knife was in the suspects right hand and the blade was facing out. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was holding the knife in a defensive position and said that when anyone tried to approach the suspect, he could lunge it at them.

I asked what direction the suspect was facing. Deputy Stubblefield said he remembered the suspect was facing the deputies. Deputy Stubblefield remembered he looked at the suspect and noticed he was trying to use his free hand to grab the latch to the door. Deputy Stubblefield described the suspect making "quick peeks" at the door. The suspect had had the knife in his right hand and his right shoulder was at an angle against the wall. The suspect was in the corner in front of the door and he was reaching for the handle with his left hand to try to open the door.

Deputy Stubblefield said it looked like a deputy reached up and tried to pull him away. Deputy Stubblefield said every time someone would come close to him, you would see the knife and then shots were fired. As Deputy Stubblefield spoke, he raised his right hand up and out in front of him. Deputy Stubblefield said if a deputy would come close to the suspect he would raise the knife up and outward from his body.

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I asked Deputy Stubblefield if he remembered a specific deputy coming closer than the group. I was referring to when the suspect was trying to get in to [REDACTED] Deputy Stubblefield said the deputies had formed a semi-circle around the suspect and the people on his right seemed closer to him.

After the shots were fired the suspect was handcuffed. Deputy Stubblefield then heard an officer involved 10-49 go out on the radio. Deputy Stubblefield saw Sgt. Adford arrive and asked if he should go to the injury accident. Since Deputy Stubblefield did not fire shots, he went to the injury accident at Moorpark Road at Avenida De Las Flores.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where the suspect fell and what the suspect did after being shot. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect went the ground and fell face first. The suspect was making groaning noises and might have tried stand up. At that point, Deputy Stubblefield could not see because the deputies closed in.

I asked if the knife was moved after the suspect was handcuffed. Deputy Stubblefield did not know.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield if the deputies had their weapons drawn or were there times when weapons were drawn and re-holstered. Deputy Stubblefield said the only time he saw a

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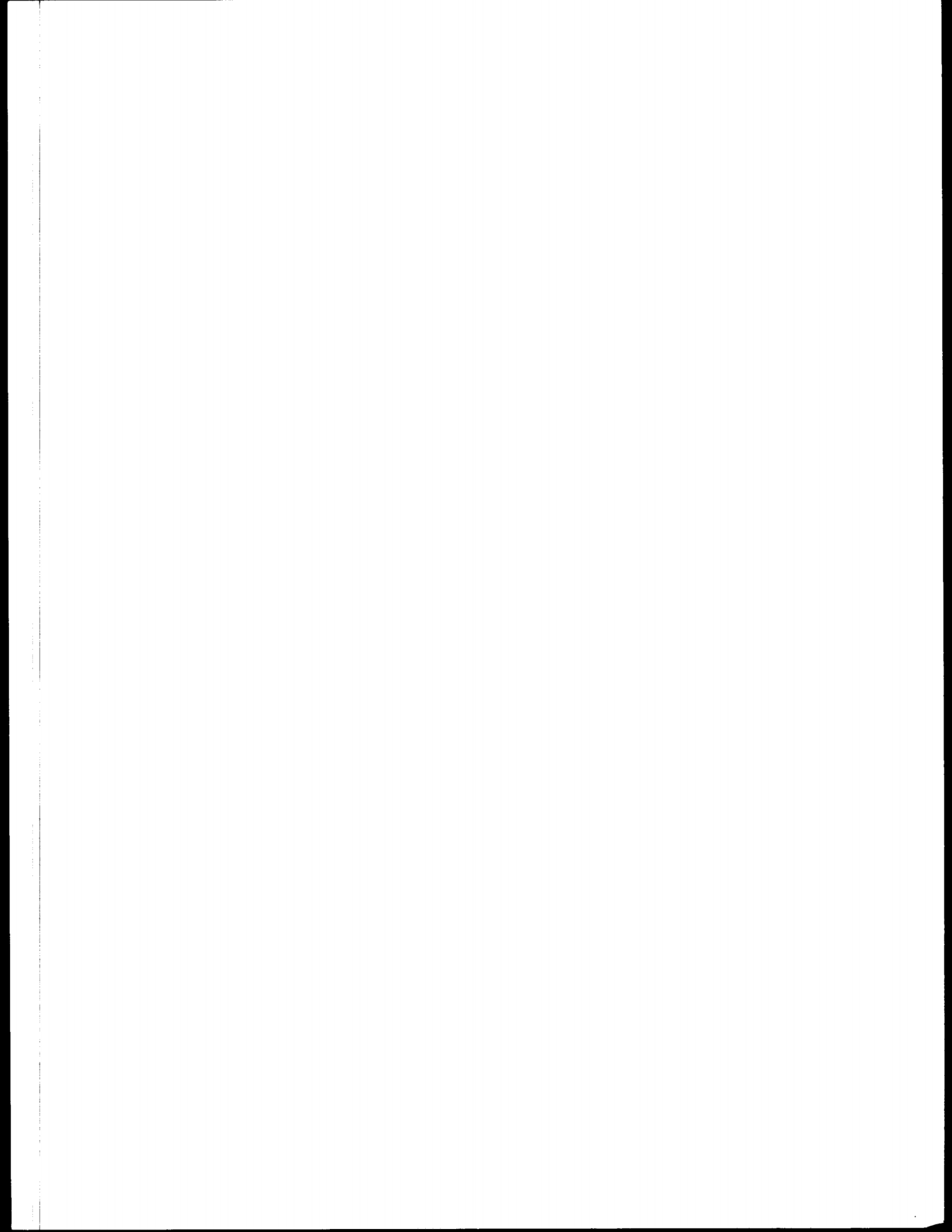
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weapon holstered was when Deputy Sedgewick hit the suspect with his baton. The only deputy with a gun other than a handgun was Deputy Vaden who was carrying a shotgun.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what he thought the suspect's intent was and how he (Deputy Stubblefield) felt. Deputy Stubblefield said he did not know what the original call was, but when he arrived he felt the suspect did not want to get arrested and would do anything not to go to jail. End of interview.

On October 13, 2001, at about 1830 hours, I was requested by Captain O'Hanlon to respond to [REDACTED] regarding an officer involved shooting. Upon my arrival, I contacted Detective Rhodes who instructed me to speak with a possible witness, [REDACTED] Captain O'Hanlon later tasked me to interview [REDACTED] and four members of the Ventura County Fire Department. All of the following interviews were tape-recorded and the cassette tapes were given to Major Crimes Detective Sergeant Montagna.

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At about 1950 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] inside of his residence, which is located four houses east of the southeast corner of Ave De Las Flores and Montgomery. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statements, which were tape-recorded.

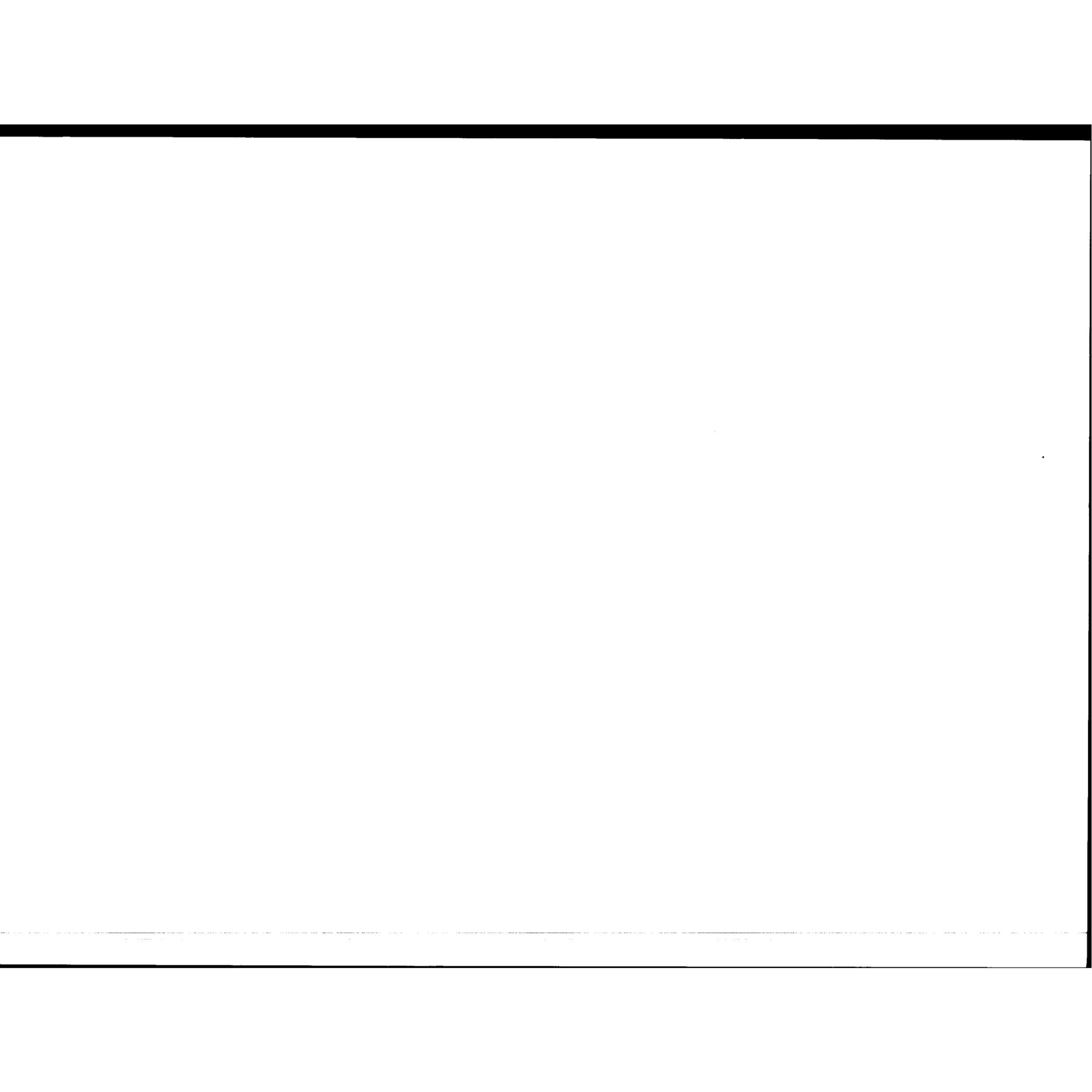
[REDACTED] was inside his bedroom, about to take a shower, when he heard about four gunshots. [REDACTED] immediately ran out his front door and stood behind the front of his truck, which was parked, in his driveway. [REDACTED] recalled seeing three officers (claiming one of them was a motorcycle officer) standing in front of [REDACTED] house," the house on the southeast corner of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] claims that the officers were ordering a person to get down. Two additional officers drove up and got out of their patrol cars. All the officers were ordering this person down. [REDACTED] believes this person was "moving all over the place," but he could not see this person. [REDACTED] could only hear the officers, "ordering him down." At one point, [REDACTED] believes he saw two officers go into the house, two other officers went around the left side of the house, while another officer stood on the eastside gate of the house. The officers were yelling at the person, "get down, get down."

After about two minutes, [REDACTED] saw the officers running west on [REDACTED] towards [REDACTED]. Shortly there after, [REDACTED] heard numerous shots being fired. I asked [REDACTED] if he saw the officers shooting. [REDACTED] said he did not see the officers shooting, claiming it was out of his view.

[REDACTED] was not sure of where the shooting actually occurred. [REDACTED] also recalled a sixth officer arriving, who parked in the middle of the street. This officer stood near the front of his patrol car with his gun drawn. [REDACTED] also remembered that all of the officers had their guns drawn during the entire incident. [REDACTED] did not hear any other noises outside prior to the first series of gunshots.

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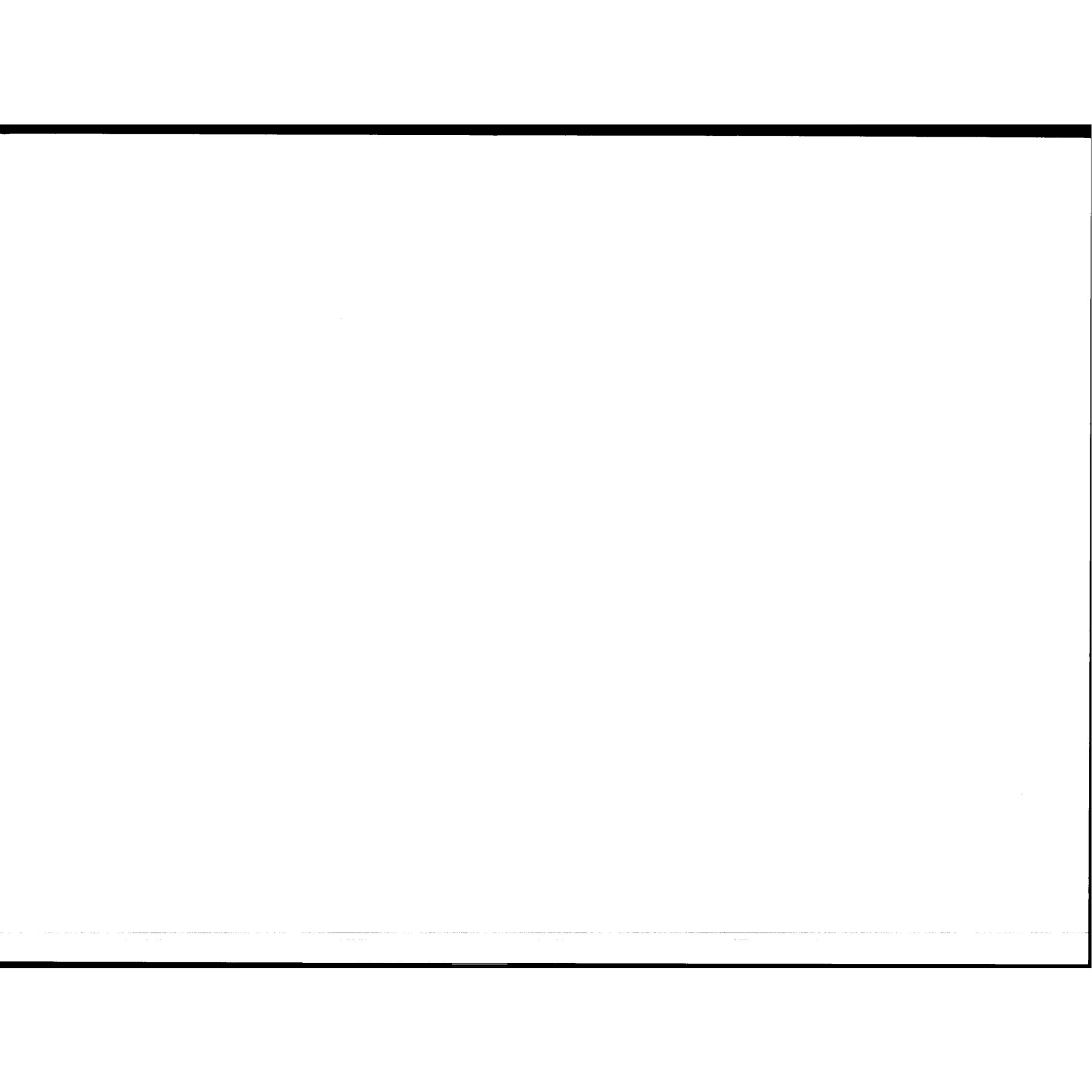
At about 2040 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at his home. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement, which was tape-recorded.

[REDACTED] told me that he and his sister, [REDACTED] were watching a movie in the living room of their house when he heard about five gunshots and a police car drive by. [REDACTED] went outside to see what happened. While standing behind a red Nova parked in his driveway, [REDACTED] looked towards the east and saw about 5-8 police officers pointing their guns at a "guy" wearing a turquoise shirt and beige cargo shorts. On 10-15-01/1600 hours, I met with representatives from the District Attorney's Victim Advocate Unit at the East County Station. Victim Advocates, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] then accompanied me to [REDACTED]. The purpose of going to this residence was to provide support via Victim Services for [REDACTED] who is a victim of Domestic Violence and is the wife of Tom Patton who was fatally shot by police. Victim services were also going to be provided to neighbors, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] who witnessed the shooting. We arrived at the address listed above to meet with everyone at one time. I introduced [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to those present.

While the meeting with the Victim Advocates was taking place, I went next door to [REDACTED] and met with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was with me when I met with [REDACTED]. I had arranged with [REDACTED] to interview her children about the incident since they were playing outside when it occurred. When we arrived at the residence [REDACTED] expressed concern that her children (7 and 8 years) were going to be emotionally affected by having to recall the events of the shooting and requested that I not conduct the interview at this time. She also stated that her children "did not see much" since they were brought into the house shortly after deputies arrived. I told her I would not do the interviews as she requested. I also asked if she [REDACTED] had given a statement to police regarding what she saw. She replied that she had not and was upset because the shooting has affected her in a negative way. I asked [REDACTED] if she would mind giving a statement at this time. [REDACTED] became emotionally upset stating that she was not able to give a statement now because she was still disturbed about the incident. [REDACTED] asserted that she did not trust police because she felt

On 10/13/2001, I was working as a field supervisor at the East Bureau Patrol designated as 4S8. At approximately 1720 hours, I heard deputies dispatched to a domestic violence incident on [REDACTED] 9A31 and 9B31 were instructed to meet the victim at [REDACTED]. A short time later, I heard deputies on the radio advising of a man with a knife followed by moments of chaotic radio chatter. I also hear a deputy advising radio, "shots fired."

I immediately drove to the location and upon arrival, I saw numerous deputies, all appeared to be doing different tasks, in front of [REDACTED]. I was able to see emergency personnel tending to a subject on the front porch area of the residence. I was informed that deputies shot the subject, Later identified as S-Patton.

I saw Sr. Dep. Yoos and ordered him to guard the crime scene at the [REDACTED] address. I asked the deputies on scene to identify the deputies involved in the shooting. Six (6) deputies were identified as being involved. Dep. Hutchinson, Sadio, Waters, Coulter, Sedgwick and Sr. Dep. Vaden were involved. I ordered them to my patrol car where we established a temporary command post. I instructed the deputies to refrain from speaking to one another regarding the incident after checking their well being. I started to ask basic questions after I informed the watch commander to notify Major Crimes and Sheriff's personnel to respond to the incident.

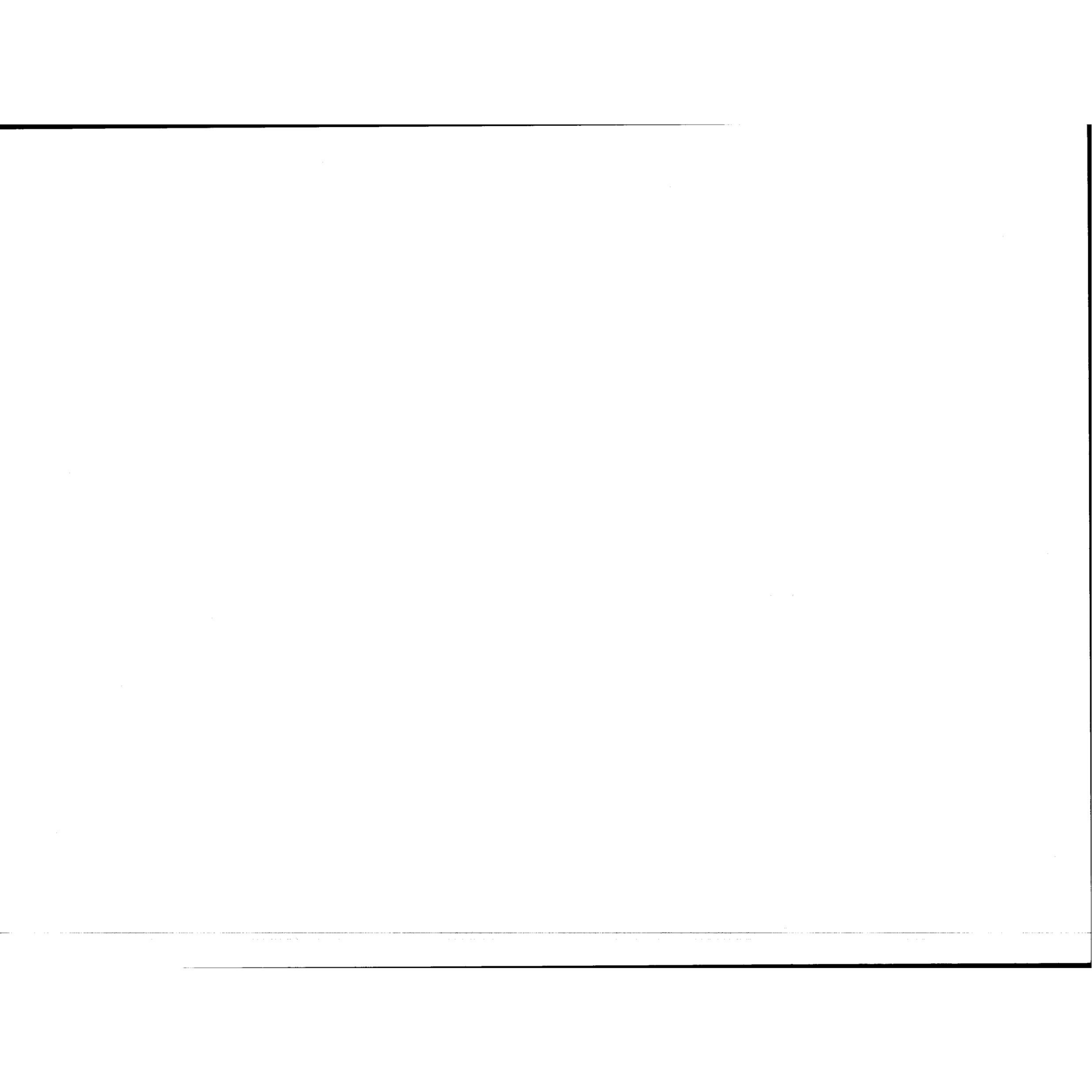
The sole purpose of the questioning was to determine where the crime scene(s) were, how many shots were fired and where the rounds or bullets may have gone. I was concerned about bullets going down range and having additional victims out of our view. I learned that Patton was shot at two different locations. A second deputy was detailed to protect the other scene at the [REDACTED] address.

Yellow crime tape was utilized to delineate the crime scenes and to help close down Flores and Montgomery Rd. I assigned Sr. Dep. Nickels to remain with the six deputies involved in the shooting. Sr. Dep. Vaden informed me that he used his department shot gun and discharged one (1)

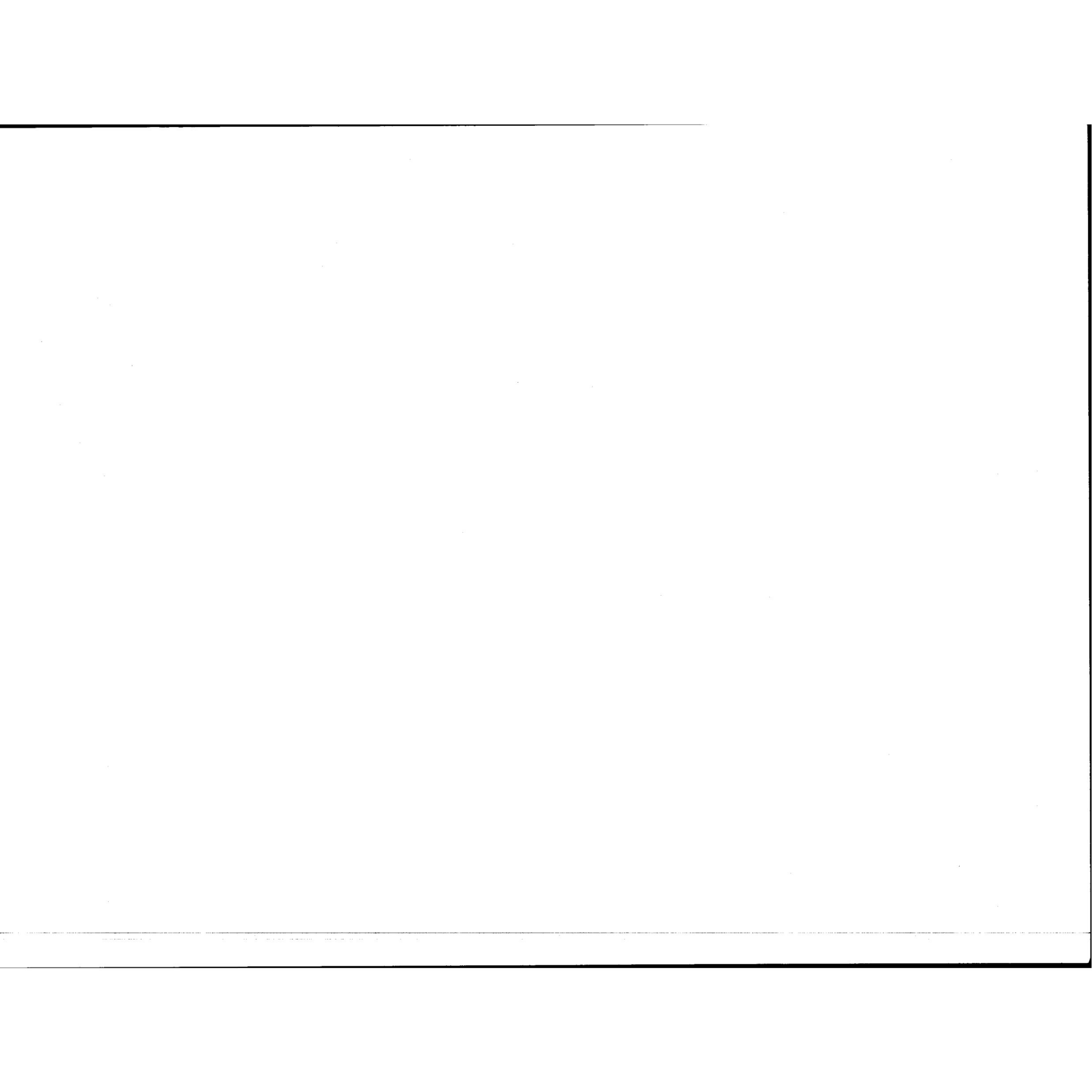

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round from the weapon. He was still in possession of the weapon and carrying it around. I instructed Vaden to secure it in the back seat of my patrol car.

Additional resource began to arrive and an ICS program was established to help manage the incident. We organized a team of deputies to start canvassing the area for other potential victims and witnesses. Through traffic was closed in all directions. Both crime scenes were secured and detectives and command staff began to arrive. Cmdr. Parks arrived on scene as well as Capt. Humphries. Cmdr. Parks assumed control of the incident after a quick briefing. I remain on scene to assist with the operational phase of the investigation.

Sgt. Roger Dewames also arrived and remained on scene to assist with the operational portion of the incident. Shortly before I left the scene, Detective Jose Rivera supervised the collection of the department shot gun from my patrol car. It was loaded with one round in the chamber and two additional rounds in the tube. The weapon and shells were collected by a crime scene tech as evidence. At approximately 0035 hours, I was released from my responsibilities at the crime scene and I returned to the station.

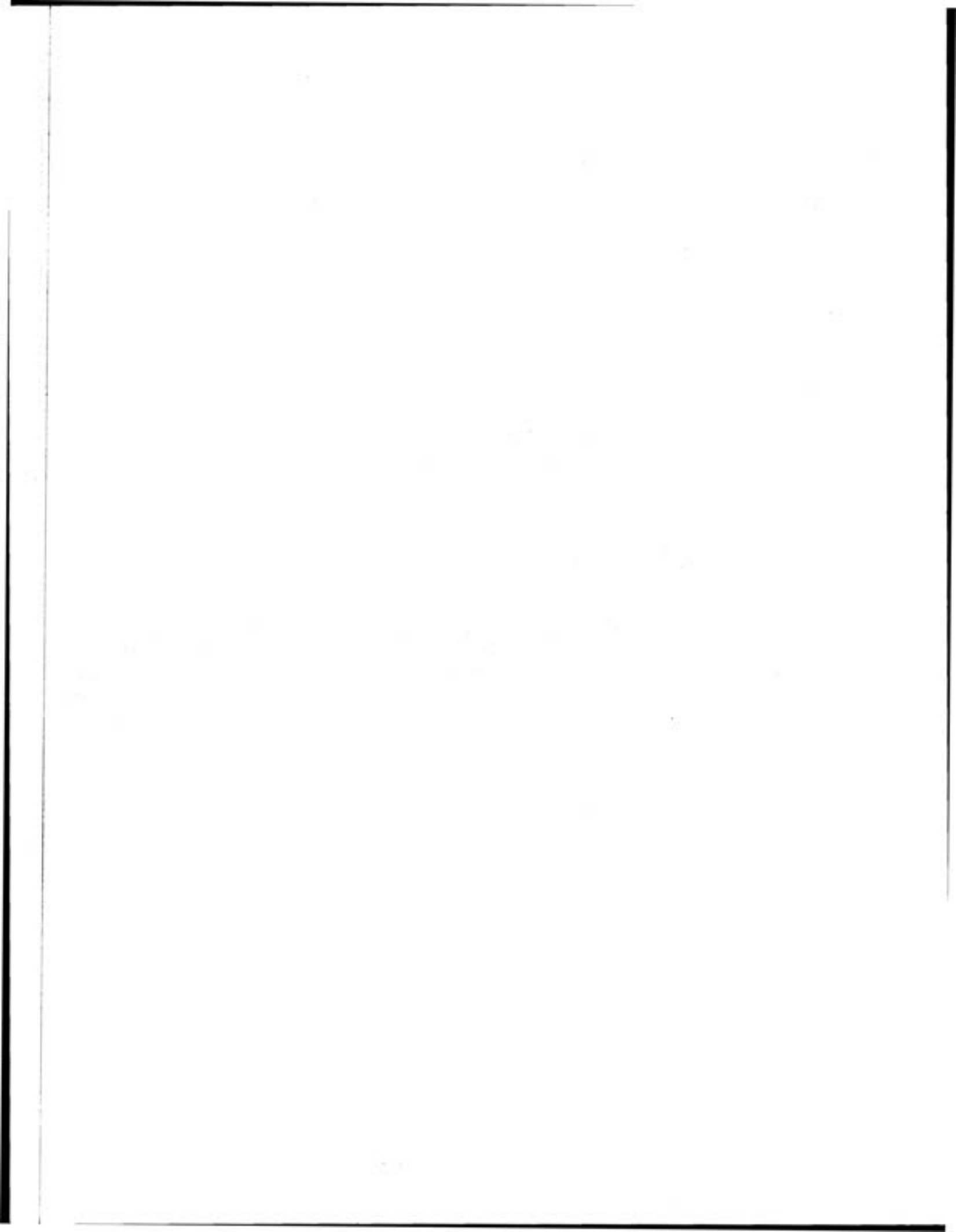

Autopsy

Tom Patton

On 10-14-01 at about 0830 hours I attended the Autopsy of Tom Patton who had been shot by Ventura County Deputy Sheriff's the night before. Dr. Frank performed the autopsy and was assisted by Forensic Pathology Technician Michael [REDACTED] Field Evidence Technicians D. [REDACTED] #3381 and [REDACTED] #3832 were present from the Bureau of Investigation. Det. S. Rhods and I were present from Major Crimes.

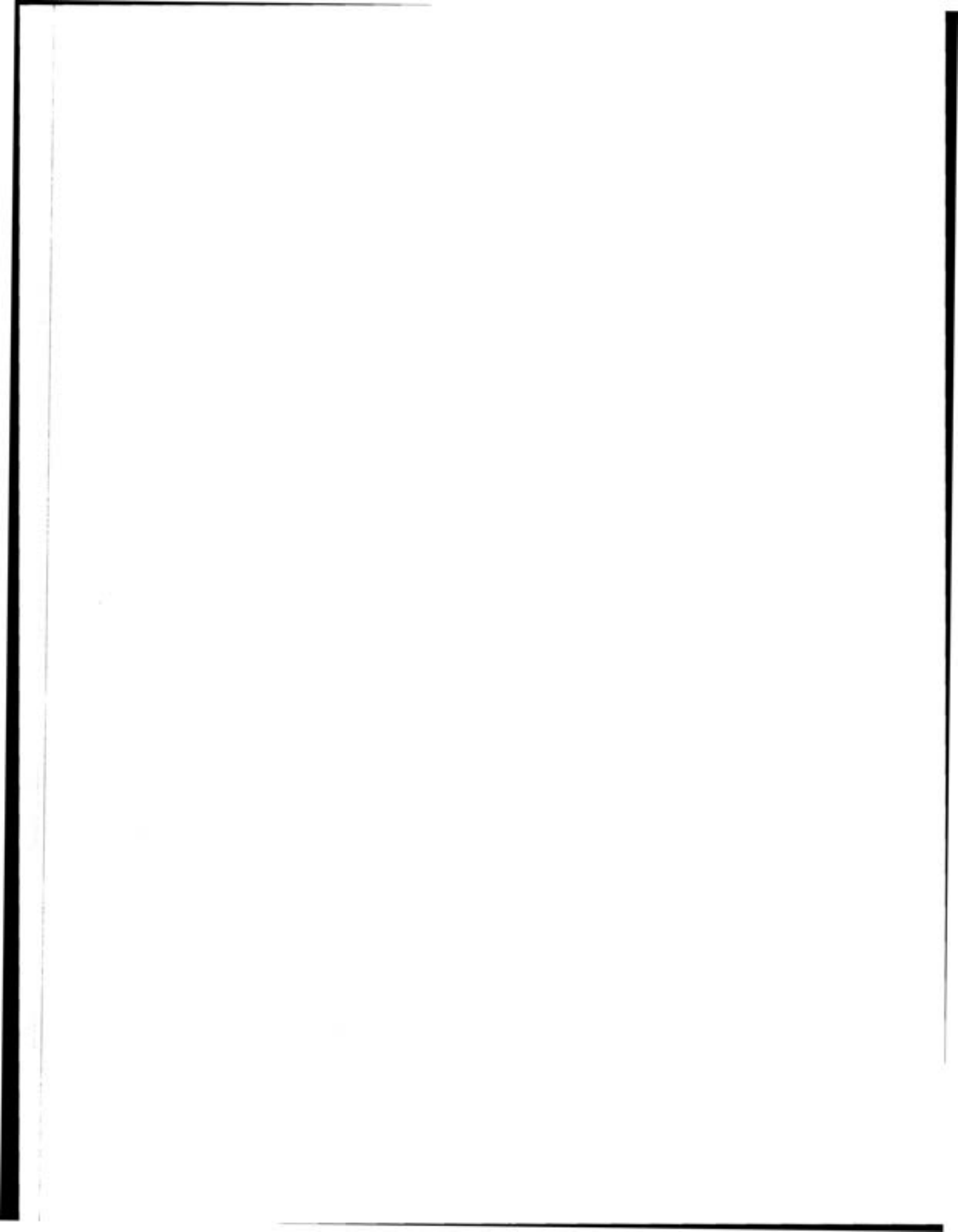
Dr. Frank began the examination by examining the x-rays supplied by the Los Robles Hospital. There were nine bullets visible in the x-rays. The x-rays revealed that there were three bullets in the suspect's left arm and six bullets in the suspect's torso. Also visible in the x-ray was that the suspects left Fibula was broken just below the knee. There were bullet fragments visible in this x-ray. The suspect' left arm just below the elbow was also broken along with his left wrist. There were bullet fragments visible in the x-ray that showed these breaks.

At 0900 hours, Dr. frank cut body bag tag number 000932 and opened the body bag. She photographed the body and then began examining a green Polo Shirt with small blue and white stripes. Only the left

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half of the shirt was inside the bag with the body. It is unknown where the other half of the shirt is. The shirt had been cut in half, down the front and back. There were numerous holes and tears in the bloodstained shirt. Dr. Frank proceeded to measure and describe the shirt, refer to her report for details. Dr. Frank located a small fragment of the copper jacket of a bullet on the front of the shirt about five inches above the bottom hem about midline on the shirt. FET [REDACTED] collected the fragment.

Dr. Frank then found a pair of red "Jockey" brand briefs under the body. The briefs were bloodstained with several holes in them. They had been cut up both sides from the outside of the leg to the waistband.

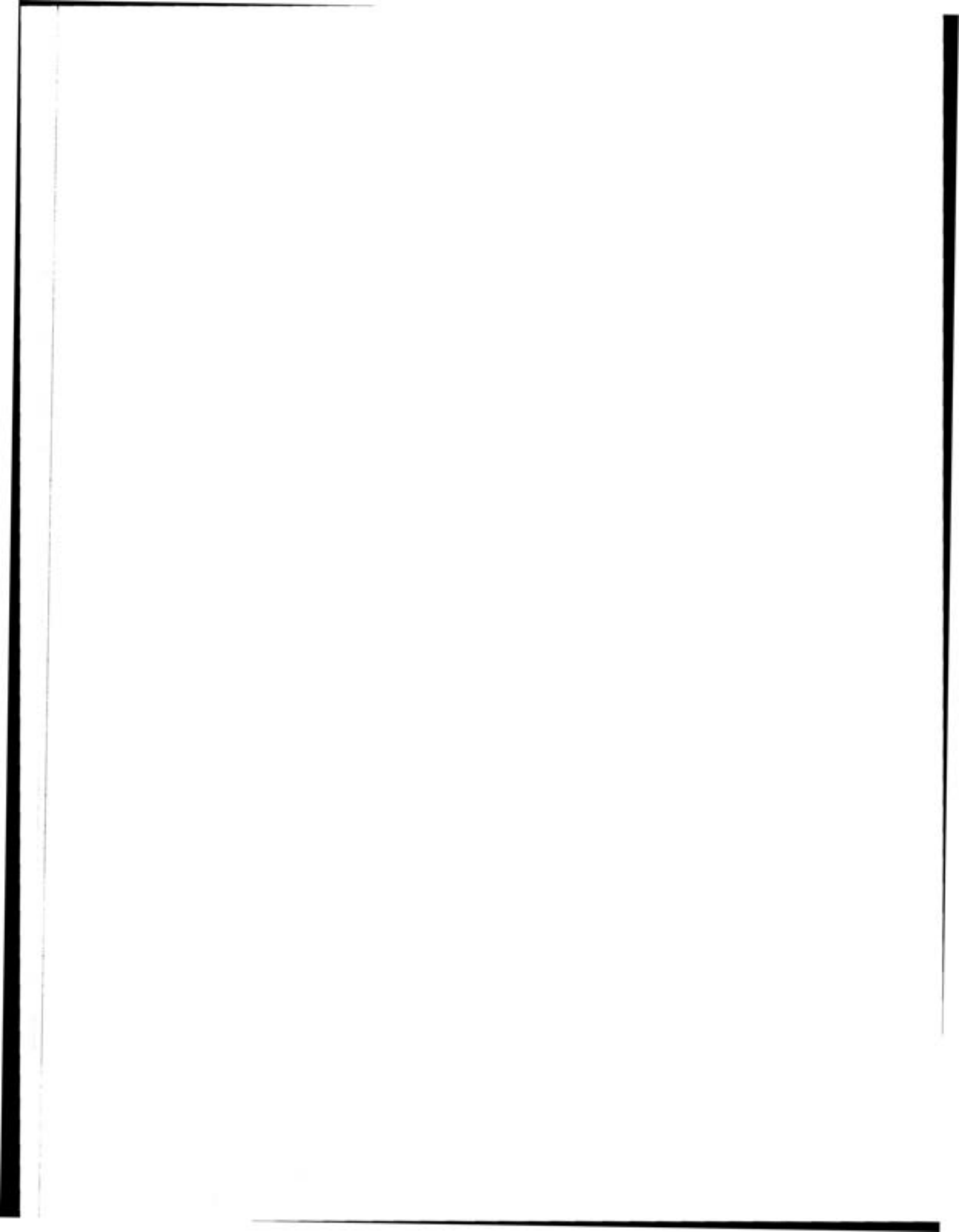
FET [REDACTED] then gave Dr. Frank a pair of green shorts that had been recovered during the initial investigation. Dr. Frank examined the shorts that had also been cut off of the suspect. These shorts were also blood stained and had several holes in them.

Dr. Frank then began examining the body. She could find no obvious injuries on the suspect's neck or head. Dr. Frank then began diagramming and photographing the wounds on the body, as did FET [REDACTED]. FET [REDACTED] took a swab of the skin on the suspect's face to test for evidence of Oleoresin Capsicum, OC.

Dr. Frank examined each wound in the suspect's body in order to determine if the wound was a bullet entry wound, a bullet exit wound, a bullet graze or was caused by some other object. Dr. Frank also examined the bullets bath as it entered and traveled through the body. Refer to Dr. Frank's diagram and report for details. Dr. Frank recovered nine bullets from the body. She believes that eight of the bullets are handgun bullets and one is the slug from a shotgun.

Prior to the examination I had told Dr. Frank that one of the deputies had struck the suspect on the right hand or wrist with his baton. I asked her to examine the suspect hand and wrist to determine if there was any bruising that may have been caused by a baton strike. Dr. Frank looked at the suspect's right wrist and saw four injuries. The first injury was impressions that Dr. Frank felt were left by the handcuffs. The second obvious injury was on the inside of the right wrist. Dr. Frank felt that the deputy placing the handcuffs on the suspect could have caused this injury. The third injury was what appeared to be a bullet

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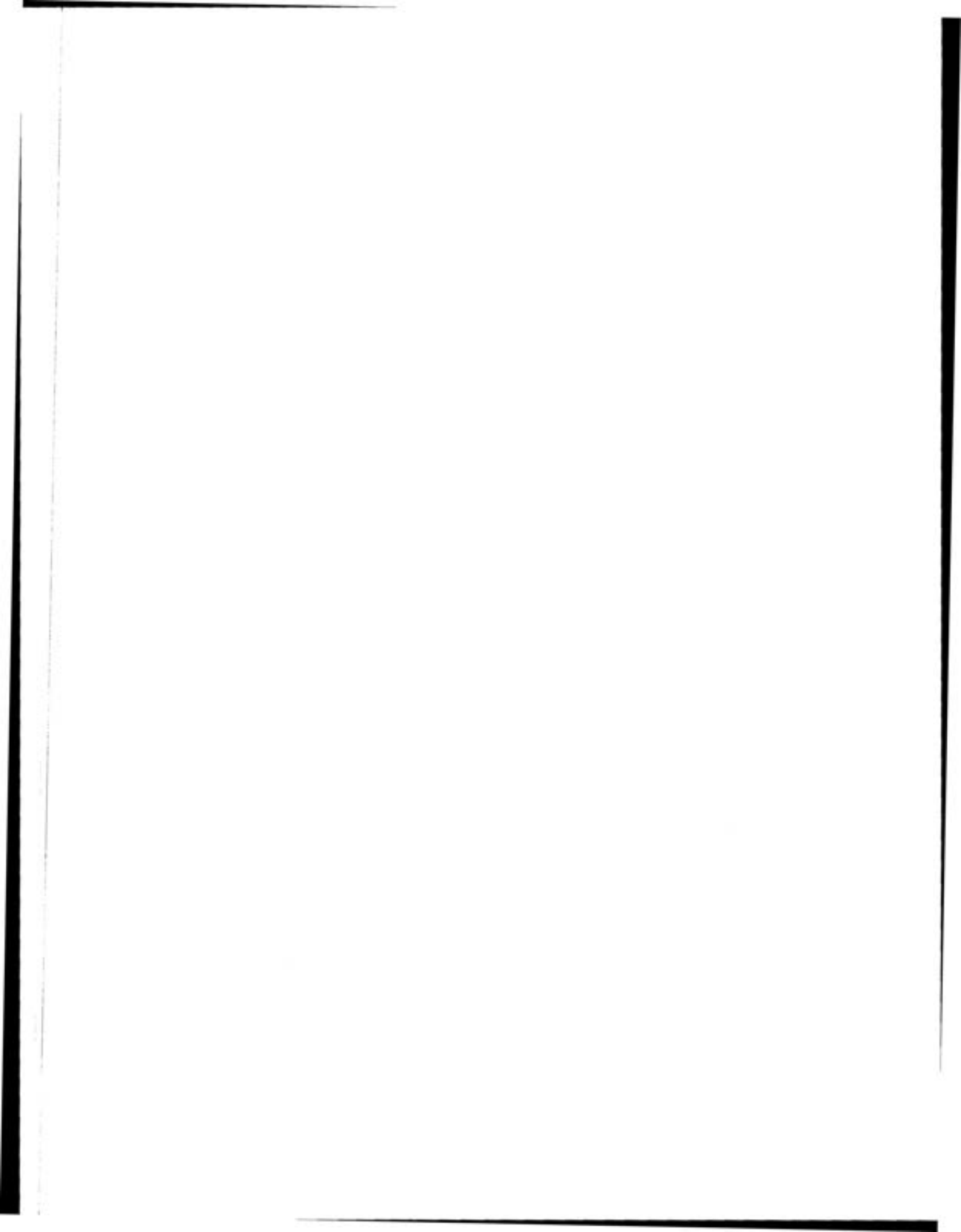
graze along the outside of the suspect's thumb between the knuckle and the thumbnail. The fourth injury was a purple bruise along the entire length of the suspect's right thumb to just above the wrist. Dr. Frank examined the bruise and felt that the bullet graze did not cause the injury. She felt that the injury was the result of the thumb coming in contact with a hard object with great force not unlike a baton strike.

Dr. Frank then told me that she was going to examine her notes in order to second check her findings. FET [REDACTED] and I collected all items that had been seized as evidence and left the location. Det. Rhods had left earlier.

On 10-15-01, I received a phone call from Coroner Investigator Baroni. Investigator Baroni told me that while Dr. Frank examined her notes she felt that there were possibly more bullets in the suspect's body that had not been located. The suspect's body was x-rayed again and four more bullets were visible. The bullets had been hidden from view on the first set of x-rays by metal clasps attached to the body board that the suspect was lying on. Dr. Frank recovered all four bullets along with the wading from the shotgun slug that was recovered earlier. Refer to Dr. Frank's report for details of the injuries on the suspect's body.

Field Evidence Technician Ian [REDACTED] arranged to collect the four bullets and the wading from the coroner's office.

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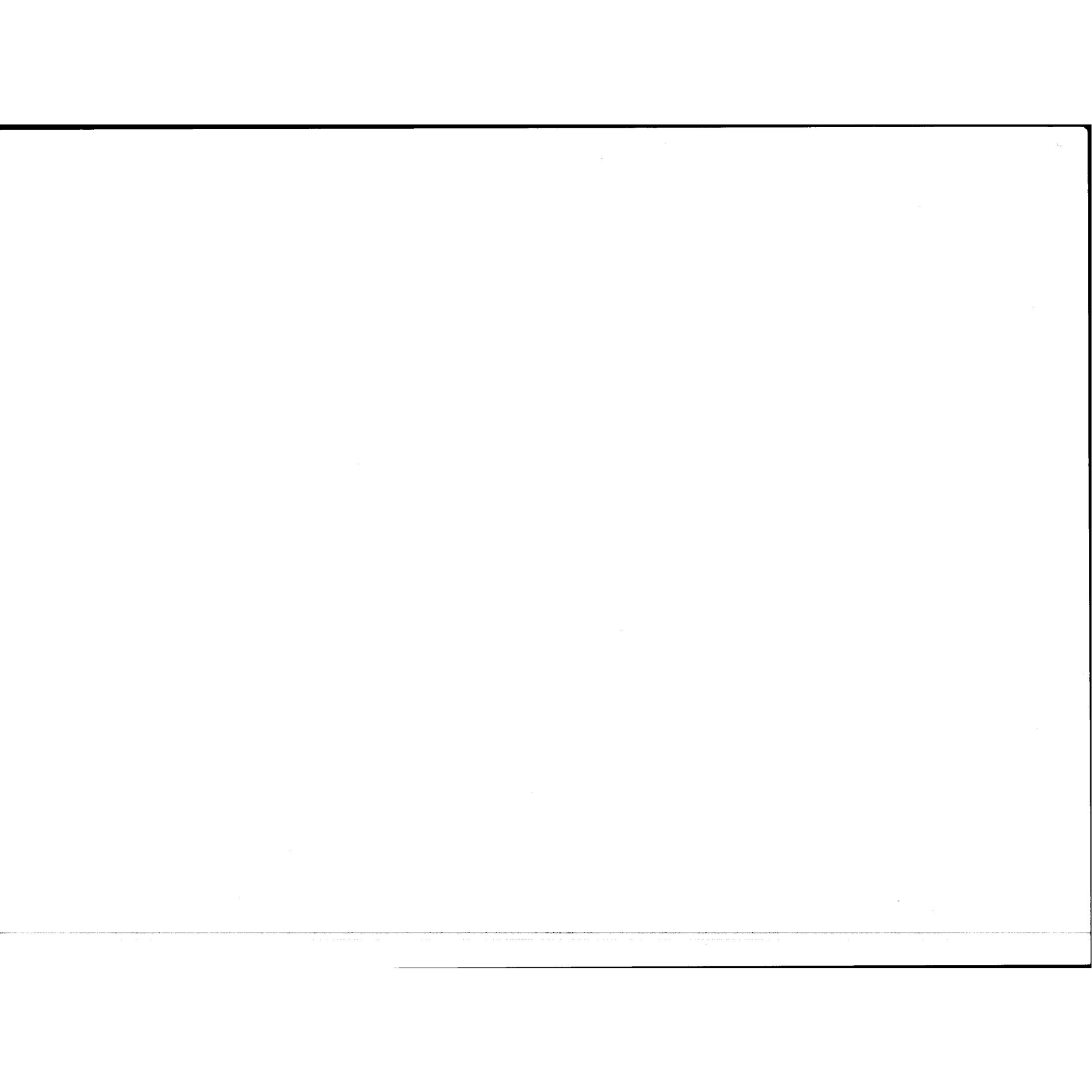
On 10-13-01, at approximately 1811 hours, I contacted [REDACTED] speaks limited English. Any further interviews should be done with a Spanish-speaking detective.

[REDACTED] was in the kitchen when the incident occurred. [REDACTED] said the suspect started walking from her left to her right, arriving at the second house. [REDACTED] again heard the officers yelling to drop the knife, but again the suspect did not listen. [REDACTED] stated more shots were fired before the suspect dropped to the ground. [REDACTED] was unsure how many shots were fired. [REDACTED] was unsure how many officers were at the second house, but she believes there were again at least 3 officers.

[REDACTED] was visibly shaken by the incident.

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On 10-13-01, at approximately 1825 hours, I contacted [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said she was the only person home at the time of the incident. [REDACTED] had just finished getting out of the shower when she heard about 6 shots fired. [REDACTED] went to her front bedroom, which faces south on Avenida De La Flores.

[REDACTED] looked out her bedroom window. The bedroom window was shut so [REDACTED] could not hear any words spoken by either the officers or suspect. [REDACTED] saw approximately 5-6 officers at the second house of the incident. [REDACTED] pointed in the direction of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said the 5-6 officers had their guns out and were pointing them towards the house. [REDACTED] said she saw one officer jump the fence of the house. [REDACTED] then saw the suspect come out of the house.

Although [REDACTED] could not hear what was being said, [REDACTED] said it was evident the suspect was not listening to the officers. The suspect started walking away from the officers. [REDACTED] could not remember if the suspect was holding a weapon or not. As the suspect continued to walk away from the officers, the suspect disappeared from her view. [REDACTED] next remembers hearing approximately 6 more shots.

[REDACTED] stated the next thing she remembers is numerous patrol cars responding to the scene with their sirens sounding.

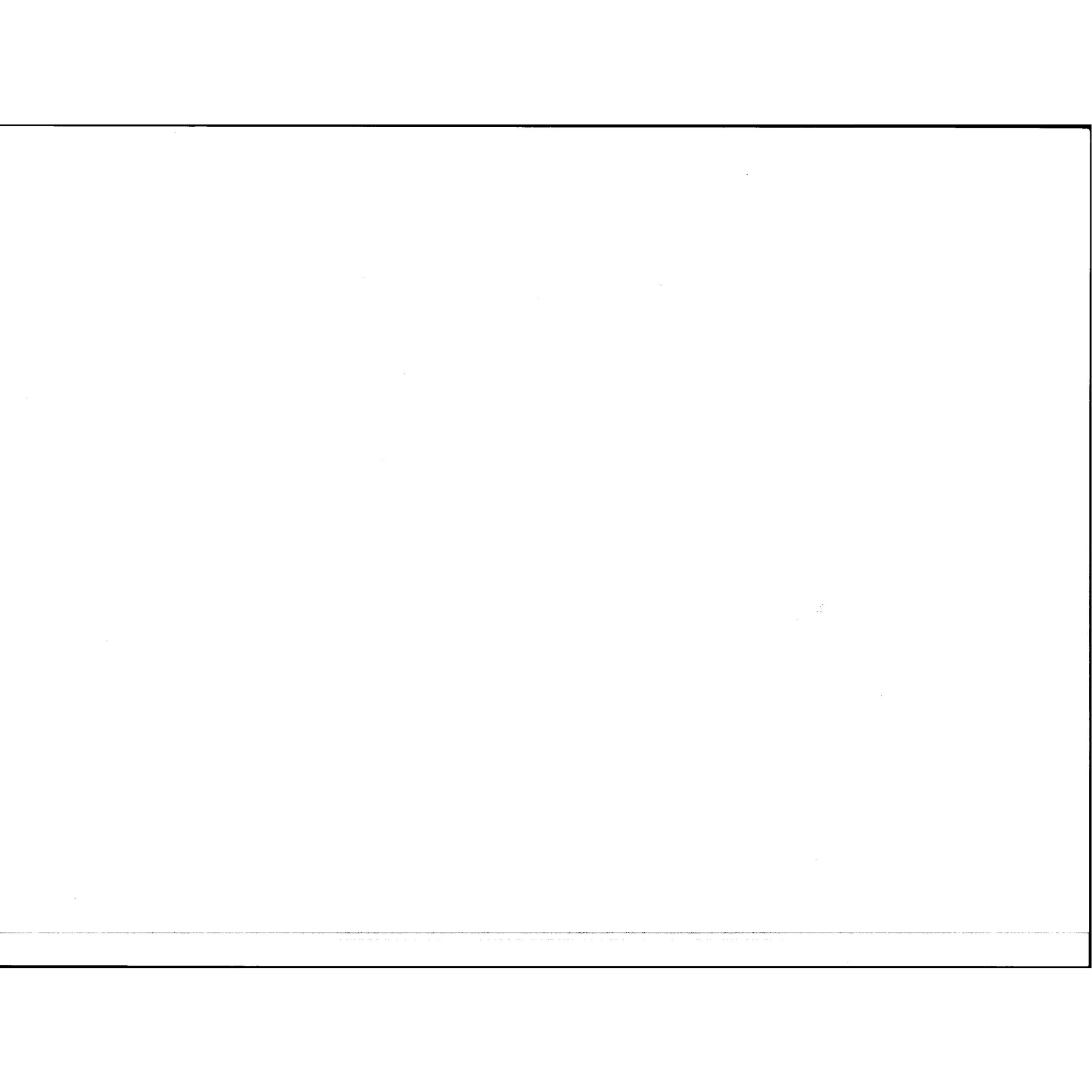

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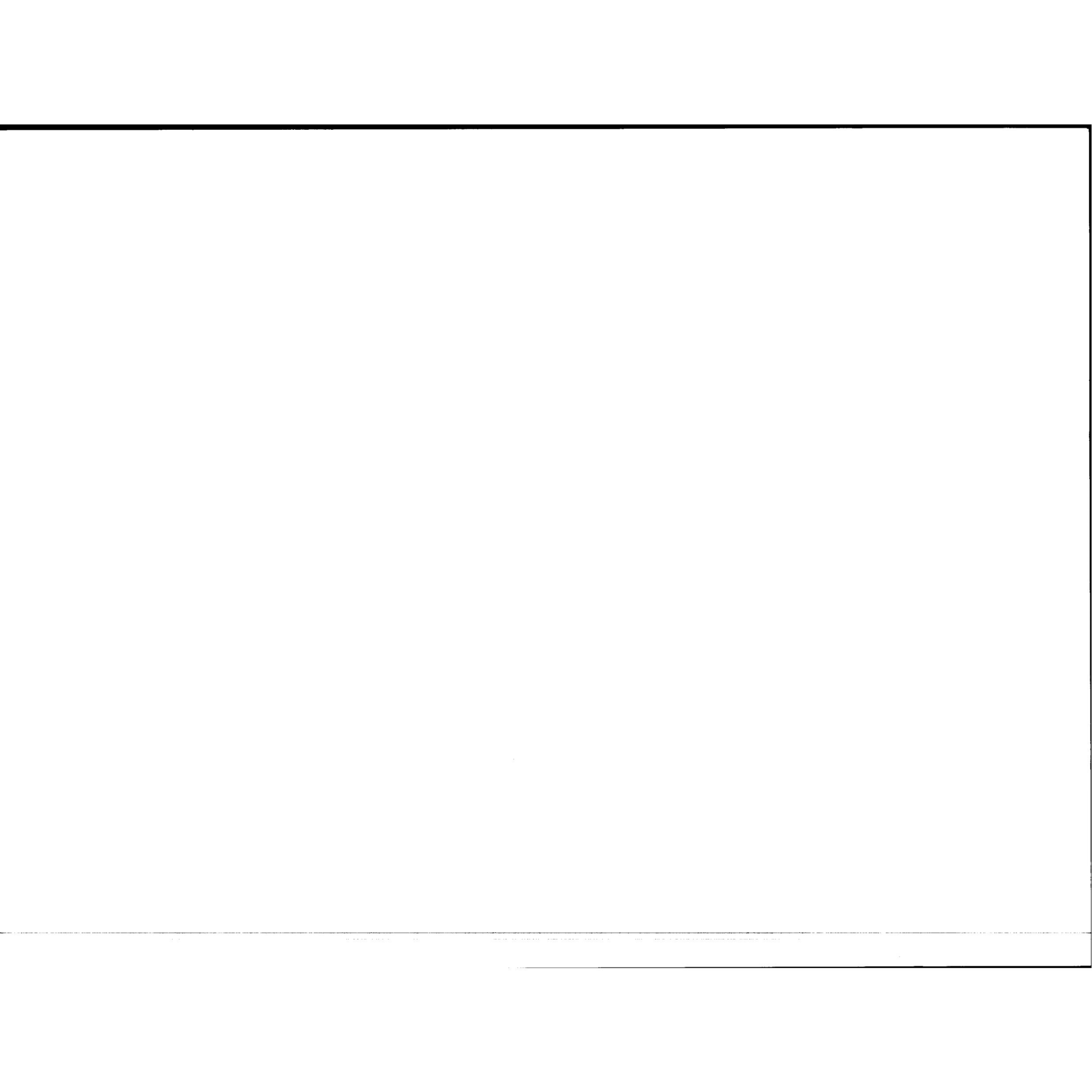
