On 04-08-2003, at about 1715 hours, I was at the East County Station, monitoring the radio. Dispatch had advised that several deputies were in a foot pursuit of a suicidal subject that was cutting his wrists. I heard Deputy Kelly advise the other deputies of the suspect's direction of travel, in the area of 187 Wilbur Rd., Thousand Oaks. I also heard Deputy Kelly advise the involved and additional responding Deputies that the suspect had an "exacto knife" in his hand. A short time later, I heard Deputy Kelly advise that shots had been fired and the subject was down. Dispatch advised that the incident had occurred in front of the "Daland Swim School" located at 135 E. Wilbur Rd., Thousand Oaks. Myself and several other detectives subsequently responded to the scene to assist in the investigation.

Upon my arrival, at 1745 hours, I parked my vehicle at 155 E. Wilbur Rd and proceeded to walk up the driveway, located on the west side of the building complexes located at 135, 145, and 155 E. Wilbur Road. I saw numerous patrol units parked on Wilbur Rd. I also noticed Sr. Deputies Camou and Streltzoff standing next to a marked patrol unit, that was parked in the driveway in front of 145 E. Wilbur Rd. (Glenn Oaks Apts.).

I continued up the driveway, where I saw Deputies Kelly, Kristol, Fuller and Blanck standing in the area of a male subject, later identified as (V) James Daniels, who was lying (face up) on the ground in front of 135 E. Wilbur Rd. (Daland Swim School). The medical personnel from AMR and the VCFD

(engine #30) where also at the scene. Captain Humphries, and Cozzens were on scene, as the Incident Commanders.

When I contacted Deputy Kelly he advised me that the AMR medical staff had pronounced Daniels as deceased. Deputy Kelly briefed me on the incident. Deputy Kelly stated that they had responded to a suicidal subject call at 'Stuft Pizza' located on Moorpark Rd. While searching the area, they saw Daniels and a foot pursuit ensued.

Deputy Kelly stated that during the pursuit, he had seen a knife in Daniels' hand and he was using it to cut his wrists. Kelly added that as the pursuit continued, Daniels had also been O.C.'d by Deputy Fuller. Deputy Kelly said that SR Deputy Welty had fired two rounds from the Less Lethal shotgun, but Kelly was unsure if Daniels was hit. Deputy Kelly said that Daniels had refused to comply with their commands to stop or drop the knife. As Daniels approached the front area of the Swim School, which was occupied by numerous children and adults, he was confronted by Sr. Deputy Camou, who subsequently fired several rounds from his handgun, striking Daniels. Refer to the additional supplemental reports for further details and statements.

I then directed Sr. Deputy Reilly to stay with Sr. Deputy Camou and the immediate crime scene was secured. After the arrival of additional personnel, I conducted several interviews. The following is a summary of the taped statements.

He said that he did not want to impose much more on his friends. James said that after being kicked out of the house, he was planning on going to a friend named house on Paige Lane. James was not sure of address. He said he had "crashed" there several times in the past and did not think it would be an issue coming over at such a late hour.

I asked James if he had ever been arrested. James said that he had been released from jail "two days ago." He said that he had spent several months in jail "on a violation." I asked James if he were still on probation. James thought he was no longer on probation because of the time he spent in jail. I ran a record check of James, which revealed he was on probation for 148.9 pc and petty theft. Dispatch further advised that James had search terms for stolen property.

I asked James if he had anything illegal on his person. James denied possession of any contraband and agreed to a search of his person. I conducted a search and found several pieces of paper with "Ventura County Sheriff" letterhead. The papers were an inventory of property booked into the county jail when James was arrested in January. There was a referral for a job search program and several other torn pieces of paper. There was one lighter, a jail issued toothbrush, and a double blade-shaving razor. The razor was in the plastic case. James said that his friend gave him the razor in order to shave. He forgot that he had it in his pocket when he left the house.

I asked James what he was going to do when he was finished talking with me. James said that he was going to go to his friend's house and sleep for a few hours. He said that he had an appointment with a "job counselor" in the morning and that he wanted to get a job. He said he had recently talked with his mother and she said that when he got a job, he could come and live with her.

I asked Jason if he had been using illegal narcotics. James said he had "not been high since before going to jail." I looked at James' eyes. His pupils were normal size, between 4.5 mm and 5.0 mm. They responded equally to light. James was lucid and answered all my questions quickly, with short concise answers.

After conducting the probation search, I filled out a field interview card on James and he continued on his way.

At about 0415 hours, I was driving in the parking lot of Stuff Crust Pizza, near the intersection of Pennsfield and Brazil. I saw James walking southbound towards me. James saw me, walked over to my patrol car and told me that his friend did not answer the door. I asked what he planned to do.

I immediately contacted Detective Gillette. Detective Gillette told me that Senior Deputy Camou was involved in a shooting and asked me to stand by with him. When I first contacted Senior Deputy Camou, he was visibly upset. I noticed that his right hand was slightly shaking and he was sweating. I asked Senior Deputy Camou if he was ok. Senior Deputy Camou nodded his head up and down to mean yes.

Senior Deputy Streltzoff drove Senior Deputy Camou to the East County Sheriff Station. I sat in the back seat of the unit. As we were leaving the area, I asked Senior Deputy Camou if was injured in any way. Senior Deputy Camou said, "No." I asked Senior Deputy Camou if there were any outstanding suspects. Senior Deputy Camou said, "No." I asked Senior Deputy Camou if anyone other than the suspect was injured. Senior Deputy Camou said, "I don't think so." I asked Senior Deputy Camou if the suspect had a weapon. Senior Deputy Camou said, "Yes." I asked Senior Deputy Camou if the weapon was secured. Senior Deputy Camou said, "I'm not sure." I contacted Detective Gillette and provided him with the above mentioned information.

During the ride to the station, I did not ask Senior Deputy Camou any additional questions. Senior Deputy Camou did mention to Senior Deputy Streltzoff that he was concerned about the safety of some children who were near a swimming pool. Senior Deputy Camou spontaneously said, "The guy wouldn't stop. Is Fuller ok, he had blood on him."

I asked Senior Deputy Camou the questions. Senior Deputy Camou said, "I think I fired five to eight shots, but I'm not sure." To the best of Senior Deputy Camou's knowledge, all of the shots hit the suspect or the block wall that was behind the suspect. Senior Deputy Camou said, "I put one of my keepers on the ground." Senior Camou explained that he put one of his keepers on the ground near the location that he fired his weapon from. Senior Deputy Camou gave me an FI card that he had in his pocket. Senior Deputy Camou told me that he spoke with the person on the FI'd card about the suspects actions. I relayed the information to Detective Gillette. Senior Deputy Streltzoff turned on the T.V. and we did not discuss the incident any further.

Captain Matson arrived at the East County Sheriff Station at approximately 1900 hours and spoke to Senior Deputy Camou. Approximately fifteen minutes later, legal counsel arrived and asked to speak with Senior Deputy Camou in private. At this time, Senior Deputy Streltzoff and I left the room. I booked the FI card that Senior Deputy Camou gave me into evidence at the East County Property Room.

About three minutes later I arrived at the Daland Swim School. I drove up the driveway and parked in front of the apartment complex south of the swim school. I saw deputies standing in the driveway next to a person lying on the ground. As I approached, I noticed Deputies Blanck and Kelley standing next to the person, who was motionless. Standing about ten feet away from the person was Senior Deputy Camou.

I asked Deputy Blanck which deputy fired his weapon. Deputy Blanck told me it was Senior Deputy Camou. I approached Camou and asked him if he fired his gun. He said he did. I noticed Camou's uniform shirt was soiled with soot, and it appeared he had been involved in a physical struggle. I asked Camou if he was hurt. He said he was not.

I asked Camou if he was the only deputy who fired his weapon. He said he was. I asked Camou which direction he fired his weapon. He pointed beyond the person and towards a block wall that was about five feet high. This wall is located on the west side of the driveway at the swim school. The rear of a shopping center is located on the other side of this wall. I contacted Senior Deputy Welty and asked him to go to the other side of the wall to check for stray bullets.

Captain Cozzens approached me and informed me of the need to start an incident log. I told Deputy Blanck to begin documenting names and times of personnel on scene, and to remain with Captain Cozzens.

I told Captain Cozzens that I was going to transport Camou to the East County Sheriff's Station so he would be sequestered. Camou and I stood outside of my patrol car for about ten minutes, since an ambulance was blocking our exit. I asked Camou if he needed anything. He asked for water. I provided Camou with a bottle of water from my patrol car.

As Camou held the bottle to his lips, I noticed his arm was shaking uncontrollably. I suggested to Camou that he call his wife to inform her of what happened. He asked me to call for him, as he did not want his wife to worry.

I called Camou's wife from my patrol car cell phone and informed her that Camou was okay, but that he had been involved in a shooting. I handed the phone to Camou, and asked him to talk to his wife. He spoke with his wife briefly.

While waiting for the ambulance to move, Camou made some unsolicited statements to me about the incident. Camou told me he chased the subject on foot from the area of Brazil Street. While chasing the subject, he (subject) stopped a few times and started "slicing" his wrist with an exacto knife. Camou chased the subject towards the Daland Swim School. Camou was concerned about the safety of the children who were at the swim school, and told the subject to stop because children were present.

At some point, Camou heard Deputy Kelley yell "shoot him." I later spoke with Deputy Kelley about this. Kelley stated that he told Senior Deputy Welty to shoot the subject with the less lethal shotgun.

The subject refused to stop, and said something to Camou. As the subject continued towards the school, Camou grew more concerned about the safety of the children. Camou yelled to the adults at the school to "get the children out of the pool."

Shortly afterwards, Camou fired several rounds from his firearm at the subject. Camou thought he missed the subject, as the subject did not seem to be affected. Camou fired two separate volleys of shots, totaling five to eight rounds.

Camou repeated over and over that he had to keep the subject from getting close to the children in the swim school.

After the ambulance moved, I drove Camou to the East County Sheriff's Station. Detective Reilly accompanied us in my patrol car.

Once at the station, we went into the kitchen lounge and watched TV. A short time later, a representative from VCDSA arrived to speak with Camou. At that time, Reilly and I left the lounge.

On 4-8-2003, at approximately 5:30 P.M., Capt. Fadler contacted me concerning an officer involved shooting that occurred in the city of Thousand Oaks and instructed me to respond to the location to assist in the investigation.

At approximately 6:15 P.M., I arrived at the crime scene, located near the intersection of East Wilbur Road and Pennsfield Street, in the city of Thousand Oaks. After checking in with the ICS command post, I walked north up a driveway to the shooting scene. While at the scene, fellow officers briefly advised that patrol officers responded to a call of a suicidal subject with a knife. When officers located him, the subject evaded officers on foot. A foot pursuit ensued. Responding officers attempted to apprehend the subject with the use of less-lethal means. As the pursuit continued, the subject was shot several times. The subject eventually died at the scene.

I was instructed to interview two of the officers involved in the foot chase. The following is a summary of a tape-recorded interview I had with the officers:

INTERVIEW DEPUTY DAVID BONEBRIGHT SERIAL # 2930 9G11

While at the scene, I initially conducted an interview at 6:43 P.M. with Bonebright inside my parked unit in the 100 block of East Wilbur Road. Deputy Bonebright is assigned to the East County Patrol Division, currently working shift 1 watch from 7 A.M. – 7 P.M. Bonebright was assigned to uniform patrol in a black / white patrol car as unit # 9G11. Bonebright was wearing the departmental issued uniform, with his badge and issued leather gear and handgun.

While at the City's Resource Center located at 1425 East Thousand Oaks Blvd, Bonebright heard a radio call of a suicidal subject in the area of Pennsfield and Brazil Streets. Dispatch described the subject as a white male, approximately 6 feet tall and 160 lbs with dark hair. Bonebright overheard 9I51 and 9R41 respond to the call. While monitoring the radio, Bonebright remained at the Resource Center to complete some reports. Shortly thereafter, he heard the units were in foot pursuit of the subject.

Deputy Bonebright responded to the scene. Bonebright traveled north on Hodencamp Drive and west on Wilbur Road. Bonebright parked along the north side of Wilbur Road at Laurie Lane. Bonebright remained in his vehicle and attempted to look for any activity. Bonebright did not see any activity. Shortly thereafter, he saw several units travel south on Laurie Lane from Wilbur Road. Bonebright followed the units. Then Bonebright heard that officers were in foot pursuit of the subject in the fields north of Wilbur Road. Bonebright returned to Wilbur Road and parked his unit in front of the Classic Cars building, facing westbound on Wilbur Road with his patrol unit's overhead emergency lights on. As Bonebright arrived at this location, he noticed Deputy Welty had also just arrived. Bonebright exited his unit and removed his less-lethal shotgun from the trunk. He noticed that Welty also had removed his less-lethal weapon from his trunk from his patrol car.

At this time in my interview, I told Bonebright we would exit my car and walk to the entrance of the driveway located west of the Oaks Plaza Professional Building, 186 E. Wilbur Road, and continue

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the interview. I turned off my recorder and walked Bonebright to the driveway. Upon arriving at the entrance of the driveway, I turned on my recorder again and continued with my interview with Bonebright as we walked through his movements that occurred during the incident.

Bonebright said he and Welty ran westbound on Wilbur Road. As they approached the driveway just west of the Oak Plaza located on the north side of Wilbur Road, Bonebright and Welty ran northbound on the driveway. Located on the west side of this driveway are tall bushes. Approximately 50 to 60 feet north of the entrance of this driveway is a large opening between the bushes. Bonebright and Welty ran through this opening and into a small open field located west and adjacent to this driveway. The field consisted of dirt and tall weeds (approximately one to two feet tall).

Bonebright and Welty ran through the field in a northwest direction. To the north of the field is the Glen Oaks Apartments and to the west of the field is a small parking lot. The parking lot is separated from the field by a brick wall. To the southwest is a two-story office building located at 155 E. Wilbur Road. Refer to attached diagram for details.

As Bonebright entered the field, he saw the subject sitting on the brick wall located in the northwest corner of the field with his legs over the west side of the wall, facing the parking lot with his back to Camou. Sr. Deputy Camou was standing approximately four feet east of the subject, telling the subject to get off the wall. Deputy Welty had moved west of Bonebright to the south end of the brick wall adjacent to the two-story office building. From Welty's location, one can see the small parking lot located on the west side of the brick wall. Bonebright was standing approximately in the center of the field facing the subject and Sr. Deputy Camou.

While standing in the field holding his less-lethal shotgun, Bonebright saw the subject jump off the wall and into the parking lot. The subject continued to run westbound through the parking lot. Bonebright ran toward the northwest corner of the field where the subject had jumped off the wall. At this time, Bonebright lost sight of Camou. As he ran to the northwest corner, Bonebright attempted to climb over the wall. Realizing the wall was too tall, Bonebright ran south to Welty's location. Wiley remained at the south end of the brick wall. As he approached Welty, Bonebright saw Welty shoot two less-lethal rounds at the subject as he ran west through the parking lot. Bonebright believed the

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subject was approaching the west end of the parking lot that leads into another long north-south driveway. Bonebright was unsure if the subject was hit with the less lethal. Bonebright saw the subject continue to run to the west end of the parking lot. The subject approached a driveway and then ran north on the driveway. Bonebright returned to the brick wall located at the northwest corner in an attempt to locate a section of the wall he could climb over. As he attempted to climb the wall, Bonebright noticed blood on the wall. Bonebright located another section of the wall approximately three feet away and climbed over the fence and continued westbound through the parking lot.

With his less-lethal still in his hand, Bonebright ran to the west end of the parking lot. When he approached the driveway, Bonebright ran northbound onto the driveway. As he began to run north, Bonebright saw the subject and Sr. Deputy Camou approximately a hundred feet ahead on the driveway. At this time, Bonebright was unaware of Welty's location.

While looking northbound, Bonebright saw the subject and Camou in the driveway, just south of the swim school, which was located on the east side of the driveway. It appeared that both the subject and Camou were parallel to one another. Sr. Deputy Camou appeared to be approximately ten feet away from the subject. Bonebright heard Camou yell at the subject to stop. Bonebright was focused on the subject and Camou and did not recall anyone else in the immediate area. Bonebright saw the subject was walking north on the driveway. Camou was east and parallel to the subject but facing the subject. On the east side and behind Camou was the swim school.

As Bonebright was running toward the subject and Camou, he considered using his less lethal, but felt he was too far away to get an effective shot. At the same time, he heard several shots. Bonebright believed that Camou had shot at the subject with less-lethal because he saw that the subject was still walking north on the driveway. As he approached the subject and Camou, Bonebright aimed his shotgun and attempted to shoot the subject with his less-lethal. When he pulled the trigger, Bonebright realized he forgot to rack a round in the chamber. Bonebright "quickly" racked a round into the chamber of his shotgun. At the same time, Bonebright saw the subject fall to the ground. Bonebright ran to the subject. The subject was lying on the ground; face down, with his hands under his body. The knife was found under his body. Shortly thereafter, paramedics arrived at the scene. During the entire incident, Bonebright did not hear the subject say anything.

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INTERVIEW JASON FULLER SERIAL # 2423 9R41

On 4-8-03, at approximately 7:35 P.M., I conducted a tape-recorded interview with Deputy Jason Fuller. Jason Fuller was dressed in a departmental issued uniform wearing his badge and issued leather gear and handgun. Fuller is assigned to the East County Patrol Division. Today, Fuller was assigned to work in the City of Thousand Oaks as unit # 9R41, driving a black/white patrol unit.

Just prior to the call of a suicidal subject via his police radio, Fuller was westbound on Thousand Oaks Blvd at Rancho Road, in the City of Thousand Oaks. When he heard the call of a suicidal subject at the pizza parlor located on Brazil and Pennsfield Streets, Fuller advised dispatch he was in the area and would respond. Fuller traveled north on Hodencamp Road, west on Wilbur Road to Pennsfield. Fuller continued southbound on Pennsfield to Brazil Street. Upon arriving in the area, Fuller noticed a citizen pointing toward the Biltmore Apartments, signaling that the suspect had gone to the apartment complex. The Biltmore Apartment Complex is located between Wilbur Road and Brazil Street, on the west side of Laurie Lane and east of Pennsfield.

Fuller turned east on Brazil to the apartment. Fuller turned north through the rear carport/parking area of the apartment. Fuller drove through the rear of the apartment complex to Wilbur Road, turned eastbound on Wilbur to Laurie Lane. Fuller traveled south on Laurie Lane to Brazil to the rear of the apartment complex again. He drove north through the same rear parking lot of the complex.

Upon driving northbound through the parking lot, Fuller saw Deputy Kelley and his trainee, walking northbound. At the same time, Fuller saw Sr. Deputy Camou enter the parking area from Wilbur Road and continue to drive southbound through this parking lot toward him.

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As Fuller entered into the parking lot, he saw the subject walk westbound into the parking lot from the apartments toward Camou. Deputy Kelley radioed Camou and identified the subject as the suicidal subject. Camou stopped his patrol car, exited his vehicle and attempted approach the subject. The subject immediately ran north through the parking lot, across Wilbur Road, and into a parking lot directly across the street located at 155 E. Wilbur Road. Sr. Deputy Camou, Deputies Kelley and Blanc ran after the subject. Fuller continued to drive through the parking lot, across Wilbur Road and into parking lot across the street in an attempt to catch up to the subject.

Upon entering the parking lot at 155 E. Wilbur Road, Fuller saw the subject turn his head around and look at him. Fuller immediately recognized the subject as a subject he had prior police contacts with. Fuller noticed the subject's left arm was bloody. Fuller had his unit's overhead emergency lights and siren on. Fuller saw the subject climb over a fence on the east side of the parking lot and into an open field. Once the subject climbed over the fence, Fuller lost sight of the subject. Fuller recalled the subject was a transient who he remembered had been sleeping behind a local nearby building on Hillcrest Drive. Fuller believed the subject was on probation for narcotic violations and petty theft. Fuller knew his mother lived in Thousand Oaks. Fuller was aware the mother has an active restraining order against the subject.

Adjacent to the parking lot (155 E. Wilbur Road) is a driveway that runs north south. Fuller continued to drive north on the driveway, passed the swim school to the end. Realizing the driveway was a dead end, Fuller turned around and drove south on the driveway to Wilbur Road. Fuller continued east on Wilbur Road to the Shadow Oaks Apartments. The Shadow Oaks apartments are located on the north side of Wilbur Road, approximately 300 feet east of the aforementioned driveway. Fuller entered another driveway located on the west side of the Shadow Oaks apartments, drove north to the rear of the apartments and stopped his patrol unit at the northwest corner of the complex.

Fuller exited his car and attempted to look for the subject. Fuller heard Camou's, Kelley's and possibly Mayo's portable police radios. Fuller believed the deputies were in some bushes south of his location along the west side of the driveway near the Edison Plant. While standing at the northwest corner of the Shadow Oaks apartment complex, Fuller described the northwest corner as having a

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small embankment with a chain-link fence that runs north south and adjacent to the driveway. To the west of the fence is an open field. Slightly south of the chain-link fence and along the west side of the apartment complex is a block wall that continues to the entrance at Wilbur Road. Fuller noticed the chain -link fence was pushed down where "people had jumped it" before. Fuller climbed onto the fence and attempted to look for the subject.

While standing on the fence, Fuller heard a deputy, possibly Camou, ask him if he could see the subject. The deputy was a short distance away and south of his location. At first, Fuller indicated he could not see the subject. Shortly thereafter, Fuller looked down and saw the subject "crouch down" on the ground. Fuller yelled, "There he is. I see him." The subject stood up and attempted to run past Fuller as Fuller stood on the fence.

Upon locating the subject, Fuller stated that Kelley and Mayo were approximately twenty feet south of the his location. Between Fuller and Deputy Kelley were "a whole bunch of bushes." Fuller believed the subject did not see him. The subject ran toward Fuller. As the subject ran past him, Fuller extended his left arm over the chain-link fence and grabbed the subject's jacket. As he grabbed the back of subject's jacket at the collar, Fuller stepped off the fence and pulled the subject against the west side of the fence. Fuller noticed the subject's left wrist was cut. Fuller saw the subject's left arm was "cover in blood." Fuller also saw the subject holding a gold and black pen knife in his right hand. Fuller yelled, "I have a hold of him."

While holding the subject, Fuller saw the subject cutting his left wrist with the knife, from wrist to elbow. Fuller said he "could see down to the bone." The subject did not say anything nor did the subject show any expression of pain. The subject was not breathing hard and just kept "looking at his arm, cutting it." The subject continued to cut his wrist. Fuller yelled at the subject, "Hey. You are not in trouble. We are here to help you." The subject continued to ignore Fuller. At that point, Fuller stated he was afraid the subject might cut him. While holding the subject with one hand, Fuller grabbed his gun and pointed it at him. Afraid that the subject might see his gun and force him to shoot him, Fuller returned his gun to his holster. Fuller stated, "At some point, I guess his left arm lifted up and I ended up with blood on my right....I don't know if he try to swing at me or if I blocked it, but his blood was on my right arm."

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After Fuller put his gun into his holster, the subject placed the knife into his mouth. The handle of the knife was placed in his mouth with the "blade end out." Then the subject attempted to unzip his jacket, possibly an attempt to escape. As the subject attempted to unzip his jacket, Fuller released the subject's jacket and tried to grab the knife from his mouth with his left hand. The subject immediately grabbed the knife and pulled it out of his mouth before Fuller could grab it. Fuller described the knife as a long black pen-like handle with a razor blade at the end of it.

After Fuller released him, the subject either crouched down or fell down and attempted to take his jacket off. Fuller removed his pepper spray from his belt and sprayed the subject on the side of the face. As soon as he sprayed the subject, Fuller was slightly affected from the pepper spray. Fuller stepped away from the chain link fence. At the same time, the subject stood and ran westbound through the field. Fuller told me the pepper spray appeared to not have affected the subject. At that time, Camou, Kelley, and possibly Mayo arrived at his location. Fuller told them the subject ran through the field. Fuller informed them "they needed less-lethal." Kelley asked if Fuller had less-lethal. Fuller replied he was not equipped with less-lethal. Mayo indicated he had less-lethal in his car that was parked on Wilbur Road.

Deputy Mayo then climbed over the chain-link fence and got into Fuller's parked patrol unit. Fuller also got into his patrol car. Fuller drove south (down) the driveway to Wilbur Road. Fuller turned west on Wilbur Road to Mayo's unit that was parked just west of the driveway. As Fuller approached Mayo's car, he saw Deputies Bonebright and Welty with their less-lethal weapons. Fuller parked his vehicle on Wilbur Road facing westbound. Fuller informed Bonebright and Welty, "If you guys see him you need to shoot him with that (less-lethal) because he is cutting himself."

While standing on the sidewalk near the entrance to the driveway at the Oaks Plaza Professional Building, Fuller saw Bonebright and Welty run north on the driveway and then run west into an open field. Further north of their position, Fuller saw the subject sitting on a brick wall near the northwest corner of this field. Then Fuller saw Deputy Kristol in front of him west on Wilbur Road. Fuller followed Deputy Kristol westbound Wilbur Road to the driveway located at 155 E. Wilbur Road. Both Kristol and Fuller continued north onto the driveway. As he ran onto the driveway and past the first building located at 155 E. Wilbur Road, Fuller saw the subject walking approximately fifty yards

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ahead of him near the swim school. To the east of the subject was Sr. Deputy Camou. Deputy Kelley was south of Camou. Deputies Bonebright and Welty were south of Kelley. As Fuller continued north on the driveway, he heard several pops. Fuller thought the pops were the sounds from the less-lethal weapon because he saw the subject still walking. Seconds later, Fuller heard another set of pops and saw the subject fall to the ground. Fuller continued north to the subject. When he got to the subject, Fuller realized the subject was shot. The subject was lying on his stomach. Shortly thereafter, paramedics responded to the scene.

When asked about the subject's mannerism, Fuller told me he was "shocked", in that, the subject did not say anything. Fuller told me he had a "hold of him and he did not look at me. He just took the knife in his right hand and started carving away....the incision (in his left arm) was pretty deep and pretty wide...I could see the bone." The subject did not say a word or show any expression as he continued to cut himself.

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On 4-09-03 telephoned me at East Valley. She told me that she is a family friend of James's mother. She said that she saw and spoke with James in the afternoon of 4-08 at the Von's Shopping Center on Janss and Moorpark Roads. She said that she was in her car and saw James on a bicycle in front of the store. He was by himself. She said that she has known James for the last couple of years. She said that she knew that James had some mental problems and in the course of their conversation asked him if he was taking his medication. She said that he was hesitant in his answer and said, "sort of." He asked her how his mother was. She went on and explained that his mother had to take firm steps against him because when he didn't take his medication he got irrational. She said that in the last instance at her apartment she was very frightened because he had broken into the apartment and destroyed some things. She said that she talked with him for a while (10-15 minutes) and he appeared to be ok, but that she thought that he was brooding over something. I asked if he sounded upset and she said no, but that he sounded despondent over something. She did not ask what was bothering him. He asked her if she could help him out with a few dollars, which she did give to him. She said that she asked if he had a place to stay. He nodded his head but didn't explain where.

She said James would eat at her house and would sometimes stay with them. I asked when was the last time James stayed at her house. She told me he stayed there the week prior to the shooting. about the note located in James' pocket and explained to her the note referred to her (by name), and the Days Inn. told me she did in fact stay at the Days Inn with a boyfriend and her child. At first she could not explain why James would have the note. Explained to me that she and James were just friends in that James was younger and she felt more like a mother or sister figure, rather than a girlfriend. went on to say she thought it was disturbing that James would have a note with her name on it. She added that the night before the shooting, had talked to her dad and James in that James had wanted to come to where she was staying. It told me she told James he couldn't come to where she was, due to the circumstances. also told me that during the above conversation, her uncle told James he couldn't stay at their house any longer, so offered to let James stay in her Cadillac

I asked about James' drug of choice. She told me it was usually "speed". also said she had seen James on it before. also thought that perhaps James may have taken "acid". She told me about a time when James "flipped out" and described to her that people were chasing him down and trying to get him with a knife. also added that at one time, James told her his mom tried to kill him or had other people trying to kill him. if these delusions were due to James' mental condition or were they drug told me she thought James was not on drugs all the time because he didn't have the money to buy them. did say she felt James' mental problems were a result of all

And yeah, he had - - he was moving over this way, towards the swim school and kind of towards us."

I asked if she thought anything when she observed James moving in this direction. said, "No, I figured the officers were right there, they'd take care of it, just get the kids down and out of the way." I confirmed that she recalled James taking steps towards the direction of the swim school.

said James was "definitely ignoring what (the deputies) were telling him to do." again confirmed that James had made movements that he was headed towards the swim school. said this occurred "early on", but after she "pulled the kids' attention away" she did not know what James did (i.e. "If he turned and faced the officers directly, if he kept moving this way."

I confirmed that she recalled hearing shots being fired. I asked if she witnessed the shooting occur, or if she just heard it. paused and asked her, "Didn't you say you ducked down?" said, "I ducked down, you know, as soon as the first - - as soon as I realized they were shooting. know what, and I did look back over this way (where James and the deputies were located) and very honestly I may have seen that, but I can't tell ya. I really can't tell ya. I just realized, 'Oh yes, this is the real Macoy. There is shooting going on. Guns are up, I'm hearing pops. Kids get down.' So I did, I had to have seen it. Officers were up with their guns when I heard the initial shooting and got them down. And then there was a series of shots, at least five, and we waited... 'till everything was quiet. But when I realized that, 'Yeah, this is real shooting going on, get down now.'"

I asked if the series of five was the second shots that she heard. The responded, "I would say, 'Yeah.'" said she did not count the number of shots fired in this series, but estimated that there were approximately "at least five" shots.

I started talking about what she observed after the shooting stopped. Said

James was on the ground and she thought his feet were towards their vehicle. She did not
know if he was lying face up or down. Said, "One of the officers kind of nudged

(James), to make sure that he was really down. They were all gathered around him. I waited
for just a moment, to make sure, 'Yeah, this situation is under control before I get these kids out
of this car', but I didn't pay real close attention to that. Again, I was focusing on, 'Get these kids
out of here so we have as little damage control as possible."

I asked if she saw anyone else, other than James and the deputies, either on foot or in a vehicle. Said she did not see anyone else. She said an "instructor" entered the business after her, claiming he was outside when the incident occurred. Said she was not aware of this subject's presence in the area, when this incident occurred.

I asked if she spoke with and/or after the incident took place.

made sure they were both "kinda okay." 

I asked if she recalled how many times she saw the wall get hit. Said, "Four, I think, about that many." I confirmed that she first saw the wall being hit by rounds and then she saw Daniels. I asked where Daniels was when she first saw him. Said, "He was more towards the wall, but about five feet away from the wall. So he was almost in the middle, but more towards the wall than the middle." I asked what direction Daniels was headed in when she saw him.

I confirmed that Daniels was approximately five feet from the wall when she saw him. I asked if Daniels was walking "up the driveway" and responded, "Yeah, like up, kinda up by all the cars." I commented on the locations where vehicles were parked at the swim school (i.e. where responded) is vehicle was parked and at the top of the driveway, where it the driveway turns east to allow north and south facing parking). I asked what parking area was Daniels walking towards. said, "He was just kind of walking straight, I don't think he was really heading for our car."

I asked what direction Daniels was facing when she first observed him and asked to demonstrate this for me. positioned herself in a direction that would have faced northbound. She bent over at the waist and held her arms up in front of her. had her elbows against her sides, her arms bent at approximate 45-degree angles, with her palms facing her body.

I asked about Daniels' arms. She said, "His hands looked kind of red so they looked kind of like they had been bleeding or something. I didn't really want to pay attention



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



She immediately looked down (through the open gate) and saw a subject lying on the ground. She saw four police officers in the driveway and two others a short distance away. She said that she still couldn't hear what was being said, but told me that the officers were talking. She said that she was frozen for a couple of minutes but saw the officers roll the subject over. A short time later the fire department arrived.

She told me that at the time of the incident there were about 60 kids at the swim club. She said that when she heard the shots and looked out she did not see any kids or parents in the driveway. I asked and she said that she did not see any inappropriate behavior by the officers following the shooting.

On 4/8/03 at approximately 1715 hours, I was driving southbound on S/R 23. I was monitoring the East County radio frequency and heard that patrol deputies were in foot pursuit in the area of Wilbur Road. I exited at Hillcrest Drive and began checking the area of Wilbur Road for the fleeing subject. Since I was driving an unmarked Blue Chevrolet, I felt that I would be able to see the subject and direct deputies to him without being recognized.

As deputies pursued the subject, I asked them to clarify the direction of travel on the radio. One deputy advised the subject was running in the area near the power plant north of Wilbur Rd. I remained on Wilbur and monitored radio traffic until I saw the subject running westbound across the access road to 135 Wilbur road. In an attempt to block any further westbound progress by the subject, I drove to the rear parking lot of the Pierce Brothers Mortuary at 101 Wilbur Rd. This parking lot is directly west of 135 Wilbur Road and is separated by a cinder block wall. After waiting for 10-15 seconds for the subject to jump over the wall, I heard numerous shots fired from the other side and immediately left the mortuary parking lot and drove up the access road to 135 Wilbur. I got out of my unit and observed deputies standing near James Daniels, who was lying face down on the pavement. One deputy grabbed Daniels by his ankles and pulled him approximately five feet. This movement caused a silver metal "exacto" type knife to roll out to the left from under the subject's torso. A deputy kicked the knife approximately 3-4 feet away from the subject. Deputies talked to the subject, called him James and told him numerous times to stay with us. He did not respond to their requests.

After seeing that sufficient deputies were with Daniels to assure he no longer presented a threat, I returned to my unit, which was parked approximately 50' south of Daniels and assumed command of the scene. Deputies were isolating the shooting scene with yellow evidence tape and I maintained contact with Watch Commander Captain Bob Lemay to insure that proper assistance units were responding and all required notifications were made. Capt. Harold Humphries arrived and assumed additional responsibilities. I remained on scene until approximately 2245 hours and released the scene to Major-Crimes detectives and Sgt. Herder.

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On 4-8-03, I was working patrol in the city of Thousand Oaks. At about 1/21 hours, I had just cleared a call in the area of Calle Jazmin and Calle Clavel.

I was stopped for the red light on Avenida De Los Arboles at Moorpark Road when I heard on my patrol unit's radio, deputies were in a foot pursuit with a suicidal subject. I decided to respond to the area to assist. I turned from Avenida De Los Arboles south onto Moorpark Road. I drove south on Moorpark Road until I reached Wilbur Road. I then turned east on Wilbur Road and drove into the Pavilion apartments. I estimated my response time was about four minutes.

On my patrol unit's radio, I heard a deputy (who I believe to be Deputy Fuller) who was in foot pursuit of the suicidal subject, advise that the subject had a "box cutter." I then heard someone request a "Less Lethal" weapon. The deputy in foot pursuit of the subject added his location was across Wilbur Road from my location.

I turned my unit around and exited the apartment complex. The deputy in foot pursuit of the subject advised the subject was now running south from an electrical power plant towards Wilbur Road along an access road. I exited my patrol unit and retrieved the "Less Lethal" weapon assigned to my unit The "Less Lethal" weapon is a modified Remington shotgun model 870. I loaded the weapon with five "bean bag" rounds and "charged" the weapon putting one round in the chamber. I saw Deputy Bonebright who had parked behind me, also had a "Less Lethal" weapon. I advised Dispatch that there were two "Less Lethal" weapons deployed on scene. Deputy Bonebright and I began walking towards the access road that leads to the power plant. I saw Deputy Kristol standing on the access road just north of Wilbur Road. I heard someone on my portable radio advise Kristol the subject wasn't going to stop for her. I saw Kristol run west from the access road across a vacant lot. I also began running towards the vacant lot. As I ran across the vacant lot, I saw the male subject, (P) James Daniels sitting on top of a stucco wall facing west. Daniels had his back towards Deputy Kelley and Senior Deputy Camou. I saw blood on Daniels' hands and arms. As I ran towards Daniels, I saw him with an object resembling a knife in his right hand. Daniels was moving this object in his hand in a manner that made it appear he was cutting his left wrist or forearm. As I ran towards Kelley, Kristol and Camou, I yelled "Less Lethal." I heard Deputy Kelley yell, "shoot him, shoot him!" Because of the close proximity of the deputies to Daniels, I did not aim my weapon at Daniels.

Daniels jumped down from the stucco wall and landed on the opposite side from us. I ran to the wall and saw Daniels running west across a parking lot approximately twenty-five yards from me. Daniels still had the object in his right hand and was moving the object in a manner that made it appear he was cutting his left wrist or forearm. I aimed my "Less Lethal" weapon at the waistline of Daniels and fired one round. I could not see where the round went and could not determine if it struck Daniels. After I fired the round, I "racked" the slide of the weapon towards me, causing the spent round to eject out of the weapon and then "racked" the slide away from me, loading another round into

forearm. I aimed my weapon at Daniels' waistline and fired a second round. I could not determine if the second round struck Daniels. At the time I fired the second round, I estimate the distance between Daniels and myself to be about 30 yards.

Daniels continued to run north on the access road. The distance between Daniels and myself was too far to effectively fire any more rounds. I saw Kelley running across the parking lot after Daniels. I was unable to jump the wall at my current location due to not enough room at the top of the wall. I ran to another area of the wall with more clearance for me to get over. I jumped up onto the wall and pulled myself up on top. I lost my balance and fell over backward. As I fell backward, I tried to stop myself by grabbing onto the wall with my right arm. I was unsuccessful in preventing myself from falling. As I fell to the ground, I struck my left calf on a corner of the wall. I got up and again tried to get over the wall. I pulled myself up and as I jumped down on the other side of the wall, I heard six to eight shots, which resembled that of gunshots. I ran across the parking lot and north on the access road. As I turned onto the access road, I saw Camou, Kelley, Kristol standing next to Daniels who was face down in the middle of the access road in front of Daland Swim School. There was blood on the ground next to and underneath Daniels. Kelley advised Dispatch there were "shots fired."

Fire and ambulance personnel were requested and responded. As fire personnel arrived on scene, I saw shell casings on the ground near me. I took out my Field Interview Cards and by folding them in half, I placed the cards next to the shell casings marking their location. I marked five or six different areas where I found casings.

Senior Deputy Streltzoff arrived to assist and requested I check the area west of the location of the shooting to ensure there was no harm done by any stray bullets. I checked the area and could not find any injury or damage that could have been caused by a stray bullet.

After checking the area, I secured my "Less Lethal" weapon in the trunk of my patrol unit. I did not remove any of the rounds from the chamber or magazine. I secured my patrol unit and assisted other deputies with locating the beanbag rounds I had fired as well as the casings. I located one of the casings on top of the wall next to some bushes.

I also assisted in setting up crime scene tape to mark off the area. I was then assigned to secure the scene on the access road leading to the power plant just north of Wilbur Road.

A short time later, Senior Deputy Davidson of the Major Crimes Unit, contacted me and conducted a tape-recorded interview of the incident. S.S.T. of the BI unit, responded to where my patrol unit was parked and took possession of the "Less Lethal" weapon I used in this incident. I was then relieved of my duties at the scene and driven to Los Robles Hospital where medical staff examined and treated my injuries. I

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



On 04/08/03, I was working uniform patrol and assigned to the county area as 4E11. At about 1715 hours, I responded to the area of Brazil Street and Laurie Lane, reference a report of a suicidal subject. My response was self-initiated, and was in an effort to assist as a Crisis Intervention Team Member.

I arrived on scene, and drove northbound on Laurie Lane towards Wilbur Road. When I reached Wilbur Road, I saw Sheriff's units (I believe two) to my left, crossing Wilbur Road, approaching businesses located in the one hundred block. I believed Deputies had chased the subject across Wilbur Road and into one of the businesses.

I continued across Wilbur road (northbound) and entered the driveway of "Classic Limousine Service" located at 199 Wilbur Road. I drove my unit to the end of the driveway, which ended at a dirt embankment covered with tall bushes, and a six to seven foot chain link fence. This area is flanked on the west by car garages (running north and south), and on the east by a six to seven foot block wall (running north and south). I exited my vehicle and attempted to establish a position east of where I had last seen Deputies drive their units.

Approximately 30-45 seconds passed when I observed a subject in dark clothing, north of my position, approximately forty feet away. The subject was on the north side of the chain link fence, running from west to east. Due to the density of the bushes, I was unable to identify who the subject was, but believed him to be the suicidal subject. He was running on the opposite side of the fence, and I was unable to make contact with him.

Sr. Deputy Camou and Deputy R. Kelley arrived at my location on foot and I advised them where I had just seen the subject. We proceeded to walk east through the bushes following the fence line. The fence ended approximately four feet from the block wall on the west, and then continued north. This allowed us to walk northward between the fence and the wall.

As we walked, I heard Deputy Kristol (9A) ask via radio, our location. I advised her we were at the northwest corner of the Shadow Hills apartments. We continued walking northward between the wall and fence, when I heard a yell from an unknown person. I ran about 30 feet, and came out into an opening. The wall that had been on my right side (west side) had become a chain link fence. I saw Deputy Fuller standing on the opposite side of the fence with his vehicle parked behind him. His location was the west side of the Shadow Hills Apartments (211 Wilbur Road). Deputy Fuller stated the subject had run back in the opposite direction (east) from our current location.

I climbed over the fence to where Deputy Fuller stood. I got into the back of his unit, and directed him to drive his vehicle, to where mine was parked so I could retrieve my less-than-lethal shotgun. Fuller drove me to my unit and I retrieved my less-than-lethal shotgun.

I held my position outside my vehicle thinking the subject may head in my direction. Approximately one to three minutes passed. I got inside my vehicle and drove back down the driveway to Wilbur Road. I saw additional units and Deputies to the west of my location parked on the north side of Wilbur Road, and drove to their location. I parked my vehicle behind the units, and exited my vehicle holding my less-than-lethal shotgun. I was advised by Sr. Deputy Hartkop that a less-than-lethal weapon was already on scene.

I placed the weapon back inside the trunk of my vehicle. I walked to the driveway leading towards "Daland" Swimming School and saw four to five Deputies standing near a subject lying on the ground. As I began walking towards the Deputies, Sr Deputy Hartkop told me to advise them (the Deputies) to began a crime scene log. I was than approached by Sr. Deputy Welty who told me a log had already been started. Sr. Deputy Welty directed me to contact those persons in the swim school who may have witnessed the incident, and to began interviewing them. A witness had stated they had seen a white male, wearing a black sweatshirt and black jeans, cut his wrist with a knife and run into the Biltmore Apartments.

Deputy Kelley and Deputy Blanck arrived and assisted in the search of the subject. They parked their patrol unit on Laurie Lane and searched the apartment complex on foot.

I drove around the area of the Biltmore Apartments and attempted to locate the subject for approximately 5 minutes. I turned north into the west parking lot of the apartment complex. I saw Deputy Kelley and Deputy Blanck in front of me, walking northbound in the parking lot. I saw Senior Deputy Camou turn southbound into the parking lot from Wilbur Road.

I continued to drive north towards Camou. I saw the subject, James Daniels, walk out of the apartment complex into the parking lot just east of Camou's patrol vehicle. Kelly and I told Camou, over the radio, that the subject was next to him. Camou exited his patrol vehicle and confronted Daniels. Daniels ran northbound across Wilbur Road and a foot pursuit ensued. (W-1)is a swimming instructor at Daland swim school, which is located at this stated he was standing at the end of the driveway of the business at about 1730 hours. He was standing at Wilbur Road when he saw a male subject wearing dark clothes being chased by officers. The subject had "Red" covering his hands. The subject and then jumped over a nearby wall. immediately concerned that the subject would run into the swim school. He stated he was concerned the subject would harm one of the school employees or one of the children. He estimated there were approximately one hundred children in, or around the swimming pool. returned to the school and told the employees and children to get out of the swimming area and go inside the classroom. stated he he returned to the parking area in front of the business and noticed the subject was walking from a rear parking area that was adjacent to the business. As he watched, the subject walked down the driveway from the rear parking area of the business towards Wilbur Road, with Deputies following told me he saw the Deputies had their guns drawn and were repeatedly telling the subject to "Put the knife down." went back inside the school and continued to get students inside the classroom, and out of the swimming area. He returned outside to the parking area, and saw the subject was now approaching the business with Deputies behind him. Deputies continued to tell the subject to "Stop, put down the knife, and don't walk any further." watched, he saw the subject get shot in the arm. He believes he heard six shots,

He saw a young kid cutting, jabbing, or slicing his left forearm or wrist area and the subject was bleeding. told the subject to stop (the cutting). The subject replied, "Leave me alone."

The subject ran through the plant hedges on the north side of the shopping center driveway and to the parking lot area of the abandoned restaurant across the street (North side of Brazil street).

and his assistant manager, kept watch on the subject. followed the subject through the parking lots and bushes of buildings located on Pennsfield Place. sent his assistant manager back to care for the restaurant. At one point, lost the subject. flagged down one of his driver's, and told him to drive the area to relocate the subject. stated never saw the subject. saw the subject again in the alley of the Biltmore Apartments. The subject continued slicing at himself as he eluded thought the object the subject was using to cut himself with was possibly an X-Acto knife. Deputies eventually located the subject at the north end of the Biltmore apartments near Wilbur Road.

stated she was having dinner when she saw a young man in the shopping center driveway. The subject walked westbound in the shopping center driveway; he then walked back eastbound. The subject then sat on a curb on the north side of the driveway. The subject used a key or a knife and was gouging into the veins of his hands. The subject stood up and would shake (his hand) and saw a considerable amount of blood on his hands. The subject continued gouging and they called 911. The subject did not appear to be upset and estimated she saw the subject gouge himself approximately six times.

added that the subject had a glazed look on his face. When the subject was seated on the curb gouging himself, he was so agitated that thought he had committed a crime and was remorseful and he was trying to hurt himself to make up for it.

I conducted four interviews in the area of the aforementioned driveway (refer to additional names report). The interviews were recorded on one cassette tape and the tape will be delivered to West County Major Crimes. The interviewees pointed out areas of the shopping center driveway while they explained what they saw. The following is a synopsis of the interviews (for specifics, refer to audio tape):

Interview of Witness """

and The left the area before our officers arrived on scene). saw a young boy in the driveway north of Stuft Pizza; he was hacking/digging at his left wrist with an unknown type object. saw blood dripping off of his hands. At approximately 1703 hours called 911 to report the incident. The manager of Stuft Pizza exited the restaurant and spoke to the subject who walked away (eastbound) from the area. The subject walked across the street (northbound across Brazil Street) in the direction of the 7-11 store (Pennsfield Place and Wilbur Road).

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For background information refer to original incident and associated narrative reports.

On April 8, 2003, I was working a plainclothes investigations assignment out of the East Valley Sheriff's Station. At approximately 1745 hours I arrived at 135 East Wilbur Road. Detective Gillette briefed me on the incident and I subsequently responded to Stuft Pizza, 398 North Moorpark Road, the scene of an apparent attempt suicide. Deputies Hartkop and Ashmore were on scene.

Stuft Pizza is located in the Best Buy Shopping Center situated on the southeast corner of Moorpark Road and Brazil Street, Thousand Oaks. The North wall of Stuft Pizza faces Brazil Street.

A shopping center driveway is located between the Stuft Pizza north wall and Brazil Street.

Blood spatters were present in the aforementioned driveway. Hartkop and Ashmore secured the driveway area and interviews were conducted of several Stuft Pizza employees and customers (Refer to Ashmore's reports for details). Bureau of Identification responded and processed the scene.

He told me that when they arrived, he asked one of the Deputies (unk. which) what happened. He was told Daniels had sustained several gunshot wounds. Next, I asked if he talked to any of the bystanders, while at the scene. He told me he did not. did add that later that same night, his unit returned to the scene and washed it down. Shortly after this, I concluded my interview with The above interview was tape-recorded and the above is a synopsis of that conversation. It is not verbatim. Refer to tape for additional details.

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Thousand Oaks. Sgt. Montagna asked me to respond to the incident.

Upon my arrival, I received a general synopsis of what happened, from Det. Mark Gillette. Sgt. Tim Lorenzen asked that I interview Deputy Roger Kelley.

The below listed statement is a synopsis of the interview I had with Dep. Kelley. Our conversation was tape-recorded. For further details refer to the cassette tape. The tape was given to the case agents, Tim Lorenzen and Rob Davidson for their case file.

Dep. Kelley told me that his shift started at 1430 hours. Dep. Kelley is currently partnered up with Deputy Daniel Blanc, who is a trainee. Dep. Kelley said they were over at the Westlake Hyatt when the call pertaining to this incident came out

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over the radio. Dispatch advised of a suicidal subject, man with a knife, who was seen cutting himself. Dispatch further stated the subject was behind Stuff Crust Pizza. Dep. Kelley told me Stuff Crust Pizza is located in the 400 block of Moorpark Road. Stuff Crust Pizza is located near Best Buy. As Deputies Kelley and Blanc proceeded towards the call, dispatch further advised that the subject had left the area of Stuff Crust Pizza and was walking north on Pennsfield towards 7-11, which is located on the corner of Wilbur and Pennsfield.

Deputy Kelley said they exited the 101 freeway at Moorpark Road and made a right on Brazil Street. Deputy Kelley said there were four people standing on the corner of Brazil near Stuff Crust Pizza flagging them down. One witness told deputies that he saw the subject in question sitting behind Stuff Crust Pizza, cutting himself with a knife. The witness pointed the direction the subject was last seen walking. The witness indicated that he went north on Pennsfield and then made a right (east) onto Wilbur Road towards the apartment complex located at Wilbur and Laurie Lane.

Deputies Kelley and Blanc parked their patrol unit on Laurie Lane and began walking on foot in the apartment complex. As they were parking their unit, Dep. Kelley heard Sr. Camou put out on the radio that a witness told him (Camou) that the subject was seen walking into the Laurie Lane apartment complex. Dep. Kelley pointed out that the apartments are adjacent to Stuff Crust Pizza.

Deputies Kelley and Blanc traveled eastbound on Brazil and then northbound onto Laurie Lane. They parked approximately 200 yards north of Brazil on Laurie Lane. Dep. Kelley and Blanc got out of the unit and began to walk through the

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apartment complex. They ran into a couple of people in the complex and asked them if they saw anybody that matched the description of the subject. Nobody admitted to seeing him and one of the potential witnesses told Dep. Kelley that another deputy asked him the same question. Deputies Kelley and Blanc split up at one point during the search looking for the subject, but eventually they both ended up at the western most part of the driveway in the apartment complex that parallels Pennsfield. They walked northbound on the driveway towards Wilbur Road, when they saw Sr. Dep. Camou. Sr. Dep. Camou, who was in his patrol car, pulled into the apartment complex driveway facing southbound.

Dep. Kelley said suddenly he saw a subject matching the description given, come up to the left side of Camou's patrol vehicle. Dep. Kelley notified Sr. Dep. Camou that the person in question was to the left of him. Dep. Kelley said it appeared that both of them looked at one another and at that point the subject, later identified as James Daniels, turned away from Camou and started walking fast or running. Dep. Kelley said that he and his trainee were quite a distance away from Camou. Dep. Kelley said Camou exited his patrol vehicle and began chasing James. Dep. Blanc, who was approximately thirty yards in front of Kelley, began to follow Camou.

Dep. Kelley said since he was a good distance behind them he ran up to Camou's patrol vehicle and drove it towards where he thought they were running. Dep. Kelley said he last saw Camou, Blanc and James going towards the north side of the street on Wilbur Road. By the time that Dep. Kelley got into Camou's vehicle he lost sight of the exact direction they went. Dep. Kelley turned the vehicle around and drove to the rear parking lot of the Roche Property Management

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located at 187 Wilbur. As Dep. Kelley began to drive towards the rear of the parking lot he noticed James, as he was walking towards the rear of the business, in the culvert, behind several bushes.

Dep. Kelley said he saw James walk fairly quickly, but he was unable to tell if he had anything in his hands. Dep. Kelley got out of his car and looked in the direction where he saw James walking, but he was unable to locate him. Dep. Kelley said that he believes he advised dispatch that James was walking behind the 187 Wilbur address in the culvert.

Dep. Kelley said he couldn't see Blanc or Camou, but he could hear them on the east side of the Classic Limousine Service building at 199 E. Wilbur, which is the business just east of 187 Wilbur. Dep. Kelley showed me the area where he parked and got out of the patrol car. Just behind the Classic Limousine building there were numerous tall bushes. I was unable to see beyond these bushes without physically climbing up a retaining wall located north of the parking lot at 187 E. Wilbur. Upon climbing up the retaining wall you have a view of the area behind the bushes and you can clearly see the Edison plant, which is fenced in.

Dep. Kelley said he had his gun drawn prior to climbing up the retaining wall because he didn't know if James might be hiding in the bushes. Dep. Kelley said he and the other deputies scanned the bushes looking for the subject. Kelley was unable to see a knife in his hand because he was too far away to see. He demonstrated to me how far away he was when he first caught sight of James behind the bushes. I estimated the distance to be approximately forty yards.

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Dep. Kelley said he heard Dep. Fuller say that he was "up here" alongside the brick wall. Dep. Kelley showed me the area that Fuller was talking about. I noted this to be east of the Classic Limousine Service along the brick wall, which separates the Limousine Business from the Shadow Oaks apartment building. The dirt path that James walked was on the Edison property, just east of the plant. According to Dep. Kelley, Dep. Fuller was standing on the fence line on the east side. He was on the property of the Shadow Oaks apartment. The fence was approximately six feet in height. James was on the west side of the fence. At the top of the fence, just north of the retaining wall, there is a hole at the top of the fence. Dep. Kelley could hear Fuller either on the radio or yelling it out to the deputies in the area that "he's cutting himself, he's cutting himself, he's got a knife."

Dep. Kelley said he, Camou and Blanc began to follow James on the same dirt path, east of the Edison plant in an effort to catch up with him. Dep. Kelley said that Blanc was leading, followed by Camou and then Kelley. Dep. Kelley was yelling to Blanc, "If you can, OC him." Dep. Kelley said Blanc was unable to OC James because he (Blanc) didn't know his (James) location.

Dep. Kelley said he could smell OC emitting in the air when he got to the area where the hole was in fence. He believed this was from when Dep. Fuller tried to OC James and where he (Fuller) tried to restrain James. Dep. Kelley could recall that Fuller said something to the effect of, "I sprayed him, but it didn't do any good."

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Dep. Kelley showed me the area they went next. Just beyond the dirt path along the east side of the Edison plant is an open field with several trees and bushes. The brush is thick to walk through. North of the field is a fence line and beyond the fence line are backyards belonging to the homes located on Galsworthy Street.

Dep. Kelley said he, Blanc and Camou saw James when they got to the open field. They were repeatedly telling him to drop the knife. Dep. Kelley said he was able to recognize James from having past contacts with him and Kelley was using James' name when giving him instructions. Dep. Kelley said even prior to this, he thought he knew who the subject was because Fuller either yelled it out loud or said on the radio that the subject was the guy that lives on Los Feliz and his mom has a restraining order against him. Dep. Kelley said from hearing this, he realized that it was James they were dealing with.

Dep. Kelley said he is aware that James is normally on some type of psych. medication, but he couldn't remember what it was for. Dep. Kelley said he has dealt with James in the past, as James' mother, reported him as a runaway, which mainly occurred when James went off his medication. Kelley recalled one incident when James mixed alcohol with his medication, which made the situation even worse. James was yelling at

Dep. Kelley said that James has been arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance. On one occasion, Dep. Kelley recalled that James upset to the point that she was transported to the hospital by ambulance, as she complained of chest pains.

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Upon James turning eighteen was unable to tolerate his behavior any longer and told him that he couldn't come back to the house. Dep. Kelley said later that evening after she told him not to come back to the house, James returned and deputies responded. James was arrested for trespassing, as he broke into the house. Dep. Kelley thought the incident occurred approximately six months ago. James has also violated the court order, which restrains him from entering or being near the house. Dep. Kelley described James stating that when James drank alcohol he became verbally abusive towards and would tell her that he could do what he wants. Dep. Kelley couldn't recall a specific time that he ever placed James on a 5150 hold.

Dep. Kelley reflected back to when he, Blanc and Camou were in the field with James. Dep. Kelley said while they were in the field he could see James repeatedly cutting himself with the knife. James didn't even appear to flinch while he was doing this. Dep. Kelley described James as being in a trancelike state and that anything somebody said or did wouldn't have any effect on him.

Dep. Kelley said James walked towards the fence line (along the backyards of Galsworthy) in a northwest direction. At one point, Kelley recalled that James tried to get over the fence. He thought he took his sweatshirt off and hung it on the fence. We walked in the vicinity of that area and I noticed a black sweatshirt hanging on the fence. Dep. Kelley thought it was James' sweatshirt. Kelley said when James tried to get over the fence that was the first time he saw the knife. Kelley couldn't recall if the knife was in James' mouth or if he had it in his hand when he tried to climb the fence, but he remembered blood was on the knife.

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The deputies kept yelling at James to drop the knife. James yelled back at them, "Just shoot me." Dep. Kelley recalled that James said this on one occasion. Dep. Kelley could see that James' arm was bloody and he kept using the knife to slice his arm. Dep. Kelley noticed that James was carrying the knife in his right hand and cutting his left arm. Dep. Kelley could clearly see that it was an exacto knife, as he recognized the blade on the knife.

James continued walking southwest in the field with the deputies following him approximately fifteen feet behind. Dep. Kelley asked Dep. Fuller if he had less lethal, but Dep. Fuller said that he didn't. Dep. Kelley instructed Dep. Fuller to have somebody respond that had less lethal and to put out the direction in which they were heading.

Dep. Kelley took me near the area where they walked and said that they first thought James was going to hop the fence. Dep. Kelley removed his baton from the holder, as he thought he might be able to get close enough to hit James with it and subsequently get the knife out of his hand. As Dep. Kelley began to approach him, James proceeded to walk south towards a dirt path along the fence line.

On the other side of the fence was the apartment complex, where James eventually was shot. Also, on the west side of the fence was a pool center. Kelley said that James continued to walk on the west side of the Edison plant. I noticed that west of the Edison plant was a narrow dirt path that was just wide

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enough for one person to walk. West of the path was fully grown ivy and then trees that were set up near the fence.

We walked along the pathway, but in the ivy, so as not to disturb the crime scene where James and the deputies previously walked. Kelley told me that James walked along the dirt path. I saw several blood drops along the dirt path and on the concrete enclosure of the Edison plant. One portion of the pathway was damp and it covered approximately two feet of the dirt pathway. I noticed two sets of footprints facing south. One set appeared to be from a boot and the other set tennis shoes. Dep. Kelley said while walking towards the dirt path he recalled updating dispatch with their location. Dep. Kelley attempted to get somebody positioned on the south side of the plant that had less lethal. He advised radio that they (deputies) were right behind James in the event they were able to have a deputy respond that had a less lethal shotgun.

Dep. Kelley indicated that when they were about halfway down the dirt path they could hear kids in the swimming pool west of them. The kids appeared to know that something was going on. Dep. Kelley surmised this was the case because they (deputies) were yelling at James to stop and drop the knife. Sr. Dep. Camou yelled at the kids to get out of the pool and get inside.

At the end of the dirt path was a blacktop driveway. This was south and slightly west of the Edison plant. Dep. Kelley said that James continued south on the blacktop. Dep. Kelley was approximately twenty yards behind him. Kelley noticed that Dep. Kristol was at the very south end of the driveway with her gun drawn. He doesn't recall hearing Dep. Kristol say anything. Dep. Kelley showed me

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where they walked along the blacktop for a short distance when James turned into an opening in the trees, which were west of the blacktop.

Upon entering the area just west of the trees was another open field. West of the field was a parking structure and a retaining wall approximately four feet high. Dep. Kelley said he, Blanc and Camou followed James into the open field. Dep. Kelley was the first one to follow James through the trees. James briefly sat on the retaining wall. Dep. Kelley remembered that James was turned away from them and Kelley could clearly see that James still had the knife in his right hand. Dep. Kelley had his stick out and he was going to see if he could knock the knife out of his hand. He didn't want to hit him in the head because he knew that it would probably just make him angry. Kelley remembered that James cut himself with the knife a couple more times. Dep. Kelley said that James kept the knife away from him (Kelley) in a way that the only possibility of getting the knife from him would be by hitting James in the head with his baton. About the time that Dep. Kelley was thinking this, James jumped off the wall.

Dep. Kelley saw Sr. Dep. Welty running in their direction. Dep. Kelley specifically remembered him because he knew that Welty had the less lethal shotgun. Dep. Kelley called Welty up to his location. Welty positioned himself south of where Kelley was standing, approximately ten feet away. Dep. Kelley said James continued to walk west through the parking lot.

Sr. Dep. Welty shot him twice with the less lethal shotgun. Dep. Kelley showed me where Welty was standing when he shot James with the less lethal shotgun. I estimated it to be approximately twenty-five yards. Sr. Dep. Welty was shooting

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from behind the retaining wall. Dep. Kelley said he couldn't tell if James was hit by the beanbags, but if he was, he didn't show any indication of being hit, such as flinching or falling. Dep. Kelley said that James was moving the entire time. Dep. Kelley was of the belief that James didn't get hit. After Welty fired the less lethal shotgun, Dep. Kelley advised deputies in the area that it was a beanbag to ensure there wasn't any sympathetic fire.

Dep. Kelley said that he, Blanc and Camou went over the retaining wall and followed James northbound through the apartment complex parking lot. East of the parking lot is the pool center.

Dep. Kelley said they were walking approximately fifteen feet behind James and they were all walking at a fairly fast pace. Dep. Kelley thought that James was walking in the middle of the driveway. Dep. Kelley continued to yell at James to drop the knife, but he said it looked like it was going in one ear and out the other. Dep. Kelley is certain that James could hear what was being said to him. From having past contacts with him he knows that there isn't a problem with James' hearing.

Dep. Kelley said that he has had contacts with James in the past, when James has been sober and when he has been drunk, or under the influence of a controlled substance. Kelley felt that James' behavior this time was different than any other time he has ever seen him. Dep. Kelley felt there was something different going on in James' head than ever before. Kelley felt that James was focused on doing whatever he (James) planned.

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Dep. Kelley took me to the area where the shooting occurred. He showed me the positions they were in at the time. Sr. Dep. Camou was standing to James' right approximately fifteen feet away. Dep. Kelley said that Sr. Dep. Camou was yelling for James to stop. Sr. Dep. Camou had his gun drawn, however, Dep. Kelley didn't. Dep. Kelley couldn't recall if Dep. Blanc had his gun out or not. Dep. Kelley demonstrated to me that he was standing approximately five feet away from Sr. Dep. Camou and Dep. Blanc was standing further down the driveway, approximately five to seven feet away from Dep. Kelley.

Dep. Kelley demonstrated that Sr. Dep. Camou moved forward, which showed me that Sr. Dep. Camou was moving closer to the entrance where the pool is located. Upon Sr. Camou moving forward he made the comment to James, "Look, I can't let you go in there. I can't let you go there." Sr. Dep. Camou moved his position again to where he was almost directly aligned with James. Dep. Kelley demonstrated that he was just a few feet further down the driveway from where James was standing. The deputies kept moving as James moved.

Dep. Kelley said after Sr. Dep. Camou told him, "I can't let you go in there," Sr. Camou "took a couple of shots at him." Dep. Kelley thought Sr. Dep. Camou fired two or three rounds. Dep. Kelley said he thought that one of them hit the retaining wall west of their location. Kelley said that he couldn't really tell because James didn't really do anything. Dep. Kelley said that James kept moving forward. Dep. Kelley said he was slightly hunched over.

Dep. Kelley stated that they all moved forward when James moved forward. Dep. Kelley said he could hear James moaning. He said that Sr. Dep. Camou

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continued to align himself with James. Sr. Dep. Camou then fired the second volley of shots. Dep. Kelley estimated that Sr. Dep. Camou fired his gun a total of seven to eight times. Dep. Kelley said that James fell down at this point. James fell on his stomach with his right hand underneath him and his left arm extended exposing the slits that he made on his arm with the knife. Deputy Kelley said that he was still making some breathing noises. Dep. Kelley said they waited for a minute and kept a hold of James because they didn't know the location of the knife. Dep. Kelley put gloves on and he pulled James body down the driveway by grabbing him by the ankles. Dep. Kelley said as soon as the right hand was exposed, he could see the knife that James was holding. The knife was kicked away from James towards the retaining wall, west of the driveway.

I asked Dep. Kelley about James' movements towards the pool. Dep. Kelley said he didn't notice James walking towards the pool entrance. He said that James was walking straight.

I asked him what he thought Sr. Dep. Camou meant by stating, "I can't let you go in there." Dep. Kelley said he thought that Sr. Dep. Camou was talking about the pool entrance and that he didn't want James to go in there.

Dep. Kelley said that he was able to see the knife in James' hand while they were confronting him in front of the pool entrance. I asked him how he was holding the knife. Dep. Kelley said that he couldn't remember if he was holding the knife to his side or if he had it at his left wrist. Dep. Kelley said James didn't have it in an overhand motion.

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I asked Dep. Kelley if he ever removed his gun during this confrontation. Dep Kelley said that he didn't.

I asked Dep. Kelley if James ever said anything during the entire incident. Dep. Kelley said the only time James said anything to them was when he told them to "just shoot me."

I clarified with Dep. Kelley, Sr. Dep. Camou's knowledge of the kids being at the pool. Dep. Kelley said, earlier, when he was giving the location of the direction that James was walking he put it out on the radio (when they were in the area of the pool just west of the Edison plant). Dep. Kelley heard Sr. Dep. Camou yell out to the kids, "Get out of the pool. Get out of the pool, it's the cops, get out of the pool."

Dep. Kelley said that James never said or did anything to threaten them (deputies) with the knife nor did he feel that he was close enough to be threatened by James. Dep. Kelley went on to say that the training he (Kelley) received, such as suicide by cop, made Dep. Kelley feel that James was determined to accomplish his mission.

I asked Dep. Kelley what happened to Sr. Dep. Welty, who had the less lethal shotgun. Dep. Kelley said after he (Kelley) hopped over the retaining wall, he never saw Sr. Dep. Welty again until after the shooting incident. Deputies Bonebright and Mayo, who also carry less lethal shotguns, were too far away at the time of incident.

I concluded my conversation with Dep. Kelley.

INTERVIEW OF DEPUTY MICHELLE KRISTOL

On 04/08/03, at approximately 1931 hours, I conducted a tape-recorded interview of Deputy Kristol #3285 regarding this case. Below is a synopsis of this interview. For further details, refer to the audiotape containing the recording of this interview.

Dep. Kristol had been on another call for service, along with Senior Deputy Welty #3075. They heard the "foot pursuit go out" and responded to the area, each in separate units. As they drove eastbound on Wilbur Rd, from southbound Moorpark Rd, she heard Deputy Mayo #2883 advise, over the radio, the location of the foot pursuit. Dep. Mayo described this area as "behind the wash, behind the apartments...Shadow Hills."

Dep. Kristol was familiar with the area Dep. Mayo was referring to. She parked her unit in the west driveway of the business complex located at 187 Wilbur Rd. (NOTE: The driveway Dep. Kristol used can be used to enter the parking lot area of 187 Wilbur Rd. This driveway also connects to a long driveway, running northbound, which leads to a fenced off power plant area.) One of the deputies, who was at the north end of the driveway that leads to the entrance to the power plant, saw her.

Dep. Kristol exited her vehicle and saw a subject, (P-2) James Daniels, at the north end of the driveway area. Dep. Kristol could not identify who this subject was. An unknown deputy yelled to her, "Stay there, he's comin' right to you."

Dep. Kristol saw Daniels "run around the corner" and was "about ¼ of the way (down) the driveway" towards her location. Dep. Kristol knew from the call that Daniels was in possession

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of "some type of a knife and he's suicidal." Dep. Kristol could see approximately three deputies following behind Daniels, "with about a five foot gap."

Daniels was running towards the west side of the driveway, "by himself." Dep. Kristol drew her handgun and yelled for the subject to "Stop", approximately "four times." Deputy Kelley #3033 yelled to her, "Michelle, he's not gonna stop, he's not gonna stop."

Daniels looked up at Dep. Kristol and saw that she was pointing her handgun at him. Daniels responded by running westbound through the bushes, located on the west side of the driveway, and into a field, located to the rear of 301 Wilbur Rd.

I asked Dep. Kristol if she saw that Daniels had anything in his hands. She responded, "Nothing in his hands."

As Daniels ran through the bushes, the deputies behind Daniels followed him. Dep. Kristol ran into the field, via an opening in the tree line on the west side of the driveway. Dep. Kristol ran northwest through this field. She put her handgun away and took out her baton.

Dep. Kristol saw Daniels running westbound through the field, with deputies following him. Kristol continued to run northwest through the field, towards Daniels, with Deputy Fuller #2423 behind her.

There is a wall that runs along the east side of the north parking lot of the business complex located at 155 Wilbur Rd. This wall separates the field, located to the rear of 301 Wilbur, from this parking lot area. This parking lot lets out onto the common driveway for the business complex at 155 Wilbur Rd, the apartment complex at 145 Wilbur Rd, and the swim school at 135 Wilbur Rd. This driveway, which runs northbound from Wilbur Rd, is located on the west side of the above listed addresses.

Daniels ran over to the wall that separates the field from the parking lot. Once there, Daniels "kind of (stood there), for a second." While all the deputies were looking at him, Daniels got up onto and sat on top of the wall. Daniels had his feet on the west side of the wall, with his back towards the deputies.

While sitting on the wall, Daniels turned to his left so he was partially facing the deputies. Daniels took the knife he had in his possession and began "gouging his…left wrist." Dep. Kristol said Daniels held the knife in his right hand, held his left hand in front of his body, and started gouging his left wrist with the knife. (NOTE: While she was telling me this, Dep. Kristol

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mimicked Daniels' actions. She made a fist with her hand and brought her fist to her left wrist, in a downward motion, with the outer edge towards the wrist.) At the time, Dep. Kristol could not see what Daniels was using to gouge his wrist with. She said she "saw silver and (she) saw a silver handle, but (she) could not see if it was a knife or a blade."

I asked what anyone said to Daniels when he was gouging at his wrist. Dep. Kristol said they were telling him to "stop" and to "put it down." Dep. Kristol said, "Almost like he couldn't hear us. He's noncompliant, whatsoever."

Daniels jumped off the wall and into the parking lot, located on the north side of the business at 155 Wilbur Rd. Dep. Kristol said, "We kind of split up. A couple of us go this way, a couple of us stayed here. And all the deputies that are following him, initially, jump over the wall and (Dep.) Fuller and I backtrack; go back...around the building, in case he doubles back that way."

I asked her what other deputies were in the area when Daniels was sitting on the wall. Dep. Kristol said, "Senior Deputy Camou (#2170), Bonebright (#2930), Kelley, I believe I saw his trainee (Deputy Blanck #3755) and Fuller and I." I asked if anyone in particular was shouting commands at Daniels and Dep. Kristol said, "I think we all were."

I asked where these deputies went after Daniels went over the wall. Dep. Kristol said, "I know that one less lethal stayed here (at the wall where Daniels went over) and one less lethal went here (the area where the northeast corner of the building at 155 Wilbur Rd met the south end of the wall) and I believe it was Deputy Bonebright that came to the left side." When asked, Dep. Kristol said Sr. Dep. Welty had the other less lethal shotgun. She then recalled that Sr. Dep. Welty was also in the field when Daniels was sitting on the wall.

I asked if anyone fired their less lethal shotgun. Dep. Kristol answered, "Yes, I don't remember how many shots and I don't recall which one did, from this side of the wall, but there was a couple shots that were fired from here and...Fuller and I were already doubling back because they were already starting to go over." Dep. Kristol thought she heard these shots when she was still in the field, but did not know her "exact position" at the time they were fired.

Dep. Kristol added, "Cause Fuller and I, as we got to the end, we heard more and then we heard them say over the radio, 'Less lethal shot' and we started really booking on the other side, trying to get to the other side, around the building."

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Dep. Kristol and Dep. Fuller ran southeast through the field, out onto the driveway area where she had parked her unit. As they were doing this, she heard shots being fired. This was followed by the less lethal announcement over the radio. They ran westbound on the north sidewalk of Wilbur Rd, towards 155 Wilbur Rd. Dep. Kristol's idea was "to cut him off, in case (Daniels) jumped the wall and came southbound out of the driveway."

Once in front of 155 Wilbur Rd, Dep. Kristol ran northwest, across the grass located between the business and the north sidewalk of Wilbur Rd, and into the south parking lot of the business. Dep. Fuller continued westbound until he reached the common driveway for 155, 145, and 135 Wilbur Rd. Once there, Dep. Fuller and Dep. Kristol meet up with one another.

Dep. Fuller stayed in the area where the common driveway meets the beginning of the parking lot area located on the west side of 155 Wilbur Rd, "with a visual." Dep. Kristol went northbound along a ramp located on the southwest side of 155 Wilbur Rd. While doing this, Dep. Kristol heard, what she thought was, "several" less lethal shots being fired.

When she entered the north parking lot of 155 Wilbur Rd, Dep. Kristol said Dep. Fuller was approximately "15 feet behind (her)." Dep. Kristol saw "several deputies" in the common driveway, "running."

Dep. Kristol said, "I can see the subject, at the last - - The only point that I saw him at, I think, was the last point of this whole thing because I hear over the radio, 'Shots fired.' I can hear them, audibly, and I see the subject just go down, forward." I asked where she was when she observed and heard these events. Dep. Kristol said she was running northbound. She showed me her approximate location when she observed these activities. Dep. Kristol indicated she was just south of the south entrance to the parking lot for the apartment complex located at 145 Wilbur Rd.

I asked, prior to the shots being fired, if she heard anyone say anything. Dep. Kristol responded, "No." I asked if she saw anything in particular, related to the deputies or Daniels' actions. Dep. Kristol answered, "No. In fact, there were so many of 'em, it was very hard for me to see the subject and the only thing I remember seeing of him was him falling forward."

Dep. Kristol was running northbound up the driveway when she observed Daniels falling forward. When she made it to Daniels' location, she saw Dep. Kelley standing to the right of

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Daniels, who was face down on the ground. Dep. Kristol said they could not see where the knife was located.

Dep. Kristol said, "Senior Deputy Camou was standing towards the head of the subject." As they could not see the knife, "two of the deputies pulled (Daniels), by his feet, back about four or five feet." Dep. Kristol could not remember which deputies did this.

When Daniels was pulled, "the knife was exposed and one of the deputies kicked it, to the side." Dep. Kristol did not recall which deputy kicked the knife.

Dep. Kristol "put on some gloves" and they attempted to talk to Daniels, who was "still gasping." Dep. Kelley and Dep. Kristol were going to start CPR, but heard medical personnel "on the way" to the scene.

I asked if she recalled how many shots she heard. Dep. Kristol said, "I know I could distinctly tell the difference between the bean bag and the shots fired. I know that because I started running faster. I want to say at least four to five, I could distinctly remember."

I asked if she ever heard Daniels say anything during this incident. Dep. Kristol responded, "No. In fact, when he - - Even when he sat on the wall and he turned and looked directly at us and we were trying to talk to him it - - Like I said, it was almost like he could not even understand or see us there. He never said a word, he never said a word."

I asked Dep. Kristol if there was anything else she could think of regarding this incident. Dep. Kristol responded, "The only thing I can think of is, I know when I first pulled out my gun, at the end of the driveway down there, my first thought was I didn't know what type of knife he had and he was runnin' directly at me and I thought I was gonna have to shoot him there, until he changed direction."

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Interview with Sr. Dep. Welty

Background

On 4-8-03 at about 1700 hours, Deputies from the Thousand Oaks area responded to a report of a suicidal subject behind Stuft Crust Pizza on Moorpark Road. After arriving and finding the subject, James Daniels, a foot pursuit ensued. At the conclusion of the foot pursuit an officer involved shooting occurred in which Daniels was shot and died at the scene.

Interview

Detectives from the Major Crimes Bureau responded to investigate the incident. Sgt. Lorenzen and I were assigned as case agents for the incident. As the evening progressed I was asked to go to interview Sr. Deputy Welty who had fired his less lethal shotgun at Daniels during the incident.

I met with Welty at the base of the driveway, which leads to the Edison Power Plant, which is west of 187 E. Wilbur Road. Welty was securing the perimeter of the crime scene at that location. I conducted a tape-recorded interview of Welty that detailed his actions and the actions of other deputies around him during that portion of the incident he was present for. Unbeknownst to me, after our interview, Welty prepared

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his own report of what took place. I reviewed his report and found that it was the same account of the events as what he verbally told me. As a result of this, the reader of this report is referred to Welty's first hand account of what took place. The audiotape of our interview was placed in the case file for future reference.

INTERVIEW OF DEPUTY DANIEL BLANCK

On 04/08/03, at approximately 1847 hours, I conducted a tape-recorded interview of Deputy Daniel Blanck #3755 regarding this case. Below is a synopsis of this interview. For further details, refer to the audiotape containing the recording of this interview. (NOTE: The first portion of this interview was conducted while sitting in my vehicle, parked in front of the mortuary on Wilbur Rd. The second portion of this interview was conducted while driving Dep. Blanck through the route taken from arrival on scene. We did not go through any of the areas accessible by foot only, as I did not want to disturb any of the potential evidence.)

Dep. Blanck was working in the same unit with Deputy Kelley #3033, as Dep. Kelley was his field training officer. They were in the Westlake area of Thousand Oaks when they heard the call for service broadcasted. Dep. Kelley initiated their response to this call, for training purposes.

Dep. Blanck said the call was dispatched as a suicidal subject call. Dispatched advised that a male, with a knife, was stabbing himself in the left arm. This subject was reported to be to the rear of Stuft Crust Pizza (398 N Moorpark Rd in Thousand Oaks). Dispatch advised they thought the subject was still in possession of the knife.

Dep. Blanck and Dep. Kelley responded to the area. They turned eastbound onto Brazil St from northbound Moorpark Rd. Dep. Blanck said approximately "five or six" citizens, who were standing on the corner of the driveway that leads into the parking lot for the business, "hailed (them) down." These citizens advised them that (P-2) James Daniels had run "northbound into the apartment building."

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Dep. Blanck made a U turn and drove eastbound on Brazil St. They turned northbound onto Laurie Ln. (NOTE: Early in the interview, Dep. Blanck stated that from eastbound Brazil St they turned northbound onto Hodencamp Rd. Later, when I drove Dep. Blanck through the area, as he recounted the incident, he saw that these roads did not intersect and corrected himself, saying they had turned northbound onto Laurie Ln.)

Dep. Blanck stopped their unit on Laurie Ln. They exited the unit and entered the apartment complex, in an attempt to locate Daniels.

They walked through the complex and Dep. Blanck observed Daniels "in the back alley way, behind, on the west side of the apartments." Dep. Blanck thought it was Senior Deputy Camou #2170 who drove "east bound on Wilbur and turned into the alleyway, directly north of (his) position."

Dep. Blanck "pointed out" Daniels and stated, "I think that's him." Dep. Blanck described Daniels as "a young male, he had a black sweatshirt and black pants on, and he was holding his left arm up." As he said this, Dep. Blanck held his left arm so it was bent at an approximate 90-degree angle. Dep. Blanck could not see any blood on Daniels, but saw that he was "kind of staggering and his shirt was down over his arms." Dep. Blanck thought this subject was Daniels "because of the way he was holding his hands."

Dep. Blanck said the deputy, whom he thought was Sr. Dep. Camou, that had driven eastbound on Wilbur Rd stopped his unit. This deputy "kind of got out of his car, to try and make contact with the subject, but (Daniels) began to run northbound, out of the driveway or out of the alleyway, across - -."

I confirmed the area he was telling me about was the driveway that ran north and south between Wilbur Rd and Brazil St, which was located on the west side of the Laurie Lane Apartment complex. I also confirmed that he and Dep. Kelley had been on foot, walking through the apartment complex, when he first observed Daniels. I confirmed that Sr. Dep. Camou turned into the driveway and Dep. Blanck yelled at Sr. Dep. Camou that he thought Daniels was the subject related to their call.

I asked where Daniels went next. Dep. Blanck said Daniels ran "northbound, out of the alleyway, across Wilbur Rd...kind of in a northeasterly direction" into a parking lot. Dep. Blanck said they ran through this parking lot.

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Dep. Blanck said that Daniels jumped a wall in this parking. Dep. Blanck added, "When I jumped the wall, I saw a big, bloody handprint on the wall, so I knew he went over that direction and there's a big vacant field right there and I kind of lost everybody there because everybody else were in cars and driving up, east and north. So I ran across the field, eastbound across the field, through some bushes, and it appeared like it was another parking lot, not necessarily a parking lot but maybe it was like another apartment building, right up there."

Dep. Blanck said he ran "north and east, trying to find where everybody was at." Dep. Blanck could hear deputies yelling that Daniels was "in the bushes." Dep. Blanck "ran through some bushes that are up in that direction."

Dep. Blanck paused for an extended period of time. He then stated, "The only thing I can really remember is that I was running, trying to catch up to them, running thorough like a field and through some bushes, ended up in an area where there was a field and I saw that there was big pepper trees and some bushes, off in the northeast corner, and I ran in that direction. I saw a couple of deputies, I don't know exactly who they were, were standing around this one particular area where there's bushes and pepper trees, kind of looked like it was a homeless encampment right there, searching through that area. I got up into the area, we're searching in there, then we heard (Deputy Fuller #2423) say that he had him, more north of our location, which was next to the... little power plant that's right there."

Dep. Blanck said that Dep. Fuller was on the "east side of that power plant area." Dep. Fuller attempted to "pepper spray" Daniels, but it did not have an effect on him. Dep. Blanck said he did not see Dep. Fuller spray Daniels with his Oleoresin Capsicum (OC), but Dep. Blanck could smell the odor and see it deposited on Daniels.

Daniels continued "north and west, through the field behind, north of the power plant." At this point, Dep. Blanck said that he, Dep. Kelley, and Sr. Dep. Camou were following after Daniels.

When they reached "a block wall or a fence of some sort", they were telling Daniels to "drop the knife." Daniels "sat on it" and continued to stab himself, "on his arm, just all up and down his whole entire forearm, just stabbing himself." As Dep. Blanck was saying this, he motioned as if he was holding a knife in his right hand and stabbing his left forearm and upper bicep area.

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Daniels did not respond to their commands. They told Daniels that they would "take care of it", but he still did not respond to them. Daniels "began running down the west side of the power plant. There's a small little area, right next to the chain link fence, and then it goes into an access road."

Dep. Blanck said that Dep. Kristol #3285 "headed (Daniels) off, from the south", as Daniels was southbound. Dep. Kristol "had her gun drawn, told him to drop the knife." Daniels refused to drop his knife.

Daniels "then went to the right, going westbound, jumped over a block wall." Dep. Blanck thought that Dep. Bonebright #2930 arrived on scene, with a less lethal shotgun. Dep. Blanck said, "We told (Dep. Bonebright) to take a shot, he didn't have a shot; he couldn't get to him, he was too far away."

Dep. Blanck said they "continued west, into the Glenn Oak - - by the Glenn Oaks Apartments." They reached "the little alleyway of the Glenn Oaks Apartments." Dep. Blanck then stopped and backtracked in the series of events. He stated, "Before (Daniels) jumped the wall, going towards the apartments, there were two shots fired of the bean bag rounds and I believe those were shot by Senior Deputy Welty (#3075). I didn't see him shoot them; I heard them. I put out that the bean bag was deployed, so that nobody thought it was shots, actual live rounds being fired." I confirmed that he put this information out over the radio.

Dep. Blanck continued, "I then jumped over the wall and he - - we were still going westbound - - we went westbound, towards the Glenn Oaks apartments. We got onto this alleyway and started going north up the drive - - well, it's kind of like a driveway, yeah it's more of a driveway than an alleyway, I guess." I confirmed that he was talking about the common driveway for 155, 145, and 135 Wilbur Rd.

Dep. Blanck said they went northbound on the driveway. He thought the following deputies, in the following order, were preceding this direction: Deputy Kristol #3285, Sr. Dep. Camou, Dep. Kelley, and him. Dep. Blanck thought that Dep. Bonebright and Sr. Dep. Welty were behind them.

Dep. Blanck said, "I was about 20 feet away from Kelley, Kristol and Camou. We all had our guns drawn on (Daniels). He was kind of staggering. He was goin' towards the swim school - - the kids' swim school and that's when I heard and saw the first four shots fired. It

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didn't seem to hit him, at first, I thought they were beanbag rounds because it didn't do anything to the guy, he just kept going. He went about another 15, 20 feet, maybe 30 feet, and that's when I heard another three rounds fired and then the subject went down to the ground. He was kind of on top of his hands. I saw him - - he was face down, lying north south along the driveway. We had him gunned. Kelley grabbed him by the feet and drug him back, to get his hands out from underneath of him. We found the weapon. We verified that he didn't have a weapon in his hand. Notified for fire and ambulance, notified dispatch that shots were fired and waited for medical response to get there."

I asked when it was that he first saw that Daniels had a knife. Dep. Blanck said, "When he was...sitting on the wall or fence just above the power plant and he was actually stabbing himself." I asked what this knife looked like. Dep. Blanck said, "It looked like a real thin pencil and fairly long, probably about six to eight inches long, but I couldn't actually see a blade. But it just looked real thin, but I couldn't actually tell if it was an actual knife or what it was, at that time. But I did notice that it was doing damage to him, as he was stabbing himself." When I asked what he meant by "damage," Dep. Blanck said this caused "excessive blood."

I asked if anyone said anything to Daniels when they were following him up the driveway for 155, 145, and 135 Wilbur Rd. Dep. Blanck said, "Continuously, thorough that whole point, told him to 'Stop', 'Put the knife down', you know, 'Don't go any further', 'Stop, stop, stop'; he would not stop, continuously moved."

I asked if Daniels said anything, at any point in time, prior to being shot. Dep. Blanck "never heard him say anything."

I confirmed that they were following after Daniels, up the common driveway, telling him to "drop the knife" and "stop", while Daniels continued to run. I asked if all the deputies, in the area where Daniels was at, had their handguns out. Dep. Blanck responded, "Yes."

I asked what Daniels did when he was in the area of the swim school. Daniels continued moving while disregarding the commands given to him by the deputies. Dep. Blanck said he was "about 20 feet, 30 feet away from Kelley, Kristol, and Camou." Dep. Blanck stated, "I didn't actually see if (Daniels) did anything. Like I said, I didn't even see the actual shots. All I heard were the shots fired."

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I confirmed that Daniels was in front of all the deputies when they were proceeding up the driveway. I asked who was the first behind Daniels. Dep. Blanck said he could not remember exactly, but seemed "to remember that it was...Kristol, Kelley, then Camou." I confirmed he was behind these deputies, with Dep. Bonebright and Sr. Dep. Welty behind him.

I asked, prior to the shots being fired, if anyone near Daniels said anything to him, other than what he had already commented on. Dep. Blanck responded, "No."

At approximately 1906 hours, I turned off the tape-recorder, in order to obtain some addresses. At approximately 1911 hours, I activated my tape-recorder and taped our conversation while I drove the route Dep. Blanck had taken, upon arriving on the scene.

We drove into the driveway of Stuft Crust Pizza. Dep. Blanck said they stopped in the driveway and contacted the citizens that hailed them. Dep. Blanck made a U turn in the north side parking lot of the restaurant and turned eastbound on Brazil St.

Once they reached Laurie Ln, they turned northbound. They parked along the west curb line, just south of the main entrance to the Laurie Lane Apartments (located at 555 Laurie Ln). Dep. Blanck and Dep. Kelley exited their unit and walked northbound. They then walked westbound through the apartment complex's leasing office and continued westbound through the apartment complex.

I then drove to the driveway located on the west side of the apartment complex. This driveway connects with Brazil St on the south end and Wilbur Rd on the north side. This driveway also allows access to the parking lots located on the west side of the apartment complex.

We drove to the north end of this driveway. The buildings in this apartment complex were identified by letters of the alphabet. Dep. Blanck said he came out of the apartments at "right about the 'H' building." As he walked westbound into the driveway area, he started walking northbound in the driveway. Dep. Blanck saw Daniels "past all of the car ports and walking northbound."

Dep. Blanck saw, who he thought was, Sr. Dep. Camou turn into the driveway off Wilbur Rd. Sr. Dep. Camou stopped his unit, while Daniels was standing at the east facing parking stalls, located on the southwest corner of apartment building "B".

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When Camou started to exit his unit, Daniels ran northbound, out of the driveway. Daniels ran across Wilbur Rd, "ran up into that little parking lot area there, and jumped the fence - - or jumped the wall, right there." I confirmed that the parking lot Daniels ran into was the one on the south side of 155 Wilbur Rd. Daniels then ran eastbound and jumped a block wall, which separates the south side of 155 Wilbur Rd and 301 Wilbur Rd.

Daniels ran eastbound though the field located to the rear of 301 Wilbur Rd. He exited the field and continued running eastbound through the south parking lot of 187 Wilbur Rd. Daniels ran northbound through the east parking lot of 187 Wilbur Rd.

Daniels entered the area located between the north side retaining wall of 187 Wilbur Rd, which is located on the northeast side of the property, and the power plant property. Dep. Blanck said, "And this is kind of where I lost everybody, but I found them on the other side of these buildings, at that little encampment like area that I was talking about, next to the pepper trees."

From the "encampment" area, they "went a little bit further north" to the area where Dep. Fuller sprayed Daniels with OC. There was a field "just north of (the) power plant", and this is "where Kelley, Camou, and (Blanck) ran across the field then just on the other side, in this northwest corner of the power plant area, that's where (Daniels) sat there and started stabbing his arm."

Daniels "ran southbound on the west side of this power plant" coming out to the driveway leading to the entrance to the power plant. (NOTE: This driveway is located on the west side of the business located at 187 Wilbur Rd and on the east side of the field located behind 301 Wilbur Rd.)

Dep. Blanck said that Dep. Kristol parked her unit at the entrance to this driveway, near where it meets Wilbur Rd. When they were proceeding southbound, Dep. Kristol exited her unit, "had (Daniels) at gun point, told him to 'Stop' and he started running westbound, through the bushes, across the field (located to the rear of 301 Wilbur Rd), again, going back towards the Glenn Oaks Apartments."

Daniels ran westbound though the field to an area located "just north of this business building (155 Wilbur Rd), in between the business building and the (Glenn Oaks) apartments."

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This ultimately led them to the common driveway located on the west side of the buildings at 155, 145, and 135 Wilbur Rd.

Once on the common driveway for 155, 145, and 135 Wilbur Rd, Dep. Blanck was approximately "20, 30 feet south of everybody else" as they all went northbound in this driveway. Dep. Blanck thought that Dep. Kristol, Sr. Dep. Camou, and Dep. Kelley were all in front of him, "right up on (Daniels), just to (Daniels') right." Dep. Blanck estimated that "they were probably within 15 feet, 10, 15 feet of (Daniels)."

I confirmed that all of them had been yelling at Daniels, telling him to stop and to drop the knife. Dep. Blanck said that, despite being behind the other deputies, he "could still hear everybody tellin' (Daniels) to 'Stop', to 'Stop." Dep. Blanck was "tryin' to tell (Daniels) to 'Stop'."

Dep. Blanck thought Sr. Dep. Welty and Dep. Bonebright were behind him, both with less lethal shotguns.

I asked what he saw Daniels do, if anything, just prior to the shooting taking place. Dep. Blanck said, "All I really saw him doing was just continuously walking or running northbound on the road. I didn't see him or I couldn't really see or I didn't see him actually do anything particular." Dep. Blanck estimated that there was approximately "30 feet" between Daniels and himself.

I asked if Daniels was facing the deputies. Dep. Blanck said, "When the initial shots were fired, I don't remember." I asked if Daniels was running northbound up the driveway or towards the swim school. Dep. Blanck responded, "Yeah, he was running up towards the swim school." I started to clarify my question and Dep. Blanck said, "He wasn't really at the swim school yet, it was just before the swim school. So, I mean, I don't want to make it sound like he was running into the swim school, but he was running towards the swim school area, where there was kids and family (sic), in that area."

I asked if he saw any children or families in the parking lot area. Dep. Blanck responded, "At the time the shots were fired, I did not see or I couldn't. I was focused on the suspect."

I asked if he saw anyone in the area after the shots were fired and Daniels was down. Dep. Blanck said, "Some people came out of the swim school area."

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shirt on the body and three EKG monitor pads were still adhered to the chest. We later learned that Daniels was wearing no underwear. Rigor Mortis was present as well as Lividity, which was present and consistent with the position of the body. The eyes were clear with no petechial hemorrhaging visible. There were no apparent needle/injection sites on the body. No tattoos were present on the body. There were numerous wounds on the body; these will be detailed later in the report.

Prior to conducting the forensic examination of the body, Dr. examined the clothing, which included the shirts (4) Daniels had been wearing. The shirts had been removed from Daniel's body at the scene while being treated by medical personnel. The shirts were taken as evidence by FETs and brought to the Autopsy for examination. Additionally, there was a hooded sweatshirt, which was worn by Daniels but removed and discarded by him prior to the shooting.

Although the shirts had been cut from the body, the order in which they were worn was still able to be determined because they were still layered as they had been on the body. The shirts were laid out and examined individually starting from the outermost of the four shirts and working inward to the shirt closest to the body. I diagramed the locations of the cuts used to remove the shirts from the body and the locations of various defects in the material, which in many cases were caused by bullets. For illustration purposes, please refer to the diagrams included at the end of this report. A description of each shirt is provided below.

Shirt #1 (Outermost garment)

The first shirt examined was a Multi-colored sweater with dark gray, charcoal and red colors visible. The sweater had a label on the collar, which read "Gianfranco Ruffini" and was a size L (Large).

Shirt #2 (Outermost middle garment)

The next shirt examined was a black short-sleeved T-shirt. The T-shirt had a white silk-screened design on the front. The design was that of a male subject holding a bottle of beer. Above this were words reading, "Left Over Crack." Below the picture was wording which read, "Rock the 40oz." And another line of wording that appeared to be Greek or Slavic in origin.

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Shirt #3 (Inner middle garment)

This shirt was examined next. The shirt was a gray Russell Athletic "Pro Cotton" T-shirt, size L (Large). The shirt had a pocket on the left breast. The pocket was empty.

Shirt #4 (Innermost garment)

The final shirt of the four to be examined was a black long sleeved thermal shirt. There was no tag on the collar of the shirt. Based on the locations of holes (defects) in the shirt, it was Dr. so opinion that this shirt was possibly worn backwards by Daniels.

Hooded Sweatshirt (Not worn at time of shooting)

This garment was examined after the shirts worn by Daniels during the shooting were examined. The sweatshirt was made by Fila and was size L (Large). It was dark blue or faded black in color. The Sweatshirt had a zippered front, was hooded with pull strings at the neck and had a small Fila design on the left chest area. The sleeves of the sweatshirt were inside out upon initial examination. There were two hand-warming pockets on the lower front portion of the sweatshirt. The right pocket contained a pack of Marlboro Cigarettes, 1 loose "Aleve" brand pill, 1 half sheet of paper which appeared to be a job referral and 1 Cigarette butt. The left pocket contained 1 broken disposable double bladed razor with part of the blade exposed. The razor had visible blood on it. Also in the left pocket was a disposable lighter and .94 cents in change. It should be noted that the left wrist area of the sweatshirt was heavily stained with blood and the front of the sweatshirt was covered with blood spatter.

Pants

The jeans worn by Daniels were dark blue in color and made by "Anchor Blue." They had a five-pocket design with the fifth pocket being a small coin pocket on the front of the pants. In the right front pant pocket contained a small white toothbrush, which appeared to be Ventura County Jail issue and a white metal wristwatch with the word, "Geneva" visible on the face. The left front pant pocket contained a wrapper/label for disposable razor cartridges, bugler cigarette wrapping papers, a folded napkin with writing on it. The writing read, "Day In." The left rear pocket

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safekeeping 03-1561." [This appears to refer to an incident that occurred in January and is documented in Book 3, section 2 of this case file.] There was nothing in the other pockets.

Socks

The socks were white non-descript athletic style socks. The left sock had a small blood spot on the heel portion. There was nothing else notable or visible on the socks.

Shoes

The shoes were Black canvas style skater sneakers with a white pinstripe-like design down the sides. The shoes were high top style and tied with white shoelaces. There were blood spots on the shoes and some blood visible on the soles of the shoes.

Visual Examination of the body

Dr. then began a visual examination of the body. There were a number of entry/exit wounds from gunshots visible on the body. Dr. lettered them A through L. During the individual examination of each gunshot wound, Dr. also numbered the wounds 1 through 12. The lettering and numbering system used was for reference purposes only and did not refer to the sequence and chronology in which the shots occurred. There were also several abrasions, bruises and lacerations on the body. Blood was present over a large portion of the upper torso. The cheek and chin area of the face was also covered by dried blood which varied from thin to very thick layers. Three lumps could also be seen on the body, one on the left shoulder, one on the right pectoral region just inside and above the nipple and one on the left wrist. Based on the X-rays and the appearance of the lumps they appeared to be bullets under the skin. Two large deep lacerations were readily evident on the left wrist. These lacerations are described later along with the other wounds and entry/exit injuries.

For illustration purposes I have included in this report, the sketch of the body, which I completed while examining the body. I used the same lettering scheme as Dr. for consistency.

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
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then began a detailed examination of each gunshot wound on the body. Each wound was measured, described and labeled during the examination. I noted the following information.

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Gunshot Wound A (#1)

Dr. categorized this wound as a distant gunshot entrance wound to the right lumbar region of the back on the right side of the spine. The wound was 24 ¾ inches below the top of the head and 1 inch to the right of the posterior midline (center of the body). The wound was 0.77 cm in diameter. No gunshot residue was visible around the wound. The track of the bullet causing this wound ended at the bullet, which was lodged in the spinal column. This bullet was recovered from the body at approximately 1320 hours by Dr. and given to FET column. (Refer to the diagram for the bullets location.)

This bullet was not immediately located in the examination process. It came to rest in a location below the level of the initial X-Rays and thus was not readily seen. After examining the path of the bullet in gunshot wound "A", Dr. ordered an additional X-ray and confirmed the location of the bullet.

Gunshot Wound B (#2)

Dr. categorized this wound as a distant gunshot entrance wound to the right posterior (rear) lower chest area of the back. The wound was 21 ¼ inches below the top of the head and 2 ½ inches from the posterior midline. The wound was 0.7 cm in diameter. No gunshot residue was visible around the wound. The track of the bullet causing this wound indicates the bullet exited the body at wound "L" located on the left chest area just to the outside of the nipple. (Refer to description of wound "L" for details.)

Gunshot wound C (#3)

Dr. categorized this wound as a distant gunshot entrance wound to the right posterior mid chest area of the back. The wound was 19 inches below the top of the head and 4 ½ inches from the posterior midline. The wound was 0.7 cm in diameter. No gunshot residue was visible around the wound. The

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on the

anterior (outside) upper arm/shoulder area of the left arm. (Refer to description of wound "K" for details.)

Gunshot wound D (#4)

Dr. categorized this wound as a distant gunshot entrance wound to the right posterior chest area of the back. The wound was 18 inches below the top of the head and 6 1/2 inches from the posterior midline. The wound was 0.6 cm in diameter. No gunshot residue was visible around the wound. The track of the bullet causing this wound indicates the bullet exited the body at wound "J" located on the left anterior (front) shoulder area. (Refer to description of wound "J" for details.)

Gunshot wound E (#5)

Dr. categorized this wound as a distant gunshot entrance wound to the right posterior upper chest area of the back. The wound was 15 inches below the top of the head and 8 ½ inches from the posterior midline. The wound was 0.7 cm in diameter. No gunshot residue was visible around the wound. The track of the bullet causing this wound ended at a bullet, which was located below the skin on top of the left shoulder. This bullet was recovered from the body at approximately 1204 hours by Dr. and given to FET (Refer to diagram for details of the bullet resting place.)

Gunshot wound F (#6)

Dr. categorized this wound as a distant gunshot entrance wound to the forearm/elbow area of the right arm. The wound was 11 inches below the top of the right shoulder. The wound was 0.6 cm in diameter. No gunshot residue was visible around the wound. The track of the bullet causing this wound indicates the bullet traveled down the forearm and exited the body at "I" located on the mid inner forearm area of the right arm 5 ½ inches above the wrist. The bullet did not fracture any bones in the arm. (Refer to description of wound "I" for details.)

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Dr. categorized this wound as a distant gunshot entrance wound to the deltoid on the outside area of the right shoulder. The wound was 2 inches below the top of the right shoulder and 9 inches from the posterior midline. The wound was 0.7 cm in diameter. No gunshot residue was visible around the wound. The track of the bullet causing this wound ended at a bullet, which was located under the skin on the right upper chest area just inside and above the right nipple. The bullet caused the upper right portion of the Humerus bone to fracture. This bullet was recovered from the body at approximately 1134 hours by Dr. and given to FET (Refer to the diagram for details on the location of the bullet.)

Gunshot wound H (#8)

Dr. categorized this wound as a distant gunshot entrance wound to the left wrist below the thumb. The wound was 10 \(^3\)/4 inches below the left elbow. The wound was 0.7 cm in diameter. No gunshot residue was visible around the wound. The track of the bullet causing this wound ends at a bullet, which was located under the skin on the posterior side of the same (left) wrist. This bullet was recovered from the body at approximately 1123 hours by Dr. and given to FET (Refer to the diagram for details of the bullets location.)

Gunshot wound I (#9)

Dr. categorized this wound as a gunshot exit wound. This wound was located on the right inner forearm 5 inches above the wrist. The wound was 2.2 cm long and 1.0 cm wide.

Gunshot wound J (#10)

Dr. categorized this wound as a gunshot exit wound. This wound was located on the anterior portion of the left shoulder. The wound was 2 ½ inches below the top of the shoulder and 5 inches to the left of the anterior midline. The wound was 1.0 cm in diameter. (see diagram for illustration.)

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two parallel lines about ½ inch long, which were horizontal on the body. Below this injury on the right side of the ribcage and also on the left side of the upper abdomen were several abrasions, which were prominent and ranged in size from several inches in length and width to smaller round abrasions.

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There was an abrasion, again similar in appearance to those noted on the chest and hip area, located on the extreme inside upper forearm of the right arm.

Left Arm

Most notably on the left arm were two extremely deep and long lacerations to the left wrist area. The lacerations ran from the base of the hand/wrist area up the forearm and were approximately 4-5 inches long. The wounds were open and extended down to the bone. These lacerations severed the muscle, tendons, nerves and small blood vessels located in the wrist. There were also numerous cuts extending the length of the forearm around the two deeper lacerations. These wounds were less severe and varied in depth and length. None of these wounds were deep enough to cause the skin layers to separate as the two major injuries had.

Additionally, there was a small abrasion on the back of the left arm just above the elbow. On the front of the left shoulder near gunshot wound K was a small scabbed over wound, which was approximately 1 inch long and was oriented vertically on the body.

Waist / Hip area

On the right hip and outer upper thigh area there were abrasions, which were similar in appearance to the ones described above. These abrasions were smaller in size. There was one large abrasion approximately 2 inches in size on the front of the body just below the hip bone and several smaller abrasions above and further to the outside of the body.

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Both legs had a number of bruises in various stages of healing and color. Two notable bruises were observed below both knees on the upper shine portion of the legs. There was a small scabbed over wound midway down the left shin between the knee and ankle.

Feet

On the underside of both feet near the inside of the heel were two injuries. The left foot had a small-discolored area with a small laceration in the middle. The right foot had a small bruise in approximately the same location.

Internal Examination of the body

Upon internal examination of the body, Dr. discovered that the injuries caused by the bullets were in the upper chest area. The tracks of the various bullets had perforated both lungs, esophagus/trachea, heart, pericardial sack as well as the muscles and rib cage. There was no damage visible in the abdomen/intestinal area. Dr. used a metal rod to track the path of each bullet as it entered and either exited the body or came to rest within the body. The rod was put in place by Dr. and photographed by FET same.

Dr. documented eight (8) gunshot entry wounds, four (4) gunshot exit wounds and four (4) bullets within the body.

Conclusion of Autopsy

Dr. concluded at the end of her examination that the cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds, and the manner of death was classified as homicide, due to interaction with deputies.

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CRIME SCENE REPORT

WILBUR ROAD & LAURIE LANE Thousand Oaks, CA

On 4-8-03, at approximately 1740 hours, Sgt. Ernie Montagna advised me of an Officer Involved Shooting, which occurred in the area of Wilbur Road in the City of Thousand Oaks. Sgt. Montagna asked me to respond to the incident.

Upon my arrival, Det. Mark Gillette synopsized what happened. I was asked to write a report regarding the description of the crime scene. Below is a general description of the crime scene.

The weather was clear and warm. There was a very slight breeze blowing from a north to south direction. Although the deputies were dispatched to the area of the Stuft Crust Pizza in regards to the incident involving P-James Daniels, he wasn't

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encountered by law enforcement until he was seen at the Biltmore apartments. The description of the crime scene will be described from that point forward.

The location of Stuft Crust Pizza is, 398 N. Moorpark Road, in the City of Thousand Oaks. The apartment complexes Daniels walked through and were subsequently a part of the crime scene were the Glen Oaks, Biltmore, Pavilions and Shadow Oaks apartments. The general area of the crime scene consists of residences and scattered businesses. Most of the residences consist of the apartment complexes. There are apartment complexes both North and South of Wilbur Road. The crime scene was generally in the area of Wilbur Road between Moorpark Road and Laurie Lane. Stuft Crust Pizza is located one block south of Wilbur Road, where witnesses first saw Daniels.

The area where Daniels walked and where deputies followed him is extensive. Deputies first encountered Daniels while they were on foot at the Biltmore apartments. The Biltmore apartments are located south of Wilbur Road between Pennsfield and Laurie Lane. In addition to the Biltmore apartments, there is another complex of apartments in the same general area called the Pavilions. There is a driveway leading into the apartment complex parking lot. The driveway is approximately 50 feet from Pennsfield. This driveway runs parallel to Pennsfield.

Through statements from deputies it was determined that Daniels had crossed Wilbur Road and walked or ran north across the street. Wilbur Road is a two-lane road that runs in an east/west direction. There is a turning lane on Wilbur Road enabling vehicles to turn into complexes that are both on the north and south side of Wilbur Road.

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Daniels began walking behind the Oak Plaza business center located at 187 Wilbur. East of 187 Wilbur, is another business, Classic Limousine Service. North of 187 Wilbur is the Edison power plant. Between the power plant and the rear paved roadway of 187 Wilbur is a cinder block wall that is approximately 83 feet long. The wall is of different heights with the highest point being approximately 4 ½ feet. At the east end of parking lot of 187 Wilbur and just before the Classic Limousine Property line the wall ends. A dirt embankment begins that is approximately a foot higher than the wall. The dirt embankment is also lined with several trees and for a person to get to the power plant property line one would

have to move branches/leaves to pass by. North of the Classic Limousine Service

is a small dirt path and directly north of the path is a six foot chain link fence, which

runs along the property line of the limousine service ending at the cinder block wall

Beyond the dirt embankment is a concrete drainage ditch, which is just south of the power plant. The power plant is enclosed by a chain link fence. At the top of the chain link fence are three strands of barbed wire, which completely surrounds the plant. The inside of the plant measures 275 feet wide by 225 feet in length. On both the east and west side of the power plant is a dirt path. On the east side of the power plant the dirt path is approximately fifteen feet wide. Along the dirt path are broken branches that appear to be from the trees that are along the property line separating the Edison power plant and the apartment complex, east of the plant.

At the northeast end of the power plant and east of the path there is a cinder block wall approximately 6 1/2 feet in height at the highest point. The wall runs along the

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apartment complex parking lot from Wilbur Road to the chain link fence. The chain link fence is mounted on top of a dirt mound. The chain link fence stands a few feet higher than the cinder block wall due to it being on top of a dirt mound.

A pole runs along the top of the chain link fence. At the south end of the chain link fence there is a gap approximately two feet wide. According to reports, this is the location where Dep. Fuller attempted to restrain Daniels.

West of the chain link fence and north of the power plant is an open field. From the power plant to the backyard fence line of Galsworthy it measures approximately 100 feet. The field is sloped with the highest portion ending at the fence line of Galsworthy. At the northeast end of the power plant there appears to be a transient camp. This is determined due to various articles of used clothing, trash etc. in the area. Sporadically, there are trees throughout the field. The ground is covered by calve length grass and foxtails.

A chain link fence runs along the backyards of the homes located on Galsworthy. These fences vary in heights, changing at each property line. Approximately 120 feet east of the chain link fence line that separates the Daland Swim School parking lot and the open field was a dark colored sweatshirt. Again, through statements given by deputies on the incident, it is believed, the sweatshirt belonged to Daniels, which he took off and placed over the chain link fence, while being followed by the deputies.

On the west side of the power plant the fence line from the Daland Swim School property and the power plant measures approximately 10 feet wide. However,

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there are numerous trees, bushes and ivy, which leaves a dirt path approximately three feet in width. There were clearly footprints in the area of the dirt. In one area of the path there was a small amount of water that seemed to run over from one of the irrigation control valves that was located on the path. In the area of the water there was a muddy footprint, which appeared to come from a tennis shoe. Several of the other footprints I saw in the dirt seemed to come from a boot.

Also, along the pathway there were several droplets of blood. Numerous photographs were taken of these blood spatters that were noticed along the dirt path.

Upon walking to the end of the dirt path, which is the route Daniels took; there is an asphalt driveway. The driveway is located a foot or two southeast of the dirt path. The paved driveway extends south to Wilbur Road. The driveway measures 260 feet from the power plant property to the opening of the parking lot at the business complex at 187 Wilbur. The driveway is 12 feet wide. On the west side of the driveway there are trees that form a line, which extends to the end of the driveway. From the chain link fence on the south side of the power plant measuring to the opening in the bushes along the west side of the driveway is 120 feet. This small opening in the trees was the direction that Daniels walked. Also, along the driveway were several more droplets of blood.

The opening along the driveway consisted of a small dirt path, approximately 2 to 3 feet wide. There was two pieces of plywood placed side by side near the dirt path. The wood pieces are of two different sizes. The bigger piece of plywood had

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droplets of blood. Upon walking a few feet further on the dirt path it leads into an open field. The ground cover is mainly grass with scattered dirt patches.

Upon walking further south in the field there is a wooden fence, which belongs to the backyard of the private residence at 301 Wilbur. North of the fence approximately fifteen feet is a large tree stump, where it is obvious a tree was cut down or the tree fell. The area surrounding the tree stump is a large dirt patch. There is a large tree a few feet northeast of the tree stump. The tree is directly in the view of where it is believed that Dep. Welty was standing. There is a second opening further south of the driveway that leads into the field. This is the area where Dep. Welty was standing when he first observed Daniels. When standing in this area you can view the open field, the Professional Center building and a small portion of the Glen Oaks apartment building.

Along the south side of the Glen Oaks apartment building is a cinder block wall. The wall is north of the Professional Business Center building located at 155 Wilbur. The wall is approximately 4 feet high. On the west side of the wall are numerous bushes that run alongside most of the wall. The bushes are just slightly higher than the wall. On the top of the wall there is a bloody handprint. The handprint indicates that Daniels's left hand was facing west. On top of the retaining wall near the bush at the very south end there was a live less lethal beanbag round. On the west side of the wall there was a second live beanbag round on the ground.

On the west side of the retaining wall there is a portion of the Glen Oaks apartment complex and the Professional Business Center parking lot. The parking spaces face in a north and south direction. The spaces on the north side accommodate

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parking for approximately six vehicles. The spaces are designed for compact vehicles only. This portion of the lot does not have overhead coverage for the vehicles. The parking for the vehicles on the south side also accommodates approximately six vehicles. This parking structure does have overhead coverage.

On the southwest side of the parking lot there is a curb. On the east side of the curb a vehicle can be parked in the space provided. On the west side the curb is painted red. This curb runs along the roadway of the Professional Business Center at 155 Wilbur, the Glen Oaks Apartments at 145 Wilbur and to the Daland Swim School at 135 Wilbur. The planter is approximately 1 ½ to 2 feet wide and it has manicured bushes in the middle surrounded by dirt. Near the bush that is furthest south there is wadding from one of the less lethal rounds. Just below the curb on the ground of the parking lot is a cap that separated from one of the beanbag rounds. This is a normal process when these rounds are fired.

Against the retaining wall, on the ground, is additional wadding from the beanbag round. The area of where the wadding is located is in alignment with the wadding that was found on the curb.

The driveway west of the area just described runs from Wilbur Road to the north end of the Daland Swim School. The parking lot at Daland doglegs east where it ends. There are several parking spaces in this area. The only way to leave this parking lot would be the same way you entered.

Along the driveway heading north there are droplets of blood. The blood is more near the curb line, which runs north and south and is located on the west side of

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the driveway. The curb ends just as you near the driveway in front of the Daland Swim School. Within the middle of the curb there are numerous bushes and a few trees. This area is approximately 3 to 4 feet wide. West of this area is a retaining wall. The wall, which varies in height, virtually parallels the length of the driveway.

Further north the driveway begins to slope upward. Prior to moving onto the driveway where it becomes the Daland Swim School property line, there are four expended shell casings within a few feet of each other on the ground. The casings are laying in a north to south direction. As you near the property line of Daland the blacktop is a darker color as if it was recently repayed. In front of the swim school there is a black SUV type vehicle parked along the east side of the curb line. The vehicle is northeast of Daniels's body.

South of the vehicle on the blacktop, there are four more expended shell casings. Three of the casings are in close proximity of one another, a foot away, and one of the casings is a greater distance away. This specific casing is nearest to the curb line on the east side of the driveway. From viewing the slope of the driveway it is possible that the casing, when coming in contact with the ground, may have rolled down the driveway.

There was an expended bullet on the driveway along with a patrol deputy's keeper from his belt. The keeper was in the vicinity of the second set of casings, which were found on what appeared to be the recently paved blacktop.

Daniels's body appeared to be in the center of the driveway. There was a large amount of blood on the blacktop surrounding the body. The blood patterns varied.

One area indicated that the blood was smeared and another area there were two blood streams. The streams appeared to be coming from the deceased body as he lay there. The smear possibly occurred when deputies first turned Daniels over from his stomach to his back and pulled him down the driveway, so they could determine the location of the knife Daniels was holding.

West of Daniels's body was a pile of clothing. The clothing appeared to consist of shirts, which gave the appearance that they were cut off Daniels's body.

Approximately 3 to 4 feet away from Daniels's clothing was the knife Daniels was seen holding and using to cut himself. The knife, which would properly be described as an x-acto type knife, is approximately 6" long. The tip of the box cutter is coated with blood.

Upon initial observation of Daniels he was covered with a yellow blanket. Upon removing the blanket, I noted the following: Daniels did not have a shirt on. Paramedics, prior to my arrival, could have possibly removed the shirt. Daniels was wearing dark colored pants; white socks and black and white high top tennis shoes. The pants and shoes were dirty and had blood on them.

Daniels was a male, Caucasian, approximately 6'1", thin build, with brown hair. I estimated his age to be approximately 20 years old. Daniels was on his back with his feet facing south. He had 3 EKG patches still secured to his chest. His left arm was to his side and his right arm was extended outward and bent at the elbow. His head was tilted facing east.

A blood smear covered the right side of his face and blood coagulated just below the cheekbone. There were also blood smears throughout the chest area. On his left wrist there were two deep gashes that ran lengthwise from the base of the hand to approximately halfway up the forearm.

Upon Daniels being rolled onto his side there were several obvious gunshot wounds in the mid and upper back. In addition, a large amount of blood had settled near the area of the buttocks.

Ventura County Field Evidence Technicians photographed the crime scene, identified and marked items of evidence and collected them. These items of evidence were later booked into the Ventura County Crime Laboratory/Property Room. Refer to the Property/Evidence reports completed by the technicians for complete description and details of the items located at the scene. For further details on exact measurements refer to Sr. Dep. John Popp's report.

SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION

On April 8, 2003, at about 1902 hours, Captain Larry Kelley from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office contacted me. He reported the officer involved gunshot wound death of James McDonough Daniels, age 19. He advised that the Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Detectives were on scene and that Detective Tim Lorenzen was the lead detective. I responded to the scene arriving at approximately 2007.

According to Detective Tim Lorenzen on, April 8, 2003, at 1704 hours, the Ventura County Sheriff's Office received a phone call from a citizen about a possibly suicidal subject repeatedly cutting his arm with a knife behind a restaurant located at Moorpark Road and Brazil Street in the city of Thousand Oaks. Deputies arrived on scene and chased the decedent, a 19-year-old white male, on foot through residential areas east and north of the restaurant, eventually ending up at a private swim school on Wilbur Road. During the pursuit the deputies attempted to subdue the decedent with pepper spray and two less-than-lethal (bean bag) rounds, all without effect. The decedent approached the school, which at the time had a number of children and adults attending swimming lessons. The decedent, still holding his knife, was shot as he continued to advance towards the school and patrons in the parking lot. The shooting was at approximately 1730 hours. Paramedics were called and arrived on scene at approximately 1737 hours. Paramedic paramedic radio pronounced the decedent dead at approximately 1745 hours on April 8, 2003

I photographed the body of the decedent and the scene. Ventura County Sheriff's BI technician photographed the body of the decedent and the scene.

I observed the decedent lying supine on top of a blue backboard on the asphalt in the driveway in front of the Daland Swim School. There was blood on the right side of the decedent's face, chest, abdomen, hands and arms. The decedent's upper clothing had been cut off and was lying near the right side of the decedent's head. The clothing was marked with a yellow and black evidence marker #24. There was smeared blood on the asphalt above the decedent's head. The smear shows the decedent was dragged a short distance probably face down. There were EKG pads in place on the

decedent's upper torso. There was an exacto knife approximately 10 feet away from the decedent's right side. The exacto knife was marked with a yellow and black evidence marker # 25. The decedent was wearing jeans and shoes. I observed approximately 11 wounds to the decedent's upper torso, arms and back. There was a 4-5 inch vertical laceration to the decedent's left wrist. There were approximately 8 shell casings on the asphalt in two groups of 4 to the left of the decedent's body. I removed a passport and some papers from the decedent's right rear pants pocket. The passport was for Daniels, James Hanlon Mc Donough, DOB with color photograph. Deputies at the scene and the passport identified the decedent.

The body of the decedent was placed on a clean white sheet and then in a blue body bag. The body bag was sealed with Medical Examiner seal # 027933, at 2110 hours on April 8, 2003. Ventura County Sheriff's Office BI took a photograph of the sealed bag. Cathedral Mortuary Associates transported the body of the decedent to the Ventura County Medical Examiner's Office at rny request.

The decedent's mother, was notified of her son's death on April 8, 2003 at approximately 1945 hours, by Deputy Jason Robarts and Sr. Deputy Rob Davidson at her residence at Thousand Oaks.

On April 9, 2003, Ventura County Medical Center medical records show the decedent was first treated on June 26, 2002. The decedent was last seen on September 13, 2002. The medical history showed major psychosis. Dr. treated the decedent. The decedent was noncompliant with his medications.

On April 9, 2003, I reviewed the above case with Dr. Assistant Chief Medical Examiner for the County of Ventura. She performed an autopsy. The manner of death was ruled homicide.

The body of the decedent was released to the Pierce Brother's Valley Oaks at the request of the family.

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GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

The body is received in a blue vinyl pouch, with a medical examiner's tag attached to the zipper and inscribed with the decedent's name. The pouch is locked with seal #027933. The body is wrapped in a bloodstained white sheet.

CLOTHING:

The following items of clothing are on the body:

- Navy blue denim jeans, which have been cut up the legs and are buttoned and zipped. There are bloodstains on the jeans. In the right front pocket of the jeans is a short handle toothbrush and an "Omega" brand white metal wristwatch. In the left front pocket is a label from a disposable razor cartridge package, a pack of "Bugler" cigarette papers and a folded paper napkin. Written on the napkin is the following: "Mindy Apartment room 2191-805-499-5910 Day Inn. In the right hip pocket of the pants is a folded soiled piece of paper with the following written on it: 2101 Olson Road bike booked safekeeping 03-1561.
- White sport socks. There is some bloodstaining on the heel of the left sock.
- 3. Black and white high top sport shoes.

There are four layers of clothing items that will be described individually, received in a sheriff's evidence bag labeled "Clothing cut off of subject by paramedics".

1. A dark multicolored striped sweater is cut across the sleeves and up into the right side of the chest and neck, and up the front and back on the left side. There is bloodstaining on both sleeves. Two adjacent ragged defects are in the back of the right sleeve, located approximately 4 1/2" above the cuff. These are separated by a few stands of yarn. A slightly ragged defect is in the right front of the sleeve, located approximately 12 1/2" above the edge of the cuff. A ragged defect is in the right front shoulder, located approximately 1" inside the shoulder seam. A ragged defect is on the right front of the sweater, located approximately 1/4" inside the arm seam and 3 1/4" above the underarm seam. A ragged C-shaped defect is in the left front of the sweater, located approximately 3 3/4" below the shoulder seam and 5" inside the arm seam. A ragged defect is located in the left front arm seam of the sweater, approximately 6" below the shoulder seam. A ragged defect is in the left arm of the sweater, just anterior to the underarm seam and approximately 4" below the arm seam. Three grouped ragged defects are in the right upper back of the sweater and are approximately 3" below the shoulder seam. Two defects are in the mid-portion of the sweater in the back, just to the right of midline.

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A group six defects are on the right lower back of the sweater and two defects are in the bottom of the mid-back of the shirt. One is in the ribbed band and one is just above the band.

- 2. A black short sleeve tee shirt with a picture logo and the words "Left Over Crack" on the front. The shirt has been cut across the sleeves and front chest, the left front and back, and is in two pieces. A defect is in the right front sleeve of the shirt, located approximately 5" from the edge of the sleeve. A ragged defect is in the right sleeve of the shirt, just below the shoulder seam and 1 1/2" from the arm seam. There are multiple defects in the right back of the shirt, adjacent to the sleeve. A large defect is in the left front sleeve of the shirt, located approximately 4 ½" above the edge of the sleeve. There are two angled defects in the right front of the shirt, just below the neckband. Three defects are grouped in the right upper back of the shirt, just inside the sleeve seem. Below this are two additional defects. There are multiple defects in the right mid and lower back of the shirt. There are two sets of paired defects approximately 1" apart. Two additional paired defects are approximately 1 ½" apart. A lower set of three defects are separated by a few strands of fabric. The final defect is just above the hem in the mid-back of the shirt. There is a large ragged defect in the left side of the shirt, located approximately 1" above the bottom hem.
- 3. A gray "Russell" athletic tee shirt, which is stained with blood primarily around the left lower portion of the shirt. There is a defect in the right front sleeve of the shirt, located approximately 5 ½" from the seam. An additional defect in the right front sleeve of the shirt is located ½" outside the sleeve seam. A large defect in the left front sleeve is located approximately ½" outside the sleeve seam. Two V-shaped defects are in the right upper front of the shirt. Paired defects on in the right upper back of the shirt, approximately 1" inside the sleeve seam. There are eleven defects in the right mid-back. Some are connected by stands of fabric. Some are paired. An additional defect is in the right back of the shirt, just above the bottom hem. Three defects are in the mid-back of the shirt, approximately 6" above the hem. An additional defect is in the left back of the shirt, approximately 2" above the hem. Two ragged defects are in the left side of the shirt, approximately 1 ½" above the bottom hem.
- 4. A black waffle-weave long sleeve knit shirt. The shirt has been cut across the sleeves and up the front and up the back and is in two parts. From the appearance of the gunshot defects pattern, the shirt was likely being worn backwards. There are two defects in the right sleeve, located approximately 2" and 5" above the cuff. There are two defects in the right sleeve, close to the arm seam and behind the shoulder seam. There is a large defect on the front of the left sleeve, approximately 1" outside the arm hole seam, and an additional defect in the back of the seam in a similar location. There is a ragged defect in the left mid-sleeve, anterior to the underarm seam.

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Multiple defects are in the right back of the shirt. One is located approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ inside the back arm seam. Several are loosely grouped in the mid-back and there is one defect located approximately 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ above the bottom seam.

5. Received in sheriff's evidence back labeled "Sweatshirt collected from fence" is a black hooded zip-front sweatshirt, with the sleeves inside out. There is heavy bloodstaining of the left sleeve. There is also some blood spatter on the front of the shirt. A ragged defect is in the left front of the shirt, located 2 ½" to the left of the zipper and 10 ½" above the bottom seam. A second defect is located in the left sleeve of the shirt, just behind the shoulder seam and 3" above the cuff. In the right front pocket of the sweatshirt is a crushed package of "Marlboro" cigarettes, along with a separated filter, a blue "Aleve" tablet and a folded piece of paper with a job description on it. The left pocket contains a green disposable lighter, the broken off blades of a double edge disposable razor, and ninety-four cents in change.

EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL THERAPY:

EKG monitor pads are on the anterior torso.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is that of a well-developed, slender Caucasian male, whose appearance is consistent with the recorded age of 19 years. The length is 72 ½" and the weight is 136 pounds. The body has not been embalmed and is well preserved. Rigidity is well developed in the extremities, and lividity is faint, posterior and fixed. The body has been refrigerated and is cold to the touch.

The intact scalp is covered by dark brown hair, which measures up to ½" in length. The corneas are clear, and the irides are brown. The conjunctivae are pale and petechial hemorrhages are not observed. There is drying artifact across the corneas. The nose is intact and contains blood. The lips are intact and the teeth are natural and in an adequate state of repair. A large amount of blood is in the mouth. The beard area is covered by short dark stubble. The ears are normally formed. The neck is straight and symmetrical and the trachea is midline.

The chest is symmetrical and the breasts are those of a normal adult male. The abdomen is flat, without palpable organomegaly. The genitals are those of a normal circumcised adult male, with the testicles bilaterally descended into the scrotum.

The arms and hands are normally formed. The nailbeds are slightly cyanotic and the fingernails extend just beyond the fingertips. There is a large amount of blood on the hands and underneath the nails.

There are no needle tracks or needle marks. There are no tattoos. The legs are normally formed, without angularity or edema. The feet and toenails are unremarkable.

The back is straight and symmetrical and the anus is without injury.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

#1 GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT LUMBAR AREA:

Entrance – Labeled "A" in the diagram, centered approximately 24 %" from the top of the head and 1" to the right of posterior midline is a distant-type gunshot entrance wound, which measures 0.7 cm. in diameter. The wound is surrounded by nearly symmetric moist marginal abrasion, which measures up to 0.2 cm. in width. There is a scant amount of gray deposit on the moist inner edges of the wound. There is no gunpowder residue on the skin around the wound.

Path - After perforating skin and soft tissue of the right mid lumbar area, the bullet penetrates the spine at the level of T12. It passes across the spinal canal, injuring the spinal cord, and then enters the body of T12.

Exit - None.

Bullet - A bullet is recovered from the left side of the body of T12 vertebra.

Direction-of-fire - The bullet passes slight right-to-left, back-to-front and slightly upward.

#2 GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT POSTERIOR LOWER CHEST:

Entrance – Labeled "B" in the diagram, centered approximately 21 ½" from the top of the head and 2 ½" to the right of posterior midline, is a distant-type gunshot entrance wound, which measures 0.7 cm. in diameter. The wound is surrounded by asymmetric moist margin abrasion, which measures widest from the 4 o'clock to the 5 o'clock position, where it is 0.8 cm. in width. The remainder of the marginal abrasion measures no more than 0.2 cm. in width. There is no gunpowder residue on the skin around the wound, although there is a scant amount of gray deposit on the moist edges of the wound.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue, the bullet enters the right thoracic cavity through the right posterior tenth rib. It then perforates the lower portion of the right lower lobe, grooves the thoracic spine, perforates the distal thoracic aorta, perforates the posterior wall of the distal esophagus and perforates the lower lobe of the left lung.

The bullet then exits the left thoracic cavity through the left anterior fifth rib, producing a comminuted fracture. The bullet passes through subcutaneous soft tissue of the left chest wall and exits the body as described below.

Exit – Labeled "L" on the diagram on the left anterolateral chest, centered 18 ½" from the top of the head and 5 ½" to the left of anterior midline, is an irregular gunshot exit wound, which measures up to 1.3 cm. in diameter. A moderate amount of fat protrudes from the wound.

Direction-of-fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, back-to-front and upward at an angle of approximately 30 degrees.

#3 GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT POSTERIOR MID-CHEST:

Entrance – Labeled "C" in the diagram, on the right posterior mid-chest, centered approximately 19" from the top of the head and 4 1/4" to the right of posterior midline, is a distant-type gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion around the wound is slightly irregular and measures between 0.2 and 0.3 cm. in width. The widest areas of abrasion are from the 3 o'clock to the 6 o'clock position and the 10 o'clock to 12 o'clock position. There is no gunpowder residue around the wound.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue, the bullet enters the right thoracic cavity through the right posterior ninth rib. It then deeply grazes the thoracic spine, perforates the posterior aspect of the right lower lobe of the lung, enters the pericardial cavity and perforates the posterior wall of the left ventricle. The bullet then exits the left side of the pericardial cavity, perforates the lower lobe of the left lung and exits the left chest cavity in the left second intercostal space. The bullet then passes through musculature of the left anterior chest wall and crosses into the left upper arm through the deltoid muscle.

Exit – Labeled "K" on the diagram, on the left upper anterior arm, centered 4" from the top of the shoulder and 8 1/4" to the left of anterior midline is a gunshot exit wound, which is irregular and measures 1.4 cm. in maximum diameter. There is irregular abrasion from the 12 o'clock to the 5 o'clock position.

Direction-of-fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, back-to-front and upward at an angle of approximately 45 degrees from the horizontal plane.

#4 GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT POSTEROLATERAL MID CHEST:

Entrance – Labeled "D" on the diagram, on the right posterolateral chest, in line with the posterior axillary line, centered approximately 18" from the top of the head and 6 ½" to the

right of posterior midline, is a distant-type gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.6 cm. in diameter. Asymmetric moist marginal abrasion is around the wound and measures 0.4 cm. in width at the 2 o'clock position, and at the 7 o'clock position measures 0.1 cm. There is no gunpowder residue on the skin around this wound.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissue of the right back, the bullet enters the right thoracic cavity through the ninth posterior rib. It then perforates the lower lobe of the right lung, passes across the mediastinum, perforates the upper lobe of the left lung and exits the left thoracic cavity through the second rib. The bullet exits the body as described below.

Exit – Labeled "J" on the diagram, on the left anterior chest, centered 2 ½" below the left shoulder and 5" to the left of anterior midline, is an irregular gunshot exit wound, which measures a maximum diameter of 1.0 cm. There is abrasion from the 1 o'clock to the 4 o'clock position.

Direction-of-fire — The bullet passes from right-to-left, back-to-front and upward at an angle of approximately 45 degrees above the horizontal plane.

#5 GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT UPPER LATERAL CHEST:

Entrance – Labeled "E" on the diagram, on the right upper lateral chest, along the posterior axillary line, centered approximately 15" from the top of the head and 8 ½" to the right of posterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound that measures 0.7 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion is irregularly distributed around the wound and is widest from the 9 o'clock to the 12 o'clock position, where it measures 0.3 cm. in width. A scant amount of gray deposit is on the moist edges of the wound. There is no gunpowder residue on the skin around the wound.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissue of the right lateral chest, the bullet enters the thoracic cavity at the level of the sixth rib. It then passes upward through the right chest, perforating the upper lobe of the right lung and passing through anterior mediastinal soft tissues, anterior to the ascending aorta. The bullet then enters the left chest cavity, producing fragmentation of the left mid-clavicle and then passes across the subcutaneous soft tissues of the left shoulder.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A partially jacketed medium caliber projectile is recovered from the top of the left shoulder.

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Direction-of-fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, back-to-front and upward at an angle of approximately 30-40 degrees above the horizontal plane.

#6 GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT FOREARM:

Entrance – On the right lateral elbow, centered approximately 11" from the top of the right shoulder, is a distant-type gunshot entrance wound, which measures 0.6 cm. in diameter. Drying marginal abrasion around the wound is asymmetric and measures up to 0.6 cm. in width posteriorly and 0.1 cm. in width anteriorly.

Path – The bullet passes through subcutaneous soft tissue and muscle of the right forearm, producing no fractures.

Exit – Labeled "I" on the diagram, on the radial side of the right mid-forearm, centered approximately 5" above the wrist, is a gunshot exit wound, which measures 2.2 cm. in length and a maximum of 1.0 cm. in width. The wound is oriented vertically and has a small laceration on the posterior aspect. There is also a linear abrasion on the inferior aspect of the wound, which measures approximately 1.0 cm. in length.

Direction-of-fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from back-to-front and downward. The actual direction of fire depends on the position of the arm at the time of the injury.

#7 GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT DELTOID:

Entrance – Labeled "G" on the diagram, on the right deltoid area, centered approximately 2" below the top of the right shoulder and approximately 9" to the right of posterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures 0.7 cm. in maximum diameter. Marginal abrasion is slightly dried and asymmetric. The abrasion from the 11 o'clock to the 1 o'clock position measures 0.1 cm. in width and the abrasion around the remainder of wound circumference measures 0.2 cm. in width. There is no gunpowder residue on the skin around the wound.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissue of the right deltoid area, the bullet produces a comminuted fracture of the right upper humerus and proceeds anteriorly into the right pectoral muscle.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A medium caliber partially jacketed projectile is recovered from the right upper anterior chest, centered approximately 14 ½" from the top of the head and 2 ¾" to the right of anterior midline.

Direction-of-fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, back-to-front and very slightly downward.

#8 GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT WRIST:

Entrance – Labeled "H" on the diagram, on the left anterior radial wrist, centered approximately 10 3/4" below the left elbow, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter. There is irregular marginal abrasion around the wound, which is widest on the posterior aspect of the wound, where it measures 0.4 cm. in width.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue, the bullet follows a subcutaneous course.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A medium caliber, partially jacketed projectile is recovered from a subcutaneous position on the radial aspect of the left posterior wrist.

Direction-of-fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from right-to-left and very slightly downward.

OTHER INJURIES:

HEAD: Two very superficial abrasions on the right side of the head at the lateral orbital ridge and the zygoma measure up to 1.0 cm. in maximum size. A dry red superficial abrasion is in the submental area and measures 1.5 cm. in maximum size.

CHEST: A dry yellow leathery abrasion is on the right anterior chest at the costal margin and measures approximately 4.0 x 2.0 cm. A superficial abrasion on the right upper anterior chest above the nipple measures 1.5 x 0.7 cm. On the right posterior mid thorax, centered approximately 18" from the top of the head and 4" to the right of posterior midline is a patterned light purple mark, which has the appearance of a portion of a rectangle, with two corners. The long edge of the mark is medial, the two short sides project to the right and fade out. The long side of the rectangle measures 2 ½", the upper short side is 3½" and the lower short side is approximately ½". Incision of the skin over this mark reveals no subcutaneous hemorrhage.

ABDOMEN: Two dry red abrasions are on the right upper quadrant of the abdomen. The upper abrasion measures 1.5 cm. in its maximum size and the lower abrasion, which is just below the costal margin, measures approximately 4.0×2.5 cm. Dry red abrasion is on the left side of the abdomen below the costal margin and measures approximately 1.5×3.0 cm.

EXTREMITIES: An abrasion is on the right deltoid area, anterior to the gunshot wound and measures approximately 1.0 cm. in length. Two superficial abrasions are on the right antecubital fossa and measure 1.5 cm. in maximum size.

A superficial abrasion is on the left arm just above the ulnar aspect of the left elbow and measures 1.5 x 1.0 cm. Numerous vertically oriented superficial and deep incised wounds are on the left anterior wrist. The longest wound measures approximately 17.0 cm. in length. Two of the wounds are extremely deep and severed tendon and severed muscle in the forearm is visible in the depths of the wound. There are also some nerve injuries and major vascular injuries associated with these wounds.

Dry red-brown to yellow abrasions are on the right hip over the lateral and anterior iliac crest. The largest abrasion measures 2.5 cm. in largest dimension. Blister-like contusions are on the plantar surfaces of both heels. One has broken open and is oozing a small amount of blood.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is opened through an abdominal fat layer of 1.0 cm. and a muscle layer of 1.0 cm. at the level of the umbilicus. The internal organs are found in their normal positions and are covered by glistening serosal surfaces. There is approximately 350 cc. of liquid blood, mixed with sesame seeds in the right chest cavity, and 150 cc. of blood in the left chest cavity. There is no abnormal accumulation of blood or fluid within the pericardial sac, which is lacerated. There is no abnormal accumulation of fluid or blood in the abdominal cavity. Internal injuries have been described.

SYSTEMS REVIEW:

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM: The heart weighs 250 grams and is covered by glistening epicardium, with a small amount of epicardial fat. The coronary arteries arise normally and follow a right-dominant course, without atherosclerosis. Sections of the myocardium are firm, red-brown and finely fibrillar, without evidence of recent or old ischemic injury. Perforating wound of the left ventricle has been described. The heart is lined by glistening endocardium. The cardiac valves have their normal structure and the leaflets are thin and translucent, without calcification or vegetations. The coronary ostia are patent. The aorta follows a normal course through the chest and into the abdomen, and exhibits no

atherosclerosis. Perforating injury of the thoracic aorta has been described. Blood vessels contain very scant quantities of liquid blood.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: The right and left lungs together weigh 450 grams. Both are covered by glistening tan to purple pleural surfaces, with a moderate amount of subpleural anthracotic pigment deposition. There are multiple areas of subpleural hemorrhage. Perforating injuries have been described. The bronchi are patent and are lined by tan mucosa, which is coated with blood. There are no pulmonary thromboemboli. Cut surfaces of the lungs are generally tan, with moderate anthracosis. There are multiple focal areas of intraparenchymal hemorrhage, but no areas of consolidation or other focal lesions.

HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM: The liver weighs 1460 grams and is covered by a glistening light red-brown capsule. Cut surfaces are slightly soft and light red-brown, without lesions. The bile ducts are patent and the gallbladder is empty.

GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM: The intact esophagus is lined by tan mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 100 cc. of thick fluid, without identifiable food or medication particles. The gastric mucosa is unremarkable. The pylorus is patent and the duodenal contents are bile-stained. The remainder of the small intestine and large intestine are normal to inspection and palpation. The appendix is normal.

The pancreas is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are tan and lobulated, without lesions.

HEMATOPOIETIC SYSTEM: The spleen weighs 160 grams and is covered by a glistening light purple capsule. Cut surfaces are soft, with inconspicuous white pulp areas. Lymph nodes within the neck, chest and abdomen are unremarkable. The thymus is minimally replaced by fat.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM: The right and left kidneys together weigh 230 grams. The capsules strip with ease from both, revealing glistening purple cortical surfaces. Cut surfaces show clear demarcation between pale cortical and medullary areas. The renal calyces and pelves are not dilated and drain into ureters of normal caliber, which follow a normal course to the urinary bladder. The bladder contains approximately 450 cc. of clear amber urine, and is lined by unremarkable tan mucosa. The prostate is normal to sectioning. The testicles are normal to palpation within the scrotum.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM: The thyroid is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are light maroon and finely lobulated, without lesions. The adrenal glands are of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces show unremarkable golden cortical and maroon medullary areas. The pituitary is normal.

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NECK: There is no hemorrhage within the strap muscles, thyroid or posterior pharyngeal constrictors. The bony and cartilaginous structures of the larynx, and the hyoid bone, are intact. The larynx and trachea are patent and are lined by tan mucosa, which is coated with a small amount of blood. There is no abnormal mobility or crepitance of the cervical vertebrae.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM: The muscles are normally developed and consistent with those of an adult male. The skeleton is normally developed and consistent with that of an adult male. Fractures have been described.

HEAD: Reflection of the scalp reveals no subgaleal hemorrhage. The calvarium is intact. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage. Removal of the dura from the base of the skull reveals no hemorrhage or fractures. The pituitary and proximal spinal cord are intact.

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM: The fresh brain weighs 1400 grams and is covered by glistening transparent slightly edematous leptomeninges. The gyri are normally oriented and exhibit no significant flattening. Examination of the base of the brain reveals an intact circle of Willis, without atherosclerosis or aneurysms. The cranial nerves are intact. There is no uncal or cerebellar tonsillar herniation. There is no subarachnoid hemorrhage. The brainstem and cerebellum have their normal external appearance.

Sections of the cerebral hemispheres reveal an intact cortical ribbon and underlying white matter. The basal ganglia and thalamus have their normal appearance. The ventricles are not dilated and are lined by glistening ependyma, without intraventricular hemorrhage. Sections of the brainstem and cerebellum reveal an intact internal structure. The spinal cord is not removed. There is transection of the distal spinal cord.

TOXICOLOGY: A specimen of left chest cavity blood, urine, and gastric contents are

retained. A specimen of cardiac blood is placed on a FTA card.

HISTOLOGY: Representative tissues are retained.

PHOTOGRAPHS: 35 mm. photographs are obtained.

X-RAYS: X-rays of the chest and abdomen are obtained.

EVIDENCE: The clothing and property, recovered bullets, a FTA card and multiple



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Section I – Overview

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Note: Prior to reading this summary, it is recommended that the reader review the attached aerial photo to familiarize him/herself with the layout of the area.

On 4-8-03, Patrol Deputies from the Thousand Oaks Station responded to a report of a male subject cutting his wrist with a knife behind Stuft Crust Pizza near the intersection of Brazil and Moorpark Roads. Responding deputies eventually located the subject. They attempted to contact him and he fled. A foot chase ensued which covered a considerable distance and crossed varying terrain. During the foot pursuit Deputies were able to identify Daniels as the person being chased, based on prior contacts with some of the pursuing deputies. He was called to by name during the chase and told he was not in trouble and that deputies wanted to help him.

During the pursuit various means of force were used in an attempt to disarm and control Daniels. Deputy Fuller physically grabbed hold of Daniels and attempted to restrain him; however he let go for fear of being stabbed by Daniels, who was armed with an Exacto knife. Fuller then O.C.'d Daniels in an attempt to control him. Sr. Deputy Welty fired two rounds from his less lethal shotgun at Daniels in an additional attempt to gain compliance; the rounds missed Daniels.

The foot pursuit ended in the shooting of the Daniels by Sr. Dep. Camou as the he neared the entrance to a private swim school, which was in session with children and parents present in the pool area of the facility. The incident lasted approximately 26 minutes from the initial 911 call to the radio broadcast of "shots fired." The foot chase lasted for approximately 9 and ½ minutes. AMR Paramedics pronounced Daniels dead at the scene.

Investigators and Field Evidence Technicians (FET) responded to investigate the scene. A canvas of the area was conducted and witnesses were located and interviewed. FETs processed the scene, photographing and collecting evidence.

In the days following the shooting, additional interviews and follow-up investigation took place.

Additionally, aerial photographs of the area were taken to better illustrate the events as the took place.

II - Background

James Hanlon Daniels, date of birth was the son of live in the San Fernando Valley and is divorced from live in the San Fernando Valley an

A records check of Daniels past contacts with law enforcement reveal an extensive history of incidents in which Daniels has been involved. Documented incidents date back to 1989 when Daniels was listed as a possible victim of child molestation, the incident was referred to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department because the incident occurred in that county. Daniels next contact with law enforcement occurred in 1995 when his mother reported him as a runaway. Following this incident, and up to this current situation, Daniels was involved in an extensive number of incidents. The contacts with law enforcement varied from runaway reports, to arrests for alcohol violations, vandalism, auto theft, battery, drug possession, under the influence and burglary. There are well over 40 documented arrest, runaway and incident reports listing Daniels name.

As these incidents progressed through time, there was an increasing reference to his being emotionally troubled and having mental health issues (reference RB#02-60029). These incidents appear to come to a head in September of 2002 when Daniels battered his mother and told her she was going to die. Daniels was committed to Mental Health on an involuntary 5150 W&I commitment. In November of 2002, began to fear for her own safety with Daniels in the home. She told Daniels he had to move out of the house; a disturbance ensued in which Daniels threatened and told her she was going to die. Deputies responded and Daniels was told to leave the house and not return or he would be arrested for trespassing. He returned the following day and was arrested.

Subsequent to this, sought a restraining order (Court Case #SD028108) against Daniels, which barred him from coming to her home or harassing her. Daniels disobeyed this order and was arrested on several occasions for violating the court order. Throughout this time, Daniels was reportedly seeing mental health professionals for his mental illness, which was diagnosed as schizophrenia and Bi-Polar

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disorder. He was placed on psychotropic medications but, according to . did not take them consistently.

III – Daniels Activities Prior to Incident

As a result of Daniels most recent arrest, (1-15-03, RB# 03-1561) he was sentenced to county jail. He was released on April 1, 2003; seven days before this incident. Once released, Daniels returned to the Thousand Oaks area. According to Daniels was taking his psych medications while in custody but apparently stopped once he was released from jail. He did however tell her that he had a job referral, which was arranged for by the jail and an appointment with County Mental Health. In a phone call the day before the shooting, Daniels pleaded with his mother for permission to return home. refused to allow Daniels back in the home until he proved himself by getting a job and getting mental health services. She helped Daniels make sleeping arrangements for the night and asked a friend of Daniels to notify her after he arrived safely at his destination.

At approximately 0330 hours on 4-8-03 (the day of the shooting), Daniels was contacted by Deputy Jones on Moorpark Road near Wilbur Road. The contact was consensual. Daniels told Dep. Jones that he had been kicked out of his friend's house where he was staying because he smells and does not take showers. Daniels told Jones he was on his way to another friends house to see if he could stay there.

Dep. Jones learned that Daniels was on probation and conducted a probation search on Daniels. Dep. Jones located several pieces of paper with jail booking information on them. Jones also found a job referral in Daniels' pocket. Daniels told him he had an appointment with a job counselor in the morning. Daniels also said he had recently talked to his mother and was told that if he got a job he could come back to her house and live with her. Dep. Jones asked Daniels about any recent illicit drug use. Daniels denied using any drugs since being released from jail. Jones examined Daniels pupils but did not find any indicators of drug use. Jones completed a Field Interview Card on Daniels and let him continue on his way.

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At about 0415 hours, Dep. Jones again encountered Daniels. This time Daniels was in the parking lot of Stuft Crust Pizza. Unprompted, Daniels walked up to Dep. Jones' patrol car and spoke with him. Daniels told Dep. Jones his friend did not answer his door when he (Daniels) knocked. Dep. Jones asked Daniels what he planned to do. Daniels said he was going to go to Denny's and wait until the morning so he could call his mother. Daniels added that he wanted to take a shower before his meeting with the Job Counselor. Daniels ended the conversation by saying bye to Jones and walking off.

Later that same day, a family friend, _______, saw Daniel during the afternoon hours of 4-8-03 in the Vons Shopping Center on Janss and Moorpark Road. According to ______, Daniels said he was "sort of" taking his psych medications. ______ described Daniels demeanor as ok, but she felt that he was "brooding" over something. She also said he sounded despondent. Daniels asked for a few dollars and ______ gave him some.

The next documented contact with Daniels was when he was seen outside Stuft Crust Pizza cutting his wrists.

Section IV – 911 Call and Initial Response

The description of events contained in this overview is based on a combination of statements of involved deputies, radio traffic, citizen witnesses and physical evidence. When read, individual statements will vary in specific details based on the position of the viewer, their role in the event and their perception of what was occurring. This overview is intended as a general introduction to the incident only and not a definitive account of what transpired.

On 4-8-03 at approximately 1700 hours, patrons and employees of Stuft Crust Pizza saw a white male wearing dark clothing sitting in the rear parking lot of the restaurant. The subject (James Daniels) was cutting his wrist with what appeared to be a knife. At 1704 hours, a patron called 911 on his cell phone. That call was transferred to the Ventura County Sheriff's Department Dispatch Center. The Reporting Party (RP) described the subject to the dispatcher and told him that the subject (Daniels) was bleeding.

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The RP then watched as Daniels walked away from the area and up (north) Pennsfield Drive toward the 7-11 store on Wilbur Road.

The call was dispatched over the radio to Senior Deputy Camou (9151) at 1707 hours. Deputies Kelley, Blanck and Fuller responded as back-up. Deputy Blanck was on his fourth day of Field Training with Deputy Kelley as his training officer. Deputy Fuller was working alone and also responded to assist. Camou, Kelley, Blanck and Fuller were working as patrol deputies in the City of Thousand Oaks. They were wearing full department uniforms with badge, patches and utility (gun) belt. They drove marked black and white patrol cars which were readily identifiable as police cars.

Sr. Dep. Camou arrived in the area approximately 4 minutes after receiving the call. Sr. Dep. Camou began to check the area and advised the dispatcher and other responding deputies that the subject (Daniels) was possibly in the apartments on Laurie Lane.

Deputies Kelley and Blanck arrived and parked their patrol car on Laurie Lane and began to check the area on foot. Deputy Fuller arrived and began to search the area from his patrol car. Sr. Dep. Camou also continued to search the area for the subject from his patrol car. Deputy Mayo, a Crisis Intervention Team member, heard the call and self dispatched himself to the call and began to drive to the area.

Section V – Foot Pursuit of Daniels

At approximately 1720 hours, Deputies Kelley and Blanck walked into the west alley of the Biltmore Apartments. The Biltmore Apartments are located on Laurie Lane and there is an alleyway/parking area behind (west of) the apartments. Dep. Kelley and Blanck looked north toward Wilbur Road. They saw Sr. Dep. Camou turn southbound into the alley from eastbound Wilbur Road. Sr. Dep. Camou's patrol car was then facing them about 50 yards away. At about this same time, Dep. Blanck saw a male subject matching the suicidal subjects description walk into the alleyway from the apartments. The subject was behind Sr. Dep. Camou's patrol car (north of the patrol car and closer to Wilbur Road).

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Dep. Blanck yelled to Sr. Dep. Camou that the subject was possibly behind him. Sr. Dep. Camou stopped his patrol car and got out in an attempt to contact the subject. The subject immediately ran from Sr. Dep. Camou. Sr. Deputy Camou began to chase the subject, who was running north across Wilbur Road. Dep. Blanck and Kelley also began to run after the subject.

Dep. Blanck and Kelley ran north in the alleyway. When they reached Camou's patrol car, Dep. Kelley got into the car intending to use it to catch up to the chase. Dep. Blanck remained on foot and crossed Wilbur Road following the path he saw Camou and the subject take.

Note: The reader is again referred to the aerial photo of the scene to orient themselves with the layout of the north side of the 100 block of Wilbur Road and the path traveled by the subject and pursuing deputies.

Dep. Blanck saw Camou chase the subject into the driveway of 155 East Wilbur Road. The driveway also serves as access to the Glen Oaks Apartments (145 E. Wilbur Road) and the Daland Swim School (135 E. Wilbur Road), there are several small parking areas which branch off of the main driveway at each of the referenced locations. Camou and the subject turned immediately east and ran across a small parking area, which is in front of 155 E. Wilbur and fronts Wilbur Road.

Dep. Blanck ran across Wilbur Road and into the same parking area. He could no longer see Camou and the subject, but saw a cinderblock wall at the east end of the parking area. Blanck ran to the wall and saw a bloody handprint on top of the wall. Dep. Blanck jumped the wall and found himself in a large vacant field, but he still could not see Sr. Dep. Camou or the subject.

At about this time, Sr. Dep. Camou transmitted on the radio, "Go to the other apartments." Dep. Blanck ran parallel with Wilbur Road, east toward the Shadow Oaks Apartments. Dep. Blanck then turned north and ended up near the Edison Power plant, which is west of the Shadow Oaks Apartments.

While Dep. Blanck was on foot trying to follow Camou and the subject, Dep. Kelley got into Sr. Dep. Camou's patrol car. He turned the car around (it had been facing south, away from Wilbur Road.) and

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drove east on Wilbur Road. He heard Camou's transmission about going to the apartments and another transmission about the subject being in a wash, north of Wilbur Road, heading toward the power plant.

Dep. Kelley turned into the parking lot of 187 East Wilbur Road. The building at this address backs up to the power plant, which is to the north. Dep. Kelley drove east then north in the parking lot toward the perimeter fence of the power plant. As Kelley neared the power plant fence line, he saw the subject running east along the fence toward the Shadow Oaks Apartments. Deputy Kelley got out of the patrol car and began to chase the subject who was now out of sight. Deputy Kelley did not see Sr. Dep. Camou chasing the subject. However, it should be noted that in order to access the power plant fence line from Dep. Kelley's location it is necessary to climb a retaining wall and push through some low hanging tree branches.

When the foot pursuit started, Dep. Fuller was in the same alleyway as everyone else, but further to the south. Fuller saw the subject walk into the alley and Sr. Dep. Camou get out of his car and begin to chase the subject. Fuller drove north through the alley in an attempt to catch up to the chase. He drove across Wilbur Road and into the driveway of 155 East Wilbur Road. Dep. Fuller had his lights and siren activated. The subject turned his head and looked back at Fuller. Dep. Fuller recognized the subject as someone he had dealt with before. The subject ran to the east end of the parking area and jumped a wall into a field to the east. Fuller drove to the north end of the driveway, which also accessed Glen Oaks and Daland Swim School. The driveway came to a dead end after the Daland Swim School, so Dep. Fuller drove back to Wilbur Road and turned east toward the Shadow Oaks Apartments.

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Fuller drove his patrol car to the northwest corner of the Shadow Oaks Apartments. This corner of the apartments is immediately east of the northeast corner of the power plant. If Daniels turned north along the power plant fence line, he would pass by Fuller at this location. Dep. Fuller stood on top of a chain link fence separating the apartments and an open, bush filled area, that runs along the east side of the Power Plant perimeter fence. As Fuller stood in this location he heard deputies near his location. Fuller then saw Daniels crouching down near him.

Daniels stood up and attempted to run past Fuller. Fuller reached out and grabbed Daniels by the jacket. Fuller jumped off the fence and pulled Daniels against the fence, which was now between them. Fuller could see that Daniels was bleeding from his left wrist. He also saw Daniels holding a penknife in his Fuller yelled to the other deputies that he had hold of Daniels.

As Fuller was holding onto Daniels, he (Daniels) began to cut his left wrist with the knife. According to Fuller, he, "could see down to the bone." Daniels showed no expression of pain. At this point Fuller yelled to Daniels, "Hey! You are not in trouble. We are here to help you." Daniels ignored Fuller. Fuller began to fear that Daniels might cut him. Dep. Fuller drew his handgun and pointed it at Daniels. Fuller said that as he did this he feared that Daniels might see his gun and force him (Fuller) to shoot him. Fuller then holstered his gun.

Daniels put the knife in his mouth and started to remove the jacket that Fuller was holding. Fuller let go of the jacket and tried to grab the knife from Daniels' mouth. Daniels grabbed the knife from his mouth before Fuller could get it. Daniels continued to try to take his jacket off. Fuller decided to pepper spray Daniels. Fuller sprayed Daniels on the side of his face, however Daniels showed no sign of being affected by the pepper spray. Fuller was slightly affected by the pepper spray and stepped back from the fence. Sr. Dep. Camou and Deputies Kelley and Blanck ran through the left over O.C. cloud from Dep. Fuller's attempt to control Daniels. Daniels ran west from the location into a field, which runs the length of the power plant on the north side and backs up to the rear yards of houses on the south side of Gallsworthy Street. At some point during the confrontation between Fuller and Daniels, Fuller got blood on him.

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Sr. Dep. Camou, Deputies Kelley, Blanck and Mayo then arrived at Fuller's location. Fuller told them what direction Daniels had run. He told them they would need less lethal to try and gain control over Daniels. Deputy Mayo said he had a less lethal shotgun in the trunk of his patrol car, which was parked on Wilbur Road.

Deputy Mayo jumped the fence, which separated he and Dep. Fuller. Fuller and Mayo then drove in Fuller's patrol car to Wilbur Road so Mayo could retrieve his less lethal shotgun. Sr. Dep. Camou, Deputy Kelley and Deputy Blanck continued to chase Daniels. Camou, Kelley and Blanck pushed through some bushes in the direction Daniels had run. When they broke through the brush into the field, they saw Daniels in front of them. They followed Daniels northwest through the field to a fence that separates the field from the backyards of houses along Gallsworthy Street. During this time the Deputies were calling to Daniels by name telling him to drop the knife and that things would be ok.

While walking in the field, Daniels repeatedly cut his left wrist and forearm with the knife. According to Deputy Kelley, Daniels did not react to the pain of his wounds and was in a trance like state; nothing anyone said to him made a difference.

When Daniels was about half way across the field he stopped and tried to climb a fence into the backyard of a house on Gallsworthy. For an unknown reason, Daniels stopped his attempt, took off his jacket and hung it on the fence. Daniels then continued walking. He now walked southwest through the field. The Deputies followed and continued to call to Daniels, telling him to put down the knife and to stop so they could help him. Dep. Kelley recalled that sometime during this period, Daniels yelled back at them, "Just shoot me." Daniels did not say anything further at that time.

Daniels and the deputies then reached the northwest corner of the Power Plant. The west side of the Power Plant is also the eastern property line of the Daland Swim School and Glenn Oaks Apartments. There is a narrow strip of hedges, which run along the western perimeter fence of the Power Plant and the fence for the eastern perimeter of the Daland Swim School and the Glenn Oaks Apartments.

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Daniels began to walk south along the Power Plant fence line. Sr. Dep. Camou, Dep. Kelley and Dep. Blanck followed Daniels. The deputies noticed the swim school was in session. There were children swimming in the pool and parents sitting outside the pool in various locations. Sr. Dep. Camou yelled through the fence to the people at the swim school. He told the adults to get the children out of the pool. Deputy Kelley and some of the parents at the swim school heard Sr. Dep. Camou yelling for the kids to get out of the pool. Several parents also saw what was taking place. The children were removed from the pool area and sheltered in the bathrooms of the swim school.

Camou, Kelley and Blanck continued to follow Daniels as he moved south along the fence of the swim school and Power Plant. They then passed by the rear of the Glenn Oaks Apartments. When they reached the southwest corner of the Power Plant, Daniels emerged from the brush-lined fence onto a blacktopped driveway that provides access to the Power Plant from Wilbur Road. He began to walk south on the driveway toward Wilbur Road.

Deputy Kristol was working patrol and responded to assist with the incident. She heard the progression of the foot chase and positioned herself at the bottom of the driveway, which accesses the Power Plant. She saw Daniels emerge from the bushes and begin to run down the driveway toward her. As he did this a male voice told her over the radio, "Michelle, he's not gonna stop for you." Kristol drew her handgun, pointed it at Daniels and yelled for him to stop approximately four times. Daniels did not comply with Dep. Kristol's directives.

Prior to reaching Dep. Kristol's location, Daniels turned west and ran through a gap in some hedges. Daniels was now in the same vacant field he had run through earlier. The same field Dep. Blanck had chased Camou and Daniels into but could not find them.

Daniels ran west through the field to a wall that separates the field from one of the small parking areas, which are accessible from the driveway Daniels had originally run into. Daniels jumped onto the wall and sat facing west. His back was to Camou, Kelley and Blanck who had followed him into the field.

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As Daniels was turning west into the vacant field, Sr. Dep. Welty and Dep. Bonebright were arriving to assist with the incident. Both Deputies had less lethal shotguns with them and removed them from their patrol cars for use. They ran up the driveway Daniels had just been on and then west into the vacant field. They were at the south end of the field and could see Daniels north of them sitting on a wall. While sitting on the wall, Daniels again began to cut his left wrist. Deputies described the cutting action of Daniels as looking like he was "cutting a piece of steak." Again, Daniels seemed oblivious to the pain and did not respond to any of the directions being given to him.

Daniels then jumped down to the east side of the wall and began to walk/jog west toward the main driveway (the one he had originally run into at the beginning of the chase.) Sr. Dep. Welty ran to the wall Daniels had been sitting on; he (Welty) was at the wall a few yards south of where Daniels had been sitting. He saw Daniels heading away from him. Sr. Dep. Welty fired two rounds from his less lethal shotgun at Daniels. At the time, Welty felt he may have struck Daniels in the lower back and leg area with the rounds; however, if hit, Daniels did not react to the impacts.

Daniels reached the main driveway, which provides access to the professional building at 155 E. Wilbur, the Glenn Oaks Apartments (145 E. Wilbur) and the Daland Swim School (125 E. Wilbur). From this location Daniels could have turned south and walked a short distance back to Wilbur Road or turned north, up the driveway toward the Glenn Oaks Apartments and the Daland Swim School. Daniels turned north and began to walk (north) up the driveway toward the apartments and swim school.

Sr. Dep. Camou and Deputies Kelley and Blanck jumped the wall Daniels had been sitting on and continued to chase him. They too turned north up the driveway.

Section VI – Area of Shooting

At the top (north end) of the driveway is the Daland Swim School. The swim school has a building, which fronts the driveway; behind the building are the swimming pools used to teach swimming. As the driveway nears the southern portion of the swim school property there is a noticeable increase in the incline of the driveway. On the west side of the driveway there is a small planter, which is planted with

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small plants and a few trees. On the east side of the driveway is a sidewalk that runs along the front of the school. The sidewalk runs north for a few yards and then turns east to accommodate two handicapped parking stalls in front of the office building. As one continues north up the driveway there are other, non-handicap, parking stalls along the front of the swim school. At the time of the shooting, there was a black Mercedes SUV parked along the sidewalk curb in front of the swim school. The handicap stalls were empty and a mini van was parked in the first parking stall north of the handicapped stalls.

Deputy Kelley was moving north along the driveway with Sr. Dep. Camou, and Dep. Blanck. As they neared the front of the swim school, Dep. Kelley saw Camou move up and place himself between Daniels and the swim school. Kelley heard Camou tell Daniels, "Look, I can't let you go in there. I can't let you go there." After telling Daniels this, Camou fired a "couple" shots at Daniels. Dep. Kelley said Daniels didn't really react to the shots. Daniels continued to walk north on the driveway. Sr. Dep. Camou then fired a second round of shots at Daniels. Daniels then fell to the ground.

Deputy Blanck followed Daniels up the driveway along with Camou and Kelley. Dep. Blanck said he was about 20 feet away from Deputies Kelley and Sr. Dep. Camou when the shots were fired. Dep. Blanck said that while following Daniels up the driveway, he (Daniels) was continually told to stop, put the knife down and not to go any further.

An employee of the Daland Swim School, had been walking to his car, which was parked on Wilbur Road, when the foot chase began. saw the deputies chasing Daniels up the alleyway behind the Biltmore Apartments and across Wilbur Road. [It should be noted that did not know the identity of Daniels, I am referring to Daniels by name for clarity sake.] saw that Daniels had a knife and that his hands were bloody. ran to the west to get out of the way. saw a police car (Fuller) drive between him and Daniels.

saw Daniels turn east and jump a fence into a vacant field to the east. said he is familiar with the area and knew that Daniels could access the back of the swim school (i.e. swimming pools) by running north to the Power Plant. Knowing this, ran back up the driveway to the swim school. He ran to the back (east) fence of the school and looked for the deputies.

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Daniels continued to walk northbound toward the school. Saw one deputy (Camou) walk up on Daniels right side until he was almost even with Daniels. Sr. Dep. Camou told Daniels, "Stop. Don't walk any further." Daniels continued walking northbound and now, according to toward a parked car that contained a couple of children and a woman. At this time, Sr. Dep. Camou shot Daniels twice.

The second shot caused Daniels right shoulder and torso to move to the left as if he had been shot in the back of the shoulder. remembers the deputy with the florescent shotgun moving to the north of Sr. Dep. Camou. According to , after Daniels was shot he turned and began to step toward the deputy with the florescent shotgun. At this same time another deputy began to move forward and told to get out of the way. back toward the pool. did this, he heard three to four more shots. Went into the pool area and entered the office, which looks out on the parking lot. He looked out the office window and saw Daniels lying face down on was asked what he heard the deputies tell Daniels before he was shot. "They're yelling at him, telling him to put the knife down, put the knife down. Don't walk any further. Stop. Stop. But I think the officer who noticed, who shot first, noticed either me or someone else nearby and feared for their safety and shot him right away." At the time of the shooting a mother, her daughter and her daughter's friend were in a mini-van parked in front of the swim school. They were interviewed and gave accounts of what took place that were similar and Dep. Kelley. The mother, , attempted to avert the girls attention from what was taking place, thus their visual account of the actual shooting is somewhat limited. After the shooting, other Sr. Deputies and Deputies responded to the scene. Sr. Deputy Streltzoff arrived and stood by with Sr. Deputy Camou after the shooting. While standing with Camou, he (Camou) made unsolicited comments about the incident. Sr. Dep. Camou told Streltzoff that Daniels kept cutting himself with an Exacto knife. Camou also said that Daniels began to run in the direction of the Daland Swim School. Camou said he was concerned about the safety of the children at the swim school and he told Daniels to stop because children were present. Sr. Deputy Reilley responded to the scene and drove with Sr. Dep. Camou and Streltzoff to the East Valley Station. During the drive, Sr. Dep. Camou asked if Deputy Fuller was O.K. because he (Camou) saw that he had blood on him.

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Sr. Dep. Camou was sequestered at the East Valley Station. Sr. Dep. Camou then met with legal counsel and elected not to give a statement to Major Crimes Detectives at the time. Through Camou's attorney, we were told that a statement at a later time might be considered.

Section VII - Crime Scene Investigation

Immediately after the shooting, responding deputies began to secure the crime scene and log those authorized persons entering the protected areas. The crime scene was extensive in that it spanned several blocks and varied terrain. Detectives and Field Evidence Technicians responded to the scene to begin investigating the incident. A briefing was held and detectives were given assignments and interviews to conduct. Evidence was located, marked, photographed and collected. Sr. Dep. Popp arrived and, using a laser-marking device, plotted the position of physical evidence in the area of the less lethal shotgun use and the shooting of Daniels. All evidence was collected by Field Evidence Technicians and booked by them at the Crime Lab in Ventura.

The area of the less lethal shotgun use was examined and two shotgun shell casings were located in a location consistent with Sr. Deputy Welty's statement concerning his use of the weapon. The beanbags fired from his weapon were located to the west of his location with shotgun wadding located in various locations between the casings and the beanbags.

The area of the shooting was also examined. Examination of this scene revealed a number of items of physical evidence. The locations of the evidence was consistent with statements made by citizen witnesses and deputies at the scene. A total of eight (8) 9MM casings were located along the east curb line of the swim school. The casings were loosely grouped with four (4) casings being located just south of the school entrance, three (3) casings further north in front of the school and one (1) casing between the two groups of casings. A gunbelt keeper was located near the grouping of three casings. Sr. Dep. Camou made the statement that he took off one of his keepers and threw it to the ground in order to mark the area he had fired from.

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The knife used by Daniels was located on the ground along the west side of the driveway. The knife had been purposefully kicked to its position of rest by deputies while securing Daniels after the shooting.

Some of Daniels clothing, which had been cut from his body by paramedics was also located

VIII - Autopsy

At 0830 hours, on April 9th, 2003, an autopsy was preformed on James Daniels body. Dr. performed the Autopsy. Sgt. Lorenzen, Field Evidence Technician and I attended the examination.

During the Autopsy, eight (8) distant gunshot entrance wounds were identified. There were four (4) gunshot exit wounds located on the body and four (4) bullets located inside the body. Dr. was able to track the path of the bullets as they entered, exited or came to rest inside the body. The trajectory of the rounds appeared to be consistent with the verbal accounts of the shooting given by deputies and citizen witnesses.

There were other wounds on the body, which included several abrasions. These abrasions could have been caused when Daniels was pulled backward after the shooting to reveal the knife, which was under his body. However, most the notable of injuries to Daniels body were two extremely deep and long lacerations to the left wrist area.

The lacerations ran from the base of the hand/wrist area up the forearm. They were approximately 4-5 inches long. The wounds were open and extended down to the bone. These lacerations severed the muscle, tendons, nerves and small blood vessels located in the wrist.

There were also numerous, less severe, cuts extending the length of the forearm around the two deeper lacerations. These wounds were less horrific and varied in depth and length. None of these wounds were deep enough to cause the skin layers to separate as the two major injuries had.

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Dr. concluded the cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds and the manner of death was classified as homicide, due to interaction with deputies.

Section IX - Observations and Conclusion

The incident began as a suicidal subject call. Five uniformed deputies responded to the scene. Sr. Deputy Camou was the primary unit assigned to the incident. Field Training Officer Kelley and his Trainee, Deputy Blanck, responded for training and Deputy Fuller a nearby beat car also went to the scene. The fifth Deputy, Crisis Intervention Team member, Mayo began his self-initiated response, but was across town at the time the incident started.

By all accounts, Daniels was in an altered mental state from the onset of this incident. Patrons and employees at Stuft Crust Pizza saw Daniels cut himself and display no sign of pain. When the Manager of Stuft Crust Pizza approached Daniels, he left the parking area he had been sitting in. Daniels' specific direction of travel is somewhat unknown after he left the pizza parking lot.

At the time of initial contact between Daniels and the deputies, his identity was unknown. Sr. Deputy Camou attempted to contact Daniels, however, Daniels immediately fled by running north across Wilbur Road. Crisis Intervention Techniques could not be employed as they require some level of containment and the ability to create a dialogue with the person in crisis. This is not possible in a foot chase.

The foot chase itself covered a large distance and traversed many different types of terrain. These factors are significant to note for several reasons. By traveling such a long distance, the ability of other responding deputies to create a perimeter and contain the scene was greatly diminished. The constantly changing terrain not only slowed the deputy's pursuit of Daniels, but also created an entirely new level of safety concerns for them as they proceeded. They were moving through heavy brush and overhanging trees, which could conceal Daniels. They were along side a high voltage power station and were constantly assessing the volatility of the situation as they neared populated areas such as the Shadow Oaks Apartments, the backyards of Gallsworthy, the Glenn Oaks Apartments and finally the Daland Swim School.

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As the foot pursuit progressed, deputies were able to identify Daniels by name. They were then able to call to him on a more personal level, calling him by name and assuring him he was not in trouble, would not be arrested and that everything could be worked out. Daniels did not respond or acknowledge the deputies statements. His only recognition of their presence was his continued flight from them. Again, Daniels continuous flight from the deputies prevented any containment or organized attempt to defuse the situation.

Various uses of force were employed in an attempt to gain control over Daniels. Additionally, the way in which the force was used and the decision making of the deputies involved showed a high degree of insight and thoughtfulness while dealing with the situation.

Deputy Fuller physically grabbed hold of Daniels and attempted to restrain him. While holding Daniels, Fuller began to fear that Daniels may use the knife on him. Fuller drew his handgun and pointed it at Daniels. This would be a legitimate escalation of force and self-protective measure given that Fuller was physically engaged with a knife-wielding subject. Deputy Fuller however, decided to holster his weapon for fear that Daniels would see the gun and force him (Fuller) to shoot.

Daniels then placed the knife in his mouth and tried to remove the jacket Deputy Fuller had hold of. Deputy Fuller then let go of the jacket and tried to disarm Daniels by grabbing the knife. This action placed Deputy Fuller at risk of personal injury by the possibility of cutting himself on the knife or becoming entangled in a hand-to-hand fight with Daniels. However, Deputy Fuller was the only person in the position to evaluate his actions and felt it was a safe maneuver to attempt. Unfortunately, Daniels saw Fuller reaching for the knife and removed it before Fuller could grab the knife.

Deputy Fuller then decided to spray Daniels with pepper spray. Fuller did so and sprayed Daniels on the side of his face. Daniels was unaffected by the pepper spray and ran away. Deputy Fuller was slightly affected by the residual pepper spray, which again illustrates that Daniels was in some altered state and was not responding to outside stimuli.

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As Sr. Dep. Camou and Deputies Kelley and Blanck reached Fuller's location, Sr. Dep. Camou must have seen the blood that Deputy Fuller got on him while struggling with Daniels. This is evident because later, after the shooting, Camou asked if Dep. Fuller was O.K. and then said he saw blood on him. This certainly added to the factors Sr. Dep. Camou was aware of as the incident unfolded.

As the foot chase progressed, Daniels and the pursuing deputies approach the back fence of the Daland Daniels reached the fence, which separates the empty Swim School. According to witness field and the upper parking lot of the swim school and put his hands on the fence. Daniels had already climbed and attempted to climb other fences. Dep. Kelley stated in his interview that he thought Daniels was going to "hop" the fence at this point. Daniels instead turned and walked south along the fence line. Sr. Deputy Camou and the deputies noticed the swim school was in session and there were children in the pool and adults sitting around the pool.

Sr. Dep. Camou yelled to the people at the swim school and told them to get the children out of the pool and inside the building. This again added to the factors being weighed by the pursuing deputies as they followed Daniels.

Daniels continued south along the fence line and then out onto the driveway that provides access from Wilbur Road to the Power Plant. As Daniels traveled south he was confronted, at a distance, by Dep. Kristol, who ordered him to stop at gunpoint. Instead of stopping, Daniels turned west and ran into the vacant field. Daniels ran west across the field and sat atop the block wall at the western edge of the field. With his back to the pursuing deputies, Daniels continued to cut his wrists.

Sr. Deputy Welty had arrived in the area about this same time. Welty had a less lethal shotgun in his trunk and deployed it for use in the chase. Welty ran into the vacant field from the south end and saw Daniels on the wall. He began to run to that area of the field, when Daniels jumped down to the west side of the wall and began to run westbound through the parking lot. Deputy Welty reached the wall and fired two less lethal rounds at Daniels. At the time, Welty felt that his rounds may have hit Daniels in the lower back and leg area. If he had been hit by the rounds, Daniels did not respond in any visible manner.

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Deputies followed Daniels as he turned north up the driveway that leads to the Daland Swim School. As they neared the school, Sr. Dep. Camou began telling Daniels that he could not go there (referring to the school). On more than one occasion, Camou told Daniels to stop and that he would not be allowed to continue. Sr. Dep. Camou then physically moved himself between Daniels and the Daland Swim School.

Sr. Dep. Camou then fired at Daniels as he was continuing to move up the driveway toward the school. It is unknown if Sr. Dep. Camou had seen standing at the entrance to the school or the mother and two children in the mini-van in front of the school, although it was opinion that Camou had seen him and/or the people in the van.

After firing the initial rounds at Daniels, he (Daniels) continued to walk up the driveway. According to Daniels was now walking toward the mini-van, which contained Mrs. children. Sr. Dep. Camou again moved up along side Daniels and fired additional rounds at him. Daniels then fell to the ground. After falling to the ground, the knife Daniels was carrying was removed from his reach and medical treatment was called for.

It can be concluded that Sr. Deputy Camou was aware of the following factors before shooting Daniels.

- Daniels was armed with an Exacto knife, which has a very sharp blade. [Radio Transcript- Book 1, tab 3; pg. 6, pg. 8, line 26 (Exacto knife)]
- Daniels was inflicting serious injury to himself with no visible reaction to the pain such injuries would cause.
 - [Statement/Interview of Dep. Kelley-Book 2, tab 4; page 7 of 14]
- Daniels was unresponsive to commands and other verbal attempts to calm him and resolve the situation.
 - [Multiple statements of deputies and citizen witnesses- Book 2]
- Daniels has had past law enforcement contacts and deputies involved in the foot pursuit broadcast that his mother had a restraining order against him. [Radio Transcript-Book 1, tab 3; page 7, Line 14]

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> Deputy Fuller had attempted to physically restrain Daniels without success and may have been injured in the process.

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[Report by Sr. Dep. Reilly- Book 2, tab 1; page 1 of 2]

- Deputy Fuller also used his pepper spray on Daniels with no visible effect.
 [Statement/Interview of Dep. Kelley-Book 2, tab 4; page 5 of 14]
- Daniels had climbed walls and pushed his way through thick brush in his attempt to flee and showed the willingness to climb other obstacles in his way.
 [Radio Transcript]
- Daniels did not respond to being given orders at gunpoint (i.e. Dep. Kristol)
 [Statement/Interview of Dep. Kristol-Book 2, tab 6; page 2 of 5]
- Daniels may have been struck by less lethal rounds and did not visibly react to the rounds. [Radio Transcript-Book 1, tab 3; page 9, line 16]
- Daniels was walking toward a swim school where there were confirmed children and adults taking shelter as a result of the incident.

The Major Crimes investigation of this incident did not include a statement by Sr. Deputy Camou. As a result, Senior Deputy Camou's specific observations, perceptions, impressions and state of mind are not known.

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Over several days, investigators interviewed those deputies who were on scene and had interacted with Daniels during a foot pursuit that lasted several minutes. Investigators interviewed all known witnesses, documented the location of evidence and photographed the entire scene.

At the conclusion of the Sheriff's investigation, Major Crimes Detectives furnished a copy of their case file (approximately 450 pages) to Deputy District Attorney and Senior Investigator for review.

After a lengthy review by the District Attorney's Office, they released their overview and "conclusion" into the shooting death of Daniels.

In reviewing the District Attorney's findings, they concluded, "the killing of James Daniels cannot be conclusively determined to be a justifiable homicide absent any statement from Sr. Deputy Camou. However, a reasonable conclusion to be drawn from the circumstantial evidence surrounding the shooting is that he (Camou) honestly and reasonably believed that

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the children and adults present in and around the swim school were in imminent danger when Daniels, who refused to relinquish the knife, approached the school. The law relating to circumstantial evidence would require a judge or jury to adopt that interpretation of the evidence. Therefore, no criminal charges will be filed in connection with this homicide".

Based on the above, this case in deemed "closed".

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I. INTRODUCTION

On April 8, 2003, at 5:04 p.m., the Ventura County Sheriff's Department received a 911 call regarding a man in the area of the intersection of Moorpark Road and Wilbur Road in Thousand Oaks who was cutting himself with a knife. Deputies from the Ventura County Sheriff's Department responded and located 19-year-old James Daniels. When they attempted to contact him, he ran. Several deputies pursued Daniels on foot and in vehicles. They saw that Daniels had a knife in his right hand and was deeply cutting the wrist area of his left arm. Throughout the pursuit, deputies implored Daniels to drop the knife. At various times during the incident, the deputies used less than lethal force, including oleo capsicum (O.C.) spray and beanbag shotgun rounds in an attempt to disarm him. All of the deputies who came in contact with Daniels during the incident reported that Daniels appeared to be in a trance-like state and was non-responsive to every command and order. Ultimately, the pursuit terminated in the driveway area of the Daland Swim School where Senior Deputy Vincent Camou shot and killed Daniels.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Department conducted a detailed investigation of the shooting which included interviewing all known witnesses, documenting the location of physical evidence, collecting and analyzing the physical evidence, photographing the entire area of the foot pursuit and shooting, including aerial photos, preparing detailed diagrams and charts documenting the scene, and conducting a lengthy investigation into the background of James Daniels.

The Sheriff's Department immediately notified the District Attorney's Office after the shooting and Senior Investigator and Senior Deputy District Attorney responded. Sheriff's personnel conducted walk-through reenactments of the shooting while they briefed the District Attorney staff.

The sole purpose of the District Attorney's investigation and evaluation of the shooting was to determine whether Senior Deputy Vincent Camou's use of deadly force, which resulted in the death of James Daniels, was lawful or unlawful. The District Attorney's investigation and evaluation of the incident did not address the tactics or police procedures used by members of the Ventura County Sheriff's Department in responding to this situation.

The District Attorney's review team consisted of Senior Attorney who authored this report, and Senior Investigator The District Attorney's review included studying approximately 450 pages of reports including interviews of police and civilian witnesses, evidence collection at the scene and the autopsy report of Dr. They listened to the tape recordings of all the interviews, reviewed several hundred photographs and diagrams of the entire scene and the transcripts of 911 and radio traffic, and reviewed a law enforcement training video entitled "Surviving Edged Weapons." Additionally, approximately 540 pages of reports pertaining to Daniels' previous contacts with Ventura County law enforcement and mental health personnel were reviewed.

The District Attorney's investigation did not include a review of any formal statement by Senior Deputy Camou. Although he made several spontaneous statements to two deputies at the scene

of the shooting, Camou exercised his rights to remain silent and chose not to provide a statement to the Sheriff's detectives conducting the investigation. Further, he declined a subsequent written request for an interview by the District Attorney's investigation team.

After a complete review of all the evidence, it is the conclusion of the District Attorney that the shooting death of James Daniels cannot be conclusively deemed justified. It is likely that Senior Deputy Camou shot and killed James Daniels in the honest belief that deadly force was necessary to protect the civilians in and around the swim school. Unfortunately, it is impossible to determine exactly what Senior Deputy Camou was thinking at the time of the shooting without a statement from him. However, a "reasonable interpretation" of the available evidence supports the conclusion that Camou honestly and reasonably believed deadly force was necessary to prevent imminent danger to himself or others and therefore acted in lawful defense of himself or others. In California, the law of circumstantial evidence requires a judge or jury to "adopt a reasonable interpretation of the evidence that points to innocence" and reject other reasonable interpretations of the evidence. California Criminal Jury Instructions 2.00. Therefore, no criminal charges will be filed against Senior Deputy Camou in connection with the shooting death of James Daniels.

II. STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. BACKGROUND OF JAMES HANLON DANIELS

James Daniels was born to to By all accounts, he showed signs of mental illness from a young age. During his adolescent years,

those indicators grew exponentially and Daniels had frequent contacts with both local law enforcement and Ventura County Mental Health.¹

Daniels' contacts with law enforcement began in 1989, when he was six years old and reported that he had been molested by his maternal grandfather. The investigation never resulted in criminal charges because Daniels' claims could not be corroborated by any other available evidence. Since that time, Daniels had frequent contacts with law enforcement as a runaway and as a suspect in crimes involving vandalism, battery and theft. Some of the earlier reports mention Daniels' use of prescribed psychiatric medication and supervision by a psychiatric social worker.

By the spring of 2000, when Daniels was 16 years old, frequent contacts with law enforcement revealed his alcohol and substance abuse. In one report to a Ventura County Deputy Sheriff, Daniels' mother, described him as "extremely unmanageable" and "out of control."


On July 24, 2000, deputies answered a 911 call of an out-of-control teenager at Mrs. residence. of Ventura County Mental Health also responded to the home. Upon arrival, Deputy Buschow learned that Daniels stated he had taken a single Clonopin to "see if he could maintain the high he got the night before from drinking alcohol." When Deputy Buschow went to locate Daniels, he found him locked inside the

bathroom "moaning softly and howling like a coyote." Daniels suddenly came out of the bathroom towards Deputy Buschow. Ultimately, Daniels was brought to the hospital because he was "irrational, uncooperative and threatening." He continually tried to get out of his handcuffs and one of the paramedics reported hearing Daniels state that he wanted to kill his mother.

Mrs. _______ confirmed that Daniels told her, "I feel like someone is pushing me to do something, I want to kill someone." When she asked whom he wanted to kill, he told her that he wanted to kill her.

By the age of 17, according to his mother, Daniels was taking "psychotropic medication" after suffering a "nervous breakdown" in July 2000. Nearly one year later, reports of contacts with Daniels by Ventura County Deputy Sheriffs revealed continued abuse of alcohol, sporadic use of prescription medication and use of illegal narcotics.






On July 29, 2002, Daniels continued abuse of alcohol culminated in an arrest for a violation of Penal Code section 647(f) (Public Intoxication) after he was discovered attempting to enter his mother's house through a window. The deputies found him too intoxicated to care for himself.

On September 11, 2002, Deputies Krofta and Miller responded to the apartment at Mrs. request. Mrs. reported to Senior Deputy Miller that Daniels had a history of mental problems since he was a small child. He recently became very anxious about starting school at Moorpark College. She said the previous day his behavior escalated and he was very "bizarre and angry." He grabbed a knife from the kitchen and stabbed it into a

drawer. He told her that he was angry with her. That evening, Daniels came home and told her that people were trying to kill him. He locked her out of the house for a short period of time when she said she was going to call mental health. Later he grabbed her arm and told her she was going to die. Daniels' mother reported that she was afraid that he was going to hurt someone.

Daniels told Deputy Krofta that he had been very tense and explained that he and his mother had a disagreement that caused him to be extremely anxious. He did not remember grabbing his mother or threatening her. He told Deputy Krofta he had an appointment with mental health to discuss medication for the voices he heard in his head. He denied that he had taken any street drugs for a period of about six weeks. He said the previous night when he was preparing food, the voices in his head became overwhelming. Not knowing how to stop them, he drove a knife into the kitchen counter. He told Deputy Krofta that when he was 14 he had attempted suicide by trying to overdose on heroin.



By November 2002, Daniels' behavior became more unpredictable and violent. On November 19, 2002, Deputies Gruen and Fullerton responded to Mrs. residence where they found signs of a violent struggle, including an overturned chair in the living room. They found Daniels upstairs and, at the request of his mother, arrested him for trespassing. On the way to the East County Sheriff's facility, Deputy Gruen described Daniels as alternately angry and yelling then crying and incoherent. (Officers had responded to the apartment the previous evening on a similar call.)

On November 21, 2002, Mrs. obtained a temporary restraining order that required Daniels to stay at least 100 yards away from her and her place of residence. In support of the order, Mrs. declared that she did not feel safe around her son. She wrote that Daniels became aggressive and violent when he was either psychotic or under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances.

Daniels violated the restraining order several times in the following months by entering his mother's home and refusing to leave resulting in additional contacts with law enforcement and arrests. On January 17, 2003, the District Attorney's Office filed one count of violation of a restraining order against Daniels. He pled guilty and served ten days in the county jail, along with a jail sentence of several months for unrelated drug charges. That same day, Mrs.

2. OVERVIEW OF INITIAL CONTACT AND PURSUIT OF DANIELS

A. Initial Contacts On April 8, 2003

Daniels was released from custody on April 1, 2003, one week prior to the shooting. According to Mrs. he was taking his medication while in custody but stopped once he was released. Daniels told his mother that he had a job referral that had been arranged by the jail and an appointment with Mental Health. Mrs. stated that he pleaded with her to allow him to come home but she refused to allow him back until he proved himself by getting a job and participating in mental health services.

At 3:30 a.m. on the morning of the shooting, Deputy Jones contacted Daniels near the intersection of Moorpark and Wilbur Roads. Daniels told Deputy Jones that he had been kicked out of his friend's house because he smelled bad and had not been taking showers. He told Jones he was on his way to another friend's house to see if he could stay there.

Deputy Jones, knowing that Daniels was on probation, conducted a probation search of him. Deputy Jones found paperwork from the jail and a job referral. Daniels told Jones that he had an appointment with a job counselor in the morning and that if he got a job, he could go back and live with his mother. Daniels denied any illicit drug use since being released from jail and Jones did not see any indicia that he was under the influence. Jones filled out a field interview card and let Daniels continue on his way.

Deputy Jones encountered Daniels again at about 4:15 a.m. in the parking lot of Stuft Crust Pizza. Daniels walked up to Jones' patrol car and spoke with him. Daniels told Jones that his friend had not answered the door when he knocked. Daniels explained that he was going to go to Denny's Restaurant and wait until morning so he could call his mother. He said he wanted to take a shower before meeting with his counselor. Daniels said goodbye and walked off.

In the afternoon of that same day, a family friend, saw Daniels in the parking lot of the Vons Shopping Center on Janss and Moorpark Roads. She described his demeanor as "okay," but felt that he was "brooding" over something. She described him as sounding despondent.

At about 5:00 p.m., patrons of the Stuft Crust Pizza saw Daniels sitting in the rear parking lot of the restaurant. He was cutting his wrists with what appeared to be a knife. At 5:04 p.m., a civilian called 911 on his cell phone. That call was transferred to the Sheriff's dispatch center. The reporting party described Daniels to the dispatcher and told her that he was bleeding.

The call was dispatched over the radio to Senior Deputy Camou at 5:07 p.m. Deputies Kelley, Blanck and Fuller responded as backup. Deputy Blanck was on his fourth day of field training with Deputy Kelley as his training officer. Deputy Fuller was working alone. All deputies were working patrol in the city of Thousand Oaks and were wearing full department uniforms with badge, patch and utility (gun) belt. They drove marked black and white patrol vehicles.

Senior Deputy Camou arrived in the area at approximately 5:11 p. m., about four minutes after receiving the call. He began to check the area and advised dispatch and other responding officers that the subject was possibly in the Laurie Lane apartments.

B. The Foot Pursuit²

At approximately 5:20 p.m., Deputies Kelley and Blanck walked into the west alley of the Biltmore Apartments, which are located on Laurie Lane. There is an alleyway that runs behind the complex, perpendicular to Wilbur Road. Blanck and Kelley looked north toward Wilbur Road and saw Camou drive southbound into the alley from Wilbur. At about the same time, Deputy Blanck saw a male, later identified as James Daniels, walk into the alley from the apartments behind Deputy Camou's patrol car. Blank yelled to Camou that the subject was behind him. Camou stopped his car and got out in an attempt to contact Daniels, who immediately ran across Wilbur Road. Deputies Camou, Kelley and Blanck pursued him. Camou followed Daniels on foot across Wilbur Road. Blanck and Kelly reached Camou's patrol car and Kelly got in, intending to use it to pursue Daniels. Blanck remained on foot and followed the route he had seen Daniels and Camou take across Wilbur Road.

Camou followed Daniels into the driveway of 155 E. Wilbur Road. This north/south driveway is the driveway for a professional building, the Glenn Oaks Apartments and the Daland Swim School. The driveway has several small parking areas along its length that give access to the various apartments and businesses. Daniels turned eastbound into the first parking area north of Wilbur and vaulted a cinderblock wall at the east end of the parking area. Camou, with Deputy

Blanck in pursuit somewhere behind him, followed Daniels over the wall and continued to pursue him east across a vacant field.

At some point, Camou radioed, "Go to the other apartments," and Deputy Blanck ran eastbound, parallel to Wilbur Road to the area of the Shadow Oaks Apartments. Blanck then turned north up the driveway of the buildings that leads to the Edison power plant, which is west of the Shadow Oaks Apartments.

Deputy Kelley, driving Camou's patrol car, caught up to them and drove up the driveway that leads to the Edison power plant. He briefly saw Daniels near the power plant fence line and got out of the car to follow him on foot but soon lost sight of Daniels.

When the foot pursuit started, Deputy Fuller had been in the alley near the Laurie Lane Apartments farther south than the other deputies. He saw Camou start to pursue Daniels on foot and followed in his patrol car. He activated his lights and sirens and saw Daniels look back at him before Daniels vaulted the cinderblock wall in the parking lot at 145 E. Wilbur Road. He recognized Daniels from prior contacts.

Deputy Fuller drove from the driveway at 145 E. Wilbur to the northwest corner of the Shadow Oaks Apartments. Fuller anticipated that if Daniels turned north along the power plant fence, he would pass by Fuller's position. Fuller stood up on a chain link fence that runs along the east side of the power plant. He heard deputies near his position and then saw Daniels crouched down near him.

Daniels stood up and tried to run past Fuller. Fuller jumped down, reached out and grabbed Daniels by his jacket through the fence and pulled him into the fence. Fuller could see that Daniels was bleeding from his left wrist and that he was holding a penknife in his right hand. Fuller yelled to the other deputies that he had a hold of Daniels.

Daniels began to cut his own wrist with the knife as Fuller held him. According to Fuller, Daniels showed no expression of pain. Fuller observed that the cut was so deep that the bone was visible. Fuller began to yell at Daniels, "James, you are not in trouble, we are here to help you." Daniels ignored Fuller, and Fuller, fearing that Daniels would cut him, drew his weapon and pointed it at Daniels. As he did so, he realized that Daniels might see the gun and force Fuller to shoot him. Deputy Fuller re-holstered the weapon.

Daniels put the knife in his mouth and began to remove his jacket. Fuller let go of the jacket and tried to grab the knife, but Daniels grabbed it first and continued to try and get his jacket off. Fuller sprayed Daniels in the face with his department issued oleo capsicum (O.C.) spray. The spray appeared to have no effect on Daniels, but affected Fuller who stepped back from the fence. At some point during this struggle with Daniels, Deputy Fuller's uniform was stained with blood from Daniels self-inflicted wound.

As Deputies Camou, Kelley, Blanck and now Deputy Mayo arrived at Fuller's location, they had to run through a dissipating cloud of O.C. spray in an attempt to apprehend Daniels. By this time, Daniels had run west into a field that runs the length of the power plant on the north side.

The field separates the power plant and the rear yards of the houses on Gallsworthy Street. Fuller directed the deputies and told them they would need "less lethal" equipment to try and gain control over Daniels.

Fuller and Mayo drove in Fullers' patrol vehicle to retrieve Deputy Mayo's less than lethal shotgun from the trunk of his car as Deputies Camou, Kelley, and Blanck continued to pursue Daniels. During the pursuit, they called to Daniels by his first name, and told him to drop the knife and tried to assure him that everything would be okay. As they followed him, they could see him cutting his left wrist and forearm with the knife. According to Deputy Kelley, Daniels was in a "trance-like" state and did not react to the pain of the wound.

When Daniels was about halfway through the field, he stopped and started to climb a fence into the backyard of a house on Gallsworthy Street. Instead, he stopped, took off his jacket, hung it on the fence and continued walking southwest through the field. The deputies continued to follow him, calling out his name and trying to reassure him that they could help him if he put down the knife. Deputy Kelley stated that during this time, Daniels yelled back at them, "Just shoot me."

At the northwestern edge of the power plant, Daniels turned south and began walking along a dirt path on the eastern property line of the Daland Swim School and the Glenn Oaks Apartments. The three foot wide path is between the chain link fence on the west side and large bushes on the other. The deputies noticed that the swim school was in session. There were

children in the pool and parents sitting around the pool in various locations. Senior Deputy Camou began yelling through the fence telling the adults to get the children out of the pool.

The three deputies continued to follow Daniels along the fence and they passed by the rear of the Glen Oaks Apartments. When they reached the southwest corner of the power plant, Daniels stepped out from the dirt path to the blacktop driveway that provides access to the power plant from Wilbur Road.

Deputy Kristol had heard the progression of the foot chase over the radio and arrived to assist. She positioned herself at the bottom of the driveway close to Wilbur Road. She saw Daniels emerge from the bushes and begin to run down the driveway toward her. She heard a male voice over the radio say, "Michelle, he's not going to stop for you." Kristol drew her handgun, pointed it at Daniels and ordered him to stop about four times. Daniels did not comply. Instead, he turned west and ran through a field to a wall that separates the field from the parking area between the Wilbur Professional Building and the Glen Oaks Apartments. He hopped up on the wall and sat facing west away from the deputies who had now pursued him into the field.

As Daniels ran into the field, Senior Deputy Welty and Deputy Bonebright arrived to assist. Both deputies removed their "less lethal" shotguns from their cars. They ran to the driveway where Deputy Kristol had positioned herself and west into the field. They could see Daniels sitting on the wall with his left side toward the deputies. As they watched him, he began cutting his wrist. One of the deputies described the action as if Daniels were "cutting a piece of steak." Daniels seemed oblivious to the pain and did not respond to any directions to drop the knife.

Daniels then jumped down on the west side of the wall and began to jog/walk west toward the main driveway. Deputy Welty ran to the wall where Daniels had been sitting and fired two rounds from the less lethal shotgun at him. At the time, Welty believed that Daniels may have been struck in the lower back and leg area, but if he were struck, Daniels showed no reaction.

Daniels reached the driveway and turned north toward the Glenn Oaks Apartments and the Daland Swim School. Deputies Camou, Kelley and Blanck all jumped the wall where he had been sitting and continued to follow him north up the driveway.

C. The Shooting

Daland Swim School sits at the north end of the driveway at 145 E. Wilbur Road. The driveway accesses the Wilbur Professional Building that fronts Wilbur Road, then continues north to the Glenn Oaks Apartments and then the Daland Swim School. The swim school has a building that faces the driveway with the pool area behind the building. The driveway gains altitude as it nears the school and the incline increases noticeably close to the school. A block wall runs the entire length of the driveway on the west, from Wilbur Road to the northern termination of the property line.

At the north end of the property, the driveway curves to the right (east) and widens into a parking lot area for the school. At the area of the parking lot, the driveway continues north to a narrow flight of stairs that accesses the backyard of a home on Gallsworthy Street. Large shrubs and small trees cover the hill where the stairs are located.

On the east side of the driveway, in front of the school, there is a sidewalk that runs the length of the building. The sidewalk runs north for several yards and then turns east to accommodate two handicapped parking stalls and several regular parking stalls just north of the front entrance of the building. At the time of the shooting, there was a black Mercedes SUV parked along the sidewalk curb in front of the building. The handicapped stalls were empty and there was a minivan with a woman and two teenage girls inside, parked in the first regular stall north of the handicapped stalls.³

Senior Deputy Camou and Deputies Kelley and Blanck moved north along the driveway following Daniels. All along the way, the deputies were telling him to stop and drop the knife but he did not comply. As they neared the swim school, Kelley observed Senior Deputy Camou place himself between Daniels and the school. Camou was shouting, "Look, I can't let you go in there, I can't let you go there." Daniels traveled north up the driveway toward the swim school approximately 277 feet with the deputies in pursuit.

Deputy Camou then fired four rounds at Daniels but, according to Kelley, Daniels did not react. The tape recording of the radio traffic during the incident reflects that the report of the "shots fired" was made from the scene at 5:29 p.m. Camou fired a second volley of shots at Daniels and Daniels fell to the ground. His right arm was under his body. The deputies pulled Daniels some distance by the feet in a southerly direction to expose the knife. Once the knife was exposed, one of the deputies kicked it over to the west side of the driveway.

Paramedics were called at approximately 5:30 p.m. They responded at 5:35 p.m. and Daniels was pronounced dead at the scene.

3. SPONTANEOUS STATEMENTS OF DEPUTY CAMOU

On the day of the shooting, Deputy Streltzoff was working uniformed patrol. He heard the call go out of a suicidal subject at 5:08 p.m. When he heard the call of "shots fired" he responded to the scene, arriving about three minutes later. He parked on the driveway in front of the Glenn Oaks Apartments, south of the Daland Swim School. He saw deputies standing around a person lying motionless on the driveway.

Upon arrival in the area of the shooting, Streltzoff learned Senior Deputy Camou had fired his service weapon at Daniels. While at the scene Streltzoff spoke to Camou. Camou acknowledged that he was the shooter. Streltzoff noticed that Camou's shirt was soiled with soot and it appeared to Streltzoff that Camou had been in a physical struggle. Camou denied being injured. Streltzoff confirmed that Senior Deputy Camou was the only person to have fired his weapon and asked Camou which direction he fired. Camou demonstrated to Streltzoff that he fired in the direction of the downed subject and the block wall behind him.

The photographs and physical evidence at the scene demonstrate that both Camou and Daniels were in the driveway adjacent to the entrance of the swim school. Based on the location of his body after the shooting, it appears that Daniels was about in the middle of the driveway in the area near the entrance of the school. As demonstrated by the physical evidence he dropped to

mark his location, Senior Deputy Camou was at the east curb of the driveway facing toward Daniels with his back to the area of the school.

Deputy Streltzoff was with Senior Deputy Camou at the scene for about ten minutes after the shooting while waiting to transport Camou to the East County Sheriff's facility. While waiting, Streltzoff brought Camou some water and noticed that as he was drinking the water, Senior Deputy Camou's arm was "shaking uncontrollably."

During this time, Senior Deputy Camou made several unsolicited statements to StreItzoff about the shooting. Senior Deputy Camou told StreItzoff that he chased the subject on foot from the area of Brazil Street and that during the chase, the subject stopped several times and started "slicing" his wrists. Senior Deputy Camou said he chased the subject to the area of the Daland Swim School and that he was concerned about the children present at the swim school. He told the subject to stop because of the children at the school. Camou told StreItzoff that at some point, he heard Deputy Kelley yelling, "Shoot him!"

Senior Deputy Camou said that the subject refused to stop and said something to him, and Camou became more concerned about the safety of the children. He said he yelled at the adults at the school to "get the children out of the pool." Because the subject refused to stop, Senior Deputy Camou said he fired several rounds at the subject. Camou told Streltzoff that he thought he missed because the subject continued toward the school and appeared to be unaffected. He then fired a second volley of shots at the subject. Streltzoff stated that Senior Deputy Camou

repeated over and over again that he had to keep the subject from getting close to the children at the school.

Deputy J. Reilly, who was working uniformed patrol that day, also responded to the scene after the "shots fired" call. Deputy Reilly remained with Senior Deputy Camou at the scene of the shooting. Reilly noted that when he first contacted Senior Deputy Camou, he was visibly upset. He said that Camou's right hand was shaking and that he was sweating. Reilly asked him if he was okay, and Camou nodded his head up and down.

As Streltzoff drove Camou back to the east county Sheriff's station, Reilly sat in the back of the car. En route, Reilly noted that Camou spontaneously stated he was concerned about the safety of children at the swimming pool and said, "The guy wouldn't stop." He also asked, "Is Fuller okay? He had blood on him."

Senior Deputy Camou elected not to waive his rights and did not give a statement to major crimes investigators from the Sheriff's Department. He also declined a subsequent request to be interviewed by the District Attorney's investigative team.

4. STATEMENT OF DEPUTY WELTY

Senior Deputy Todd Welty was working patrol in the city of Thousand Oaks and heard that deputies were in foot pursuit of a suicidal subject. He heard that the subject had a 'box cutter' and the deputies needed "less lethal" backup. He went to the location with a "less lethal" weapon, namely a modified Remington Shotgun Model 870. He arrived and parked on Wilbur

Road by the access road leading to the power plant. (187 E. Wilbur Road.) He loaded five "bean bag" rounds into the shotgun and noticed that Deputy Bonebright had also arrived with a less lethal shotgun. He advised dispatch that there were now two less lethal weapons on scene. He charged the weapon, loading one round in the chamber.

He and Bonebright began walking toward the access road when someone on the radio advised Deputy Kristol that the subject wasn't going to stop for her. Welty then saw Deputy Kristol run into the vacant lot east of 155 E. Wilbur Road and he followed her. He saw the subject, later identified as Daniels, sitting on the wall separating the parking lot of 155 E. Wilbur Road from the vacant lot. Daniels had his back facing east and was cutting his left arm with an object that resembled a knife. He saw blood on the Daniels' hands and arms. Deputies Camou, Kelley and Kristol were between him and Daniels. Welty yelled "less lethal" and heard Deputy Kelley yell, "Shoot him, shoot him!" Welty did not aim his weapon for a shot because the other deputies were in such close proximity to Daniels.

Daniels jumped down from the wall and ran across the parking lot at 155 E. Wilbur Road. Welty saw he was still cutting himself with the knife. He aimed his weapon at the Daniels' waist area and fired one round from about 25 yards. He could not tell whether the round struck him. He fired another round from about 30 yards. Daniels did not react to either round but continued running and turned north on the access road toward the swim school.

Welty ran to an area of the wall but had difficulty getting over it. By the time he got over the wall and up the driveway, Daniels had been shot and was lying face down on the ground.

5. STATEMENT OF DEPUTY FULLER

Deputy Jason Fuller had been working patrol in the Thousand Oaks area in a marked black and white patrol vehicle. He went to the area of the foot pursuit in response to the 911 call. He followed Camou and the other deputies in pursuit of Daniels in his patrol car. Fuller had his lights and siren activated.

When Fuller entered the parking lot at 155 E. Wilbur Road, Daniels turned and looked at him. Fuller recognized him as someone with whom he had prior contacts. He saw Daniels jump the wall, which abuts the open field, leaving a bloody handprint on top of the wall. He then disappeared from Fuller's view. At that time, Fuller remembered that Daniels was on probation for narcotics violations and that his mother lived in Thousand Oaks and had a restraining order against him.

Fuller drove to the northwest corner of the apartments and stopped. From his location, he could hear the portable radios of Camou, Kelley and possibly Deputy Mayo. He could not see them but believed they were in some bushes alongside the western edge of the driveway, south of his location.

Fuller got out of his car and climbed halfway up the chain link fence that runs north and south adjacent to the western edge of the driveway at a location where the top of the fence had been pushed down. Once there, he heard Camou ask him if he could see the subject. At first he could not, but then he looked down and saw Daniels crouched down on the ground near him. Daniels

Daniels by the jacket collar. While holding Daniels by the back of the collar, Fuller could see that Daniels' left arm was "covered in blood" and had cut himself from the "wrist to the elbow" down to the bone. He had a knife in his right hand. He did not say anything nor, did he demonstrate any expression of pain. He was not breathing hard but just "kept looking at his wrist, cutting it." Fuller continually yelled at Daniels that he was not in trouble and that the deputies were there to help him.

Later, when asked about Daniels' behavior during this episode, Fuller said he was "shocked" that Daniels had no expression, said nothing, and would not even look at Fuller. Fuller said, "He just took the knife in his right hand and starting carving away. The incision was pretty deep and pretty wide . . . I could see the bone."

Daniels ignored Fuller, who became concerned that Daniels might cut him. While holding Daniels' jacket with one hand, Fuller removed his gun from the holster with the other and pointed it at Daniels. Fearing that Daniels might see the gun and make some provocative act, Fuller holstered the gun. At some point during this encounter blood from Daniels' arm got on Fuller's right arm.

After Fuller re-holstered his gun, Daniels put the end of the knife in his mouth with the blade end pointed out and attempted to remove his jacket. As Daniels unzipped his jacket, Fuller released his hold on the jacket and tried to grab the knife. Daniels immediately grabbed the knife before Fuller could, then he either crouched or fell down and tried to take his jacket off. Fuller removed

his pepper spray from his belt and sprayed Daniels on the side of the face. As soon as the pepper spray emitted, Fuller was affected and stepped away from the chain link fence. Daniels ran off through the field to the west, seemingly completely unaffected by the spray.

At the same time, Camou, Kelley and Mayo arrived at Fullers' location and Fuller told them "they needed less than lethal" in order to stop Daniels. Mayo and Fuller met with Deputies. Welty and Bonebright who arrived on scene with their less than lethal shotguns. Fuller advised them they needed to shoot Daniels because he was cutting himself.

Fuller saw Bonebright and Welty run north on the driveway that accesses the power plant and then west into an open field. North of their position, Fuller saw Daniels sitting on a brick wall near the northwest corner of the field. Fuller followed Deputy Kristol to the driveway of 155 E. Wilbur Road. As he turned into the driveway, he saw Daniels walking about 50 yards ahead of him on the driveway near the swim school. Deputy Camou was east of Daniels. Deputy Kelley was south of Daniels and Bonebright and Welty were south of Kelley. As Fuller continued north on the driveway, he heard several pops and saw Daniels continue walking. Seconds later, he heard a second set of pops and saw Daniels fall to the ground.

6. STATEMENT OF DEPUTY KELLEY

Deputy Roger Kelley started his shift at 2:30 p.m. and was partnered with Deputy Daniel Blanck, a trainee. They went to the area in response to the 911 call. Once there, they were directed to the location of the Laurie Lane apartments by several civilians. They got out of the patrol car and walked north in the driveway where they saw Camou pull in from Wilbur, facing southbound.

Kelley was present when Daniels approached Camou's vehicle and began to run. He observed Camou pursue Daniels on foot. Blanck, who was approximately 30 yards ahead of Kelley, also gave chase on foot. Kelley joined the pursuit of Daniels in Camou's patrol vehicle. Shortly thereafter, he lost sight of Daniels and the other deputies.

Kelley drove to 187 E. Wilbur where he briefly spotted Daniels in some bushes. Kelley drew his gun as he got up on the retaining wall that runs east and west just south of the power plant. He heard Deputy Fuller say he was "up here" and saw Fuller standing on the fence line on the east side of the power plant on the property of the Shadow Oaks Apartments. Kelley could hear Deputy Fuller yelling, "He's cutting himself, he's cutting himself, he's got a knife."

Kelley said he could smell O.C. in the air and heard Fuller say something to the effect of, "I sprayed him, but it didn't do any good." They headed into the open area south of the houses on Gallsworthy. He saw Daniels at this time and Kelley called him by name (James), and told him to drop the knife. (Kelley knew the subject was James Daniels when he heard Fuller say that the subject was "the guy that lived on Los Feliz and his Mom has a restraining order against him." He had dealt with Daniels and his mother many times in the past. Kelley was aware that Daniels was on some kind of psychiatric medication.)

Kelly said Daniels did not respond to his comments and continued walking toward the back of the houses on Gallsworthy. At one point it looked like Daniels tried to get over the fence into one of the backyards, but instead, he took off his sweatshirt and hung it on the fence. That was the first time that Kelley saw the knife and he took out his baton. The deputies kept yelling at Daniels to drop the knife, and once Daniels yelled back at them, "Just shoot me." Kelley said that it was as though Daniels was in a trance. He was non-compliant and repeatedly cutting himself with the knife. He had no reaction to the self-inflicted wounds.

Kelley followed Daniels at a distance of about 15 feet. He was hoping to get close enough to hit Daniels with the baton and knock the knife out of his hand. As Kelley got closer, Daniels turned south along a dirt path along the fence line behind the Daland Swim School. Kelley could hear children in the pool at the swim school and he could hear Camou yelling at the kids to get out and go inside. At the same time, the deputies were yelling at Daniels to drop the knife.

Kelley followed behind Daniels at a distance of about 20 yards as Daniels continued along the driveway and toward the open field. He saw Deputy Kristol at the end of the driveway with her gun drawn. Kelley observed Daniels sit briefly on the brick wall at the west side of the field. Kelley could clearly see the knife in his right hand and watched as Daniels cut himself a couple more times. Kelley concluded that the only way to disarm Daniels and prevent him from further harming himself was to strike him in the head with his baton. Kelley was unable to take any action before Daniels jumped off the wall and continued moving.

Kelley saw Senior Deputy Welty running in their direction with the less than lethal shotgun and called Welty to their location. At this location Kelley was heard to yell at Welty, "Shoot him, shoot him!" As Daniels walked west through the parking lot, Welty fired two rounds in his

direction. According to Kelley, neither round appeared to have any effect on Daniels and he kept moving.

Kelley, Blanck and Camou went over the wall and followed Daniels northbound on the driveway that leads to the swim school. They were about 15 feet behind him and walking at a fairly fast pace. Daniels was in the middle of the driveway. They continued to yell at him to drop the knife but he was completely non-responsive. Kelley said that he has had previous contact with Daniels when Daniels was both sober and under the influence of drugs and alcohol and that his behavior this time was different from any other. Kelley stated it appeared that Daniels was extremely focused on whatever he had planned.

As they neared the swim school, Kelley said Camou was to Daniels' right, about 15 feet away. Camou was yelling at Daniels to stop, and he had his gun drawn. Kelley was approximately five feet south of Camou. Deputy Blanck was five to seven feet further south from Kelley. Kelley did not have his gun drawn. Kelley couldn't remember whether Blanck had his gun drawn.

As Daniels continued straight up the driveway, Camou moved forward, matching Daniels' forward progress. He told Daniels, "Look, I can't let you go in there. I can't let you go there." Camou moved up to where he was nearly aligned with Daniels and after telling him, "I can't let you go in there," Camou fired "two or three" rounds at him. Kelley thought at least one of them hit the retaining wall west of them, but he was not sure because Daniels didn't react. He kept walking, hunched over slightly.

Kelley said all the officers moved forward as Daniels moved forward. He could hear Daniels moaning. Camou then fired the second volley of shots and Daniels fell down. Kelley thought Camou fired a total of seven to eight shots. Daniels fell on his stomach with his right hand beneath him. His left arm was extended and he was making breathing sounds. Paramedics were summoned.

Kelley said that Daniels never did anything to threaten them with the knife. Kelley thought that based on the training he received, Daniels was bent on committing "suicide by cop." He felt that Daniels was determined to accomplish his mission.

7. STATEMENT OF DEPUTY BLANCK

Deputy Daniel Blanck was in his fourth day of training with Deputy Kelley in the Westlake area of Thousand Oaks. The call came over the radio of a suicidal man stabbing himself in the arm with a knife. Kelley initiated the response to this call for training purposes.

When they got to the area, Deputy Blanck pursed Daniels on foot after Camou, in a northeasterly direction. He followed the pursuit to Deputy Fuller's location and then through a field north of the power plant. They reached a block wall and all of the deputies were telling Daniels to drop the knife. Daniels sat on the wall and continued to cut himself on his arm. Daniels was non-responsive to their commands and disregarded their pleas to let them "take care of him."

Daniels began to run down the west side of the power plant and down to the access road that leads to Wilbur Road. Deputy Kristol headed him off. She had her gun pointed at him and told

him to drop the knife but he did not comply. Daniels headed west into a vacant field and jumped over a block wall. Deputies Bonebright and Welty arrived with the beanbag shotguns.

Blanck, Kelley and Camou followed Daniels over the wall and up the driveway leading to the swim school. Blanck thought that Deputy Kristol was in front of Camou, then Kelley, then himself. He believed that Welty and Bonebright were behind him. He thought that Kristol, Camou and Kelley were within 10 to 15 feet of Daniels.

Blanck said that as they approached the swim school, "I was about 20 feet away from Kelley, Kristol and Camou. We all had our guns drawn on him. He was kind of staggering. He was going towards the swim school—the kid's swim school and that's when I heard and saw the first four shots fired. It didn't seem to hit him. I thought they were beanbag rounds because it didn't do anything to the guy, he just kept going. He went about another 15, 20 feet, maybe 30 feet and that's when I heard about another three rounds fired and then the subject went down to the ground." Because Daniels was on top of his hands, Blanck said Kelley dragged him by his ankles to expose the weapon. Fire and ambulance were called.

When asked about the knife, Blanck said he saw it when Daniels was sitting on top of the wall by the power plant. It appeared to him to be pencil thin, about six to eight inches long. He could not see the blade, but could see that it was doing damage as Daniels was stabbing himself. Blanck said there was "excessive blood."

Blanck said the deputies continuously told Daniels to "Stop, put the knife down, don't go any further, stop, stop, stop," but he would not stop and kept moving the entire time. At the moment of the shooting, Blanck said he didn't see him doing anything in particular other than continuing to walk northbound on the driveway. He stated, "He wasn't really at the swim school yet, it was just before the swim school. So, I mean, I don't want to make it sound like he was running into the swim school, but he was running toward the swim school area, where there was kids and family in that area."

At the time of the shooting, Blanck said he was focused on Daniels and did not see anyone else in the area. After the shots were fired, he saw some people come out of the swim school area.

8. STATEMENT OF DEPUTY KRISTOL

Deputy Kristol was out on another call for service with Deputy Welty when she heard the "foot pursuit go out." When she arrived she got out of her vehicle and saw Daniels at the north end of the driveway. An unknown deputy yelled at her, "Stay there, he's coming right to you." She saw Daniels about one-quarter of the way down the driveway. She knew from the radio traffic that he was in possession of a knife and was suicidal. Kristol could see possibly three deputies behind Daniels with a gap of about five feet between them.

Deputy Kristol saw Daniels running down the west side of the driveway. She drew her handgun and yelled at him to stop approximately four times. Kelley yelled to her, "Michelle, he's not going to stop, he's not going to stop!" Daniels looked at Kristol and turned west into a vacant

field north of 301 E. Wilbur Road and east of the businesses at 155 E. Wilbur Road. He appeared to have nothing in his hands.

Deputy Kristol followed him into the field and into the area of the block wall where he sat momentarily, "gouging his...left wrist" with a knife. She saw Deputies Camou, Bonebright, Kelley, Blanck and Welty in the immediate area. They were all telling him to "stop" and to "put it down." Deputy Kristol described Daniels as non-compliant.

Kristol continued to pursue Daniels, along with the other deputies, as he left the area of the wall.

According to Deputy Kristol, someone fired several "less lethal" rounds from the east side of the wall as she and Fuller were already running, and they heard the "less lethal" over the radio.

The pursuit continued for a brief period. She then heard what she thought were several "less lethal" shots being fired. She looked up the driveway and saw "several deputies" in the common driveway "running." She heard the "shots fired" call over the radio and saw Daniels "just go down, forward." She was running, just south of the south entrance to the apartment complex located at 145 E. Wilbur Road. She did not hear anyone say anything just prior to the shots being fired.

Kristol never heard the subject say a word during the entire pursuit. She described him as nonresponsive. She stated that when he was headed toward her on the driveway she thought she was going to have to shoot him.

9. STATEMENT OF DEPUTY BONEBRIGHT

Deputy David Bonebright heard the call of a suicidal subject when he was at the Resource Center at 1425 East Thousand Oaks Boulevard. He responded to the area of E. Wilbur Road and Laurie Lane. He then heard that officers were in foot pursuit in the fields north of Wilbur Road. He parked his vehicle and removed his less than lethal shotgun from the trunk of his car. At this time, he saw that Deputy Welty was nearby and had also removed his less than lethal shotgun.

He and Welty joined the pursuit and ran into the vacant field where he saw Daniels sitting on a brick wall located in the northwest corner of the field. Daniels' back was to the deputies who were standing in the field. Bonebright saw Senior Deputy Camou about four feet east of him telling him to get off the wall.

According to Deputy Bonebright, Daniels jumped off the wall and ran west through the small parking lot immediately north of the building at 155 E. Wilbur Road. He ran to Deputy Welty's location and as he approached, he saw Welty fire two rounds at Daniels, which had no apparent effect on him. He continued to run west then turned north onto the driveway that leads to the Glenn Oaks Apartments and the Daland Swim School.

Deputy Bonebright saw Daniels and Deputy Camou approximately 100 feet ahead on him driveway. They were just south of the swim school, parallel to one another, about ten feet apart. Bonebright was focused on those two and did not recall who else was in the immediate area. Bonebright saw Daniels walking north on the driveway. Camou was east of and parallel to Daniels but was facing him.

As he was running in their direction, Deputy Bonebright considered using his less lethal, but he was still too far away to get an effective shot. Just then, he heard several shots. He thought that Camou must have shot Daniels with the less-than-lethal weapon because after the shots, Daniels continued to move forward north on the driveway. Bonebright unsuccessfully attempted to fire his less-than-lethal weapon at Daniels as he neared the school. At that moment, however, he saw Daniels fall to the ground.

During the entire incident, Bonebright never heard the subject utter any words.

10. STATEMENTS OF CITIZEN WITNESSES

There were numerous civilians interviewed that saw or heard various portions of the incident. Several people at the Stuft Crust Pizza saw Daniels cutting himself. Others witnessed various portions of the foot pursuit. In this portion of the report, however, only those with substantial details relating to the events occurring near the swim school are included. In total, over 50 civilians were interviewed, including many who saw or heard nothing related to the incident.

is an employee of the Daland Swim School. On April 8, 2003, he got off work and walked to his car, which was parked on Wilbur Road. As he got near the end of the driveway, he saw a young man, later identified as James Daniels, running from the police in the parking lot of the apartments on the south side of Wilbur Road. Daniels ran across the street toward and could see that his hands were bloody and he had a knife in his right

hand. Fram west into the parking lot of the mortuary to get out of the way. At the same time he saw a police car move up between him and the subject as if to block the subject.

saw Daniels continue to flee from the deputies. was familiar with the area and became concerned that Daniels might run into the swim school and harm someone. said there were approximately 100 children in and around the school at the time.

ran back up the driveway to the front of the school and through the office to the rear of the school. From there, he saw Daniels running north with the police still following him. He watched until he lost sight of them. He went outside to the north parking lot of the school where he saw Daniels running west, toward the rear of the school. He could see that he still had the knife in his right hand and was using it to cut his left arm repeatedly. described Daniels inflicting cutting wounds on his arm by penetrating the blade into his forearm and digging into his arm, slicing down toward his wrist. stated, "As soon as I saw that, I'm like, I know this guy's not giving up. That's a mental problem."

Daniels stopped when he reached the chain link fence that divides the school parking lot from the open field to the east. saw him facing west with his arms on the fence. The deputies were about six to ten feet away from him with their guns drawn, pointed toward the ground. They repeatedly told him to "drop the knife," and "everything will be okay." said Daniels shook his head back and forth and said, "No, no."

One of the deputies waived at to get out of the way and he began to go back inside the school building. saw another employee () and told him to go inside. entered the building and told everyone to stay inside. He told the swim instructors to get the children out of the pool and bring everyone inside. He went to the east fence where he saw the officers still southbound in pursuit of Daniels.

went to an area in front of the office, remaining inside the perimeter fence, "Just to make sure he didn't come back up." explained that he went there to protect others, stating, "I'm not having a child die here." While at the front of the building, saw Daniels come northbound up the driveway. His arms were red with blood. saw about five deputies following him. One of the deputies carried a florescent yellow shotgun and the others had handguns. The deputies were advancing on Daniels who continued to cut himself. They were yelling at him, "Stop," "Don't walk any further," and "Put the knife down." Daniels just continued walking northbound.

One of the deputies walked up to Daniels' right side, until he was almost even with him.

said the deputy was about three to four feet away from him. heard the deputy say "Stop, don't walk any further." Daniels continued walking and the deputy shot him two times. At the time, said Daniels was walking away from the deputy toward a parked car that contained a woman and two children. estimated the distance between Daniels and the parked car to be 25 to 30 feet.

said the first shot hit Daniels in the right arm and caused his right arm to fly up into the air. He said the second shot caused his right shoulder and torso to move to the left as if he had been shot in the back of the shoulder. As the first deputy shot at Daniels, the deputy with the florescent shotgun moved up ahead of the shooter. Daniels then turned and stepped toward the deputy with the shotgun and another deputy told to go away. As went back inside the school, he heard three to four more shots. He went into the office, looked out the window and saw Daniels lying face down with three or four deputies surrounding him with their guns drawn and pointed at him on the ground.

described Daniels' knife as small, similar to a surgeon's scalpel. He said it looked like a pen. reiterated that just before the shooting the deputies were "yelling at him, telling him to put the knife down, put the knife down. Don't walk any further. Stop. Stop. But I think the officer who noticed, that shot first, noticed either me or somebody else nearby and feared for their safety and shot him right away."

is an employee of the swim school. He was doing paperwork in the administrative office when he saw run from the front parking lot to the pool area and the east fence. went outside the front door to the north parking lot to see what was looking at. From there, looked east and saw a male subject, later identified as James Daniels, facing him with his arms on the fence. His arms were bloody from the hands to the elbows. Behind the male, three police officers were talking to him, calling him by name and directing him to "drop the knife."

About that time, heard telling to "get away from there." ran into the swim school and told people to get the children out of the pool and take them to the bathrooms. He went into the office to look for stragglers and found two girls in the office. He looked out the front windows and saw deputies in the parking lot with their guns drawn. He did not see Daniels at that time. took the two girls out the east exit of the office and walked them to the bathrooms. About the time they reached the bathrooms, heard about five shots. Later, he saw a body in the parking lot covered with a yellow blanket.

lives in the Laurie Lane Apartments. When she arrived home on April 8, 2003, she encountered a very thin white male wearing a black hooded sweatshirt in the complex trying to open a gate that accesses Wilbur Road. He couldn't get the gate open and he turned around and walked past her. She noticed a large amount of blood on his left arm. He held his arms away from his body and was shaking them. She saw nothing in his hands. She went to her apartment.

About ten minutes later, she heard police activity outside and looked out her apartment window to see what was happening. She then walked outside and stood on the driveway on the west side of her building looking at the north side of Wilbur Road, up the driveway leading to the Daland Swim School. She witnessed much of the foot pursuit of Daniels from that location. She heard the deputies yell at Daniels but he refused to comply or stop. When he was near the north side of 155 E. Wilbur Road, she saw one of the deputies with the less lethal shotguns shoot at him twice but she could not tell whether he was struck because he did not respond and continued walking.

When Daniels was near the top of the driveway she saw another deputy shoot at him three to four more times. Again, Daniels did not react but continued walking. The closest deputy was three to five feet away when she heard three or four more shots and saw Daniels stop, look at the deputies and fall to the ground. From her distance, she could not tell if Daniels had attacked the deputies, but she was amazed that he never stopped or flinched after the first volley of shots.

Ms. ______ believed that all the shots she witnessed were "less lethal" because she never saw any of the deputies with a handgun drawn.

drove her gray Toyota Sienna LE mini van to the Daland Swim School to bring her daughter and and fis friend to the school. She parked her car directly in front of the school facing the building. She parked in the first regular stall north of the handicapped stall closest to the entrance. She waited while the girls were inside the school. She left the door unlocked and the driver's window down and listened to music while she waited.

When the girls came back, she tried to start the car but the battery had run down. Something, possibly shouts from the deputies, drew her attention. She looked over and saw a subject, later identified as James Daniels, "standing by the wall." Ms. described Daniels as looking "out of it," meaning he appeared either to be under the influence of drugs or mentally ill. She stated he was stumbling around and it appeared to her that he was clearly aware of the deputies' presence but refused to follow their commands. She noticed something on his hands

and arms and one of the girls said that the officers must have shot him because he had blood on his hands.

She saw Daniels facing away from the wall and turned a little bit toward the officers. She could see him "face on," although she couldn't actually see his face. She described him having his "hands up and his head crouched down, hood over his head." She knew it was "a bad situation and that the officers were trying to get control over it." Mrs. described the position of his arms as in front of his body, bent approximately 30 to 45 degrees, with his hands up, palms in towards his body.

Regarding his direction, she said, "Yeah, he'd taken a couple steps toward us. He had turned and faced us, his back wasn't directly toward the officers, because you know, he was facing the swim school, but he had turned, you know, that doesn't put his back toward the officers but it did put him straight towards us, head on, with his head down. And yeah, he had—he was moving over this way, toward the swim school and kind of towards us."

Three officers were a little further south with their guns drawn, shouting at him subject. She thought there was another deputy still further down the driveway to the south. Mrs. told the girls not to watch what was occurring and to turn away from the action. She said she continued to keep "scanning a little bit, to see what was going on, but trying to divert the kids." She said she wasn't really paying close attention, just enough to make sure they were still okay. She talked to the girls to make sure they were facing away. She said it was a matter of seconds

before the deputies were shouting at Daniels, telling him to "drop it." She said they were shouting instructions, but he was ignoring them and moving forward toward her and the girls.

Mrs. did not know if the deputies saw her and the girls. She then heard what she thought were a couple "warning shots" followed by "gunfire." When she heard the "gunfire," she told the girls to "hit the ground now, get down!" All three of them got down in the van and waited until all the firing had stopped. When she was certain it was quiet, she looked out and saw Daniels on the ground and the officers gathered around him. She told the girls not to look and brought them inside the swim school.

feet from one another.

One of the deputies had his arms up, holding a handgun pointed at the man. Another deputy had a gun that was black and orange. He was holding it with two hands and had it pointed down. The deputy with the handgun was closest to the man. He was yelling something like "Stop" or "Put it down" at the subject who was closer to the block wall on the west side of the driveway.

The man was running. He had something in his hands, which were all bloody. She described his body position as "kind of crouched down." She demonstrated by bending at the waist. She held her hands together, close to her body, with her elbows out, and her arms bent at approximately 90 degrees. She held the knuckles of her hands together, touching. She said he was "kind of jogging – running and looking behind his shoulder." In terms of his direction, said he was moving up the driveway, not towards the school.

observed the situation until the first shot, at which time her mother told her to get down. She did so and heard several more shots. When the shooting started, she said there were two or three shots, then a pause, then two more, then a pause, then maybe three more, a pause and then the last one. She described the firing of the rounds as "stutterish."

After the shooting stopped, her mother brought the girls into the swim school. She remembered seeing the man on the ground but could not describe his body position.

and her friend were sitting on the middle bench seat of Mrs. She was on the passenger side and was to her left. Mrs. was trying to start the van when something caught sattention to her right. was not sure exactly what caught her attention, but she saw three deputies advancing north up the driveway.

The first and northernmost deputy held an "orange gun" (a long gun), which he held in a low ready type position. About six feet behind him was the second deputy, who had a handgun pointed straight out at some object that could not see. (There was a large black SUV type vehicle parked directly in front of the swim school entrance which blocked her view.) The third deputy was further south and to the left of the second and did not have a weapon.

said the deputy with the handgun fired several times at the unseen object, but missed and hit the block wall to the west. She then saw a subject come out from behind the SUV vehicle which had blocked him from her view. She described him as being about five feet from the wall, probably near the middle of the driveway, but closer to the wall. She said he was headed "up the driveway more . . . He was just kind of walking straight, I don't think he was really headed for our car."

Regarding the position of his body, she demonstrated that he was bent over at the waist, with his hands in front of him, elbows at his side and bent at about 45 degrees, palms facing his body. She said his hands were red as if they were bleeding. She couldn't see anything in his hands, but admitted that she was "grossed out" by blood and didn't really want to pay attention to that. She said his fingers were touching and curled inward, with his hands perhaps two inches apart.

When she first saw and heard the deputy fire his handgun, the officers were just coming up to the rear of the black SUV that was parked at the entrance to the school. After the initial shots, shown more shots facing toward who was on the driver's side. They heard "two or three" more shots after that. She thought there were probably six to eight shots altogether.

look at the scene after that and she never did look. But she said was looking intently at the scene once they got up from their crouched position to go into the swim school.

G.

Mrs. was at the swim school with her four children. She was sitting in the back portion of the pool area when someone ran to the back fence. She saw a male with short dark hair in the bushes behind the fence. There were two policemen following him. She thought the officers had their guns drawn. She described the police as "very calm." The police yelled at them to get everyone out of the pool at least twice. She said they got the children out of the pool and brought them into the restrooms.

H.

said she was parking her car in the upper parking lot of the Daland Swim School. She was backing into a stall in the eastern part of the lot when she saw a subject on the other side of the chain link fence on the eastern property line, which borders an open field. The subject was facing east, with his back to her and was surrounded by three deputies. The deputies were calling him by name and telling him to put the knife down. She thought she saw something in his hand. The subject did not respond to the deputies and, after about a minute, he took off running southbound through the field.

Fearing for her safety, she began to pull out of the parking lot when she heard a gunshot. After about ten seconds she heard two more gunshots. She then immediately saw the same subject she

had seen earlier, now staggering in front of the Daland Swim School with several deputies in close proximity. She then parked her car and went into the school.

11. STATEMENT OF

On April 8, 2003, Detectives Davidson, Lorenzen and Robarts and a Chaplain went to the home of to notify her of her son's death. When the deputies entered the house, Mrs. asked them if her son was dead or alive. They replied that he was dead and she began to cry. She told them that a friend of Daniels' had called her and told her that Daniels had been shot. When she could not locate him at any of the local hospitals, she feared that he was dead.

Mrs. Line told the detectives she last spoke with Daniels the night before and that "he was just all over the place." She doubted that he was taking his medication. During their conversation the night before, Mrs. Line told Daniels that he had to get his head on right. He said he had a job referral, an appointment for "SSI" and an appointment with mental health already lined up. He said that the jail had made some of the appointments for him.

Mrs. described how she had made arrangements on Sunday night for Daniels to stay at the home of family friends (), and that she thought he might have been "coming down" off his medications. She did not think that Daniels had been using street drugs since his release from jail but may have been drinking alcohol.

During the time the detectives were at the home of Mrs. The same of Mrs. She repeatedly asked who shot Daniels and expressed hope that it was not an officer that knew him. She expressed her concern for the deputies and stated she was very sorry that they had to go through this.

12. STATEMENT OF

During the autopsy, Dr. found a piece of paper in Daniels' pants pocket with writing that said, "with a phone number and the name of "Day In (sic)." Detective Lorenzen located who stayed at the Newbury Park Days Inn between April 6 and April 8, 2003. explained to Detective Lorenzen that she was very close to Daniels. Daniels was her brother's best friend, and he was like an adopted member of their family. Daniels spent a lot of time at their house because he and his mother didn't get along. He stayed at her family's home the week prior to the shooting.

When told of the note in Daniels' pocket, was disturbed and did not know why he would have the note. She described her relationship to Daniels as more of a mother or a sister figure than a girlfriend. She had stayed in the motel with her boyfriend and child for several days. According to she and her father had talked to Daniels on April 7, 2003, because he wanted to come and stay with her at the motel. It told Daniels that he would not be able to stay with her and her family at the motel. During that conversation, learned that her Uncle had told Daniels that he could not stay at their home any more, so offered to let Daniels sleep in her car which was parked out in front of their house. Daniels had slept in the car on previous occasions when he had nowhere else to go.

When last spoke to Daniels on April 7, 2003, she said he was depressed and lonely, "because he had nowhere to go . . . no money . . . no job." said that he had recently gotten out of jail, where he had been for four months. That was the longest he had ever been in custody. She said that he was not capable of getting a job and that was a problem with his mother.

said that Daniels' illegal drug of choice was speed (methamphetamine), but he wasn't always on drugs because he usually didn't have any money. She said that he talked about suicide. She thought he would commit suicide one day but hoped he would get some help.

III. PHYSICAL EVIDENCE

PURSUIT AND SHOOTING SCENE

Blood drops were located at numerous areas of the entire crime scene from the parking lot of the Stuft Crust Pizza restaurant to the Laurie Lane Apartments, to the asphalt and dirt paths along the route of the foot pursuit and to the driveway area of 135 E. Wilbur Road. Samples were taken for analysis, but the witness accounts make clear that the only person bleeding was James Daniels. No request was made to type any of these samples.

Daniels' sweatshirt was recovered from the rear fence of a residence along Gallsworthy Street.

The deputies saw him place it there after it appeared he attempted to scale the fence.

Two beanbags and associated wadding were collected from the planter area of the north parking lot of 155 E. Wilbur Road. This location is consistent with the witnesses description of the location where Deputy Welty fired two less than lethal rounds at Daniels.

The driveway accessing Glenn Oaks Apartments and Daland Swim School intersects Wilbur Road and proceeds north past the swim school and ends at the parking lot just north of the school. Immediately north of the end of the driveway and the parking lot are the backyards of several residences located on Gallsworthy.⁴

Daniels' body was located in the driveway adjacent to the school. A blood smear on the asphalt appears directly north of the body and is consistent with the body being moved several feet south after the shooting. Daniels' head was resting toward the north a distance of approximately 46 feet west of the south entrance of the school and about the same distance southwest of the minivan parked in the first parking stall north of the north entrance of the school where and the two teenaged girls were at the time of the shooting.

Four 9mm expended cartridge casings were located at the southeast curb line of the driveway just south of the swim school building. Four additional 9mm expended cartridge casings and a gun belt keeper were located at the east curb line of the driveway directly east of the south entrance to the school. The gun belt keeper was approximately 12 feet southeast of the location of Daniels' head.

The knife that Daniels carried was recovered from where it had been kicked by the deputies after Daniels was shot. The knife has an x-acto type blade, approximately ¾ inch in length, attached to a pen-like handle.⁵

The location of all of the physical evidence was consistent with the description of the incident by law enforcement and civilian witnesses. Senior Deputy Camou stated that he dropped his gun belt keeper on the ground to mark where he was standing at the time he fired the final shot from his service weapon. The location of the shell casings and gun belt keeper is consistent with the witness description that several shots were fired and Daniels kept moving. Camou followed Daniels up the driveway and fired a second volley of shots.

2. AUTOPSY REPORT

Dr. performed an autopsy of James Daniels on April 9, 2003, at the Medical Examiner's Office in Ventura. Dr. determined the cause of Daniels' death to be multiple gunshot wounds. The manner of death was found to be homicide, due to his interaction with Sheriff's deputies.

Dr. located eight gunshot entrance wounds and four gunshot exit wounds in Daniels' body. Six of the entrance wounds are in the area of the right posterior upper, mid and lower chest area of the back. These wounds extend in a diagonal line beginning about two-inches from the right lumbar spine up to the right shoulder/armpit area. The directionality of all of six of these wounds is left to right, back to front and upward in degrees varying from five to 45. There is a gunshot

⁵ A photograph of the knife is included in Appendix D.

entrance wound in the right deltoid (right upper arm) and a gunshot entrance wound to the left anterior wrist.

No opinion was given regarding the order in which the wounds were received or the position of Daniels body in relation to the shooter at the time he was shot. However, Dr. concluded that the location of the wounds and their directionality is consistent with the description given by witnesses regarding the relative positions of Senior Deputy Camou and Daniels at the time of the shooting.

In addition to the gunshot wounds, Dr. also noted two very deep and long lacerations on Daniels' left wrist. She described these wounds as four to five inches long and severing the muscle, tendons, nerves and small blood vessels in the wrist. She also noted numerous other cuts extending the length of the forearm around the two deeper lacerations. The photographs of these wounds taken at autopsy show both bones in the forearm clearly exposed as the flesh gapes open several inches across the expanse of the wounds.

Blood samples taken at the time of the autopsy were analyzed by the Ventura County Sheriff's Crime Laboratory for the presence of drugs or alcohol. The toxicology results revealed that Daniels had no controlled substances in his body at the time of his death.

IV. LEGAL PRINCIPLES

Police officers have a duty to "maintain peace and security" and "to protect citizens from harm." Batts v. Superior Court (1972) 23 Cal.App.3d 435,438; People v. Engel (1980) 105 Cal. App. 3d

489. Society expects that the police function of protecting citizens from harm will extend to even those situations where the threat of harm comes from the citizen himself. In any situation where a person "as a result of a mental disorder is a danger . . . to himself . . . a peace officer . . . may . . . take, or cause him to be taken, the person into custody and place him or ,her in a facility designated by the county and approved by the state Department of Mental Health . . ."

(Welfare and Institutions Code section 5150).

Homicide is the killing of one human being by another, either lawfully or unlawfully. Homicide includes murder and manslaughter, which are unlawful, and the acts of excusable and justifiable homicide, which are lawful.

The shooting of another person in self-defense or in the defense of others is justifiable and not unlawful. The law of self-defense and the defense of others was codified in 1872 and has remained essentially unchanged. It is found in Penal Code sections 197, 198 and 199. It requires that the user of deadly force honestly believe that he or someone else is in imminent and deadly peril, and that a reasonable person in the same circumstances would believe the same and would deem it necessary to use deadly force in order to protect against such peril.

A police officer may use deadly force where the circumstances create a reasonable fear of death or serious bodily injury in the mind of the officer. Graham v. Conner (1989) 490 U.S. 386;

Martinez v. County of Los Angeles (1996) 47 Cal. App. 4th 334.

The 'reasonableness' of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with the 20/20 vision of hindsight. [Citation]... The calculus of reasonableness must embody allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make spilt-second judgments – in circumstances that

are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving-about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation ...[T]he 'reasonableness' inquiry...is an objective one: the question is whether the officers' actions are 'objectively reasonable' in light of the facts and circumstances confronting them, without regard to their underlying intent or motivation. [Citations] <u>Graham</u> 490 U.S. at 396-397.

Under California law, anyone, including a police officer who, is confronted with a situation justifying the use of deadly force to protect himself or another person need not retreat. The person using deadly force may "stand his ground" and defend himself or another, even if he might have more easily gained safety by flight. See <u>People v. Newcomer</u> (1897) 118 Cal. 263, 273; <u>People v. Dawson</u> (1948) 88 Cal. App. 2d 85, 95.

In determining whether a person acting in self-defense, or defense of others, acted properly upon the appearance of danger, the law recognizes that a person experiencing a stressful event is not able to reflect upon his actions and the perceived threat against him to the same degree as a person who is not being confronted by an emergency situation. When police officers encounter potential threats of deadly attack, the warning is often instantaneous and the danger immediate. The California Supreme Court, in People v. Hecker (1895) 109 Cal. 451, 467 stated:

Where the peril is swift and imminent and the necessity of action immediate...the law does not weigh in too nice scales the conduct of the assailed and say he shall not be justified because he might have resorted to other means to secure his safety. The suddenness of the attack puts him to the wall.

The officer may and must make his often-instantaneous decisions based on appearances of danger and not its actual existence. "He may act upon such appearances with safety and if without default or carelessness, he is misled concerning them and defends himself correctly according to what he supposed the facts to be, his act is justifiable . . ." People v. Collins (1961) 189 Cal. App. 2d 575, 588.

The law provides that actual danger is not necessary to justify the exercise of self-defense or defense of others. Thus, the right to self-defense and defense of others is the same whether the danger is real or merely apparent. People v. Jackson (1965) 233 Cal. App. 2d 639, 641-642. The honest and reasonable perceptions for the person utilizing the force are paramount – not the facts as later determined by others. See People v. Clark (1982) 130 Cal. App. 3d 371, 377.

V. ANALYSIS

The deputies who came in contact with Daniels during the evening on April 8, 2003, were obligated to take Daniels into custody for his own safety and the safety of others, as they had done in the past. They attempted to do so from the time of their initial contact with him. His failure to comply with their demands and his continued movement and infliction of injury prevented them from formulating a coordinated response to the danger he presented. There was a significant amount of time that passed between the initial contact with Daniels and the shooting that allowed several of the deputies to observe Daniels in a "trance-like" state. He was non-responsive to their demands to drop the knife. He was inflicting life-threatening injuries to himself while evidencing no physical reaction to the wound. His only verbal response to the deputies throughout the incident was to "shoot me."

During the pursuit, the deputies made several attempts to slow the incident down and reduce the potential for further violence by using calm voices, calling Daniels by his first name, imploring

him to drop his weapon and assuring him that they were there to help him. During the pursuit, at least one other deputy believed that Daniels would make some provocative act toward an officer or a civilian causing one or more of the deputies to shoot him before he made his way to the area in front of the school. Throughout the incident, Daniels continued to move and refused to do the one thing that would have alleviated the officer's safety concerns – surrender his weapon.

It is apparent that the deputies appreciated the increased danger associated with the proximity of the swim school and employed every means from verbalization and physical restraint to less-than-lethal weapons in an attempt to protect Daniels from himself and to protect others from him. By the time Daniels arrived in front of the school, both Camou and Blanck had their lethal weapons drawn which demonstrated a belief that deadly force may be necessary to protect the civilians and the officers in the area.

Despite their attempts to alleviate the danger Daniels presented with less than deadly force the issues presented here are: 1) Did Senior Deputy Camou honestly believe that either he or another officer or civilian was in imminent danger when he shot Daniels? 2) Would a reasonable person/officer under the same circumstances believe that deadly force was necessary to protect against such peril?

Honest Belief of Imminent Danger

Senior Deputy Camou exercised his right to remain silent and declined to provide a formal statement regarding the shooting. It is therefore impossible to determine conclusively what he was thinking at the time he shot James Daniels and whether in fact he believed he or someone

else was in imminent danger at that moment. However, a reasonable interpretation of the circumstantial evidence surrounding the incident and the shooting is that he believed that civilians or deputies were in imminent danger as Daniels approached the school and the parking lot.

Circumstantial Evidence of Camou's Mental State

Senior Deputy Camou was involved in the incident as one of the first deputies to come in contact with Daniels after receiving the 911 call. The tape of the radio traffic regarding the call for service proves that Camou knew that Daniels was inflicting serious wounds on himself with an edged weapon or knife. Based on the statements of the other deputies in close proximity to Daniels, Camou was in his presence for most of the foot pursuit. He observed Daniels' non-responsive and non-compliant behavior towards the deputies. He must have seen the injury to his arm and Daniels' lack of expression of pain or other acknowledgement of the injury. He had to have overheard the radio traffic among the responding deputies during which they discussed previous contacts with Daniels and his apparent mental illness.

Senior Deputy Camou was aware that Deputy Fuller had sprayed Daniels with O.C. spray without any apparent effect because he, along with other deputies ran through the cloud of spray left behind in their pursuit of Daniels. He was aware that attempts to disarm Daniels by use of the less-than-lethal shotgun were unsuccessful as he was present when Deputy Welty shot Daniels with the bean bag shotgun as he approached the school in the driveway. He was present in the driveway at the time and observed that the less-than-lethal shotgun had no impact on Daniels and did not impede his progress toward the school in any way.

Senior Deputy Camou knew that Daniels was capable of inflicting violent injury with the knife as he was present and witnessed Daniels cutting his forearms while seated on the block wall before making his way to the school. He believed that Daniels had injured Deputy Fuller with the knife as evidenced by his spontaneous statement after the shooting asking if Fuller was alright and referring to having seen the blood on Fuller's arm.

In the area of the shooting, in close proximity to the entrance to the swim school, there were several deputies in the driveway and other civilians in the parking lot. Senior Deputy Camou, along with all other Ventura County deputies present in the driveway, knew and had been trained that a suspect armed with a knife or other edged weapon is a deadly threat to an officer with a holstered weapon or an unarmed civilian from a distance of 21 feet. Further, a suspect armed with an edged weapon is considered a deadly threat to an armed officer, with a gun drawn and pointed, when within 15 feet.

The photographs, scene diagrams and physical evidence demonstrates that at the moment of the shooting, Senior Deputy Camou was within 15 feet of Daniels who refused to drop the knife and continued to move in the driveway adjacent to the entrance of the school. Daniels, at the time of the shooting, was approximately 46 feet away from the southern entrance of the school and about the same distance south of Mrs.

and the teenage girls in the van in the parking lot. Senior Deputy Camou had every reason to believe that nothing short of deadly force was going to prevent Daniels from further movement and encountering officers or civilians nearby. He was keenly aware of the children present inside the school as first evidenced by his commands to

remove the children from the pool when Daniels first entered the area at the back of the school. Further, Camou's commands "I can't let you go in there" to Daniels immediately preceding the shooting evidenced his belief that Daniels was about to enter the school. Camou's statements after the shooting, including "the guy wouldn't stop," provides further circumstantial evidence of his mental state at the time of the shooting.

One logical and reasonable conclusion drawn from the proven facts as described above is that Senior Deputy Camou honestly believed the civilians in and around the swim school were in imminent danger as Daniels continued moving in the driveway armed with a knife.

Another logical and equally reasonable conclusion to be drawn from the proven circumstances is that Camou purposefully placed himself between Daniels and the entrance to the school and explained his presence by stating to Daniels that he "could not let him go in there." Senior Deputy Camou had no obligation to retreat from his location and would have been derelict in his duties had he done so. At that moment, Daniels was armed with an edged weapon capable of inflicting deadly injuries. He consistently refused to comply with demands to drop the weapon. Camou stood in a position within lethal striking distance of Daniels. His gun was unholstered and aimed at Daniels. Despite this commanding presence, Camou told Deputies at the scene that Daniels continued moving and "wouldn't stop." Given Camou's inability to retreat it is reasonable to conclude that Camou believed he was in imminent danger of a deadly assault by Daniels at the moment of the shooting.

Reasonable Belief of Imminent Danger

Camou's belief that deadly force was needed to protect himself or others from imminent harm is supported by the actions and statements of other deputies in close proximity to Daniels at the time of the shooting. One of the other deputies in the area of the driveway had his gun unholstered and pointed at Daniels. In addition, at various points during the pursuit, other deputies formed the belief that they might have to resort to the use of deadly force to stop Daniels. Deputy Kristol believed that she was going to be forced to shoot Daniels had he continued toward her on the driveway from the power plant. Camou was behind Daniels at the time and presumably saw her draw and point her weapon at Daniels. Deputy Kelley drew his baton in the field north of the power plant. He was continually trying to determine how and when to strike Daniels with his baton to force the knife from his hands but never was able to position himself for such a strike. While Daniels sat on the wall adjacent to the vacant field, Kelley contemplated hitting Daniels in the head believing that was the only way to get the knife out of Daniels' hand.

The reasonableness of Senior Deputy Camou's belief in the need to defend himself or others is further supported by Daniels' criminal and mental health history. Mrs. ______, Daniels' mother, who was certainly familiar with Daniels' mental illness and behavior, told detectives after the shooting that it appeared to her that Daniels was not taking his medication after he was released from jail the week before the shooting. Further, Dr. _____ concluded, in her most recent report of Daniels' mental health, that when he was not taking his medication Daniels was "unpredictable and violent."

There is conflicting evidence about whether, at the moment of the shooting, Daniels had taken any steps in the direction of the swim school, or whether he was still headed up the driveway. It is uncontroverted, however, that he continued moving.

stated they observed Daniels coming toward the school or the minivan at the time of the shooting. Other witnesses described Daniels moving north up the driveway, parallel to the entrance of the school. Senior Deputy Camou was the one in the best position to observe and describe Daniels' exact position and movements in the moments immediately preceding the shooting. It is unknown whether Camou saw and the girls in the minivan, or in the north parking lot, and whether their presence entered into his decision to shoot.

However, had Daniels turned toward the school, he would have encountered scores of innocent children. Had he kept walking north up the driveway, he would have had direct access to the backyards of homes on Gallsworthy. Had he returned down the driveway, he would have encountered at least three other armed deputies. Regardless, there was no indication throughout the pursuit that Daniels would at that moment abandon his weapon or stop and engage in any meaningful negotiation with the deputies.

It should be noted, that according to all of the witnesses, Daniels never made any verbal or physical threats to any other person. His injurious intent seemed wholly focused on himself. Given his violent behavior, request to "shoot [him]" and his previous history of suicide threats, it is reasonable to conclude that he would not have abandoned his behavior voluntarily. It is equally reasonable to conclude that Daniels would make some provocative act to prompt the

deputies to shoot him as he had requested they do moments earlier. The danger level was very high and it is likely that a jury would conclude that a reasonable police officer in Senior Deputy Camou's position would believe that deadly force was necessary at the moment of the shooting to prevent imminent harm to officers or civilians in the immediate vicinity.

VI. CONCLUSION

The killing of James Daniels cannot be conclusively determined to be a justifiable homicide absent a statement from Sr. Deputy Camou. However, a reasonable conclusion to be drawn from the circumstantial evidence surrounding the shooting is that he honestly and reasonably believed that the children and adults present in and around the swim school were in imminent danger when Daniels, who refused to relinquish the knife, approached the school. The law relating to circumstantial evidence would require a judge or jury to adopt that interpretation of the evidence. Therefore, no criminal charges will be filed in connection with this homicide.






