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I arrived at the Coroner's Office at approximately 0830 hours on 8-06-03. I took a photo of the body bag tag #027923. I took overall photos of the suspect and his clothing. The photos show a fishing vest with several socks stuffed into the pockets. Inside most of the socks were door hinges. I photographed a small tear in the upper right side of the vest at the bottom of a pocket. The photos also show three shirts the suspect was wearing and they all have a hole in the upper right side. I took photos of another door hinge that was in some socks and recovered from the suspect's crotch area.

I took close up photos of the injuries to the suspect. The photos show some small cuts on both sides of his face and chin. There are some small superficial wounds on the suspect's left leg just below the knee. I photographed a wound on the lower right side of the suspect's back that is approximately 3.5 cm by 1.5 cm. The suspect's right arm has a small entry wound from a bullet and a large exit wound approximately 12 cm by 7 cm. I photographed another small bullet wound about 1 cm in diameter on the lower right side of the suspect's abdomen. I photographed a third bullet wound approximately 8 cm by 2.5 cm on the right side of the suspect's chest. The direction of the bullet wound is right to left. I photographed and collected a large piece of a bullet that was recovered from the suspect's heart and some fragments that were found near the heart. I also collected some fragments from the suspect's stomach area. Refer to coroner's report, 1545-03, for further specifics on injuries and cause of death.

**OBJECTIVE:** Determine the direction of travel of the bullets at the crime scene where possible. Compare the bullets, items 010,011 and 071A to the submitted firearms to determine which firearm they were fired from.

**RESULTS:** The following is a summary of the analytic findings:

On Aug. 5, 2003 I was asked to respond to the East Valley Sheriff's station, which was the scene of a shooting incident. The scene was examined over a period of several days.

There were 33 strikes to the building that could be documented. One travels south the remaining 32 have a basically northbound trajectory. These will be grouped by general location and direction of travel. Letters in brackets [ ] indicate letters in the crime scene photos of the building taken by Bureau of Identification personnel, please see those photographs. One bullet [E] struck north face of the patio wall south bound. One bullet struck the south face of the patio wall, northbound, and produced three related exit holes in the same surface [A through D]. One bullet entered northbound through the south facing glass of the west classroom and struck the north interior wall of the classroom above the service opening. Four bullets struck the south facing stone face work between the patio and the lobby [F-I], northbound. One bullet struck the south facing planter wall near the patio [AG], northbound. Three bullets struck the South facing Glass of the lobby, northbound (interior damage indicates that there may have been a fourth bullet entry in this location). Two bullets enter the South face of the west pillar [J & K] and the upper one [K] exits and traveling north re-enters the south face of the sunroof structure [AC]. Two bullets enter the south face of the pillar cross beam [L & M] and the upper one [M] exits and traveling north re-enters the buildings south face [R]. One bullet entered the south face of the East pillar [N], traveling north. Two bullets enter the west face of the wall trim in the lobby entry area (outside the building) traveling north almost parallel to this west-facing wall [O & P]. Nine bullet entries, traveling north, enter the south wall above the lobby entry [Q, S, T, U, V, W, X, Y and Z (R strikes this face but is a re-entry of M)]. One bullet [AA] enters the south wall parapet east of the lobby entry area, traveling north. Four initial bullet entries, traveling north, enter the south-facing wall of the sunroof structure [AB, AD, AE, and AF (AC, W2, X2, Y2 and Z2 are re-entries into this surface)]. One strike in the lobby interior [AH] did not appear to be related to another entry so might have entered through an open door.

One bullet strikes the Sheriff's Department signpost in front of the lobby area traveling north.

One bullet enters the trashcan in the northeast parking area in front of the station traveling in a southwest to Northeast direction.

One bullet enters the left side of the Ford Van California License [REDACTED] (traffic van) traveling south to north.

One bullet enters the left side of the Chevrolet Van California License [REDACTED] (Hazmat Van) traveling west to east.

One bullet enters and exits the right rear tire of the Chevrolet S-10 pickup California License [REDACTED].

The Toyota Solara California License [REDACTED] exhibits one entry in the rear right; the bullet was traveling northward and one strike in the rear of the car.

The Nissan Maxima California License [REDACTED] exhibits one entry in the rear right side, the bullet was traveling northward. One exit on the rear left side and one damage area inside the rear left side. The exiting bullet enters the Volkswagen Jetta California License [REDACTED] which exhibits the entry in the rear right side taillight; the bullet was traveling northward.

The LASD Unit, California license [REDACTED] exhibits six ricochet marks on the hood. The direction of travel is from northeast to southwest and is on a line from the trashcan area of the northeast area of the front parking lot to the rear right corner of the Acura Integra.

The Acura Integra California License [REDACTED] exhibited twenty-seven areas of bullet damage that could be documented. Letters in brackets [ ] indicate letters on the Acura in the photos taken by Bureau of Identification personnel during its examination at the Laboratory, please see those photographs. One in the right headlight [A], one in the front right quarter panel [B], two in the right windshield [C&E], one in the right outside mirror [D], one in the passenger door [F], one in the right side roof above the door [G], one in the right side pillar [H], one in the rear passenger window [I], one in the rear quarter panel at the front edge of the rear wheel well [J], one projectile hole in the lower right rear quarter panel through the rubber trim [K], three projectile holes in the upper rear of the rear right side quarter panel [L, M & N] which are consistent with shotgun slug damage and correspond to the ricochet marks on the LASD unit, one bullet hole in the rear light [O], one bullet hole in the Hatch deck [P], three bullet strikes to the front wheel [Q, S & R], one bullet entry to the front tire and one strike that does not enter [T], one bullet strike to rear wheel [U], two bullets strike in the rear wheel tire [V] (a third entry in the tire is from [J], one bullet strike beneath of passenger door [W] and two bullet strikes to underside of car [X & Y].

The firearm, #27, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. When examined at the scene it was found to contain three discharged and three live rounds. The firearm, #29, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. When examined at the scene it was found to contain six discharged cartridge cases. The firearm, #31, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #45, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #46, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #54, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #56, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #60, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #90, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #91, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition.

The bullet #10 was fired from the Colt rifle #60.  
The bullet #71A was fired from the Ruger revolver, #29.



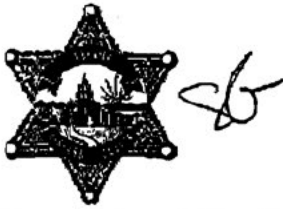

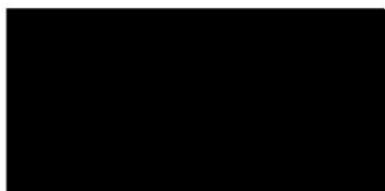

### Autopsy Report

On 8-6-03 at approximately 0845 hours, I attended the autopsy of Gregg Hackett, the suspect in this case. The autopsy was preformed at the Medical Examiner's Office in Ventura by Dr. Frank. Dr. Frank was assisted by [REDACTED]. Also present for the autopsy was Field Evidence Technician (FET) [REDACTED] and Detective Tim Blake from the Los Angeles Police Department.

The autopsy was started on time. The body was contained in a blue body bag. Dr. Frank had already opened the bag at 0735 hours. The seal tag on the bag was 027923, this was the same tag put on the bag the previous evening by Coroner's Investigator Craig Stevens at the crime scene. The bag had been opened so that the body could be X-rayed.

The bag was opened and I observed the following. The body was inside the blue bag with a white sheet under and around the body. When the sheet was removed, I recognized the body as that of Gregg Hackett, the same person I had seen at the shooting scene the previous day.

There were EKG monitoring pads still adhered to the chest. There was also an airway tube as well as a carotid line (intravenous line) still attached to the body. The hands were covered with

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paper evidence bags, which had been taped in place. A set of handcuffs was still attached to the left wrist.

Rigor Mortis was present as well as lividity, which was present and consistent with the position of the body. The eyes showed no signs of petechial hemorrhaging. There were no apparent needle/injection sites on the body. Dr. Frank noted that Hackett had no teeth and was not wearing dentures.


There were several wounds visible on the body. These injuries are documented in later sections of this report.

**CLOTHING**

Prior to examining the body, Dr. Frank conducted a detailed examination of the clothing that had been worn by Hackett. The shirts worn by Hackett had been removed from the body prior to the bodies' placement in the body bag. The shirts had been placed into an evidence bag and retained by FET [REDACTED] as evidence. Additionally, a tan cargo-type vest with pockets on the front had also been packaged at the scene. FET [REDACTED] brought these bags to the autopsy for examination.

**Outermost garment  
Dark Tan "Ausable" Brand Cargo Vest (XL)**

A tan canvas-like vest with numerous pockets was the first item to be examined. Within many of the pockets Dr. Frank located portions of white athletic sock, which had been cut into small pocket like tubes. Within these pieces of sock were large brass colored hinges. These sock covered hinges were placed in various pockets on the vest. A ragged hole in the right chest area of the vest corresponded to a gunshot entry wound on the body. In the lower right hand pocket of

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the vest, Dr. Frank located \$1.05 in loose change and in the pocket immediately to the left she found a cut piece of sock with no hinge.

**Shirts**


The outermost shirt was a green herringbone polo shirt made by "High Sierra." The middle shirt was an olive colored T-shirt (unknown brand) and the inner most shirt was a royal blue "Fruit of the Loom" T-shirt. The shirts had been partially cut from the body by medical personnel while treating Hackett at the scene. A series of small holes were observed on the upper left chest area of the shirts and were consistent with a gunshot entrance wound on the body below the hole in the shirts.

**Shorts / Underwear / Footwear**

Still on the body was a pair of Navy blue shorts made by "High Sierra" and a pair of dark blue Hanes Boxer-briefs. Two quarters and 3 "Worther" candies were found in the right rear pocket of the shorts. Both the shorts and briefs had a small hole on the lower left leg area of the garments. There was no corresponding wound under the hole in these garments.

Upon removing the shorts and briefs from Hackett's body, Dr. Frank discovered another brass colored hinge inside of a sock. This contraption consisted of two full (uncut) socks with one sock containing a piece of sock, which contained the hinge. This contraption was found resting on top of Hackett's penis and testicles.

Also on the body was a pair of white athletic socks and black sneaker like shoes.

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### VISIBLE INJURIES AND AUTOPSY

Dr. Frank conducted a visual examination of the body to identify and describe the visible injuries. Dr. Frank began with the upper torso and identified the following:


- 1) A gunshot entrance wound on the upper right side of the chest was located. The entry wound measured 2.5 cm in length and 2 cm in height. Dr. Frank used a probe to track the bullets path through the body. The bullet passed from right to left and entered the chest through the sternum. Later, during the autopsy, it was discovered that the bullet perforated the pericardial sac, passed through the right ventricle and lodged in the wall of the heart. The bullet was located, collected and booked as evidence. I examined the bullet and it appeared to be the base portion of a jacketed round from an AR-15.

This entrance wound is labeled as #1 on the autopsy diagram.

- 2) A gunshot entrance wound on the lower right abdomen was located. This wound was round and measured approximately .4 cm. Later, during the autopsy, it was discovered that after entering the abdomen the bullet fragmented and caused extensive perforations to the intestines. The bullet fragments were so small that only two very small pieces were collected.

This entrance wound is labeled as #2 on the autopsy diagram.

- 3) A gunshot entrance wound on the right posterior mid-forearm was located. This wound was also round and measured approximately .4 cm. Dr. Frank tracked the bullets path through the arm and discovered that it tracked to a massive gaping exit wound on the inner-forearm area of the right arm. The exit wound was "I" shaped and extensive

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pieces of muscle and tissue were missing. There was no visible fractures or damage to the bone structures in the arm. No bullet or fragments were recovered from this wound. This entrance wound is labeled as #3 on the autopsy diagram.

There were other lesser, non-lethal injuries to the body. These injuries consisted of bruises on the inside elbow of the left arm, a small abrasion to the right wrist, a dark contusion on the right side of the lower back and several minor abrasions on the knees.

Dr. Frank also noted a small triangle shaped cut on the underside of the chin. This wound was accompanied by a larger bruised area around the wound itself. There was also a small cut below the left eye. There were no other notable injuries found on the body.

**AUTOPSY CONCLUSION**

The autopsy was completed and Dr. Frank provided me with her findings. Those findings were:

**CAUSE OF DEATH:** Multiple gunshot wounds.

**MANNER OF DEATH:** Homicide, shot by law enforcement officers.

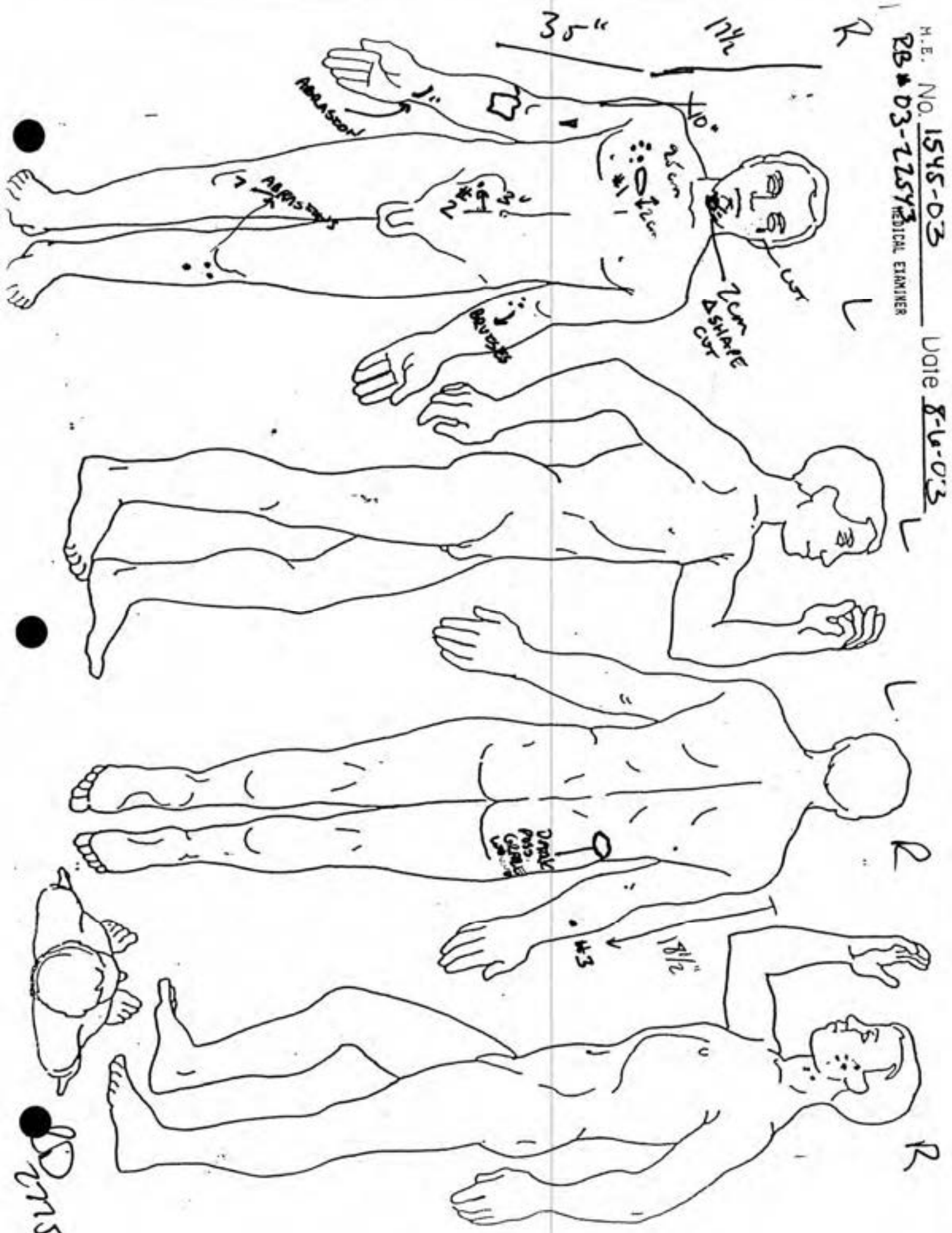
The autopsy was completed and I left the Medical Examiner's Office.

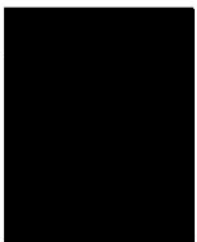

### SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION

On 8/5/2003, at about 1245 hours, Sgt. O'Hanlon from the Ventura County Sheriff's Department contacted me. He advised that a white male adult had driven into the parking lot of the East Valley Sheriff's Station and at about 0936 hours, had fired multiple handgun rounds at, and into the occupied building. He advised that the male subject had been shot by return fire from law enforcement officers inside the building. The subject had been pronounced dead at the scene. I advised him that I would respond to the scene. I arrived at about 1330 hours.

At the scene, I spoke to Sgt. M. Smith who related the following known information based on the preliminary investigation. Sgt. Smith advised that the decedent had been identified as Gregg Wynn Hackett, age [REDACTED]. The decedent had been identified by his California Driver's License, which had been found in his wallet shortly after he had been shot and while he was being attended to by emergency medical personnel. She also stated that the red, 2-door hatchback that the decedent had been driving was registered to him.

Sgt. Smith advised that the decedent's parent's had been located and informed of the death and the circumstances surrounding of the incident. She stated that they were going to be interviewed later in the day.

I was escorted to the scene, which was on the south side of the building, by Sgt. M. Powers and spoke to Senior Deputy R. Davidson. He stated that the decedent had been wearing a photographer's style vest with numerous pockets. He stated that all of the pockets had something in them. Some of the pockets had been found to have large, heavy-duty door hinges wrapped in either gaze or terry cloth material. Senior Deputy Davidson stated that the Sheriff's Bomb Disposal Unit had been called to the scene and were going to clear the area around the decedent and the vehicle prior to allowing any other personnel near the body.

I examined the decedent. The body is that of a white male adult whose appearance is older looking than the stated age of [redacted] years. A white, disposable blanket had covered the decedent since paramedics had pronounced him. The body is supine on the asphalt parking lot with his wrists in handcuffs and positioned in the small of his back.

Evidence of medical therapy includes an endotracheal tube, IV line in the right jugular vein and EKG monitor pads on the chest and abdomen.

The right forearm has a massive wound with extensive tissue damage. There is a grazing entry wound to the right side of the chest, above the right nipple and extending almost to the centerline of the chest. There is a contusion on the right lower back, about 1 inch in diameter. The face had several small lacerations, which appear to have been caused by broken glass from the decedent's vehicle, which is shattered all about the body and vehicle. A detailed description of all injuries will be provided in the autopsy report by the Medical Examiner.

The decedent is dressed in three T-shirts, with a blue one next to the body and two others that are different shades of green. The decedent is also wearing blue "cargo pant" style shorts with a brown belt and white socks. The T-shirts have been cut away from the body with only the right sleeve intact. The sleeve is cut and the T-shirts are removed by me and placed into an evidence bag and given to the Senior Deputy Davidson.

The body is lifted off of the ground and placed onto a white sheet inside a blue body bag. Seal number 027923 is placed at about 1832 hours. The body is transported to the Ventura County Medical Examiner's Office by Cathedral Mortuary Associates pending a review of the case with the Medical Examiner.

On 8/6/2003, I reviewed the case with Dr. Janice G. Frank, M.D., the Assistant Medical Examiner for the County of Ventura. She advised that an autopsy would be conducted. At the conclusion of the procedure, Dr. Frank advised that the cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds. The manner of death is ruled a homicide.

The body was released to the Pierce Brothers Valley Oaks Mortuary in Westlake Village at the request of the family.

**GENERAL DESCRIPTION:**

The body is received in a blue vinyl pouch, with a medical examiner's tag attached to the zipper and inscribed with the decedent's name. The pouch is locked with seal #027923. The pouch is opened at 0735 hours for the purpose of obtaining x-rays, and is closed at 0750 hours. The autopsy is beginning at 0830 hours. The body is lying on a white cotton sheet, which is folded over the anterior surface of the body. Paper bags are over the hands.

**CLOTHING:**

The following clothing items are on the body:

1. Navy blue shorts, with side pockets. The shorts have been cut up the front of both legs. A brown tooled leather belt is threaded through the belt loops and is buckled. There are many bloodstains on the shorts. Two cellophane-wrapped Werthers hard candies and two quarters are in the right hip pocket. Two ragged defects are in the right lateral leg of the shorts, just behind the side seam and on top of the side seam. Both of the defects are located approximately 9"-10" above the bottom hem, and  $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 1" above the cargo pocket of the shorts. The defects are reverse L-shaped and measure 3.5 cm. and 3.0 cm. vertically respectively, by 3.0 cm. horizontally
2. Navy blue knit boxer shorts. A hole in the right lower leg of the shorts,  $3\frac{1}{4}$ " above the bottom hem, is surrounded by bloodstain. The hole is somewhat ragged, particularly on the lateral side of the hole, and measures approximately 3.0 cm. transversely by 2.0 cm. vertically.
3. Light blue boxer shorts. There is a bloodstain on the right lower leg of the shorts, beginning at the hem. No fabric defects are observed. In the crotch of the shorts are two sport socks, one inside the other. The inner sock contains a cut-off toe of a third sock, which contains a heavy-duty yellow metal hinge.
4. Black low-top walking shoes.

The following clothing items are received in two unlabeled sheriff's evidence bags.

1. A tan, multipocket vest, which has been cut up the right side seam and just in front of the left side seam. There are multiple bloodstains on the front of the vest. There is also a moderate amount of soil on the front surface. A complex ragged defect is in the right front of the vest, centered approximately 6" below the right shoulder seam, and beginning  $\frac{1}{4}$ " inside the right arm hole.

The defect is partially interrupted and the largest area measures approximately 1" in length. This is in line with a tear on the bottom hem of the right upper pocket, and the pocket contains three ragged defects, one at the right lower corner of the pocket and two at the lower edge of the pocket, in its mid portion. These defects measure approximately 0.3 cm, 0.8 cm, and 3.0 cm, in maximum size. The following items are recovered from the pockets: From the right upper pocket is a cut-off toe of a white sock, containing a heavy-duty yellow metal hinge. The right mid outer pocket contains the cut-off portion of a cuff of a white sock. The right middle pocket contains a cut-off toe of a white sock. The right lower zipper pocket is empty. The outer small pocket contains one dollar and five-cents in change. The right lower middle pocket contains a piece of cut-off white sock, which has some gray on it. The right lower inner pocket is empty. The left upper pocket contains a piece of cut-off sock cuff, which is wrapped around a heavy-duty yellow metal hinge. The left middle pocket consists of two parts; the outer flap-covered part is empty. The zippered part contains a cut-off piece of white sock, which encloses a heavy-duty yellow metal hinge. The large zipper portion of the left lower pocket contains a cut end of a piece of white sock. The left lower outer pocket contains a piece of cut-off white and gray sock, with a folded heavy-duty yellow metal hinge. The left lower middle pocket contains a piece of white sock, which is lying over a folded heavy-duty yellow metal hinge. The left lower inner pocket also contains a piece of white sock, around a folded heavy-duty yellow metal hinge. The back of the vest contains a large zipper pocket, which is empty.

2. The second evidence bag contains three knit shirts, which have been cut from the body. These were originally worn one on top of the other. The shirts have been cut across the top of the right sleeve and shoulder, and across the front of the left sleeve and shoulder, up the mid front, and up the side, separating the lower left front of the shirts from the remainder. The outer shirt is a dark green herringbone knit polo-style shirt. A ragged hole in the front of the shirt is centered approximately  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " from the shoulder seam and  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " to the right of the right edge of the placket. The hole measures approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter and there are some small ragged tears around the hole at the 11 o'clock position. There is a small amount of red-brown stain extending from the 6 o'clock to the 12 o'clock position around the edge of the hole. There is also bloodstaining on the mid front of the green shirt. Inside the green shirt is an olive green knit tee shirt. A large ragged defect in the right chest of the shirt is centered approximately  $9\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top of the shoulder seam. It consists of two ragged holes that are connected by a vertical strand of fabric. The defect in total measures  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " transversely by approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$ " vertically. There is bloodstain around the medial side, top and bottom of the defect. There is a second slightly ragged defect located just to the right of midline and centered approximately 7" below the top neckband of the shirt. This defect measures approximately  $\frac{1}{4}$ " in maximum size.

Worn inside the olive green shirt is a bright blue tee shirt. There is a large ragged defect in the right front of the shirt, which is centered approximately 9 1/2" below the shoulder seam. The defect measures approximately 1 1/2" transversely by 1" vertically. Medial to this defect, centered approximately 7 1/2" below the top of the neck, is a slightly ragged defect, which measures approximately 5/8" transversely by 1/2" vertically. There is bloodstaining around both of these defects.

**EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL THERAPY:**

1. An endotracheal tube is strapped in the mouth.
2. A vascular line is in the left side of the neck.
3. EKG monitor pads are on the anterior torso.

**EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:**

The body is that of a well-developed, well-nourished Caucasian male, whose appearance is consistent with the recorded age of [REDACTED] years. The length is 76" and the weight is 218 pounds. The body has not been embalmed and is well preserved. There is some rigidity remaining in the lower extremities and in the jaw. Rigidity has been broken in the arms. Lividity is posterior and blanches slightly with firm finger pressure. The body has been refrigerated and is cold to the touch.

The intact scalp is covered by gray-brown hair, which measures up to 1 1/2" in length. The corneas are clear, and the irides are blue. There is conjunctival congestion, but petechial hemorrhages are not observed. There is drying artifact across the left cornea. The nose is intact and contains a small amount of blood in the left nostril. The lips are intact and the jaws are edentulous. There is short light gray stubble on the beard area. The ears are normally formed. The neck is straight and symmetrical and the trachea is midline.

The chest is symmetrical and the breasts are those of a normal adult male. The abdomen is mildly obese, without palpable organomegaly. The genitals are those of a normal circumcised adult male, with the testicles bilaterally descended into the scrotum.

The arms and hands are normally formed. The nailbeds are deeply cyanotic and the fingernails are bitten short. There are no needle tracks or needle marks. There are no tattoos. Adhesive tape is wrapped around the right index finger. Handcuffs are about the left wrist. The legs are normally formed, without angularity or edema. The feet and toenails are unremarkable.

The back is straight and symmetrical and the anus is without injury.

**EVIDENCE OF INJURY:****GUNSHOT WOUND OF CHEST:**

**Entrance** – On the right side of the chest, centered approximately 17 ½" from the top of the head and 3 ½" to the right of anterior midline, is a complex tangential gunshot entrance wound. The wound begins approximately 2" above the right nipple as five small separated superficial dark red abrasions, which range in size from 0.5 cm. to 1.0 cm. The main part of the wound is a transversely oriented irregular graze, which begins approximately 1 ¾" above the nipple and 1" medial to the nipple. This graze measures 9.5 cm. transversely by 2.0 cm. vertically in its maximum dimension. There is contusion above and below the graze, which measures up to 4.0 cm. in length. The central part of the graze wound passes more deeply into skin and subcutaneous soft tissues, and this oval area of the wound measures 4.0 x 1.5 cm. At the medial end of this oval central defect, the wound passes beneath the skin and pursues a subcutaneous course across the sternum for a distance of approximately 9.0 cm. Associated with the entrance is light blue and punctate red contusion over the mid-sternum.

**Path** – After pursuing a subcutaneous course across the right anterior chest, the bullet penetrates the thoracic cavity at the level of the third intercostal space, through the sternum. There is bright red discoloration of the muscle along the wound path, along with some dark gray deposit over the right fourth rib as it joins the sternum. A small fragment of copper jacketing is recovered from soft tissues just adjacent to the thoracic entrance. A small piece of gray metal is recovered to the left of the entrance within soft tissue. There is a transverse fracture of the body of the sternum at the level of the bony entrance to the chest. The bullet then penetrates the anterior pericardial sac, producing extensive anterior mediastinal soft tissue hemorrhage. The bullet then passes through the anterior wall of the right ventricle, just to the right of the interventricular septum. A fragment of the projectile passes into the interventricular septum and lodges just behind the chordae of the anterior leaflet of the mitral valve. Accompanying this gunshot wound is approximately 400 cc. of liquid and clotted blood within the pericardial sac and 100 cc. of liquid blood in the left chest cavity

**Exit** – None.

**Bullet** – Fragments of jacketing and gray metal are recovered from soft tissue anterior to the sternum. A fragment of projectile, consisting of deformed copper-jacketed base and portion of the lead slug are recovered from the upper interventricular septum, and adjacent to this is another small fragments of gray metal.

**Direction-of-fire** – The bullet passes from right-to-left and front-to-back, without significant vertical deviation.

**GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT LOWER ABDOMEN:**

**Entrance** – In the right lower abdomen, centered 35" below the top of the head and 3" to the right of anterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound which measures approximately 0.3 cm. in maximum diameter. There is marginal abrasion around the wound, which is widest from the 7 o'clock to 8 o'clock position, where it measures 0.5 cm. in width. Medial to this the abrasion measures approximately 0.1 cm. in width. There is some gray discoloration around the edges of the wound, but no gunpowder residual is observed on the skin.

**Path** – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right lower abdominal wall, the bullet enters the abdominal cavity, producing a gaping defect on the inner wall of the abdomen. Fragments of the bullet produce perforating injury to the small intestinal mesentery, along with perforating wounds of multiple loops of small intestine and transection of the small intestine in at least two sites. The colon is not injured. Tiny (less than 1.0 mm) fragments of projectile are found on the surface of the retroperitoneum and there is a very small injury to the wall of the left internal iliac artery, produced by fragments of projectile. There is laceration of the left iliopsoas muscle accompanying the wound. A moderate amount of intestinal contents and less than 50 cc. of blood are free in the abdominal cavity.

**Exit** – None.

**Bullet** – Tiny fragments of projectile are recovered from the left retroperitoneal soft tissues.

**Direction-of-fire** – The projectile passes from right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

**GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT POSTERIOR FOREARM:**

**Entrance** – On the right posterior forearm, approximately 18 ½" from the top of the right shoulder, is a gunshot entrance wound that measures 0.4 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion around the wound is widest from the 7 o'clock to the 11 o'clock position, where it measures 0.2 cm. in width. There is no gunpowder residue on the skin around the wound.

**Path** – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right forearm, the bullet perforates the arm, producing extensive laceration of soft tissues, muscle and tendons. No bony injuries are identified.

**Exit** – On the right anterior forearm, just below the antecubital fossa, is a complex gaping I-shaped exit wound. A slightly separated diagonally oriented laceration on the radial side of the exit measures approximately 2.5 cm. in length. With the edges of the wound reapproximated, there is minimal tissue loss.

The upper transverse portion measures approximately 7.0 cm. in length, and the lower portion measures approximately 6.0 cm. in length. The vertical portion of the lacerated exit wound measures approximately 4.0 cm. in length. Lacerated skeletal muscle and tendon is visible in the depths of this gaping wound.

**Direction-of-fire** – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from back-to-front, slightly right-to-left and upward. The actual direction-of-fire depends on the position of the arm at the time of the injury.

#### **GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT FLANK:**

**Entrance** – On the right flank, centered 27" from the top of the head and 6" to the right of posterior midline, is a dark red crusted abrasion that measures 3.0 x 1.5 cm. No penetration of soft tissue is identified. This is interpreted as being a possible graze wound.

#### **OTHER INJURIES:**

1. There are scattered superficial abrasions on the right side of the face and neck, in front of the ear and down the anterior portion of the sternocleidomastoid muscle. The abrasions range in length from 0.1- 1.0 cm. in maximum size.
2. A round abrasion on the undersurface of the chin measures 2.0 cm. in diameter. In the center of this abrasion is a triangular laceration, which measures 0.4 cm. in maximum size. Around this area of abrasion are several linear abrasions, which range in length from 0.5 cm. up to 2.4 cm.
3. A group of contusions and superficial lacerations is over the left zygomatic arch. The deepest lacerations are over the mid portion of the arch and have angled outlines, consistent with injury from fragments of safety glass. The lacerations measure 0.5 cm.
4. A dark red-brown dry triangular-shaped abrasion is on the right biceps area, located approximately 10" below the top of the right shoulder. This abrasion measures 1.0 cm. vertically by 0.5 cm. transversely.
5. A fine linear abrasion is on the medial aspect of the right forearm, just below the elbow, and measures 3.0 cm. in length. Adjacent to this is a slightly curved linear abrasion, which measures 0.6 cm. in length.
6. A curvilinear superficial laceration is on the radial aspect of the right anterior wrist and measures 4.3 cm. Two additional small superficial linear lacerations are adjacent to this and measure 0.5 cm. in maximum size.

7. A dry linear abrasion is over the right fourth PIP joint and measures approximately 1.0 cm. in length.
8. A few small contusions are around the left elbow and measure up to 1.0 cm. in maximum size. There is also some superficial abrasion in the same area, which measures up to 1.0 cm. in size. There are also three pressure marks around the left elbow.
9. Some punctate subcutaneous hemorrhage is on the left anterior forearm, just below the antecubital fossa.
10. There is a tiny amount of hemorrhage beneath the cuticle of the left middle finger.
11. An upside down V-shaped linear abrasion is over the upper right patella and measures 0.7 x 0.4 cm.
12. A very superficial curvilinear abrasion is on the right medial kneecap and measures 2.0 cm. in length.
13. Superficial abrasions and some contusions are on the left leg, over the lateral kneecap and on the lateral aspect of the left calf. These measure up to 1.0 cm. in maximum size.

#### INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is opened through an abdominal fat layer of 1.0-2.0 cm. and a muscle layer of 1.0 cm. The internal organs are found in their normal positions and are covered by glistening serosal surfaces. Left hemothorax, hemopericardium and scant hemoperitoneum have been described, as well as injury within the thoracic and abdominal cavities.

#### SYSTEMS REVIEW:

**CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:** The heart weighs 420 grams and is covered by glistening epicardium, with a moderate amount of epicardial fat. The coronary arteries arise normally and follow a right-dominant course. There is mild atherosclerotic narrowing of the proximal anterior descending coronary artery, with up to 40% stenosis. The right coronary artery exhibits some circumferential thickening of the vessel wall, with less than 10% narrowing of the lumen. The left circumflex vessel is patent. Sections of the myocardium are firm, red-brown and finely fibrillar, without evidence of recent or old ischemic injury. Injury to the right ventricle and interventricular septum has been described. The heart is lined by glistening endocardium. The cardiac valves have their normal structure and the leaflets are thin and translucent, without calcification or vegetations. The coronary ostia are patent.



The aorta follows a normal course through the chest and into the abdomen, and exhibits no significant atherosclerosis or injury. Blood vessels contain small quantities of liquid blood.

**RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:** The right and left lungs together weigh 980 grams. Both are covered by glistening purple pleural surfaces, with large quantities of subpleural anthracotic pigment deposition. The bronchi are patent and are lined by tan mucosa, which is coated with aspirated gastric contents and some blood. There are no pulmonary thromboemboli. Cut surfaces of the lungs are congested and anthracotic, without areas of consolidation or other focal lesions.

**HEPATOBIILIARY SYSTEM:** The liver weighs 1910 grams and is covered by a glistening red-brown capsule. Cut surfaces are firm and red-brown, without lesions. The bile ducts are patent and the gallbladder contains approximately 4 cc. of bile and no stones.

**GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM:** The intact esophagus is lined by tan mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 400 cc. of thin tan fluid, without identifiable food or medication particles. The gastric mucosa is unremarkable. The pylorus is patent and the duodenal contents are bile-stained. The remainder of the small intestine and large intestine are normal to inspection and palpation, aside from previously described injury. The appendix is normal.

The pancreas is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are pink and lobulated, without lesions.

**HEMATOPOIETIC SYSTEM:** The spleen weighs 140 grams and is covered by a slightly wrinkled dark gray capsule. Cut surfaces are soft, with identifiable white pulp areas. Lymph nodes within the neck, chest and abdomen are unremarkable. The thymus is partially replaced by fat.

**GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:** The right and left kidneys together weigh 270 grams. The capsules strip with ease from both, revealing glistening purple cortical surfaces. Cut surfaces show clear demarcation between cortical and medullary areas. The renal calyces and pelves are not dilated and drain into ureters of normal caliber, which follow a normal course to the urinary bladder. The bladder contains approximately 100 cc. of clear yellow urine, and is lined by unremarkable tan mucosa. The prostate is normal to sectioning. The testicles are normal to palpation within the scrotum.

**ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:** The thyroid is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are maroon and finely lobulated, without lesions. The adrenal glands are of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces show unremarkable golden cortical and maroon medullary areas. The pituitary is normal.

**NECK:** There is soft tissue hemorrhage on the left side of the neck, secondary to vascular access. There is no hemorrhage within the strap muscles, thyroid or posterior pharyngeal constrictors. The bony and cartilaginous structures of the larynx, and the hyoid bone, are intact. The larynx and trachea are patent and are lined by tan mucosa, which is coated with a small amount of regurgitated gastric contents. There is no abnormal mobility or crepitation of the cervical vertebrae.

**MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:** The muscles are normally developed and consistent with those of an adult male. The skeleton is normally developed and consistent with that of an adult male. Fractures have been described.

**HEAD:** Reflection of the scalp reveals no subgaleal hemorrhage. The calvarium is intact. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage. Removal of the dura from the base of the skull reveals no hemorrhage or fractures. The pituitary and proximal spinal cord are intact. There is some congestion of the petrous ridges.

**CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:** The fresh brain weighs 1550 grams and is covered by glistening transparent leptomeninges. The gyri are normally oriented and exhibit no significant flattening. Examination of the base of the brain reveals an intact circle of Willis, without atherosclerosis or aneurysms. The cranial nerves are intact. There is no uncal or cerebellar tonsillar herniation. There is no subarachnoid hemorrhage. The brainstem and cerebellum have their normal external appearance.

Sections of the cerebral hemispheres reveal an intact cortical ribbon and underlying white matter. The basal ganglia and thalamus have their normal appearance. The ventricles are not dilated and are lined by glistening ependyma, without intraventricular hemorrhage. Sections of the brainstem and cerebellum reveal an intact internal structure. The spinal cord is not removed.

**TOXICOLOGY:** Specimens of central blood, urine and gastric contents are retained. Two red top tubes of blood are also retained.

**HISTOLOGY:** Representative tissues are retained.

**PHOTOGRAPHS:** 35 mm. photographs are obtained.

**X-RAYS:** X-rays of the head, chest, abdomen and right arm are obtained.

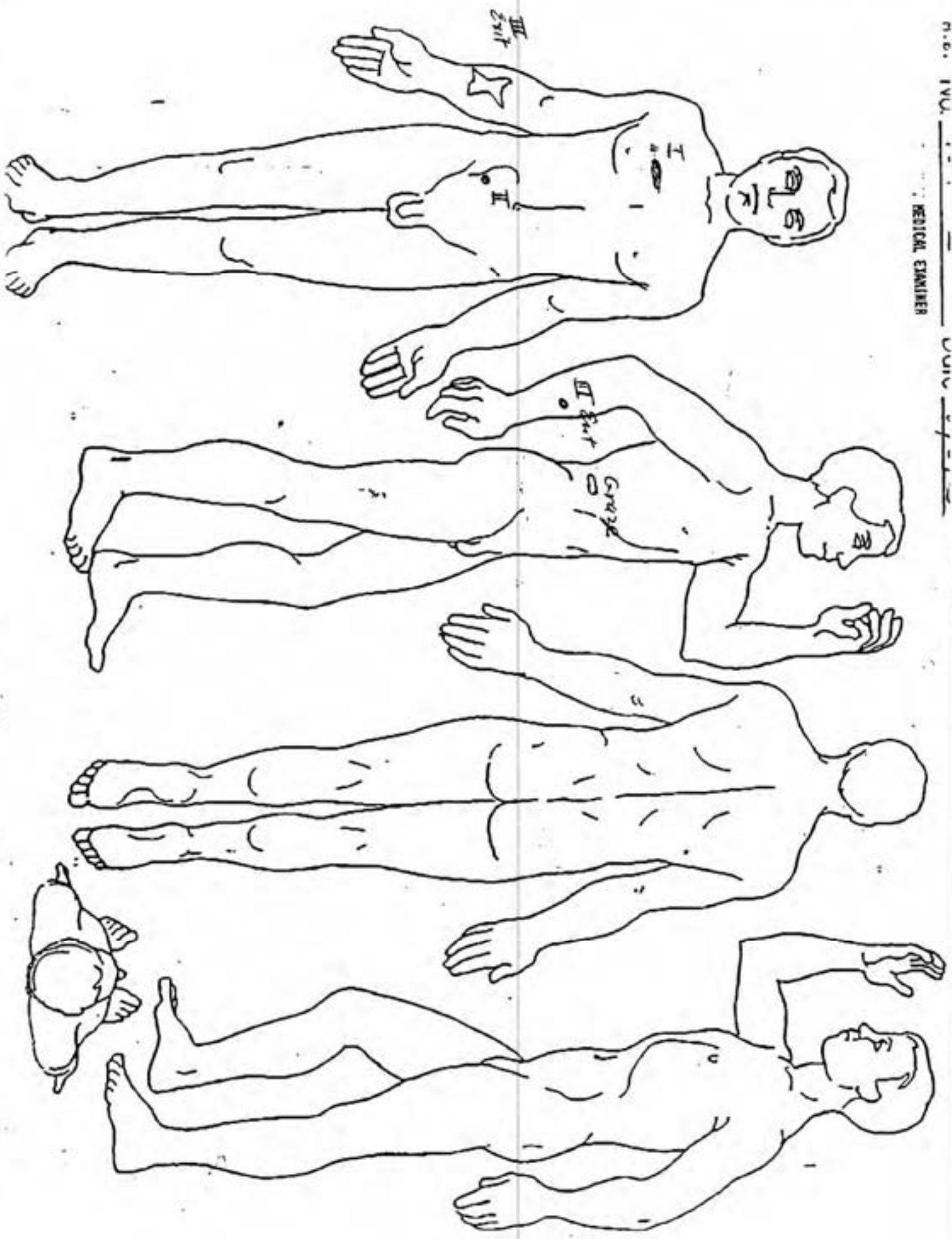

**OBJECTIVE:** Determine the direction of travel of the bullets at the crime scene where possible. Compare the bullets, items 010,011 and 071A to the submitted firearms to determine which firearm they were fired from.

**RESULTS:** The following is a summary of the analytic findings:

On Aug. 5, 2003 I was asked to respond to the East Valley Sheriff's station, which was the scene of a shooting incident. The scene was examined over a period of several days.

There were 33 strikes to the building that could be documented. One travels south the remaining 32 have a basically northbound trajectory. These will be grouped by general location and direction of travel. Letters in brackets [ ] indicate letters in the crime scene photos of the building taken by Bureau of Identification personnel, please see those photographs. One bullet [E] struck north face of the patio wall south bound. One bullet struck the south face of the patio wall, northbound, and produced three related exit holes in the same surface [A through D]. One bullet entered northbound through the south facing glass of the west classroom and struck the north interior wall of the classroom above the service opening. Four bullets struck the south facing stone face work between the patio and the lobby [F-I], northbound. One bullet struck the south facing planter wall near the patio [AG], northbound. Three bullets struck the South facing Glass of the lobby, northbound (interior damage indicates that there may have been a fourth bullet entry in this location). Two bullets enter the South face of the west pillar [J & K] and the upper one [K] exits and traveling north re-enters the south face of the sunroof structure [AC]. Two bullets enter the south face of the pillar cross beam [L & M] and the upper one [M] exits and traveling north re-enters the buildings south face [R]. One bullet entered the south face of the East pillar [N], traveling north. Two bullets enter the west face of the wall trim in the lobby entry area (outside the building) traveling north almost parallel to this west-facing wall [O & P]. Nine bullet entries, traveling north, enter the south wall above the lobby entry [Q, S, T, U, V, W, X, Y and Z (R strikes this face but is a re-entry of M)]. One bullet [AA] enters the south wall carpet east of the lobby entry area, traveling north. Four initial bullet entries, traveling north, enter the south-facing wall the sunroof structure [AB, AD, AE, and AF (AC, W2, X2, Y2 and Z2 are re-entries into this surface)]. One strike in the lobby interior [AH] did not appear to be related to another entry so might have entered through an open door.

One bullet strikes the Sheriff's Department signpost in front of the lobby area traveling north.

One bullet enters the trashcan in the northeast parking area in front of the station traveling in a southwest to Northeast direction.

One bullet enters the left side of the Ford Van California License [REDACTED] (traffic van) traveling south to north.

One bullet enters the left side of the Chevrolet Van California License [REDACTED] (Hazmat Van) traveling west to east.

One bullet enters and exits the right rear tire of the Chevrolet S-10 pickup California License [REDACTED]

The Toyota Solara California License [REDACTED] exhibits one entry in the rear right; the bullet was traveling northward and one strike in the rear of the car.

The Nissan Maxima California License [REDACTED] exhibits one entry in the rear right side, the bullet was traveling northward. One exit on the rear left side and one damage area inside the rear left side. The exiting bullet enters the Volkswagen Jetta California License [REDACTED] which exhibits the entry in the rear right side taillight; the bullet was traveling northward.

The LASD Unit, California license [REDACTED] exhibits six ricochet marks on the hood. The direction of travel is from northeast to southwest and is on a line from the trashcan area of the northeast area of the front parking lot to the rear right corner of the Acura Integra.

The Acura Integra California License [REDACTED] exhibited twenty-seven areas of bullet damage that could be documented. Letters in brackets [ ] indicate letters on the Acura in the photos taken by Bureau of Identification personnel during its examination at the Laboratory, please see those photographs. One in the right headlight [A], one in the front right quarter panel [B], two in the right windshield [C&E], one in the right outside mirror [D], one in the passenger door [F], one in the right side roof above the door [G], one in the right side pillar [H], one in the rear passenger window [I], one in the rear quarter panel at the front edge of the rear wheel well [J], one projectile hole in the lower right rear quarter panel through the rubber trim [K], three projectile holes in the upper rear of the rear right side quarter panel [L, M & N] which are consistent with shotgun slug damage and correspond to the ricochet marks on the LASD unit, one bullet hole in the rear light [O], one bullet hole in the Hatch deck [P], three bullet strikes to the front wheel [Q, S & R], one bullet entry to the front tire and one strike that does not enter [T], one bullet strike to rear wheel [U], two bullets strike in the rear wheel tire [V] (a third entry in the tire is from [J], one bullet strike beneath of passenger door [W] and two bullet strikes to underside of car [X & Y].

The firearm, #27, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. When examined at the scene it was found to contain three discharged and three live rounds. The firearm, #29, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. When examined at the scene it was found to contain six discharged cartridge cases. One bullet entered the south face of the East pillar [N], traveling north. Two bullets enter the west face of the wall trim in the lobby entry area (outside the building) traveling north almost parallel to this west-facing wall [O & P]. Nine bullet entries, traveling north, enter the south wall above the lobby entry [Q, S, T, U, V, W, X, Y and Z (R strikes this face but is a re-entry of M)]. One bullet [AA] enters the south wall parapet east of the lobby entry area, traveling north. Four initial bullet entries, traveling north, enter the south-facing wall of the sunroof structure [AB, AD, AE, and AF (AC, W2, X2, Y2 and Z2 are re-entries into this surface)]. One strike in the lobby interior [AH] did not appear to be related to another entry so might have entered through an open door.

One bullet strikes the Sheriff's Department signpost in front of the lobby area traveling north.

One bullet enters the trashcan in the northeast parking area in front of the station traveling in a southwest to Northeast direction.

One bullet enters the left side of the Ford Van California License [REDACTED] (traffic van) traveling south to north.

One bullet enters the left side of the Chevrolet Van California License [REDACTED] (Hazmat Van) traveling west to east.

One bullet enters and exits the right rear tire of the Chevrolet S-10 pickup California License [REDACTED].

The Toyota Solara California License [REDACTED] exhibits one entry in the rear right; the bullet was traveling northward and one strike in the rear of the car.

One in the right headlight [A], one in the front right quarter panel [B], two in the right windshield [C&E], one in the right outside mirror [D], one in the passenger door [F], one in the right side roof above the door [G], one in the right side pillar [H], one in the rear passenger window [I], one in the rear quarter panel at the front edge of the rear wheel well [J], one projectile hole in the lower right rear quarter panel through the rubber trim [K], three projectile holes in the upper rear of the rear right side quarter panel [L, M & N] which are consistent with shotgun slug damage and correspond to the ricochet marks on the LASD unit, one bullet hole in the rear light [O], one bullet hole in the Hatch deck [P], three bullet strikes to the front wheel [Q, S & R], one bullet entry to the front tire and one strike that does not enter [T], one bullet strike to rear wheel [U], two bullets strike in the rear wheel tire [V] (a third entry in the tire is from [J], one bullet strike beneath of passenger door [W] and two bullet strikes to underside of car [X & Y].

The firearm, #27, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. When examined at the scene it was found to contain three discharged and three live rounds. The firearm, #29, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. When examined at the scene it was found to contain six discharged cartridge cases. The firearm, #31, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #45, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #46, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #54, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #56, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #60, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #90, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition. The firearm, #91, was examined, test fired and found to be in normal operating condition.

The bullet #10 was fired from the Colt rifle #60.  
The bullet #71A was fired from the Ruger revolver, #29.

On 8-5-03, I responded to the Ventura County Sheriff's Department East County Station, arriving at about 1015 hours. I was directed by the Case Agent, Sergeant Melissa Smith to interview Los Angeles Police Officer Maurice Hallauer as he was believed to be one of the officers involved in a shooting that occurred earlier that day at the East County Station.

I contacted Los Angeles Police Officer Hallauer and asked him if he wanted to give a statement after he had contacted Los Angeles Police Protective League Attorney Gary Ingemunson. Hallauer told me that he would give me a statement. We went into Commander Keith Parks' office where I interviewed Hallauer. Also present during the interview besides Los Angeles Police Officer Maurice Hallauer #32654, were Los Angeles Police Protective League Attorney Gary Ingemunson, Los Angeles Police Officer Scott Rate #26509, who was with the Officer Representation Section.

I began by stating that it was my understanding the Hallauer was attending an traffic accident reconstruction class at the East County Sheriff's station when some gunfire erupted in the public parking lot outside and Hallauer was involved "somehow" in that shooting. Hallauer concurred with this statement.

I asked Hallauer to briefly tell me what happened. Hallauer said that he and others were in the traffic accident reconstruction class (in the community room, located in the NW corner of the East County Sheriff's Station) in the front of the building. Hallauer heard rounds being fired. The whole class crouched and moved toward the (south) window (facing the public parking lot) to see what was happening. Hallauer saw a small red car in the parking lot with a subject

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behind the car. Hallauer heard a shot. Hallauer crept outside the classroom onto the patio (toward the public parking lot and emanation of the gunfire) taking cover behind the patio wall that separates the patio from the public parking lot. Hallauer drew his pistol, peeked over the top of the patio wall and saw a muzzle blast from the suspect's weapon. Hallauer returned fire, shooting at the suspect after seeing that there was a hillside background behind the suspect. Hallauer explained that he didn't know how many rounds that he fired. Hallauer said that he had 2 magazines for his Smith and Wesson .45 caliber semi-automatic pistol, each magazine holding 7 rounds and 1 round in the chamber of his pistol, carrying a combined total of 15 rounds.

After firing the first set of shots, he again took complete cover behind the wall, moved to his left and peeked out a gate and saw the suspect turn to his right and fire a large black revolver (toward the staff parking lot). The suspect turned back facing Hallauer and shot another round at the Sheriff's building (where Hallauer was concealing himself). Hallauer returned fire at the suspect again.

**Injuries**

Hallauer said that at some time during this exchange of gunfire, bullets hit the Sheriff's building beside him causing debris to strike his hand in two separate places. Hallauer showed me two injuries, the first injury he sustained being a small cut about 1/8 inch in diameter on his left inner thumb between the tip of the thumb and first knuckle. Hallauer said he sustained a second injury a few seconds later, showing me a cut about 1/4 inch in diameter, located on the back of his left hand about 1 1/2 inches from the 3<sup>rd</sup> knuckles midway between the index and middle finger. Hallauer said that a paramedic told him that he may still have some debris in the thumb wounds. I later photographed Hallauer's injuries and downloaded the digital images into the Ventura County Sheriff's Photo Lab system under this report number, titled "LAPD Officer Maurice Hallauer's Injuries." Copies of these photos were given to Detective Sergeant M. Smith along with this report.

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Back to the shooting incident, Hallauer said a Ventura County Sheriff's Deputy had retrieved a shotgun loaded with slugs. Hallauer said that he and the Ventura County Sheriff's Deputy retreated back into the classroom (community room) and the deputy began shooting at the suspect with the shotgun. Hallauer ceased firing, believing that the deputy had a better chance of hitting the suspect with shotgun slugs. Hallauer continued watching the suspect and verbally relaying his suspect observations to the deputy with the shotgun.

Hallauer said that the deputy told him that he was low on ammunition. Hallauer asked the deputy where he could obtain ammunition. Hallauer said that the deputy handed him a blue card and told him go downstairs toward the conference room and he would need the card to get through the door. Hallauer left the community room, went downstairs in pursuit of more shotgun slug ammunition. Hallauer said that he asked some people where he could get some shotgun slug ammunition (not getting a satisfactory response). Hallauer said that finally a female Ventura County Sheriff's Sergeant retrieved a shotgun from a patrol unit and handed him a shotgun. Hallauer said that he returned to the shooting scene and the incident was over. End of initial interview.

**Video and Audio Taped Walk Through Interview of  
Los Angeles Police Officer Maurice Hallauer**

In addition to myself and Officer Hallauer, Los Angeles Police Protective League Attorney Gary Ingemunson, Los Angeles Police CIID Detective Tim Blake #25612, Ventura County Senior Deputy District Attorney James Ellison. The interview was video taped by Ventura County Sheriff's Evidence Technician [REDACTED]. In addition to the video, I audiotaped the interview.

I explained that we were beginning the interview (at the East County Sheriff's Station) adjacent to Commander Keith Parks' office, heading to the community room (where the traffic accident reconstruction class took place). Hallauer showed us he was seated in a seat where there was an arrowhead water bottle on the desk. Hallauer was seated at the desk nearest the door leading to Sheriff's administration. There were two seating positions at the desk. Hallauer was

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seated furthest from the public parking lot, about 15 feet from the south window that faces the public parking lot. During the walk through interview, the blinds were partially drawn on the south window that faces the public parking lot. Hallauer said that during the incident, the window blinds were open. Hallauer said that the class students crouched down and moved toward the window after he heard the shots. Hallauer said that he moved to about 10 feet from the south door of the community room and about 10 feet from the east wall of the classroom. Hallauer saw the red car with somebody behind it. Hallauer moved to the patio in a crouched position.

Hallauer showed me how he moved to the S/E corner of the patio. Hallauer said he and the other deputy were crouched down, placing the cover of the patio wall between themselves and the suspect who was firing his weapon. Hallauer knelt on one knee and drew his pistol from his off-duty carrying fanny-pack holster. Hallauer raised his head above the wall enough to where he could see the suspect. Hallauer showed us that he pointed his weapon toward the red car and returned gunfire when he saw a muzzle blast (from the suspect's weapon). Hallauer said he didn't know how many rounds he fired from that position. Hallauer crouched down behind the wall again.

Hallauer showed us that he moved about a foot to the east, sticking his head out of an (open) wrought iron gate that is built into the east-facing wall of the patio. At about that time, Hallauer saw the suspect turn to his right (toward the staff parking lot) and fire one round from his weapon in that direction.

Hallauer said that the suspect then turned back facing his direction (toward the community room) and began firing in Hallauer's direction again. Hallauer returned gunfire from the east gated area of the patio. Hallauer said he doesn't recall how many rounds he fired from that position. Hallauer heard or saw (he doesn't remember which) a Ventura County Sheriff's Deputy with a shotgun inside the community room. Hallauer showed us that he moved back into the community room and saw the deputy firing the shotgun from generally in the center of where the spent shotgun casings were currently at on the floor. Hallauer moved to the left side

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of the community room and began verbally relaying the suspect's movements to the deputy with the shotgun.

Hallauer said that the deputy told him he was low on ammunition. Hallauer asked the deputy where could he get some more ammunition. Hallauer said the deputy handed him a blue (key card) and told Hallauer to go downstairs. Hallauer left the community room and went down the flight of stairs that leads to the jail and property room.

Hallauer said he didn't know how to use the blue key card. Hallauer began pressing the buzzer for the property room. A male opened the (non key card accessed) north door, adjacent to the property room public counter. Hallauer told the male that he needed to find slug rounds. The male told Hallauer he would unlock the (key card accessed) east door. The male "buzzed" (unlocked) the door. Hallauer went east in the hallway between the property room and the elevator encountering "a lot of people," saying that he needed to find slug rounds. Hallauer said that he saw a bunch of people by the rear sliding door, "I know there were a bunch of police cars." DDA Ellison said that he was one of the persons in the area at the time and saw Hallauer go out the north door on the bottom floor to the patrol vehicle parking lot. Hallauer stepped out the north door and saw a female Ventura County Sheriff's Sergeant. The Sergeant asked Hallauer who he was. Hallauer replied, "I'm LAPD." The Sergeant opened some car doors and found a shotgun in a Sheriff's patrol car. The female Sheriff's Sergeant gave Hallauer a shotgun. Hallauer took the shotgun back upstairs and everything was over when he arrived there.

**Hallauer's Gun Condition**

I was present when Hallauer's gun was unloaded. On 8-5-03 at about 1530 hours, Hallauer removed his stainless steel Smith and Wesson .45 caliber pistol from his fanny-pack holster. I saw Hallauer remove one round from the firing chamber of his pistol. I saw Hallauer remove a magazine from the butt of his pistol and place it on a desk. I removed 4 rounds from the magazine that Hallauer removed from his pistol, making a total of 5 unspent rounds removed from Hallauer's pistol and two clips. I saw Hallauer remove an empty magazine from his right

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front pants pocket and place it on the desk with his pistol. The pistol was photographed with the one round found in the pistol near the trigger guard, the four rounds found in the magazine near the magazine it was found in and the empty magazine, all in the same photo. Evidence Technician [REDACTED] took the pistol, individually packaging the components of the pistol as we found them and booked the pistol into evidence later at the Ventura County Sheriff's property room in Ventura.

I subsequently took the aforementioned 3 digital photographs of Hallauer and the injuries to his left hand. I will forward copies of the audio and videotape of Hallauer's interview to Hallauer's attorney pursuant to Hallauer's request. I gave the original audiocassette tape of Hallauer's statement to the case agent, Sergeant Melissa Smith.

**Interview of Deputy**

**Richard Curry**

**#292831**

**Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department**

On 8/5/03, after my interviews with Sr. Deputies Smith and Ebersole, I was asked to interview Deputy Curry who is a Deputy with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Dept. I was told by Sgt. Melissa Smith that Curry had been attending the class in the Community Room when the shooting started. Furthermore, I was told that Curry returned fire during the time the suspect was shooting at the station.

I contacted Curry in the Administration Office of the East Valley Sheriff's Station. Curry was accompanied by several department representatives, who introduced themselves as Elizabeth Gibbons (legal counsel), Detectives Elizabeth Smith and Timothy Miley (LASO Homicide). After we spoke briefly, I suggested that we move to a "soft" interview room where I could interview Curry.

The following is a synopsis of a taped interview and is not verbatim. Refer to tape for additional details.

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At 1412 hours, I began the interview with Curry with his representatives present. I began by asking Curry to tell me in his own words what happened earlier.

Curry began by telling me he was at the East Valley Station attending a "traffic reconstruction" class in the Conference Room. Curry added that today was the second day of a ten day class which was hosted by the Ventura County Sheriff's Dept.

While the instructor was talking to the class, he heard "popping" sounds coming from outside the building. Curry said the sounds were like gunfire, and thought that it was some type of training.

Curry went on to say that he and one of the Ventura County Deputies got up and looked outside to see what was going on. Curry told me he saw a red car at the entrance of the visitor parking lot with a subject standing behind the car who was shooting at the station.

I asked Curry where he was sitting at the time he heard the shooting begin. He told me it was one seat from the end (closest to the windows at the front of the building).

Next, I asked Curry about seeing the shooter and if he could tell what type of gun he was shooting. Curry said he could see the suspect with something black in his hands, which he was pointing around the side of the car. When asked if it was a handgun or rifle, Curry said he could not tell, but assumed it was a handgun. Curry commented on the fact the sounds that he was hearing, sounded bigger than a handgun.

Curry went on to say that several of the officers in the classroom went outside and were kneeling down behind the wall. Curry added that this is when he realized that the suspect was really shooting at the station.

Curry said that he saw one of the Ventura County Deputies with his gun out near the wall, so he went outside and took cover near the wall himself. Curry said the Ventura Deputy began to shoot at the suspect at which time the suspect stopped firing. Curry said he took the opportunity to peek over the wall and saw the suspect reloading. Shortly after this, the suspect again began firing at the station.

Curry said the suspect stopped firing again, at which time he looked over the wall a second time and saw the suspect reloading. Curry said he then began firing his weapon at the

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suspect. After shooting several rounds at the suspect, the suspect began firing at them. Curry said he could hear bullets being fired in his direction.

Curry said the suspect stopped firing again, and he looked up to see where the suspect was. Curry said he could see the suspect behind the car and fired his remaining bullets at the suspect. Curry added that after he ran out of ammunition (off duty gun) he thought about the fact that the suspect may approach the area where he was taking cover. Based on the fact that his gun was empty, Curry decided to take cover inside the building.

I asked Curry about going to the outside wall where the Ventura Deputy was at after the shooting started. I asked Curry if he knew who the deputy was. Curry said he didn't know his name, but said he was a tall, bald, "motor officer" from our department (VSO).

I confirmed with Curry that this officer began to shoot at the suspect first and he was next to that officer. Curry said he thought there was another officer between himself and the Ventura Co. Deputy. Curry said it could have been the LAPD officer, but he was not sure.

I asked Curry if he could recall the number of bullets he fired in the first volley. He said he could not remember.

When asked what type of gun he was using, Curry told me it was his "off duty" gun which was a Smith and Wesson, Model 406, 9 mm.

I asked Curry about the events again and the fact he engaged the suspect twice. I asked Curry about what he saw the suspect doing while he (Curry) was shooting at him. Curry said the suspect was doing something in the trunk of the car. I confirmed that the trunk lid was up. Curry added he noticed the suspect's car was parked "off set" as if trying to give himself more cover to conceal himself. Curry also said he could clearly see the suspect through the glass of the hatchback.

Curry said that based on the fact the suspect was firing his weapon, then stopping and firing again, lead him to believe the suspect was reloading his gun each time he stopped shooting.

I asked Curry if he could describe the suspect. He said he was a [REDACTED] When asked about an approximate age, Curry said he did not know.

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I asked Curry if he actually saw the suspect firing his weapon. Curry said, "Yes". I then asked if the suspect was lying across the car and if he was using one hand to fire or both. Curry said he could not tell from where he was at.

I asked Curry if he could say how many shots were fired by the suspect. He said that initially when he was in the classroom, he heard four to five shots. After that when he was outside, there were a lot of shots fired by the suspect.

I asked Curry if there was any conversation between himself and the other officers near the outside wall. Curry said there was some conversation between the VSO Deputies, but he could not recall any details. He did say he recalled one of the VSO guys saying something to the effect of "this guy is really shooting".

I asked Curry about something he mentioned earlier in that he said while he was near the wall a bullet had struck the building near where he was. Curry said in thinking back, the bullet struck the top of the window of the classroom.

I asked Curry about the suspect firing at them and what he was thinking at the time. Curry responded by telling me he was afraid that either he or one of the other officers were going to get shot. He also mentioned he didn't know if the windows at the front of the station were bullet proof and the fact that someone in the station could have been shot.

I asked Curry if he recalled seeing any civilians in front of the station while this was going on. He said that while he was shooting at the suspect, he did not see anyone else in the area.

I asked Curry if he heard the suspect yell or say anything during this incident. He told me he did not.

We spoke briefly about his gun once more and discussed the bullet capacity of that weapon. After doing so, Curry felt he shot nine times during the event (eight from the magazine and one in the chamber). In discussing the bullets, Curry thought they were department issued "hollow points". We then looked at a bullet from Det. Miley's gun and decided the bullets Curry had in his gun were Winchester brand.

I asked the others if they had any questions to ask Curry. Det. Sgt. Miley asked Curry if the suspect was facing his direction when he first went outside near the wall. Curry confirmed this. Sgt. Miley then asked about a second magazine, and Curry told him he did not have one.

I then discussed with the others that since we were doing the investigation, we would take the gun into our custody and do the ballistic work up on it. All parties agreed and I took control of Curry's empty Smith and Wesson (serial # [REDACTED]).

Shortly after this, my interview with Curry concluded. Refer to tape for additional details.

After I received Curry's handgun, I obtained a "gun box" from the East Valley Property Room. I then used plastic wire ties to secure the gun to the box. I located FET [REDACTED] and at 1505 hours, I turned the gun over to him where it was later booked into evidence.

On August 5, 2003, I drove to the East County Sheriff's Station to assist other investigators with an officer involved shooting investigation. (S) Gregg Hackett had driven into the front parking lot of the East County Station and began shooting at the station and people in the parking lot with two handguns. He was ultimately shot by sheriff's deputies. I interviewed several deputies, including Deputy Axelrod, who were witnesses to the crime. I interviewed Deputy Axelrod in a report writing room at the East County Station at about 1140 hours.

Deputy Axelrod told me he is assigned to the East County Special Enforcement Unit (SEU). He has been a deputy for about eight years, and has been assigned to the East County Station for approximately five years.

Deputy Axelrod arrived for work on August 5<sup>th</sup> at about 0800 hours. After he arrived at the station, he sat at his desk and began doing paperwork in the SEU office. Axelrod told me while he was sitting at his desk he heard, "Shot's fired, respond Code 3!" Axelrod told me he was not sure if he heard this information over the station's public address system or if it was over the police radio.

Deputy Axelrod told me he assumed the "traffic" was for an officer in the field, so he immediately headed to his car in the parking lot to respond wherever he was going to be needed. While Axelrod was on his way to his car, he heard other people in the station yelling that help was needed out in front of the station, and he realized that was where the incident was unfolding. Axelrod told me he

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continued to his car and retrieved his AR-15 and body armor from the trunk. Once he was outside the building, Axelrod could hear gunshots.

After retrieving his equipment from his car, Axelrod ran toward the southside of the station to a group of deputies who were standing behind a retaining wall at the southwest corner of the building. As he approached the deputies, he saw someone running from that location into the employee parking lot. Axelrod told me he noticed the person running into the employee parking lot was wearing a tie, and he thought the person was Detective P. Dain (ID# 1119). Axelrod also saw other people running to different locations, and he was trying to figure out where the shooting was coming from. He noticed almost everyone's attention was focused toward the front parking lot of the station, so he assumed that was where the shooter was located.

As Axelrod arrived at the other deputies' location, Senior Deputy D. Ambarian (ID# 2203) directed him to a low rooftop near the rear exit to the detective offices. Axelrod and Ambarian took cover behind the corner of the building on the northside of the roof. While they were on the roof, Axelrod said he remembered Ambarian fired "a couple" rounds from that location. I asked Axelrod if he saw Ambarian actually fire the rounds, and he said to me, "I either heard it or I looked and I saw the shells." Axelrod told me there was a lot of chaos and people yelling out directions.

Axelrod told me a few minutes later, Detective Dain was yelling for someone with an AR-15 to run to his location. Axelrod said Ambarian turned and headed down off the roof. Axelrod remained at that location for several moments, trying to locate the suspect. He told me he could see the top of the suspect's car and the top of the LASD patrol car it was stopped near, but he never saw the suspect.

The call continued from other deputies for someone with an AR-15 to head to their location, so Axelrod left the roof and ran to the group of deputies congregating in the employee parking lot. Axelrod remembered that Detective Dain and Deputy J. Rivas (ID# 1992) were members of the group.

The group of deputies began to approach the suspect's car. Axelrod told me he could see the suspect's legs on the ground as he looked under the suspect's car, but the top part of his body was blocked from view by car tires. Deputies J. Cantrell (ID# 2631) and M. Correia (ID# 2733) were approaching the suspect's car from the east. Other deputies were yelling, "He's down, he's down", so Axelrod's group continued to approach the suspect's location.

As they continued to approach the suspect's car from the south, Axelrod could see two "handguns on the ground and shell casings...all over the place." He told me one of the guns was black and he thought the second gun was silver colored. He also thought they were both large caliber revolvers with long barrels.

Once the suspect's body was in view, Axelrod could see that the suspect was prone, on the ground. The suspect's right arm was extended away from his body, and his left arm was underneath him. Finally, when they were close enough to the suspect, Sr. Deputy T. Kingi (ID# 3016) handcuffed the suspect while Axelrod covered the suspect with his AR-15.

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I asked Axelrod if the suspect said anything to them while he was being handcuffed. Axelrod told me the suspect was not conscious, and he was "gurgling white liquid." Axelrod told me the suspect had a wound on his right forearm. He also thought the suspect may have had a head wound and leg wounds because of the locations and amounts of blood he saw near his head and legs, but he was not sure.

After the suspect was handcuffed, the handguns were pushed away from him. He was checked for additional weapons and a fanny pack was pulled off him. Once deputies were sure there were no additional weapons near the suspect, they immediately requested fire department and ambulance personnel to treat the suspect for his injuries. Axelrod told me medical personnel arrived quickly and began treating the suspect. At that point, deputies began to back away from the suspect, and supervisors began organizing the crime scene.

Axelrod told me he did not fire any rounds during this incident. The only deputy Axelrod actually saw fire a weapon at the suspect was Sr. Deputy Ambarian. Axelrod never saw the suspect shooting the weapons he had. Axelrod's first view of the suspect was when he saw the suspect's legs under his car. Axelrod felt this incident lasted about ten to fifteen minutes.

My interview with Deputy Axelrod was recorded on a cassette tape. The tape was turned into Sergeant M. Smith and will be retained with the case file. While I was interviewing Axelrod, I had him draw a brief diagram of the East County Station so I could better understand what he was trying to explain to me. I secured the drawing as evidence and booked it into the Sheriff's Property Room.

On August 7, 2003, I spoke with FET [REDACTED] who was still at the East County Station processing evidence, regarding the possible shell casings on the roof that were ejected from Sr. Deputy Ambarian's handgun. [REDACTED] told me he would check the roof area for spent casings.

Investigation continuing.

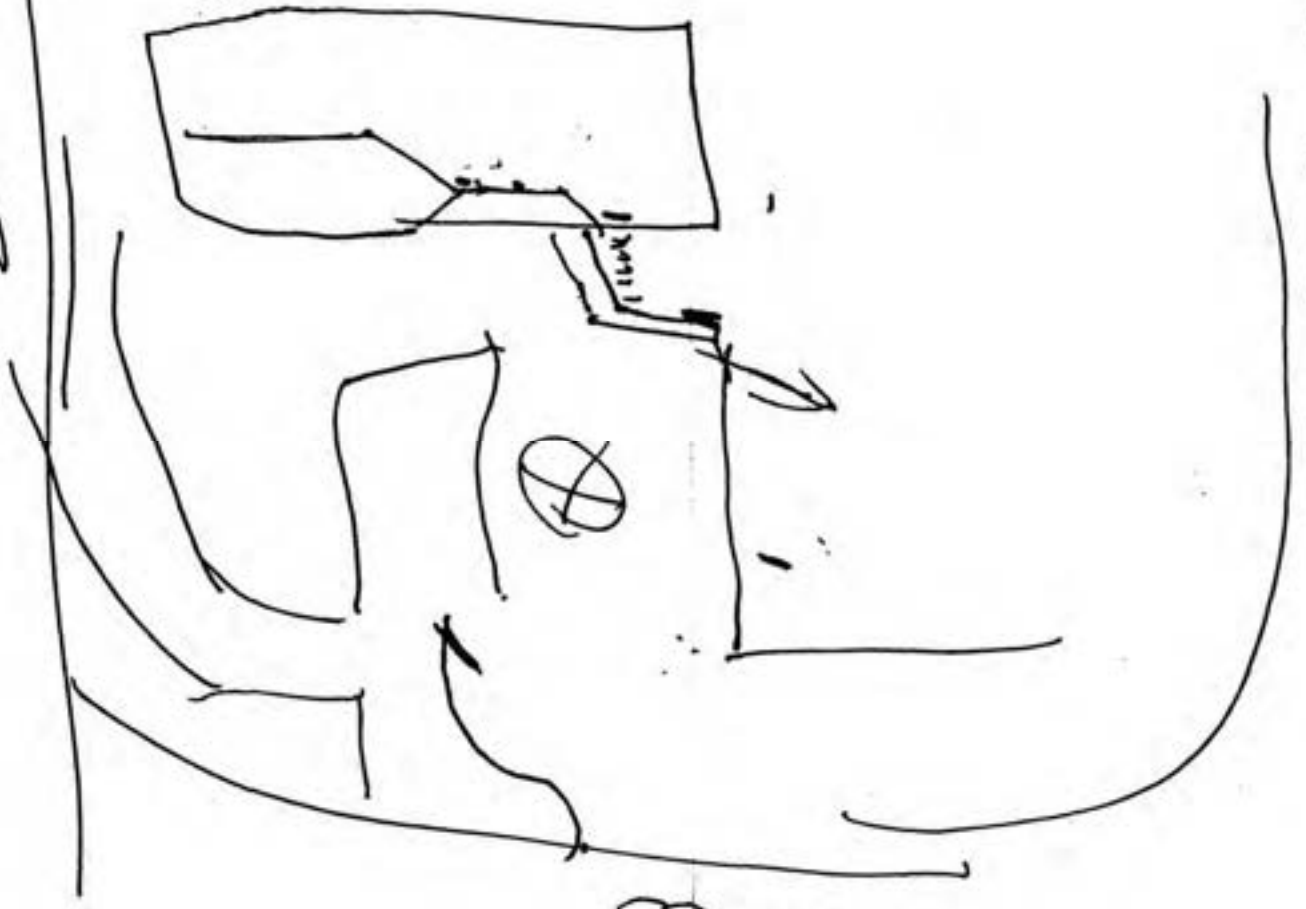

On 8-5-03, I spoke with Deputy Bill Butterfield in regards to an officer involved shooting that occurred at the East County Sheriff's Station in Thousand Oaks, CA. Deputy Butterfield was at the station and on duty at the time of the shooting. He told me the following:

At the time of the shooting, Deputy Butterfield was speaking with an identity theft victim named [REDACTED]. They were in the press-room which was in the station lobby. Deputy Butterfield heard two popping noises. He opened the door from the press-room which led to the lobby. Deputy Butterfield saw Captain Cozzens looking out the door which led from Administration. Deputy Butterfield realized the noises he heard was gunfire and he saw one of the lobby windows shatter. Captain Cozzens told Deputy Butterfield he saw a shooting suspect in the parking lot. He provided Deputy Butterfield with a description of the suspect, his vehicle as well as a location for that suspect. Deputy Butterfield relayed this information to Sheriff's Dispatch using his portable radio. Deputy Butterfield could not remember what Captain Cozzens told him, just that he told that information to dispatch. During this time, Deputy Butterfield also saw Sergeant Salas standing at the door which led from the lobby to the traffic division and records division. Deputy Butterfield heard an exchange of gunshots for about five to ten minutes after he initially heard the two popping noises.

On August 5, 2003, I spoke with Jason Cantrell at the East County Sheriff's Station in Thousand Oaks. This interview was fragmented at times and for ease of reading it is written in a chronological order. The following is a synopsis of our tape-recorded conversation.

Cantrell was not sure of the specific time he left the station and did not notify Sheriff's dispatch that he and Corriea were in service. Deputy Corriea (Correia) left the East County Station in separate cars. Cantrell drove from the detective parking lot and did not see any red vehicles pulling into the station as he left. Jason drove south on SR 23. At the Sunset Hills off ramp, he heard a "code twelve" and some other radio traffic about shots being fired at "station ten." Corriea and Cantrell turned around in the center medium at Janss Road and returned to the East County Station.

At the East County Station, Cantrell saw three deputies staged at the station driveway on Olsen Road. Corriea, armed with an AR-15, began to approach the suspect from the rear. Cantrell saw the suspect lying on the ground behind a red vehicle. Corriea and Cantrell began to approach the suspect. From about fifteen feet, Cantrell saw a silver revolver near the suspect.

Cantrell saw other deputies approach the suspect and Senior Deputy Kingi handcuffed the suspect while several other deputies were in the employee parking lot.

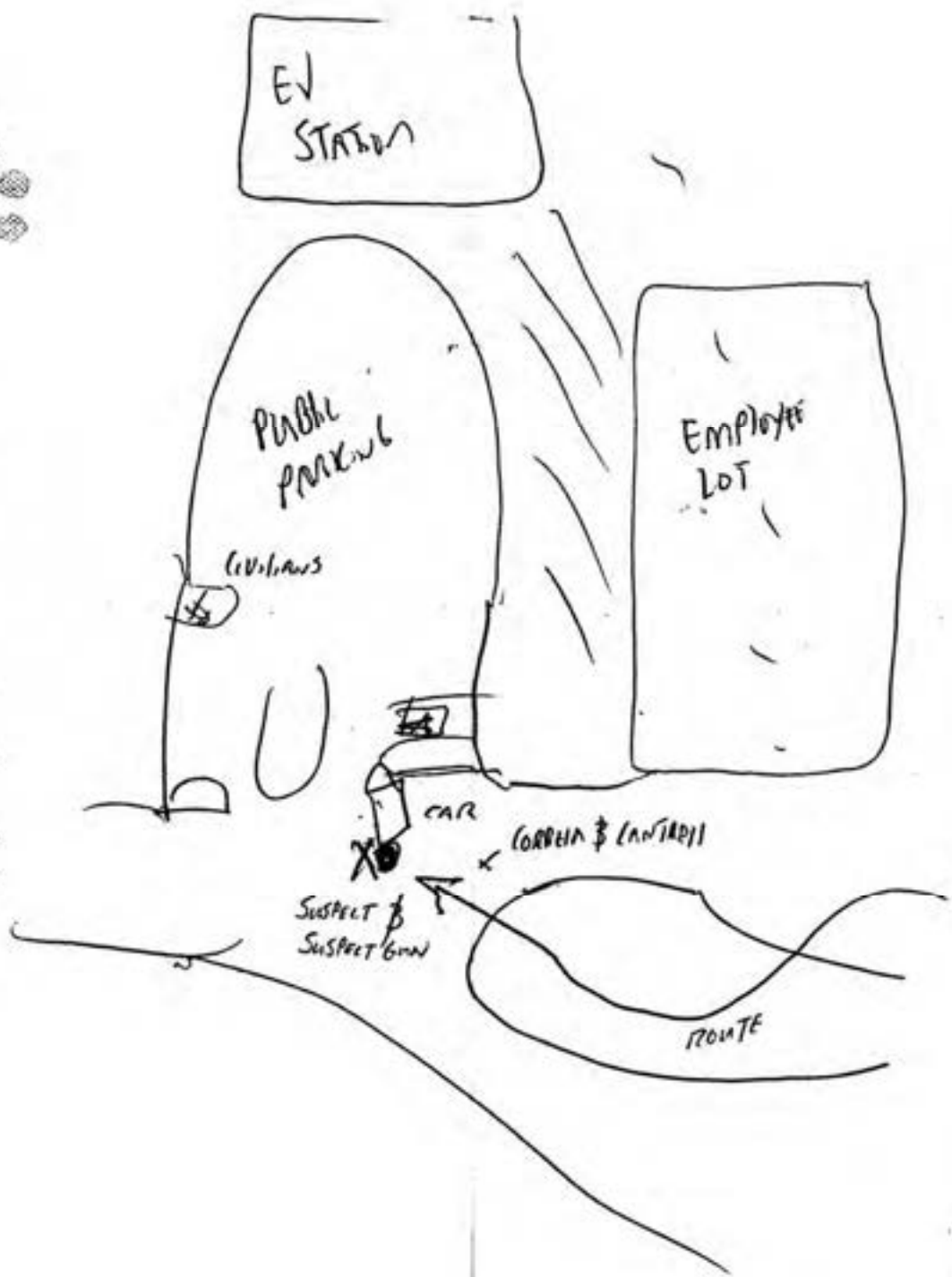

On 8-5-2003, at about 1030hrs, I received a call from Sgt. Don Aguilar to respond to East Valley Sheriff's station (EVSO) to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. Sgt. Aguilar told me that a suspect had driven to the front of the station, got out of his vehicle and fired numerous shots into the station lobby. No further was known at this time.

I immediately responded to the location and upon arrival learned the shooter was down and no longer a threat. I subsequently met with other investigators in the station patrol briefing room where I was assigned to interview witnesses.

At about 1300hrs, I interviewed Detective Mike Christensen about his knowledge of the shooting. Mike told me that at about 0940hrs, date, he and other investigators were attending an investigator meeting being held in the station's downstairs patrol briefing room when the

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station intercom/paging system announced that shots were being fired at the station. Mike said he and the other investigators all left the meeting room and responded upstairs to determine how they could assist. Mike said he heard one or more shots fired and was told by someone that the shots were coming from or into the lobby of the building.

Mike said ran back downstairs and out the rear doors to the lower parking lot where his unmarked unit was parked to obtain his body armor (vest) from the trunk. Mike said that simultaneously, he saw Sr. Dep. Jody Keller in the lower lot obtaining a shotgun from her unmarked unit. Mike said he joined her and the two of them moved cautiously along the south (right) side of the station toward the front of the complex where they believed the active shooter was located.

Mike said he could still hear some shots being fired but could not determine where they were being fired from. Mike said he noticed several deputies, both uniformed and non-uniformed, moving in the employee parking lot just south and above his location, (elevated terrain). Mike said the deputies appeared to be focused upon an area of the visitor's parking lot located in front of the station. During this time Mike said he could hear the continual sound of gunshots. Mike told me he heard several deputies yelling repeatedly, "Drop the gun." Mike said that soon thereafter the deputies in the employee lot moved forward into the visitor's lot so he and Sr. Dep. Keller continued their movement south from the station wall toward what they believed to be the active scene. Mike said he and Keller made it to the first row of vehicles in the employee parking lot closest to the station and remained in cover as a second suspect was thought to be present. Mike said he could not see the suspect vehicle or the suspect from his location.

Mike said that at some point shortly thereafter the gunshots stopped and he heard some deputies yelling the suspect was "down". Mike said he now moved forward cautiously, looking for additional suspects in the employee parking lot as he advanced.

Mike said he eventually arrived at the top of the employee parking lot near the scene and saw the scene was already being taped off and paramedics were already on scene, evidently attempting to treat the suspect lying handcuffed behind a red compact car parked in the

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entrance to the visitor's lot just north of the four-way intersection of the visitor lot, employee lot, rear access road, and the Olsen Road entrance.

Mike said that during his slow advance toward the scene, clearing the employee lot for other suspects, he recalls having seen the fire department arriving on Olsen Road and staging just outside the entrance, in an area that was subject to being fired upon by the suspect. He said it appeared the fire vehicles may have been stuck in the traffic on Olsen Road at the time and unable to advance or retreat until the scene was secured and they were waved in by other deputies.

Mike said Captain O'Hanlon asked him to accompany the suspect to the hospital so Mike returned to the rear lot and brought his unmarked unit around to prepare for departure. Mike said he parked and returned to the scene on foot and saw the paramedics were still working on the suspect. Mike said that shortly thereafter he heard from another officer(s) that paramedics had pronounced the suspect dead.

Mike said he then assisted with separating the deputies involved in the shooting into the shooters and non-shooters pending arrival of investigators for interviews.

**Interview of Deputy Rebecca Coons #2874**

On 08/05/03, at approximately 1220 hours, I conducted a tape-recorded interview of Deputy Coons #2874. Below is a synopsis of this interview. For further details, refer to the audiotape.

Dep. Coons was working uniformed patrol in the East County area. She heard Sheriff's dispatch (SCC) broadcast a Code 12 (closest unit respond) for shots fired at the community room. Dep. Coons responded code 3 from Collins and the 118 freeway, following Deputy Lantz #3474.

Dep. Coons and Dep. Lantz arrived just after Deputy Spiker #3405. Dep. Coons parked her unit so it was blocking the main exit driveway of the station. Dep. Coons exited her unit with the shotgun. When she exited her unit, she heard subjects yelling. Dep. Lantz was parked in front of her unit and she responded to his unit.

Dep. Coons said an unknown subject was yelling at them to stay back. Then an unknown subject yelled at them to approach. Deputies Coons, Lantz, and Spiker ran westbound, up the entrance driveway to the station.

Dep. Coons said they ran northbound, over the area that separates the entrance driveway from the employee parking lot. This area has various plants present in it. Dep. Coons indicated the area they went through was located west of the third light standard, when counting them from east to west.

They entered the southernmost parking area of the employee parking lot. Dep. Coons said she heard numerous people yelling to "watch for crossfire." Dep. Coons proceeded

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westbound, though the south side of the southernmost parking area. She took cover behind a gray Honda Odyssey minivan, behind the rear driver's side of the vehicle. Dep. Coons thought Deputies Spiker, Lantz, and Correia #2733 were behind the front driver's side of the same vehicle, using it as cover. Dep. Coons said she was not certain as to who was in this position, as she was paying more attention to the suspect's location.

Dep. Coons thought it was Deputy Roberts #2948, who was in the parking area located north of the one she was in, telling people to "approach but watch for crossfire." Dep. Coons said there were numerous personnel in the parking areas located north of her location. She commented on the fact that all these personnel were wearing "plain clothes."

Dep. Coons said she had not heard any gunfire. She had not seen anyone fire their weapons.


Dep. Coons moved around the backside of the minivan and moved westbound. She was then able to see the suspect's vehicle. Dep. Coons took cover behind a white colored van, which belonged to the Ventura County Environmental Health Department. This vehicle was also parked on the south side of the same parking area.

Dep. Coons remembered seeing Sergeant Wareham #2108 in front of her. There were approximately "two or three" other subjects with Sgt. Wareham. Dep. Coons said there were "a couple people" who were approaching the area where the suspect was located. These subjects approached from the southernmost driveway of the employee parking lot.

I asked Dep. Coons where Sgt. Wareham was located when she first saw him. Dep. Coons said, "He was just in front of me and I think he was prone out." She did not remember if Sgt. Wareham was "in the bushes or in the driveway..." Dep. Coons said that "somebody was saying" to shoot the suspect if he moved. This same subject said the suspect was not moving at the time. Dep. Coons said that "they started approaching" the suspect, while she maintained her position.

I asked if she saw anything in Sgt. Wareham's hands. Dep. Coons responded, "It looked like he had an AR(15)." The suspect was lying in the same area where he was located at the time of this interview.

Dep. Coons said the suspect was handcuffed and an ambulance was brought into the scene. After the suspect was handcuffed, Deputy Oswald #3365, Officer Herbst #338 (of the

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Simi Valley Police Department), another law enforcement subject, and Dep. Coons cleared vehicles in the employee parking lot, after someone said this task needed to be completed.

Dep. Coons cleared some of the vehicles located in the southernmost parking area of the employee parking lot. She then cleared some of the vehicles located in the parking area north of this parking area. Both these parking areas were located in the employee parking lot. Dep. Coons was told to go into the station and did so.

Dep. Coons did not fire her weapon during this incident. She did not see anyone else fire their weapon during this incident. She did not recall hearing any shots fired during this incident.

**Review of audiotape recording made by Deputy Coons**

As Dep. Coons was getting off the freeway at Olsen Rd, she activated her micro cassette recorder. She thought she turned it off after the suspect was handcuffed. She provided me with this audiotape.

I reviewed the contents of this audiotape. Below is a synopsis of the tape's contents. For further details, refer to the audiotape booked as evidence.


Some of the radio traffic is audible on the tape. This consisted of units putting themselves on scene. Someone broadcasts that the suspect is behind a red vehicle, crouching down. Someone is heard saying, "Sergeant Wareham wants us to go up."

Subjects are heard saying to watch the crossfire. Someone says the suspect is not moving, at that moment. Someone says that the subject is down and not moving.

A broadcast is made regarding personnel approaching and taking the suspect into custody. Another broadcast is made, saying the suspect is down and units are "code 4." Someone requests, over the radio, for fire and ambulance to respond.

Dep. Coons and other personnel are heard organizing and conducting the clearing of parked vehicles. Someone is heard saying that those involved in the incident were to go to specific areas inside the station.

Dep. Coons' tape recorder runs while she is inside the station. There are various voices on the recording, talking about the incident. The tape recorder continues to record until it shuts itself off.

Statement of Deputy Mark Correia:

At approximately 1155, I met with Deputy Correia at the East Valley Sheriff's Station. Correia was sitting with other deputies in his Special Enforcement Unit office. We walked to the lower level juvenile booking area where the interview took place. I interviewed Correia about the incident and he provided his statement. This interview was tape recorded. (Refer to cassette tape for more details). Deputy Correia told me the following in summary:

Deputy Correia told me he and Deputy Cantrell are members of the Thousand Oaks Police Department Special Enforcement Unit (SEU). He and Cantrell were on their way to arrest a suspect in Los Angeles County. They were driving separate vehicles, following each other, southbound SR 23 in the area of Arboles. Deputy Correia overheard radio traffic of a "Code -12" at the Community Room. Dispatch then advised of shots fired at the station. Deputy Correia used the center median to turn around and responded "Code-3" back to the sheriff's station. Deputy Correia exited at Olsen Rd., and turned right. He drove east on Olsen to the main entrance to the station. He made a u-turn and parked his unit, blocking the front entrance of the station to traffic. About 3 other units were already parked at the entrance, blocking the drive. These vehicles consisted of 2 black and white units, and Deputy Roberts' unmarked unit. Correia retrieved his ballistic vest and his AR-15 rifle. He loaded his rifle and Deputy Correia and Deputy Cantrell "teamed up."

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Correia and Cantrell began approaching the scene along the main driveway. Correia saw Sergeant Wareham holding his AR-15 rifle. Wareham was waving Correia and Cantrell over toward the suspect. As they got closer, they saw the suspect lying in a prone position, to the rear of a red vehicle, along the driveway. The suspect was motionless. Wareham was pointing his rifle at the suspect. He was positioned in the employee parking lot area, to the south of the suspect. Correia saw Deputy Ambarian and several other officers pointing their weapons at the suspect from the employee parking lot, to the south - east of the suspect. Correia and Cantrell positioned themselves to the west of the suspect. All three groups approached the suspect evenly. As they approached, Correia saw two handguns lying on the ground, to the right of the suspect. He saw the left hand of the suspect under the suspect's body. The groups arrived at the suspect and a deputy handcuffed the suspect. Correia was concentrating on providing cover for the team and he did not see who actually handcuffed the suspect.

Correia told me after the suspect was secure, he saw Deputy Coulter approach him from the area of the station. Deputy Coulter told Correia that he had engaged the suspect and felt he may have shot him. Coulter told Correia that he had engaged the suspect from the area of the wall, located next to the community room. Correia overheard Sergeant Wareham mention that he also had engaged the suspect. Captain Cozzens arrived shortly thereafter and took control of the scene. Deputy Coulter was directed to check vehicles in the parking lot for any additional witnesses. Correia later went up to his office after the crime scene was secured with tape.

Deputy Correia told me at no time did he hear any shots being fired and he confirmed he had not shot any rounds from his weapon.

On August 5, 2003, I spoke with Ken Cozzens in his office at the East County Sheriff's Station in Thousand Oaks. This interview was fragmented at times and for ease of reading it is written in a chronological order. The following is a synopsis of our tape-recorded conversation.

At about 0935 hours, Senior Deputy Godfrey came into his office and told him that someone was shooting at the building. Cozzens took his weapon and went out the administration door to a walkway in the lobby. Cozzens heard shots being fired. Cozzens did not remember how many shots he heard because he heard shots from outside and shotgun shots from the community room.

Cozzens saw Senior Deputy Logan (Logan) and Deputy Butterfield (Butterfield) in the lobby. Cozzens looked around a corner and saw a red foreign sedan at the end of the parking area. Cozzens noticed the rear hatch was lifted up. Cozzens saw a white male (suspect) at the rear of the car. At times, Cozzens saw the suspect reach into the rear of the vehicle. Cozzens saw the suspect holding a long, older model revolver. Cozzens saw the barrel of the gun and felt it was at least six inches in length. Cozzens said at times the suspect would crouch over and he

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(Cozzens) felt the suspect was reloading. Cozzens felt the suspect reload numerous times because the suspect would fire a shot and then would bend forward and move his hands forward. Cozzens said that when the suspect was crouching, the suspect was near the left rear tire (driver's side, rear tire) and was moving and functioning. Cozzens said the suspect would stand up and more shots would be fired. Cozzens felt the suspect was holding the gun in his right hand. Cozzens said that the suspect raised his weapon on more than one occasion, because that was how he (Cozzens) identified the gun as being a long, revolver type gun.

Cozzens said at one point, the suspect was standing near the right rear tire and was holding the weapon toward the direction of Olsen Road and then raised the weapon. Cozzens said that when he saw the gun, he heard a shot and moved behind cover. Cozzens also stated that when the suspect began to raise the gun back toward them, he knew there would be a shot and he moved behind cover. Cozzens did not see anyone else participating in the shooting with the suspect. Cozzens did not hear the suspect say anything.

At one point during the incident, Cozzens saw a white pick up truck drive behind the suspect and drive toward the rear of the building (Later identified as an employee named [REDACTED]).

During the incident, Cozzens and Logan began to communicate about where the suspect was. Cozzens was told that Deputy Colture (Colture) was in the conference room firing a shotgun. Cozzens began to yell out information. Cozzens was yelling so Colture would hear him and would be able to get a shot off. Cozzens thought he yelled for Colture to take a shot under the car, but he was not sure if Colture actually took the shot. Cozzens would yell out the description of the suspect as being a white male and that the suspect was crouching. Cozzens thought he yelled that the suspect was reloading.

During the incident, Cozzens was unable to move forward because the suspect had a clear shot at them and he did not know what the suspect could see. Cozzens said he heard someone yell

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that deputies were outside and were going to "flank" the suspect and he interpreted that as deputies were going to the employee parking lot.

At some point, the suspect went down and did not get up. Cozzens saw other deputies' approach the suspect and he, Logan, and Butterfield approached. Cozzens, Logan and Butterfield approached from the walkway in front of the cars. When Cozzens approached the suspect, he noticed the suspect had visible wounds to his leg and was loosing color in his face. Cozzens saw numerous rounds on the ground. Cozzens thought Senior Deputy Kingi moved and handcuffed the suspect. At that point, Cozzens noticed there were sufficient personnel at the location and began to coordinate activities.

Cozzens estimated that the incident lasted between five and seven minutes and he observed the actions of the suspect from about three hundred feet. Cozzens had no additional information.

On this same date and after my interview with Sr. Deputy Julie Smith #2973 was completed, I then interviewed Deputy Tom Ebersole #3377, in the report writing room at the East Valley Station. I confirmed with Ebersole that he was present during the shooting, but was a witness only.

I asked Ebersole to begin by telling me in his own words what had transpired earlier in reference to the shooting.

Ebersole told me that he was out on patrol and at Fire Station #31, when he heard the call go out over the radio. Ebersole said he ran to his unit and advised Dispatch that he was enroute and responded "code three" to the East Valley Station.

Ebersole said that as he was approaching the station, he heard over the radio that the suspect was down. When he arrived at the station he pulled in behind several units already parked on Olsen Road. After parking, he went to the trunk of his unit and retrieved his rifle (AR15). Ebersole added that by the time he got out of his unit and got to his rifle, he did not hear any shots being fired.

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Ebersole said that when he approached the station (on foot) he was told to start checking the vehicles in the area for additional suspects.

Ebersole said that he and several other officers began checking the cars parked in the area and did not locate anyone. After checking the cars, he was then asked to secure the perimeter, which he did.

I asked Ebersole if he recalled any of the radio traffic as he was responding to the station. He told me he initiated his "code three" response on his own.

As for additional traffic, Ebersole said he remembered dispatch giving out the information in reference to "shots fired.... Community room.... Station 10..... subject is now at the flag pole... the subject is now at the rear of his vehicle, the subject is reloading, etc. Ebersole added that by the time he got out of his unit and retrieved his rifle, the suspect was down and was being cuffed. I asked Ebersole if he went to the suspect's car to help clear it. He told me he did not.

As my interview with Ebersole was ending, I confirmed with him that he did not see anyone shoot after he arrived at the scene. Ebersole confirmed he did not, and said that by the time he arrived, everything was over.

I concluded my interview with Ebersole.

The above is a synopsis of a tape recorded interview and is not verbatim. At the completion of this report the tape was turned over to Det. Sgt. Melissa Smith the case agent.

**Senior Deputy Robert Fleming**

On August 5, 2003, I met Senior Deputy Fleming at the East County Police Station in reference to this investigation. Senior Deputy Fleming is currently assigned as a detective with East County investigations. At approximately 1150 hours, I conducted an interview with Detective Fleming. The following information is a synopsis of the tape-recorded interview:

Detective Fleming was in the patrol briefing room (downstairs) with other detectives for a monthly investigators meeting. The meeting began at 0900 hours. Detective Fleming heard some information over the intercom system radio. He heard a voice over the radio say, "Shots fired." Someone in the meeting turned up the radio volume and Detective Fleming heard a voice on the radio announce information about a subject behind a red car.

Detectives got up and responded. As Detective Fleming left the briefing room, he heard Sergeant Salas announce over the station intercom that the suspect was in the parking lot near the visitor's lot shooting at the building. Detective Fleming went directly to the locker room and retrieved his ballistic vest. Detective Jeff Miller already had a rifle and gave Detective Fleming his duty handgun. Detective Fleming then went upstairs to the detective office to try and get a "vantage point" of where the suspect was. Detective Fleming then went out the stairway exit to the employee's parking lot to see where the suspect was.

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As Detective Fleming was outside walking down the stairs behind Sergeant Moussa, Detective Fleming saw numerous people outside taking cover behind walls. He heard shots being fired. Detective Fleming was unable to determine who was firing the shots. He saw the area where the suspect was. Captain Frank O'Hanlon requested more "high powered" rifles. Detective Fleming went back into the detective office at the top of the stairs. Inside, Detective Fleming ran downstairs to try and obtain additional shotguns from the shotgun cabinet. There were no shotguns in the cabinet.

Next, Detective Fleming went into the patrol vehicle parking lot to check vehicles for additional shotguns. He grabbed a shotgun from Sergeant Salas and gave it to a uniformed deputy. There were no other shotguns available from the patrol vehicles. Detective Fleming went back inside the station, upstairs into the detective office, and out the detective office exit to the employee parking lot. He went down the stairs with his handgun to the employee parking lot to get a better view. Detective Fleming started to go to his detective vehicle, which was parked in the first aisle, to get his shotgun.

Detective Fleming heard more shots being fired and then heard a voice on the radio announce the suspect had been hit. He kept working his way around the cars and saw that the suspect was being handcuffed. Detective Fleming did not return fire during the incident. He did not see any sworn personnel fire their weapons.

Detective Fleming went to Sergeant Dave Wareham to check his well-being. Sergeant Wareham had his AR-15 rifle, duty handgun, and ballistic vest. Detective Fleming heard Sergeant Wareham say, "I was involved in the shooting." Detective Fleming escorted Sergeant Wareham toward the detective office. Detective Wareham stopped by his detective vehicle to put his ballistic vest and handgun in his vehicle, but kept his AR-15 rifle. Sergeant Wareham told Detective Fleming he had the best vantage point off to the side of the suspect and he saw the suspect firing down range so he "took the shot." Detective Fleming also stated that after the suspect was hit, he glanced over toward Sergeant Wareham's direction and the suspect brought a handgun to his head as he was laying down. Sergeant Wareham told Detective Fleming he was not sure if the suspect shot himself or not. Detective Fleming did not see Sergeant Wareham fire his weapons during the incident.

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Captain Ken Cozzens was present and thought Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey was joking. Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey replied, "no we're taking rounds!"

Commander Chris Godfrey told the office staff to get down then ran into the office to grab his weapon and an extra clip. He did not know the exact location of the shooter, so he went down the main hallway from the administration offices towards the detective bay to avoid the front of the building. He yelled for the staff in the records room to get down behind the bullet-resistant service window and adjacent block wall as he passed that room. He made it through the detectives bay and left the building through the detective bay back door, which faces the employee parking lot.


Commander Chris Godfrey came out of the building and saw Deputy Joe Rivas with two other officers down behind the half-wall between the employee parking lot and the detective bay door. He was unable to recall the identity of the two other officers at the half-wall. Senior Deputy Dan Ambarian arrived at the wall area with what appeared to be an AR-15 rifle.

Commander Chris Godfrey started to move towards the half-wall past the edge of the building. Deputy Rivas shouted for him to stay back behind the building corner because the gunman was firing in their direction. After a few minutes of confusion about the suspect's location, Deputy Rivas said that the suspect was on the other side of the Los Angeles Police car, which was parked in the visitors parking lot first stall. Someone yelled out that they thought the suspect had an AR-15 rifle.

Commander Chris Godfrey looked to his left and he saw Detective Sergeant Dave Wareham and another unknown detective already in the first row of cars of the employee parking lot. Detective Wareham was at his car getting out his flack vest and AR-15 rifle. Commander Chris Godfrey told the detectives to move through the employee parking lot and flank the gunman.

Commander Chris Godfrey saw Detective Pat Dain move up through the employee cars towards the gunman. He saw Detective Dain take a position behind a car and shoot in the direction of the suspect. The suspect continued to fire, so Detective Dain moved behind a huge tree in the parking lot then reloaded the shotgun. Detective Dain was calm and methodical under fire and wanted someone to get him an AR-15 rifle. He did not see any of the suspect's gunfire hit the tree that Detective Dain was behind.

Commander Chris Godfrey heard someone shout, "he's reloading, he's reloading!" Deputy Rivas and the other officers moved closer to Detective Dain's position near the tree after hearing the suspect was reloading. He also moved into the parking lot near the cars during this same time. He thought the advancing officers were shooting at the suspect, but was not sure which individuals actually discharged a weapon. He initially thought that Deputy Rivas had discharged a shotgun in the suspect's direction, but then later in the

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interview thought that Deputy Rivas may have only pointed the gun instead of shooting it. He saw four officers in the lot, two with shotguns and two with AR-15 rifles all fairly close during the gun battle, so he was unclear on exactly who discharged their weapons.

Commander Chris Godfrey heard someone yell, "he's down, he's down!" He and the other officers advanced to the suspect car in a slow, safe manner with weapons still drawn. The officers handcuffed the suspect, then rolled him over. The suspect had ammo bags on his belt that spilled what appeared to be 44-magnum ammunition onto the ground when he was rolled over. Commander Chris Godfrey then saw two large caliber revolvers, which appeared to be 44 magnums, 357 magnums or maybe even a 45 magnum with long barrels on the ground near the suspect. There were hundreds of rounds in the trunk of the car, down on the ground, and on the suspect's belt.

Commander Chris Godfrey directed the officers to continue to check the parking lots and adjacent areas for other suspects and people that may have been hurt. At the same time that the parking lots were being secured, someone called for fire and ambulance crews to respond. He already knew that the fire and ambulance crews had staged near the East County Station because he had seen them arrive during the attack.

Commander Chris Godfrey estimated this gunfight lasted between 10 and 15 minutes. He believed that the suspect had fired "a whole lot" of rounds, but was unable to estimate the total number of shots. He initially recalled the suspect's gunfire was rapid in succession, which would lead someone to believe that it was AR-15 gunfire. He did not actually see the suspect fire a weapon during this incident. He only heard the suspect's gunfire. He never heard the suspect say anything. The suspect's actions of standing behind his car and shooting at everyone from every direction reminded him of the North Hollywood Shootout incident.

Commander Chris Godfrey did not discharge a weapon during this incident.

After the suspect was secured, Detective Wareham told Commander Chris Godfrey that he had gotten two clear shots on the suspect. Detective Wareham believed that the first round that he fired from his AR-15 caused the suspect to go down. He did not see Detective Wareham shoot the suspect. He did see a wound over the suspect's right nipple and a lot of blood on his neck.

Commander Chris Godfrey did not know the identity of each officer at the scene and involved with this incident based on the numerous personnel on scene.

Commander Chris Godfrey did not identify anything at the scene that would have established a motive for the gunman attack. He believed that the suspect was going to shoot and continue to shoot and try to kill

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people until he was killed. The deputies put themselves in harms way to get the job done and he was extremely proud of their actions.

After the interview in Commander Chris Godfrey's office, I stopped the audiotape and went on a walk-thru with him to retrace his actions. The walk-thru conversation was not tape-recorded. During the walk-thru Commander Chris Godfrey retraced his actions ad observations, which were consistent with the taped interview information that he had just provided. After our walk-thru, I took digital photos of the views of the areas that were related to my investigation (refer to attachments C thru L).

I provided Sergeant Melissa Smith, from the Ventura County Sheriff's Major Crimes Bureau, the audiotape of this interview and the CD Rom of the digital photos.

On 08-05-03, at approximately 1140 hrs, I met with Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey in the East County Station Traffic Bureau Sergeant Office to interview him concerning the officer involved shooting incident, which had occurred earlier in the day in the station parking lot. I audiotape recorded our interview and the following is a synopsis of Rick Godfrey's statement (refer to tape for details):

On 08-05-03, around 0930 hrs to 0940 hrs, Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey was teaching an accident reconstruction traffic class in the East County Community Room. The community room is located next to the front entrance of the station. Senior Deputy Dan Ambarian was also an instructor present in the classroom.

Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey heard several noises outside that sounded like gunshots. He went outside onto the patio adjacent to the south side of classroom with Senior Deputy Ambarian to investigate the noises.

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He saw a man walking into the station near the large pillars outside the lobby. Sr. Dep. Ambarian asked the man what was happening. The man's response was that it was something out there in the parking lot. Sr. Dep. Rick Godfrey looked out into the parking lot and saw a red car parked at the front parking lot entranceway near the four-way intersection with the employee parking lot and the road to the heliport. The red car was facing the building entrance with the front-end pointed in a diagonal position across the driveway. There was somebody standing behind the trunk. He heard multiple shots again as the gunman shot at them. The additional rapid fire from the suspect made it sound like an automatic weapon. He remembered seeing smoke coming from the weapon, but did not actually see the firearm. He and Sr. Dep. Ambarian went down to the concrete for their safety. The bullet passed within three feet over the top of their heads.


Six to eight of the traffic class students had come out onto the patio. Some of the students pulled their weapons out and started to pop up and down over the patio wall. He was not sure on the students' names that had drawn their weapons. He saw Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriff Richard Curry and a LAPD Officer taking cover behind the patio exterior half wall and shooting pistols in the direction of the suspect near the red car. He had a clear memory of one of these officers firing one round from a pistol that had a gray anodized finish, but was not sure on the officer's identity.

Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey and Senior Deputy Ambarian were not in possession of a firearm at that time. Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey started to go over the patio wall towards his traffic van that was parked in the front driveway. The community room window over his shoulder exploded behind him. He thought it was the third window panel from the west end. He retreated back towards the classroom and saw Sheriff's Service Technician [REDACTED] on the telephone. He went back into the classroom and told SST [REDACTED] to get down.

Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey ran into the administrative office area that is adjacent to the classroom. He saw Captain Ken Cozzens and Commander Chris Godfrey standing in the administration room and told them they needed help out front, because they were taking shots at the front of the station. He told them to notify dispatch and the personnel in the station that it was "live fire." Sr. Dep. Godfrey then told them, "this is the real thing were being shot at!"

Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey went back out to the classroom patio wall and told the officers to stay down and that he had reported it. He heard shots still being fired at them. He heard shots hitting the building above them and around them. He went back into the administration room and told Captain Cheryl Wade to get the shotguns out of the armory.

Sr. Dep. Godfrey went around the outer hallway of the station and told employees to get down. He arrived at the traffic office and looked through the southwest corner window of that office, where he had a

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"birds eye view" of the shooter. He telephoned dispatch and instructed dispatch to have the main driveway to the East County Station blocked off because there was traffic coming in and out. He then told the dispatcher his observations from the traffic office viewpoint. He saw a very tall man between 6' 02" and 6' 04" wearing what appeared to be a shooting vest. He was unable to tell the types of guns the suspect was using, but he was firing very rapidly. He saw the gunman reloading. He saw Deputy Coulter near the decorative wall on the west side of the station and other officers working their way up through the vehicles in the employee parking lot towards the suspect. At one point the dispatcher requested if he could read the license plate number on the gunman's car. He was unable to read the plate so he retrieved some binoculars from the office, but was still unable to read it from the traffic office.


He abandoned the telephone with dispatch and went through the front lobby. About the time that he got to the patio of the community room and watched with the binoculars, he saw at least four officers around the suspect. He heard the officers yelling for the suspect to "drop the gun", "stop shooting" and "get down."

Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey went back into the community room and telephoned dispatch from that phone. He told [redacted] from dispatch that the gunman was in-custody, handcuffed and secured. He hung up the phone with [redacted] then returned to the traffic office and spoke to the other dispatch then hung up with her.

After the arrest, Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey saw Deputy Coulter on the patio with shotgun. Deputy Coulter had the action opened with no rounds in the ammo saddle and several shotgun casings on the patio floor. He did not see Deputy Coulter shoot a firearm. He was not positive on Deputy Coulter's course of action during the attack.

During the attack, the gunman fired numerous times at the station sometimes in rapid succession for approximately 10 to 20 minutes. The gunman's bullets often hit the building and broke windows in the classroom and in the front lobby. After the gunman was taken into custody, Sr. Dep. Rick Godfrey found bullet damage to his van at chest level. He also saw bullet damage to the top of the community room window. He also observed a lot of high bullet damage to the pillars out in front of the building and to front façade of the building.

Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey further described the gunman's clothing as a white shirt with a shooting vest, like a "shotgun trap vest", and possibly a hat. However, he was not positive because the distance to the gunman was approximately 200 feet away. He saw the suspect remain near the rear of the hatchback during his entire observation of the incident.

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Later after the incident was under control, he saw Senior Deputy Ambarian back in the administration room with an AR-15. He did not know when Senior Deputy Ambarian got the weapon or his involvement with it.

Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey did not discharge any weapons during this incident.

Senior Deputy Rick Godfrey and I concluded our taped conversation then he retrieved the traffic class roster that listed each of the students attending the course in the community room. He provided a copy of the roster, which consisted of two pages (refer to Attachments A and B). He clarified that he initially thought one of the officers that had shot at the gunman was Los Angeles Police Officer Heredia. However, he had been mistaken and now clearly recalled that the two officers that shot at the gunman from the community room patio were Los Angeles Police Officer Maurice Hallaller and Los Angeles County Deputy Richard Curry. He also added that all the students on the list were present with the exception of Deputy Dean Worthy who was absent from class and not involved in this incident.

I provided Sergeant Melissa Smith, from the Ventura County Sheriff's Major Crimes Bureau, the audiotape of this interview.

On August 5, 2003, I drove to the East County Sheriff's Station to assist other investigators with an officer involved shooting investigation. (S) Gregg Hackett had driven into the front parking lot of the East County Station and began shooting at the station and people in the parking lot with two handguns. He was ultimately shot by sheriff's deputies. I interviewed several deputies, including Senior Deputy Guzzard, who were witnesses to the crime. I interviewed Sr. Deputy Guzzard in the dispatch center at the East County Station at about 1700 hours.

Sr. Deputy Guzzard told me he is currently assigned as one of the station managers for the East County Sheriff's Station. He has been a deputy sheriff for about seventeen years, and has been assigned to the East County Station for approximately eight years during this assignment.

Sr. Deputy Guzzard arrived for work on August 5<sup>th</sup> at about 0530 hours. He was dressed in a patrol uniform and was armed with his department issued handgun. When he arrived at the station, Guzzard began performing his normal duties as a station manager. He told me nothing unusual happened until about 0935 hours. While he was sitting at his desk in the station manager's office, Guzzard heard three loud bangs. At first he thought the noise was being cause by the wheels of a cart being pushed across the ceramic floor in the station lobby or someone hammering.

Sr. Deputy Guzzard looked up into a camera in his office that pans the front lobby of the station. He did not see anyone in the lobby. Being curious, Guzzard got up from his desk and walked into the

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records office, which is in the room next to the station manager's office, to try and identify the source of the noise he heard. At that point he heard a couple more "bangs". As he looked into the lobby through the glass windows, he saw deputies pouring out of the community room. There was a traffic accident investigation class being conducted in the community room. Guzzard said the deputies were diving towards the floor.

Sr. Deputy Guzzard started to head toward the door to the front lobby and noticed that one of the glass panes in the front of the station was shattered or "spidered". At this point Guzzard realized gunshots were being fired into the building and he yelled for everyone in the records office to get on the floor. He said Sergeant P. Salas (ID# 2420) and Sr. Deputy L. Logan (ID# 0733) arrived at his location.

They opened the front door to the lobby and looked out the door to see if they could see where the shots were coming from. While they were looking out the front door, they heard more gunshots. Guzzard said he could see bursts of powder flashing off the wall and sparks flying as the wall was being stuck by bullets. He realized that the station was definitely under fire.


At about this time, Captain K Cozzens (ID# 0765) and Deputy W. Butterfield (ID# 2103) arrived at their location. Someone instructed Butterfield, who had a radio with him, to broadcast a "999 at the station, shots fired." Butterfield then broadcast this information to notify dispatch and other officers about the shooting.

Guzzard said he was not wearing body armor, so he ran downstairs to his locker to get his body armor. After retrieving his body armor, Guzzard returned upstairs and went out into the lobby with other deputies when they heard a lull in the gunfire. After clearing the lobby for suspects, Guzzard and the other deputies he was with exited the front door of the building. Guzzard said the group of deputies began approaching a red car that was parked in the front parking lot of the station.

As they approached the car, Guzzard said he was looking for the suspect, but he did not see anyone. He said the shooting had stopped. The last time he heard any gunshots was just before he entered the front lobby. Guzzard said other deputies were converging on the suspect's vehicle as he moved through the parking lot toward the car.

As he got close to the suspect's vehicle, he saw the suspect lying on the ground. The suspect was on the ground near the rear quarter panel on the driver's side of the vehicle. Deputies, who had been advancing on the location from the employee parking lot, arrived at the suspect's location before Guzzard and his group. He saw deputies leaning over the suspect and ordering him to put his hands behind his back. Eventually, one of the deputies handcuffed the suspect. Guzzard told me he never saw the suspect move or heard him say anything.

After the suspect was handcuffed, deputies rolled him over and checked his pulse and called for medical assistance. Guzzard told me fire department and ambulance personnel were already "standing by out front". After the suspect had been subdued someone called for the fire department

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
and ambulance to move to the suspect's location and treat his injuries. He said medical personnel arrived quickly and began treating the suspect.

Guzzard said as he surveyed the area around the suspect, he saw spent shell casings and unused ammunition all over the ground near the suspect along with two handguns. Guzzard said one of the handguns was a revolver with "a really long barrel...kind of a blued color." Guzzard was not sure what the second handgun looked like because his attention was focused on the gun he described to me. Guzzard said this revolver was on the ground near the suspect's feet.

After the incident was over and the suspect was receiving medical treatment, deputies began organizing the crime scene. Guzzard said he returned to his office to begin dealing with the aftermath of the shooting.

Guzzard told me that during this incident he heard what he thought was ten to fifteen gunshots. He said he did not see any deputies firing a gun at the suspect. Guzzard told me he had his handgun drawn, but he did not fire it. Guzzard felt this incident lasted about somewhere between five and ten minutes.

My interview with Sr. Deputy Guzzard was recorded on a cassette tape. The tape was turned into Sergeant M. Smith and will be retained with the case file.



On August 5, 2003, at approximately 1500 hours, I interviewed Sr. Deputy Dan Hawes #2261 of the Ventura County Sheriff's Department, East County Special Enforcement Unit. This interview was to document what part Sr. Dep. Hawes took in this incident. The following is a synopsis of my tape-recorded interview with Sr. Dep. Hawes. Refer to the cassette tape for details.

Sr. Dep. Hawes was in his office along with Dep. Axelrod #3114 and Administrative Assistant [REDACTED]. At approximately 0930 hours, they heard a broadcast via the Sheriff's Department Radio of, "999, shots being fired in front of the building." Sr. Dep. Hawes and Dep. Axelrod started to run out of the station to their unmarked units. As they ran, they heard there was a person at the flagpole firing into the building. Sr. Dep. Hawes and Dep. Axelrod got to their unmarked units and retrieved their bulletproof vests, gun belts, and their issued AR-15 rifles. Their unmarked units were parked on the basketball court east of the station. Sr. Dep. Hawes and Dep. Axelrod then ran to the southeast corner of the station, which is adjacent to the gym. Sr. Dep. Hawes could not see the flagpole area from this position. Sr.

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Dep. Hawes said Dep. Axelrod moved up to another wall near the first row of employee parking to be with some other deputies. This is the last place where he saw Dep. Axelrod. Sr. Dep. Hawes wanted to take advantage of having a rifle, so he moved to higher ground.

Sr. Dep. Hawes ran back into the station and met with Sgt. Tusi #1361(Sgt. Tusi also had his issued AR-15), as he ran up the stairs to the main floor of the station. Sr. Dep. Hawes and Sgt. Tusi got onto the roof via a maintenance stairwell. Once on the roof, they proceeded to the east side of the building. At this time, Sr. Dep. Hawes heard several more shots being fired. They got to the south edge of the roof just above and to the east of the flagpole. Sr. Dep. Hawes said he could hear people say the subject was by the red car. Sr. Dep. Hawes and Sgt. Tusi could not see a red car, so they walked west towards the center of the roof. Eventually, Sr. Dep. Hawes saw the red car located at the far end of the visitor parking area. Sr. Dep. Hawes and Sgt. Tusi could still hear shots being fired into the building. They did not continue to walk further west, because they would be in the suspect's field of fire. Sr. Dep. Hawes could see several rounds that had penetrated the facade of the roof in his immediate area.

Once they heard the suspect was down, Sr. Dep. Hawes and Sgt. Tusi walked further west on the roof. From this vantage point, Sr. Dep. Hawes could see other Sheriff Personnel approach the suspect and contain the area. He did not see who fired any shots at the suspect, due to trees blocking his view. He also never saw the suspect shoot his weapon. Neither, Sr. Dep. Hawes or Sgt. Tusi ever shot at the suspect. Sr. Dep. Hawes said the entire incident lasted approximately five to seven minutes. Sr. Dep. Hawes and Sgt. Tusi stayed on the roof of the station as security until members of the Sheriff's S.W.A.T. team relieved them. Once the Sheriff's S.W.A.T. team did their protective sweep of the station, Sr. Dep. Hawes and Dep. Roberts #2948 were placed back on the roof as security for the crime scene. At approximately 1230 hours, Sr. Dep. Hawes and Dep. Roberts left the roof to assist Major Crimes Detectives at an (unknown) address on Adrian Street, in the City of Thousand Oaks.

On 08-05-2003, I was working as a detective in the City of Camarillo. I was assigned to assist Major Crimes Detectives with an officer involved shooting that occurred at the East Valley Sheriff's Station.

Upon arrival, I was assigned to interview Deputies' Stubblefield, Jeff Smith, Erich Heinzelmann and Sergeant Moussa.

I interviewed Erich Heinzelmann. I tape recorded all of my interviews. Heinzelmann told me he was working in his traffic assignment on patrol when he heard dispatch advise a code-12 at the community room. Heinzelmann then heard dispatch advise shots fired at Station 10.

Heinzelmann stopped his motorcycle at the intersection of Olsen Road and the entrance to the station. Heinzelmann and other deputies climbed the hill south of the station and when they reached the top, Heinzelmann told me he saw the suspect already down on the ground. Heinzelmann stated that numerous deputies were approaching the suspect. Heinzelmann stated that he began searching and clearing the employee parking lot for additional suspects.

Heinzelmann had no additional details.

On August 5, 2003, 1250 hrs, I interviewed Detective Jody Keller at the East Valley Station. Jody was present at the time of the officer involved shooting. Jody told me the following.

Jody stated she was in a Detective's meeting in the downstairs briefing room at the East Valley Station. At about 0930 hrs, an announcement came over the P.A. system that shots had been fired near a red car in the parking lot. Jody stated she ran out the back door of the station to her unit to get her vest and weapon and took up a position near a dumpster. Jody stated she could hear shots being fired. Jody said she was asked by Sergeant Lee to get her shotgun. Jody stated she got her shotgun out of her unit and gave it to Sergeant Lee who disappeared through the back door of the station. Jody said she was joined by Detective Christensen and Schultz and together they maintained a position near the dumpster at the Northeast side of the station observing other deputies advancing North through the employee parking lot. Jody stated when she heard the suspect was down, Detective Christensen, Schultz and her moved North into the employee parking lot for better observation. Jody stated during the time of the incident, she did not see anyone shooting nor did she fire any rounds from her weapon. Jody stated she heard a lot of rounds being fired and stated the incident lasted about 10 minutes.

On 8/5/2003, at about 1030 hours, I responded to the Ventura County Sheriff's East Valley Police Station to assist in the investigation of an Officer involved shooting.

On arrival, Sergeant Melissa Smith directed me to interview Senior Deputy Takeo Kingi (#3060). I located Kingi in his office, located in the Crime Analysis unit.

The following is a summary of his statement. I tape-recorded the interview. Refer to the audiotape for details.

Kingi told me on 8/5/2003, at about 0930 hours, he was working at his desk when he heard one gun shot. He heard dispatch advise the incident over the radio. He ran "out front" and heard an unknown voice say, "He's shooting from the lobby." He ran to the locker room to put on his Sam Browne, vest, and weapon.

He went from the locker room, through the weight room, to the ramp leading to the employee parking lot, located on the southeast corner of the building. As he got outside, he heard two gunshots. He saw an expended rifle round at the base of the ramp that he believed to be from an AR-15 round. He saw and started up the ramp behind "Hal" (Sullivan) and followed by "Fleming".

Captain O'Hanlon- standing at the top of the ramp at the end of the wall leading to the employee parking area.

Commander Godfrey- standing by the stairs located at the top of the ramp out side the door leading to the Investigations Unit.

Senior Deputy Pat Dain- standing behind a tree on the west side of the parking lot in the employee parking lot. Dain was firing a shotgun in the direction of the suspect.

Deputy Joe Rivas- crouching in the same area as Dain.

Kingi advanced into the parking lot and took cover behind a green Dodge truck, California license [REDACTED]. Captain O'Hanlon ordered Kingi to get a team together to advance on the suspect. He and Senior Deputy Dennis Sliva moved southeast through the parking lot and took cover behind a Sheriff's Department trailer, California exempt license [REDACTED]

From behind the trailer, Kingi saw the suspect's right side as he laid face down on the ground near the left rear side of the car. He saw a revolver on the ground near the rear of the car. There was broken glass on the ground that appeared to be from the suspect's vehicle windows. He did not see any expended ammunition casings on the ground near the suspect. He described the car as a red 2-door hatchback. He and Sliva advanced toward the suspect. At the same time, he saw other personnel advancing. He heard Sergeant Dave Wareham say, " Only one person talk." Then Wareham said, "One person go up and cuff him. Kingi, go cuff him."

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Kingi approached the suspect. He noticed the suspect's left hand was underneath him and his right hand was empty. Kingi pulled the suspect's left hand out from under his body and, with the assistance of another unidentified person, handcuffed the suspect. There was nothing in the suspect's left hand.

He said within seconds of handcuffing the suspect, the Fire department was on scene to render medical aid to the suspect and any other injured parties.

After handcuffing the suspect, Kingi realized he had a small abrasion on his finger and immediately went to the ambulance that was on scene and treated for his injury.

Kingi had walked me through his actions. At the base of the ramp, I saw 2 empty ammunition casings at the same place Kingi recalled seeing one casing.

At 1206 hours, I walked past the crime scene tape in the employee parking lot and obtained the license plate numbers from the vehicles Kingi used as cover. I saw several expended shotgun shells lying on the ground next to the tree that Kingi said Dain had used to take cover.

**Interview of Deputy Jeremy Lantz #3474**

On 08/05/03, at approximately 1135 hours, I conducted a tape-recorded interview of Deputy J. Lantz, regarding his involvement in and observations of this incident. Below is synopsis of this interview. For further details, refer to the audiotape.

Dep. Lantz was working uniformed patrol in the East County area, as the 4FR unit. He was traveling westbound on the 118 freeway when he heard a 999 (officer needs assistance) broadcast. Sheriff's dispatch (SCC) said there were shots fired at the East Valley Community Room. SCC advised that a subject was in the parking lot, shooting at the East Valley Sheriff's Station.

Dep. Lantz responded code 3 to the scene. When he arrived, he heard someone broadcast a request to block the entrance/exit driveways to the station. Dep. Lantz said that Deputy Spiker's #3405 unit was blocking a portion of the entrance driveway. Dep. Lantz parked his unit so that it was blocking part of the entrance driveway and part of the exit driveway. Deputy Coons #2874 parked her unit behind Dep. Lantz's unit, so that it blocked the exit driveway.

Dep. Lantz exited his unit, with a shotgun. Dep. Spiker said he did not have any additional information. Dep. Lantz said that as he exited his unit, he heard "two" "pops." He did not know where these sounds were coming from, as there was an echo.

Dep. Lantz knew, from the sounds he heard, that the incident was still in progress. Dep. Lantz said detective units started arriving on scene, on Olsen Rd.

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Dep. Lantz had been behind his unit and began to move around it. Dep. Lantz thought Deputies Spiker, and Coons proceeded up the driveway with him. They went up the hill that separates the entrance driveway from the south side of the employee parking lot. Once there, Dep. Lantz saw Sergeant Wareham #2108. Sgt. Wareham was motioning for them to approach. Dep. Lantz yelled back at the detectives that Sgt. Wareham was motioning them to approach and they needed to do so. Detectives were obtaining and readying their weapons.

During further questioning, Dep. Lantz said he saw and heard Sgt. Wareham from his position behind his unit. When Sgt. Wareham motioned for them to approach, Dep. Lantz told the others what Sgt. Wareham was motioning for them to do. This is when Dep. Lantz and the others started up the driveway.


Dep. Lantz said they proceeded up the hillside, which separates the entrance driveway from the employee parking lot. They walked up through an area that had no foliage on it, as it appeared to have been used as a walkway for some time.

Dep. Lantz said that as he entered the southeast side of the employee parking lot, he saw Sgt. Wareham near a tree, which was located near the suspect's parked vehicle. In this area, there were two trees located in the area between the visitor's parking lot and the employee's parking lot. Dep. Lantz saw Sgt. Wareham next to the larger of these two trees. (NOTE: Sgt. Wareham was west of Dep. Lantz's position.)

Sgt. Wareham was looking back towards Dep. Lantz, motioning for him to approach. When Dep. Lantz entered the employees' parking lot, Sgt. Wareham turned his attention to the suspect's vehicle. Dep. Lantz saw that Sgt. Wareham appeared to have a weapon in his hand, but could not tell what it was due to the distance between them.

Dep. Lantz said he did not see anyone else in the immediate area, with the exception of Sgt. Wareham and the suspect's vehicle. Dep. Lantz moved westbound through the southernmost parking area of the lot. As he did this, he used vehicles parked on the north side of this parking area as cover.

While moving in a westerly direction, Dep. Lantz met up with Deputies Stubblefield #3230 and D. Sliva #2904. This occurred in the area between the fifth and sixth parking stalls, when counting from east to west.

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There was a white camper style trailer parked in the fifth stall and a black and white Explorer's van parked in the sixth stall. Located on the ground near the rear passenger side of the van were five .223 rounds. Three rounds were spent, leaving just the shell casings, and two were live rounds.

Dep. Lantz said he looked to the south and saw Dep. Coons moving westbound along the vehicles parked on the south side of this parking area.

Dep. Lantz said he could now see the suspect, who was lying facedown on the ground. Dep. Lantz said the suspect was in the same area where he was at the time of this interview. Sgt. Wareham was still behind the tree, using it as cover.

Dep. Lantz continued westbound through the parking lot. As he did so, he saw more personnel responding to the area. Dep. Lantz said Sheriff's personnel ran in front of him. They proceeded to run in a southerly direction and up an embankment, which separates the entrance driveway for the employee parking lot and the main entrance/exit driveway for the station. These people then approached the scene from the south. Dep. Lantz said there was a group of subjects who did this, but he only remembered Senior Deputy Kingi #3016 in this group.


Dep. Lantz said personnel were shouting to watch for crossfire and where their weapons were pointed. Dep. Lantz thought Sgt. Wareham shouted that the suspect was down.

When Dep. Lantz reached the west entryway to the parking area, he saw Sgt. Wareham move out from behind the tree he was using as cover. Someone shouted for only one person to give commands.

Dep. Lantz said personnel approached the suspect, handcuffed him, and rolled him onto his back. Sheriff's personnel then started to check the suspect for breathing and a pulse. Dep. Lantz thought an ambulance was requested.

Dep. Lantz said he approached the area where the suspect was located. Someone said they needed to clear the parking lot. Dep. Lantz thought Captain Cozzens #0765 was the person who made this statement.

Dep. Lantz then started to clear the vehicles located on the east side of the visitor's parking lot. As he moved north, passed the second vehicle, he saw two subjects in the area of a BMW that was parked on the west side of the visitor's parking lot. One of the subjects was a male, who shouted that he was okay.
