## Narrative:

Source of Activity: On December 16, 2015 at approximately 11:55 a.m., I received a telephone call from Detective Sergeant Dean Worthy of the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Major Crimes Bureau. Worthy told me there had been an Officer Involved Shooting that just occurred at the comer of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive in the city of Camarillo. Worthy asked if I would respond to the scene. I respond to the scene from the Ventura County Government Center in the city of Ventura. Upon my arrival at the scene, I was briefed by Worthy on the progress of the investigation to that point. I was directed to control and document the crime scene.

Deputy MichaelZabrasky (8BY) was assigned as the Incident Command System.Scribe. Patrol Sergeant Gus was the Patrol Incident Supervisor. I was briefed by $\quad$ on the progress of the investigation to that point. The crime scene was cordoned off by yellow and red crime scene tape. pointed over to the number one and two northbound traffic lanes of Carmen Drive. From the center median, I could see numerous items (evidence) in both traffic lanes. $\square$ pointed towards the intersection, south, (Carmen Drive and Daily Drive) and stated the marked black and white, Chevy Tahoe, was driven by Deputy Leon Mah's (Deputy who was involved in the O.I.S.). There was a marked Ventura County Fire Engine facing south in the northbound traffic lanes of Carmen Drive. The northbound traffic lane was closed to all vehicular traffic and personnel.

Field Evidence Technicians, Ih Ir were notified and responded to the scene. I was assigned to assist them $\square$ Ine scene photographing and evidence coilection. Senior Deputy John Popp was assigned to complete a factual diagram of the scene. Senior Deputy Darren was assigned to photograph the scene with the UAV.

## Scene Description:

This Officer Involved Shooting took place on Carmen Drive in the City of Camarillo, County of Ventura, Upon my arrival at the scene, the weather was clear and dry. As one is looking north from the intersection of Daily Drive onto Carmen Drive, it was a clear, unobstructed view. As one travels northbound on Carmen Drive, north of the intersection of Daily Drive (where the Officer Involved Shooting occurred), there are two marked traffic lanes. The traffic lanes are delineated by raised white botts dots. The roadway was well maintained and free of any debris except that was generated by the Officer Involved Shooting. The exterior lanes on the east side of Carmen Drive was bordered by Portland Concrete raised curb. East of the sidewalk was a raised block wall. There was a raised center median that separated the north and southbound traffic lanes.

There was a marked black and white police vehicle, Chevy Tahoe unit number 104015, California license 1454738. This vehicle was facing north, parked in the number two traffic lane of Carmen Drive just north of the intersection of Daily Drive. The overhead light bar was in the on position (activated), with lights in the push-bar and the rear.

There was a marked yellow fire truck, unit number 54, California license 1255813. This vehicle was facing south, parked in the number two northbound traffic lane of Carmen Drive.

Within the crime scene tape, south of the Chevy Tahoe (police vehicle) was a blue Ford Fusion

Narrative:
On $12 / 16 / 2015$, at approximately 1250 hours, I was called out to a shooting scene in the City of Camarillo, at the intersection of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive, to diagram the scene. I arrived on the scene at approximately 1305 hours. Upon arrival, I contacted Detective Sgt. Therrien of the Major Crimes Unit on scene and was briefed. The scene consisted of the roadway of Carmen Drive, from the Daily Drive intersection north. It involved the northbound lanes, east sidewalk, blockwall along the east sidewalk, medians, southbound lanes, and the driveway at 305 Carmen Drive (USA Gas Mini-Mart).
Scene included: evidence located by the B.I. Techs, three vehicles, one parked at the east curb of Carmen Drive, just north of the Daily Drive intersection (Police Unit). One parked northeast across the north crosswalk of Daily Drive (Blue Ford Fusion), and one parked southbound in the northbound lanes of Carmen Drive straddling the \#1 and \#2 lane, north of Daily Drive (VCFD Fire Truck \#54):

## Purpose of Report: Clarification of Deputy Mah's Patrol Call Sign

On December 16, 2015, I was assigned as a detective with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Bureau. At approximately 1158 hours, I responded to the intersection of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive in the City of Camarillo to assist in a officer involved shooting investigation. While on scene, I learned that $\square$ had brandished and assaulted Deputy Mah with a large knife. As a result of 's actions, Deputy Mah shot $\quad$ resulting in his death.

During the follow-up portion of this investigation, I was reviewing a report authored by Deputy Zabarsky (\#4261). Deputy Zabarsky made mention of the radio transmissions he heard while enroute to the disturbance. Deputy Zabarsky indicated the radio transmission referred to Deputy Mah's call sign as 8B11.

I reviewed the Camarillo Police Station's schedule of deputies working on December 16, 2015. Deputy Mah was listed as working the 8A11 area and Deputy Cashmark was listed as working the 8B11 area. Therefore, Deputy Mah would be utilizing call sign 8 A 11 and Deputy Cashmark would be utilizing 8 B 11 as her call sign.

I reviewed a disc supplied by Ventura County Sheriff's Dispatch of the radio transmissions that took place during the incident. As the incident unfolded, a voice I recognized as Deputy Mah transmitted over his radio to Sheriff's Dispatch, "Station one, 8B11, with the subject, he has a knife." From this point forward, Sheriff's dispatch refers to Deputy Mah's call sign as 8B11.

Due to Deputy Mah and Sheriff's Dispatch referring to him as 8B11 during the incident, the calls for service summary and official dispatch log will list Deputy Mah's radio transmissions and subsequent actions as 8B11. The two previous mentioned logs will differ from the Camarillo Police Station's schedule for Wednesday, December 16, 2015.

## 911 AUDIO WITH SUSPECT'S SUICIDAL STATEMENTS

## BACKGROUND

On December 16, 2015, I was assigned as a detective in the Ventura County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Bureau and assisted with an officer involved shooting investigation which occurred earlier in the It the intersection of Carmen Drive at Daily Drive in the city of Camarillo. I later learned the suspect had assaulted the officer by brandished a knife and the officer shot him. The suspect died as a result of his injuries. The suspect was identified as

During the investigation, I learned had used a landline telephone from $7 / 11$ to call 911. told the dispatcher he wanted an officer to kill him. I sent a request for the audio reproduction to the Ventura County Sheriff's Dispatch. Dispatch Supervisor $\quad$ n $\quad$ r sent a copy of the 911 audio call.

I found the audio recording was about four minutes and fifty nine seconds in length.

## 'S STATEMENTS DURING THE 911 CALL

I listened to the audio containing the 911 call and found the following in summary: On December 16, 2015, at about 1152 hours, a male, later identified as called 911 from a landline telephone with the number 805-484-9536. The telephone was registered to the 7/11 store at 255 Carmen Drive in the city of Camarillo.

During the call stated there was going to be a crime at the $7 / 11$ in Camarillo. stated someone was going to rob it. stated he was going to rob it. said, "I need cops over here to kill me." said, "I need to die."

The dispatcher asked why. told him to just send the cops over here. said, "So I can kill myself."

## Notification and Response





## Narrative:

On 12/16/2015, at approximately 1150 hours, I was working as a uniformed School Resource Officer (SRO) as 8 BY in the city of Camarillo. At approximately 1154 hours, I heard Sheriff's Dispatch send two (2) patrol units to 7-11 located at 255 Carmen Drive reference a male-subject at the location. Sheriffs Dispatch advised the subject (later identified as Sted he wanted "cops to come over so he can kill himself."

## SOURCE OF ACTIVITY

Deputy Christopher Loes \#2941 (3C11) and Senior Deputy Virginia Tinoco \#2817 (3C12) were initially sent "Code 3" (Emergency lights and siren) to the call. Deputy Joseph Preciado \#2899 (8ZH) was in the area and also responded to the location. Deputies Leon Mah \#4478 (8A11) and Selena Cashmark \#4647 (8B11) also told Sheriff's Dispatch they would be responding to the call as well.

## NOTE: All times stated in this reports are approximates.

The radio traffic was unique enough to prompt me to take notice and start to drive toward the location to possibly assist if needed. While enroute to the area, Sheriff's Dispatch updated the call several times as follows: Yelling heard in the background; Subject saying please kill me; additional subject (possibly the deputy) saying put the knife down; 8 B 11 (later determined to be Deputy Mah as 8 A 11 ) saying put the knife down; 8811 (Deputy Mah) stating the subject has a knife / one at gunpoint; and 8811 (Deputy Mah) stating shots were fired.

I responded "Code 3" from the area of Las Posas Road and Temple Avenue to assist. At approximately 1158 hours, I arrived on scene and parked my patrol car in the east driveway of the Carmen Shopping Center near Sergeant Gustavo \#2561 (3S12) Supervisor's vehicle. His vehicle was stopped in the \#1 southbound lane of Carmen Drive between Daily Drive and Paseo Camarillo. was laying facedown in the \#2 lane of northbound Carmen Drive approximately forty (40) yards away from us on the opposite side of the street.

Upon my arrival, Sergeant
assigned me as "Scribe" and I began to document significant information related to this incident.

Ventura County Fire Engine (VCF) 54 had stopped facing southbound in the \#2 northbound lane of Carmen Drive and approximately twenty (20) yards south of $\quad$. At approximately 1203 hours, American Medical Response (AMR) 492 arrived on scene and stopped in the \#2 northbound lane of Carmen Drive approximately twenty (20) yards north of $\square$. VCF and AMR personnel began to medically evaluate and started life saving measures.

Initially, I tried to use a digital camera from a patrol unit but it was not working properly. Instead, I used my department issued Apple iPhone to take eleven (11) digital photographs of the scene while medical personnel were attending to

While I was taking digital photographs of the scene, toward the fire engine. While walking, I saw the back right tire of the fire engine (Evidence Marker\#i2). kick a metal shell casing located near casing rolling on the asphalt and I saw the object had moved approximately one ( 1 ') foot to the southeast of the original resting place. The digital image of the shell casing was taken after it had been kicked by

After taking digital photographs, I remained at Sergeant vehicle as "Scribe" for the remainder of this incident.

Narrative:
On 12-16-2015, I was assigned to the City of Camarillo as 8 ZH . This is a homeless intervention position for the City of Camarillo in an unmarked unit. At about 1150 hours, I heard the city units receive a call of a suicidal subject at the 711 Gas Station on Daily Drive and Carmen Drive, in Camarillo. As 1 responded to the 711 Gas Station, the first patrol unit arrived on scene and contacted the subject. I then heard deputy say over the radio, "The subject had a knife."

At that point, I responded Code-3. As I was half way to the scene, I then heard deputy say, "Shots fired," Once I arrived on scene, at about 2 to 3 minutes after the call was dispatched, 1 could see Deputy Mah and Deputy Loes standing in the number 2 lane of Carmen Drive with their duty issued weapons unholstered and pointing towards the ground in a low ready position. I could also see an unknown subject laying face down in the number 2 lane not moving.

I stopped my vehicle in the middle of the Carmen Drive to block both lanes of traffic. I then stopped all traffic northbound on Carmen Drive from Daily Drive. As unknown witnesses yelled to me that they had witnessed the entire incident, I asked them to sit on the nearby curb or standby until sufficient units were on scene to gather their statements.

Once more units were on scene, I was asked by Sergeant Sharp to set and inner perimeter and provide security until Major Crimes Detectives arrived. I took no statements, only gathered information for Sergeant Dean Worthy.

## NOTIFICATION AND RESPONSE

On December $16^{\text {th }}, 2015$, I was assigned as an investigator with the Sheriff's Major Crimes Bureau. At approximately 1155 hours, Detective Cadman and I were driving southbound on A Road, when we heard via the radio (Sheriff's Communication Center), patrol units being dispatched to a call of a suspicious subject at the "7-Eleven" on Carmen Drive (Camarillo), who stated he wanted to die and wanted the cops to come over so he can kill himself. Approximately a minute later, I heard someone announce over the radio that the subject had a knife. A few seconds later I heard "shots fired."

Cadman and / then responded to the area of Carmen Drive and Dailey Drive. When we arrived at the scene, Cadman parked his vehicle on the northeast corner of the intersection (Carmen Drive and Daily Drive), and blocked westbound traffic from Daily Drive.

## Observations:

When I got out of the vehicle, I noticed a blue colored sedan, parked facing northeast in the intersection of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive, blocking northbound traffic from Carmen Drive. Near the blue colored sedan, I saw Deputy Preciado directing traffic.

I saw a marked patrol unit (Chevrolet Tahoe /SUV) parked facing northbound on the east curb of Carmen Drive, just a few feet north from Daily Drive (later determined to be Deputy Leon Mah's assigned patrol unit). Several feet north from Daily Drive, I saw a male subject lying face down on the roadway (northbound Carmen Drive), with his hands handcuffed behind his back (later determined to be S- $\square$ ead was directed toward the west and his feet were next the east curb of Carmen Drive. I noticed blood emitting from torso. was not moving and appeared to be deceased. I noticed that Deputy Loes was knelt

I saw that Deputy Mah was standing on the roadway (northbound Carmen Drive) a few feet west of

At approximately 11:55 a.m., Detective Dan Ambarian and I learned of an officer-involved shooting that had just occurred in the City of Camarillo. Soon thereafter, we were tasked with responding to the Los Robles Hospital Emergency Room to ascertain the suspect's condition and get a statement if possible. We also coordinated the response of the personnel from the Sheriff's Crime Lab and Medical Examiner's Office to the hospital.

## Actions:

Upon arriving at the Emergency Room, we met with Deputy Chris Loes, who told us he had been the second officer on-scene and later rode in the amb s a security escort to the suspect. Loes advised us that the suspect, who was later identified as
12:28 p.m. by primary nurse was had been declared deceased at ever regained consciousness while at the scene, during transport, or at the hospital. Deputy Loes told us that medical staff had located an expended bullet (slug) on the (lower left) exterior surface of
 abdomen. Medical staff had placed the slug in a plastic container, which was later released to Sheriff's personnel.

A short while later, Senior Deputy Medical Examiner Michael T and Sheriff's Field Evidence Technician (FET) arrived. $z$ did a visual examination of the deceased's injuries, while took photos for evidentiary purposes. FET also collected the recovered slug and $\quad$ remaining clothing. Prior to transport to the Medical Examiner's Office, $\square$ body was placed in a blue body bag and secured with seal \#26844. I was assigned to attend the autopsy, to be held the following day.

While traveling southbound toward Daily Drive, we heard via my vehicles radio (Sheriff's Dispatch), patrol units being dispatched to a suspicious subject call at the "7-Eleven" on Carmen Drive ( 255 Carmen Drive). Sheriffs Dispatch advised the subject stated he wanted to die and wanted the cops to come over so he could kill himself. Shortly after the call for service I heard a patrol unit advise they were on scene. I then began to travel westbound on Daily Drive toward the area of "7-Eleven." Within a short time, I heard a patrol deputy announce over the radio that the subject had a knife and then shortly after, I heard the deputy say over the radio, "shots fired!" I then responded to the scene code three (lights and sirens).

As Detective Ramirez and I arrived at the intersection of Daily Drive at Carmen Drive. I parked my vehicle on the northeast corner of the intersection (northbound Carmen Drive at westbound Daily Drive). I used my vehicle to prevent traffic on westbound Daily Drive from turning right (northbound) onto Carmen Drive and into the scene.

## Observations:

When I got out of my vehicle, I saw a blue colored sedan (additional unmarked patrol vehicle) parked facing northeast on Carmen Drive just north of the intersection, blocking the northbound lanes of travel. Near the blue colored sedan, Deputy Preciado was directing traffic around the scene.

I saw a marked patrol unit (Chevrolet Tahoe) parked along the east curb line of Carmen Drive, just north of Daily Drive, facing northbound (later determined to be Deputy Mah's assigned patrol vehicle). ## Ventura County Sheriff Deputy Leon Mah Camarillo Police Station

## 12-16-2015

On 12-16-2015 at approximately 1150 hours, I responded to an officer involved shooting incident with other Major Crimes Detectives to the area of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive in the City of Camarillo. I arrived on scene and parked my vehicle outside of the areas cordoned off by yellow crime scene tape. I walked north on the center median of Carmen Drive towards the temporary incident command center (ICS) set up by Ventura County Sheriff's Sergeant Gustavo In route to the ICS, I walked past a Ventura County Sheriff's marked sport utility vehicle parked on the curb of Carmen Drive facing north just north of Daily Drive. I also walked past the crime scene pointed out to me by Ventura County Sheriff's Detective Albert Ramirez. I saw a Ventura County Fire truck parked within the crime scene in the number two northbound lane of Carmen Drive facing south. I saw several spent bullet casings on the street next to the fire truck. I saw lifesaving gear on the street in front of the fire truck as well. I learned the victim had been transported to the hospital and the officer involved was Ventura County Sheriff's Deputy Leon Mah. I learned Ventura County Sheriff's Sergeant Eric Tennessen transported Dep. Mah to the Camarilio Police station. I joined the other Major Crimes detectives in the briefing conducted by Sgt. $\square$ regarding the incident. After the briefing, Ventura County Sheriff's Detective Mike Marco and I were assigned to handle the evidence gathering and follow-up investigation with Dep. Mah.

1 arrived at the police station and found Dep. Mah and Sgt. Tennessen in the Administrative briefing room sitting alone. I introduced myself to Dep. Mah and asked him how he was feeling. With the exception of his injured hand, Dep. Mah stated he was feeling fine, I noticed Dep. Mah was bleeding from the knuckies of his right hand. I told Dep. Mah that it was ok for him to call his family and his wife. Dep. Mah told me he understood and had already placed a call to his wife. I explained to Dep. Mah that I and Det. Marco were the investigators and for him not to discuss details of the incident with anyone until he meets with his attorney who was in route. Sg . Tennessen requested medical personnel respond to the station to provide medical care for Dep. Mah's injuries. I instructed Sgt. Tennessen to take photos of Dep. Mah's injuries with his department issued cell phone. After Dep.

Mah was evaluated by medical personnel and his hand was bandaged, we waited for Sheriff's Bureau of Investigations to arrive in order to take complete quality photos of Dep. Mah's injuries, condition of his uniform, and overall photos of him in duty uniform. At this point, members of the Ventura County Sheriff's Peer Support group Captain James Fryhoff, Sergeant Shane Matthews, and Deputy Jacob Holt, arrived to provide moral support to Dep. Mah.

Field Evidence Technician fom Sheriff's B.I. unit arrived at approximately 1500 hours. I directed FET Io take the necessary photographs. Det. Marco documented the injuries Dep. Mah sustained as well as any visible damage to his uniform caused by an apparent fall. I made a decision not to collect Dep. Mah's uniform since I had learned he had no physical contact with the suspect or knife carried by the suspect. Ventura County Professional Standards Sergeant Alan Devers conducted a gun and equipment exchange. Det. Marco documented, supervised, and seized evidence during this process. FET $\quad$ took possession of the gun and associated ballistic equipment Dep. Mah used during the incident, which he later booked as evidence.

Ventura County Sheriff's Association Attorney Rick arrived to meet with Dep. Mah. I greeted and spoke briefly with Att. to advise him Det. Marco and I were the case agents in the case. Att.
met with Dep. Mah in the same Admin. Briefing room where Dep. Mah was waiting. After a period of time, Att. stepped out from the briefing room and asked to speak with me and I asked Det. Marco to join us. Att. asked me for an update on the progress of our investigation. I told Att. We wished to conduct an interview of Dep. Mah possibly in conjunction with a "walk through" of the crime scene. Att. expressed his concern about the location of the crime scene and the reality of numerous onlookers since the crime scene was located at a major intersection. I told Att. $\quad$ a walk through was not mandatory and we would be happy with an interview. Att. agreed and advised me he would meet with Dep. Mah again and get back to us as soon as he was done. After a period of time, Att. $\square$ stepped out again and told me he was going to call an associate attorney to assist him. Attorney Steve arrived after a period of time and joined Att.

During the meeting between Dep. Mah and the attorneys, I learned Sheriff's command staff made a decision to release a video of the shooting taken by a witness to the media. The meeting between Dep. Mah and

the attorneys concluded and Att. told me Dep. Mah was ready to be interviewed. The time frame for the video broadcast on the news was scheduled to take place during our interview of Dep. Mah. I alerted Att. $\square$ of the pending release of the video and suggested he speak to Att. $\square$ and Dep. Mah about the pending news cast in the event Dep. Mah decided to view the video prior to providing a statement to us. Att. agreed and we postponed the interview.

After a short period of time, Att. $\quad$ stepped out and asked me if it was possible for Dep. Mah to view the video. I contacted Ventura County Sheriff's Detective Dean Worthy and arranged for a lap top to be brought to the station with the video downloaded for Dep. Mah to review. Ventura County Sheriff's Senior Deputy Cyrus Zadeh arrived and set up the lap top for Att. I I instructed Sr. Dep. Zadeh to leave the room once the lap top was set up and he complied. During the televised media press conference and telecast of the shooting video, Det. Marco and I remained in the lobby and did not view the telecast. Att. stepped out after a period of time and asked if Dep. Mah could listen to the dispatch recording. I granted the request and asked Sr. Dep. Zadeh to assist Att. $\square$ with the lap top and step out of the room when he was done.

At approximately 1730 hours, Det. Marco and I sat down in the same room with Dep. Mah and Attorneys and to commence the interview. I allowed Professional Standards Sgt. Devers, Senior Deputy District Attorney bunlevey, and District Attorney Investigator Corina Wondoloski to sit in on the interview with prior understanding that they would not be directly involved in the interview. I activated my recorder and I identified myself. I instructed everyone in the room to identify themselves and afterwards I began interviewing Dep. Mah.

I confirmed with Dep. Mah that he was consenting freely to being interviewed by us and he confirmed. On this date, Dep. Mah was working a 12 hour overtime patrol dayshift in the City of Camarillo. Dep. Mah's last days off were 12-11-15 through 12-13-15. Dep. Mah returned to work his normal patrol assignment in the City of Ojai on 12-14-15 and 12-15-15. Dep. Mah was scheduled to be off but decided to sign up for an overtime shift in Camarillo today. Prior to the beginning of his patrol shift which begins at 0700 hours, Dep. Mah had at least six hours of sleep and ate properly. Dep. Mah stated he did not take any type medications. Dep. Mah prepared for shift as he normally does by donning his full Sheriff's duty uniform with proper identifying patches and badge.

Dep. Mah carries a Sig Saur 40 caliber model 226 semi-auto handgun plainly visible in a holster on his duty belt. Dep. Mah loaded a full 12 round magazine into the gun and topped it off with one extra round in the chamber for a total of 13 rounds. Dep. Mah caries two extra 12 round magazines on his duty belt. Dep. Mah also carries an issued yellow electronic hand held shocking device (Taser X26) plainly visible in a holster on his duty belt. Prior to his deployment, Dep. Mah attended a patrol briefing which Dep. Mah considered normal with no critical topics or information discussed.

I asked Dep. Mah to cover the type of calls he handled leading up to the shooting incident and to include anything significant. Dep. Mah stated the morning was fairly quiet and he handled a few insignificant calls including an alarm call. I asked Dep. Mah to describe the call he received that led to the shooting. Dep. Mah corrected me and stated he was actually dispatched to respond to another alarm call. Dep. Mah was responding to the area of West Chapel Drive and stopped at the intersection of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive for a red light. Dep. Mah's marked black and white patrol unit was facing southbound in the number 1 lane with no other vehicles in front of his unit. At this point, Dep. Mah heard the call of a suspicious subject in the area of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive when he realized he was on scene.

At this point, Dep. Mah noticed a male walking eastbound in the crosswalk towards his patrol unit. Dep. Mah and the male made eye contact and the male walked to the driver's side door of Dep. Mah's patrol unit. Dep. Mah had the driver's side window partially down and he rolled the window down to make verbal contact with the male. Dep. Mah believes he heard the male say something to the effect of, "Just kill me now." Dep. Mah told the male to "go away" and to "cross the street" so that he could to talk to the male. Instead, the male walked to the front of Dep. Mah's patrol unit and just stood there. Dep. Mah described the male as Caucasian with an approximate age of 20 years old, "beach blonde" hair, unshaven and "unkempt". Prior to conducting the interview, I learned Dep. Mah had prior contact with the male during a call where the male ran from the police. I asked Dep. Mah if he knew or had prior contact with the male and Dep. Mah confirmed he did. 1 asked Dep. Mah to elaborate.

Dep. Mah stated approximately two weeks ago, he was working a uniformed patrol overtime shift in Camarillo when "a sergeant" went in foot pursuit of the same male. Dep. Mah stated the male was suspected of

shoplifting and decided to run when he saw the sergeant. Dep. Mah responded to assist the sergeant involved and the male managed to elude police by running into the sewers. Approximately one hour later, the male was spotted at the "In \& Out" restaurant near Carmen Drive and Highway 101. When the male saw Dep. Mah, the male jumped the fence onto Highway 101 and ran across the freeway. Dep. Mah stated he drove to the other side of Highway 101 and when the male saw Dep. Mah again, the male jumped the fence again and ran across the freeway again. Dep. Mah searched for the male who was seen in the area of "iHOP" restaurant on Daily Drive east of Carmen Drive. When the male saw Dep. Mah, he ran across Daily Drive to the "Motel-6" where Dep. Mah exited his patrol unit to chase the male on foot. The male slowed down and Dep. Mah tackled the male and handcuffed him without further incident or use of force. The male was booked for shoplifting, eluding police, and outstanding warrants. Dep. Mah recalls the first or last name of the male was " $\quad$. I focused the interview back to today's incident.

Dep. Mah confirmed he recognized the male as soon as he saw him approaching his patrol unit. When the male reached the driver's side window of Dep. Mah's patrol unit, Dep. Mah heard him say "Kill me now" or "Just kill me", Dep. Mah responded by telling the male to walk to the sidewalk. The male ignored Dep. Mah and walked to the front of Dep. Mah's patrol unit and just stood there. Dep. Mah was not able to notify dispatch due to heavy radio traffic. At this point, Dep. Mah is still stopped for a red light and the male walked back to the driver's side window of Dep. Mah's patrol unit. Before the male could say or do anything, Dep. Mah again told the male to walk to the sidewalk and that he would speak to him there. The male complied and walked to the east sidewalk of Carmen Drive. Dep. Mah did not see the male carrying anything in his hands. I asked Dep. Mah what his mind set was at this point. Dep. Mah was wondering what was wrong with the male and why would he want Dep. Mah to kill him.

Dep. Mah activated his emergency lights and made a U-turn. Dep. Mah immediately pulled over and stopped. Dep. Mah parked on the east side of Carmen Drive with his patrol unit facing north partially blocking the number 2 lane. Dep. Mah placed the transmission in park causing all the doors to unlock. At this point, Dep. Mah had not notified dispatch about his status. As Dep. Mah placed the transmission in park, the male opened the front passenger door of Dep. Mah's patrol unit. Dep. Mah yelled at the male to close the door several times

and at one point yelled, "Close the fucking door!" Dep. Mah got out of his patrol unit and walked around the back of the patrol unit to make contact with the male who was on the sidewalk. I stopped Dep. Mah at this point to get specific details about his actions and mind set.

Dep. Mah stated he now felt the male was capable of "doing something" and "was unpredictable". Dep. Mah responded to the actions of the male by removing the Taser from his holster as he exited his patrol unit in anticipation of utilizing it against the male. Dep. Mah approached the male with the Taser in his right hand at "the ready." As Dep. Mah approached the male, Dep. Mah recalls the male kept saying "Kill me" or "Kill me now". Dep. Mah diverted his attention to the traffic for a moment and when he looked back at the male, Dep. Mah saw the male holding a knife in his right hand. Dep. Mah described the knife as having a black handle with a silver 6 to 7 inch blade. I asked Dep. Mah to describe the demeanor, stance, and fashion in which the male was holding the knife. Dep. Mah described the male as being "excited" or "amped up". Dep. Mah raised his right fist towards his chest indicating how the male was clearly displaying the knife in his right hand. Dep. Mah recalls the male was still saying "Kill me" or "Shoot me".

When Dep. Mah saw the knife, he quickly transitioned from Taser to handgun. Dep. Mah stated he did so because the Taser is "unpredictable" and he feared the male may stab him or someone else. Dep. Mah added he "feared for his life" and "wanted to go home to see his family". I asked Dep. Mah if by this time he had communicated with dispatch about his situation. Dep. Mah recalls he advised dispatch he was "with a subject with a knife". Dep. Mah described holding his gun "at the ready" while he yelled at least seven times at the male to drop the knife. As Dep. Mah ordered the male to drop the knife, the male ignored the commands and began walking towards Dep. Mah in turn causing Dep. Mah to walk backwards. Dep. Mah continued yelling commands at the male to drop the knife and he refused to do so.

I asked Dep. Mah if he recalls the approximate distance between he and the male when Dep. Mah initially drew his gun in response to seeing the knife. Dep. Mah looked across the room past me and pointed to the wall indicating that was the approximate distance between he and the male. Det. Marco estimated the distance to be 10 to 15 feet. I asked Dep. Mah to describe his and the male's movements. Dep. Mah recalls the male started to walk faster towards him, causing Dep. Mah to walk backwards faster. Dep. Mah estimated the

male gained approximately 5 feet on him during this time. Dep. Mah continued yelling commands at the male to drop the knife, which the male ignored.

At this point, Dep. Mah recalls the male momentarily stopped walking forward and Dep. Mah stopped walking as well. Dep. Mah saw the male walk backwards "a little bit" and Dep. Mah walked forward to keep the male from "getting too far away". Dep. Mah continued yelling at the male to drop the knife. The male then stopped walking backwards and Dep. Mah stopped as walking forward. The male then began walking forward towards Dep. Mah at a faster pace while still holding the knife in his right hand as before. Dep. Mah began walking backwards faster but the male was gaining ground on Dep. Mah. At this point, Dep. Mah expressed that he "feared for his life" and "was scared" because he did not want to get stabbed therefore he fired his gun at the male. I asked Dep. Mah if he recalls communicating with dispatch prior to firing his gun. Dep. Mah recalls at one point saying, "One at gun point!"

I asked Dep. Mah if he recalls how many times he fired his gun at the male. Dep. Mah stated "four or five times". Dep. Mah did not see where the rounds struck the male but he recalls seeing blood on the male during the shooting. Dep. Mah was walking backwards when he shot at the male. I asked Dep. Mah what happened after he shot the male. Dep. Mah stated after the first few rounds he fired at the male, the male continued walking towards Dep. Mah. At this point, Dep. Mah "fired a couple of more rounds". After shooting at the male the second time, Dep. Mah either miss-stepped or tripped and ended up tumbling on his back and rolling over. Just before he fell, Dep. Mah saw the male still standing and walking towards him. While on the ground, Dep. Mah was worried that the male was going to jump on top of him and stab him. Dep. Mah quickly got up and recalls watching the male fall to the ground. Dep. Mah did not shoot at the male a third time and he did not lose control of his gun at any time. Dep. Mah recalls broadcasting on the radio "shots fired!" after he got up. I asked Dep. Mah how close he estimates the male actually got to him during the shooting. Dep. Mah estimated within 1 foot.

At this point, Dep. Mah stood at a safe distance and pointed his gun at the male who was now on the ground. Dep. Mah could not see the knife the male had been holding but still considered the male "a threat". Approximately 30 seconds later, a deputy whom Dep. Mah identified as "Deputy Loes", arrived to assist him.



## Narrative:

When Dep. Loes arrived, he stood to the left of Dep. Mah but it is unclear to Dep. Mah if Dep. Loes had his gun drawn. Dep. Mah was standing on the left side of the male on the ground. When Dep. Mah approached the male, he walked around the "back side" of the male and at that point he saw the knife in the right hand of the male. Dep. Mah kicked the knife away from the male's hand and handcuffed the male who Dep. Mah still considered a threat. Dep. Mah did not see the male move and he did not hear the male say anything.

Dep. Mah stated "Sergeant I arrived on scene followed by the paramedics and amb I asked Dep. Mah to estimate how long it took for the paramedics to arrive after the male went down due to being shot. Dep. Mah estimated "a couple of minutes" elapsed. Dep. Mah stated fire personnel were the first to render first aid to the male. I asked Dep. Mah if he recalls hearing any bystanders or if he saw any citizens get involved. Dep. Mah did not recall hearing or seeing any bystanders say anything but pointed out there was a lot of traffic and people in the area. I asked Dep. Mah if he watched the paramedics render first aid to the male. Dep. Mah stated he was led away from the scene by "Sergeant Tennessen". Dep. Mah sat in Sgt. Tennessen's police unit for a short period of time before Sgt. Tennessen drove him to the Camarillo police station.

I asked Dep. Mah to describe the injuries he sustained after falling down. Dep. Mah scraped two knuckles on his right hand that were bloody. Dep. Mah's right forearm, elbow, and knee, were scraped from "road rash". I pointed out to Dep. Mah that I noticed the back of his shirt on the right side had road rash stains on it. Dep. Mah claimed he felt no pain in his right shoulder area but was not sure if he sustained any scrapes due to the fall.

I spoke to Dep. Mah about his training and experience. I asked Dep. Mah if he received any training regarding persons with knives. Dep. Mah learned that a person who is in possession of a knife can quickly draw and close distance rapidly on a person in order to mount an attack. Dep. Mah learned that when a person is in possession of a knife, one must keep a safe distance at all times to avoid an attack. At this point, I had no further questions of Dep. Mah. I turned to Det. Marco and asked him if he had any questions.

Det. Marco asked Dep. Mah if the male said anything else between the time Dep. Mah first got out of his patrol unit and the time Dep. Mah shot the male. Dep. Mah did not recall hearing the male say anything else besides saying he wanted to be shot or killed by Dep. Mah. Det. Marco asked Dep. Mah about the demeanor of the male during the incident. Dep. Mah again stated the male was "excited" and "amped up". Det. Marco asked

Dep. Mah if he recalls seeing where the male produced the knife from. Dep. Mah stated he did not know. Det. Marco asked Dep. Mah why he needed to "back pedal". Dep. Mah stated the male was walking towards him with the knife and Dep. Mah needed to get distance for his safety. Dep. Marco asked Dep. Mah if he recalls the reaction of the male when he was shot. Dep. Mah recalls the male yelled in pain but did not say anything. Det. Marco asked Dep. Mah about the sequence of the rounds he fired. Dep. Mah recapped the sequence of the rounds he fired and his statement was consistent with what he told me earlier. Det. Marco asked Dep. Mah what direction he was firing the rounds and Dep. Mah answered "south". Dep. Mah confirmed the male was in a position south of Dep. Mah when Dep. Mah fired his gun at the male. No further questions from Det. Marco. At this point, I terminated the interview.

JL: Qkay. We're on the record. Today's date is December 16th, 2015. I'm Detective Jose Lopez with Ventura County Sheriff's Department and we're here at the Camarillo Police Station.

What I'm going to ask is, for each of you to identify yourselves and your title. And we'll go around.

LM: Deputy Leon Mah.
JL: okay.
MM: Deputy Mike Marco, Major Crimes.
JL: I'll set that --
$A D:$ Sergeant Allen Devers, Professional
Standards.

JL: Okay.
And the time is approximately 1730 hours.
First of all, Deputy Mah, I just want to make sure you're okay with doing this interview. We got consent from you to conduct this interview?

LM: Yes.
JL: okay, thank you.
Okay. First thing I want to talk about is just basically how your started. And I understand you were
working overtime today?
LM: Yes.
JL: You're normally assigned -- are you assigned to this station?

LM: I'm assigned in Ojai.
JL: Oh, to Ojai? Okay. So td was an overtime shift, correct?

LM: Yes.
JL: Okay. Did you have a Doff yeste or was -- is this -- what $\square$ is this for you?

LM: I worked Mor_ and Tuesday. I was off on the weekend.

JL: okay.
LM: It's Friday, Saturday, Sunday.
JL: Okay. So you've worked -- you've been working since Monday, correct?

LM: Yes.
JL: Okay. Before you started your shift, can you just give me a little bit of background? Did you get enough sleep, did you eat before you came to work? Can you tell me a little bit about that?

LM: Yeah, I slept.
JL: Approximately how much you slept.
LM: I slept probably six hours, six and a half hours.

JL: Okay.
LM: And I ate a little snack in ... throughout
the morning.
JL: Okay.
LM: Just --
JL: And what time did your shift start? What time did you get here?

LM: I started at 7:00.
JL: At 7:00, okay. Now, just kind of walk me through your preparation for -- for work. What do you -what do you do? Obviously you got dressed and --

LM: Got dressed and --
JL: (INAUDIBLE).
LM: Load up the car, check the car, make sure everything's in working order; lights.

JL: Okay.
LM: Check the shotgun.
JL: Did you attend a briefing?
LM: I attended briefing, yes.
JL: Okay. Was there anything in the briefing that stands out or was it --

LM: No.
JL: Okay. How about your gun preparation? Can you tell me -- talk to me about your gun, type of gun you have, what you carry, the rounds and everything.

LM: It's a Sig Sauer 40, 40 cal. It's a P226.
JL: Okay.
LM: It's a 12-round magazine with a 13th round that's in the chamber.

JL: Okay. And you carry extra magazines?
LM: And two extra magazines.
JL: And you carry them on your belt?
LM: Yes.
JL: Okay. And you're wearing your duty belt today?

LM: Yeah.
JL: You're wearing your uniform with identifying patches on it; that's correct?

LM: Yes.
JL: That's what you were wearing today?
LM: Yes.
JL: Okay. And so you started your shift, kind of just walk me through a little bit leading up to and just stop at when you got the call. But was there anything extraordinary, what type of calls did you handle?

LM: I handled an alarm call. It wasn't too busy of a morning. It was -- I know I had an alarm call. Can't remember the other call I had before that. But it was nothing --

JL: Okay.
LM: Nothing significant.
JL: And I meant to ask you too, do you -- you take any medications?

LM: No.
JL: No medications at all?
LM: None.

JL: Okay. So you had a pretty routine morning. Sounds like you had an alarm call and --

LM: Yeah.
JL: -- some other -- maybe some other calls but that are pretty routine?

LM: Uh-huh.
JL: Okay. So let's -- let's talk about the call that you got that got you to this incident. Let's -let's start with that. Talk to me about the call.

LM: Okay. I was actually going to another alarm call.

JL: Okay.
LM: And then $I$ was at the intersection of Carmen and Daily when that call went out and that's -- I just happened to be there.

JL: Okay. Can you tell me, do you remember where the alarm call was at?

LM: On West Chapel.
JL: Okay. So you were headed that direction.
LM: Yeah.
JL: And you were on -- on Daily?
LM: I was on southbound Carmen at Daily.
JL: Okay.
LM: At the inter- -- at the intersection.
JL: Right at the intersection. Okay. Then what happened?

LM: And then $I$ was at -- I was in the Number 1
lane, I was number -- you know, first one in line at the light.

JL: Okay.
LM: Red light, I was stopped. Then I see someone coming in my direction, I can see him. Then I look over and I see him. He look -- he's making eye con- -- eye contact with me. And I see him come, where he comes over to my driver's side door. And I had the window cracked, $I$ roll it down and he said something like, you know, just kill me now or something along those lines.

And I, you know, I told him to go away, go across the street. And then he stood in front of my car.

JL: Okay. Let me stop you there.
LM: Okay.
JL: Okay. So now you're at the red light waiting for the light to turn green and all of a sudden you see a male, right?

LM: Yes.
JL: You said "he."
LM: A white male, yes.
JL: Do you remember what he was wearing, what he looked like, how old he was?

LM: He was a white male, probably early twenties, bleached blond hair.

JL: Uh-huh.
LM: Think he was unshaven, just unkempt, unkempt looking.

JL: Okay. Is this someone that you've contacted before?

LM: Yes, about -- think two weeks ago.
JL: Tell me about that.
LM: It was -- the sergeant was in a foot pursuit. He shoplifted from Target so they were searching for him. He -- he went in the sewers under the 101 and then he -- like an hour later, he was spotted at In-N-Out.

He jumped the fence on the freeway. I went on the freeway, I saw him, he saw me, then he started running across the freeway. I got on the freeway, tried to cut him off at the Number 1 lane but he saw me, then he jumped to the northbound lanes and ran across the freeway.

So I turned around, went back on the Carmen over -- overpass, people were saw him, they were pointing, pointing towards the direction of iHop. And I'm driving that way, I see him running behind iHop. Then I go down Carmen, make a right onto eastbound Daily, then I approaching iHop, I see him run across the street from iHop towards Motel 6.

And then I pull into Motel 6 and I foot pursuit in the parking lot, then $I$ was able to get him into custody.

JL: And how did that go? Tell me just real briefly how did you get him in custody?

LM: Well, I -- I chase him, then he slowed down, then $I$ just tackled him in some grass.

JL; Okay. And did you use any -- any -- any weapons, tasers or anything?

LM: No. Just --
JL: It was just strictly a tackle?
LM: Uh-huh.
JL: And handcuff?
LM: And then one other - couple other deputies came over to help handcuff.

JL: Okay. So you already had contact with him that day? That was how long ago?

LM: I want to say two weeks.
JL: Okay.
LM: Two and a half weeks.
JL: Okay. And what was he charged with?
LM: Shoplifting, 148, and I think he had a couple warrants.

JL: Okay. And do you remember his name?
LM: I want to say his name was $\square$. I don't
remember --
JL: Okay.
LM: -- if that was his --
JL: That's okay.
LM: -- first name or last name. I --
JL: Okay.
LM: rings a bell.
JL: Okay. So now getting back to, you're at the red light and you see this male. When you saw him, did --
did you recognize him?
LM: I recognized him, yes.
JL: Okay. So you knew who it was?
LM: Uh-huh.
JL: Okay. So now he comes over to your side, on the driver's side.

LM: Right.
JL: And you already had your window down?
LM: Yes.
JL: Okay. Tell me again what he says to you.
LM: He said something, kill me now or just kill me.

JL: Okay.
LM: I'm not sure what he said.
JL: What was your reaction to that?
LM: I told him, you know, go over there. So like I want to -- I was in the middle of an intersection, I didn't want to get out of the car and talk to him there. I just told him to walk over there to the sidewalk. Or I said go away over there.

JL: Okay.
LM: Then he walked to the front of my patrol car.

JL: Okay.
LM: Was trying to get on the radio but it was too much traffic. And then he walked back, the -- he left the front of my car and walked back to my driver's side
window. And I kind of told him, go over there and I'll come and talk to you. And -- and he walked to the sidewalk.

JL: Okay. Do you recall him carrying anything? Only if you remember.

LM: I don't remember anything.
JL: At that point?
LM: I don't remember.
JL: Okay. Your mindset at that point, what are you thinking about this person?

LM: I'm thinking, you know, what is he -- I'm thinking what is he -- you know, what's -- what's he going to do? What's his -- what's his issue?

JL: Uh-huh.
LM: I mean, why does he want me to kill him, you know?

JL: Okay. And so then what did you do next?
LM: So I turn all my lights on, I made a U-turn. And then now I'm in the Number 2 lane of northbound Carmen.

JL: Okay.
LM: At the -- at the intersection.
JL: Uh-huh.
LM: He's on the sidewalk, I put it in park. And when I put it in park, it unlocks all the doors.

JL: Okay.
LM: And he opened the passenger door.

JL: Okay. Let's stop there again. Before you made your U-turn and before you turned your lights on, did you -- were you able to get back on the radio at all?

LM: No.
JL: Okay. So you made your U-turn and you turned and parked without -- and you weren't on the radio yet at this point?

LM: No.
JL: Right?
LM: Was trying to.
JL: Okay. And then you put it in park?
LM: Uh-huh.
JL: Okay. Then what happened from there?
LM: Well, like I say, it unlocks all the doors.
JL: Okay.
LM: And then he opened the passenger door.
JL: Okay. Now you're talking about the front passenger?

LM: The front passenger door.
JL: Okay. He was able to open it even though you put it in park?

LM: It un- -- it unlocks all the doors.
JL: Oh, in -- on. Okay.
LM: And then he opened it. I told him to close the fuckin' door. Close the door, close the door. And he's -- and then I eventually got out of the car and walked around the back of my vehicle.

JL: Okay. So now he's -- he's on the sidewalk, you're -- he opened your door, you -- you told him basically what you just said, told him to -- to close the door or --

LM: Close the f- -- I -- close the fuckin' door. JL: Okay. Tell me how you're feeling right now. Now how are you feeling about this person?

LM: Well --
JL: What is your mindset?
LM: My mindset is like he's -- he might do something. So I didn't -- when I got out of the car, I'm really -- took the taser out and had my taser out. Well, just 'cause I -- he was going to be unpredictable, that's what I thought.

JL: Okay. And when you got out of your car, did you -- is -- is that the point you removed it or when you got to the back or do you remember?

LM: I start -- I think when I opened door, I started taking it out.

JL: Okay.
LM: Just to have it out and at my ready.
JL: Okay. Are you putting anything out on the radio at this time?

LM: I don't think so. I don't remember. I don't think so.

JL: Okay. So let's -- let's go from there.
LM: Uh-huh.

JL: Now you're walking. Sounds like you got your taser.

LM: Yeah.
JL: In which hand, do you remember?
LM: My right hand.
JL: Okay. And now walk me through what happened from there.

LM: Okay. So he's -- he's on the sidewalk. I start walking toward the sidewalk. I think he's still telling me to -- or kill me now or kill me or something along those lines. I don't know if I looked, just looked at traffic for a second, then I looked back and then he -he had a knife in his right hand.

JL: Okay. Did you give him any -- any warnings? Did you -- when you had the taser out, did you show it to him? Did you -- did you activate it?

LM: I didn't. I didn't.
JL: Did you yell any commands at him?
LM: No, I didn't activate it. I just had it out.

JL: Okay. So now you -- your -- your vision was a little bit -- well, not your vision but your attention from him was away for a second.

LM: Okay.
JL: You turn back and you said he had a knife in his hand?

> LM: Yes.

JL: Let's stop there. Do you remember what hand he had it in?

LM: In his right hand.
JL: Okay. Can you describe the knife?
LM: It was a black-handle knife with a silver blade.

JL: Okay, what -- do you remember approximately -- I know this is tough, but do you know what size blade approximately?

LM: I'm guessing maybe six or seven inches in -in blade.

JL: And tell me, when you're looking at him now, he's got this knife, how is he standing? What is he -how -- what is his demeanor to you? What is he -- what is he --

LM: He's ex- --
JL: -- portraying to you?
LM: Excited. Or I don't know the word to say, he's excited or amped up.

JL: Okay.
LM: How I'd say.
JL: And how is he standing with this knife?
LM: He's -- he just -- he's just holding and nothing -- I think he's just holding it and just standing there.

JL: Okay. You got your arm up.
LM: Yeah.

JL: You're holding your arm up.
LM: His -- his hand.
JL: Like almost towards your chest and just displaying it.

LM: He's -- he's displaying it in his hand.
JL: And he's telling you what?
LM: I think he's telling me again, just kill
him. Something like that.
JL: Okay.
LM: Or shoot me or --
JL: Okay. And you still have the taser in your hand?

LM: No. I -- when I saw the knife, I immediately put the taser back and drew --

JL: Yeah.
LM: -- my gun out.
JL: So tell me why you did that.
LM: Well, he had a -- a knife and I -- I mean, a taser's unpredictable. He had a knife. I mean, he could've stabbed me or --

JL: Okay.
LM: -- somebody else.
JL: So you're feeling -- you put your taser away. Tell me why you transitioned to the gun. Be -- is it -- tell me what you're feeling a little bit more -- a little bit more about your feelings of why you did that. LM: Oh, fear for my life.

JL: Okay.
LM: That's number one and --
JL: Okay.
LM: -- I want to go home and see my --
JL: Okay.
LM: See my family.
JL: All right. So let's stop there now. Any traffic on the radio? Have you put anything out at this point?

LM: I think I might have said I'm with the subject, he has a knife.

JL: Okay.
LM: Think $I$ remember saying that he has a knife on the radio and --

JL: All right. So now you got your gun.
LM: Yeah.
JL: And tell me what, are you -- tell me what you're doing with the gun.

LM: I just have it at the -- the hold and like -- like this.

JL: At the ready?
LM: At the ready.
JL: Okay. That's --
LM: Yeah.
JL: -- pointing it down at the ready?
LM: Yeah.
JL: And you're looking at him, right?

LM: Uh-huh.
JL: Okay. Do you remember saying anything to him at that point?

LM: I said drop the knife. And I said drop the knife.

JL: Did you just say it real soft or -LM: No, I yelled. I was -- I yelled, drop the knife.

JL: Okay.
LM: I mean, I screamed it.
JL: How many times do you think you yelled it?
LM: I don't know. Seven or eight.
JL: Okay. Now, are you guys just standing there or what's happening as -- as far as movement goes when you're doing this? What's happening with him, what is he doing?

LM: I'm at that -- when I said drop, one -- drop the knife or -- then he starts walking towards me and then I start backing up, walking backwards. And he's still walking at me. I said drop the knife, drop the knife.

JL: Okay.
LM: And we're just --
JL: Okay. And let me back you up a little bit more. And when you first got out of the car and you're standing there and you're facing him and he's -- he's got the knife now --
LM: Uh-huh.

JL: -- can you approximately tell me -- and you're on the sidewalk, right?

LM: Yes.
JL: You're on the -- I'm going to call it the east sidewalk.

LM: The northeast sidewalk.
JL: Right.
LM: Northeast, yeah.
JL: Yeah. Approximately how far is he from you?
What is the distance between you two?
LM: I want to say from me probably to maybe the -- the chair or the wall right there.

JL: Okay. I'm not good with distance.
LM: Or the --
JL: How much -- how much is that, Mike?
Approximately? We're just -- just approximate?
MM: Fifteen feet. Anyone agree with that?
JL: Okay.
TD: Ten to fifteen. Ten --
JL: And that's --
TD: -- to fifteen. Ten.
JL: That's the first time that you pointed your gun at him, he's at that distance, right?

LM: Yes.
JL: And he's got the knife.
LM: Uh-huh.
JL: Clearly. Okay. Now this is important, you
start yelling at him like you just said, several times, drop the knife, drop the knife, blah, blah, blah, right?

LM: Right.
JL: Tell me the movement between you two. Does it increase, does it decrease, what's happening there? Talk to me about that.

LM: Okay. He starts walking towards me. I start walking back, I'm pacing back, back -- backpedaling. I think he might have increased a little bit on my distance when he got a little closer and I kept going back, so I think it increased a little bit, like he got a little bit closer.

JL: Okay. So how -- what's the closest you think he got at that point? What -- how much do you think he moved up on you?

LM: Maybe --
JL: Approximately?
LM: Maybe moved up, moved up five feet.
JL: Okay. So then what's happening now?
LM: I'm yelling. I'm still, drop the gun. And we're still going back.

JL: You're yelling drop the knife, right, not drop the gun?

LM: Oh, yeah, sorry. Drop the knife, yeah.
JL: Yeah. 'Cause he had a knife, not a gun, right?

LM: Drop the knife, yes.

JL: Okay. Keep going, what's happening?
LM: Well, we're going back, back and then -then he stops walking and then I stop and he starts to walk backwards a little bit. And so then bring (INAUDIBLE) so I'm just walking, I start walking a little bit forward so he can -- wouldn't get too far away.

JL: Are you yelling? Are you giving any commands at this time?

LM: I -- I believe I'm still saying drop the knife.

JL: Okay.
LM: So we're walking. He's walking back, then he stops, I believe, and then I stop. And then he starts walking at me again, but this time he's walking a little faster.

JL: Okay. The first time that he walked towards
you --
LM: Hmm.
JL: -- I'm just seeing him walking.
LM: Huh.
JL: Was he just walking like a normal pace or what kind of pace was he? Well, what would you -- how would you describe his pace?

LM: Oh, the first time? Probably just I think it was like normal walk.

JL: Okay. What about the second time?
LM: Second time was more -- more -- I think more
of a -- a speed walk maybe.
JL: Okay.
LM: Or a faster pace. But $I$ mean, it was
faster.
JL: And how is he holding that knife?
LM: It's like, I think he was still holding it like this.

JL: Okay. So let's pick up from there. Now he's --

LM: Okay.
JL: -- advancing --
LM: Right.
JL: -- on you a little bit faster than before?
LM: Right.
JL: What are you doing?
LM: Then I put -- I start backing up faster, he's -- I think he's gaining ground on me. So I back up and tell him to drop the -- drop the knife and then you knows, you know, fear of my life and then, you know, scared. You know, I don't want to get stabbed. I'm scared. And that's when I -- I fired.

JL: Okay. You shot him?
LM: I shot him, yeah.
JL: Okay.
LM: I shot him.
JL: Did you -- did you put out any more traffic before that? Did you say anything on the radio before
that, before you actually shot?
LM: No, I -- no, at one point I said one at gunpoint.

JL: Okay. Do you remember saying that?
LM: Yeah.
JL: Okay. So now I'll pick up at -- at the point where you're -- you're walking backwards and he -and you -- you feel fear for your life?

LM: Uh-huh.
JL: So you start shooting at him.
LM: Right.
JL: Right? Okay. Do you remember how many times you shot at him?

LM: I --
JL: Approximately?
LM: I thought four to five rounds.
JL: Okay. Did you see the rounds actually hit him? And if you did, where?

LM: I mean, I saw -- eventually I think I saw blood but I don't know where -- where it hit him.

JL: Okay. And so you were standing at this time when you were shooting?

LM: I was -- as I was shooting, I was walking backwards.

JL: Okay.
LM: Or face -- a fast pace, you know, trying to backpedal --

JL: Okay. Trying --
LM: -- as he's walking and at me. So when I fired, I was still walking backwards.

JL: Okay. Then what happened after, after you shot? What is he doing when you're shooting at him?

LM: He -- he's still con- -- he didn't, right after the first few rounds, he didn't -- he was still walking.

JL: Okay.
LM: So I think I fired a couple more rounds. And then, I don't know, I tripped or I misstepped and tumbled on my back and rolled over. And 'cause the last thing I saw was him not completely on the ground yet, still, you know, walking towards me. You know, I'm on my back, I thought, you know, he's going to -JL: Okay.

LM: -- jump on top of me and, you know, stab me. JL: Okay.

LM: So I hop back up and -- and then he -- I think I remember seeing him, watching him or he fell over and into the street.

JL: Okay. So after you fell down, you didn't shoot anymore rounds while --

LM: No.
JL: -- you were on the floor?
LM: No.
JL: On the ground, right? Did you drop your
gun?
LM: No, I had it in my hand.
JL: Okay. Did you put out any traffic at that time?

LM: Shots fired.
JL: Okay. Then what happened?
LM: And then he was in the street and I just, I stayed there, you know, with my gun pointed at him 'cause I didn't -- I didn't see the knife yet. And then backup showed up about thirty seconds later I'm guessing.

JL: And what do you mean, you "didn't see the knife yet"?

LM: Well, I didn't -- where we were all standing, I didn't see where the knife was.

JL: Oh, you didn't know --
LM: I don't know if he was still --
JL: -- where it went?
LM: Had it in his hand or --
JL: Okay.
LM: -- if he was going to jump back up, I didn't know.

JL: Okay.
LM: So I just stayed at the ready until backup arrived.

JL: So he's -- to you, he's still --
LM: A threat.
JL: Okay. So then what happened? You're
standing there and --
LM: I --
JL: -- you got your gun pointed at him?
LM: I just -- I just stood there and waited for backup to arrive.

JL: Okay. Go ahead.
LM: And then deputy arrived and then --
JL: Which deputy, do you remember who?
LM: Deputy Loes.
JL: Okay.
LM: He was on my left. I don't know if he had a -- his gun drawn but $I$ walked around to -- I was on the victim's left side and I walked around behind him. Then I saw the knife still in his right hand. And then I -- I kicked it away with my shoe and handcuffed him.

JL: Okay.
LM: And waited for --
JL: And Deputy Loes was there when you did that?
LM: Yeah, yes.
JL: And who is that handcuffed him?
LM: I did.
JL: Okay. And why'd you do that?
LM: He could have still been a threat, I didn't know.

JL: Okay. Did you hear him moving, talking, any -- saying anything?

LM: No.

JI: Okay. Then what happened?
LM: And then Sergeant $\square$ arrived on scene and then -- and then the fire department arrived on scene and ambu arrived on scene.

JL: Okay. How -- how soon did the fire arrive, fire department arrive, paramedics?

LM: Fire was there first.
JL: How soon after you went down and you guys handcuffed him, did -- which --

LM: Yeah, I want to --
JL: How much time do you think passed?
LM: I'm guessing a couple minutes. I mean, that's --

JL: okay.
LM: That's, I'm just estimating. I --
JL: That's okay. So there was no first aid given to him until paramedics got there?

LM: Right.
JL: Okay. And that was a couple of minutes after he went down, correct?

LM: Yes.
JL: Okay. Did -- was there -- do you remember hearing any bystanders, anybody in the area that was involved now or anything like that? Or --

LM: I looked around. I didn't hear anybody say anything but I -- you know, there was a lot of people around, a lot of traffic.

JL: And when the paramedics showed up, what -what did you see? What did they do?

LM: I already -- well, fire was there first and then I was already -- I was led away from the scene.

JL: By?
LM: By Sergeant Tennessen.
JL: Okay. And then obviously you came -- from there did you go -- where did you go from there?

LM: From there --
JL: With Tennessen?
LM: -- I went to his truck, we sat in his truck for a little bit, then he drove me back here to the Camarillo Police Station.

JL: Okay. And this is where I eventually came -- came and met with you?

LM: Yes.
JL: Correct? What did -- you sustained some injuries.

LM: Yes.
JL: Okay. Can you talk to me a little bit about that?

LM: My two knuckles on my right hand were, from the fall I guess, scraped up and they were bloody. Got some road rash from -- on my right forearm I guess and elbow area.

JL: Okay.
LM: And then a little -- somewhere, just on my
left knee.
JL: I notice you have scuff marks on the back side of your, left. Is it the right?

LM: I think it's --
JL: Right side?
LM: -- on the right side.
JL: Okay. Do you remember -- do you feel any pain on your --

LM: I don't feel --
JL: On your shoulder?
LM: -- any pain there, no.
JL: Okay. But we don't know 'cause we haven't looked at your shoulder yet to see if you actually got scraped.

LM: Right.
JL: Okay? Any other -- any other injuries?
LM: Not that I can --
JL: Okay.
LM: -- feel.

## Notification and Response Officer Involved Shooting Deputy Mah Weapon Retrieval Documentation of Appearance and Injuries

On December 16, 2015, I was assigned as a detective with the Ventura County Sheriffs Office Major Crimes Bureau. At approximately 1158 hours, I responded to the intersection of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive in the City of Camarillo to assist in a officer involved shooting investigation. While on scene, I learned that had brandished and assaulted Deputy Mah with a large knife. As a result of 's actions, Deputy Mah shot $\quad$ resulting in his death.

While on scene, Captain Instructed Detective Lopez and I to respond to the Camarillo Police Station located at 3701 Las Posas Road, Camarillo, California to speak with Deputy Mah about the incident. At approximately 1235 hours, Detective Lopez and I arrived at the station and introduced ourselves to Deputy Mah. We noted that Mah had several abrasions as a result of the assault. Deputy Mah had abrasions to his first two knuckles of his right hand and abrasions to his right forearm and left kneecap region. Those injuries were photographed by Detective Sergeant Tennessen prior to our arrival. Detective Sergeant Tennessen also photographed Deputy Mah in his uniform from multiple angles.
 The treating paramedics wer American Medical Response-rwurm both employed by

At approximately 1520 hours, Ventura County Sheriffs Field Evidence Technician (FET) again photographed Deputy Mah and his injuries. At the conclusion of Mah being photographed, I retrieved his weapon and magazines as evidence. I noted that Deputy Mah was right handed and wore his issued firearm and holster on the right side of his gun belt. He wore a double magazine pouch to the left of his gun belt buckle and it contained two department issued magazines. I removed the magazine closets to the gun belt buckle and noted the magazine contained twelve unspent rounds. Each of the twelve rounds were Speer 40 S\&W. I removed the additional magazine located in the magazine pouch and again noted that it contained twelve unspent rounds. Each of those twelve rounds were Speer 40 S\&W, I removed the magazine from Mah's duty weapon and noted it contained six unspent rounds. Each of those rounds were Speer 40 S\&W. I removed Deputy Mah's duty weapon from his holster and saw it was a department issued Sig Sauer, model P226, serial number 1 inspected the firearm and saw it had a round in the chamber. I removed the round from the chamber and noted it was an unspent Speer 40 S\&W.

## Officer Interview

Deputy Sheriff Chris Loes \#2941
December 16, 2015 / 3:27 P.M.

## Notification:

On Friday, December $16^{\text {th }}, 2015$, I was working my assignment as a Detective Sergeant with the Major Crimes Bureau. At approximately $11: 55 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$., Detective Dan Ambarian and I learned of an officer-involved shooting that had just occurred in the City of Camarillo. Soon thereafter, we were tasked with responding to the Los Robles Hospital Emergency Room to ascertain the suspect's condition and get a statement if possible. The suspect, $\square$ never regained consciousness and died at the hospital.

Upon arriving at the hospital, I met with Deputy Chris Loes. Deputy Loes advised me that he had been the second officer on-scene in the immediate aftermath of the shooting, and that he rode in the amb ${ }^{\text {ath }}$ ith the suspect as he was transported to the hospital.

After the suspect's body was released to Medical Examiner's personnel, I drove Deputy Loes to the Major Crimes Bureau in Camarillo for the purpose of interviewing him. I recorded our interview, with Loes' knowledge. The following is a summary of the interview; for exact details or verbatim statements, refer to the audio recording.

## Interview:

At approximately 11:50 a.m. that morning, Deputy Loes was working Patrol in the unincorporated County areas adjacent to the City of Camarillo as 3C11. At approximately 11:50 A.M., he was parked in a church parking lot on Carmen Dr, near Las Posas Rd. writing reports when he was dispatched to a report of a suicidal subject. As Loes began heading toward the parking lot exit, he heard Dispatch divert Deputy Mah (in a City Patrol assignment) to the call. As Loes pulled out onto the street (Carmen Dr.) he heard Deputy Mah advise Dispatch that he had contacted the subject, who was armed with a knife, and that he had the subject at gunpoint. Loes responded "Code Three" (activated his emergency lights and siren and drove quickly to the scene). About 20-30 seconds prior to his arrival at the scene, Loes heard Mah transmit "shots fired."

As Deputy Loes arrived on-scene, he saw Deputy Mah standing on the northbound (East) side of Carmen Dr. (\#2 lane). Deputy Mah had his gun drawn at a subject who was lying on the ground, face down. Loes got out of his vehicle and approached with his firearm drawn. He knew the suspect had been armed with a knife, but did not

see it and didn't know yet if the suspect was still breathing (playing dead). Loes covered the suspect with his firearm and suggested to Mah that they put on gloves and secure the suspect with handcuffs. As he and Mah approached, Loes noticed that the suspect's left arm was one the ground (stretched outward). He held the suspect's left hand down with his foot, while Mah applied the cuffs. Deputy Loes said he didn't recognize the suspect and seemed certain that he hadn't any previous contacts with him.

Once Deputy Mah handcuffed the suspect, Loes advised Dispatch that Fire could enter the scene. Deputy Mah located the suspect's knife (under the body) and pushed it off toward the curb. Loes walked over to the knife, and kicked it further away. He then turned back to the suspect and checked for a pulse, but was not able to discern one (Loes marked the time at 12:02 P.M.). County Fire Company 54 arrived on-scene and began treating the suspect. AMR paramedics responded soon thereafter.

Loes noticed that Deputy Mah had an abrasion on the knuckles of his hand (he was unsure if it was Mah's left or right). Mah said he was okay. Loes asked what happened. Mah told him that the suspect, armed with a knife, chased him. Mah told Loes that he "backpedaled" (with his firearm drawn) but began to lose his balance; at which point he fired his weapon. Loes said he thought Mah told him he fell to the ground. Loes said Mah and the suspect ended up in front (north) of Mah's patrol vehicle on Carmen Dr. Loes saw brass casings dispersed on the ground, about 10-15 feet north of the patrol vehicle.

Loes told me there were several witnesses watching when he arrived at the scene. He described one male witness that he saw on the other side of a wrought-iron fence in the gate guarded property east of the scene. He said the man (a construction worker) was standing behind a blue Ford work truck. Loes noticed him as soon as Mah handcuffed the suspect.

Loes described the suspect's knife as a "little black-handled steak knife." He said the knife had a serrated blade; about $4^{\prime \prime}-5^{\prime \prime}$ in length.

Additional deputies soon arrived at the scene. They blocked traffic and located several witnesses. Deputy Mah didn't say anything more to Loes. Sergeants Gus $\quad$ and Eric Tennessen arrived on-scene and sequestered Deputy Mah.

Deputy Loes took photos of the scene (which he later downloaded to the Photolab system) while the paramedics worked. Loes showed me a photo he'd taken of the suspect at the scene, showing the slug embedded in the suspect's lower left abdomen area.

Loes rode in the amb vith the suspect during the transport to Los Robles Hospital, Loes said that the suspect never said anything, either on the street or thereafter; he never regained consciousness and appeared

lifeless.
Upon arriving at the hospital, medical staff moved the suspect to a trauma room and began CPR. Shortly thereafter, (Attending Physician) pronounced the suspect's death (at 12:28 P.M.). At the hospital, medical staff gave Loes the expended slug found on the suspect's abdomen. Loes turned the slug over to FET at the hospital, who booked it into evidence.

I later leamed the suspect had assaulted the officer by brandishing a knife and the officer shot him. The suspect died as a result of his injuries. The suspect was identified as

At the scene, I discovered there were several witnesses standing in the parking lot of the USA at 305 Carmen Drive. I contacted the witnesses.

## Initial Response \& Actions

Deputy Kulhanek was standing on Lake Side Drive, just east of the group talking to them over a wall that was between them. I later determined the group consisted of Witnesses

On $12 / 16 / 15$, I was working in my assignment as a detective with the Ventura County Sheriff's Major Crimes Bureau. At approximately 1210 hours, I was at the Ventura County Hall of Justice when Sgt. Therrien and I learned of an officer involved shooting that occurred in the City of Camarillo. I responded to the scene of the shooting, near the intersection of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive. During the investigation, Det. Curtin and I learned there were several citizens who called the Sheriff's Communication Center to advise they witnessed the officer involved shooting. We were tasked with contacting the potential witnesses.

On 12/17/15, at approximately 0930 hours, I contacted $\square$ at the Camarillo Police Station. I conducted a digitally recorded interview with in the station "soft room". I later downloaded the interview onto a CD that was booked as evidence. Refer to the recording for complete details. The following is a summary of the interview:

I asked to tell me where she was and what she saw in relation to the officer involved shooting that occurred on $12 / 16 / 15$. Carmen Drive, waiting to turn left onto Daily Drive. told me she was on her way to shop at Michael's craft store. While $\quad$ was waiting for the signal light to turn green, she noticed a Sheriff's patrol car stopped at the signal light for southbound Carmen Drive at Daily Drive. saw a male subject who she believed to be a "beggar in the center divider." then realized the subject was standing in the cross walk, directly in front of the police car, blocking its path. . said the subject was "not moving" and it appeared to her that the subject in the cross walk and the deputy were "conversing".
saw the subject cross the street to the sidewalk on the northeast corner of Carmen and Daily Drives. $\qquad$ told me the deputy activated his overhead lights and made a u-turn, stopping along the east curb of Carmen Drive, north of Daily Drive. said the male subject went to the passenger side of the patrol car and opened the passenger side door. said the officer got out of his vehicle and believed the deputy had a "stun gun" in his hand, which she described as being yellow. said she watched as "the young man pulled out the knife and the officer pulled out his weapon and was on his radio and trying to get him to like, stay back and the guy was very erratic and wasn't listening and started coming towards the officer, at which point, he (the deputy) was backing away from him and they were kind of going back. Well, the officer was (moving) backwards and the guy was charging him with the knife." told me her signal had changed to green and as she turned into the intersection, she heard gunshots. I asked _ how many gunshots she heard and she said, "At least four or five."

On December $16^{\text {th }}, 2015$, I was assigned as a detective with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Bureau. At approximately 1155 hours, I responded to the area of Carmen Drive at Daily Drive in the City of Camarillo, to assist in the investigation of an officer involved shooting.

The following day, December $17^{\text {tr }}, 2015$, I was directed by Detective Sergeant Worthy to contact and interview a witness who reported seeing the officer involved shooting. The witness verbally identified herself as At approximately 1319 hours, I conducted a digitally recorded interview of Dver the telephone and she told me the following in summary:

I asked o tell me what she witnessed. $\quad$ explained she was in the 24 -Hour Fitness parking lot walking to her vehicle ( 453 Carmen Drive, which was anywhere from 450 feet to 120 feet away from the scene, based on my follow-up research conducted on Googel Earth). standing in the parking lot facing east speaking with a friend. explained they heard gunshots. video recording of the incident which was released to the media. Eealized after watching the video recording what she had witnessed. Based upon the statement $\quad$ provided, it was anparent she used the video recording of the incident to fill in details of what she had witnessed. explained she watched one person fall off of the curb (later identified as Deputy Mah) and the other went down after he was shot (later identified as
 and her friend ran over to the scene. Scheurn's friend called 911 to report the incident. There were no paramedics present and stood by watching. An off duty paramedic responded to the scene and asked and her friend what happened. The paramedic walked toward the scene to render aid. said the off duty paramedic then returned and said $\quad$ was dead. The off duty paramedic explained did not have a pulse. bid not see the paramedic touch $\square$ because of the distance away she was.

I asked orecall the incident from her memory with out filling details in from watching the video recording of the incident. aid she saw Deputy Mah "scooting" backwards. she sid she was too far away to realize it was a deputy. hought it was two people "going at it" (engaged in a physical fight). The incident took place on the sidewalk of northbound Carmen Drive,

While at the intersection, observed a patrol vehicle conduct a u-turn in the intersection and approach an individual (later identified as $\quad$ ) standing on the northeast corner. said pulled out a knife and had another unknown object inside his opposite hand. said he believed the Officer (later identified as Deputy Mah) had a "taser gun". After watching this occur, told his passenger (later identified as David they had to stay and watch the incident.

Deputy Mah fold . "Drop the knife, drop the knife" and began to back up (north on Carmen Drive). pointed to the east sidewalk of Carmen Drive north of Daily Drive and said they went back and forth (demonstrating Deputy Mah and traveled north and south on the sidewalk). then said they went around the corner (traveling north on Carmen Drive) and Deputy Mah had his weapon drawn. I mean If some guy or gal is coming at you with a gun or a big knife, I'm like this is Camarillo, you know, but that's holy crap."

## INTERVIEW WITH WITNESS

On 12-16-15, at approximately 1150 hours, I responded to the area of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive in Camarillo to assist with an officer involved shooting. I arrived in the area and was advised there was a witness, $\square$ who was standing by in the area of Daily Drive and Brently Avenue. contacted Deputy Heiberger, who was directing traffic in the area, and requested to speak with someone in order to provide her statement.

I spoke with and digitally recorded my interview with her. The following is a summary of the interview. Refer to the recording for further. Said her vehicle was stopped in the turn lane (Southbound Carmen Drive to Eastbound Daily Drive) and she saw a "cop Car" to her right. She saw a "kid" walk from the cop car to the sidewalk. The unit then made a u-turn and parked along the sidewalk and the deputy got out of the car. The deputy and kid were yelling at each other and the deputy was yelling"put your knife down, put your knife down." said the subject had a knife and was running at the deputy saying, "Shoot me, shoot me, shoot me." The deputy kept yelling at him to put the knife down and then heard the "popping" sound of the taser. said she then turned her car left (no longer had a visual of incident).
additionally said the "cop" was running backwards and the kid was running at him "fast." said she then heard the pop of the taser gun. I asked what the deputy was trying to do and she said he was trying to get away from the subject. I asked what would have happened if the deputy did not "taser" the subject and she said he "probably would have stabbed him, cause he had his knife out, he was running at the cop." said she believed the knife was "pretty big" and she believed it to be a butcher knife.

On Jan. 12, 2016, at approximately 0938 hours, I conducted an interview of $\square$ over the phone. was one of many witnesses who called the sheriff's office to provide a witness statement regarding the Officer Involved Shooting event which occurred on Dec. 16, 2015 in Camarillo. left me a voice mail message Jan. 7, 2016 and indicated he had information regarding the shooting. The following is a summary of statement:
said he was at a business around the corner meeting with his lawyer regarding a family trust. explained he was in his vehicle on Carmen Dr. waiting to get onto the 101 freeway and head back to Los Angeles. Carmen described he was southbound on Carmen Dr, in the number one traffic lane stopped for the signal at Daily Dr. said there were one or two cars in front of his, also stopped for the red traffic signal. said, "I was on the same latitude as the incident." I asked if, based on his vehicle's position, the incident occurred to his left side (or east) and he said "exactly."
recalls it was warm outside and he was looking out his driver's window, which was rolled down. said, "I saw you know, first the officer back up because this kid." then changed the subject telling me how he had a son who suffered from szichophrenia who eventually died from a heroin overdose. $\square$ further stated that he is "pretty familiar" with

subject was being "a bit aggressive" and shortly thereafter the subject either backed up or "kept his distance ${ }^{\prime \prime}$ from the officer. After that, the officer started going toward the subject and the subject "got aggressive again" causing the officer to back up. I asked $\square$ if the officer had his gun out at this point and told me the officer had his gun out from the moment he first saw the two standing on the sidewalk.
continued, "And then finally, you know, he uh, shot him and I thought it was five shots honestly, it turned out to be six I guess, from what I read." $\square$ said the subject started falling down on the first shot, from what he could recall. $\square$ described the subject as staggering and falling into the street. said the traffic signal changed so he had to proceed forward. I asked if it was possible that while he was watching the incident unfold he missed the green light and sat through another cycle of the traffic signal. $\square$ said he is certain that did not happen, further stating that the whole incident lasted about 15 seconds.
said he was debating whether or not he should call law enforcement and get involved. He decided to reach out to law enforcement after reading the newspapers and noticing there was never a mention of the subject having a gun. Another reason why called is because he was of the opinion that he was closer to the officer and the subject than any of the other witnesses.

I asked if he had to look behind him and to the left or directly to his left while watching the incident and he said it occurred directly to his left side. was unable to provide me with any additional information regarding the incident. This concludes $\square$ statement.

Mah was dispatched to and responded to a suicidal subject at the 7-11 convenience store located at 255 Carmen Drive. Deputy Mah was involved in a shooting and several units responded. I arrived on scene at approximately 1205 hours from southbound Carmen Drive.

Upon arrival, Deputy S. Cashmark and I responded to the shopping center in the north west corner of the Carmen Drive and Daily Drive intersection. Deputy Cashmark and I created a perimeter using yellow tape with the words "SHERIFF'S LINE DO NOT CROSS." While at the perimeter, we were approached by witnesses. I interviewed the following witnesses. The following is a summary of the audio recorded interviews. For exact statements, refer to the audio recordings.

At approximately 1213 hours, I interviewed
told me she was approaching the rear of her vehicle which was parked in front of the Wells Fargo Bank, located at 487 Carmen Drive, when she heard three to four gun shots she described as, "bam, bam, bam." walked behind another row of cars, closer to Carmen Drive and saw two deputies near the patrol unit. _ pointed to a patrol unit parked on the east curb of Carmen Drive, facing north, just north of Daily Drive. saw one deputy "nudge him (suspect) with a foot to see if he was alive." On 12-16-15, at about 1153 hours, I was working uniformed patrol in a marked Sheriff's patrol car. Deputy Loes \#2941 (3C11) and I were dispatched to a call of a suicidal subject at 7-11, located at 255 Daily Drive in the City of Camarillo. Dispatch advised the subject stated he needed to die and wanted cops there so he could kill himself.

I was responding code 3 (lights and sirens) when I heard Deputy Mah \#4478 (8A11) arrive on scene. I heard Deputy Mah tell dispatch he was with the subject. Shortly after, I heard Deputy Mah say the subject had a knife. A few seconds later, I heard Deputy Mah say that shots were fired.

I exited the southbound side of the 101 Freeway at Carmen Drive. I approached the area of Carmen and Daily Drive from the south. I could see Deputy Mah's patrol patrol car facing north on Carmen on the southeast corner of the intersection. I saw Deputy Loes' patrol car in the southbound lanes of Carmen Drive.

Deputy Preciado $(8 \mathrm{ZH})$ was on scene attempting to divert traffic. I started blocking off traffic traveling north on Carmen at Daily. As I was directing traffic, I noticed two male individuals standing on the southwest corner of Carmen and Daily Drive of 256 Carmen Drive. While I was directing traffic, I asked both subjects if they witnessed the incident. Both subjects, later identified as had both parties standby until I was able to speak with them.

At the scene, I discovered there were several witnesses standing in the parking lot of the USA at 305 Carmen Drive. I contacted the witnesses.

## STATEMENT

I contacted in the parking lot of the USA gasoline station on the northwest comer of Carmen Drive at Dally Drive. stayed at the scene and told me he only heard the gun shots. I conducted an audio recorded interview with and he told me the following in summary: $\quad$ was driving northbound on Carmen Drive and was stopped in the number one lane to turn left onto Daily Drive.
$\square$ was stopped with one vehicle ahead of him so he could not see anything. Prior to making the left turn, he heard a "pop, pop, pop." believed the sounds were gunshots. heard a total of five or six shots.
looked toward the sounds of the gunshots and he had a partial view of an officer backing up. He did not see the suspect. He saw another officer arrive with is firearm out. did not see anything else. $\square$ stated he was a fire captain with the Ventura County Fire Department.

Background:
On Friday, December $16^{\text {th }}, 2015$, I was working my assignment as a Detective Sergeant with the Major Crimes Bureau. At approximately 11:55 a.m., I learned of an officer-involved shooting that had just occurred in the City of Camarillo. Soon thereafter, I was tasked with responding to the Los Robles Hospital Emergency Room to ascertain the suspect's condition. The suspect,

$\square$ never regained consciousness. He was pronounced dead at 12:28 P.M. by Doctor Roland Bastian.

1 attended the autopsy the next morning at the offices of the Ventura County Medical Examiner in Ventura. The autopsy was scheduled to begin at 10:00 A.M. I arrived at approximately 9:15 A.M. to meet with Chief Medical Examiner Dr. Ann Bucholtz and her staff and discuss the case.

During the meeting, I spoke with Deputy Medical Examiner Michael Tellez, who advised me that prior to transporting the body from the hospital (at 4:28 P.M. the previous day) he had broken/removed the seal on the blue plastic body bag in order to get a Livescan reading of the deceased's left index finger(print) in order to obtain positive identification. That done, he replaced the seal with one bearing \#26841 (at 4:33 P.M.).

Prior to my arrival, $x$-rays were taken of the body (through the sealed body bag). The film showed the approximate locations of 4 objects (slugs) in torso (see Internal Examination below).

The autopsy was conducted by Dr. Bucholtz, who was assisted by Forensic Technician (FT) Brian Applegate. In addition to me, those in attendance were VCSO Field Evidence Technician (FET) Jesus Castillo (for evidence collection and photos), District Attorney Investigator Kim Michaels, and Deputies Nicole Brazier and Gabriel Gonzales (for training purposes). Dr. Bucholtz began the autopsy at 10:00 A.M.

## Observations:

Or. Bucholtz and FT Applegate broke the seal and opened the body bag. Inside the bag, body lay on a single white bed sheet. body was unclothed, except for the two white protective forensic bags that l'd

## External Examination (Non-Gunshot Injuries):

Dr. Bucholtz examined the outside of head, face, and body. She noted the presence of rigor mortis. She saw no evidence of petechial hemorrhaging or wounds to the skull.

Head/Face: had abrasions on the outside corner of his right eye orbit, under his nose, and on/under his chin. His left central incisor (top front tooth) was missing completely, and his right central

Body: $\square$ had an array of abrasions that included his right shoulder, right thigh, and several small abrasions on both hands and fingers. He had a noticeable contusion on his left knee.

## Gunshot Wounds:

There were a total of 10 gunshot-related wounds on body (entry, exit, and graze), which Dr. Bucholtz attributed to a total of 6 shots fired. Each of the wounds appeared to be consistent in size and shape with those I'd seen in the past from . 40 cal firearms. During the autopsy, Dr. Bucholtz traced the trajectory of the bullets by threading metal rods through each entry wound and corresponding wound channel to the terminating point of each slug or exit wound. The following is a description of those wounds, listing them vertically (top to bottom) as they appeared on body. (Note:

1. Entry Wound - Left side of the base of the neck, approximately $2 \%_{2}^{\prime \prime}$ left of the spinal column. The wound channel led downward and slightly left, exiting in front of left armpit (Wound \#5), and continuing into/through left forearm (Wounds \#7 \& \#8).
2. Entry Wound - Back side of the left shoulder, at the top of the left scapula. Wound had an oval appearance. The wound channel led downward and left, piercing left lung and terminating at a slug recovered just under the skin of the (left) ribcage.
3. Entry Wound - Outside edge of left shoulder, slightly behind the lateral midline of the body. The wound channel extended laterally across the body, terminating at a slug recovered approximately $1_{2}^{\prime \prime}$ left of $\square$ spine.
4. Entry Wound - Left breast, approximately $y_{2}^{\prime \prime}$ right of left armpit; wound channel crossing through the torso downward diagonally, piercing both lung and heart and terminating at a slug recovered on the outside of the lower chest (ribcage), right side. Dr. Bucholtz remarked that this would have been a fatal wound.
5. Exit Wound - Left breast, approximately $1^{n}$ below and right of $\square$ left armpit (see Wound \#1 above)
6. Entry Wound - Left breast, approximately $112^{\prime \prime}$ left of $\square$ left nipple; wound channel extending through the torso downward and right diagonally; piercing lung, diaphragm, stomach, liver, and bowel. Wound channel terminated at slug recovered from bowel. Dr. Bucholtz remarked that this also would have been a fatal wound.
7. Entry Wound - On the inside surface and midlength of left forearm, slightly below the radius; wound

channel extending through the forearm and exiting the outside edge of the forearm, under the ulna (Wound \#8).
8. Exit Wound - Outside edge, midlength of left forearm and slightly below ulna.
9. Entry/graze Wound - Left hand at inside surface of the base of index finger, contiguous to (related) graze wound along the inside surface of the $4^{\text {th }}$ digit (or, "pinkie" finger).
10. Graze/burn Wound - Left side of lower abdomen; 2 small lacerations above a small round abrasion/burn mark. This was where medical staff at hospital recovered spent slug under ciothing.

## Internal Examination:

Dr. Bucholtz advised me that she had found no tumors or growths in
body. Similarly, she found no evidence of stroke, bleeds, or abnormalities in his brain. She noted that hyoid bone was intact and he had no signs of fracture or damage to his skull.

Dr. Bucholtz showed me that suffered significant damage to most of his vital organs: i.e., heart, lungs, and liver. The heart suffered a direct hit that destroyed the aorta and continued through the left and right ventricles.

Dr. Bucholtz recovered 4 slugs from
torso (Note: 1 additional was found by medical staff at the hospital, and 1 more recovered at the scene):

1. Left Chest - Recovered from the outer surface/tissue of left ribcage; See Wound $\# 2$.
2. Back - Recovered adjacent to left side of spine, upper back; See Wound \#3.
3. Right Lateral Chest - Recovered from the outside tissue of the lower right ribcage; See Wound \#4.
4. Right Abdomen - Recovered from the interior of bowel; See Wound \#6.

## Conclusion:

Dr. Bucholtz determined the Cause of Death to be Gunshot (Wounds) and the Manner of Death to be Homicide.
Refer to Dr. Bucholtz' autopsy report and diagram for additional information and a complete and detailed record of injuries. FET Castillo retained possession of the evidence collected at the autopsy. FET Castillo booked the items into evidence at the Ventura County Sheriff's Office Property Room in Ventura.

## UPPER EXTREMITIES

The upper extremities are symmetrical without palpable fractures. On the right forearm are two healed curved incisions with areas of suture marks, one measuring 4 inches long, the other 3 inches long. No recent incised wounds are seen. The fingernails are extremely short without tearing. The antecubital fossae are unremarkable bilaterally. On the adjacent left upper arm is a rectangular $1 / 2 \times 1 / 4$ inch red-u...iebrasion measuring 53 inches from the sole of the left foot and 7 inches left of midiline and consistent with a grazing partial marginal abrasion to this wound. Path of the bullet: The bullet enters the left upper chest through the left lateral fourth intercostal space and fractures the left lateral fifth rib. It lacerates the left lower lobe of lung, perforates the heart and the liver. It exits the right chest through the right anterior seventh intercostal space.
Site of recovery: The bullet is recovered in the subcutaneous right chest at 44 inches from the sole of the right foot and 4 inches right of midine. On Dec. 29, 2015, I authored a search warrant seeking any and all medical records associated with $\square$ from Ventura County Medical Center (VCMC) as well as Hillmont Inpatient Psychiatric Unit (IPU). The search warrant was granted by the Honorable Judge Manuel Covarrubias. I served the search warrant in person to Marc Rachmuth in the Records Department at VCMC on Dec. 30, 2015. On Jan. 5, 2016 Detective D. Ambarian went to VCMC and was given $\square$ 's records by $\qquad$
The purpose of searching these records was an attempt at locating any documentation (specifically from Hillmont IPU) which may outline or showease that had been suicidal in the past, or even had feelings of a homicidal nature which he may have shared with a medical doctor, nurse, psychiatric doctor or other staff members associated with VCMC and/or Hillmont IPU. Investigators were trying to obtain as much information about $\square$ as possible in an effort to shed some light on why he may have tried to kill a uniformed police officer on Dec. 16, 2015.

## Affidavit in Support Of Search Warrant

## 1. Affiant Training and Experience:

The facts establishing the foregoing grounds for issuance of a search warrant are as follows: Your affiant is Steven Michalec. I am a sworn Peace Officer within the meaning of Penal Code section 830 and have been so employed in the State of California by the Ventura County Sheriff's Office for over Twenty years. 1 am currently assigned as a Robbery / Homicide Investigator in the Sheriff's Major Crimes Bureau. I have been assigned to the Major Crimes Bureau for approximately three and a half years. Prior to this assignment, I was assigned to the Ventura County Sheriff's Ojai Valley Station Investigations Unit and primarily investigated property crimes and crimes against persons.

During my years with the Ventura County Sheriff's Department, I have several years of experience working uniformed patrol. I have worked in various custody assignments in the Ventura County Main Jail, Todd Road Jail, Branch Jail Honor Farm and the Ventura County Hall of Justice. I graduated from the Ventura County Criminal Justice Training Center and have attained Basic, Intermediate and Advanced Peace Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.) certifications.

During my employment with the Ventura County Sheriff's Department, I have received hundreds of hours of training in the detection and investigation of crimes, and apprehension of criminals who commit the crimes. I have had numerous hours of training related to the investigation of theft, robbery, burglary, fraud, computer crimes, forgery, identity theft, receiving stolen property, gang investigations, and homicides. This training was provided in part by the Ventura County Sheriff's Department, and several other P.O.S.T. approved organizations, including the California Narcotics Officers Association (CNOA), the Robert Presley Institute of Criminal Investigation, Los Angeles Regional Criminal Information Clearinghouse (LA CLEAR), California Homicide Investigators Association (CHIA) and other law enforcement agencies. I have received ongoing training from my employment with experienced property crimes, narcotics, sexual assault and robbery/ homicide investigators.

During my carcer, I have responded to and investigated many types of crimes against persons and property. I have investigated hundreds of criminal cases including burglaries, robberies, thefts, identity thefts, vehicle thefts, assaults, sexual assault cases, homicide and other criminal cases. I have experience interviewing suspects involved in various types of crimes and I have become familiar with the methods and practices employed by those suspects. Through my training and experience, I have become familiar with the tactics and methods employed by criminals.

I have read and continue to read legal periodicals dealing with the ever-changing laws related to, but not limited to, search and seizure, search warrants and Miranda. I have spoken with other Detectives and Investigators with extensive experience in the investigation of various crimes involving, but not limited to, burglary, arson, street gangs, homicide, robbery and sexual assault. I have learned the importance of crime scene management and preserving crime scene evidence. I have spoken with many victims and witnesses of various crimes as well as arrestees' of various crimes. I have successfully investigated, arrested and/or assisted in the prosecution of hundreds of people for crimes of violence, narcotics, burglaries, thefts and sexual assault / abuse.

I have assisted with the preparation as well as the execution of numerous search warrants. I have been present at numerous crime scenes when evidence was present and either assisted in the collection of evidence or personally collected the evidence. During previous assignments, I have been involved in numerous criminal investigations. I have learned about the importance of collecting items to identify both known and unknown suspects, and provide supporting evidence to witness, victim, and suspect statements. The investigations of those cases have led to the successful arrest and prosecutions of numerous felons.

## II. Suspicious Circumstances Call For Service:

On December 16, 2015, I became involved in this investigation when Sergeant Worthy, a fellow peace officer employed with the Ventura County Sheriffs Office, briefed me and told me there had been an officer involved shooting, in the City of Camarillo, County of Ventura.

Sergeant Worthy told me that at approximately 1153 hours on December 16, 2015, patrol deputies from the Ventura County Sheriff's Camarillo Station were dispatched to a
"suspicious subject" call in the area of Carmen Drive at Daily Drive, in the City of Camarillo, County of Ventura. A male caller had spoken to a sheriff's dissazcher and \$aid he "needed to die and wanted cops to come over so he can kill himself". Deputy Mah, whom I know as a fellow law enforcement officer, was on patrol in the City of Camarillo and encountered
Puring the altercation, that occurred in the area of the
intersection of Carmen Drive at Daily Drive,
Mah in an attempt to stab Deputy Mah. During the incident, Deputy Mah feared for his life and came at Deputy
fired his duty weapon at
who later succumbed to his injuries.

## III. Audio Footage of Call for Service

On December 16, 2015, at approximately 1615 hours, I received the audio recording for the reporting party who called dispatch and asked for the police to kill him. In listening to the recorded dispatch call, a mechanical voice indicated the date was "December 16, 2015, 11:50:28" The following is a summary of the phone conversation between the Sheriff's Dispatcher and the caller:

The dispatcher identified himself and asked the caller what he was reporting. The male caller told the dispatcher, "There's gonna be a crime at the 7-Eleven in Camarillo." The dispatcher asked if he meant at 255 Carmen Drive and the caller confirmed that was the location. The caller told the dispatcher that "Someone's gonna rob it (7-Eleven)." The dispatcher asked the caller how he knew someone was going to rob the store and the caller said, "Because it's me. I need cops over here to kill me." The caller continued and said, "I need to die." When the dispatcher asked the caller why he was saying that, the caller again asked, "Can you just send 'em over here?" The caller was insistent that the dispatcher send the police.

While the dispatcher entered the information, he asked the caller if he was "trying to make this like a suicide by cop type of situation?" The caller answered, "Well, I just need a gun to get this done with. Please." The dispatcher asked the caller, "What is your plan?" to which
the caller said, "No. I mean, seriously, just send 'em now." The dispatcher explained that the police would be sent, but asked the caller what he wanted to happen. The caller said, "For me to die." The dispatcher asked the caller if he was going to "threaten the officers to make them take action?" At this point, the caller said, "Look, there's a cop right here. I'm gonna go get it done." The caller carried the phone with him the dispatcher continued to ask questions, but the caller stopped answering the questions. Loud motor vehicle noise could be heard in the background.

The caller could be heard saying, "I'm serious, I need you to kill me." A male voice, presumably Deputy Mah, is heard saying, "Get out of my way." The caller said, "I need you to kill me man. I'm not gonna stop until you kill me." Motor vehicle noises could still be heard in the background. The caller said, "Look man, just do it for me, please." The dispatcher asked for the subject's name, but there was no answer. The only sounds on the call at this point were motor vehicle sounds.

A male voice yelled, "Close the fucking door! Close the door right now!" While the male voice yelled, the caller was saying, "Shoot me. Shoot me. Shoot me, shoot me. I'm gonna cut myself." The male caller pleaded with the officer and said, "Come on man, just kill me. Just kill me please. Why can't you just kill me? Please. Please kill me." The deputy was heard in the background saying, "Stop. Put the knife down." The caller said, "No. I'm not gonna kill you." The caller continued saying, "Yes, yes, shoot me, shoot me! What are you doing? Shoot me! Shoot me in the head, what are you doing?" The deputy could be heard in the background yelling multiple times, "Put the knife down! Put the knife down!" and "Get down on the ground!" The male caller continued to tell the officer to "Kill me!" The phone went silent and the dispatcher asked, "Hello?" before the phone disconnected. At the end of the recording, there was an electronic voice that stated, "December 16, 2015, 11:55:26".

## IV. Video footage of Incident

On $12 / 16 / 15$, I viewed video footage that was obtained from civilian witness, $\square$ who used his cell phone to video of a portion of the altercation between Deputy Mah and $\square$. The video was taken from inside of a vehicle, but in viewing it, I was able to see Deputy Mah and $\square$ on the northeast corner of Carmen Drive at Daily Drive. A knife is clearly visible in $\square$ right hand and a telephone in his right hand. Deputy Mah had his firearm in his right hand and he retreated backwards (north) as walked towards Deputy Mah with the knife out towards Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah retreated approximately twenty five yards and gained distance between himself and continued to hold the knife in a threatening manner in his right hand. Deputy Mah spoke to $\square$ and told him to drop the knife. $\square$ quickly charged at Deputy Mah and held the knife in such a manner that it appeared he would strick Deputy Mah with the knife once he closed the distance enough to strike Deputy Mah. When $\square$ was within ten feet of Deputy Mah, Deputy Mah fired four shots with his duty weapon. The video was obstructed temporarily by an interior panel of the vehicle, but when Deputy Mah and $\square$ were again visible, I could see $\square$ continued to close the distance and he had the knife extended towards Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah fired an additional two rounds at $\square$ while they were within two to three feet of each other. Deputy Mah was moving backwards still and he stumbled, falling onto his back on the edge of the east curb of Carmen Drive. As Deputy Mah got up from the ground, $\square$ came towards him still, but he collapsed in the roadway. The video ended with Deputy Mah approaching $\square$ with his weapon still drawn on $\square$. The occupants of the vehicle could be heard asking each other what they should do.

## V. Location to be searched

I personally ran a California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) inquiry and learned that as of April, 2015, $\square \square$ listed his home address a


Detective Curtin, whom I know as a fellow law enforcement officer, told me the following: On December 16, 2015, Detective $\square$, whom I also know as a fellow law enforcement officer, conducted an internet search to determine if $\square$ had listed any prior residences. It was discovered that in the City of Camarillo, County of Ventura as his address.

Detectives from the Camarillo Police Station went to $\square$ noticed the residence appeared abandoned and run down. Detective Miller contacted Ventura Police Officer Therrien, who lived near VPD Officer Therrien knew who was and stated he lived at parents moved out of the residence approximately three months Therrien stated tha $\square$ ago to an unknown location in the State of Oregon. Officer Therrrien was aware that was "Squatting" at the residence at $\square$ Place ever since the parents moved out. Officer Therrien said he last saw the residence approximately five days ago.

Detective Rettura, whom I know as a fellow law enforcement officer, contacted a neighbor to the west of $\longrightarrow$ Place. Detective Rettura related that the neighbor knew who and that his parents used to live in the residence of
Place. The neighbor said they knew him there approximately a week ago. The neighbor stated they knew when $\square$ was at the residence because she could hear him riding to and from the residence on his skateboard. On 12/15/15, the neighbor heard the front door of Place close and the sound of someone riding a skateboard away from the residence. The neighbor believed the person on the skateboard was $\square$

## VI. Request for Sealing Order

The contents of this affidavit may tend to identify information that would be sensitive to the criminal investigation. There exists an overriding interest that overcomes the right of public access to the record and the overriding interest supports sealing the record. A substantial probability exists that the overriding interest will be prejudiced if the record is not sealed.

I respectfully request that this warrant be sealed pending further order of the Court. Without sealing, the affidavit and supporting documentation and warrant become a matter of public record within 10 days pursuant to Penal Code section 1523(a). Sealing is justified even against discovery by the defendant based on the governmental privilege that allows for the protection of the identity of the citizen and confidential informants pursuant to Evidence Code section 1041 [Swanson v. Superior Court (1989) 211 Cal. App. 3d 322]. The sealing requested herein, however, is not based on denying discovery to the defendants when and if they are charged, but is being requested to merely prohibit public disclosure which could surely undermine the continuing investigation herein.

## VII. Opinions and Conclusions

Based on the facts set forth in this affidavit, I have probable cause to believe that the felony crimes of Penal Code Section 664/187 (attempted murder) and Penal Code section 245 (assault with a deadly weapon) occurred and that evidence thereof is located at the locations identified in the accompanying search warrant, based on the facts that $\square$ called the Ventura County Sheriff's Office Dispatch center on 12/16/15 and requested deputies come to kill him. Upon eeing a patrol vehicle, he stood in front of it and forced a confrontation with the deputy. During the incident, the deputy drew his weapon and ordered the subject to comply and drop his knife. Irew a knife, held it out towards the deputy and asked the deputy to kill him. As ointed the knife at the deputy and quickly closed the distance, the deputy, fearing for his life, fired his weapon and struck

Based on my training and experience, it is my opinion that evidence will be located in the residence of $\square$ Place indicating $\square$ motive behind assaulting a police officer in the hopes of creating a "suicide by cop" scenario.

I request Night Service of this warrant because the investigation is still ongoing and it is currently dark outside. I also request night service based on the fact that waiting until morning will involve shift changes of uniformed officers who are currently being used to secure the area and prevent contamination of the crime scene and will result in chain-of-custody problems, which will be minimized by a prompt search.

Based on the totality of the information contained within this affidavit, I respectfully request that this Search Warrant for the aforementioned and described locations be granted.

Once the protective sweep was conducted, the residence was secured until the search warrant was approved at approximately 1930 hours.

At approximately 1940 hours a detail of investigators approached the residence to conduct the search. Present for the service of the warrant were: Sgt. Ryan Clark, Dets. Rettura, B. Miller, P. Hawthorne, N. Soler, and S. Michalec. Sheriff's BI also assisted. NOTE: there was no electrical power to the residence and supplemental lighting was provided by the Sheriff's technical unit.

Det. Miller made an announcement and we conducted another protective sweep of the residence prior to starting the search. The residence was unlocked and no force was used to enter. The residence appeared to be vacant and was littered with trash and debris. The rear sliding glass door was also unlocked and appeared to be off the rails. Once the protective sweep was completed, the BI unit took photos of the residence prior to starting the search.

The search was conducted without incident and various items stipulated in the warrant were collected, See Sgt. Clark's search warrant inventory for a detailed list of items.

A notice of search warrant service was left at the residence and Bl conducted exit photos. The doors to the residence were unable to be locked, but they were closed at the conclusion of the search warrant.

## STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

## I. AFFIANT'S EXPERIENCE

I, Sergeant Dean E. Worthy, am employed as a Detective with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office. I have been working as a full-time sworn California peace officer for approximately 19 consecutive years. I am currently assigned to the Special Services Division's Major Crimes Bureau as a Detective-Sergeant in the homicide unit. Prior to my current assignment, I worked patrol in every contract city and all of the unincorporated areas within the Ventura County Sheriff's Office's jurisdiction. Some of my prior assignments include: Detention Services-Classification Deputy; Traffic Collision Investigator; Motorcycle Officer, K-9 Handler, Housing Supervisor at the Todd Road Jail Facility; Financial Crimes Investigator assigned to the Major Crimes Bureau; Senior Deputy Homicide Detective-Major Crimes Bureau; Watch Commander at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility and Patrol Sergeant assigned to East County Patrol Services.

I am a graduate of the Ventura County Criminal Justice Training Center, where I completed over 800 hours of classroom instruction, which included the investigation of homicides, assaults, robberies and other violent crimes against persons. I have also received continuous training while working closely with experienced homicide, robbery/assault and narcotics investigators. I currently hold an Advanced P.O.S.T. certificate. I have completed over 80 hours of specialized instruction for investigators at San Diego's Regional Training Center's Institute of Criminal Investigations. Additionally, I have completed over 80 hours of specialized training and instruction for homicide investigations at the South Bay Regional Public Safety Training Consortium. I have personally investigated multiple Officer Involved Shooting incidents and have completed over 16 hours of specialized training and instruction in this field.

[^3]The expertise I developed in my various assignments has led to my selection as a Detective Sergeant in the Major Crimes Bureau, responsible for the investigation of homicides; as well as suspicious deaths, robberies, assaults, sex crimes and major financial crimes cases.

## II. STATEMENT OF FACTS:

Based on the facts and opinions set forth below, I have probable cause to believe that the felony crime of attempted murder pursuant to California Penal Code 664/187, has been committed, and that evidence thereof is located at the locations identified in the accompanying search warrant, based on the following facts:

Note: Any mention of an officer, deputy, sergeant or detectives in this affidavit are known to me personally as law enforcement officers in the County of Ventura, State of California.

On Dec. 16, 2015, at approximately 1200 hours, I was working as detective for the Special Services Division's Major Crimes Bureau as a Homicide Sergeant. I was at our office, located a 5177 Camino Ruiz in Camarillo when Major Crimes Captain M. came to my desk and informed me that an officer involved shooting had just occurred on Daily Dr. and Carmen Dr. within the incorporated City of Camarillo.

I quickly responded to the scene and implemented the Incident Command System and assumed the responsibility of case agent with this investigation. Upon my arrival, I spoke with Patrol Sergeant G. , who was the primary patrol supervisor on scene. Sergeant informed me that Deputy Leon Mah had been involved in a shooting with a suspect who had been armed with a knife near the intersection of Carmen Dr. and Daily Dr. The suspect, whom was still unidentified as this point, had been transported to the Los Robles Emergneyc Room in Thousand Oaks for gunshot injuries. Sergeant G. told me the second deputy to arrive on scene was Deputy C. Loes. Sergeant G. explained that Deputy Loes rode inside AMR's amb with the suspect to the emergency room.

Major Crimes Detectives Peterson and Ambarian responded to Los Robles Hospital to check on the status of the suspect. I was informed by Sergeant Peterson that the suspect had been pronounced deceased at approximately 1228 hours by emergency room personnel.

Crime Scene Investigation Technicians from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office's Bureau of Identification were sent to the Los Robles Emergency Room to photograph the suspect and collect clothing and other items of evidentiary value, which may have been on the suspect's person when he was brought into the emergency room.

At the scene of the shooting. was informed by Major Crimes Detective H. that the suspect was possibly
 Detective
Dajor Crimes Detective $H$. explained that the suspect had taken a landline cordless telephone from the 7-11 convenience store (located at 255 Carmen Dr.) prior to the shooting and sheriff's dispatch advised a good portion of the incident was captured/recorded on the 911 call. Detective had learned that $\square$ has had similar incidents involving him borrowing the cordless phone at $7-11$ in recent weeks. Patrol Sergeant G. had explained to me that $\square$ was arrested within the last couple of weeks for theft and resisting arrest. Though Patrol Sergeant G. $\quad$ was not certain, he felt strong that the suspect with the knife who Deputy Mah encountered was most likely $\quad$. A booking photograph of $\square$ was sent to Detectives Ambarian and Peterson at Los Robles Hospital. Both Detective Ambarian and Peterson advised the suspect who was deceased at Los Robles Hospital was , based on the photograph I had sent them.

Additionally, survei bameras from the 7-11 convenience store captured inside the business. A "still shot" (or photograph) was taken of the video depicting a picture of standing at the counter. This photograph was uploaded to investigators' cell phones and dispersed via text message. This photo, which clearly depicts not only face, but also showcased the clothing which he was wearing prior to the shooting. This photograph was sent to Detectives Ambarian and Peterson. Sergeant Peterson called and told me the person in the photograph was $\square$; the person he was with at the hospital, who had been transported by AMR and had been pronounced deceased.

Shortly after the shooting incident, Deputy Mah was sequestered and transported to the Camarillo Police Station by Camarillo Special Enforcement Unit Sergeant Tennesson. Deputy Mah had yet to provide a statement to investigators as to what had transpired. Due to the time of day; middle of the day, on a weekday, and one of the busiest intersections within Camarillo, there was a significant number of witnesses. Investigators identified approximately 50 to 60 eye witnesses who saw some portion of the incident, or the whole incident entirely.

Witness statements were quite consistent; that being that the suspect was armed with a knife and charged at the deputy. Witnesses accounts of what transpired indicate the deputy had to shoot the suspect in self-defense to avoid being stabbed.

## SUMMARY OF VIDEO FROM WITNESS <br> CELL PHONE

Investigators quickly learned that had armed himself with a kitchen-style knife and attempted to stab Deputy Mah. Major Crimes Detective Sergeant R. Clark informed me that a witness recorded the incident from his cellular telephone. Sergeant Clark explained that the witness, identified a consented to allowing detectives to download the footage from his cellular telephone and retain it as evidence in this case. Sergeant Clark and Major Crimes Detective S. Jenkins extracted the video from cell phone.

I watched the video from the Major Crimes' Mac-Computer from inside the Sheriff's Command Post. (Note: the video is of rather good quality and the incident unfolds rather quickly, as the video is only 47 seconds in length from start to finish. Additionally, the video does not show the initial contact Deputy Mah has with when he (Deputy Mah) first arrives on scene).

The following is a synopsis of what the video depicts:
Deputy Mah and can be seen standing on the sidewalk at the northeast corner of Carmen Dr. and Daily Dr. Deputy Mah was facing in a southeast direction and was facing toward him in a northwest direction. It appeared Deputy Mah and were standing about 10 to 20 feet away from each other. Dad a black phone in his left hand with his left arm bent at the elbow, with the phone resting near the left side of his chest. had a knife in his right and it appeared he had his right arm extended toward the ground. The knife had a silver blade, which appeared to be about four to six inches in length. was holding the knife with a "hammer fist" type grip with the blade of the knife pointed up near his thumb and pointer finger.

Deput Mah's marked black and white police vehicle (Chevy Tahoe) was positioned on the east curb line of the northbound lanes of Carmen Dr. and it was facing northbound. The rear of the police vehicle was about 10 to 20 feet away from Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah and move north along the sidewalk (with Deputy Mah walking backward and walking forward; toward Deputy Mah) and eventually come to rest about 40 to 50 yards north near a 40 MPH speed sign.
bent his right elbow and held the knife pointed toward Deputy Mah at the right side of his $\square$ chest. Deputy Mah unholstered his firearm and held the firearm down to his side in his right hand. Deputy Mah and were standing about 10 to 20 feet away from each other.

To aid in one's understanding of the sequence of events as it pertains to time elapsing, I will break down the events in increments of time; as the incident evolves throughout the 47 second video.

0004 to 0008 sec - $\square$ walked several steps toward Deputy Mah. $\square$ moved his right hand (with the knife) up and down with the blade pointed toward Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah took several steps backwards as $\qquad$ moved toward him. forward steps were longer in stride than Deputy Mah's backward steps.
 s was in closer proximity to Deputy Mah after taking the steps. Deputy Mah continued to have the firearm pointed down toward the ground. It appeared was talking to Deputy Mah as he stepped toward him. view.

0012 to 0016 sec - Deputy Mah was quickly moving or skipping backwards with the firearm pointed at an angle toward is feet. ran toward Deputy Mah and Deputy Mah pointed the firearm at him. They were about 4 to 7 feet away from each other. (The camera's view came from the driver's side windows of $\square$ 's vehicle).

0016 to 0018 sec - leaned forward and took several long strides toward Deputy
Mah. was holding the knife in his right hand with the blade pointed down toward the ground. Deputy Mah backed up quickly.

0018 to 0020 secstopped, stood up straight, and kept facing Deputy Mah with the knife in his riaht hand. Deputy Mah kept moving backwards and created additional distance from (about 10 to 15 feet, approximately).

0020 to 0024 sec - took several steps backwards or away from Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah used his handheld radio and took several steps forward. (Occupants in 's vehicle turned the music off so audio could be heard).

0024 to 0026 sec - Deputy Mah told to get on the ground and continued pointing his firearm at him. $\square$ took several quick steps toward him with the knife in his right hand.

0026 to 0028 sec - Deputy Mah told to put the knife down. leaned forward and ran toward Deputy Mah. had the knife extended behind him and to his right side as if he were getting ready to thrust it forward. Deputy Mah took several steps backwards and used his firearm to fire one round at as he was about 3 to 6 feet away from Deputy Mah.

0028 to 0029 sec - Deputy Mah kept moving backwards. leaned forward by bending at the waist with his head at about waist high and kept moving forward toward Deputy Mah. After a brief pause, Deputy Mah fired two additional rounds at as he was about 2 to 4 feet away from Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah kept moving quickly backward and kept moving quickly forward toward Deputy Mah.

0029 to 0032 sec - Deputy Mah and moved out of sight (or camera view) because the rear driver's side pillar of 's vehicle was blocking the camera's view. Two additional gunshots can be heard.

0032 to 0033 sec - Deputy Mah and Deputy Mah was stepping backwards and come back into view out the rear window. ._coninued lo lean forward and move toward Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah fired one additional round at The distance was about 2 to 4 feet.

0033 to 0035 sec - Deputy Mah stepped off the curb. Deputy Mah fell backwards with his back landing on the edge of the curb and the gutter. Deputy Mah rolled onto his right side, rolled onto his knees, and stood up in the street.
 kept leaning forward and moving forward. $\qquad$ moved toward the street and fell forward in the street.

0035 to 0047 sec - Deputy Mah stood near and pointed his firearm at him. laid on his stomach on the street/asphalt and did not move. Deputy Mah took a couple of steps away from him. The video ends at this point.

Emergency Medical Personnel were summoned and medics from American Medical Response Engine \#492 transported
 to Los Robles Emergency Room. was pronounced deceased at approximately 1228 hours.

Sheriff's Major Crimes Detective Sergeant W. Therrien was responsible for the Crime Scene. Sergeant Therrien, along with CSI Technicians, processed the Crime Scene for items of evidentiary value. Sergeant Therrien reported to me that they located and recovered (6) spent shell casings on the ground where the shooting occurred. Also located and collected from the scene was a single "mushroomed" bullet.

At the Emergency Room, Sheriff's Investigators and Crime Scene Investigations technicians located a spent bullet which came from body. (Unknown if the bullet was trapped in his clothing, but the bullet was recovered from person at the emergency room).

## SUMMARY OF 911 CALL PLACE BY

Detective H. contacted Sheriff's Dispatch and requested the audio file from the 911 phone call placed be forwarded to my department email. I received the audio file via email and played the diaital recording of the 911 phone call. A break-down of the 911 phone call placed by is as follows:

On Dec. 16, 2015, at 1150 hours, Ventura County Sheriff's Dispatch received a 911 call from a male subject. The assigned Dispatcher was The male caller ( ) had called from landline telephone I The telephone was registered to the 7-11 convenience store located at 255 Carmen Drive within the incorporated City of Camarillo.

During the 911 call, Camarillo. stated someone was going to "rob" the store. When asked by Dispatcher Lowe who was going to commit the robbery, $\square$ said he ( was going to rob the store. stated, "I need cops over here to kill me, I need to die." Dispatcher Lowe asked $\square$ why and $\square$ said, "Just send the cops over, so I can kill myself."

Dispatcher Lowe asked which replied, "I need a gun to get this done with, please send them now."


Note: As Dispatcher was entering this information into his computer to forward to West County Patrol Radio, Deputy Leon Mah \#4478, assigned that __ Camarillo Patrol as (8A11 - Eight Adam Eleven) just happened to be in the same vicinity as 3, prior to the complete 911 call being dispatched to Camarillo patrol units.

Based upon witness statements, coupled with video of the event; which was captured by Witness $\square$ 's cell phone, it is evident at this point in the conversation between Dispatcher Lowe and $\square$ that Deputy Mah arrives on scene.

Though exchange between $\square$ and Deputy Mah can be heard:

Deputy Mah told $\square$ to get out of the way.
said, "I need you to kill me, I need you to kill me man."
Deputy Mah told $\square$, "Get over there (INAUDIBLE)." Note: There is vehicular traffic noise heard in the background.
said, "Look man, just do it for me, please, please."
A sound consistent with the noise of a car door opening or closing is heard.
Deputy Mah yelled, "Close the fucking door, close the door right now, close the door, close the door, close the door."
said, "Shoot me please, shoot me, shoot me, shoot me, shoot me."
said, "I'm going to cut myself, no hold on man, just kill me. Just kill me please, why can't you just kill me, please, please kill me, stop just kill me,"

Deputy Mah said, "Put the knife down."
said, "No I'm not going to kill you."
Based on video surveillance, it is about this point in the verbal exchange when Deputy Mah unholsters and removes his firearm.
said, "Yes, yes, shoot me, shoot me, what are you doing, shoot me, shoot me in the head, what are you doing?

Deputy Mah yelled, "Put the knife down, put the knife down!"

Deputy Mah broadcasted over his radio, "One at gunpoint." Deputy Mah is then heard yelling at to get on the ground.
said, "Kill me, kill me,"
Deputy Mah yelled, "Put the knife down."
The audio ends at this point in the exchange as apparently $\square$ either hung up the phone or the connection was lost due to the phone being damaged. Based on damage to the phone and injuries sustained to Is left hand, it is quite possible the one of the bullets from Deputy Mah's gun struck the phone as $\quad$ was holding it.

Detective H . $\square$ tasked Dispatcher R. Cortez from the Advanced Real Time Information Center (ARTIC) with obtaining as much information as possible regarding ; including prior police contacts, criminal history and other information which may help investigators learn what triggered $\square$ to commit this attack. In doing so, investigators learned had a history of arrests for theft, burglary, drug possession, drug use and resisting arrest.

Dispatcher Cortez conducted a Facebook (FB) search and found FB profile, under the name $\square$ out of Camarillo. Dispatcher Cortez found that although L was not very active on FB, he had posted a photo of himself as recent as Dec. 9, 2015. In searching $\square$ FB photos, Dispatcher Cortez found depictions of holding a handgun. (See below photos).


I later logged into Facebook.com and located Bryan $\square$ Facebook account. While viewing his account, I determined his Facebook ID Number was his ID Number is used by Facebook.com to identify each account within their system. Not being able to access FB as a "friend" I am unable to view his posts, comments and or additional photos he has sent to other FB "friends" of his.

## ADDITIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

It was paramount that investigators determine whether or not that this was an isolated incident which involved only . It would be irresponsible for investigators to simply assume that this was an isolated incident and that $\square$ acted alone in this assault against a uniformed deputy sheriff. With the current climate in the United States regarding hate and discontent toward law enforcement officers and government agents/officials, investigators became concerned about the possibility that this may have been a planned or even rehearsed event and I considered the possibility that
may have had one, or potentially even more accomplices. Conversely, I could not assume that assault against Deputy Mah was the only criminal act he had recently committed. I became concerned about the possibility that $\square$ may have already assaulted, injured or possibly even killed someone prior to his encounter with Deputy Mah.

## SERVICE OF SEARCH WARRANT AT CAMARILLO

For these reasons, I instructed Sergeant Tennesson and his team of investigators to respond to a residence associated with $\square$; $\square$ in Camarillo. Investigators obtained information that $\square$ parents, including his father and stepmother, lived at that residence.

Detective Tennesson and his investigators responded to the residence and in looking through windows discovered the house was in disarray. Sergeant Tennesson and his team entered the residence through an unlocked door and conducted a safety sweep to ensure there were no victims inside. In doing so, Sergeant Tennesson determined the house was vacant; however, he observed anti-law enforcement graffiti' "Fuck the Police" in plain view inside the residence. Sergeant Tennesson spoke with a neighbor who explained that $\square$ has been staying or "squatting" in the house for the last couple of weeks. The neighbor said parents had moved out of state, possible Idaho, and that the residence on was foreclosed upon sometime ago. Feeling strongly that the residence could contain items of evidentiary value; specifically items which tend to show or demonstrate that $\square$ harbors feelings of discontent and hate toward law enforcement. And feeling strongly that such information could not only aid investigators in determining why
tried to kill a police officer, but could
potentially educate investigators and assist in preventing such attacks in the future; Major Crimes Detective S. Michalec authored a search warrant for the residence. The search warrant was reviewed and approved by the Honorable Judge Cody. In the evening hours of Dec. 16, 2015, Sergeant Clark and detectives from the Camarillo Police Station executed the search warrant. Anti-law enforcement graffiti was photographed and various writings were collected. To date, the writings have yet to be deciphered.

## HILLMONT INPATIENT PSYCHIATRIC UNIT (IPU)

Based on the circumstances surrounding $\square$ actions, I felt it likely that had possibly been taken on a 5150 Welfare and Institutions (W\&I) commitment by law enforcement in the past. However, research revealed no police agencies in our county had taken $\square$ on a $5150 \mathrm{~W} \& 1 \mathrm{l}$ hold. I considered the possibility that $\square$ may have admitted himself to Hillmont (IPU) on a "voluntary" basis. I also considered that had been a patient at Hillmont (IPU) he may have provided information to either staff members, psychiatrists and/or doctors that he wanted to harm or possibly even kill a police officer,

On Dec. 21, 2015, I spoke with Mark Stadler, the Program Administrator for the Ventura County Law Enforcement Crisis Intervention Team (CIT). I briefed Stadler on the circumstances surrounding the officer involved shooting. I explained my suspicions that may have been a prior patient/client at Ventura County Mental Health; also known as Hillmont Assessment and Referral; Hillmont Inpatient Psychiatric Unit (IPU); and simply Hillmont, potentially for behavioral or psychiatric issues. I told Stadler that based on records which had already been researched, neither the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, nor any of our neighboring police agencies have taken $\square$ on a 5150 Welfare and Institutions (W\&I) commitment. I asked Stadler if he would be able to contact Hillmont and determine whether or not had been a prior patient/client at their facility; perhaps in a "voluntary" capacity.

On Dec. 22, 2015, Stadler called me and advised he spoke with an employee of Hillmont named Mark. Mark explained to Stadler that although he was not at liberty to discuss patients and/or clients at Hillmont, he did say that should a law enforcement agency serve Hillmont with a subpoena or search warrant it would be beneficial to them because Hillmont did possess records regarding . In speaking with Mark, Stadler obtained Hillmont's custodian of records information and the method in which they receive legal process (as outlined in Location 2).

## III. OPINIONS AND CONCLUSIONS:

Based on my education, training, experience and investigation in this case, I believe there is probable cause establishing that the crime of California Penal Code

664/187 (attempted murder) has been committed: and that evidence of that crime could potentially be contained within the records at Facebook.com and Hillmont.

## FACEBOOK RECORDS

Facebook is a way for individuals to share information with other people within a specific group, known on the website as "friends." Facebook is also a way for individuals to store digital images and videos on the Facebook system: I believe that the above listed Facebook accounts may contain information about and his assault against a uniformed police officer. Through training and experience, I know that individuals store messages, photographs, and chat logs to share with other individuals on Facebook.com.

The Facebook records may also contain information which may assist investigators in identifying additional suspects or witnesses. Through training and experience, I know that Facebook.com maintains digital/electronic communications, email, digital images, friend lists, and private messages associated with a particular Facebook.com account.

## HILLMONT INPATIENT PSYCHIATRIC RECORDS

I know based on my education, training and experience that Hillmont, in conjunction with Ventura County Medical Center (VCMC), maintains records of patients or "clients" who are treated for psychiatric disorders. These records can be kept in either paper or electronic form. These records are maintained so that the patient or client can receive the highest level of care and so that staff members, therapists or doctors can establish a history of either an improvement or a decline in one's mental health. Without these records, treatment is essentially futile, as staff would have no way of knowing whether a patient is improving or not.

In prior major crimes cases I have investigated, I have learned that suspects who are treated at mental health facilities for suicidal ideations and even homicidal thoughts or urges often divulge such feelings and thoughts to facility staff. I also know from prior investigations that staff members often chronicle or document not only their clinical opinions, but specific statements their patients or clients make, such as threats of violence or plans of committing homicidal acts.

Often times in criminal investigations involving violent acts, specifically acts of violence against uniformed police officers and/or government agents/officials, investigators develop material information which illustrates that a suspect acted in concert with one or more suspects. It is important that investigators learn as much as possible about in an effort to establish that this deadly assault against a uniformed police
officer was not only an isolated incident, but that committed this crime on his own accord, and without assistance or perhaps even coercion from one or more suspects. Obtaining mental health records from Hillmont (IPU) may yield evidence of potential co-conspirators and/or may establish a plan he may have had to attack a uniformed police officer; be it to commit a "suicide by cop" scenario or potentially to carry out a planned assault against an officer.

## REQUEST FOR NON-DISCLOSURE ORDER

It is further requested that Facebook.com and Hillmont (IPU) refrain from directly or indirectly disclosing the existence of this Search Warrant or criminal investigation to the subscriber, or any other person, potentially associated with the FB account of or the treatment he received at Hillmont (IPU) for a period of 180 days from the execution of this search warrant. Disclosing the existence of this Search Warrant or criminal investigation to the subscribers, Facebook account holders, or others associated with cold potentially hinder this investigation by alerting individuals who could be suspects yet to be identified or discovered, leading to the possible destruction or tampering of evidence.

## REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF FILING RETURN TO SEARCH WARRANT

I know from my experience it typically takes Facebook.com and Hillmont (IPU) weeks and in some cases months to comply with legal process or search warrants seeking account, business or medical records; particularly when search warrants seek records that are voluminous, in the various forms of data that are requested; which may be the case here. I also know that on occasion Facebook.com and Hillmont (IPU) maintain records which are contained in an archived condition or capacity, which also adds to the time it takes for those businesses or entities to comply with legal process. I have authored prior search warrants seeking Facebook records during prior investigations and have rarely, if ever, obtained a complete version of these records in less than a 10 period. I therefore seek an order extending the deadline for the filing of the return to this search warrant to a date ten days following the compliance with this warrant by all responding parties, or ten days following any order unsealing the warrant, whichever is later.

## REQUEST FOR SEALING ORDER

I respectfully request that this warrant be sealed pending further order of the Court. Without sealing, the affidavit and supporting documentation and warrant become a matter of public record within 10 days pursuant to Penal Code section 1523(a). Sealing

## BACKGROUND

On December 16, 2015, I was assigned as a detective in the Ventura County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Bureau and assisted with an officer involved shooting investigation which occurred earlier in the at the intersection of Carmen Drive at Daily Drive in the city of Camarillo. I later learned the suspect had assaulted the officer by brandishing a knife and the officer shot him. The suspect died as a result of his injuries. The suspect was identified as The officer was identified as Ventura County Deputy Sheriff Leon Mah \#4478.

During the investigation, I learned a citizen withe a portion of the confrontation between onto his cellular phone. Refer to Detective Ram
 had used his cellular phone to video Mah. had the video saved ll report narrative, same RB\#, for details about his statement.

## CELLULAR PHONE DOWNLOAD

I contacted on Carmen Drive near the area of the command post about fifty yards north of Daily Drive. I asked I could take his phone to the major crimes office to download the video as evidence and he said yes. signed a consent form and gave me his phone.

I took the phone to the office and used the Cellebrite software program to download the video onto a memory drive. I found the phone was a black Samsung Galaxy S6 SM-G920P bearing phone number saved the video file as evidence on a computer. I left the video file on $\quad$ 's phone.



## Scene orientation

In the beginning of the video, Deputy Mah and can be seen standing on the sidewalk at the northeast corner of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive. Deputy Mah was facing in a southeast direction and was facing toward him in a northwest direction. It appeared Deputy Mah and were standing about 10 to 20 feet away from each other. had a black phone in his left hand with his left arm bent at the elbow with the phone resting near the left side of his chest. had a knife in his right hand and it appeared he had his right arm extended toward the ground. The knife had a silver blade and it appeared to be about four to six inches in length. $\square$ was holding the knife with a hammer fist with the blade of the knife pointed up near his thumb and pointer finger.

The marked police vehicle was parked on the east curb of the northbound lanes of Carmen Drive and it was facing north. The rear of the police vehicle was about 10 to 20 feet from Deputy Mah.

Music can be heard coming from Is vehicle. Can be heard making miscellaneous comments such as, "Oh my god, I can't believe this is happenng right now."

Deputy Mah and the suspect move north along the sidewalk and eventually come to rest about 40 to 50 yards north near a 40 mph speed sign.

## Suspect's and Deputy's actions during confrontation

I referenced the times between 0000 to 0047 seconds to correspond to the length of the video.
0000 to 0004 bent his right elbow and held the knife pointed toward Deputy Mah near the right side of his chest. Deputy Mah unholstered his firearm and held the firearm down to his side in his right hand. They were standing about 10 to 20 feet away from each other.

0004 to 0008 - walked several steps toward Deputy Mah. $\quad$ moved his right hand (with the knife) up and down with the blade pointed toward Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah took several steps backwards as moved toward him. Is forward steps were longer in stride than Deputy Mah's backward steps. was in closer proximity to Deputy Mah after taking the steps. Deputy Mah continued to have the firearm pointed down toward the ground. It appeared was talking to Deputy Mah as he stepped toward him.

0008 to 0012 - Deputy Mah and $\square$ walk behind the police vehicle and out of view.

0012 to 0016 - Deputy Mah was quickly moving or skipping backwards with the firearm pointed at an angle toward s feet. ran toward Deputy Mah and Deputy Mah pointed the firearm at him. They were about 4 to 7 feet away from each other. The cameras view came from the driver's side windows.

0016 to 0018 leaned forward and took several long strides toward Deputy Mah. $\square$ was holding the knife in his right hand with the blade pointed down toward the ground. Deputy Mah backed up quickly.

0018 to 0020 - stopped, stood up straight, and kept facing Deputy Mah with the knife in his right hand. Deputy Mah kept moving backwards and created additional distance from (about 10 to 15 feet, approximately).

The male also told Dispatch he wanted to kill himself. Deputies were dispatched to the area of Carmen Drive and Daily Drive in Camarillo. Immediately upon the arrival of the first unit, the male approached the deputy while holding a knife in his hand in a threatening manner. In fear for his life, the deputy pointed his firearm at the male and ordered the male to drop the knife several times. The male refused to comply with the deputy's request and charged at the deputy. The deputy discharged his firearm several times at the male.

Medical personnel transported the male subject to an area hospital, where he was pronounced dead. The deputy sustained minor injuries during the incident. Sheriff's Major Crimes are investigating the incident. The investigation is still on-going.

## Complaint Background

On December 16, 2015, Deputy Mah responded to a suicidal subject call in the city of Camarillo. Upon arrival, Mah contacted made statements that he wanted to die and was armed with a knife. Deputy Mah arrived and brandished a knife, made additional statements and advanced toward Deputy Mah. Deputy Mah shot and died as a result of his injuries.

## Review of Investigation


#### Abstract

I have reviewed the Ventura County District Attorney's Office report on their independent review of the shooting. The District Attorney's Office review included review and examination of 970 pages of reports, diagrams, and recordings of witness and deputy interviews along with a review of a 47 second cell phone video of the event. The Ventura County District Attorney's Office deemed Deputy Mah's shooting justified and determined he acted lawfully.

I have reviewed Sergeant Beckett's investigative report and agree with his opinions and conclusions. Sergeant Beckett's investigative report is based on the Major Crimes investigation and Deputy Mah's voluntary statement to detectives. The Major Crimes investigation revealed Deputy Mah was working a scheduled overtime shift in Camarillo. Deputy Mah attended briefing and was in full uniform driving a marked Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle and had handled insignificant calls prior to being dispatched to a suicidal subject call.


Deputy Mah responded to a suicidal subject call for service involving Sheriff's dispatch provided additional information about $\quad$ being suicidal and how he wanted to die. Deputy Mah arrived and contacted $\quad$. Deputv Mah used proper radio procedures and tactics when he arrived and contacted $\quad$. Initially, Deputy Mah drew his Taser as he got out of his patrol vehicle, but holstered and drew his weapon when he saw $\square$ was holding a knife.

During the incident, Deputy Mah confirmed $\quad$ was suicidal and saw he was armed with a knife. Deputy Mah tried to retreat and verbally asked $\quad$ to comply. refused to cooperate, continued to advance toward Deputy Mah as he ( ) brandished a knife. At one point, began to run toward Deputy Mah and Deputy Mah fired several rounds at $\square$. over 100 feet in 24 second as $\square$ The investigation showed Deputy Mah retreated failed to comply with commands and continued to act aggressively as he brandished a knife and appeared intent on harming Deputy Mah.

When Deputy Mah responded, he had a professional bearing, used acceptable officer safety tactics, gave numerous verbal commands to comply, was aware of force options, and tried to slow the event. $\quad$ refused to comply, continued to advance toward Deputy Mah and clearly wanted to harm Deputy Mah.

Deputy Mah's actions were lawful and within local, state, federal use of force practices. Deputy Mah did not violate any Ventura County Sheriff's Office policies, procedures or common patrol practices as he responded to the call, during the incident and after shooting

## Use of Force

### 300.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This policy provides guidelines on the reasonable use of force. While there is no way to specify the exact amount or type of reasonable force to be applied in any situation, every member of this department is expected to use these guidelines to make such decisions in a professional, impartial and reasonable manner.

### 300.1.1 DEFINITIONS

Definitions related to this policy include:
Deadly force - Force reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.
Force - The application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents or weapons to another person. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed or restrained.

### 300.2 POLICY

The use of force by law enforcement personnel is a matter of critical concem, both to the public and to the law enforcement community. Deputies are involved on a daily basis in numerous and varied interactions and, when warranted, may use reasonable force in carrying out their duties.
Deputies must have an understanding of, and true appreciation for, their authority and limitations. This is especially true with respect to overcoming resistance while engaged in the performance of law enforcement duties.
The Department recognizes and respects the value of all human life and dignity without prejudice to anyone. Vesting deputies with the authority to use reasonable force and to protect the public welfare requires monitoring, evaluation and a careful balancing of all interests.

### 300.2.1 DUTY TO INTERCEDE

Any deputy present and observing another deputy using force that is clearly beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances shall, when in a position to do so, intercede to prevent the use of unreasonable force. A deputy who observes another employee use force that exceeds the degree of force permitted by law should promptly report these observations to a supervisor.

### 300.3 USE OF FORCE

Deputies shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the deputy at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.
The reasonableness of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable deputy on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that deputies are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation a deputy might encounter, deputies are entrusted to use well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident.
It is also recognized that circumstances may arise in which deputies reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or methods provided by the Department. Deputies may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidiy unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be reasonable and utilized only to the degree that reasonably appears necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.
While the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter is to avoid or minimize injury. nothing in this policy requires a deputy to retreat or be exposed to possible physical injury before applying reasonable force.

### 300.3.1 USE OF FORCE TO EFFECT AN ARREST

Any peace officer may use reasonable force to effect an arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his/her efforts by reason of resistance or threatened resistance on the part of the person being arrested; nor shall a deputy be deemed the aggresscr or lose his/her right to self-defense by the use of reasonable force to effect the arrest, prevent escape or to overcome resistance (Penal Code § 835).

### 300.3.2 FACTORS USED TO DETERMINE THE REASONABLENESS OF FORCE

When determining whether to apply force and evaluating whether a deputy has used reasonable force, a number of factors should be taken into consideration, as time and circumstances permit. These factors include, but are not limited to:
(a) Immediacy and severity of the threat to deputies or others.
(b) The conduct of the individual being confronted, as reasonably perceived by the deputy at the time.
(c) Deputy/subject factors (age, size, relative strength, skill level, injuries sustained, level of exhaustion or fatigue, the number of deputies available vs. subjects).
(d) The effects of drugs or alcohol
(e) Subject's mental state or capacity.
(f) Proximity of weapons or dangerous improvised devices.
(g) The degree to which the subject has been effectively restrained and his/her ability to resist despite being restrained.
(h) The avalability of other options and their possible effectiveness.
(i) Seriousness of the suspected offense or reason for contact with the individual.
(0) Training and experience of the deputy.
(k) Potential for injury to deputies, suspects and others.
(l) Whether the person appears to be resisting, attempting to evade arrest by fight or is attacking the deputy.
(m) The risk and reasonably foreseeable consequences of escape.

## Use of Force

(n) The apparent need for limmediate control of the subject or a prompt resolution of the situation.
(o) Whether the conduct of the individual being confronted no longer reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat to the deputy or others:
(p) Prior contacts with the subject or awareness of any propensity for violence.
(q) Any other exigent circumstances.

### 300.3.3 PAIN COMPLIANCE TECHNIQUES

Pain compliance techniques may be effective in controlling a physically or actively resisting individual. Deputies may only apply those pain compliance techniques for which they have successfully completed department-approved training. Deputies utilizing any pain compliance technique should consider:
(a) The degree to which the application of the technique may be controlled given the level of resistance.
(b) Whether the person can comply with the direction or orders of the deputy.
(c) Whether the person has been given sufficient opportunity to comply.

The application of any pain compliance technique shall be discontinued once the deputy determines that compliance has been achieved.

### 300.3.4 CAROTID CONTROL HOLD

The proper application of the carotid control hold may be effective in restraining a violent or combative individual. However, due to the potential for injury, the use of the carotid control hold is subject to the following:
(a) The deputy shall have successfully completed department-approved training in the use and application of the carotid control hold.
(b) The carotid control hold may only be used when circumstances perceived by the deputy at the time indicate that such application reasonably appears necessary to control a person in any of the following circumstances:

1. The subject is violent or physically resisting.
2. The subject, by words or actions, has demonstrated an intention to be violent and reasonably appears to have the potential to harm deputies, him/herself or others.
(c) The application of a carotid control hold on the following individuals should generally be avoided uniess the totality of the circumstances indicates that other available options reasonably appear ineffective, or would present a greater danger to the deputy, the subject or others, and the deputy reasonably believes that the need to control the individual outweighs the risk of applying a carotid control hold:
3. Females who are known to be pregnant
4. Elderly individuais
5. Obvious juveniles
(d) Any individual who has had the carotid control hold applied, regardiess of whether he/ she was rendered unconscious, shall be promptly examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel and should be monitored until examined by paramedics or other appropriate medical personnel.

(e) The deputy shall inform any person receiving custody, or any person placed in a position of providing care, that the individual has been subjected to the carotid control hold and whether the subject lost consciousness as a result
(f) Any deputy attempting or applying the carotid control hold shall promptly notity a supervisor of the use or attempted use of such hold.
(g) The use or attempted use of the carotid control hold shall be thoroughly documented by the deputy in any related reports.

### 300.4 DEADLY FORCE APPLICATIONS

Use of deadiy force is justified in the following circumstances:
(a) A deputy may use deadly force to protect him/herself or others from what he/she reasonably believes would be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.
(b) A deputy may use deadly force to stop a fieeing subject when the deputy has probable cause to believe that the person has committed, or intends to commit, a felony involving the infiction or threatened infiction of serious bodily injury or death, and the deputy reasonably believes that there is an imminent risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the subject is not immediately apprehended. Under such circumstances, a verbal waming should precede the use of deadly force, where feasible.

Imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous. An imminent danger may exist even if the suspect is not at that very moment pointing a weapon at someone. For example, an imminent danger may exist if a deputy reasonably believes any of the following:

1. The person has a weapon or is attempting to access one and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to use it against the deputy or another.
2. The person is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death without a weapon and it is reasonable to belleve the person intends to do so.

### 300.4.1 SHOOTING AT OR FROM MOVING VEHICLES

Shots fired at or from a moving vehicle are rarely effective. Deputies should move out of the path of an approaching vehicle instead of discharging their firearm at the vehicle or any of its occupants. A deputy should only discharge a firearm at a moving vehicle or its occupants when the deputy reasonably believes there are no other reasonable means available to avert the threat of the vehicle, or if deadly force other than the vehicle is directed at the deputy or others.
Deputies should not shoot at any part of a vehicle in an attempt to disable the vehicle.

### 300.5 REPORTING THE USE OF FORCE

Any use of physical force by a member of this department shall be documented completely and accurately in an appropriate report.
Physical force is defined as any physical contact with, or use of any lethal or less-iethal weapon against a person (or persons), where there is a reasonable potential for injury. For "hands-on" techniques, it does not include manual escorts but does include control holds. take-downs, strikes, etc. It also includes any deployment of a less-lethal weapon regardless of whether or not the person is actually struck or contacted. Examples include: baton strike (whether or not contact is made), discharge of OC at a person, Taser deployment (probes

fired at a person or drive stun), and less lethal shotgun discharge (whether or not contact is made).
Physically pointing a lethal firearm, less lethal shotgun, or Taser (with or without the laser) directly at a person is also considered a use of force under this policy and shall be accurately documented in an appropriate report: (Exceptions to this requirement may exist for specialty units during specific operations, such as SWAT or Narcotics units during the service of high risk search warrants, etc. Refer to individual unit policies for details.)
An appropriate report is a retrievable report that requires an assigned RB number (e.g. Arrest Report or incident Report). The only exception occurs within the Detention Services Division when documenting a use of force that does not result in an injury to a staff member or inmate and where there is no arrest associated with the incident. In such a case a Jail Incident Report (JIR) will suffice. In all other cases, a retrievable report (Crime Report, Afrest Report, or Incident Report) is required. A retrievable report (with an RB number) is required within the Detention Services Division any time OC is deployed or a Taser is deployed, i.e., the probes are fired and/or when the Taser is used in drive stun mode.

### 300.5.1 NOTIFICATION TO SUPERVISOR

Watch Commander and immediate supervisor notification shall be made as soon as practicable following the application of force in any of the following circumstance
(a) The application caused a visible injury.
(b) The application would lead a reasonable deputy to conclude that the individual may have experienced more than momentary discomfort.
(c) The individual subjected to the force complained of injury or continuing pain.
(d) The individual indicates intent to pursue litigation.
(e) Any application of a TASER device or control device.
(f) Any application of a restraint device other than handcuffs, shackles or belly chains.
(g) The individual subjected to the force was rendered unconscious.
(h) An individual was struck or kicked.
(i) An individual alleges any of the above has occurred.

### 300.5.2 ADMINISTRATIVE NOTIFICATION TO AREA CAPTAIN

In addition to watch commander and immediate supervisor notification a described above, specified uses of force require notification to the area/unit captain. The on-duty sergeant shall make this notification with a Use of Force Notfication Form, which may be sent to the area/unit captain via email. Absent extenuating circumstances or permission from the area/unit captain, the form shall be submitted by the end of the shift. (This notification process is for specified force incidents that do not fall under the provisions of Policy 310 -Critical Incidents and Shooting, Member Involved).
The specifics of when notification is required vary slightly between the Detention Services Division and the other divisions of the department and are outlined below.

### 300.5.3 USE OF FORCE NOTIFICATION TO AREA CAPTAIN IN PATROL AND FIELD ENVIRONMENTS

When any of the following occurs as a result of a use of force in a patrol/field environment, the Patrol/Field Operations Use of Force Notification Form shall be completed by the on-duty sergeant reviewing the use of force:

- Any force application resulting in visible injury or complaint of pain
- Any force application requiring medical treatment
- Any force application involving the Taser where probes were deployed or drive stun mode was used. Does not include Taser displaying/pointing (with or without laser) or sparking.
- Any baton strikes, less-lethal projecties, hand strikes, kicks, or use of unconventional weapons (l.e. vehicle ramming, flashlight strikes, etc.) where contact was made with the subject.
- OC deployment where OC spray contacts the subject.
- K9 bites or other situations where the K9 contacts an individual and causes injury or complaint of pain.


### 300.5.4 USE OF FORCE NOTIFICATION TO DETENTION SERVICES CAPTAIN

Per Detention Services Policy Manual Section 15, Chapter 6 (Use of Force Documentation \& Notification), all reportable force as defined under Section 300.5 of this policy requires completion of the Detention Services Use of Force Notification Form.

### 300.5.5 AREA CAPTAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

Area captains recelving a Use of Force Notification Form shall review the force incident for policy compliance and liability issues. In the event the captain believes the force incident is, or may be, out of compliance with policy, he/she shall forward his/her findings to the division commander for possible referral to the Internal Affairs captain for further review. When the matter is referred to Internal Affairs, the Use of Force Notification Form completed by the sergeant shall be included in the documentation.

### 300.5.6 PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS RESPONSIBILITIES

The Professional Standards captain (Audit and Inspections Unit) shall obtain a Use of Force Report monthly. The report is generated from the VCIJIS system and provides a department wide list of all reportable use of force by type, area, officer, etc. The Audit and Inspections Unit will review this report as a starting point to identify any potential trends or problems related to liability, training, policy issues, etc. Areas of concern will be reported to the Professional Standards commander for possible action. Additionally, the Audit and Inspections. Unit captain shall forward the Use of Force Report to the area captains monthly for their review.

### 300.5.7 REPORTING TO CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

The Records Manager or the authorized designee shall ensure that data required by the Department of Justice (DOJ) regarding all officer-involved shootings and incidents involving use of force resulting in serious bodily injury is collected and forwarded to the DOJ as required by Govemment Code \& 12525.2.

### 300.6 MEDICAL CONSIDERATION

Prior to booking or release, medical assistance shall be obtained for any person who exhibits signs of physical distress, who has sustained visible injury, expresses a complaint of injury or continuing pain, or who was rendered unconscious. Any individual exhibiting signs of physical distress after an encounter should be continuously monitored until heishe can be medically assessed.

Based upon the deputy's initial assessment of the nature and extent of the subject's injuries, medical assistance may consist of examination by fire personnel, paramedics, hospital staff or medical staff at the jail. If any such individual refuses medical attention, such a refusal shall be fully documented in related reports and, whenever practicable, should be witnessed by another deputy andjor medical personnel. If a recording is made of the contact or an interview with the individual, any refusal should be included in the recording, if possibie.
The on-scene supervisor, or if not available, the primary handling deputy shall ensure that any person providing medical care or receiving custody of a person following any use of force is informed that the person was subjected to force. This notification shall include a description of the force used and any other circumstances the deputy reasonably believes would be potential safety or medical risks to the subject (e.g. prolonged struggle, extreme agitation, impaired respiration).
Persons who exhibit extreme agitation, violent irrational behavior accompanied by profuse sweating, extraordinary strength beyond their physical characteristics and imperviousness to pain (sometimes called "excited delifium"), or who require a protracted physical encounter with multiple deputies to be brought under control, may be at an increased risk of sudden death. Calls involving these persons should be considered medical emergencles. Deputies who reasonably suspect a medical emergency should request medical assistance as scon as practicable and have medical personnel stage away if appropriate.

### 300.7 SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITY

When a supervisor is able to respond to an incident in which there has been a reported application of force, the supervisor is expected to:
(a) Obtain the basic facts from the involved deputies. Absent an allegation of misconduct or excessive force, this will be considered a routine contact in the normal course of duties.
(b) Ensure that any injured parties are examined and treated.
(c) Once any initial medical assessment has been completed or first aid has been rendered, ensure that photographs have been taken of any areas involving visibie injury or complaint of pain, as well as overall photographs of uninjured areas.
(d) Ensue potential witnesses are identified and interviewed.
(e) Ensure all reports are reviewed and approved.
(f) Determine the potential likelihood for civill 位gation. The supervisor should make notfication of a potential claim through the appropriate channels.
(g) Evaluate the circumstances surrounding the incident and determine if there is a question of policy non-compliance or if for any reason further investigation may be appropriate.
In the event that a supervisor is unable to respond to the scene of an incident involving the reported application of force, the supervisor is still expected to complete as many of the above items as circumstances permit.

## Investigator's Opinions and Conclusions

## I.A. \#15-135 (Deputy Leon Mah \#4478)

Investigator: Sergeant Mike Beckett

## Executive Summary:

This is a department initiated review of an officer involved shooting (OIS) involving Ventura County Sheriff's Deputy Leon Mah \#4478. The shooting occurred on December 16, 2015, at approximately 1152 hours, near the intersection on Carmen Drive and Daily Drive in the city of Camarillo.

This incident began when Citizen placed a 911 call and informed the dispatcher he was going to rob the 7-11 convenience store.
also stated during the call, "I need cops over here to kill me. I need to die."

Deputy Mah happened to be at this intersection stopped for a red light when the call was dispatched as a "suspicious subject." When the call was broadcast, Mah saw walking towards his patrol car. remained on the line with dispatch and told the operator, "There's a cop right here. I'm going to get it done." went to Mah's patrol car and stood in front. Mah told $\quad$ to walk to the side of the road and he complied.

Mah turned around and re-positioned his vehicle. As he did so, $\square$ was blocking his path so he instructed him to get out of the way. —_ instead told Mah, "I need you to kill me. I'm not going to stop until you kill me." _ went to the passenger side of Mah's vehicle and opened the door. Mah exited his vehicle and approached with hisTtaser drawn. Mah looked away at traffic briefly and when he looked back, was holding a knife up near his chest. Mah switched from his Taser to his handgun.

[^10]Medical personnel were immediately summoned and rendered aid to $\square$ at the scene and during transport to the hospital. $\square$ was declared deceased at the hospital.

A passenger in a nearby vehicle videotaped a significant portion of the incident using his cellular telephone. The footage reveals that Mah was backing away from $\square$ for about 24 seconds before firing his first shot. It shows that $\square$ advanced on Mah during the time that Mah was retreating. Measurements taken at the scene show that Mah retreated about 106 feet when he first his last shot at

Sheriff's Major Crimes thoroughly investigated this incident which included several witness interviews. I reviewed their investigative product and determined that no additional investigative work was needed to conduct an administrative review.

Note: Sheriff's Major Crimes submitted the findings of their investigation to the District Attomey's Office for review on October 21, 2016. On February 22, 2017, The District Attorney's Office provided a report of their findings of the incident. They concluded that the shooting of $\square$ by Mah was justified and not a criminal act.

## Policy Review:

Based on the information and the subsequent investigation, the aforementioned incident was reviewed in light of the following policy:

This administrative review revealed that it was lawful, reasonable, and within policy for Deputy Leon Mah to use deadly force by fining his handgun at $\square, \quad$, in order to protect himself from imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.

## Conclusion:

My conclusion is based on the following facts and opinions:

- On $12 / 16 / 2015$, attacked Deputy Leon Mah with a knife. Mah attempted to retreat but was unsuccessful. Mah fired several rounds at and killed him.
- The incident began when $\square$ called 911 and told the dispatcher that he was going to rob the 7-11 store and needed "cops over here to kill me. I need to die."
- When the call was broadcast over the radio, Mah just happened to be stopped at a nearby intersection. Before Mah could react, $\square$ closed the distance and confronted him.
- When spotted Mah in his patrol car, he told dispatch, "There's a cop right here. I'm going to get it done." All of 's comments to the 911 dispatcher reveal his suicidal mindset.
- $\square$ stopped in front of Mah's vehicle so he told $\square$ to move to the side of the road. complied.
- Mah turned around and repositioned his vehicle. As he did so, $\square$ stood in the way. Mah told him to move out of the way but instead of moving, $\square$ told him, "I need you to kill me. I'm not going to stop until you kill me."
- went to the passenger side of Mah's vehicle and opened the door. Mah exited his vehicle with his Taser drawn.
- Mah looked back and back momentarily and when he looked back to , he saw that was now holding a knife. Mah reacted by holstering his Taser and drawing his handgun.
- Mah repeatedly ordered to drop the knife and repeatedly told Mah to kill him.
- walked towards Mah while holding his knife up by his chest. Mah backed away from in an attempt to maintain a safe distance.
- $\quad$ r ran at him with his knife held in a manner that suggested he was going to attempt to stab Mah. Mah fired six rounds at $\quad$ while backing away from him. As Mah fired his sixth round as he slipped on the curb and fell over backwards.
- Mah notified dispatch of the shooting and medical personnel were summoned. was treated at the scene and also while being transported to the hospital. was pronounced dead at the hospital.
- A passenger in a vehicle stopped nearby videotaped a significant portion of the incident. The footage supported all of the facts stated above. The footage showed that Mah retreated for 24 seconds before firing his first shot at $\square$. It also shows that Mah retreated about 106 feet up to the point where the last shot was fired.
- The Ventura County District Attorney's Office thoroughly reviewed the entire investigative product produced by Sheriff's Major Crimes as a result of this incident. They determined that Mah was justified in shooting $\square$ and his actions were not criminal in any way.
- Mah's actions were reasonable and necessary. Mah was being assaulted by with a knife and Mah attempted to retreat with no success. Mah was justified in using deadly force because he believed he was in danger of being killed by and he feared for his own life.

I determined that Mah's actions during this incident were consistent with the Sheriff's Office Use of Force Policy.

While reviewing the audio recordings of the call being dispatched to patrol, I noticed that the dispatcher advised units that $\square$ "wanted to kill himself" rather than his actual comments of, II need cops over here to kill me. I need to die." The difference in wording is significant because police regularly go to calls of suicidal subjects and most of those subjects simply want help. In reality, advised dispatch that he wanted to die and he wanted a police officer to do it for him. "Suicide by cop" is a much more serious situation in my view because the emotions motivating the behavior are generally much stronger than mere depression. Subjects who attempt "suicide by cop" are typically armed and create situations which force police officers to react with deadly force.

While it is difficult to determine how the incident would have unfolded had Mah known 's actual words, dispatchers should be reminded to be more precise in relaying critical information like this.

In summary, Deputy Mah acted appropriately and courageously when faced with a life threatening situation. It is clear that $\square$ wanted to die and he wanted to force Mah to do it for him. Given the circumstances Mah was faced with, he would have been justified in firing sooner. Therefore, the force Mah used was lawful and appropriate for the circumstances he faced.

Deputy Mah's patrol vehicle was parked along the eastside curb of Carmen Drive just north of the Daily Drive intersection, as shown in the photograph below.

$\square$ 's skateboard was located near the back of Deputy Mah's patrol vehicle, as depicted in the photograph below, with the rear bumper of the patrol vehicle visible in the top of the photograph.


Various items of physical evidence were located at the scene and collected. These items included the knife $\quad$ wielded during the incident ${ }^{2}$, six spent shell casings, a bullet, blood droplets, and broken pieces of the cordless phone $\square$ used to call 911 .

The knife $\square$ brandished is depicted in the photographs below as it was located by detectives who responded to the scene and collected evidence.


Based on measurements taken at the scene and the location of various items of evidence, deputies were able to determine that advanced on Deputy Mah over a distance of approximately 106 feet as Deputy Mah retreated and ultimately fired shots.

The red line and arrow in the aerial photograph below depicts the approximate path took as he advanced on Deputy Mah with a knife in hand from just south of Deputy Mah's patrol vehicle to the point at which $\square$ fell to the ground. The firetruck and medical supply bags seen in the roadway in the photograph were not present at the time of the incident.

## B. Autopsy

An sutopsy was performed on $\square$ 's body on December 17, 2015, by Dr. Ann Bucholtz, a forensic pathologist and former Medical Examiner for the Ventura County Medical Examiner's Office. Dr. Bucholtz located a total of seven gunshot wounds to - body, two of which appear to have been caused by a single bullet. Dr. Bucholtz identified the following gunshot wounds to body and corresponding internal injuries:

1) a gunshot wound to s upper mid back resulting in lacerations of the lung and rib fractures
2) a gunshot wound to 's left upper back resulting in lacerations of the lung and rib fractures
3) a gunshot wound to $\square$ left shoulder resulting subcutaneous injury to his upper back
left forearm, which Dr. Bucholtz determined might
4) a gunshot wound to be a reentry from another gunshot wound, resulting in subcutaneous injury without fractures
5) a gunshot wound to
6) a gunshot wound to left armpit resulting in lacerations of the lung, heart, and liver
7) a gunshot wound to 's left chest area resulting in lacerations of the lung, aorta, diaphragm and bowel.

> Four bullets were recovered from 's body during the course of the autopsy. For the bullets which were not recovered from within $\square$ 's body, there were corresponding exit wounds, indicating the bullets passed through $\square$ 's body.

In addition to the four expended bullets discovered during the autopsy, two additional bullets were located. One bullet was found at the shooting scene and another bullet was located by medical staff on the exterior surface of $\square$ 's abdomen. In total, six bullets recovered. These six bullets combined with the six shell casings found at the shooting scene, indicate that Deputy Mah fired a total of six shots during the incident.

Dr. Bucholtz concluded that died from multiple gunshot wounds and that the killing was a homicide, meaning a death at the hands of another.

## C. Toxicology Report

Samples of 's blood were collected during the autopsy performed by Dr. Bucholtz. Those samples were submitted for testing to NMS Labs, located in Pennsylvania. The test results revealed that $\square$ had Delta 9-Carboxy Tetrahydrocannabinol and Delta 9 Tetrahydrocannabinol, the principle psychoactive ingredients of marijuana/hashish, in his blood at the time of his death.

## IV.

## LEGAL PRINCIPLES

## A. Law of Homicide and Self-Defense

Homicide is the killing of one human being by another, either lawfully or unlawfully. Homicide encompasses murder and manslaughter, which are unlawful, and acts of excusable and justifiable homicide, which are lawful.

Homicide is justifiable when committed by any person "resisting any attempt to murder any person, or to commit a felony, or to do some great bodily injury upon any person." (Pen. Code § 197(1).)

CALCRIM 505 sets forth the specific jury instructions on self-defense. It provides that a person is not guilty of murder or manslaughter if 1) that person "reasonably believed that [the person] [or] someone else . . . was in imminent danger of being killed or suffering great bodily injury"; 2) that person "reasonably believed that the immediate use of deadly force was necessary to defend against that danger"; and 3) that person "used no more force than was reasonably necessary to defend against that danger." (Judicial Councll of California Criminal Juy Instructions (October 2016 Update), Calcrim 505.)

CALCRIM 505 further provides that in deciding whether that person's "beliefs were reasonable, consider all the circumstances as they were known to and appeared to [that person] and consider what a reasonable person in a similar situation with similar knowledge would have believed. If [that person]'s beliefs were reasonable, the danger does not need to have actually existed." It also provides that "[a person] is not required
to retreat. He or she is entitled to stand his or her ground and defend himself or herself and, if reasonably necessary, to pursue an assailant until the danger has passed. This is so even if safety could have been achieved by retreating." (Ibid.)

A killing by a peace officer is justifiable when it was "necessarily committed in overcoming actual resistance to the execution of some legal process, or in the discharge of any other legal duty" or "when necessarily committed in arresting persons charged with [a] felony, and who are fleeing from justice or resisting such arrest." (Pen. Code § 196.)

Police officers have a duty "to maintain peace and security" and "to protect citizens from harm." (Batts v. Superior Court (1972) 23 Cal.App.3d 435, 438.) A police officer may use deadly force when the circumstances create a reasonable fear of death or serious bodily injury in the mind of the officer. (Graham v. Conner (1989) 490 U.S. 386, 396397.) Reasonableness includes "allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second judgments-in circumstances that are tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving-about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation." (Ibid.)

Under the Fourth Amendment, police are "not required to use the least intrusive degree of force possible" but may use only such force as is objectively reasonable under the circumstances. (Forrester $v$. City of San Diego (9th Cir, 1994) 25 F.3d 804, 807.) An officer"s use of deadly force is reasonable only if "the officer has probable cause to believe that the suspect poses a significant threat of death or serious physical injury to the officer or others." (Tennessee v. Garner (1985) 471 U.S. I, 3.) Furthermore, "if police officers are justified in firing at a suspect in order to end a severe threat to public safety,
the officers need not stop shooting until the threat has ended." (Plumhoff v. Rickard (2014) 134 S.Ct. 2012, 2022.)
"The test of reasonableness in this context is an objective one, viewed from the vantage of a reasonable officer on the scene. It is also highly deferential to the police officer's need to protect himself and others." (Martinez $v$. County of L.A (1996) 47 Cal.App. 4 th 334, 343 (quoting Graham 490 U.S. at 396-397).) The reasonableness test requires careful attention to the facts and circumstances of each particular case, including: (1) "the severity of the crime at issue"; (2) "whether the suspect poses an immediate threat to the safety of the officers or others"; and (3) "whether [the suspect] is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight." (Graham, 490 U.S. at 396.)

## B. is Criminal Conduct

engaged in felony and misdemeanor criminal conduct immediately prior to the shooting. Had he survived, he could have been charged with the commission of the following crimes:

- Attempted Murder in violation of Penal Code section 664/187(a)
- Assault with a Deadly Weapon in violation of Penal Code section 245(a)(1)
- Assault with a Deadly Weapon on a Peace Officer in violation of Penal Code section 245 (c)
- Brandishing a Deadly Weapon in violation of Penal Code section 417 (a)(1)
- Resisting an Executive Officer in violation of Penal Code section 69
- Resisting, Obstructing, or Delaying a Peace Officer in violation of Penal Code section 148(a)(1).


## ANALYSIS

On December 16, 2015, repeatedly expressed a desire to die in the messages he sent to Jonathan Foote, in the statements he made to the 911 dispatcher, and in the statements he made to Deputy Mah. $\square$ told $\square$ via text message that he wanted to die, however, also wrote that he could not kill himself because be loved his father too much. It appears that, in lieu of taking his own life, $\square$ decided to create a scenario whereby he would behave in a threatening manner towards an armed peace officer in order to provoke a lethal response with the goal to commit suicide. When called 911, he informed the dispatcher he was about to commit a violent crime, specifically a robbery of the 7 -Eleven convenience store. $\square$ 's statement ensured that responding peace officers would perceive him as a potential threat. further specifically told the dispatcher he needed officers there to kill him. When asked if he was trying to create a suicide-by-cop situation, $\square$ replied, "I need cops over here to kill me...I need a gun to get this done with."

When observed Deputy Mah's patrol vehicle, he told the dispatcher, "There's a cop right here. I' m going to get it done," $\square$ then approached Deputy Mah's patrol vehicle on his skateboard. $\square$ forced Deputy Mah to confront him when $\square$ opened the passenger door to Deputy Mah's patrol vehicle. $\square$ told Deputy Mah, "You need to kill me" and "I'm not going to stop until you kill me." The latter statement would cause a reasonable officer in Deputy Mah's position to conclude that
intended to take any action necessary, up to and including killing the officer, if the officer did not use deadly force against him:
brandished a knife at Deputy Mah in a threatening manner, holding the knife in front of his body with the blade pointed up. proceeded to move towards Deputy Mah with the knife in hand, forcing Deputy Mah to walk backwards in order to avoid being stabbed. advanced on Deputy Mah, closing the distance between the deputy and himself while being armed with a weapon that could readily inflict great bodily injury or death. $\square$ ignored Deputy Mah's repeated commands to put down the knife and get on the ground. After stopping briefly and taking a few steps backwards, charged at Deputy Mah, lunging towards the deputy with the knife. Witnesses indicated that got to within a few feet of Deputy Mah before Deputy Mah fired the first shot. Given the proximity between the two men, $\square$ could easily have stabbed Deputy Mah, causing great bodily injury or death.


#### Abstract

After the first shot was fired, $\square$ continued moving towards Deputy Mah, still armed with the knife. Deputy Mah fired a total of six shots as $\square$ came at him, knife in hand. Even after all six shots had been fired, $\square$ took several additional steps towards Deputy Mah before collapsing to the ground.


's actions on December 16, 2015, constituted a number of crimes, including attempted murder, in violation of Penal Code section 664/187(a), assault with a deadly weapon, a violation of Penal Code section 245(a)(1), assauit with a deadly weapon on a peace officer, in violation of Penal Code section 245(c), resisting an executive officer, a
violation of Penal Code section 69, and resisting, obstructing, or delaying a peace officer, a violation of Penal Code section 148(a)(1).

Deputy Mah gave $\square$ multiple opportunities to cease his attack before Deputy Mah resorted to lethal force. ignored Deputy Mah's repeated commands to drop the knife and get on the ground. Deputy Mah backed up a substantial distance, at increased risk to his own safety, while $\square$ came towards him with the knife. When $\square$ quickly charged and lunged at Deputy Mah with the knife, Deputy Mah honestly and reasonably believed that $\square$ 's actions posed a significant threat of death or serious bodily injury and that the immediate use of deadly force was necessary to defend against that danger. Many percipient witnesses concluded, based on their own observations of the incident, that Deputy Mah's use of force appeared reasonable under the circumstances.

Not only was Deputy Mah's use of deadly force reasonable under the circumstances, the evidence shows he used no more force than was reasonably necessary to defend against the danger $\square$ posed. Deputy Mah fired six shots as $\square$ continued moving towards him armed with a knife. In total, $\square$ suffered seven gunshot wounds, two of which were apparently caused by one bullet. While the autopsy revealed that several of the gunshot wounds were to 's back, the cellular phone video footage confirms that Deputy Mah never fired at $\square$ when $\square$ 's back was tumed. Rather, the gunshot wounds to $\square$ 's shoulder and upper back are consistent with

Junging at Deputy Mah while hunched forward, as seen on the video footage. $\square$ posture at that moment exposed his upper back and shoulder to forward firc.

The law provides that if the police officer is justified in firing at a suspect in order to end a severe threat to public safety, the officer need not stop shooting until the threat has ended. Here, $\square$ continued to pose a threat during the time all six shots were fired. moved towards Deputy Mah with knife in hand as all shots were fired and even took several steps forward after the final shot was discharged. After $\square$ collapsed and fell to the ground, Deputy Mah fired no further shots. To the contrary, he immediately notified dispatch of the shooting so that emergency aid could be rendered to as quickly as possible.

V1.<br>CONCLUSION

It is the conclusion of the District Attorney that:
A. At the time Deputy Leon Mah fired his handgun at Deputy Mah honestly and reasonably believed that he was in imminent threat of death or great bodily injury.
B. Deputy Leon Mah honestly and reasonably believed that the immediate use of deadly force was necessary to defend himself against the danger posed by $\quad$ at the time Deputy Mah fired his weapon.
C. Deputy Leon Mah used no more force than was reasonably necessary to defend against the apparent danger posed by $\square$,
D. The fatal shooting of $\square$ by Deputy Leon Mah was a justifiable homicide.
