This is the fourth straight year that the total of pharmaceuticals collected was higher than the previous year. In 2012, we collected over 1767 pounds of unused medication. 1516 pounds of unused / expired medication was collected in 2011, 1155.75 pounds in 2010 and 646.55 pounds in 2009.

The Camarillo Police Department would like to remind citizens that unused or expired prescription medications are a public safety issue, leading to overdose and abuse. The non-medical use of prescription drugs ranks second only to marijuana as the most common form of drug abuse in America. Additionally, the majority of teenagers abusing prescription drugs get them from family, friends and the home medicine cabinet. Unused drugs that are flushed contaminate the water supply.

If you want to drop off unused / expired medications at the Police Department, we have a Pharmaceutical drop-off bin in our lobby. The lobby is open Monday-Friday from 8:00AM-5:00PM.

A sheriff's deputy patrolling along the coast north of Ventura disrupted a smuggling operation involving at least 14 people and approximately 2,000 pounds of marijuana.

The deputy drove up to a remote area as suspects were loading large bales of marijuana into a recreational vehicle. The cargo had already been off loaded from a panga boat that had been steered onto the sand from the ocean. The suspects scattered as soon as they saw the patrol vehicle. The deputy requested assistance and soon had additional deputies and officers from a variety of local, state, and federal agencies assisting in the search for the smugglers.

After several hours of searching by law enforcement officers on the ground, in two helicopters, and with K-9's, 14 suspects were located and arrested. Of the fourteen, all were men, and one was a male juvenile. Roughly half the group is claiming United States citizenship, while the rest are undocumented.

The RV containing the marijuana was seized, along with the boat. The investigation is being handled by the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, and the case will be presented to the Ventura County District Attorney's Office for the filing of criminal charges.

ICE Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) agents are continuing to investigate the case for possible federal violations.

People living along the coast and visiting our beaches need to realize that it is an international border. Anyone witnessing suspicious activity involving boats coming ashore with people engaging in human trafficking or narcotics smuggling should notify authorities immediately.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit completed a one month long investigation into the sales of multiple pharmaceutical and illicit drugs in Eastern Ventura County with the arrest of William Golden. Investigators learned that Golden was dealing several different drugs to residents of Eastern Ventura County. He was observed on multiple locations dealing drugs in Simi Valley. The investigation revealed that the majority of his customers were teenagers and young adults.

Golden was arrested on January 8, 2014, in the 19800 block of Rinaldi Street in Porter Ranch. A search of his vehicle revealed hundreds of dosage units of Methadone, Vicodin, Xanax, Marijuana, Ketamine, LSD, Psilocybin Mushrooms, Ecstasy, and Cocaine possessed for sale. A follow-up search warrant at his residence in the 10700 block of Tinker Ave in Sunland-Tujunga revealed more of the same drugs possessed for sale. Several thousand dollars of drug sales profits were also seized in the investigation.

Golden was booked into custody at the Ventura County Main Jail where he is being held in lieu of \$500,000 bail. His court date is pending.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is comprised of members of law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, and the Ventura County District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation. The main mission of the unit is to stem the flow of prescription medication to the illegal market. A secondary, and related, mission is identifying and stopping new trends of non-traditional drug sales that target teenagers and young adults in Ventura County.

Narrative:

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services, in conjunction with the Ventura County Fire Protection District, Ventura County Emergency Medical Services, California State University Channel Islands (CI), and the American Red Cross, will be hosting a three-day full scale preparedness exercise titled 'Operation Ready Ventura County 2014.' The exercise scenario is a catastrophic earthquake that has caused significant damage in Ventura County, specifically to the CI campus.

The purpose of this exercise is to test four areas of responsibility: Mass Evacuation, Reception Processing, Mass Care and Shelter, and Commodity Points of Distribution.

On Tuesday, January 14, 2014, the exercise will begin with a series of discussion based table-top exercises at the Ventura County Emergency Operations Center in Ventura. Concurrently, the American Red Cross will be activating a traditional shelter in partnership with the Ventura County Human Services Agency at Freedom Park in Camarillo.

On Wednesday, January 15, 2014, numerous public safety agencies will converge upon a full-scale mass casualty incident on the CI campus. Police, Fire and Emergency Medical Services first responders will encounter a number of simulated injured victims requiring rescue, triage and transport to a temporary hospital facility on campus. Numerous other non-injured victims will be evacuated and transported by local transportation operators from the CI campus to a Red Cross non-traditional shelter that has been setup at Freedom Park. Evacuees will be registered at the shelter and have the opportunity to visit a Local Assistance Center.

On Thursday, January 16, 2014, the exercise will focus on commodity points of distribution and the process for providing potable water during a disaster. During this exercise, responders will test the regions ability to transport potable water and maintain the integrity of this water in portable water bladders.

Narrative:

During the month of October 2012, three separate residential burglaries occurred in the Westlake Village area of Thousand Oaks. During each of the burglaries, the victims discovered an unknown telephone number called the residence multiple times before the burglary occurred. The point of entry and items taken were similar in each burglary.

During May 2013, a series of similar residential burglaries occurred in the city of Camarillo. After extensive investigation and collaboration with law enforcement agencies in Los Angeles and Orange Counties, Camarillo detectives identified Gurgen Martirosyan and Vigen Manukyan as the likely suspects responsible for the residential burglaries in the city of Camarillo.

On May 22, 2013, Martirosyan and Manukyan were arrested and taken into custody during an in-progress home invasion robbery in the city of Van Nuys. Search warrants were served at both Martirosyan's and Manukyan's residence, which led to the discovery of additional property and evidence.

Based on the above information, Thousand Oaks Police Department detectives conducted follow-up investigation over the last several months. The investigation led to direct evidence linking Martirosyan and Manukyan to the three residential burglaries that occurred in the Westlake Village area during October 2012.

Martirosyan and Manukyan are being held without bail in Los Angeles County jail for the home invasion robbery in Van Nuys, multiple residential burglaries in Los Angeles County area and possession of stolen property charges related to Ventura County residential burglaries.

Narrative:

On January 13, 2014, Camarillo Special Enforcement Unit arrested Martin Rodriguez and Christian Granados for stealing landscaping equipment out of a gardener's vehicle in the city of Camarillo.

Beginning in January of 2013, the city of Camarillo began experiencing gardening equipment thefts from victims as they worked in the yards of their clients. The method of operation was very similar during each occurrence. The suspects would wait for the gardener to finish working in the front yard, and when they moved to the rear of the residence, they would take the landscaping equipment from their truck or trailer. There were thirty-one cases involving these types of thefts in the cities of Camarillo, Moorpark, Thousand Oaks, and the unincorporated area of Ventura County known as El Rio during the past year.

Camarillo detectives began an extensive investigation and through collaboration with detectives in Thousand Oaks and detectives with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office, Lost Hills station, they were able to identify Rodriguez and Granados as the suspects in the thefts. Detective's set-up surveillances on the two subjects and caught them in the act of stealing equipment on Monday, January 13, 2014.

On January 14, 2014, Detectives served search warrants at a location in the 14000 block of Gledhill Street, Panorama City and a residence in the 7300 block of Vista Del Norte, in Van Nuys. They located

and recovered property that was taken during the thefts.

Rodriguez and Granados were booked at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility for eight (8) counts of Grand Theft. Rodriguez is in custody in lieu of bail set at \$250,000.00 and Granados is in custody with his bail set at \$10,000.00.

Narrative:

Two Ventura County Sheriff's Search and Rescue volunteers are retiring after a combined 76 years of service to the community.

Larry Beckett and Mike Jauregui will be recognized by the Ventura County Board of Supervisors during a ceremony Tuesday honoring their decades of selfless commitment to the people of Ventura County.

Volunteering for the Ventura County Sheriff's Search and Rescue Team takes serious dedication. It requires physical fitness and specialized technical training in mountaineering, first aid, survival, swift water rescue, and SCUBA diving.

Good judgment and strong character are among the traits our volunteers consistently bring to the team. 'That others may live' is a pragmatic, yet powerful team motto that explains why they will drop everything at a moment's notice to go into the mountains to save the lives of strangers.

Mike and Larry have literally seen it all during their 76 years on the team. Larry began his long tenure on the SAR team at a time when the Sheriff's Office hadn't yet gotten its first helicopter.

When he started in 1973, the method of notifying other members of his location and status was to fire his revolver into the air. One shot meant he found something. Two shots were used to signal his location. Three shots meant he needed help.

Eventually, we trained him to use VHF radios and satellite phones like the rest of us.

One of Larry's memorable rescues was an example of using good judgment. He and the team were assembled in Lockwood Valley to rescue an entire Boy Scout troop stranded in bad weather on Pine Mountain. When the troop began ascending the mountain, the weather was just fine in the valley. However, they could see the dark clouds gathering around the summit. As they neared their goal, the troop got caught in a blizzard.

Larry and the team discussed the conditions and decided they would wait until morning before searching for the troop. They assessed the situation and determined the troop was well equipped with the right gear, tents, and food.

Two rangers were upset that the SAR Team wouldn't venture out that night. Larry knew the weather would put the team in a dangerous position and they would be unable to effectively search for the missing troop.

The two rangers ventured out on their own and quickly got caught in snow blowing horizontally with zero visibility. They were forced to huddle behind a large boulder and spend a very cold night exposed to the elements. The two men were unharmed, but were humbled by the elements.

By morning, the SAR Team ventured out and found the troop with the help of a helicopter. All were safely returned to Lockwood Valley.

Larry worked for three decades as a school psychologist, ran a dude ranch in Montana, and served as International Service Chair with Rotary International. He is also on the board of directors of the Nomad Foundation, which has sent Larry to Africa twice in recent years.

Larry and his wife, Judy, have lived in Ventura County for 44 years. Larry's passion is the outdoors, and he and Judy enjoy spending time with their two daughters and three grandchildren.

Mike Jauregui was working as an optometrist, seeing his last patient of the day, when the phone rang. The SAR Team was needed to rescue a man clinging to the Sespe Wall. Mike hung up the phone and looked his patient in the eye. She understood immediately what was happening and told him to go. She would gladly reschedule the appointment.

Mike quickly drove home and retrieved his climbing gear. When he arrived at the scene, he learned the grim news that one man had already fallen to his death. The survivor was barely holding on to a flake of rock and declared his intent to jump. Deputies continued to talk to the man while Mike began to scale the wall.

He knew from experience to set up multiple anchors and carefully approach the victim. Mike had learned the hard way from someone who was so desperate to be rescued that he jumped into Mike's arms while he clung precariously to a sheer cliff.

This time, Mike methodically made three anchor points in the rock wall before approaching the victim with a rescue harness. The man's hands were white from holding on so hard for such a long time. One hand tightly gripped a small root of a bush sticking out of the rock face.

The man followed Mike's instructions and was safely lowered to the ground just as dusk turned to night.

Nothing could be done for the man's friend, who had fallen 140 feet before rescuers had arrived.

The men had no climbing experience between them and were not using any safety equipment. They magnified the dangers by drinking before trying to scale the steep wall.

I asked Mike and Larry what made them dedicate so many years to the SAR Team.

Mike said, 'We had so many successes. We saved many lives over the years. That's what motivated us.'

For Larry, the SAR Team was an extended family.

'I'm personally very grateful for the experience of having done that,' he said. 'As long as I was with it, I was not prepared for the feeling of separation I felt when I left the team.'

Larry and Mike responded to hundreds of emergency calls during their years on the team.

There are currently 178 members of the Sheriff's Search and Rescue Team. They volunteer their time to the team and can be called upon at any time to leave their families and their jobs to risk their lives to save others.

At about 11:00 PM on 1-15-2014, an off-duty Ventura County Sheriff's deputy was the victim of a vehicle vandalism. The deputy, and his son, who is also a Ventura County Sheriff's employee, saw the suspects flee the area in a vehicle. They both immediately began to search for the suspects and the vehicle. The off-duty deputy spotted the vehicle a few blocks away from the scene. All four suspects were booked at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility for conspiracy to commit a crime and vandalism. All four suspects are currently in custody with bail set at \$20,000.00.

Narrative:

This is Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED pronounced-*CEPTED*) Month. Let's take responsibility for making our areas safe.

Residential and business areas are the heart of a community. Our homes are the center of our lives, where we should feel most safe. And, while we may have multiple choices when it comes to where we walk through certain parts of town or the use of public transportation, we have few choices when it comes to the streets where we live. The main principle here should be 'know thy neighbor.' Streets and homes should be designed to encourage interaction between neighbors. Good examples include front porches, sidewalks, and property lines that are defined simply by low shrubbery instead of high fences and barriers.

Traditional security measures, such as good locks, lighting, and alarms, are important tools in the prevention of crime. Generally they work in harmony with CPTED concepts. However, installation of such things as security gates, rot-iron fences, barbed or razor-wire fences, and barred windows can create an impression of high crime and danger, whether justified or not. These security measures deter those with legitimate business from coming to an area, and making it safer by their presence. Such measures also indicate to the criminal element that criminal behavior is expected or at least anticipated. Regardless of how well designed a structure is, it should still be secured and locked when unattended.

If heavy fortification is deemed necessary, CPTED principals can still be used to lessen the visual impact on the surrounding neighborhood. For example ' White painted burglar bars mounted inside the windows rather than black ones bolted onto the exterior, or decorative metal fences rather than institutional chain link fences. The use of thorny shrubbery to deny access to unwanted areas also works well.

Lighting is one of the most important elements in any site design. Whether a single house or industrial complex, appropriate lighting techniques should be used. Good lighting enables people to feel more comfortable with their surroundings. It should provide clear paths for movement and highlight entryways without creating harsh effects or shadowy hiding places.

NATURAL SURVEILANCE

Fully illuminate all doorways that open to the outside.

- Install windows on all sides of houses to provide full visibility of the property.
- Provide appropriate illumination to sidewalks and all areas of the yard. ۲
- Properly select and install landscaping so that it allows unobstructed views of vulnerable doors and windows from the street and other properties.

RESIDENCES

- Install double cylinder dead bolt locks to interior doors that connect a garage to the interior living quarters. (Keep keys handy, but concealed, for emergencies.) Locate door locks a minimum of 40 inches from adjacent windows where possible.
- Use single-cylinder dead bolt locks with a minimum one- inch throw on doors used as • primary ground floor exits.
- Use two locking devices on all windows. ,
- Install glass sliding doors with the fixed position door on the outside, and equip the interior sliding panel with a locking pin and one or two more locks.

TERRITORIAL REINFORCEMENT

- Use front porches or stoops to create a transitional area between the street and the home.
- Define property lines and private areas with plantings, pavement treatments, or fences.
- Make the street address clearly visible from the street and alley with numbers a minimum of six inches high and distinctly or easily read.

MAINTENANCE

- Keep trees and shrubs trimmed back from windows, doors, and walkways and to a maximum of three feet high.
- Trim your tree skirts to be at least three feet from the ground to allow for more visibility.
- Use exterior lighting at night, and keep it all in working order.
- Keep litter and trash picked up and the yard neat at all times. The house and garage should be kept in good repair.
- •

The proper <u>design</u> and effective <u>use</u> of the built environment can lead to a reduction in the fear and incidence of crime and an improvement in the quality of life. Our physical environment can be influenced to produce behavioral effects that will reduce crime. These behavioral effects can be accomplished by reducing the natural tendency of the physical environment to support criminal behavior.

As you can see, CPTED is a simple concept that merely uses what you already have, in more effective ways to keep you and your family safe into the New Year. While housed at the Ventura County Pre-Trial Detention Facility, Hernandez developed medical problems which required him to be transferred the Ventura County Medical Center under the guard of a Sheriff's Deputy.

On January 22, 2014, at about 12:45 p.m., Hernandez lunged at the Sheriff's Deputy, who was guarding him, and tried to take the deputy's firearm. Fortunately, the deputy was able to overpower Hernandez and secure him without any injury to himself or the staff of the hospital.

Hernandez was subsequently arrested today for attempting to remove a Peace Officers Firearm and Resisting a Peace Officer by means of Violence. Hernandez is scheduled to appear in court on January 27, 2014, on his new charges.

Narrative:

The Ventura County Combined Agency Taskforce and the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit recently concluded a several year investigation into local Doctor Terry Stanger. A criminal case was presented to the Ventura County District Attorney's Office which alleged over prescribing of opiate, anti-depressant, and other controlled medications absent a legitimate medical purpose from his Ventura Office, as well as violations of money laundering statutes. The investigation revealed Dr. Stanger was also mailing medications throughout the United States and Europe. Detectives seized over 25,000 pills of highly addictive medication that were sold or destined for sale outside the scope of normal professional practice. Investigators also seized hundreds of thousands of dollars of suspected ill-gotten proceeds from the criminal activity. Dr. Stanger's activity came to the attention of local law enforcement when it was learned he was the source of supply for local drug dealers and several fatal overdoses were tied back to his prescriptions.

The Ventura County District Attorney's Office filed a criminal complaint charging 15 felony counts ranging from drug dealing to money laundering. Dr. Stanger is scheduled to appear in court on February 19, 2014 to answer to these charges.

The Ventura County Combined Agency Taskforce is made up of narcotics detectives from all agencies within the county and representatives from the United States Drug Enforcement Administration. VCAT's mission is to conduct investigations and disrupt large scale drug distribution organizations.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is comprised of members of law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, and the Ventura County District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation. The main mission of the unit is to stem the flow of prescription medication to the illegal market. A secondary, and related, mission is identifying and stopping new trends of non-traditional drug sales that target teenagers and young adults in Ventura County.

As game day approaches and football fans across the state prepare to root for their team, the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS), in conjunction with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), and the National Football League (NFL), would like to remind you and your friends to take every precaution to avoid driving drunk by planning ahead and designating a sober driver because ' *Fans Don't Let Fans Drive Drunk.*

The Thousand Oaks Police Department will have extra deputies on duty from 12:00 pm until 8:00 pm specifically looking for impaired drivers. Additionally, every regularly scheduled patrol officer working will be watching for the tell-tale signs of impaired driving before, during and after the game to stop and arrest those driving intoxicated.

'If you plan on drinking alcohol during the big game, we encourage you to designate a sober driver or plan for alternative modes of transportation such as a taxi cab to get you home safely,' said Captain James Fryhoff. 'A taxi cab may cost you \$30, but that's nothing compared to the \$10,000 or more in fees, fines, and the stigma that can stem from getting a DUI.'

Nationally in 2012, alcohol-impaired collisions took 10,322 lives. Californians witnessed 802 deaths in DUI collisions on their streets and highways. These collisions were 31 percent more likely to occur on weekends than on weekdays.

Detectives also located the stolen light industrial air conditioner at the home. In addition to stolen property sought in relation to the Moorpark burglary, detectives also located stolen property from thefts and burglaries in Los Angeles County. Investigators from the Los Angeles Police Department responded to the location and took possession of those stolen items.

As a result of the investigation, Nicholas Johnson was arrested for commercial burglary and for being a

convicted felon in possession of a firearm. He remains in custody at the Ventura County Pre-Trial Detention Facility.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department is warning Ventura County residents of on-going telephone scams that have been targeting elderly residents or other susceptible victims. Thousand Oaks Police have seen an increasing number of telephone scams where the criminal calls a resident and informs them their family member is in jail in another country. The criminal pretends to be a law enforcement official and advises the victim they need to act quickly or their loved one's safety may be in jeopardy. The majority of the fraudulent calls appear to originate from Canada. The fraudulent official requests money be 'wired' via a money wire transfer company (i.e. Western Union or MoneyGram) to an overseas location (in particular, Latin American countries). Within a short period of time, the wired funds are collected by the suspects and the victim will have suffered a financial loss as a result of this telephone scam.

Ventura County residents can protect themselves from this type of telephone scam by not proceeding with the transaction until having personally confirmed an emergency situation. This can easily be done by calling the family member and checking on his or her welfare.

The City of Thousand Oaks has seen an increase in commercial burglaries within the past few weeks. Investigators have made solving these crimes a priority, but are asking business owners and residents to assist in putting an end to this increase.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department encourages citizens to report any suspicious activity they may see in or around commercial areas. The suspects involved in the burglaries have forced entry into the businesses when the business is closed. The burglaries are occurring during early morning or late evening hours. Some businesses had alarms systems, but they were not activated at the time of the break in. The Thousand Oaks Police Department would like to offer the following crime prevention tips:

- Before you leave for the night / weekend, please remove all cash from your registers and put it in a safe place or remove it from the business. Leave emptied register drawers open.
- Leave a light on and your windows uncovered after closing. This allows for an unobstructed view inside.
- Consider applying security film on the interior of your glass windows. Security film adds a layer of protection from glass breakage and is available through several local vendors.
- If you have an alarm system, make sure it is operating properly and is turned on. The alarm system should include a motion detector and should be tested frequently.
- Make sure your alarm company has all of your correct contact information and they contact the police for a response to the business if your alarm is activated.
- If you use a security camera, make sure it is operating properly. Conduct a weekly inspection of your security camera.
- Make sure all of your doors and windows are locked before you leave.
- If you hear an audible burglary alarm, especially at night, call 911.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department uses several social media tools to communicate critical information to the community. Nixle, Twitter and VC Alert are our primary tools used to disseminate information. Nextdoor will serve as an additional social media outreach to the residents of Thousand Oaks.

Nextdoor was specifically designed to make neighbors feel comfortable sharing information with one another in order to help build stronger communities. All members must verify they live within the neighborhood. Information shared on Nextdoor is password protected and cannot be accessed by those outside the neighborhood or found on Google or other search engines. In addition, Nextdoor never shares personal information with any third parties. Unlike an email list or other online group, neighbor posts are organized and archived for future reference.

Narrative:

Beginning in November 2013, Sheriff's narcotics detectives started receiving information of criminal activity occurring at a property in the 1500 block of Cypress St, Oxnard. Preliminary information was that this location, known locally as 'The Compound', was involved in narcotics sales, stolen vehicles, identity theft, prostitution and weapon sales. As the investigation progressed, it was discovered that several other local law enforcement agencies had received similar information. Detectives were able to identify a residence in the City of Camarillo believed to be affiliated with the Compound.

On February 7, 2014, members of the Sheriff's Narcotics Bureau, Intelligence Unit, Gang Unit, and Transportation Unit, the Oxnard Police Department, and VENCATT (a stolen vehicle task force), served a search warrant at the Compound. Investigators located several people living in and around the property in illegal buildings, tents, and recreational vehicles. During the search a loaded handgun, approximately one half ounce of methamphetamine, heroin, stolen equipment

from the Pleasant Valley Parks Department, and common household items often used in the conversion of methamphetamine were found. The following arrests were made:

Joseph Ortega: Possession of narcotics for sale, possession of a firearm by a prohibited person, under the influence of a controlled substance while armed.

Kemo Parker: Possession of a controlled substance.

Kyle Delaware: Under the influence of a controlled substance.

Narrative:

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit in conjunction with the Los Angeles

CCounty Health Authority Law Enforcement Task Force (HALT) and the California Medical Board concluded a five month investigation into a 'pill mill' in the area of Arleta in the San Fernando Valley. Detectives learned of this criminally operating medical clinic through a tip from a local Simi Valley pharmacist. The Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit had previously contacted every pharmacy in Ventura County during the Summer of 2013 and made them aware of the task force. The unit asked for pharmacist's cooperation at reporting individuals attempting to obtain controlled substances through any fraud or deceit. The tip detailed an individual who was doctor shopping (visiting multiple doctors to obtain excessive amounts of medication) and named one of

the doctors as Michael Streams.

The investigation led to the Arleta Medical Clinic in the 8900 block of Woodman, in the area of Arleta, in Los Angeles where Dr. Streams was named as the physician of record. Detectives soon learned that Rimma Orlova and Eduard Levenzon operated a pain management clinic out of the location where individuals could receive prescriptions for pain pills and anti-anxiety drugs for cash

without seeing a doctor. A large number of the drugs prescribed were oxycodone (Roxicodone) and alprazolam (Xanax). A typical fee for the prescriptions was \$300. Customers of the clinic

would simply pay Orlova for the scripts which were either pre-signed by Dr. Streams or filled out on site by Nurse Practitioner Lorene Shelby. Shelby frequently did not examine or see customers, but instead merely signed her name to the prescriptions. Investigators also learned that customers talked openly at the clinic about buying prescriptions from other customers or selling the pills they received.

For the year 2013, over 3000 prescriptions were written in Dr. Streams name and over 500 were written in Shelby's name. A typical dose was 90 pills per prescription. The estimated street value for drugs written from the clinic is well over \$5,000,000. Dozens of patients were traveling to this clinic from Ventura County.

The investigation also revealed there was a medical marijuana recommendation business operating out of the clinic by Orlova and Levenzon. For a typical fee of \$60 customers could receive marijuana recommendations by Nurse Daijing Zhuang, and other individuals yet to be identified, that were pre-signed by a doctor different from Streams. Information was also received

that Zhuang was filling out prescriptions for pain management medications that were pre-signed by Dr. Streams. No examinations of customers were conducted.

Additionally, Dr. Streams operated a medical marijuana clinic in Anaheim where customers could

receive recommendations for a fee absent an examination.

On 2-6-14, investigators served search warrants at 7 locations related to this investigation. Evidence was recovered consistent with a criminally operating organization that was purely profit

driven with no regard for medical care of 'patients.' Approximately \$1,250,000 in assets were seized, \$400,000 of which was US Currency.

Streams, Orlova, Levenzon, Shelby, and Zhuang were all arrested for various charges related to dealing drugs, practicing medicine without a license, and conspiracy. Shelby and Zhuang were released on bail and their court date is pending. Streams, Orlova, and Levenzon remain in custody in lieu of \$1,000,000 bail.

The investigation is ongoing and additional arrests are pending.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members of law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, and the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation. The task force's main mission is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. Specialized teams throughout the Sheriff's Office and Simi Valley Police Department also assisted with the investigation.

Narrative:

During the late Fall of 2013, through the early Winter of 2014, deputies from the Ventura County Sheriff's- Moorpark Station responded to several vandalism calls at the Baron Brothers Nursery, located just outside of the City of Camarillo. All three suspects were identified as juveniles from the City of Camarillo and were charged with 594(b)(1) PC / Felony vandalism, 10852 VC / Vehicle tampering and 182(a)(1) PC / Criminal conspiracy.

The suspects were transported to the Moorpark Station for processing and were cited and released to the custody of their parents.

Narrative:

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit in conjunction with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration concluded a one month investigation with the arrest of Victor Pinto and the service of a search warrant at his residence in Los Angeles on February 12, 2014.

Investigators recently learned information that identified Victor Pinto as a source of supply of Molly, steroids, and cocaine to Ventura County residents in Thousand Oaks and Simi Valley. Investigators were able to gather enough evidence to arrest Pinto for sales of drugs. Pinto was arrested in a parking lot in the 20400 block of Ventura Boulevard, in the City of Los Angeles. He had over a half pound of Molly on his person possessed for sales.

The drug Molly may represent any number of Ecstasy type drugs currently on the illicit market. In this case, the drug Methylone was being sold as Molly. It is similar to ecstasy in that it provides users with a euphoric high similar to other illegal stimulants and hallucinogens.

The service of the search warrant resulted in the seizure of a half-pound of cocaine, another twenty ounces of molly, and a large amount of steroids, all possessed for sale. Additionally, over \$50,000, two expensive vehicles, and a motorcycle, all believed to be derivative of drug sales, were seized.

Pinto was booked into the Ventura County Main Jail in lieu of \$500,000 bail. His court date is pending.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is comprised of members of law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, and the Ventura County District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation. The main mission of the unit is

to stem the flow of prescription medication to the illegal market. A secondary, and equally important related, mission is identifying and stopping new trends of non-traditional drug sales that target teenagers and young adults in Ventura County.

An 18 year old Camarillo man tried to kill himself by deliberately inhaling carbon monoxide from his vehicle's exhaust system on Thursday afternoon, while parked in the Wildwood Park parking lot on Avenida de Los Arboles.

Thousand Oaks Police Officer, Jeffrey Stuteville observed a suspicious vehicle parked in the park parking lot. Due to the heavy rains, the trails were closed and this was the only vehicle in the parking lot. The vehicle was backed into a parking stall at the far south end of the parking lot in a location to conceal itself from people or vehicles on the roadway.

Stuteville entered the parking lot and parked next to the vehicle. The vehicle's engine was on and the windows appeared to be fogged up. This made it difficult for Stuteville to see who was inside. Stuteville noticed a green hose connected to the rear exhaust of the vehicle and placed through the rear passenger window. Fearing this was a suicide attempt; Stuteville pulled on the driver's door handle and opened the door.

Stuteville observed a male sitting in the driver seat. The male appeared to be in distress from inhaling the carbon monoxide fumes. Stuteville immediately removed the driver and provided assistance until fire and paramedics arrived. The male was later transported to the hospital for further evaluation.

Stuteville's quick actions saved this young man's life and prevented what could have been a tragic ending.

A three-judge panel of the Ninth Circuit made a significant ruling regarding the issuance of concealed weapons permits and what criteria may or may not be used in denying a permit. California laws currently authorize citizens to carry a concealed weapon upon receiving a permit that is based on a showing of good cause to need to carry, having good moral character, and passing a background check.

The court has struck down the good cause portion of the current law. Our legal staff is actively reviewing the case to clearly understand what guidelines will now be in place. I will, of course, comply with those guidelines and make changes in our current policy as soon as the details are clarified.

The last two suspects in two 'take over' style bank robberies were sentenced Wednesday (2-5-14). Eric Delbon Denmark and Spencer Rondon Thomas were each sentenced to 12 years in state prison after they pled guilty to two counts of robbery and special allegations that they committed the robberies for the benefit of a street gang. They also pled guilty to resisting arrest.

All three were caught after an aware citizen contacted the Sheriff's Office with a description of the getaway vehicle. Officers and deputies from several different agencies were able to locate the vehicle as it drove south on Highway 101 in Woodland Hills. After a short vehicle pursuit, Denmark and Thomas ran off on foot. Mancilla, the getaway driver was immediately arrested. Denmark was caught a short distance away. Thomas ran across the freeway and was apprehended after he was found hiding in a shed located in the back yard of a residence. Thomas suffered a minor injury to his arm after being bit by a Sheriff's Department K9.

Denmark and Thomas are documented members of a street gang called '7 Tray Hustlers' which is a set within the well-known Crip gang. '7 Tray' stands for 73rd Street in South Los Angeles.

Mancilla was sentenced to five years in state prison on 9-24-13 after she pled guilty to the same charges as Denmark and Thomas. Mancilla admitted to being a member of this gang.

Investigators believe that the trio robbed the bank on 7-2-13 so they could use the money for their gang's yearly party which was on 7-3-13, which coincides with their gang name.

Narrative:

The residents of Ventura County have recently been targeted by a scam in which a telephone caller represents themselves as a member of the Ventura County Sheriff's Office. The scam attempts to persuade the victim to provide payment information over the telephone for failing to report for jury duty.

Over the past week, several residents in Ventura County have received calls from an individual identifying themselves as a sworn member of the Ventura County Sheriff's Office. The caller claims the victim has a warrant issued for their arrest; however, they have the option to pay the fine over the phone by providing credit card information. Victims are caught off guard, and shocked at the prospect of having a warrant issued for their arrest. The scam preys upon the victim's unquestioning acceptance of authority and willingness to cooperate with law enforcement. In some cases, the victims have returned calls in response to messages left on their answering machines and heard a recorded message leading them to believe they had reached the Sheriff's Office. During calls, the suspect has also disclosed personal information about the victim, such as the victim's address, to further legitimize their identity.

This 'jury service scam' has been circulating around the United States since 2005, occurring in states from Maryland to California. The suspects utilize internet programs known as 'Voice Over Internet Protocol', or 'VoIP' to facilitate the scam. Utilizing these programs, suspects can change their voice and mimic a local area code telephone number in order to provide a sense of legitimacy to the call. This technique allows for calls to originate from foreign countries.

Residents are reminded that Sheriff's employees NEVER request financial or payment information over the telephone for any reason. If the public receives calls regarding jury service, they should contact the Ventura County Superior Court Jury Services Division directly at (805) 654-2256.

This includes areas of the Los Padres National Forest (LPNF) and Hungry Valley State Vehicular Recreation Area (HVSVRA). These areas include several miles of recreational Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) trails ranging from 4X4, motorcycle and All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV) use. Deputies assigned to the Lockwood Valley Sheriff's Station regularly patrol these OHV areas and are subject to call outs for OHV related collisions, injuries and search & rescue operations.

These funds being seeked will be invaluable to the Lockwood Valley Sheriff's Station and will enable deputies to establish dedicated off-road patrols to provide information, education and enforcement actions as needed.

Narrative:

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office has released its 2013 Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) crime statistics for Part 1 Crimes.

The data represent information collected from the unincorporated areas and the five contract cities where the Sheriff's Office provides police services. Those cities are Thousand Oaks, Camarillo, Moorpark, Fillmore, and Ojai.

Overall, reported crime is down 6% throughout the Sheriff's Office jurisdiction. A few areas, such as Moorpark and Camarillo showed an increase in reported crimes in 2013 over 2012. Most of the increases were due to spikes in property crimes, such as burglary and theft. Many of those crimes were thefts or burglaries from vehicles that were either unlocked or had valuables left in plain view. These crimes of opportunity can be prevented by removing valuable property from vehicles and locking them when leaving them unattended.

Narrative:

An extensive search for two home burglary suspects ended late last night with their capture along Santa Rosa Road between Camarillo and Moorpark.

An off-duty deputy spotted the men hitchhiking along the shoulder of the road just before 10:00 pm. Deputies from Camarillo and Moorpark converged on the pair and arrested them after they were identified as the suspects from a residential burglary that occurred earlier Thursday at a home in Camarillo.

Deputies had been called to a home on Old Ranch Road Thursday morning to investigate a possible burglary in progress. When deputies arrived, the two suspects fled the scene in a silver sedan. Deputies pursued the vehicle east on Santa Rosa Road until it collided with a light pole and the two men ran into the nearby community of Leisure Village. The men evaded deputies for several hours by hiding in the open space south of Leisure Village.

Investigators found stolen property from the burglary inside the silver sedan.

The search involved patrol deputies, investigators, a helicopter, and two K-9 units.

Both suspects were booked at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility in Ventura for First Degree Residential Burglary and Resisting or Delaying a Peace Officer. They are scheduled to appear in court on March 3, 2014 at 1:30 pm. Their bail is \$50,000.

Los Padres National Forest - Fifteen Hikers Rescued From Sespe River 2/28/2014 1:00:00 PM

Narrative:

The Sheriff's Aviation Unit conducted a rescue of 15 hikers near the Sespe River after receiving distress calls/signals from the Sespe River/Tar Creek Falls area. The hikers were airlifted to safety after the river became impassable to cross. None of the hikers were injured.

On Friday, February 28 at about 12:40 p.m., a Ventura County Sheriff's Office helicopter was dispatched for a group of 12 hikers stranded by high waters in the Los Padres National Forest. The group was on the fourth day of a five-day backpacking trip near the Sespe River and Tar Creek Falls. The group attempted to return to their vehicles when they encountered dangerously fast moving water at the swollen Tar Creek. One of the hikers called 9-1-1 and a Sheriff's helicopter was immediately dispatched to the area, but was unable to continue the search due to unsafe visibility in the canyon.

At about 5 p.m., a second request for a rescue helicopter was received for the same area. A separate group of three hikers activated their personal emergency satellite beacon and based on the satellite coordinates, this group was about one mile apart from the previously stranded twelve hikers.

The Sheriff's helicopter again responded where the original 12 hikers were located on the east bank of the Sespe River, near Tar Creek. The group appeared to be in a safe location. The Sheriff's helicopter continued north along the river where the second group of three hikers was located on the west bank of the Sespe River, near the west fork. The three men were in an unsafe location on a rock shelf above the rising river. Hoist operations were conducted to contact and lift the three men from the area. Each person was evaluated for injuries and they were flown to a safe location where County Fire Department and Sheriff's personnel awaited them.

The Sheriff's helicopter returned to the Sespe River in an attempt to make contact with the original 12 hikers. After locating them, a rescuer was hoisted from the helicopter to contact the group. None of the 12 was injured and they requested to remain for the evening. Based on their current location and condition, the determination was made that the group was in a safe

location and the Sheriff's helicopter returned to its home base in Camarillo.

Due to the water flow across Tar Creek, it was decided that the Sheriff's helicopter would return the following day to recover all 12 hikers from the location. On Saturday morning, the 12 hikers were hoisted from the area by the Sheriff's helicopter and flown to Fillmore. No medical attention was required for any of the hikers.

Both groups were prepared with the appropriate level of food, water, and personal survival gear. A cell phone and an emergency satellite beacon were key communication devices that were helpful in locating the backpackers. The Ventura County Sheriff's Office Aviation Unit reminds all individuals who enter the backcountry that weather conditions, including waterways, can change rapidly.

Narrative:

Approximately 100 homeless people needed to be moved Friday from the National Guard Armory in Ventura to the Ventura Mission Church, which is two miles away. The armory was being used as a homeless shelter, but there was an event planned at the facility, and an alternate shelter needed to be set up at the church across town.

The Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services learned there was no plan to transport people from one shelter to another and they were being told to walk the two miles to the church in the height of the rain storm.

A phone call to Roadrunner Shuttle changed all that. The company offered their services for free and transported all of the homeless people from the armory to the church. This is another example of public and private agencies working together to solve problems in the community.

Roadrunner Shuttle has provided similar emergency transportation services before. During the Springs Fire, the company sent a fleet of buses to evacuate an entire camp of children along PCH as the fire was approaching the area.

Narrative:

A female jail inmate punched a female sheriff's deputy in the neck Sunday while being booked for vandalism and being under the influence of a controlled substance at the Pre-Trial Detention Facilty in Ventura. The deputy immediately restrained the inmate to control her until she was handcuffed.

Natalie Cota, an Oxnard resident, was charged with battery on a peace officer and remains in custody in lieu of \$25,000 bail.

George Rustali, of Newbury Park, was brought to the jail for resisting an executive officer, resisting or delaying a peace officer, brandishing a deadly weapon, possession of tear gas, and battery. He was very intoxicated and combative with deputies when he arrived at the jail. He spit in the face of one of the booking deputies and was restrained. Deputies placed Rustali in a padded cell for observation, due to his level of intoxication and his erratic behavior.

Rustali remains in custody in lieu of \$75,000.

Larry Zapata had completed the booking process early Sunday morning and was about to be moved to one of the housing units in the jail. Prior to being assigned housing, inmates are thoroughly searched to ensure they are not smuggling any drugs or weapons into the housing areas of the jail. It was during that search that Zapata was caught with 4.6 grams of heroin in his possession. Zapata had been brought to jail for several misdemeanor warrants. He is now facing a felony charge of possessing a controlled substance in a jail facility.

Zapata remains in custody in lieu of \$41,500.

Sunday's activities are not unusual in a jail facility, but they illustrate the hazards deputies and jail staff members face every day.

Narrative:

In February and March of 2014, the Moorpark Investigations Unit received reports of and investigated several phone scams.

In the phone scams, the suspects are using a variety of stories to get the victims to wire money to a specific location. In one scam, victims received a call from someone purporting to be an IRS agent. The victim is told they have an unpaid tax bill, and they are directed to obtain a pre-loaded debit card or Green Dot Moneypak to pay the bill. The victim is threatened with arrest if they do not pay the bill. Often, the purported IRS agent becomes hostile or hangs up on the victim when questioned about the authenticity of the call.

Another phone scam that occurred recently involved a job offer to assist in the processing of cashier's checks. Victims are usually contacted via email or through a website such as Craigslist. They are asked to assist in the processing of cashier's checks. The victim agrees to receive a cashier's check in the mail. The victim deposits the cashier's check into their personal account, keeps a portion for themselves as a fee, and wires the remainder to another subject, who is often located outside of the United States. Within days or weeks of sending the wire transfer, the victim learns that the cashier's check was actually a counterfeit check, and the funds from the check were not received by the victim's bank. This results in the victim being responsible for all of the loss.

When investigating the scams, detectives learned that the overwhelming majority of the scammers are located outside of the country.

In order to avoid being the victim of a scam, Moorpark residents are encouraged to:

- Never wire money based on a request made over the phone or in an e-mail, specifically to an unfamiliar company or unknown person. Wiring money is like giving cash'once you send it, you can't get it back.
- Remember, if it sounds too good to be true, it usually is.
- Do not conduct financial transactions with someone you do not know.
- Ask questions. Remember, legitimate businesses will provide information about their companies when asked.
- If you have questions, stop and contact your local authorities.

Narrative:

On March 13th, 2014, the Sheriff's Gang Unit conducted a probation search in the 400 block of Stroube Street, which is located in the unincorporated area of Oxnard, known as El Rio. During the probation search, a known documented member of a criminal street gang, (S) Timothy Medina, was found to be in possession of a loaded handgun. At the time, Medina was out on bail pending a court case for a gang-

related robbery. Medina was arrested for the loaded gun and is currently in custody with \$750,000 bail.

Narrative:

At the conclusion of a month long investigation, Leah Montijo and Jorge Garcia were arrested for several narcotics and weapon charges.

In February 2014, Sheriff's narcotics detectives received information that Leah Montijo was selling methamphetamine from her residence in the city of Ventura. While conducting a surveillance of Montijo, detectives saw what appeared to be Montijo engaged in several narcotics transactions. Detectives identified a male subject with Montijo as Jorge Garcia, a documented Santa Paula gang member.

In early March, detectives received information that Garcia was involved in an incident in the city of Oxnard that resulted in the recovery of a stolen vehicle. Inside the vehicle, Oxnard police officers found a large quantity of heroin and a loaded handgun. Garcia evaded officers during this incident, but sufficient evidence was located to tie Garcia to the crime.

A Search Warrant was obtained for Montijo's person and residence. On March 14, 2014, Sheriff's detectives observed Montijo and Garcia leave Montijo's Ventura residence. A Sheriff's Office patrol unit was requested to stop the vehicle to take Garcia into custody and execute the Search Warrant on Montijo. When the deputy driving the patrol unit activated the overhead lights and siren, Garcia sped away on McFarlane Street at a high rate of speed in an attempt to evade the deputy. When trying to turn onto

Olive Street, Garcia lost control and collided with the curb on the west side of the street. At this time Garcia's vehicle was partially disabled and the patrol unit and a detective unit were able to block it in and prevent Garcia from fleeing. Garcia was then seen throwing a plastic bag from the vehicle. As officers approached the vehicle, they discovered that Montijo's 9 year old son was a passenger in the back seat. When ordered to step away from the vehicle, Garcia used the boy as a shield and initially refused to comply with their directives. Ultimately, officers were able to remove the combative Garcia and take him and Montijo into custody. The thrown plastic bag was found to contain several ounces of methamphetamine.

A search of the vehicle revealed approximately 5 ounces of heroin, 12 ounces of methamphetamine, a large sum of cash, and a loaded handgun. The handgun was later determined to have been stolen during a burglary in Northern California in late February, 2014.

The Search Warrant served at Montijo's residence revealed a small quantity of methamphetamine and an additional handgun.

Garcia was arrested for conspiracy, felony child endangering, possession of heroin and methamphetamine for sale, transportation of heroin and methamphetamine, evading arrest, being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm and ammunition, and possession of a controlled substance with a firearm.

Montijo was arrested for conspiracy, felony child endangering, possession of heroin and methamphetamine for sale, transportation of heroin and methamphetamine, and resisting arrest.

Both were booked into the Sheriff's Main Jail. Bail is set at \$500,000.00

Narrative:

On 3/18/14, members of the Thousand Oaks Police Investigations and Special Enforcement Units arrested 2 subjects for numerous felony counts related to identity theft, burglary and thefts from vehicles. A third female who was staying with the two suspects was also arrested for an outstanding felony warrant and possession of methamphetamine.

Over the past month and a half, Thousand Oaks, Newbury Park and Westlake had a sharp increase in vehicle burglaries. Numerous victims had their personal information and credit cards stolen. The suspects then used that information to make thousands of dollars in fraudulent purchases at retail stores throughout the county.

After a month long investigation into the crime spree, investigators and members of the Directed Enforcement Bureau Bike Team were able to identify the suspects involved. They were Michael Rodriguez (age 44) and Nastaza Schmidt (age 25).

On 3/19/14, members of the Thousand Oaks Police Investigations and Special Enforcement Units

located the suspects at a motel in Newbury Park. The suspects were found to be in possession of several pieces of evidence related to vehicle burglaries they committed in Agoura Hills just hours prior to the arrests. Additional evidence related to previous burglaries as well as methamphetamine were also located in their motel room.

Investigators believe these suspects are responsible for more than thirty (30) vehicle burglaries and thefts from vehicles in the city of Thousand Oaks alone. The Thousand Oaks Police Department is working closely with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and other neighboring agencies to link these suspects to other crimes in the area.

Burglaries of vehicles and thefts from unlocked cars continue to be a popular way to gain access to people's personal information. The identity theft crimes associated with these burglaries are frequently committed before people even realize they are victims. Thousand Oaks Police want to remind the public how important it is to avoid leaving valuables in your vehicles and to make sure you lock your doors.

Narrative:

At the conclusion of a month's long narcotics investigation, Stewart Wesley Reid, Michael Ricketts, Brenda Felix, and Cleofas Leon were arrested for narcotics charges.

For several months, investigators assigned to the Sheriff' Narcotics Bureau, West County Street Team, have received information from multiple sources that Stewart Reid was selling large quantities of methamphetamine and heroin in Ventura County.

On March 25, investigators were conducting surveillance of Reid's residence in the 200 block of Leighton Dr, Ventura. A vehicle was seen to arrive and detectives observed what appeared to be a narcotics transaction between the occupants of the vehicle and those from the residence. When the vehicle left, it was stopped by detectives. The occupants of the vehicle were identified as Brenda Felix and Cleofas Leon, both from Riverside County. A search of their vehicle revealed approximately \$29,000.00 in cash.

A search of Reid's residence was conducted pursuant to his probation conditions. Investigators contacted Reid and Michael Ricketts who also lived at the location. Investigators located approximately 6 pounds of

crystal methamphetamine, 1 pounds of heroin, and approximately \$194,000.00 in cash. Investigators believe Reid was responsible for the sales of significant quantities of the methamphetamine and heroin in several Ventura County communities.

The four listed suspects were arrested for the following charges:

On 3-8-2014, Peter Foy II was in custody at the Ventura County Jail Pre-Trial Detention Facility pending a sentence transfer to state prison. Foy was sentenced to state prison on 3-7-2014.

On 3-8-2014, a jail telephone call was monitored where Foy called Brandon Adams. Brandon Adams is Foy's co-defendant from Foy's first narcotic sales conviction in 2012. During this conversation, Foy told Adams he (Adams) would be contacted by a person Foy trusted and Adams should deal with the person. Unbeknownst to Foy, the person was actually an undercover police agent. Foy had earlier conspired with the undercover agent and told the agent to contact Adams to assist with the conspiracy to commit insurance fraud and credit card fraud.

The undercover agent met with Adams in the city of Simi Valley. Adams agreed to commit the insurance fraud and credit card fraud based on Foy's referral. Adams then introduced Toncher to the undercover agent. Adams and Toncher subsequently solicited the undercover agent to kill two Simi Valley residents. Both intended murder victims were involved in Foy's previous criminal convictions.

During multiple meetings between the three, Toncher agreed to financially support the killing of the Simi residents through the identity theft/fraud profits.

On 4-3-2014, Adams and Toncher were arrested for the above listed charges and were booked into the Pre-Trial Detention Facility. Their bail is currently set at \$5 million each. Multiple search warrants were served and filed with the Ventura County Superior Court. Adams and Toncher are scheduled to appear in Ventura County Superior Court on Monday, 4-7-2014. The investigation into Peter Foy II regarding his involvement in this investigation is on-going. All known potential murder victims were notified of the plot. In response to the threats, the entire jail facility was placed on lockdown and numerous deputies responded to search the perimeter for suspicious devices and/or persons. Multiple patrol resources were also tasked with checking locations related to Lovas.

The PTDF Classification Unit, in conjunction with the Sheriff's Gang Unit, investigated the incident. Lovas was located and taken into custody at a residence in the 4300 block of Terrace Avenue in the city of Oxnard several hours after the threats.

Lovas was arrested and booked on one felony count of P.C. 148.1(a)- False report of a bomb. Her bail was set at \$40,000.

At the time of this incident, there were close to 1,000 individuals, both staff and inmates, located inside the PTDF. The Ventura County Sheriff's Office takes any threats towards the safety and well-being of jail staff and inmates seriously. The Sheriff's Office is committed to investigating each incident and bringing those

responsible to justice.

On April 9, 2014, at approximately 3:25 PM, deputies responded to the Tory Burch store in the Camarillo Premium Outlets for a burglary that had just occurred. Deputies learned that a group of six to eight female suspects entered the store with large shopping bags. The suspects quickly went through the store loading merchandise into the bags they brought in with them. One of the store clerks recognized the suspects from a previous burglary that occurred one to two months ago. During the previous burglary, one of the suspects threatened to shoot the clerks if they intervened. Based on that information, the clerks believed the suspects were still armed.

When the store employees tried to contact the suspects, the suspects fled the store with the merchandise, without paying for any of the items. The suspects were in the store for approximately 30 seconds. The

employees were able to see the suspects get into a gold Chrysler mini-van. The suspects left the Outlet Mall parking lot toward the 101 freeway.

The deputies on scene were able to view the security video and put out a broadcast to the surrounding agencies with the suspects' and vehicle descriptions.

Deputies working in the Thousand Oaks area located the van traveling southbound on highway 101 near the Hampshire Road off-ramp. Deputies conducted a 'high risk' traffic stop on the vehicle and detained the six suspects. One of the store clerks was brought to the location of the traffic stop and identified all of the suspects as being the ones who stole the merchandise from the store. Deputies searched the van and located the 'booster bags,' which contained the stolen property from the Tory Burch store. Deputies also located additional clothing items that were believed to have been stolen from several other stores. Detectives are following-up on the other potential victims.

All six suspects are from the San Francisco area, and were in a vehicle rented from San Francisco. Detectives believe these suspects have been going up and down the coast committing similar types of burglaries throughout the state.

The suspects were arrested and booked into the Pre-Trial Detention Facility in Ventura for burglary, conspiracy, possession of stolen property and possession of burglary tools. Their bail was set at \$20,000.00.

National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week is April 13 ' 19, 2014, and the Ventura County Sheriff's Office is honoring the public safety dispatchers who serve as the lifeline between people in need and vital law enforcement services. These public safety dispatchers dedicate their careers to providing superior service to people who have a need for law enforcement assistance. In many cases, the dispatcher can make the difference between life and death.

Each year, the public safety dispatchers and supervisors at the S.C.C handle more than 348,000 telephone calls, including 92,000 9-1-1 calls. Every day, hundreds of people depend on the skill, expertise and commitment of the dispatchers who work in public safety communications. These team members help save countless lives by handling emergency telephone calls, dispatching law enforcement resources, and providing moral support to people in distress.

Public safety dispatchers must undergo a rigorous testing and background process before being hired. After they have been hired, new dispatchers must attend the three-week Basic Dispatcher Course that is certified by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.). Typically, their training also includes six additional weeks of classroom training and between 6 ' 12 months of on-the-job training before the new dispatcher can work independently. Even then, almost 50% of the dispatchers hired are not able to successfully complete the training program, due to the challenging demands of the job.

Within the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, we are celebrating the valuable contributions that our public safety dispatchers make on a daily basis. We are incredibly fortunate to have such talented and dedicated professionals who work so hard to serve the public and deputies on the front lines.

On 4-26-2014, the Ventura County Combined Agency Narcotic Task Force (VCAT) concluded a threemonth investigation with the seizure over 22 lbs. of high grade heroin and arrest of a Mexican citizen suspected of smuggling the heroin into the United States. The investigation revealed that the heroin was destined for the city of Oxnard.

This investigation was initiated after VCAT investigators learned an individual, identified as Everardo Mayo, was working for a Mexican Drug Trafficking Organization (DTO) and smuggling large quantities of heroin from Mexico to Ventura County, as well as other Southern California areas. On 4-26-2014, VCAT investigators detained Mayo in the City of Paramount, and found he was in possession of over 10 pounds of heroin. Investigators also searched a related residence in the 14900 block of Downey Avenue, Paramount, where Mayo was believed to be storing additional heroin. More than10 pounds of heroin were seized at the residence along with evidence the heroin had recently entered the U.S. Mayo was booked into the Los Angeles County Jail for possessing heroin with the intent to sell and transportation of heroin. His bail is set at \$250,000.00. Mayo is scheduled to appear in Los Angeles County Superior Court on 4-29-2014. The 22 lbs. of heroin has a potential street value of approximately two million dollars.

During late 2013 and early 2014, the Moorpark Police Department investigated numerous scams targeting citizens of Moorpark. The scams generally target elderly citizens and citizens of Hispanic descent who speak little or no English. The scams include IRS phone scams, loan scams, utility bill scams, diamond scams, lottery scams, and the relative in an accident in Mexico scam.

As a result of the investigations, detectives conducted public outreach directed at specific segments of our population. In order to connect with senior citizens, we conducted a presentation at the senior center advising of typical scams that target senior citizens. In order to connect with members of the Hispanic community, we made several information alert fliers in Spanish and distributed them at businesses frequented by members of the Hispanic community.

Throughout the numerous investigations, detectives learned that almost all of the scammers request the victims purchase 'Green Dot' money cards and make payments through the cards, or send money via Western Union. To combat this, we've met with managers at Moorpark businesses where victims were directed to purchase gift cards or send money. The purpose of the meetings was two-fold; (1) To educate store employees on the potential criminal scams so they could warn customers who were at their stores to buy the gift cards, and, (2) Have local businesses place informational fliers at the point of sale of the gift cards, informing victims of potential scams before they made the purchase and lose money.

Finally, the Moorpark Police Department recently created a Phone Scam Hotline. This hotline was developed to provide Moorpark citizens with the latest information on various scams affecting residents of Moorpark. The hotline provides information in Spanish or English, and if residents wish to speak to an investigator, they can leave a message and their call will be returned promptly. The information on the hotline will be updated as changes occur in the types of scams occurring in Moorpark.

Thousand Oaks, CA 'Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on May 3, 2014, at an undisclosed location within the city limits between the hours of 6:00 pm and 3:00 am.

The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. 'Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 6 lives and resulted in 112 injury crashes harming 139 of our friends and neighbors,' said Sergeant Brad Clifton.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most

prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Nearly 90 percent of California drivers approve of DUI checkpoints.

DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests affording the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Narrative:

On 5/13/14, at approximately 11:20 PM, Ventura County Sheriff's Deputies assigned to the City of Thousand Oaks Police Department responded to a 'Shots Fired' call for service in the 1100 Block of Vista Canyon Lane. When deputies responded they contacted the reporting parties and were told the reported shots had possibly come from (S) Smith's residence. Deputies approached the residence and saw that the sliding glass door to Smith's front patio was shattered and there was debris on the front patio. There were numerous attempts to make contact with the occupants in Smith's residence, but the deputies were unsuccessful in making contact.

At approximately 1:00 AM, detectives with the City of Thousand Oaks Special Enforcement Unit responded to the scene and surveilled the residence for any persons coming or going. At approximately 8:55 AM, Smith left his residence and a traffic stop was initiated. Smith is currently on active probation with search terms. Detectives responded to Smith's residence to invoke his probation search terms. During the search of Smith's residence it appeared as if an explosive device had exploded on Smith's front patio. The remainder of the residence was searched with no additional persons located.

During the search of Smith's garage, numerous assault rifles, gun parts, and miscellaneous dry

chemicals were located. Due to the possible exploded device on the front patio and the chemicals found in the garage, the Sheriff's Office Bomb Team responded to evaluate the scene and determine if the area was safe.

The Bomb Team evaluated the scene and determined the method in which the dry chemicals were stored was safe and no evacuations of nearby residences were needed.

Due to the property located inside the residence and garage, a search warrant was written and served at residence. During the service of the search warrant detectives located and seized several hundred rounds of live ammunition in various calibers, assault weapons, expanded ammunition magazines in violation of California law, and narcotics.

Thousand Oaks Police Department Kicks Off High Visibility Enforcement

(Thousand Oaks, CA) The Thousand Oaks Police Department wants to remind motorists to *Click It or Ticket*. In order to enforce this reminder, beginning Monday, May 19th, officers will be joining in the 2014 national seat belt enforcement mobilization and cracking down on motorists who are not belted.

Even with a seatbelt usage rate of 97.4 percent, California still has 800,000 or more who aren't buckling up. In a crash, they stand a 50 percent greater chance of being killed than those who have taken the two seconds to buckle in. In an on-going effort to reach those remaining safety hold-outs, police, sheriff and the California Highway Patrol across the state will be taking part in *Click It or Ticket* from May 19 through June 1.

'Memorial Day weekend kicks off summer vacation season, and we want to ensure that everyone arrives at their destination safe and sound,' said Thousand Oaks Police Captain Jim Fryhoff. 'If you are not wearing your seat belt, you will be ticketed.'

According to new data released from the Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), fatalities are up nationwide for the first time in five years. In 2012, 10,335 people who were killed in motor vehicle crashes were not wearing their seat belts. NHTSA data also details how more traffic vehicle deaths occur at night. In 2012, 61 percent of passenger vehicle occupants killed during the nighttime hours of 6:00 p.m. ' 5:59 a.m. were not wearing their seat belts.

'Wearing a seat belt is one of the easiest and best things you can do to protect yourself in the event of a car crash,' said Rhonda Craft, Director of the California Office of Traffics Safety. 'Taking a few moments to properly secure yourself and all your passengers before going on your way could mean the difference between life and death.'

The cost for a seat belt violation in California for unbuckled vehicle occupants over age 16 is a minimum of \$161 for a first offense. The penalty fees for failing to properly buckle up any child under the age of 16 is a minimum \$490 per child for a first offense, plus a violation point will be added to the driver's record. If the parent is not in the car, the driver gets the ticket.

On 05/18/2014, at approximately 11:15 AM, an alert citizen traveling on the Ventura-Ojai Bike Trail near Crooked Palm Road saw two males fleeing the scene of a brush fire. The citizen immediately contacted the Sheriff's Office. Patrol units were dispatched to the scene and were able to quickly locate and detain two possible suspects. Each suspect admitted to being involved in starting and fueling the fire. One adult and one juvenile were both subsequently arrested for felony arson.

Narrative

Sheriff Patrol Deputies responded to an arson in progress call in the area of Crooked Palm Road and the Ventura- Ojai Bike Trail. A citizen had reported that two male subjects came out of the brush near the trail

and were fleeing an active fire. The citizen gave a description of each suspect and their direction of travel to Sheriff's Dispatch, which was radioed to responding patrol units.

A deputy was able to locate both of the suspects within 5 minutes of receiving the call. The suspects were detained approximately � mile south of the reported location of the fire. After speaking with additional witnesses, collecting evidence and admissions by the suspects, deputies arrested both suspects for 451 of the California Penal Code/ Felony Arson. (S1) Samuel Patterson was booked at the Pre Trial Detention Facility in Ventura and the juvenile was booked at Ventura County Juvenile Hall in Oxnard.

As part of the Sheriff's Office response, a helicopter flew to the area to assist in locating the suspects and assessment of the fire. Ventura County and Ventura City Fire resources responded to the fire, including 3 engine companies, 2 battalion chiefs, and 1 hand crew. With their collected effort, they were able to quickly knock down and contain the approximately 50 by 50 foot brush fire. Additional responding fire engines were cancelled once the fire was extinguished. A member of the Ventura County Arson Task Force responded to the fire for further investigation.

The area where the fire was intentionally set is heavily brush and extremely dry due to recent drought conditions. At the time of the fire, winds were blowing at 10-15 mph with gust up to 25 mph. The alertness of a concerned citizen and quick responses of Sheriff and Fire resources certainly averted a much larger incident and directly contributed to the apprehension of two dangerous suspects.

All residents are reminded to contact the Sheriff's Office regarding any suspicious subjects, vehicles, or activities within the open spaces of our county.

Narrative:

The County of Ventura has been recognized for innovative approaches to reduce underage drinking and support responsible alcohol policies. Between 2006 and 2007, cities across Ventura County enacted underage drinking policies known as Social Host Ordinances. Social Host fines are civil penalties aimed at individuals who host parties where alcohol is available to minors. These parties catering to juveniles are high risk environments; where fights, vandalism, and even assaults occur.

A study published this year on the effects of Social Host laws in Ventura County showed a significant reduction in *'last 30-day drinking among 9th and 11th graders'* locally; as well as reductions in the size of unruly gatherings' especially those with 50 guests or more'since the laws were adopted. (Please See VenturaCountyLimits.org/law for study details)

Because of intense interest from nearby cities and counties to reduce teen drinking, numerous agencies began contacting both the Ventura County Behavioral Health and the Thousand Oaks Police Department to identify strategies they could use to implement a Social Host Ordinance in their own areas. In response, the Thousand Oaks Police Department, Ventura County Sheriff and the Ventura County Behavioral Health Department designed a training program available to any municipality or community prevention organization.

On May 15, 2014, coalitions from Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Riverside and Orange Counties attended a one-day training to learn from our efforts.

Speakers presenting the information were some of the most prominent leaders in developing the initiative over the last several years, including Sheriff Geoff Dean, Thousand Oaks Councilwoman Jacqui Irwin, Prevention Services Manager Dan Hicks, Behavioral Health Division Manager Patrick Zarate, and Captain Jim Fryhoff from the Thousand Oaks Police Department.

The current Social Host Ordinance is a local law enacted in all ten cities and unincorporated areas of Ventura County. It holds the hosts of parties responsible where underage drinking is allowed. The penalties can be civil fines or community service. Fines range from \$500.00 to \$2,500.00. Since its inception in 2006, hundreds of citations have been issued in local communities. The results are in increased safety for our teens.

'This is not about raising money for the cities, it's about changing reckless behavior that could hurt our children.' said Captain Jim Fryhoff (Thousand Oaks Assistant Chief of Police).

Councilwoman Irwin commented that 'Up to 70% of the sexual assaults on young women and teens came out of home party settings. This is not a rite of passage, it is a preventable harm'

The Thousand Oaks Police Department and Ventura County Sheriff's Office would like to remind the public that if they host parties where underage drinking is present, they will be liable under a Social Host Ordinance.

Please keep the health and safety of our children foremost in planning your social gatherings this summer.

Thousand Oaks, CA 'Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on May 24, 2014, at an undisclosed location within the city limits between the hours of 6:00 pm and 3:00 am.

The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. 'Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 6 lives and resulted in 112 injury crashes harming 139 of our friends and neighbors,' said Sergeant Brad Clifton.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most

prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Nearly 90 percent of California drivers approve of DUI checkpoints.

DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests affording the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to Thousand Oaks Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver ' Call 9-1-1'.

Narrative:

Sheriff's investigators eradicated the first large scale marijuana cultivation of the 2014 season with the seizure of 50,280 marijuana plants,

During a marijuana reconnaissance flight in the canyons north of Lake Piru, narcotics investigators discovered a large scale marijuana cultivation site. The marijuana cultivation was located in a canyon approximately 10 miles north of Lake Piru in the Los Padres National Forest. The marijuana plants stretched for over a mile and occupied several smaller side canyons.

On May 23, Investigators from the Sheriff's Narcotics Bureau West County Street Team, Sheriff's Custody Bureau, Santa Paula Police Department, and California National Guard Multi-Functional Counter Drug Task Force, were flown to the site by the Sheriff's Air Unit. 50,280 marijuana plants were eradicated with an estimated street value of over \$201,000,000.

Detectives discovered that water had been diverted from several natural springs into hand dug reservoirs. Growers often add fertilizers to these reservoirs, using miles of irrigation hose to water multiple grow sites throughout the canyons. This exploitation of the water course prevents native plants from receiving water and is unsafe for animals or humans to drink. Several hundred pounds of fertilizer were found, along with herbicides, rat poisons, and mountains of trash. Multiple grower campsites were found, one containing a rifle. Investigators believe 6-8 suspects were living in the camps. The suspects fled upon the arrival of investigators.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office believes these large scale marijuana cultivations are connected to Mexican Cartels operating in California. We remind those using our county's backcountry to be vigilant in watching for clandestine marijuana operations. If you see irrigation hose, fertilizers, rustic campsites, or hikers without equipment in secluded areas, you may be in danger. If you find yourself in an area and see this type of situation, quietly leave the area and notify law enforcement immediately. You can report your observations anonymously.

Investigators conducted an investigation into Hollett after th learned she was dealing prescription opiate medication and methamphetamine from a residence in the 13 block of Fuschia, Oxnard. The investigation revealed that Hollett was dealing drugs from a residence where s was the caretaker for a 94 year old man. The service of a search warrant at the residence where Hollett worke and a subsequent probation search at her residence, yielded evidence of the crime of drug sales.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a full time task force comprised of members law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The task force's main mission is combating t transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market.

The task force was formed in May of 2013. Over the past year, investigators have arrested 114 individual involved in the sales of drugs. Included in these arrests are four doctors, one pharmacist, and two nur practitioners. The unit has served 64 search warrants and seized several million dollars worth of drugs, over 1 million dollars in currency and vehicles, and 20 firearms.

A search warrant was served at Schneeman's residence in the 13 block of Ramona Drive, Newbury Park where thousands of pills and over 50 vials of various steroids were seiz A large amount of Cialis and Viagra was also recovered at Schneeman's residence. In addition to the drugs significant amount of currency was seized from Schneeman's residence and bank accounts.

Local law enforcement has seen a recent trend of younger and younger males using steroids to the detrimen their health. Another trend has been the pairing of steroids and opiate prescription medication.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members of enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorne Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The task force's main mission is combating transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. A secondary, and equally important mission, is identification and stopping of new trends of abuse among the county's younger population set.

Sheriff's Investigators were able to link Oneil and Tisinger to several of the burglaries and identity theft type crimes.

The investigation revealed the suspects would enter the health clubs using day passes commonly given out by the health clubs. The suspects alleged that they would look for locks that still had the combination code sticker from the back, which gave them access into the lockers.

After entering the lockers, the suspects took cash and credit cards. They used the cards before the victims had a chance to cancel them, and were often able to get cash

advances at ATMs using the victim's debit/credit cards by trying the date of birth from the victims as the passcode, which reportedly worked on occasion.

Tisinger and Oneil were booked into the Ventura County Jail for numerous charges related to theft and identity theft.

Narrative:

Beginning in February 2013, a series of 19 residential burglaries occurred in Ventura County, in which members of the Indian community were specifically targeted for losses totaling more than \$1 million in cash, jewelry and gold.

The investigation into the break-ins revealed they were occurring in several other counties in California and Nevada. Investigators were able to identify, locate, and arrest members of this burglary crew who are affiliated with a Long Beach-based criminal street gang.

The Sheriff's Office Crime Analysis Unit was able to utilize evidence and data from a variety of sources to identify and track down the suspects.

The group targeted members of the Indian community by searching the Internet for open-source

information to identify families with common Indian surnames. Once identified, they would scout specific locations before breaking into the victims' homes. The suspects used pre-paid mobile phones to call the victims' residences prior to breaking in to ensure nobody was at home. The suspects also drove newer vehicles and dressed nicely to avoid raising suspicion among the victims' neighbors.

Shortly after the burglaries began, detectives reached out to members of the Indian community in Ventura County to warn them of the emerging trend. As a result of that outreach, several burglaries resulted in little or no loss of valuable property because the potential victims had taken precautions to protect their property.

These cases involved investigators from numerous law enforcement agencies sharing information and working together to identify the suspects involved. Among the various law enforcement jurisdictions, more than 100 residential burglaries of this type took place in a one-year period. The group averaged two burglaries per week during that time period.

Five of the suspects have been arrested, while four additional suspects are being sought and have outstanding warrants for their arrests.

Since the arrests were made and warrants were issued, there have been no additional cases of this type within Ventura County.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit arrested Jan Shmidt on June 4, 2014,

for manufacturing concentrated cannabis. Investigators served a search warrant at Shmidt's home aft they learned he was supplying Thousand Oaks teenagers and young adults with a form concentrated cannabis known as honey oil or wax.

Upon service of the search warrant, investigators discovered Shmidt had an active large scale butat honey oil lab. Butane honey oil labs are extremely dangerous and often times catch fire and explode. Shmidt had three industrial ovens operating when investigators entered the residence. He was active converting marijuana material into a concentrated form of the plant through the use of butane. The stove, with open flames, was also on in the residence, creating an extremely hazardous and volat situation for the neighborhood. Shmidt, as well as other individuals, in the residence were escorted away from the residence. The scene was immediately rendered safe through the assistance of the Le Angeles City Fire Department, Los Angeles City Department of Water and Power, a hazardo materials response team, and a law enforcement drug lab task force from LA IMPACT (The Le Angeles Interagency Metropolitan Police Apprehension Crime Task Force).

Among the items seized from the residence were several hundred pounds of marijuana, approximate two pounds of honey oil / wax, hundreds of cans of butane, over \$60,000 in cash, and a sophisticate surveillance system.

Investigators from LA IMPACT and support personnel from the city and county of Los Angeles spe over fifteen hours processing the scene and removing hazardous materials. Shmidt was arrested and booked into the Ventura County Jail. He is in custody in lieu of \$250,000 ba

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the Distr Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The task force's ma mission is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. A secondary, a equally important mission, is the identification and stopping of new trends of abuse among the county younger population set.

Narrative:

In January of 2013, McMillin was arrested by the Ventura Police Department for suspicion of robbery, assault, and hit and run that occurred at Olivas Golf Course on December 28, 2012. During this incident, McMillin stole a wallet from another golfer. When the victim noticed, he and his son chased McMillin into the parking lot. In an attempt to get away from the victim, McMillin struck the victim's son with his vehicle. This case is still pending in the Ventura Superior Court. McMillin was out of custody on \$350,000 bail, his next court date in Ventura County is June 24, 2014.

In February 2014, McMillin was observed tampering with vehicles at the Los Robles Golf Course in the City of Thousand Oaks. When witnesses attempted to contact McMillin, he fled the area but the witnesses were able to photograph Mcmillin and capture the license plate of his vehicle.

In April, 2014, the City of Thousand Oaks Special Enforcement Unit began monitoring McMillin's actions. On numerous occasions, McMillin was observed loitering at the Los Robles Golf Course, Simi Hills Golf Course in the City of Simi Valley, and other golf courses in Ventura, Los Angeles, and Orange counties. McMillin's was observed casing for potential thefts from vehicles and/or golf bags at the various courses.

McMillin's method of operation was to walk the parking lots of the golf courses looking for unlocked vehicles, once inside the vehicle he would look for a wallet or purse and remove the victim's credit cards or cash. When not casing the parking lots for unlocked vehicles, McMillin would walk around the golf course club house's looking for unattended golf bags. McMillin would open that bag and remove credit cards, cash or valuables from inside. The Ventura County Sheriff's Office Crime Analysis Unit has identified approximately 14 similar thefts in Ventura County within the past year.

On June 4, 2014, The Special Enforcement Unit surveilled McMillin from his residence in Ventura to the Monarch Beach Resort Golf Course in the City of Dana Point. McMillin was observed tampering with a golf bag that did not belong to him. McMillin was detained as he ran back to his vehicle. Detectives from the Special Enforcement Unit located the owner of the golf bag who confirmed a significant amount of cash had been removed from his golf bag. Two additional victims came forward who also had cash removed from their golf bags.

The City of Dana Point contracts with the Orange County Sheriff-Coroner Department for its police services. Patrol deputies responded to the scene to take crime reports and arrest McMillin for the thefts.

On 6/4/14, McMillin was booked into the Orange County Jail for the felony charge of: Penal Code Section 666 ' Petty theft with prior convictions. Due to being out on bail in Ventura County McMillin currently has no bail. McMillin is scheduled for court in Orange County on June 6, 2014.

Detectives from the Special Enforcement Unit returned to Ventura County and subsequently served a search warrant at McMillin's residence in the City of Ventura where no additional evidence was located.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department would like to remind the public not to leave valuables inside their vehicles and to lock their vehicles at all times. Additionally, while at the golf courses to keep a vigilant eye on your golf bag. Most crooks are simply looking for crime of opportunity.

Narrative:

Narcotics investigators arrested three members of a major heroin distribution organization known as 'The Boys', operating in western Ventura County. A significant amount of heroin and money was seized.

In April of this year, narcotics detectives from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office West County Street Team and the Santa Paula Police Department, began an investigation into heroin sales occurring in western Ventura County. Investigators identified a drug trafficking organization, known as 'The Boys,' who were conducting street level heroin sales in Oxnard, Ventura, and Santa Paula. During the investigation, Roberto Zaragoza was identified as being the heroin supplier for the two identified delivery drivers, Victor Castillo and Jonathan Cruz-Diaz. Detectives observed the drivers make numerous heroin sales throughout the three cities and surround county areas.

On June 11, Members of several Sheriff's investigative units, the Santa Paula Police Department, Oxnard Police Department, and the California Highway Patrol, served three Search Warrants as part of this investigation. At the apartment identified as belonging to Zaragoza in the 1200 block of Gonzales Road, Oxnard, detectives found approximately 360 grams of tar and powdered heroin, and \$10,000.00 in cash. At the apartment identified as belonging to Castillo and Cruz-Diaz, in the 600 block of Cuesta Del Mar, Oxnard, detectives located 27 balloons of heroin prepackaged for sale, and approximately \$6,400.00 in cash. It is the practice of this organization to package heroin in children's colored balloons, each containing .2 to.3 grams. At a residence in the 4100 block of Gonzales Road, in the county area near Oxnard, detectives located over two pounds of tar heroin. During the arrest of Castillo, he was found to be in possession of 126

balloons of tar heroin. Zaragoza was found to be in possession of \$4,500.00 in cash.

This investigation resulted in the total seizure of approximately 3.25 pounds of heroin and over \$21,000.00 in cash. Investigators believe The Boys heroin distribution ring was responsible for the majority of all heroin sales in the western portion of Ventura County.

The Sheriff's Narcotics Bureau, West County Street Team, is made up of narcotics detectives from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Santa Paula Police Department and the Oxnard Police Department. This team works cooperatively to conduct narcotics investigations in the western portion of Ventura County.

Narrative:

The Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on June 14, 2014, at an undisclosed location within the city limits between the hours of 6:00 pm and 3:00 am.

The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 people were killed by an impaired driver. 'Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 6 lives and resulted in 134 injury crashes harming 139 of our friends and neighbors,' said Sergeant Brad Clifton.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment and checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Nearly 90 percent of California drivers approve of DUI checkpoints.

DUI checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests

affording the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to Thousand Oaks Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver ' Call 9-1-1'.

Narrative:

On June 11, 2014, at approximately 5:30 AM, the Thousand Oaks Police Department arrested a male juvenile for attempted murder after he shot at a witness who interrupted a theft from a vehicle at the Biltmore Apartments parking lot in the City of Thousand Oaks.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department responded to the original call for service and learned that two suspects were in the parking lot looking into car windows when the witness observed them. The suspects ran from the area and one of them shot at the witness when he realized he was being followed. The other suspect continued running in another direction and was caught by deputies responding to the scene.

A perimeter around the complex was established and a search was initiated with the assistance of Sheriff canines and the helicopter. The second suspect was not immediately located.

An investigation was started which led detectives to an address in the City of Oxnard and the arrest of two additional people. One was a male juvenile who was later identified as the shooter and the second was an adult woman named Jessica Soto who was an accessory to the crime. The Oxnard residence was searched and a firearm matching the caliber used in the shooting was located.

Soto and Meza were both booked at the Main Jail. Meza was booked for conspiracy charges with his bail set at \$45,000 dollars and Soto was booked for being an accessory to the crime with her bail set at \$10,000 dollars. Both have a scheduled court date of June 13, 2014 for their arraignment in Superior Court. The male juvenile was lodged in Juvenile Hall.

Narrative:

In late January 2014, a market in the 700 block of Thousand Oaks Blvd. in the City of Thousand Oaks was the victim of a burglary. During the burglary, the suspects stole the victim's ATM machine from inside the business. The suspects, who were captured on security video surveillance, were seen using a metal hand dolly to smash the entry glass doors and remove the ATM.

Detectives from the Special Enforcement Unit were able to determine the suspects had used a stolen vehicle to commit the burglaries, and eventually located the vehicle in the City of Canoga Park. The Special Enforcement Unit conducted surveillance of the stolen vehicle and was able to identify two suspects, Stephen Gran and Robert Cassano.

Due to the area where the suspects lived, the Special Enforcement Unit began working with L.A.P.D. detectives who were also experiencing a rash of ATM burglaries. The investigation also led detectives to the Newport Beach area where another suspect, Daniel Sweeny, was identified in ATM burglaries. The information regarding Daniel Sweeny was given to Orange County Sheriff's Department detectives.

The Ventura County investigation concluded in May 2014, with the arrest of Robert Cassano and Stephen Gran for commercial burglary and an attempt commercial burglary. Cassano has already pled guilty and is pending sentencing. Gran's case was filed with the Ventura County District Attorney's Office and he is pending trial.

The Orange County Sheriff's Department's recently arrested of Daniel Sweeny, of Tustin, who they suspect is responsible for as many as 24 similar ATM thefts/burglaries in the Orange County area. The Special Enforcement Unit is working with the Orange County Sheriff's Department in an attempt to link Cassano to some of the crimes Sweeny is suspected of committing. The L.A.P.D. investigation is still ongoing.

The suspect was cooperative and was taken into custody without incident and brought to the Camarillo Police Station. The suspect admitted to threatening the other student, but indicated he had no intent of carrying out the threat. The suspect was cited for 422 PC, Criminal Threats. Weapons were removed from the suspect's residence and booked into the Sheriff's property room for safekeeping.

Sheriff's deputies contacted CIRT (Children's Intensive Response Team) for an evaluation and the suspect was taken for additional mental health treatment.

Narrative:

The search continues for a missing off-duty City of Arcadia firefighter in the back country north of Fillmore. Michael Herdman, age 36, was reported missing on the evening of June 15th. Numerous search & rescue resources have searched the rough terrain day and night during the past week.

Herdman was last seen by a hiking partner June 13th. Herdman's friend eventually returned to the starting point of the four-day backpacking loop. Many search & rescue resources have joined in the search, including teams from Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, Fresno County Sheriff's Department, Kern County Sheriff's Department, Orange County Sheriff's Department, San Luis Obispo County Sheriff's Department, Civil Air Patrol, Department of Homeland Security Rapid Response Team, and Ventura County Sheriff's Aviation Unit and Search & Rescue K-9's. Search & Rescue teams are specially trained personnel that volunteer their time away from work and their families to train and participate in rescue operations. Up to 75 personnel are attached to this incident each day.

Air Search & Rescue operations also include the use of the Qube Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS). The Ventura County Sheriff's Office received a temporary emergency certificate of authorization to deploy the UAS in the search area. Simi Valley based Aeronvironment contributed a Puma UAS in the search. Aeronvironment is operating the Puma with a certificate of authorization under direction from the University of Alaska.

Search & Rescue teams have been working in rugged terrain during warm daytime temperatures. Thus far, there have been four search team members injured during the incident, ranging from a rattlesnake bite

to heat exhaustion.

Hikers are discouraged from entering the search area as this operation continues.

Narrative:

On June 15, 2014, shortly after 9:30 am, Peter O'Neill was driving his full size Chevrolet pickup truck through the private roadway of Olivewood Drive. It is believed O'Neill suffered a medical episode; rendering him unconscious. Immediately thereafter, O'Neill's vehicle left the main traveled portion of the roadway and drove up a sloping hillside within the condominium complex. The front of the vehicle then collided with a large tree. A witness reported the collision by calling 911 and Deputy Kristopher Doepking responded to the scene Code-3 (lights and sirens activated).

Upon Deputy Doepking's arrival, he found O'Neill unconscious and slumped over in the vehicle's passenger seat with the engine still running. Concerned with being able to care for O'Neill with the pickup truck positioned on the unsteady hillside, Deputy Doepking gained entry to the vehicle and pulled O'Neill to safety. Once O'Neill was removed from the vehicle, Deputy Doepking immediately evaluated his vital signs and determined O'Neill was unconscious, not breathing and had a very faint pulse.

Deputy Doepking performed emergency rescue breaths for O'Neill and, in doing so, discovered O'Neill had a significant airway obstruction. By repositioning O'Neill's head and jaw, Deputy Doepking eliminated the airway obstruction and O'Neill started breathing, though his breathing was quite shallow and labored. O'Neill's pulse began to improve and he started showing signs of life. Ventura County Fire and American Medical Response (AMR) personnel arrived on scene and relieved Deputy Doepking's life saving efforts. O'Neill was transported to the Los Robles Emergency Room by AMR, where he is currently in the Intensive Care Unit listed in critical condition.

Ventura County Fire and AMR personnel praised Deputy Doepking for his quick actions explaining that had he not done what he did, O'Neill may very well have died at the scene.

Some may have the perception that law enforcement officers are only summoned to investigate and deal with individuals breaking the law, or when some form of a criminal complaint exists; that is simply not the case. Every sworn/uniformed patrol deputy with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office is trained in First Aid and CPR and they receive regular update training on the subject.

Many times when patrol deputies respond to calls for service, they are unaware until they arrive on scene that the issue might be a medical emergency; which is why they are equipped with rescue breathing masks and other Fist Aid equipment. It is then that they must take quick action and revert to their training. Conversely, there are many occasions wherein sheriff's deputies are first to arrive on scene (before fire department personnel or paramedics) and they must use their medical training to render aid and potentially save a life, as is the case here.

It is equally important to point out that the quick actions of the witness immediately calling 911 after the collision helped to speed up the response time by Deputy Doepking.

This program not only provides physical fitness from participating in athletic competitions, but also encourages social interaction and community involvement. Special Olympics athletes will be working with deputies as they serve customers at Tip-A-Cop.

Tip-A-Cop events are one of the main fundraisers for the Law Enforcement Torch Run. The Torch Run is part of a year-round, grassroots fundraising campaign by law enforcement agencies to benefit their local Special Olympics programs. The Torch Run makes its debut annually in the month of June when members of the Ventura County Sheriff's Office and Special Olympic Athletes carry the torch as it makes its way through Ventura County and continues to Long Beach for the start of the summer games. This year over 65 Sheriff's employees participated in the Torch Run.

Ventura County 'Avoid the 14' DUI Task Force

The Fourth of July is a favorite holiday for many Americans. Families and friends gather to celebrate our country with food, parades, parties, and fireworks. For many people, the celebration includes alcohol, but the holiday quickly goes from festive to fatal when people choose to drive after drinking. Over the July 4th holiday period in 2012 alone, 78 people were killed in alcohol impaired-driving crashes on our nation's roads.

To crack down on drunk driving this Fourth of July, The Avoid the 14 DUI Task Force will be out in full force, aggressively targeting those who put lives in danger. 'Every Ventura County law enforcement agency is ramping up their enforcement to make our roads safer this Fourth of July,' said Captain Jim Fryhoff. 'For everyone's sake, don't drink and drive or you will be targeted for arrest. The 'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over' campaign means zero tolerance for drunk driving ' no excuses.'

The Avoid the 14 DUI task force will be cracking down on drug and alcohol impaired driving, deploying officers to two (2) DUI/Drivers License checkpoints, and one (1) DUI saturation patrol. The CHP will be deploying all available officers onto freeways and county roads for its Maximum Enforcement Period (MEP).

Data from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) show that 10,322 people were killed in drunk-driving crashes in the United States in 2012'representing a third of all crash fatalities. Data shows that the Fourth of July holiday period is especially deadly. During the July 4th period in 2012 (6 p.m. on July 3 to 5:59 a.m. on July 5), there were 179 people killed in crashes, and 44 percent of those crashes were alcohol-impaired.

In every state, it is illegal to drive with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08% BAC, yet people continue to break the law and drive drunk. According to the FBI, over 1.28 million drivers were arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol or narcotics in 2012. And the rate of high-BAC impaired driving is astounding. In fatal crashes during the July 4th period in 2012, more than one fourth (28%) involved a driver or motorcycle operator with a BAC of .15 or higher ' almost twice the legal limit.

NHTSA data also reveals that 46 percent of young (age 18-34) drivers were drunk (BAC of .08 or higher) while driving in fatal crashes over the July 4th period in 2012(6 p.m. on July 3 to 5:59 a.m. on July 5). Motorcycle operators are also over represented as the highest percentage of alcohol impaired drivers in fatal crashes. In 2012, more than one-fourth (27%) of the motorcycle operators in fatal crashes had a BAC of .08 or higher.

Drunk drivers are more common at night, too. Over the July 4th period in 2012, more than a third (39%) of the drivers in nighttime fatal crashes (6 p.m. to 5:59 a.m.) were alcohol-impaired, as compared to 16 percent of drivers in fatal crashes during the day.

'This Fourth of July holiday, you can show your patriotism by helping to make Thousand Oaks roads safer for everyone,' said Avoid the 14 Captain Jim Fryhoff. 'Remember,' Captain Fryhoff warned, 'to *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*. It's as simple as that.' Law enforcement is not messing around this Independence Day: if you're caught driving drunk, you will be arrested. And keep in mind that aside from putting your life and the lives of others at risk, driving impaired can also lead to serious consequences. A DUI arrest can mean time in jail, loss of your license, and steep financial expenses; the average DUI costs about \$10,000.

Law Enforcement recommends these simple tips to prevent drunk driving:

- Plan a safe way home <u>before</u> the fun begins;
- Before drinking, designate a sober driver;
- Figure impaired, use a taxi, call a sober friend or family member, or use public transportation;
- If you happen to see a drunk driver on the road, don't hesitate to Call 9-1-1;
- If you know someone who is about to drive or ride while impaired, take their keys and help them make other arrangements to get to where they are going safely.

Narrative:

Major Crimes detectives and Jail personnel are investigating a Pre-Trial Detention Facility inmate death that occurred at Community Memorial Hospital in Ventura.

On June 27, 2014, the Oxnard Police Department arrested Juan Zavala for resisting arrest, resisting an executive officer and escape from arrest. Oxnard Police transported Zavala to the Ventura County Medical Center where he was treated and cleared for booking by hospital staff. At 10:14 PM, Oxnard Police booked Zavala at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility for the listed charges.

During the booking process, Zavala attempted to kick a deputy and was placed in a cell for his safety and constant monitoring. Zavala displayed bizarre behavior and signs of being under the influence of drugs.

At approximately 2:45 AM, just 4 hours from the time Zavala was brought into the jail, medical staff and jail personnel came to the aid of Inmate Zavala who was in distress in his cell. Staff provided emergency medical aid while additional resources were summoned. Ventura City Fire personnel and paramedics arrived and Zavala was transported to Community Memorial Hospital by ambulance. Zavala was treated by hospital staff and later pronounced dead at about 2:00 PM.

The cause of death is under investigation by the Sheriff's Major Crimes Unit, pending an autopsy by the Medical Examiner.

Narrative:

The Moorpark Police Department and the Ventura County Sheriff's Office would like to remind residents to be careful with your pets, especially dogs, over the 4th of July Holiday.

Everybody needs to be careful with fireworks around their young and older dogs that have not been conditioned to gunfire or loud noises. People don't think about fireworks until it's too late, so think about it now. Majority of dogs don't have a problem with it, but some do. Why take a chance' No point in stressing your dogs out.

Fireworks are unnatural. You don't have a lot of control over when or where the noise happens. It's a lot harder to fix a noise sensitive dog than it is to prevent noise sensitivity in the first place.

Here are some tips to prevent fireworks sensitivity in your dogs:

- Please <u>don't</u> bring your dogs to fireworks shows or any other fireworks related events.
- Keep your dogs as far away from fireworks as possible.
- If possible, bring your dogs inside, in a closed-off interior room.
- Block out the noise with a TV, radio, or white-noise maker.
- Check with your neighbors about their fireworks plans and coordinate with them.
- Ask for a phone call before they start.
- Be considerate of those neighbors with dogs.

Sometimes the fireworks start before the 4th of July and run a few days after the holiday, so please be mindful.

There is <u>NO REASON</u> for a dog to be around fireworks, and residents should be considerate of those neighbors having dogs nearby not to set off fireworks. Usually, dogs conditioned to gunfire or loud noises can handle the noise of fireworks, but there really isn't anything good about them as far as dogs are concerned.

Another concern other than noise sensitivity, is a dog will hurt themselves trying to get away from the noise. Your dogs may also attempt to escape their back yard or confined areas. If for some reason your dog does escape, please contact Ventura County Animal Services (Camarillo Animal Shelter 600 Aviation Drive, Camarillo, CA 93010) or (670 W Los Angeles Ave, Simi Valley, CA 93065) at 805-388-4341 or 888-223-PETS.

Please take the time to protect your pets while the possibilities of unexpected explosions are

around. Fireworks happen twice a year normally around New Year's and Fourth of July. You might want to condition your dogs to fireworks, especially if you live where your dogs will be exposed a couple of weeks out of the year. A reputable dog trainer can assist you with the necessary training.

Remember, if you want to shoot off fireworks, be safe and go to a location where safe and sane fireworks are legal to use.

First and foremost of concern is the safety of our residents. The Moorpark Police Department and the Ventura County Sheriff's Office asks the cooperation of all citizens in preventing injury and property damage by refraining from the use or possession of all fireworks especially illegal fireworks.

Residents can report the unlawful use of fireworks by calling the police non-emergency number at 805-654-9511. Callers are asked to determine as accurately as possible the location of the suspected unlawful activity, and relate the specific information to police call takers.

A breakdown of the 2013 collection totals is as follows: Ojai station ' 143 pounds, Fillmore station ' 93.9 pounds, Camarillo station ' 2,197 pounds, Moorpark station ' 249.3 pounds, Headquarters station ' 257 pounds, and Thousand Oaks station, 2,348 pounds. The Ventura County Sheriff's Office would like to thank the citizens of Ventura County, for their outstanding effort to make our communities safer.

Narrative:

Thousand Oaks, CA 'Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on July 5, 2014, at an undisclosed location within the city limits between the hours of 6:00 pm and 3:00 am.

The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. 'Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 6 lives and resulted in 136 injury crashes harming 139 of our friends and neighbors,' said Sergeant Brad Clifton.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most

prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Nearly 90 percent of California drivers approve of DUI checkpoints.

DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests affording the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to Thousand Oaks Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver ' Call 9-1-1'.

Narrative:

In the early morning hours of July 7, 2014, patrol deputies were dispatched to a stabbing that had just occurred in the 800 block of Warwick Avenue in the City of Thousand Oaks. When deputies arrived they found the victim, Jose Barragan, lying on the ground with several bystanders trying to treat his injuries. Ventura County Fire and American Medical Response arrived shortly after the patrol deputies and began treating Barragan. Barragan was transported to the Los Robles Hospital for his injuries. While at the hospital it was discovered that Barragan had multiple stab wounds to his upper torso and neck. Barragan was treated for his injuries and placed into the Intensive Care Unit.

The reporting parties to the incident advised dispatch that the suspects had left the area in a vehicle driving toward Wilbur Road. Patrol deputies responding to the scene observed and stopped the vehicle nearby. The driver of the vehicle was Brianna Ayala, the front passenger was Jonathan Alinei, and the rear passenger was Hector Martinez.

The investigation revealed this was a gang related attack. The victim, Jose Barragan, is a documented member of a criminal street gang in the City of Thousand Oaks, and the suspects are documented members of a rival criminal street gang in the City of Thousand Oaks.

Through their investigation, Detectives identified Brandon Navarro as another suspect in the gang related attack. Brandon Navarro is also a documented member of the rival criminal street gang in the City of Thousand Oaks.

On July 8, 2014, Detectives with the Special Enforcement / Gang Unit conducted surveillance in the City of Glendale and took Navarro into custody without incident.

All four suspects were booked into the Ventura County Pre-Trial Detention Facility for Penal Code sections 664/187 ' Attempted Murder, 186.22(a) ' Street Terrorism Act, and 182(a)(1) ' Conspiracy with bail amounts ranging from \$500,000 to \$1,000,000.

Jonathan Alinei, Hector Martinez, and Brianna Ayala are scheduled to appear in Ventura County Superior Court today July 9, 2014, at 1:30 PM. Since Brandon Navarro was arrested a day later he is scheduled to appear in Ventura County Superior Court on July 10, 2014 at 1:30 PM.

Its mission is to provide high quality, effective, and educationally sound training on alcohol responsibility and the law.

The enforcement strategy programs include 'Shoulder Tap' and 'Minor Decoy' operations. These operations use underage decoys, under the direct supervision of law enforcement officers, to solicit adults outside ABC licensed stores to buy the minor alcohol, or in an attempt to purchase alcoholic beverages from ABC licensed establishments.

The goal of the Grant is to: Ensure ABC licensees in the VCSO's jurisdiction are adhering to all applicable laws; Ensure licensed establishments sell alcoholic beverages in a responsible manner; Apprehend licensee violators and those willing to purchase alcoholic beverages for minor adults and juveniles; Reduce the ability for youth access to alcohol; Create public awareness through media releases regarding these enforcement activities in order to deter any future violations.

Today, at approximately 10:56AM, a Thousand Oaks Motorcycle Officer attempted to stop a vehicle traveling erratically in the area of Thousand Oaks Boulevard and Moorpark Road. Narrative:

Investigators from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit received a Crime

Stoppers Tip at the end of July 2014, stating that Anthony Barragan was dealing cocaine and

prescription drugs from his residence in the 1800 block of Dorrit Street, Newbury Park. The tip detailed

heavy drug traffic occurring at the residence during all hours of the day. Investigators conducted

surveillance at the location on July 31, and almost immediately saw Anthony Barragan conduct a drug

deal with a 17 year old juvenile. The juvenile drove a short distance away from Barragan's residence

and then appeared to use cocaine in plain view of the detectives. Investigators arranged for the juvenile

to be stopped by patrol deputies. Patrol deputies ultimately arrested the juvenile for under the influence and possession of cocaine. Based on the observations of the investigating detectives, combined with the crime stoppers tip, a search warrant was sought and obtained for Barragan's residence.

On 8-1-14, investigators watched Barragan's residence. Detectives saw Barragan get into a vehicle that arrived in front of his residence. Investigators, suspecting Barragan was conducting a drug deal, detained the occupants of the vehicle and Barragan a short distance away. Investigators confirmed Barragan was conducting a cocaine deal with the driver, Angel Bracamontes, and his passenger, Roselyn Marceleno. Barragan was arrested for sales of cocaine, as well as the sales charge to a minor from the day prior. Bracamontes and Marceleno were arrested for possession of cocaine.

As detectives were planning to serve the search warrant at the residence, Jesse Place walked out of the house and drove away. He was also detained and found to be under the

influence of cocaine. Investigators served the search warrant at the house and discovered additional cocaine possessed for sale in Barragan's bedroom. Barragan was additionally arrested for possession for sales of cocaine.

Barragan remains in custody in lieu of \$50,000 bail. He is facing several years in prison for selling cocaine to a minor. Bracamontes, Marceleno, Place, and the 17 year old all have pending court dates.

In the recent past, investigators from the pharmaceutical crimes unit have made a total of ten arrests of teenagers or young adults selling and possessing cocaine in the areas of Newbury Park, Thousand Oaks, and Westlake.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a full time task force comprised of members of law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The task force's main mission is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. A secondary, and equally important mission, is identifying and stopping emerging drug trends among our county's youth.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office East County Narcotics Street Team assisted in this investigation.

Narrative:

On February 9, 2014, Ventura resident Michael Zermeno overdosed on heroin at his home in the 6200 block of Freemont Court. He never regained consciousness and died two days later in the hospital. An investigation revealed Zermeno purchased the heroin from Matthew Slough in the City of Ventura just prior to overdosing. Investigators from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) sought and obtained a search warrant for Slough's residence in the 7100 block of Wren Court, Ventura. Detectives served the search warrant and arrested Slough for sales of heroin on February 27, 2014. Slough secured bail and was released from custody on March 17, 2014. Investigators from the PCU continued for the next several months to gather evidence relating Slough to Zermeno's death.

During the months of June and July 2014, the Ventura County Sheriff's Gang Unit received information about unlawful firearm activities involving Matthew Slough.

On July 31, 2014, members of the Sheriff's Gang Unit executed a search warrant at Matthew Slough's residence in Ventura. During the warrant service, Matthew Slough and his father Troy Slough were arrested for weapons and narcotics violations. There were several firearms located inside the residence, including 2 manufactured zip guns as well as homemade silencers and high capacity magazines. Slough and his father were also found to be under the influence of a controlled substance and a concentrated cannabis manufacturing lab was discovered. Slough and his father were booked into custody at the Ventura County Jail. Troy Slough was later released pending a future court date.

On August 6, 2014, Matthew Slough was charged by the Ventura County District Attorney with involuntary manslaughter from the February sale to Zermeno. He was also charged with an enhancement of causing great bodily injury or death in the commission of dealing heroin. Slough remains in custody and is facing several years in state prison.

Narrative:

On August 10, 2014, at approximately 5:30 a.m. sheriff's dispatch received a call from an observant citizen who reported seeing three juveniles going through vehicles in the mid-block of Los Padres Drive in Thousand Oaks. This citizen also reported seeing a vehicle associated with the subjects quickly driving away from the area. Uniformed Thousand Oaks patrol deputies quickly responded to the area and began a search for these suspicious subjects. Sheriff's deputies located Caulen Boyd and a male juvenile in the same general area where the witness had reported seeing them going through vehicles. After a preliminary investigation, deputies determined Boyd and the juvenile were entering unlocked cars in the area and stealing personal property. Boyd and the male juvenile were subsequently arrested. Additional investigative methods were utilized, which ultimately helped to identify three additional male juveniles involved in the vehicle thefts. The three additional male juvenile suspects were located and arrested.

Follow-up investigation has revealed that the suspect's crimes were not solely concentrated in the Los Padres Dr. area. It was discovered that the suspects committed thefts encompassing a vast area; stretching from the south end to the north end of Thousand Oaks.

Deputies were able to identify a vehicle as being involved in the thefts and a Thousand Oaks residence where the stolen items were stashed. The suspects entered as many as 40, potentially more, unlocked vehicles in residential communities and stole personal property. At this time, the sheriff's office has not identified all of the victims. Nearly 100 stolen items were recovered during this investigation.

Citizens from this residential neighborhood who discover that they are the victims of theft are strongly encouraged to contact the Thousand Oaks Police Department. Upon doing so, Thousand Oaks Detectives will make arrangements to have the stolen items identified and returned to their respective owners.

In recent months, the Thousand Oaks Police Department has noticed a significant increase in thefts from vehicles. In some instances, force was used to gain access into the vehicles where personal property was stolen. In most cases, however, the owners simply neglected to lock their vehicles and they left personal property inside, which was subsequently stolen.

In conducting multiple investigations into these vehicle thefts, patrol officers and sheriff's detectives have noticed that a high number of these crimes are being committed by juveniles and young adults. The locations in our city where these vehicles are being targeted are random. There is simply no profile to create geographically. Teenagers and young adults in all areas of Thousand Oaks are entering unlocked vehicles and steeling property. Some of the most common items stolen include wallets, credit cards, cell phones, cell phone chargers, lap tops, flashlights, sunglasses and U.S. currency, including loose change-coins left behind in an ash tray or other compartment. In many instances, credit cards which are stolen are often used by the suspects to purchase items from local businesses before the victim becomes aware of the theft.

The thefts are all too often a huge burden to the victims; many of whom have to spend hours of their time notifying their financial institutions, credit bureaus and other entities of the crimes so as to prevent future financial loss or identity theft.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department has continually reminded vehicle owners to lock their vehicles securely to reduce the likelihood of theft. We would also like to remind citizens to be alert and diligent as it relates to observing vehicles or persons who appear suspicious in nature. Obviously the hour of day should likely play a factor when considering whether or not someone is or is not suspicious. Certainly a 15 year old male wearing a backpack walking down a residential street at 3:00 pm may not, in and of itself, be suspicious. Now, take that same person and change the time to 3:00 am, that is suspicious and that person needs to be contacted by law enforcement.

Thousand Oaks patrol deputies and detectives have arrested multiple juveniles and young adults who have been in possession of stolen property and have admitted to committing these thefts from vehicles. Some of these individuals have no other criminal background and, for the most part, are productive teenagers that come from good families and do well in school. Many of these individuals have openly told deputies and investigators that there is a new trend or fad, if you will, that the youth in our community call 'Car Hopping' or 'Car Fishing.' According to these teenagers and young adults, car hopping is when a group of subjects will go to a random residential community, be it on foot or in a vehicle, and walk up and down the street checking to see if car doors are unlocked. If the cars are in fact unlocked, these perpetrators will enter the vehicle and take whatever property of value is inside. Many times the suspects carry a backpack on their person to quickly store the stolen property. Some suspects or groups are more sophisticated than others and have a 'look out' nearby, who will alert them upon the discovery of law enforcement or curious homeowners. Statistics have shown these crimes most likely occur late at night and in the early morning hours when most homeowners are asleep.

According to many of the suspects who have cooperated with law enforcement, they seem to take the stance that 'everyone is doing it.' The Ventura County Sheriff's Office wants to point out that this so-called car hopping is not a fad, it is a crime. What many of these teenagers and young adults simply do not comprehend is that entering another person's vehicle without permission and stealing the property of another in many cases is a burglary ' a felony in California. It is also significant to point out that when two or more persons conspire, to *commit any crime*, it is a felony under California Penal Code section 182. So, these juveniles and young adults who head out in the hours of darkness with their friends to go 'Car Hopping' end up committing felony crimes and their ignorance to the laws will not stand up in court as a legal excuse.

We have found that in many cases wherein juveniles were arrested for these vehicle thefts their parents were completely taken by surprise. Often times the parents or guardians simply thought that their child was 'spending the night at a friend's house.' The Thousand Oaks Police Department would like to remind parents and guardians alike how important it is to know where there sons and daughters are, most specifically, as it pertains to juveniles during the hours of curfew; which are 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. We as a law enforcement agency certainly understand that parents often try to establish a certain element of respect and trust with their children in the hopes that their sons and daughters will make good decisions in life. Often the teens in our community can become easily influenced by peer pressure, which at times may result in criminal acts being perpetrated, such is the case with this car hopping phenomenon. Parents and guardians are the first line of defense in teaching and mentoring the youth in our community and educating them about the harm that comes from committing crime.

Now that the school year is about to begin, the Camarillo Police Department and Pleasant Valley School District would like to remind Camarillo residents who drive around the city's schools to be mindful of children walking or riding their bicycles to and from school. Drivers are reminded to be patient in or around these school zones as traffic is typically backed up with parents who are attempting to drop off their children at school. It is recommended that if you do not have children attending a school, you find an alternate route during the school hours of 7:00 AM ' 4:00 PM in order to avoid any traffic congestion in front of our city schools. Parents are also reminded to teach their children proper bicycle riding safety. The Camarillo Police Department would like to remind parents that children under the age of 18 must wear helmets properly while riding a bicycle, scooter or skateboard per CVC 21212(a). Studies show that 74-85% of bicycle related injuries could have been prevented with the proper use of a helmet and using proper bicycle safety. Proper use means buying a good helmet, making sure it fits, and making sure to buckle the chinstrap, while fitting it properly under the chin. We would like to remind children to look for an intersection that has a crossing guard or a marked crosswalk before crossing, as this is the safest way to cross the street. The Camarillo Police Department's Traffic Unit will be providing extra saturation patrols to school zones, during the first few weeks of the school year.

A bicycle is considered a vehicle and while riding you must obey the rules of the road. The Camarillo Police Department does have a limited amount of helmets and safety gear available for free, provided to families dealing with financial hardships. Narrative:

An aerial reconnaissance mission discovered illegal marijuana cultivation in the Los Padres National Forest north of the City of Ojai. One suspect was arrested.

In July 2014, Sheriff's Air Unit and narcotics detectives conducted an aerial reconnaissance mission in search of marijuana growing illegally in the Ventura County backcountry. Investigators located a large marijuana garden in the Los Padres National Forest north of the City of Ojai, in the Rose Valley area.

On August 12, a follow up flight was made in preparation for an eradication scheduled for August 14. It was discovered that approximately three fourths of the plants had been harvested. Investigators were dropped into the site and were searching for evidence when the Air Unit saw two subjects running through the brush. Detectives chased one subject through the heavy brush until he was eventually lost. The helicopter was able to maintain visual contact while another helicopter was summoned to bring additional personnel. Upon the arrival of the second helicopter, Josue Cardenas was taken into custody by a member of the Sheriff's Air Unit. He was booked into the Sheriff's Main Jail for cultivation of marijuana and resisting arrest.

On August 14, members of the Sheriff's Mountain Marijuana Eradication Team, the California National Guard, and the California Department of Justice Campaign Against Marijuana Planting (C.A.M.P.) eradicated the illegal marijuana cultivation. 847 marijuana plants, 5 to 6 feet tall, were eradicated and an additional 12 pounds of processed marijuana was seized. The campsite and cooking locations were removed as well as hundreds of feet of irrigation tubing, fertilizers, and trash. The suspects had diverted water from a natural spring approximately one half mile away. It appeared that several people had been working in the cultivation prior to the eradication.

As we embark upon the school season, the Thousand Oaks Police Department would like to remind parents, students, and motorists to follow basic traffic and pedestrian safety rules when traveling throughout the City, especially in school zones.

By adhering to the following traffic safety tips, the number of accidents in and around school zones can be reduced:

Motorists should be aware of children on sidewalks and crossing streets before and after school since many do not pay attention to vehicular traffic.

Motorists need to be extra alert for sudden movements into the roadway by young people riding bicycles or walking to and from neighborhood schools.

Parents/drivers are encouraged to allow sufficient time to drive their children to school and not to double park to allow passengers to exit the vehicle.

Thousand Oaks, CA ' The Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Drivers License Checkpoint on August 16, 2014, at an undisclosed location within the city limits between the hours of 9:00 pm and 3:00 am.

The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 people were killed by an impaired driver. 'Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 6 lives and resulted in 136 injury crashes harming 139 of our friends and neighbors,' said Sergeant Brad Clifton.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving. Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Nearly 90 percent of California drivers approve of DUI checkpoints.

DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests affording the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the Thousand Oaks Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver ' Call 9-1-1'.

On Saturday August 16, 2014, the Ventura County Sheriff's Office deployed 50 deputies into the field for the purpose of conducting probation / parole sweeps in the City of Thousand Oaks. The Thousand Oaks Special Enforcement Unit wanted to take a proactive approach and focus the searches primarily on gang members, drug users, and thieves. This operation was funded by a California State grant for supervising post-release and serious habitual offenders, due to state prison realignment.

The objective of the operation was to take a <u>zero-tolerance</u> approach to enforcing the individuals probation / parole terms as outlined by the court. At approximately 7:00 AM, Sheriff's Deputies began knocking on doors of the 75 targeted residences. The residential searches included the areas of Thousand Oaks, Newbury Park, Westlake, and Oak Park.

The operation netted 22 arrests, for charges that included the following: Possession of methamphetamine, under the influence of controlled substances, possession of drug paraphernalia, warrants, providing false information to peace officers, resisting arrest, possession of blank prescription notes, possession of stolen property, trespassing, and probation violations. Deputies also located and seized a handgun; however, no arrests have been made regarding the handgun.

Subjects that were not cited and released were booked into the Ventura County Jail.

The two Fillmore Search & Rescue Team members located the victim walking in the area of Via Pescador and Avenida Acaso. The Search & Rescue members contacted Sheriff's Communication Center and advised they had located the missing subject. Deputies went to the location and the man was positively identified as the missing victim. He was returned to his home and was not injured.

All three of the subjects were arrested for BP 25658(a) / furnishing alcohol to a minor. One of the subjects was additional arrested for PC 1203.2(a) / violation of probation, and VC 23247 / ignition interlock device prohibitions. The Thousand Oaks Police Department wants to thank the other 27 subjects who refused to purchase alcohol for the minors.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department's Bike Team will continue to conduct periodic operations in an effort to prevent minors' access to alcohol.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department would like to remind the public that selling alcohol to, or purchasing alcohol for, minors is illegal and that alcohol is a factor in many homicides, suicides, and other unintentional injuries which along with car crashes are the four leading causes of death in 15-20 year olds. The Ventura County Sheriff's Office wants to remind the public to report incidents of underage drinking and illegal purchasing of alcohol.

Narrative:

On August 21, 2014, at approximately 2:45 PM, patrol deputies, the Special Enforcement /Gang Unit, and Detectives responded to a fight and possible stabbing that had just occurred in the 400 block of Hillcrest Drive in the City of Thousand Oaks. Deputies ultimately found the victim, Johnny Lomeli, hiding in a garage and being treated by a friend. Deputies saw the victim was bleeding from an apparent stab wound to his back as well as a laceration to his head. Ventura County Fire Department and American Medical Response responded to the scene and transported Lomeli to Los Robles Hospital for his injuries. While at the hospital, it was discovered that Lomeli had suffered a stab wound to his back that caused internal injuries. Lomeli's injuries were not life threatening.

The investigation revealed the victim, Johnny Lomeli, is a documented Thousand Oaks gang member and the suspects, Eddie Martinez and Israel Bojorquez, are documented gang members from the City of Oxnard. On August 21, 2014, at approximately 6:40 PM, with the assistance of the Sheriff's Gang Unit, the Special Enforcement Unit was able to locate and arrest Martinez as he was walking on Pleasant Valley Road in the City of Oxnard. At approximately 7:40 PM, the Special Enforcement Unit also located and arrested Bojorquez at a residence in the 5200 Block of Cypress Drive in the City of Oxnard.

Both Martinez and Bojorquez were booked into the Ventura County Pre-Trial Detention Facility for Penal Code sections 245(a) ' Assault with a Deadly Weapon, and 186.22(a) ' Street Terrorism Act with bail amounts ranging from \$105,000 to \$130,000. Martinez was also arrested for an outstanding misdemeanor vandalism warrant.

Eddie Martinez and Israel Bojorquez are scheduled to appear in Ventura County Superior Court on August 25, 2014, at 1:30 PM.

Narrative:

Law enforcement investigators have interrupted a complex criminal enterprise that was responsible for the distribution of large quantities of narcotics from Mexico into Ventura County and other parts of the United States. The investigation has culminated with the arrests of several individuals, including influential Mexican Mafia members. The suspects have been indicted by the Ventura County District Attorney's Office.

The year-long joint investigation was led by investigators from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office who formed a task force comprised of various local and federal agencies. The investigation found that members of the Mexican Mafia were conspiring with Drug Trafficking Organizations (D.T.O.) and the Sinaloa Cartel to import narcotics into the United States, including Ventura County.

The investigation found that the Mexican Mafia members controlled a vast network and used proceeds of the drug sales to fund their criminal enterprise. The Mexican Mafia used its reputation for violence to extort and control drug trafficking. The criminal origination also distributed narcotics to local gangs for the purposes of sales. Some of the proceeds were used to purchase guns for various gang members.

Thus far, detectives have seized \$4,375,000 in cash and illicit drugs with a street value of over \$5,000,000. The indictments list charges including extortion, conspiracy, criminal street gang enhancements, sales of controlled substances, and possession for sales of controlled substances.

- 35 firearms
- 69 pounds of methamphetamine
- Several liters of liquid methamphetamine
- 52 pounds of cocaine
- 3 pounds of tar heroin
- 28 pounds of 'China White' heroin

Narrative:

Two suspects were arrested on Thursday for two vehicle burglaries that occurred at a restaurant parking lot in the 1600 Block of Daily Drive in Camarillo.

On August 29, 2014 at 9:10 AM, Camarillo patrol deputies responded to a vehicle burglary in progress call in the parking lot of the IHop restaurant. Arriving deputies walked to the back parking lot and observed one of the suspects taking property from one of the vehicles. When the suspect saw the deputy, he immediately ran to an awaiting car, a 2003 silver Honda Accord. The car, with the three subjects inside, fled the parking lot at a high rate of speed, almost causing an accident upon doing so.

Another responding officer observed the vehicle fleeing the scene at a high rate of speed and began to pursue the vehicle. The vehicle fled through residential streets at approximately 70 MPH. The deputy lost sight of the vehicle briefly as it turned onto a cul-de-sac in the 1900 block of Yolanda Street. The deputy turned onto Yolanda Street and observed the two passengers fleeing from the vehicle and jumping over neighborhood fences. The driver of the vehicle turned the car away from the deputy in an effort to flee the cul-de-sac. The deputy attempted to cut-off the suspect's escape route and in doing so the suspect vehicle collided with the push bar of the patrol vehicle causing minor damage. The suspect vehicle then fled southbound on Murray Street at a high rate of speed.

The deputy pursued the two passengers on foot as other arriving patrol units set-up a perimeter. The Sheriff's K-9 Unit was requested and responded as well as a helicopter from the Air Unit. A responding officer located one of the suspects and detained him until he was positively identified by a witness.

A short time later, a citizen called Sheriff's dispatch to report a person, driving a silver Honda, had cut her off and was driving at a high rate of speed in the area of Arneill and Ventura Boulevard. Another caller advised that a subject was seen running eastbound on Ventura Boulevard toward Glenn Drive. Deputies responded to the area and located a 2003 silver Honda Accord with collision damage consistent with the damage sustained from colliding with the deputy's patrol car. There was also property visible in the back seat, consistent with the property taken from the two vehicle burglaries.

A short time later, a citizen at the Glenn Apartments notified dispatch that a subject matching the Honda driver's description was seen getting into a taxi cab. The taxi was then observed by a deputy, getting onto southbound Highway 101. Detectives attempted to overtake the taxi cab on the freeway without success. Ultimately, detectives were able to contact the taxi driver and have him pull into a gas station in Canoga Park. This gave detectives time to catch up to the vehicle and arrest the suspect. The suspect was taken into custody without incident

Castro was identified as the driver of the vehicle and was arrested and booked for two counts of vehicle burglary, and felony evading. Ramos-Cisneros was identified as the suspect taking the property from the vehicles. He was arrested for two counts of vehicle burglary and resisting or delaying a peace officer.

Narrative:

Improving Motorcycle Safety Aim of Thousand Oaks Police Department Operation

Careless motorists as well as riders get special scrutiny

The Thousand Oaks Police Department will be conducting a specialized Motorcycle Safety Enforcement Operation on September 7, 2014, in an effort to lower deaths and injuries. Extra officers will be on duty patrolling areas frequented by motorcyclists and where motorcycle crashes occur. Officers will be looking for violations made by drivers and riders alike that can lead to motorcycle crashes. They will be cracking down on both those operating regular vehicles and motorcycles who are under the influence of drugs or alcohol, speeding, making illegal turns, or any other dangerous violation.

Motorcycle fatalities saw a phenomenal drop of 37 percent from 2008 to 2010, but then rose 23 percent by 2012. Operations like this are aimed at curbing any more rises in motorcycle deaths and sending the numbers back downward.

In 2013, there were a total of 38 traffic collisions involving motorcycles in the City of Thousand Oaks. Fifteen motorcyclists suffered injuries, and two motorcyclists were killed.

California collision data reveals that primary causes of motorcycle-involved crashes include speeding, unsafe turning and impairment due to alcohol and other drugs by both riders and drivers alike. The Thousand Oaks Police Department is also reminding all motorists to always be alert and watch out for motorcycles, especially when turning and changing lanes.

Riders can get training through the California Motorcyclist Safety Program. Information and training locations are available at www.CA-msp.org or 1-877 RIDE 411 or 1-877-743-3411.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The message to all drivers and motorcyclists is: share in the responsibility and do your part by safely 'sharing the road.'

The Sheriff's Office is providing a valuable resource to the community by setting up disposal bins for the National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day, which takes place Saturday, September 27, 2014 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

The event is a collaborative effort between local law enforcement agencies and the Drug Enforcement Administration to encourage residents to properly get rid of their expired or unused drugs.

The goal is to keep these products out of the hands of children. Many household pharmaceuticals are sold and traded among teenagers, who often help themselves to their parents' medications. The consequences of medications getting into the wrong hands and being abused can be deadly.

Preventing a tragedy can be as simple as taking your unused or expired medications to any of our substations or headquarters and disposing of them properly. Dry medications should be placed in Ziploc bags, and liquid medications should be in sealed containers.

People often ask how they should dispose of expired or unused medications.

The most common questions are, 'Can I flush them down the toilet, or should they go in the trash"

The answer is no to both. Flushing them puts the dissolved chemicals into the water supply. Throwing them away puts the chemicals in the landfill.

The following items can be accepted: prescription medications, over-the-counter medications, medication samples, medications for pets, vitamins, medicated ointments/lotions, inhalers, or liquid medication in leak-proof containers.

The following items cannot be accepted: needles (sharps), controlled substances, medical waste, or IV bags.

This morning at 5:39 a.m., Headquarters Sergeant Jim Kenney was on patrol in the area of Faria Beach on Pacific Coast Highway. Sgt. Narrative:

On 9/11/2014, at about 1620 hours, Sheriff's deputies from the Headquarters Station and the Sheriff's Gang Unit responded to reports of a shooting near the 1000 block of Collins Drive in the area of El Rio. The initial call indicated a male victim was shot at and fled the scene holding his neck.

Sheriff's deputies and detectives located the victim. He had suffered superficial wounds to his face and neck which did not require medical treatment. Several witnesses were contacted and Sheriff's Gang Unit detectives quickly identified Bobby Medina, a resident of El Rio, as the suspect. Medina is on probation for narcotics violations.

Detectives from the Sheriff's Gang Unit located Medina at his residence and arrested him for possession of a controlled substance shortly after the attempted murder. As the investigation progressed, additional evidence suggested that Medina was in fact the suspect in the attempted murder. A search warrant was served at Medina's residence and several items related to the shooting investigation were seized.

Medina was ultimately booked into the Pre-Trial Detention Facility on charges of attempted murder, assault with a firearm, and prohibited person with a firearm / ammunition. Medina's bail amount is set at \$525,000.

On 9/13/14, members of the Sheriff's Gang Unit and Camarillo Special Enforcement Detail conducted search warrant services and probation searches in the El Rio community pursuant to the attempt murder investigation. During the searches, two firearms were seized, including one believed to be used in the shooting.

During one of the searches, Gerald Silva was arrested for various weapon and gang related offenses. Silva is a documented criminal street gang member. Silva was booked into the Pre-Trial Detention Facility with his bail amount set at \$105,000.

The investigation is on-going. Detectives are seeking possible witnesses to the crime or anyone with knowledge of the crime.

The Camarillo Police Department is partnering with the Camarillo Health Care District in launching a new program designed to aid adults in the community that are at risk.

For several years, the Camarillo Police Department has offered a program called 'Kid Print' at no cost to families in the community. Kid Print is offered nationwide at Law Enforcement agencies and varies from agency to agency. As part of the Camarillo Police Department's program, parents are given a small plastic card that contains a fingerprint, photograph, and specific information about their child, in case the child is ever lost or missing. Parents can present this card to Law Enforcement in case of an emergency. Additionally, Camarillo Police can create an instant flyer with the software that is included in the Kid Print program. Over 10,000 'Kid Prints' have been completed through the Camarillo Police Department, since the implementation of this program.

Since there are several at risk adults and many senior living facilities in Camarillo, the Camarillo Police Department wanted to develop a no cost program similar to 'Kid Print' to address these needs in the community. The Camarillo Police Department is pleased to announce the beginning of the 'Adult At Risk Information Card Program.' The 'Adult At Risk Information Card' will contain the following information: name, photo, date of birth, height, weight, phone number, address, known disability or illness, communication method, and two contact numbers and addresses. The types of at risk adults and families that may find this card helpful are those that may have the following diagnosis or disabilities: Alzheimer's, Autism / Asperger Syndrome, Blind or Low Vision, Brain Injury, Deaf or Low Hearing, Dementia, Diabetes, Down Syndrome, Epilepsy or Seizures, Mental Illness or some type of physical disability.

The Camarillo Police Department will work in conjunction with the Camarillo Health Care District to bring this program to the community. The Camarillo Health Care District will provide space at their facilities to provide this service and act as a liaison to the other adult facilities in the community in setting up dates and times for appointments. For those in the community that are confined to a residence, the Camarillo Police Department will bring this service to them.

Two cards will be provided to at risk adults, one for the adult and one for the caregiver. The cards will be retained by the at risk adult and the caregiver and can be presented to law enforcement should the at risk adult become lost or disoriented. Additionally, an at risk flyer can be made immediately and distributed to other Law Enforcement agencies, news stations, etc if the at risk adult is missing or lost.

Both the Kid Print and Adult At Risk Information Card Programs are run by the Camarillo Citizen Patrol.

On Thursday, September 25, 2014, the Ventura County Law Enforcement CIT is holding its first ever 'CIT Officer of the Year' ceremony, at the Camarillo Library. The Ventura County Law Enforcement CIT is a collaborative effort between all six local law enforcement agencies in Ventura County, mental health providers, social services, the medical community, and the local chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI). Within the past two years, Community College District Police, California State University Police, and the United States Navy Police have also joined the local CIT program.

The Ventura County Law Enforcement CIT was founded in 2001, by Oxnard Assistant Police Chief Scott Whitney, Ventura Police Department Commander Mark Stadler, Ventura Police Department Sergeant Jack Richards (Ret) and Dr. Michael Ferguson. Currently, over 72% of Patrol Officers are CIT trained in Ventura County, along with 77% of the Dispatchers. Ventura County Law Enforcement's goal is to have 100% of all Patrol Officers CIT trained.

Documented positive effects of the CIT program include a decrease in use-of-force incidents and a low number of injuries to officers and mental health consumers. The result has been an increase in the non-violent de-escalation of crisis situations in the field.

Sandra Lopez has been charged with a felony count of identity theft after stealing the identity of a deceased person in order to fraudulently obtain credit cards.

Last month, the Ventura County Sheriff's Major Crimes Unit began an investigation into an allegation that Sandra Lopez stole her deceased mother's identity in order to obtain credit cards. During the course of the investigation, detectives obtained evidence confirming Lopez opened five separate credit accounts by pretending to be her deceased mother. Detectives also learned Lopez operated a collection agency named 'Simple Collections.' The fraudulent credit accounts were opened within weeks of the death of Lopez's mother and were used to obtain goods and services for Lopez's own benefit. After detectives executed a search warrant at her residence in Oxnard, the case was presented to the District Attorney's Office. As a result of the investigation, a felony identity theft charge has been filed against Lopez.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office is committed to safeguarding the identities of citizens within our community, as well as, the estates left to surviving relatives of the deceased. Family members are reminded to notify financial institutions and credit agencies of the death of a family member in order to avoid fraudulent financial activities occurring under their loved ones identity.

Narrative:

In July and August of 2014, the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) responded to an increase in cocaine use and sales in the east county area by conducting several investigations that resulted in multiple arrests for drug violations. The cocaine was being used and sold by teenagers and young adults. Through these investigations, detectives determined that the majority of the cocaine in these cases was originating from Marco Cuevas, a Sylmar resident.

Detectives conducted an investigation into Cuevas where they witnessed him selling cocaine to a Ventura County resident. The investigation also revealed that Cuevas was involved in the sale of guns.

On 9-26-14, members of the PCU, along with other specialized units from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, arrested Cuevas in Moorpark where he was suspected of going to engage in a cocaine deal. Cuevas had several ounces of cocaine on his person, as well as a half-pound of cocaine in his vehicle. The cocaine in the vehicle was in the back seat area with his five year old son. The son was tested, and preliminarily proved positive, for cocaine in his system. Cuevas' wife, Sandy, was also in the vehicle and

was in possession of over \$10,000 in suspected drug proceeds.

A search warrant was served at the Cuevas' residence in the 13300 block of Berg Street, in Sylmar. Evidence of drugs sales, several pounds of marijuana, hundreds of pills of prescription drugs, \$75,000 in cash, 16 guns, and nearly 3000 rounds of ammunition were located at the residence.

Marco Cuevas was booked into Ventura County Jail for possession for sale of cocaine, conspiracy to sell cocaine, child endangerment, and multiple weapons violations including being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm. He is in custody in lieu of \$1,000,000 bail.

Sandy Cuevas was booked into Ventura County Jail for possession for sale of cocaine, conspiracy to sell cocaine, and child endangerment. She secured bail and her court date is pending.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a full time task force comprised of members of law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The task force's main mission is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. A secondary, and equally important mission, is identifying and stopping emerging drug trends among our county's youth.

On 9-28-2014, the Thousand Oaks Police Department's Directed Enforcement Team conducted an alcohol enforcement operation. Underage minor decoys were used, under the direct supervision of law enforcement officers, to solicit adults outside California Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) licensed stores to purchase alcohol for the minors. The goal of this operation was to limit minors' access to alcohol.

Two underage decoys were used in an attempt to solicit others to purchase alcohol for them in different locations throughout the City of Thousand Oaks. Approximately 47 subjects at four locations were solicited during the operation. 1 adult male purchased alcohol for the minor decoys. The one male subject was arrested for BP 25658(a) / furnishing alcohol to a minor. 1 adult male was arrested for PC 484(a) / petty theft, after he agreed to buy the minor decoys alcohol, but instead he purchased cigarettes for himself and attempted to leave the scene with the remainder of the money. A third adult male was observed driving erratically, walking with an unsteady gait, and was heard speaking to the decoys with slurred speech. He was contacted and subsequently arrested for VC 23152(a) & (b) / DUI. The Thousand Oaks Police Department wants to thank the other 44 subjects who refused to purchase alcohol for the minors.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department's Directed Enforcement Team will continue to conduct periodic operations in an effort to prevent minors' access to alcohol.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department would like to remind the public that selling alcohol to, or purchasing alcohol for, minors is illegal and that alcohol is a factor in many homicides, suicides, and other

unintentional injuries which along with car crashes are the four leading causes of death in 15-20 year olds. The Ventura County Sheriff's Office wants to remind the public to report incidents of underage drinking and illegal purchasing of alcohol.

Narrative:

There are many things a parent can do to ensure their family's safety. Adequately preparing your home and teaching children how to use 9-1-1 properly from an early age may, one day, save a life. If you are unsure where to begin, here are a few of the key things you can do and messages you can relay to youngsters to ensure that your household is prepared should a call for help ever have to be made.

Post your address clearly and prominently in multiple locations. Having your address easily visible at the end of your driveway and on your home itself will ensure that first responders aren't left wondering if they are at the right location. Make sure that you use numbering and lettering that can be seen during the day or night, and are visible no matter which direction you are coming from. Many cities and counties have ordinances that will give you direction on how to post your address properly, so be sure to check with local authorities for more information.

Report missing street signs in your neighborhood immediately. This is even more important for those of you who live in the rural parts of Ventura County. Making sure that your neighborhood has all the proper signage not only helps friends and family find your home, but it can be crucial during an emergency situation where time is of the essence.

Teach your kids what 9-1-1 is. Let them know that 9-1-1 is the number to call when they need help or they see someone who needs help right away.

Teach your kids when to call 9-1-1. It is important that children learn that there are specific times when

calling 9-1-1 is the right thing to do. Let them know that they should only call when someone or something, such as an animal, is hurt or in danger or if they need a police officer, firefighter, or doctor.

Last but not least, practice makes perfect. Help your kids memorize information that will be useful to 9-1-1 dispatchers, such as their name, their parents' names, their address, and their phone number. The more comfortable and calm they are, the more quickly they can provide vital information to the 9-1-1 dispatcher who can then send the appropriate responders to the location.

Once is never enough, as they say, and your job isn't done after your kids understand the basics. As the years pass, technology will change and so will your child's capacity for providing crucial details to the 9-1-1 dispatcher. It is up to you to make sure that they are knowledgeable about the features and capabilities of the device they use to dial 9-1-1 and that they are ready to provide the most detailed and useful information possible when they call 9-1-1.

If you or your child is ever in doubt whether to dial 9-1-1 or the Sheriff's non-emergency number (805) 654-9511, go ahead and dial 9-1-1. We're here to help you.

Servers or cashiers at 15 locations asked for identification and turned the decoys away without selling any alcoholic beverages. The Thousand Oaks Police Department wants to thank these 15 subjects who refused to sell alcohol to a minor. Servers or cashiers at 8 locations furnished alcohol to the underage decoy and either failed to ask for identification or looked at the identification and furnished it anyway. All 8 of these subjects were arrested for BP 25658(a) / furnishing alcohol to a minor.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department's Directed Enforcement Team will continue to conduct periodic sting operations in an effort to prevent minors' access to alcohol.

Narrative:

In June of 2014, investigators from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit learned a prescription pad had been stolen from the office of a Ventura physician. The information initially came from an astute pharmacist in Oxnard who determined Ryan Doming was attempting to pass a forged prescription from that stolen pad. Detectives followed up on the information and learned that Ryan's

brother Cody, and their friends Jessica Davis and Michael Vasquez, were also involved in attempting to pass forged prescriptions for Alprazolam (Xanax) and Hydrocodone (Norco) from that same pad. Ryan and Cody Doming were arrested for multiple counts of commercial burglary and prescription fraud. Davis, who learned of the ongoing investigation, fled the area and a warrant was issued for her arrest. It is believed she has returned to the area, and is living in Oxnard. Detectives were unable to locate Vasquez until October of this year.

Investigators learned Vasquez was staying at a residence in the 8200 block of Tiara Street, Ventura. Detectives received information that this residence was a location known for the use and sale of drugs. Detectives saw Vasquez and another subject named Andrew Manning selling methamphetamine and marijuana, in the area, on multiple occasions.

Based on the information received in the investigation, a search warrant was served at the Tiara Street address in the early morning hours of October 10, 2014. Michael Vasquez and Andrew Manning were located in the residence and were arrested for sales of methamphetamine and marijuana. Vasquez was also arrested for commercial burglary and prescription fraud from the June investigation. Elizabeth Meeks and Angel Navarette were found to be sleeping on the couch at the location. They were both arrested for possession for sales of methamphetamine and under the influence of methamphetamine. Valerie Delatorre was also located in the residence and arrested for being under the influence of methamphetamine.

The homeowners, Paula and Rock Nelson, were not at the location during the service of the search warrant. Investigators contacted their two teenage children, however, who were ultimately taken into protective custody by the Child Protective Services Division of the Ventura County Human Services Agency.

Investigators found methamphetamine and marijuana possessed for sale in numerous locations throughout the residence. Syringes loaded with suspected methamphetamine were also found in the residence.

Paula and Rock Nelson were located later in the day and arrested for maintaining a place where drugs were being sold, felony child endangerment, and under the influence of methamphetamine.

Narrative:

On October 28, 2014, Deputy Eugene Kostiuchenko was killed in the line of duty after being struck by a vehicle during a traffic stop. The driver of the vehicle was arrested by the California Highway Patrol for felony D.U.I.

Deputy Kostiuchenko initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle on northbound Highway 101 at Lewis Rd. at about 1:14 a.m. He exited his vehicle to make contact with the driver. Two deputies arrived to assist with the traffic stop. Later in the contact, Eugene released the driver from the traffic stop and walked back to his vehicle when he was struck by another vehicle. The vehicle narrowly missed colliding with the assisting deputies. The driver of that vehicle continued traveling northbound at a high rate of speed. Twenty Five of the thirty three registered sex offenders were in compliance with their registration requirement. Eight of the registrants were not contacted because they were not home or had moved. Sheriff's detectives will follow-up to determine if the registrants are out-of-compliance.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office will be conducting similar sweeps on an ongoing basis, to verify registered sex offenders are living at their reported residences and in compliance with any probation or parole terms.

Narrative:

On November 5, 2014, the Moorpark Police Department Investigations Unit released two photographs of a suspect connected with at least four burglaries of high-end equine jumping saddles. Investigators received a quick response from the public identifying the suspect as Gregory Andersen and confirmed that he was a resident of Malibu, CA.

The investigation began with a burglary reported on February 20, 2014, at Whitethorn Ranch in Somis, CA. Sixteen saddles valued at over \$53,000 were stolen from the location sometime over night. There were no solid leads at the time of the initial report. As the investigation progressed two stolen saddles were located. After further investigation, it was learned Andersen (using the alias Matthew Gregory) shipped the two stolen saddles from a Post Office in Woodland Hills, CA. All information obtained on 'Matthew Gregory' was fraudulent including name, date of birth, driver license number, social security number, and passport number. The two photos of 'Matthew Gregory' were located during our subsequent investigation and eventually released to the public in the initial attempt to identify and locate him.

We believe that Andersen used the alias Matthew Gregory to sell over \$180,000 in saddles from 2007-2014. The investigation into the burglaries is continuing. Andersen is currently out of custody on \$500,000 bail. On November 21, 2014, the Ventura County District Attorney's filed Identity Theft and Possession of Stolen Property charges against Andersen.

We encourage anyone who has information regarding any saddle burglaries within the time frame mentioned to please contact Detective Ken Truitt at the Moorpark Police Department. Also, if anyone purchased saddles from a Matthew Gregory, please call law enforcement. Narrative:

In August of 2014, investigators from the Ventura County Sheriff's Special Crimes Unit targeted several criminal groups that were suspected of committing numerous residential burglaries, vehicle burglaries and motor vehicle thefts throughout Ventura County. Investigators identified members of one group as Aaron Phillips, Jose Chavez and Andrew Coombes. Phillips had been arrested for similar crimes on July 7, 2014 and was out on bail pending trial. Coombes was also out on bail after recent arrests for Possession of Methamphetamine, Auto Theft, Evading Arrest, and Identify Theft.

On October 6, 2014, Phillips was contacted while deputies were conducting a probation search on his wife. Phillips was found to be in possession of several altered vehicle keys commonly used to commit vehicle theft. He was arrested for a variety of charges including possession of burglary tools and being under the influence of narcotics. He was booked into Ventura County Jail. Two days later, Phillips posted \$10,000 bail and was released from custody.

On October 24th, investigators developed enough probable cause to arrest Phillips, Chavez and Coombes on a variety of charges stemming from a series of auto theft and vehicle burglaries in Camarillo and the Santa Rosa Valley. Phillips was arrested for Burglary and Chavez was arrested for Auto Theft. Both were booked into Ventura County Jail. Coombes, who was already in custody, was arrested for Auto Theft and Burglary.

On October 25, 2014, Chavez posted \$40,000 bail and was released from custody. On November 2, 2014, Phillips posted \$20,000 dollar bail and was released from custody.

Five weeks later, December 9, 2014, Sheriff's investigators began an investigation into a vehicle stolen in Thousand Oaks and later found abandoned in Oxnard. Investigators developed information that Philips was responsible. The vehicle contained property stolen from a recent commercial burglary in Oxnard. On December 12, 2013, investigators stopped a vehicle in which Phillips was a passenger. The Driver, Michael Kor, was on probation for Burglary and had two active warrants for possession of methamphetamine. A search of the car revealed methamphetamine, stolen property and items used to commit identity theft. Both Kor and Phillips were arrested. Kor was booked for his outstanding warrants and possession of methamphetamine. He remains in custody on \$30,000 bail. Phillips was arrested for Auto Theft and remains in custody on \$500,000 bail.

Investigators believe that Phillips, Coombes and Chavez are responsible for over a hundred Vehicle Burglaries, Vehicles Thefts and/or stolen vehicles in the Ventura County Area. Many of those crimes were committed while the subjects were out on bail after their initial arrests.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office reminds residents to lock their vehicles at night and keep valuables out of plain sight. Most vehicles thefts occur when cars are left unlocked or high dollar items are in plain view.

Narrative:

In May of 2013, the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) task force, in cooperation with every local police agency in the Ventura County, initiated a program designed to reduce patient 'doctor shopping' to obtain highly addictive prescription medications.

The PCU is a task force comprised of members of law enforcement from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The task force's main mission is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. A secondary, and equally important mission, is the identification and stopping of new trends of abuse among the county's younger population set.

Since its inception, the Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit has contacted all 189 active pharmacies operating in Ventura County. The task force contacted pharmacies and started a dialogue between law enforcement and health care in Ventura County. Through this outreach program, information was exchanged between the pharmacists and the task force. The task force investigated several large scale cases that were developed from information provided by the pharmacists. Educational information was also disseminated to the pharmacies from the task force to safeguard their businesses against fraud, burglaries, and robberies.

Pharmacists were encouraged to utilize the State of California Controlled Substance Utilization Review and Evaluation System (CURES) in order to ensure their patients were not engaged in the illegal practice of doctor shopping. CURES is a database available to law enforcement, physicians, and pharmacists that records all dispensations of controlled substance medications. In the past month, all pharmacies were again contacted and asked to provide contact information in the form of an email address so the task force could share real time intelligence regarding criminal activity or educational information.

On the heels of this outreach program, the task force recently contacted all 1,795 doctors in the

county and provided similar information. The task force is attempting to foster a stronger relationship with health care by collaborating with physicians and pharmacists in an effort to curb the unlawful abuse and sales of prescription drugs. The task force recognizes that physicians are the gate keepers for prescription drugs.

The task force is asking for 100% physician compliance with utilizing the CURES program before issuing a prescription for a controlled substance. Through a simple, two minute check, doctors can access all prescriptions issued to their patient in the past year. Physicians will be able to determine if the patient is utilizing the services of several doctors to obtain drugs of abuse. The doctor, supplied with this information, will be able to more accurately assess a method of treatment for that individual patient, which may include, refusing to write another controlled substance prescription and / or referral to an appropriate pain management doctor or addiction specialist. The task force is also requesting that pharmacists continue to use CURES as well, to ensure another layer of protection against doctor shopping.

Several recent investigations conducted by the task force highlight the need for law enforcement and health care to be better connected and for physicians and pharmacists to utilize the CURES system.

On 8-26-14, the PCU arrested Jacob and Lindsey Baumgarten for multiple counts of doctor shopping after it was discovered they visited 102 doctors in the past year and obtained controlled substance prescriptions for mainly opiate drugs. The case only came to light after an astute pharmacist recognized Lindsey from a prior prescription where she used a different name. A call by a physician or pharmacist to law enforcement after the third or fourth doctor / pharmacy, utilizing the CURES database, would have stopped the needless dispensation of hundreds of prescriptions of controlled substances, not to mention prevented this added drain on our health care system.

On 11-21-14, the PCU arrested Braden New for multiple counts of doctor shopping after it was discovered he visited 72 doctors in the past year and obtained prescriptions for opiate medication. New withheld information regarding prior physicians visited when seeing doctors. Again, the utilization of the CURES system would have stopped this activity long before it came to the attention of law enforcement.

There have also been several recent probable overdose deaths in the county. In one case, an individual visited 14 doctors in the past year for opiate and anti-anxiety medications. Another case involved an individual who visited 12 doctors in the past year for opiates, anti-anxiety, and sleep aid drugs.

The enormous amounts of pills that are obtained by doctor shoppers are not only acquired for personal use, but often times find their way into the hands of our county's youth.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit believes it is important to balance the need of eliminating the unlawful use and sales of prescription medication without infringing on a doctor's ability to treat and prescribe to patients for legitimate medical reasons. The California Board of Pharmacy and the Health Quality Investigation Unit of the California Division of Investigation assisted in this community outreach.

Servers at four locations furnished alcohol to the underage decoy and either failed to ask for identification or looked at the identification and furnished it anyway. All four of these subjects were arrested for BP 25658(a) / furnishing alcohol to a minor.

The Ventura County Sheriff Headquarters station will continue to conduct periodic sting operations in an

effort to prevent minors' access to alcohol.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office would like to remind the public that selling alcohol to, or purchasing alcohol for, minors is illegal and that alcohol is a factor in many homicides, suicides, and other unintentional injuries which along with car crashes are the four leading causes of death in 15-20 year olds. Narrative:

Earlier this month, investigators from the Ventura County Sheriff's Special Crimes Unit had intelligence that Juan Castillo, Michael Cantero and Esteban Oseguera were involved in a county wide theft ring. Cantero was on parole for attempted residential burglary and had recently bailed out of jail for a narcotic related arrest. Castillo and Oseguera had been arrested for similar crimes on November 13, 2014. Both were out on bail pending trial.

On December 8, 2014, at about 5:00 am, a uniformed deputy attempted to stop a stolen vehicle in the City of Ventura. The vehicle was occupied by two males and had been reported stolen the previous day in Santa Barbara County. During the stop, the male passenger ran from the vehicle and avoided capture. The driver, Esteban Oseguera, was arrested. Deputies searched the car and found numerous items that had been stolen earlier in the morning from unlocked vehicles in the City of Camarillo. Oseguera was arrested for Auto Theft and Possession of Stolen Property. He was booked into the Ventura County Jail.

On December 17th, 2014, at about 5:00 am, investigators stopped Castillo and Cantero as they left the Spanish Hills neighborhood of Camarillo. Investigators searched the car and found several items, including a handgun, that had been stolen from various unlocked vehicles in Spanish Hills. Investigators also recovered stolen property from vehicle thefts in Ojai, Ventura and Los Angeles reported over the previous several months.

Cantero and Castillo were arrested for various property and weapons related charges. Both remain in custody on \$500,000 bail.

Based on recovered stolen property and suspect statements, investigators believe the suspects are responsible for hundreds of vehicle thefts and stolen vehicles over the last 6 months. The

On 12-18-14 at 5:45 PM, Deputies assigned to the Thousand Oaks Police Department responded to a call of a person causing a disturbance in the 700 block of Hodencamp Road in Thousand Oaks. The information received from the 911 dispatch center was that an adult male was armed with a bat and was involved in a domestic dispute.

The first deputy arrived on scene and contacted three people outside the residence. While getting the initial information of the circumstances, the deputy observed a suspicious male standing inside an open garage. When the deputy approached the open garage he encountered the male who was agitated. The deputy observed the male holding a gun, which he had been hiding. Additional deputies responded to the scene.

Meanwhile, the initial responding deputy provided safety for the residents. The suspect refused to comply with the deputy's directions. He remained armed with a hand gun and a bow and arrow. The suspect repeatedly yelled for the deputies to kill him. When the suspect refused to drop his weapons, the deputies feared the male would re-enter the house or adjoining residences. The deputies fired less lethal bean bag rounds in an attempt to disarm him. The bean bag rounds had no effect and he continued to hold his weapons.

Deputies used crisis intervention techniques in an attempt to get the suspect to calm down and release his weapons. After a brief period of time, the suspect stepped out of the garage. The deputies were then able to effectively deploy a TASER electronic control device and take the suspect into custody.

During the incident, the suspect refused to comply, made suicidal statements and repeatedly challenged the deputies to shoot him, all while armed with a handgun and other weapons. The

deputies demonstrated great restraint, courage, and compassion. The suspect was eventually safely subdued and disarmed.

The immediate investigation identified that he had two loaded handguns within reach. He was arrested for weapons charges including a mandatory mental health evaluation.

Narrative:

Over the past few months, there has been an increase in 'hot prowl' residential burglaries throughout the Thousand Oaks area. The crimes involved a female suspect who was seen fleeing the crime scenes on a mountain bike.

A 'hot prowl' burglary is unique in that it occurs in the evening time while resident(s) are home and oftentimes asleep. Most residential burglaries occur in the day time as suspects prefer to not encounter residents inside the home.

Due to the serious nature of the recent crimes, Thousand Oaks Police Investigators have been working the cases in an attempt to identify and apprehend the suspect.

On 12/21/14 at about 7:00am, Thousand Oaks Police received a call from a Thousand Oaks resident stating there was a female running from her backyard to her front yard. The suspect got on a mountain bike and fled the area. Evidence left at the scene helped investigators learn the identity of the suspect who was identified as Tricia Moran. Moran lived a few blocks away from where the resident encountered her in her backyard.

Investigators learned that several crimes occurred the night of 12/21/14 in the same residential area, which was near Duesenberg Drive and Clear Water Street. One of those crimes was a hot prowl burglary.

A probation search was done at Moran's residence. The search uncovered several pieces of evidence that matched evidence described at the different crime scenes. Moran was also in possession of methamphetamine.

Moran was arrested for 459PC (Residential Burglary) and 664/459PC (Attempt Residential burglary) and booked into the Ventura County Jail with a bail of \$500,000. Investigators are expecting to add additional residential burglary charges for the previous crimes.

Evidence established the pair left the State of California and ended up in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, where local law enforcement authorities, acting at the direction of VCSO investigators, nearly captured the pair. Romero and the victim were located in Texas, where the victim was recovered by the San Antonio Police Department. Evidence suggested Romero fled to Mexico after eluding authorities.

The juvenile victim was returned to another group home in late August, where she ran away the following day. Evidence suggested the juvenile eventually arrived in Mexico, where she and Denisse Romero were reunited. Romero drove the juvenile around Mexico, where they eventually moved in to an apartment together in Ensenada.

VCSO investigators developed leads that established the location of the pair. VCSO members contacted agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and requested assistance. FBI investigators worked with members of the Mexican Government. Mexican authorities located Romero and the juvenile at their apartment and took the juvenile into protective custody. Romero was not taken into custody because no formal extradition agreement was in place. The juvenile was returned to her legal guardian in the United States on 12/3/2014.

A case against Denisse Romero was presented to the Ventura County District Attorney's Office,

and a \$250,000 warrant was issued for her arrest for felony violations of 278 PC (Child Stealing) and two additional felony charges related to sexual assault of a minor.

On 12/22/2014, VCSO investigators received information that Denisse Romero was back in the United States, living with family members in Oxnard. Detectives with the Sheriff's Major Crimes Bureau, along with a patrol deputy, drove to the residence, where Denisse Romero failed to come out of the home. She was found hiding inside a closet in the home. She was arrested and booked at the Ventura County Jail for her charges.

Narrative:

On 12/19/2014, investigators and deputies served a multi-location search warrant related to an investigation involving the recruitment of two juveniles into a criminal street gang that operates in the Fillmore area. Arrests were made as a result of the investigation.

A photo of the gang members and video footage of the gang 'Jump in' is available via web link http://goo.gl/J2GQbs. A Spanish audio file of the news story by a Sheriff's public information officer, Deputy Judith Porter, is available via web link http://goo.gl/dWpykN.

On 10/31/14, the Sheriff's Gang Unit served a search warrant in the City of San Fernando in Los Angeles County at the residence of Salvador Velgara. Velgara is a documented member of a criminal street gang that operates in the city of Fillmore and surrounding communities. Investigators located three firearms and methamphetamine possessed for the purpose of sales. Investigators also located a digital camera that contained two videos of a gang initiation rite known as a 'Jump In.' A 'Jump in' is a violent introduction to the gang in which the new member is subjected to a physical assault by his fellow gang members.

Investigators identified the two subjects being 'Jumped in' as juvenile residents of the City of Fillmore. California Penal Code section 186.26 (solicitation or recruitment to participate in a criminal street gang) makes it a felony to recruit someone into a gang with specific enhancements for the use of violence and additional enhancements when the person being recruited is a juvenile.

Sheriff's Gang Unit investigators learned that the 'Jump in' took place in March of 2013 in the

backyard of a residence in the 300 block of Del Valle Drive in Fillmore, CA. Investigators identified the participants of the 'Jump in' as Brad Beltran, Vincent Meraz, Salvador Velgara, Damien Virgen, Rudy Meraz, and two male juveniles who are both age16.

On 12/19/2014, a combined team of 36 Sheriff's Office investigators and deputies served warrants at five locations to retrieve evidence related to the crime. During the service of the warrants, Vincent Meraz, Rudy Meraz and one of the juveniles were arrested for violating Penal Code section 186.26. Brad Beltran and Salvador Velgara who were already in custody on other charges were also arrested by detectives for violating Penal Code section 186.26. Damien Virgen was contacted by phone and later turned himself in. Joseph Cabral was arrested after detectives found a collapsible baton, methamphetamine, and a methamphetamine pipe in his bedroom.

Narrative:

Kristy Butler was arrested by Ojai Station Detectives following a month long investigation into several burglary incidents. It was discovered that Butler was using the social media website Facebook to sell some of the stolen property.

Over the course of the past month several residential burglaries were reported from neighborhoods in the Oak View area. The circumstances surrounding these burglaries were similar in nature. Small household items were being removed from garages, homes, and yards of the victims.

On December 18th, 2014, at around 1 am, a victim reported confronting a woman in her garage. At this time, the suspect fled the scene in a vehicle. This victim was able to record the vehicle license plate which led deputies to the residence of Kristy Butler. Detectives identified a Facebook profile in Kristy Butler's name and noticed that this profile was active on a local 'For Sale or Trade' group within the Facebook social media platform. This profile was advertising several household items for sale. These items included vacuum cleaners, powers saws, child safety seats, and other miscellaneous household items. These items for sale matched many of the items reported by other victims of the recent string of burglaries. These items advertised for sale on Facebook were documented and photographed by detectives. During subsequent follow-up interviews with the involved victim's, detectives positively identified stolen property being listed for sale by the Facebook user account 'Kristy Butler'.

On December 23, 2014, detectives from the Ojai area patrol station executed a search warrant at the residence of Kristy Butler and successfully located some of the stolen property from the burglaries that occurred over the past month. In addition, detectives located other evidence connecting Butler to the burglaries. In all, Kristy Butler was connected to at least five different

burglaries at the time of this release. Butler was arrested and booked for multiple counts of burglary at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility in Ventura. If anyone has any additional information regarding this individual and the sale of stolen property via Facebook, please contact the Ojai area station detectives at (805) 947-8075.

Narrative:

During the past couple of months the City of Thousand Oaks has seen an increase in gang activity and crimes.

On October 16, 2014, a Thousand Oaks gang member, Jorge Lopez, was walking home on Windsor Drive when he was attacked by two rival Thousand Oaks gang members, Victor Lopez and Samuel Gonzalez. During the attack, the victim was struck with a brick.

On December 21, 2014, the Special Enforcement / Gang Unit arrested Victor Lopez for assault

with a deadly weapon and gang enhancements for the attack on the victim. Victor Lopez was booked into the Pre-Trial Detention Facility where he is being held on \$110,000 bail. Victor Lopez was scheduled to appear in court on December 22, 2014 @ 1:30PM.

On December 22, 2014, the Special Enforcement / Gang Unit arrested Samuel Gonzalez for assault with a deadly weapon and gang enhancements for the attack on the victim, Jorge Lopez. Samuel Gonzalez was booked into the Pre-Trial Detention Facility where he is being held on \$250,000 bail. Samuel Gonzalez is scheduled to appear in court on December 23, 2014 @ 1:30PM. Samuel Gonzalez' bail is significantly higher because he has multiple arrests and is considered a Serious Habitual Offender.

During the first week of December 2014, the Special Enforcement / Gang Unit saw a significant increase in gang related graffiti in the 800 Block of Warwick Ave. and in the Conejo Creek Condominium complex, both rival gang areas.

On December 10, 2014, members of the Thousand Oaks Special Enforcement / Gang Unit were conducting a surveillance in the 800 block of Warwick Ave. Rival gang graffiti was located in the area. After a short time, two juvenile gang members were observed spray painting over the rival gang graffiti. These two juveniles were arrested and lodged into the Juvenile Justice Facility for conspiracy, felony vandalism and gang enhancements.

On December 18, 2014, at approximately 6:20 PM patrol deputies responded to a call of 10 subjects fighting with bats and guns in the 800 block of Warwick Ave. The Special Enforcement / Gang Unit responded to the scene. At approximately 6:30 PM patrol deputies responded to the Conejo Creek Condominiums for another gang disturbance with a stabbing victim. The investigation revealed that both calls were related and the stabbing actually occurred in the 800 block of Warwick Ave. when rival gang members went to the 800 block of Warwick Ave. and a large gang fight ensued.

The investigation revealed that suspects Salvador Arroyo, Marco Gutierrez, Robert Dighero, Victor Lopez, and Samuel Gonzalez drove to the 800 block of Warwick Ave. to confront rival gang members. During the fight Salvador Arroyo was stabbed. Marco Gutierrez was struck with a blunt object causing injury. Victim/Suspect Edgar Guzman, a rival gang member of Arroyo, Gutierrez, Dighero, Lopez and Gonzalez was struck multiple times with a blunt object. The investigation revealed that during the fight, suspect Brahin Valencia used a knife and stabbed Salvador Arroyo.

On December 22, 2014, the Special Enforcement / Gang Unit arrested Salvador Arroyo for conspiracy, assault with a deadly weapon, disturbing the peace by fighting, and gang enhancements.
