Narrative:

Over the past several months, Los Angeles and Ventura Counties have seen a sharp increase in residential burglaries. Typically, the suspects knocked on the front door to the residence to determine if anyone was home. If no one answered the door, they went around the backside of the residence and forced entry into the residence. If someone answered the door, they fabricated a reason for being there, such as asking if the resident had seen a missing dog or for a person who they knew did not live there. The purpose of the ruse was to determine if anyone was home without raising suspicion. On some of the cases, the residents did not answer the door or announce their presence. The suspects then forced entry into the residence with the residents inside.

According to witness statements from several of the crime scenes, the suspects were male and female, and were driving newer vehicles with dealer plates. These statements were often corroborated by video surveillance.

On 12/31/14, at about 3:45 PM, Thousand Oaks police responded to a call of suspicious male and female subjects looking into the window of a residence. When confronted by the resident, the subjects stated they were there looking for their lost dog. The subjects, however, did not want to provide any contact information to the resident in case she found the dog. This raised suspicion and the homeowner called police after seeing the subjects meet up with another subject who was waiting in a car.

Police responded to the scene and observed a vehicle with dealer plates leaving the area. The vehicle was similar to one used in prior residential burglaries. A traffic stop was then conducted.

The ensuing investigation determined the three suspects had committed at least one residential burglary and were in the process of attempting another when confronted by the homeowner. Investigators learned the suspects had employed a ruse similar to those previously described in an attempt to determine if the house was occupied. Investigators also located evidence of the burglaries inside the suspect vehicle.

Robert Crockett, Chloe Freer and Rayshaun Flowers were arrested for residential burglary and attempt residential burglary. All three were booked into the Ventura County jail and had bail set at \$500,000. Their arraignments are scheduled for Monday, January 5, 2015 at 1:30 PM.

All three suspects are from the Los Angeles County area. Investigators believe there may be more victims or witnesses who may have information about these suspects. Anyone with information is asked to call Detective Jerin Widofsky (805)494-8221 or Sgt. Jason Robarts (805) 947-8108.

Narrative:

On January 2, 2015, the Camarillo Police Department's Community Resource Unit conducted an alcohol sting, using underage minor decoys, in an attempt to purchase alcohol from various retail establishments in the City of Camarillo. The goal of this operation was to limit minors' access to alcohol and confirm retail establishments are abiding by the Business and Professions Code and rules set forth by the Department of Alcohol Beverage Control.

Two underage decoys were used in an attempt to purchase alcohol from twenty locations throughout the City of Camarillo. Cashiers at eighteen locations asked for identification and turned the decoys away without selling any alcoholic beverages. A cashier at two locations, Camarillo Liquor Market and Toppers Pizza sold to the underage decoy and either failed to ask for identification or looked at the identification and sold anyway.

The Camarillo Police Department's Community Resource Unit will continue to conduct periodic sting operations in an effort to prevent minors' access to alcohol. These sting operations are being funded by a grant through the California Department of Alcohol Beverage Control.

The police department would like to remind the public that selling alcohol to minors is illegal and that alcohol is a factor in many homicides and suicides; which along with car crashes are the leading causes of death in 15-20 year olds. The Ventura County Sheriff's Office wants to remind the public to report incidents of underage drinking and illegal purchasing of alcohol.

Narrative:

On 1/9/2015, the Sheriff's East County Narcotics Team concluded an investigation into James Walker, who was selling methamphetamine to customers in the city of Thousand Oaks. Deputies with the Thousand Oaks Police Directed Enforcement Team assisted detectives by stopping Walker after he left his Thousand Oaks residence. Walker was with a female identified as Jennifer Yeates who was under the influence of a controlled substance. Walker was in possession of over two grams of methamphetamine. Both Walker and Yeates were arrested and transported to the East County Sheriff's station.

Narcotics detectives served a search warrant at Walker's residence where they detained another resident, Joseph Fratella. Fratella was found to be under the influence of a controlled substance and was arrested.

During the search of the residence, detectives located about six (6) ounces of methamphetamine in Walker's vehicle. Several grams of methamphetamine and a small amount of concentrated marijuana commonly referred to as 'Honey Oil' was found inside Walker's bedroom. Detectives found over twenty (20) pounds of dried marijuana and the implements of a small marijuana extraction operation in various locations of the house. A small marijuana grow was found in the rear yard and several marijuana plants were eradicated.

Jeffrey Dupont, another resident arrived at the house during the search. Dupont was in possession of several grams of methamphetamine and also had two (2) active warrants for his arrest. Dupont was also arrested.

Walker was booked at the East County Sheriff Jail for possession of a controlled substance for sale, possession of marijuana for sale, and manufacturing concentrated marijuana. Dupont was

arrested and booked for possession of a controlled substance and the two (2) outstanding warrants. They are both scheduled to appear in court on 1/13/2015, at 1:30 PM. Walker's Bail is set at \$50,000 and Dupont's bail is set at \$40,250

Fratella and Yeates were arrested and cited for being under the influence of a controlled substance. They are scheduled to appear in court on 2/5/2015.

Traffic Enforcement Operations Planned for Thousand Oaks

The Thousand Oaks Police Department will step up pedestrian safety enforcement operations this Friday with focused enforcement on collision causing factors involving motorists and pedestrians. Routine traffic patrols will focus efforts in trouble spots while special overtime patrols will also be deployed to crackdown on drivers and pedestrians who violate basic traffic laws.

The department has mapped out locations over the past three years where pedestrian involved collisions have occurred along with the violations that led to those crashes. Officers will be looking for traffic offenses made by drivers and pedestrians alike that can lead to life changing injuries. Special attention will be directed toward drivers speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for signs and signals, failing to yield to pedestrians in cross walks or any other dangerous violation. Additionally, enforcement will be taken for observed violations when pedestrians cross the street illegally or fail to yield to drivers who have the right of way. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked crosswalks or at corners.

Pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use non-motorized means of transportation. Locally, the Thousand Oaks Police Department has investigated 95 fatal and injury collisions involving pedestrians during the past three (3) years. In 2012, California witnessed 612 pedestrian deaths that year while nationally; 4,743 pedestrians were killed.

A national study reveals that pedestrians and drivers do not obey laws and signals consistently and many often use cell phones, text and listen to music while walking or driving. Only 60 percent of pedestrians said they expected drivers to stop when they were in crosswalks, even though they have the right-of-way. The following safety tips can save lives and stop this tragedy witnessed far too often in Thousand Oaks:

Drivers can:

- Look out for pedestrians, especially in hard-to-see conditions such as at night or in bad weather.
- Slow down and be prepared to stop when turning or entering a crosswalk where pedestrians are likely to be.
- Stop at the crosswalk stop line to give drivers in other lanes an opportunity to see and yield to the pedestrians too.
- Be cautious when backing up ' pedestrians, especially young children, can move across your path. See www.safercar.gov/parents/backover.htm

Pedestrians can:

- Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road, cross at crosswalks or intersections, and obey signs and signals.
- Walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible if there is no sidewalk.
- Pay attention to the traffic moving around you. This is not the time to be texting or talking on a cell phone.
- Make eye contact with drivers as they approach. Never assume a driver sees you.
- Wear bright clothing during the day and reflective materials (or use a flashlight) at night.
- Look left-right-left before crossing a street.

On the evening of January 18, 2015, two separate armed robberies occurred in the city of Camarillo. Camarillo Patrol and Detectives located and arrested both suspects for the crime.

The first reported robbery occurred at approximately 8:00 PM near the Factory Center Outlets. An employee of one of the stores was riding his bicycle on the sidewalk of East Ventura Boulevard at Factory Store Drive, in Camarillo, when he encountered the two male suspects. As he neared the suspects, they parted ways and appeared to be allowing the victim to pass in between them. One of the suspects then began punching the victim on his head, while the other suspect pulled the victim's backpack off of him. After taking the victim's property, the suspects fled the area. The victim sustained minor injuries that did not required medical attention.

The victim continued to ride his bicycle home, when he encountered the suspects again, this time in a vehicle. The suspect drove by the victim and taunted him by calling him names. The victim saw the suspects stop in the shopping center in the 600 block of Las Posas Road, in Camarillo. The victim was able to contact the police and give them a description of the suspects.

Arriving patrol deputies located Dionicio Salinas in the parking lot of the shopping center. He was detained and was positively identified by the victim. Neither the second suspect, nor the vehicle was located in the area.

While deputies were investigating the first robbery a second victim reported that he was robbed

at gunpoint by two suspects, at approximately 7:30 PM, near Mobil Avenue near Kino Street, in Camarillo.

The victim reported that he heard someone approach him from behind, and when he turned around he saw two suspects running toward him and pointing guns in his direction. One of the suspects told the victim to get down on the ground and take everything out of his pockets. The victim complied and then one of the suspect's removed items from the victim while the other suspect's began to punch the victim on his head. The suspects then fled the area with the victim's property. The victim sustained minor injuries that did not required medical attention.

This victim was brought to the area where Salinas was being detained and he also positively identified Salinas as one of the suspects who robbed him.

Salinas was arrested and booked at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility for two counts of robbery. His bail was set at \$65,000.00.

On January 20, 2015, detectives identified Jose Estrada as the second suspect involved in the robberies.

On January 21, 2015, detectives served a search warrant at a residence in the 800 block of Calle La Palmera, in Camarillo, and arrested Estrada for robbery. Estrada was booked at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility. His bail has not yet been set.

The deputies soon learned the driver was operating his vehicle for the Uber taxi service. The rear seat passengers were contacted and found to be in possession of approximately one quarter pound of concentrated cannabis known as 'butane honey oil' and \$2000. The investigation revealed the two subjects were using Uber to drive them to a drug deal where they could sell their concentrated cannabis. Cody Jens and Luke Karasiuk were arrested for possessing a controlled substance for sale. They were both booked into the Ventura County Jail.

Concentrated Cannabis, aka honey oil, wax, or shatter, is an extremely potent drug that can contain purity levels of up to 80% of Delta 9 THC (the active ingredient in marijuana). A typical dose of honey oil is 1/10th of one gram. These individuals had well over a thousand dosage units of the product. Honey oil is extremely dangerous in that it can cause adverse events in users such as severe hallucinations and panic attacks. Honey oil is very hazardous to make since it involves a chemical reaction utilizing large amounts of butane. Frequently, labs blow up killing or maiming individuals attempting to make the product.

This, coupled with information provided to investigators early on in the investigation by a concerned citizen provided the clues necessary to conduct a thorough investigation that resulted in Leopold Weinstein's arrest.

The investigation started in June of 2014 when large amounts of flammable liquids were found on the roof of a dental building in Camarillo and it was obvious to investigators the suspect intended to use the liquids to commit arson. Less than two weeks later, another dental building in Camarillo was a victim of arson. Investigators looked into several different motives, but were left with very few clues. Over the following five months Leopold Weinstein was identified after his vehicle was observed near one of the locations at an odd time of day. The concerned citizen took a photo of the vehicle and passed it on to investigators, but the information was not immediately advantageous. It wasn't until investigators were able to determine a vehicle matching the description of the one provided by the citizen was observed in previous incidents.

On January 28th, 2015, a sixth, and final act of arson was committed by Leopold Weinstein at the original dental building that was targeted in June of 2014. Surveillance provided investigators a positive identification and caught Leopold Weinstein in the act of setting fire to the building. Leopold Weinstein's motives are not entirely clear, but he too is a dentist and it appears it was

financially motivated. Leopold Weinstein was booked at the Ventura County Sheriff's Main Jail and his bail is set at \$250,000. Leopold Weinstein is scheduled to appear in Court on Tuesday, February 3rd, 2015.

On 2/4/2015, Ventura County Sheriff's patrol deputies working the Oak Park area stopped a vehicle for a minor violation. They contacted the driver, James Alvarez and his passengers Elroy Orduno and Albert Penuelas. During the traffic stop, deputies discovered Alvarez was on active probation in Ventura County and the vehicle he was driving belonged to Orduno. They invoked Alvarez's probation search terms and searched Alvarez and the vehicle. Deputies located two pounds of high grade marijuana inside the vehicle. Deputies arrested all three subjects for conspiracy and possession for sales of marijuana. Deputies later determined Penuelas provided them false identifying information. The deputies were able to determine his true name and discovered he had two outstanding felony warrants.

Narcotic Detectives assisted with the investigation and served a search warrant at Orduno's residence located on the 300 block of Alder Springs Drive in Oak Park. Officers with the Thousand Oaks Directed Enforcement Team (DET) assisted Narcotic Detectives with the service of the search warrant. They contacted and detained Orduno's girlfriend, Penny Vitela and their two minor children, ages 4 and 6, inside the residence.

During the search of the residence, detectives located about two thousand Xanax pills, over 22 grams of methamphetamine, 5 grams of cocaine, small amount of marijuana and a loaded shotgun.

The condition of the house was unkempt and some of the drugs were found in locations that were within arm's reach for the minor children. Based on the circumstances, detectives began a Drug Endangered Children (DEC) investigation. Child Protective Services was contacted and notified of the situation. They immediately responded to assist with the investigation. At the conclusion,

Child Protective Services took custody of the children and removed them from the home.

The children's mother, Penny Vitela was arrested for child endangerment and she was later booked into the Main Jail in Ventura. Her bail is set at \$50,000

Elroy Orduno was arrested for violations of possession of a controlled substance, possession of marijuana for sale, possession for sale of a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance with a firearm, and child abuse. His bail is set at \$70,000

James Alvarez was arrested for Transportation of Marijuana and his bail is set at \$50,000

Albert Penuelas was arrested for giving false information to a peace officer and conspiracy to transport marijuana and two felony warrants.

All four subjects are set to appear in court on February 6th, at 1:30 PM.

Narrative:

On May 11, 2014, Bradley Marquez died from an overdose of heroin and valium at a residence in the 3300 block of Hollygrove, Thousand Oaks. After several months of investigation, multiple search warrants, and numerous interviews, detectives from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Unit and the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit concluded their investigation with the arrest of Corita Aburto and Mateo Peterson for their role in Marquez' death.

The investigation revealed all three subjects were using heroin and valium at Aburto's residence on May 11, 2014, in the 3300 block of Hollygrove, Thousand Oaks. Marquez suffered an overdose from the drugs. Instead of immediately calling 911, Peterson, Aburto, and another subject at the residence, who happened to be a nurse, attempted to treat him themselves. After several hours and no improvement in his condition, Marquez was dragged out of the house and left at a neighbor's door step. Peterson and Aburto then attempted to destroy and hide Marquez' phone and then Peterson 'discovered' Marquez and called 911. Peterson initially disavowed any knowledge of Marquez' identity and Aburto hid in the residence. Paramedics responded and pronounced death.

The Ventura County District Attorney's Office filed one count of �11366 of the California Health and Safety Code / Maintaining a Place for drug use or sales against Aburto. The Ventura County District Attorney's Office filed one count of �32 of the California Penal Code / Accessory after the fact and one count of �135 of the California Penal Code / Destroying or concealing evidence against Peterson. The investigation is continuing as to who supplied Marquez the drugs and additional charges are possible.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The primary mission

of the task force is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use. Anyone with information regarding these topics is encouraged to contact the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit at (805) 383-8700 or via e-mail at pharm.tip@ventura.org.

The task force investigates all drug related overdose deaths in the County of Ventura and will continue to aggressively pursue all individuals involved in the furnishing of drugs resulting in another person's death. Arrests will be made and cases will be presented to the District Attorney's Office in investigations where investigators believe charges can and should be filed. All too often, young adults begin their opiate addiction innocently enough with exposure to prescription medication received for an injury. They may also be introduced to medication through friends or family. Prescription medication use, sometimes leads to abuse. This abuse of highly addictive, yet very expensive drugs, regularly leads to heroin use. Heroin users become heroin dealers to support their habits. It is a vicious cycle that very frequently ends in tragedy and death.

The PCU supports responsible prescribing and dispensing of opiate medication from doctors and pharmacists, in the hope that increased scrutiny from medical professionals will curtail heroin abuse in the future. Several sources state that the United States has about 5% of the world's population but consumes nearly 80% of the opiate medications produced, most notably 99% of the world's hydrocodone (Vicodin).

Narrative:

On February 18, 2015, the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit concluded an investigation into an organization dealing cocaine to teenagers and young adults in the east end area of Ventura County. George Ramirez, Francisco Ramirez, and Eddy Franco were arrested after it was learned they were in possession of nine ounces of cocaine destined for Ventura County. This investigation was a continuation of a prior investigation that was conducted in September of last year, when Marco and Sandy Cuevas were arrested for similar activity.

Search warrants were served at Ramirez' residences in the 6600 block of Chimineas and 5600 block of Tyrone in the City of Los Angeles. Additional cocaine and several thousand dollars in US Currency were located at the Chimineas address. Motorcycle 'chop-shops' were located at both locations and three stolen full motorcycles, two stolen motorcycle frames, a stolen motorcycle engine, and thousands of dollars in suspected stolen motorcycle parts were recovered. One of the motorcycles was stolen out of the City of Simi Valley. George Ramirez was also arrested for felony child endangerment when his three and eight year old children were found home alone with cocaine accessible to them.

George and Francisco Ramirez are in custody at the Ventura County Main Jail with a bail of \$500,000. Eddy Franco is in custody at the Ventura County Main Jail with a bail of \$100,000. They all have court dates on February 19, 2015.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The primary mission of the task force is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger

Narrative:

Scammers have been busy pretending to be police officer's by defrauding residents out of thousands of dollars by employing the red light scam.

Recently, several Thousand Oaks residents have been contacted by phone claiming their photograph was captured while failing to stop for a red light at an intersection. The suspect tells the victim the violation had been ignored and there is a warrant for their arrest. The victim is told the warrant can be cleared by paying the bail. The victim is instructed to purchase a 'Reload It' gift card for the full amount of the bail and to re-contact the suspect to provide the information on the gift card. This information allows the suspect to take the money from the card. Once the money is removed from the card, the money is lost.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department and other local police agencies do not attempt to collect fines by phone. Traffic violators are told to either go to court to pay the fine or mail their payment to the courthouse. No police agency will ask you to pay a fine using a gift card or reloadable card.

Although the intersections within the city of Thousand Oaks are not equipped with red light cameras, we ask residents to drive safely. Avoid becoming a victim of a scam by researching the particular request from the suspect or by calling Detective Lohman (805) 494-8232, before you send money or reloadable gift cards.

Narrative:

On 2/18/2015, deputies with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office served an eviction order on Ricardo Hernandez, 100 block of Maegan Place. Hernandez was home and left the residence after being served with eviction and stay away orders. Shortly after Hernandez left, deputies observed illegal drugs inside the residence.

Sheriff Narcotic Detectives responded to assist with the investigation. A search warrant was obtained and the residence was searched. Detectives located numerous grams of methamphetamine packaged for sale, loaded shotgun, two assault rifles- one of which was a loaded AK47 rifle, two loaded handguns, ballistic vest, various military knives and evidence that Hernandez was actively involved in the sales of illegal drugs.

After completing the search of the residence, detectives conducted a surveillance of the location in hopes that Hernandez would return. An hour later, Hernandez arrived at the location with Alberto Castro and Alejandro Hernandez. All three subjects entered the residence and left after a few minutes. Detectives followed them away from the residence where deputies with the Thousand Oaks Police Directed Enforcement Team conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and arrested Hernandez.

During the traffic stop, the deputies determined Alberto Castro and Alejandro Hernandez were under the influence of a controlled substance and they were arrested. They also provided false identification to the deputies but their true identities were quickly determined with the use of a portable fingerprint identification system. The fingerprint identification device that identified Castro also alerted deputies that Castro had three outstanding warrants for his arrest.

Detectives searched the vehicle and located over 19 grams of methamphetamine and evidence of illegal drugs sales. Detectives determined Alberto Castro and Alejandro Hernandez both

resided at a residence located on the 1200 block of Avenida De Los Arboles. Based on the ongoing investigation, detectives obtained a search warrant for their residence on Avenida De Los Arboles.

Shortly after 2200 hours, Narcotic detectives and deputies with the Directed Enforcement Team converged on Castro and Hernandez's residence and served the warrant. They encountered over 15 individuals inside the residence and had to summon patrol units to assist with the service of the warrant.

After securing the residence, detectives observed numerous make shift shelters and room additions that were made into living quarters. The shelters and rooms were obviously not up to code so detectives requested the assistance of the City of Thousand Oaks Code Enforcement. An officer from Code Enforcement arrived and conducted an investigation. A determination as the status of the residence will be made at a later time.

Detectives searched the residence for evidence of drug activity, but nothing notable was found.

Ricardo Hernandez was arrested for disobeying a court order, possession for sale of a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance with a firearm, and possession of ammunition designated to penetrate metal or armor. His bail is set at \$50,000

Alberto Castro was arrested for possession for sales of a controlled substance, transportation of controlled substance, under the influence of a controlled substance, drug paraphernalia, conspiracy, providing false information, and three outstanding warrants. His bail is set at \$70,000

Alejandro Hernandez was arrested for possession for sales of a controlled substance, possession for sale of a designated controlled substance, and conspiracy. His bail is set at \$50,000

All three subjects are scheduled to appear in court on 2/20/2015, at 1:30PM.

On February 20, 2015, members of the Health Quality Investigation Unit (HQIU) of the California Division of Investigation (formerly known as the Medical Board of California) and the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) arrested Dr. Randolph Nordyke for multiple health and safety code and penal code violations, at his home in San Diego, California.

The HQIU and PCU concluded an investigation into Podiatrist Randolph Nordyke on February 20, 2015, with his arrest and service of a search warrant at his home. Investigators recently learned Dr. Nordyke, who was reportedly retired from his Ventura practice, was doctor shopping, and falsifying prescriptions, in order to feed his own oxycodone addiction. Dr. Nordyke, on multiple occasions, wrote prescriptions in one of his former Ventura County patient's name for large amounts of oxycodone. Dr. Nordyke then went to Ventura and San Diego area pharmacies and picked up the prescriptions posing as the husband of the patient. Dr. Nordyke was also visiting multiple doctors in the Ventura County area to obtain oxycodone prescriptions.

Dr. Nordyke was arrested for charges including identity theft, unlawfully prescribing controlled substances, forging prescriptions, and burglary. The investigation is continuing as to the extent of his doctor shopping as well as identifying other potential identity theft victims.

Dr. Nordyke relinquished his privilege to prescribe controlled substances to the Drug Enforcement Administration who also assisted in the investigation.

Dr. Nordyke is in custody at the Ventura County Main Jail with a bail of \$50,000.

Narrative:

On February 21, in the early morning hours, patrol deputies responded to a report of vehicles on fire at the Ventura County Government Center public parking lot. Upon arrival at the scene there were several parked vehicles on fire as they encountered suspect Jeffrey Landis. Deputies attempted to detain Landis for arson but he resisted. Less Lethal force and a Sheriff's K9 was used to take Landis into custody. Landis sustained minor injuries and has been booked at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility.

The vehicle fires were first observed by CHP officers as they were leaving the Pre-Trial Detention Facility. Shortly after, deputies arrived on scene and arrested Landis. Ventura City Fire Department extinguished the fire. Landis was treated at a local hospital for his injuries prior booking.

Five vehicles were burned. Four of the vehicles were property of the County of Ventura. One County of Ventura vehicle had moderate damage. The rest of the burned vehicles were total losses.

A small backpack claimed by Landis was on the ground at the scene of the vehicle fires. Landis made statements of a possible explosive device in the backpack. The Sheriff's Bomb Squad responded and rendered the backpack safe. There were no evacuations or street closures during the incident.

Sheriff's and Ventura County Fire Department Arson Investigators as well as Sheriff's Major Crimes detectives are continuing with the investigation. His bail is set at \$ 20,000.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office has released its 2014 Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) statistics for Part I Crimes in all Sheriff's jurisdictions. Overall, Part I Crimes were down 10%. Reported Violent Crime was up 1% and Property Crime was down 11%.

Specifically, the cities of Thousand Oaks, Fillmore, and Ojai saw an increase in burglaries, mainly commercial type. Additionally, the city of Ojai saw an increase in grand thefts, which included thefts from vehicles and buildings. The city of Fillmore had an increase in 'Aggravated Assault' with the use of a firearm. One of these reported assaults was a shooting at a group of 11 people who were classified as victims. A single shot was fired at the group and none of the victims were injured.

While reviewing the information, you will notice an increase in the category of 'Rape.' In January of 2014, the definition changed and the UCR Program started collecting uniform information from law enforcement agencies with the new definition of 'Rape' which broadened the scope of the previously narrow definition. For more information about this change, visit http://www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/ucr/new-rape-fact-sheet.

This new definition will redistribute currently captured crime information from the category Part II 'Sex Offenses' to the category Part I 'Rape.' As predicted by the FBI Assistant Director of the Criminal Justice Information Services Division, there will be a more accurate accounting of rape crimes alone with a noticeable increase in the category this year.'

Today at 0900 AM, a deputy from the Fillmore station ran a routine records check on a parked vehicle. The check revealed the vehicle was recently stolen out of the Palmdale area of Los Angeles County. While he was watching the vehicle, (S) Jesus Mora got into the car and drove away. The deputy attempted to initiate a traffic stop on Mora at 2nd St. and Island View, but Mora accelerated and started a vehicle pursuit. They traveled to Second St. and Mountain View and fled south on Mountain View through a school zone. Speeds were estimated near 60 MPH as Mora drove through the intersection of Sespe and Mountain View, passing a vehicle that was stopped to make a right hand turn onto Mountain View. This action, in addition to the dip in the roadway intersection and the wet surface, appear to have caused Mora to lose control of the car. He sideswiped a parked vehicle and started to rotate 360 degrees. The rear bumper then collided into another parked car, totaling it, and pushing it more than 50 feet south on Mountain View. The vehicle's rear passenger's door collided into an electric pole, pushing it 18-24 inches into the vehicle, and causing the vehicle to spin in the opposite direction into a block wall and knocking it over, finally coming to rest into a residence's driveway on the west side of the 400 block of Mountain View.

The deputy, who pursued with lights and sirens, saw the vehicle lose control and slowed, seeing the collision unfold before him. The sole occupant and driver, who was partially ejected through the passenger's front window, was able to immediately get out through the window and flee over one fence, into the backyard, and over the rear fences of the 400 block of Mountain View.

The deputy attempted to chase the suspect, but injured his knee while running and had to discontinue the foot chase. A security perimeter was quickly set up around the neighborhood. San Cayetano Elementary was locked down during the search. A School Resource Officer was assigned to maintain the perimeter of the school and ensure the safety of the students and faculty until the end of the incident or school.

The Sheriff's helicopter, a K-9, additional deputies from other areas and citizens patrol members

arrived to help secure the perimeter and execute the search. A detailed search was conducted of backyards, garages, and open residences without initial success. After nearly four hours of searching, the suspect, Mora, was located in a locked garage within the perimeter. Mora had changed clothes and was hiding under blankets and behind objects in the garage. Mora was taken into custody without further incident. He will be charged with felony evading in a car, possession of a stolen vehicle, burglary into a dwelling, and hit and run. Mora suffered minor injuries from the collision and was booked into the Sheriff's Pretrial Detention Facility after receiving medical treatment at a local hospital.

Thousand Oaks Police Department to Step Up Enforcement for Distracted Drivers

In an effort to make our roads safer, the Thousand Oaks Police Department is deploying extra traffic enforcement officers on Friday, March 6, 2015, to stop distracted driving. Thousand Oaks PD is spreading the message that distracted drivers are not only a danger to themselves, but everyone else on the road.

Using an electronic device while driving is a serious safety problem. Most drivers know that texting while driving is a dangerous behavior, but many still use their cell phones and other mobile devices when they are behind the wheel, putting themselves and others at risk. Many drivers see distracted driving as risky when other drivers do it, but do not recognize how their own driving deteriorates.

In 2012, 3,328 people were killed and 421,000 were injured nationwide in crashes involving a distracted driver. That same year, eleven percent of fatal crashes were reported as distraction-affected crashes.

While anything that takes your eyes off the road, hands off the wheel, or mind off the task of driving is a hazard, there is heightened concern about the risks of texting while driving because it combines all three types of distraction 'visual, manual and cognitive. In addition, most drivers aren't aware that just talking on a cell phone, hand held or hands free, can lead to 'inattention blindness' as critical brain functions needed for driving are used for cell phone talking.

At any given daylight moment across America, there are about 660,000 drivers using cell phones or manipulating electronic devices while driving. The Thousand Oaks Police Department is focusing on ways to change the behavior of drivers through enforcement, public awareness and education 'the same activities that have curbed drunk driving and increased seat belt use.

In a national survey, almost half (48%) of drivers say they answer their cell phones while driving at least some of the time, and more than half of those (58%) continue to drive after answering the call. Your Police Department recommends the following safety measures:

You can:

- turn off electronic devices and put them out of reach before starting to drive
- speak up when you are a passenger and your driver uses an electronic device while driving. Offer to make the call for the driver, so his or her full attention stays on the driving task

Parents can:

- be good role models for young drivers and set a good example. Talk with your teens about responsible driving
- If you know your teen is on the road 'don't call or text them until you know they have reached their destination

Employers can:

Adopt, publicize, and enforce company policies that prohibit employees from texting or talking on hand-held cell phones while in a company vehicle, or in a personal vehicle while using a company issued cell phone.

On March 5, 2015, at approximately 6:45 PM the Thousand Oaks Police Directed Enforcement Team was conducting proactive foot patrol on Warwick Avenue when the Ventura County Sheriff's Communications Center broadcast a call of a robbery that had just occurred in the 800 Block of Warwick Ave. The Directed Enforcement Team responded and handled the initial investigation. The suspects, two juvenile males had fled the scene prior to the Directed Enforcement Team's arrival. The investigation revealed the two juvenile suspects, both of whom are documented gang members in the City of Thousand Oaks, confronted the victim and demanded money from the victim. When the victim stated he had no money to give, the suspects began punching the victim in the face and body. While the victim was being beaten his baseball cap fell to the ground. One of the juvenile suspects picked up the victim's baseball cap and both suspects then fled the area. The victim sustained minor injuries to his face

On March 6, 2015, the Thousand Oaks Police Special Enforcement Unit continued the investigation of the robbery. The Special Enforcement Unit conducted additional interviews and eventually located the two suspects walking together on Warwick Avenue. Both suspects were arrested for 211 PC ' Strong Armed Robbery, and 186.22 PC ' Street Terrorism / Gang Step Act. The investigation also revealed that one of the juvenile suspects threatened the victim with additional violence if the victim called the police. The juvenile that made this threat was also arrested for 136.1 PC ' Witness / Victim intimidation. Both juveniles were lodged into the Juvenile Justice Facility.

The Camarillo Police Department's Community Resource Unit arrests two employees at local massage establishment.

The Camarillo Police Department's Community Resource Unit and the city's code compliance office have been completing compliance checks of local massage establishments. Compliance checks of massage establishments are allowed under the City of Camarillo's Municipal Code. Since code compliance completes the initial inspection when a massage business applies for a license / permit to operate, the Police Department and the City of Camarillo coordinate their efforts more efficiently when both are at the establishment for the compliance checks. The thought is that the code compliance officer would recognize any physical changes (plumbing, electrical, construction etc.) that occurred and were not approved at the time the permit was issued.

On March 5, 2015, at approximately 1300 hours, the Police Department and City Code Compliance conducted a compliance check at April's Massage, 2109 Pickwick Drive. April's Massage had just opened for business on Feb 6, 2015. During the compliance check deputies learned that two employees of the business were performing massages without licensing or certification. Deputies also learned that the owner of the business, who was also present, was in violation of several of Camarillo's Municipal Codes. Through further inspection of the business, the code compliance officer noticed several changes to rooms, including the installation of a large jetted tub (also referred to as a Table Shower) that was not there during the initial inspection. Additionally, deputies discovered several suitcases with luggage tags attached, throughout the building. Deputies became suspicious that employees were living at the business.

All three subjects were taken into custody for the violations, and interviews were conducted at the

Police Department to determine the identities of the employees. These interviews were conducted by the Sheriff's Office Special Crimes / Intelligence Unit. During these interviews, deputies discovered that one of the masseuses was only 17 years old and was the daughter of the other masseuse. Both masseuses were performing massages when deputies initially entered the business. Deputies also discovered a significant amount of cash in one of the masseuses' purse.

The owner of the business was cited for several Camarillo Municipal Code violations, and the mother of the juvenile masseuse was booked into the Pre-Trial Detention Facility for several charges, including child endangerment. The juvenile was released to the custody of Child Protective Services.

The Camarillo Police Department would like to thank the Camarillo Code Compliance Office for their outstanding partnership in discovering these violations. The Police Department also wants the public to know that we will continue to perform these compliance checks on a regular basis, and will aggressively seek prosecution for these violations.

Governor Jerry Brown signed SB 255 into law in California on October 1, 2013. This new law makes revenge porn a misdemeanor under California's disorderly conduct statute. The punishment is six months in jail and a \$1,000 fine with additional fines for repeat violations. In January of 2015, SB 1255 was enacted which expanded the 'Revenge Porn' law to include photos taken by the victim also known as 'Selfies.'

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office is committed to protecting victim(s) of Internet crimes. In today's world of social media it is easy to become a victim of such crimes. The Ventura County Sheriff's Office reminds parents to educate their children of the dangers and consequences of posting and sharing personal and private information with others.

On March 5, 2015, Detectives with the City of Thousand Oaks Police Forgery / Fraud Unit and the Special Enforcement Unit served a search warrant at the Lexington Apartments in the City of Agoura Hills, Los Angeles County. The warrant resulted in the arrest of Rosel Mayor Magistrado and Jeffery Robert Greenfield for multiple counts of identity theft, forgery, grand theft auto, commercial burglary, and unlawful use of credit cards.

In January 2015, patrol deputies responded to a forgery call in the City of Thousand Oaks. The victim had paid utility bills using his personal checks and placed the bills in the mailbox for the postal carrier to pick up. About a week later the victim was reviewing his bank records when he noticed the 'Pay to the Order of:' and the amount on his checks had been changed. The victim reported these discrepancies to the bank and the Police Department.

Forgery / Fraud Detectives received the case and began their investigation. Through their investigation Detectives determined Magistrado had deposited the personal checks into Greenfield's bank account.

As with any identity theft case detectives also discovered that Magistrado was using multiple names and using other victim's identities to obtain goods. Detectives were able to link Magistrado to numerous crimes where she used other victim's identity to purchase groceries, dog food, pay bills, rent an apartment, and even lease a BMW vehicle.

As a result of the search warrant executed at Magistrado's residence, detectives recovered miscellaneous mail, bank statements, checks, check books, driver licenses, social security cards, birth certificates, passports, credit cards, income tax W-4's and 1099's, cell phone numbers, and addresses for in excess of 250 persons. The addresses on the mail span multiple counties including Santa Barbara County, Ventura County, Los Angeles County, San

Bernardino, Orange County and San Diego County.

Detectives are currently working with the United States Postal Service to have the mail returned to its rightful owners and the United States Secret Service regarding the credit card forgery equipment seized.

Rosel Magistrado was arrested for 502.6(a) PC ' Fraudulent Use of Card Scanning Device, 530.5(a) PC ' Identity Theft, Obtaining Credit with others Identification, 487(d)(1) PC ' Grand Theft Auto, 476 PC- Forgery, 182(a)(1) PC ' Conspiracy to commit a crime, 484i(c) PC ' Unlawful access Card Activity, 496 (A) PC ' Receiving Stolen Property, 484(a) PC ' Petty theft, and 459 PC ' Burglary. Jeffery Greenfield was arrested for 502.6(a) PC ' Fraudulent Use of Card Scanning Device, 476 PC- Forgery, 182(a)(1) PC ' Conspiracy to commit a crime, 484i(c) PC ' Unlawful access Card Activity, and 496 (A) PC ' Receiving Stolen Property. Both Magistrado and Greenfield were booked into the Ventura County Pre-Trial Detention Facility. Magistrado is currently pending trial and is being held on \$250,000.00 bail. Greenfield was released pending further investigation.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department will be deploying two roving DUI patrols this St. Patrick's Day looking to stop and arrest drivers who are impaired by alcohol or drugs. These DUI patrols are, in addition to regularly scheduled patrol officers, all looking for the tell-tale signs of an impaired driver behind the wheel.

In 2013, there were 31 people killed in drunk-driving crashes on St. Patrick's Day. All in all, during the St. Patty's Day period from 2009 to 2013, there have been 276 drunk-driving fatalities. Every one of those lives was lost because of bad decisions. Unfortunately, March 17 has become a deadly day in the United States, with a dramatic spike in drunk-driving fatalities. And we're not just talking about a little bit too much to drink here; from 2009 to 2013, almost three-fourths of the drunk-driving fatalities on St. Patrick's Day involved drivers who were *twice* the legal limit.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department offered this advice to partygoers: 'Get ahead of the decision this year. If you know you're going to celebrate St. Patrick's Day with alcohol, then figure out a plan ahead of time for how you'll get home. Don't wait until you're too buzzed to decide, and don't let your friends drive drunk.' *Buzzed Driving Is Drunk Driving*, so if you have anything to drink, count on a sober friend, taxi, or public transportation to drive you home safely. Not drinking' Maybe this St. Patrick's Day, you'll be the saint who drives your friends sober.

Let's make 2015 different. Use this party-planning checklist to stay safe this St. Patrick's Day.

- DDVIP: The California Office of Traffic Safety DDVIP app is now available for free download on iOS and Android devices. Launched last year the new DDVIP app offers enhanced features, allowing users to 'Map a Spot' with their current location to find DDVIP partnering establishments in their area or a 'List of Spots' to search all participating bars and restaurants throughout California. Users can stay up-to-date with the latest from DDVIP and see what other users are saying via its social tab. Also through the app, for those who want to imbibe but also make it a point to plan ahead, users can easily order a sober ride from Uber, Lyft or Curb ' all from one screen.
- NOW: Even if you don't have plans yet, plan to drive sober or designate someone else to.
 Save the number of a taxi company in your phone so you always have a backup plan.
- WHEN YOU MAKE PLANS: A sober driver is an essential part of any party plan. Once
 you know where you'll celebrate, decide whether you're drinking or driving. You can only
 choose one.
- ON ST. PATRICK'S DAY: Before you take your first sip of green beer, leave your keys at home or give them to a friend. If you're the designated driver, don't drink. Enjoy non-alcoholic beverages and brag about your VIP (very important partygoer) status online using the hashtag #designateddriver. Only drive sober or ride with a sober driver.
- EVERY DAY: If you're impaired, use a taxi, call a sober friend or family member, or use public transportation to get home safely. If you know people who are about to drive or ride while impaired, take their keys and help them make other arrangements to get to where they are going safely.
- DRUGS, MEDICATION & ALCOHOL= CRASHES: Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol.

Thousand Oaks, CA ' The Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a Driver's License/DUI Checkpoint on March 14, at an undisclosed location within the city limits.

The deterrent effect of Driver's License/DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an unlicensed or impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized Driver's License/DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths and nearly 24,000 serious injuries in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. 'Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 6 lives and resulted in 93 injury crashes harming 131 of our friends and neighbors,' said Sergeant Barbara Payton.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving, which now accounts for a growing number of impaired driving crashes. Drugs which may impair driving not only include illegal narcotics, but many prescription drugs, marijuana, and even some over-the-counter medications.

Driver's License/DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and

frequency of DUI arrests affording the greatest opportunity for achieving unlicensed and drunk/drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to Thousand Oaks Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Drivers! ' Call 9-1-1'.

Nichols and Burks exited the vehicle and ran from the deputies in an attempt to evade capture. Burks was taken into custody almost immediately after exiting the vehicle.

The Sheriff's Aviation Unit helicopter assisted with the search. A request for the Sheriff's K-9 Unit and Sheriff's Search and Rescue Bloodhound was made due to the extreme terrain in the area. Approximately 20 minutes later, Deputies located Nichols hiding under a piece of plywood in a nearby backyard. Both suspects were safely taken into custody without incident.

Over \$1100 dollars of stolen alcohol was recovered from Nichols' vehicle. Nichols was also identified as the suspect in two prior burglaries of high end alcohol from this same Vons. Nichols was booked into the Ventura County Pre-Trial Detention Facility for three counts of burglary, resisting arrest, and felony evading. Synopsis: The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit completed an investigation of Gabriel Flores selling heroin in the City of Ventura. Flores was arrested and a search warrant was served at his residence on Cameron Court, in the City of Ventura.

Investigation: During the latter part of 2014 and early 2015, detectives from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit learned of the use and sales of heroin and Xanax in the City of Ventura, among teenagers and young adults. Detectives learned of several probable heroin overdose deaths in the city as well.

Detectives from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit initiated an investigation into Gabriel Flores when they learned he was selling heroin in the City of Ventura. The investigation revealed that Flores sold heroin within 50 feet of De Anza Middle School, located in Ventura, on multiple occasions. The drug sales did not occur on the school property. Flores sold the drugs while school was in session, however. None of the buyers had any connection to the school.

On March 13, 2015, detectives from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit and the West County Sheriff's Narcotics Street Team conducted surveillance on Flores' residence located in the 100 block of Cameron Court, Ventura. Flores residence was within one block of De

Anza Middle School.

During the surveillance, detectives observed Flores leave his residence pushing a stroller with his three month old baby seated inside. Detectives then observed Flores conduct a hand to hand heroin deal with Steven Merrill of Ventura. Flores and Merrill were arrested and taken into custody without incident. Flores' three month old baby was released to Ventura County Child Protective Services. A search warrant was served at Flores residence. Heroin packaged for sale, used syringes, as well as a syringe loaded with suspected heroin was seized. All of these items were found in a location easily accessible by the five and six year old children also residing in the apartment. The five and six year old children were also released to Ventura County Child Protective services.

Merrill was arrested for a misdemeanor charge of possession of heroin. He was booked into Ventura County Jail with a \$15,000 bail. His court date is pending.

Flores was arrested and booked for sales of heroin with an enhancement of dealing near a school, possession of heroin for sale, and child endangerment. Flores is in custody in the Ventura County Jail with a \$500,000.00 bail. His court date is pending.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. Their primary mission is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use. On March 17, 2015 detectives from the Camarillo Investigations Bureau arrested a 13 year old Camarillo resident for reporting a false emergency, a practice also known as 'Swatting.'

The term 'SWAT'ing or Swatting,' is derived from SWAT (Special Weapons and Tactics), which are known as a highly trained law enforcement officers who respond to incidents beyond the capabilities of normal patrol operations. 'Swatting' is the act of calling in a false report to law enforcement that is of such an extreme nature, that the deployment of the SWAT team is usually required. These incidents have been used in the past as a prank or to harass the subjects who reside at the location law enforcement is responding to.

On January 20, 2015, deputies responded to the 1600 block of Bridgeport Lane, in Camarillo for a possible hostage situation. At approximately 4:40 PM, a male subject called the Ventura County Sheriff's Communication Center and told them he was holding ten people hostage at the location. He demanded a large sum of money and said he would blow-up the house if his demands were not met. The caller described the type of weapons he had and the amount of explosives he was going to detonate.

The Sheriff's Department deployed over eighteen units to the scene, some of which included members of the Sheriff's SWAT team, several K-9's and detectives. Deputies spent close to an hour securing the scene, until they realized this was a false report.

While detectives from the Camarillo Investigations Bureau were investigating this incident, they received information from detectives with the Ocean City Police Department, in New Jersey, that they were investigating a 'Swatting' incident that occurred on January 15, 2015 in their city. Their investigation revealed the IP (Internet Protocol) address of the suspect was located in Camarillo,

CA.

Detectives followed up on this information and developed a possible suspect in the case with ties to both the Camarillo and New Jersey 'Swatting' incidents. They additionally learned of another 'Swatting' incident that occurred on January 16, 2015, in the city of Ventura, CA. During that incident, the caller gave almost identical information to the Ventura Police dispatcher that he gave during the Camarillo incident.

On March 17, 2015, Camarillo detectives and members of the Southern California High Tech Task Force served a search warrant in the 1500 block of Tierra Buena Court, in Camarillo, and arrested a 13 year old male juvenile for Penal Code 148.3(a) / Reporting a false emergency. The juvenile was cited and released to his parent.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office would like to remind the public that any reported emergency is taken very seriously and responded to professionally. When we receive false reports of emergencies of this nature, it not only endangers the lives of the officers responding to the scene and the innocent parties at the locations, but takes emergency resources away from situations where they are truly needed.

Traffic Enforcement Operations Planned for Thousand Oaks

The Thousand Oaks Police Department will step up bicycle safety enforcement operations on Saturday, March 21, 2015, with focused enforcement on collision-causing factors involving motorists and bike riders. Special overtime patrols will be deployed to crackdown on drivers and bicyclists who violate basic traffic laws.

The department has mapped out locations over the past three years where bicycle involved collisions have occurred along with the violations that led to those crashes. Officers will be looking for violations made by drivers and bike riders alike that can lead to life changing injuries.

Bicycle fatalities are rising in California as more people use bicycling for commuting, exercise and recreation. Locally, Thousand Oaks Police Department has investigated 85 fatal and injury collisions involving bike riders during the past three (3) years. In 2012, California witnessed 124 bicyclist deaths that year while nationally 726 riders were killed.

Nationally, fatal bike crash patterns have changed markedly. The percentage involving adults age 20 and older increased from 21 percent in 1975 to 84 percent in 2012. The percentage involving males increased from 82 percent to 88 percent during this period. Adult males comprised 74 percent of all bicyclist deaths in 2012. The percentage of deaths occurring in urban areas climbed from 50 percent in 1975 to 69 percent in 2012. The following safety tips can save lives and stop this tragedy witnessed far too often in Thousand Oaks:

Drivers:

- 'Share the road' with bicyclists
- Be courteous; California law now mandates at least three feet of clearance when passing a bike riders

- Look for cyclists before opening a car door or pulling out from a parking space
- Yield to cyclists at intersections and as directed by signs and signals
- Be especially watchful for riders when making turns, either left or right

Bicyclists:

- Wear properly fitted bicycle helmets every time they ride. If under 18 years of age, it's the law
- A helmet is the single most effective way to prevent head injury resulting from a bicycle crash
- Riders are considered vehicle operators; they are required to obey the same rules of the road as other vehicle operators, including obeying traffic signs, signals, and lane markings.
- When cycling in the street, cyclists must ride in the same direction as traffic.
- Bicyclists should increase their visibility to drivers by wearing fluorescent or brightly colored clothing during the day, and at dawn and dusk
- To be noticed when riding at night, the law requires a front light and a red reflector to the rear
- For additional safety, use a flashing rear light, and use retro-reflective tape or markings on equipment or clothing

Improving Motorcycle Safety Aim of Thousand Oaks Police Department Operation

Careless motorists as well as riders get special scrutiny

The Thousand Oaks Police Department will be conducting a specialized Motorcycle Safety Enforcement Operation on Sunday, March 22, 2015, in an effort to lower deaths and injuries. Extra officers will be on duty patrolling areas frequented by motorcyclists and where motorcycle crashes occur. Officers will be looking for violations made by drivers and riders alike that can lead to motorcycle crashes. They will be cracking down on both those operating regular vehicles and motorcycles that are under the influence of drugs or alcohol, speeding, making illegal turns, or any other dangerous violation.

Motorcycle fatalities saw a phenomenal drop of 37 percent from 2008 to 2010, but then rose 23 percent by 2012. Operations like this are aimed at curbing any more rises in motorcycle deaths and sending the numbers back downward. Over the course of the past three years, motorcycle involved collisions have resulted in 85 fatal and injury crashes. During that time period, four collisions involved motorcyclist who were DUI.

- Use your lane position to increase visibility; change lanes only when there is ample room

- Match your speed to surrounding traffic
- Always wear a DOT compliant helmet and brightly colored, protective clothing

Safety tips for drivers 'Share the Road:

- Look twice for motorcyclists, especially when entering the roadway, turning or changing lanes
- Motorcyclist are allowed in HOV lanes unless prohibited by signage

Synopsis: On March 18, 2015, the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) completed an investigation into Mitch Keatley selling concentrated cannabis in Newbury Park. A butane honey oil lab was discovered at his residence.

Investigation: During the month of March, 2015, detectives from the PCU learned Mitch Keatley was dealing marijuana and concentrated cannabis in the City of Thousand Oaks. Concentrated cannabis is also known as wax, BHO, or shatter. Keatley, and his passenger, Nicholas Fenze, were arrested on March 18, 2015, while they were driving to Thousand Oaks to deliver marijuana. A search warrant was served at Keatley's residence in the 700 block of Rudman, in Newbury Park. The residence is in close proximity to a school. About eighty marijuana plants, several pounds of processed marijuana, an active butane honey oil lab, and several thousand dollars in cash, was discovered at the house. The residence was evacuated and eventually secured by officers from LA IMPACT, an interagency task force of Los Angeles City and County police officers who specialize in clandestine lab investigations. The lab created a dangerous condition for the residents as well as for the entire neighborhood. Butane honey oil labs frequently blow up and have caused injury and death.

Keatley was booked into the Ventura County Jail for a multitude of charges including manufacturing drugs. He is currently in custody with a bail of \$300,000.

Fenzke was booked into the Ventura County Jail for conspiracy to sell marijuana and possession of marijuana for sale. He is currently in custody with a bail of \$20,000.

Krehbiel was booked into the Ventura County Jail for maintaining a place where drugs are used

or sold. He bailed out of custody.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office East County Street Team assisted on the investigation.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. Their primary mission is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use. Synopsis: Between March 20, 2015 and March 24, 2015, the Ventura County Sheriff's Gang Unit (SGU) and Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) concluded an investigation with the arrest of three individuals suspected of trafficking in prescription medication and guns.

Investigation: At the beginning of 2015, the PCU received an anonymous tip regarding Alfredo Leon selling prescription medication in the County of Ventura. Detectives identified Leon and several of his associates. The Sheriff's Gang Unit arrested one of his associates, Martin Ipatzi, on 3-20-15. Ipatzi was in possession of approximately 700 pills of hydrocodone and clonazepam. Three handguns were also seized during his initial arrest.

Detectives from the PCU followed up this arrest with several search warrants at Ipatzi's apartment, a residence where he kept property, and two storage lockers. All locations were in the city of Oxnard. Over 12,300 pills including hydrocodone and clonazepam were seized along with 7 handguns and a rifle. Ipatzi's girlfriend, Erica Barboza, was also arrested in the investigation. One of the storage lockers was in her name and investigators learned she destroyed evidence in this case after Ipatzi was arrested.

Detectives then served a search warrant at Leon's residence in the city of Oxnard. He was arrested for conspiracy to sell Alprazolam and Hydrocodone. Two guns were seized from his residence as well. In total, over 13,000 pills and 13 guns were seized in this investigation.

All individuals were booked into the Ventura County Jail for a variety of drug and weapons violations. Court dates are pending. This investigation is continuing and additional arrests are

anticipated.

Narrative:

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services (OES), in cooperation with the Ventura County Watershed Protection District, and various cities and special districts within Ventura County, is launching a countywide effort to re-assess risks posed by natural and human-caused disasters and identify ways to reduce those risks.

The planning process will result in the preparation of an updated Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan (MHMP). The County developed their first MHMP in 2005, updated the plan in 2010 and is kicking-off the 2015 plan update process. An updated version of the plan is required under the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 in order to be eligible to continue to receive certain forms of Federal disaster assistance. OES has received a grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for preparation of the updated plan.

Additionally, the updated 2015 MHMP will support the County's participation in the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System (CRS) program by addressing the program's Floodplain Management Planning activities. To earn CRS credits and participate in the CRS program, communities must illustrate that they have gone beyond the minimum floodplain protection requirements and have developed extra measures to provide protection to their community from flooding. In 2011, Ventura County entered the CRS program at class 6 participation. Ventura County is the first county in California to enter the program at that level.

Ventura County is vulnerable to a wide range of disasters. In the past five years, Ventura County has received multiple Presidential disaster declarations and State Emergency Proclamations due to various natural disasters including the hazards of winter storm, drought and wildfire. The risks posed by these hazards and other hazards increases as the County's population continues to grow. The 2015 MHMP will provide the County, the participating cities and special districts with the necessary tools to identify these risks and prioritize future actions for reducing these risks. Additionally, the plan will provide a framework for future requests for Federal assistance to institute risk-reducing actions.

The County's current Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan, as well as information about the CRS program can be found on the County of Ventura's flood information webpage: http://www.vcfloodinfo.com/home.

The planning process will occur from March 'August 2015. In many cases, the dispatcher can make the difference between life and death.

Each year, the public safety dispatchers and supervisors at the Ventura County Sheriff's Office handle more than 340,000 telephone calls, including 98,000 911 calls. Every day, hundreds of people depend on the skill, expertise and commitment of the dispatchers who work in public safety communications. These team members help save countless lives by handling emergency telephone calls, dispatching law enforcement resources, and providing moral support to people in distress.

Public safety dispatchers must undergo a rigorous testing and background process before being hired. After they have been hired, new dispatchers must attend the three-week Basic Dispatcher Course that is certified by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST). Typically, their training also includes four additional weeks of classroom training and between 6 '12 months of on-the-job training before the new dispatcher is allowed to work independently. Even then, almost 50% of the dispatchers hired are not able to successfully complete the training program, due to the demands of the job.

Within the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, we are celebrating the valuable contributions that our public safety dispatchers make on a daily basis. We are incredibly fortunate to have such talented and dedicated professionals who work so hard to serve the public and the deputies. Please join us in thanking them for doing such an excellent job at fulfilling a critical role in public safety.

The Ojai Police Department in partnership with Monarch Arc & Monarch Watch, Monarch Butterfly Conservation Groups, recently planted drought resistant plants and specific types of milkweed at the Ojai Police Station to help sustain local Monarch Butterfly populations creating a sustainable and environmentally friendly ecosystem. As a result of these volunteer efforts, the Ojai Police Station has been designated as a 'Monarch Waystation #10146' by MonarchWatch.org.

The Ojai Police Department has recently made changes to the landscaping that exists around the station property. In an effort to be a better partner to the environment staff members assigned to the station began planting drought resistance plants a few months ago. This was done so that the station would reduce its dependency on water irrigation during this terrible drought. At about the time we were planting, a local citizen representing Monarch Arc approached the Sheriff's Office with a conservation idea that would benefit the community and the environment. Monarch Arc is a local educational and conservation group dedicated to preserving Monarch Butterfly populations.

Monarch butterflies (Danaus plexippus) of North America are renowned for their long-distance seasonal migration and spectacular winter gatherings in Mexico and California. The monarch butterfly population has recently declined to dangerously low levels. In the 1990s, estimates of up to one billion monarchs made the epic flight each fall from the northern plains of the U.S. and Canada to sites in the oyamel fir forests north of Mexico City, and more than one million monarchs overwintered in forested groves on the California Coast. Now, researchers and citizen scientists estimate that only about 56.5 million monarchs remain, representing a decline of more than 80% from the 21 year average across North America. This is an alarming statistic.

Habitats typically consisting of various types of milkweed have been destroyed on a massive scale, and now patterns of climate and weather are shifting unpredictably in response to pollution of the atmosphere but the disappearance of these beautiful creatures is more serious than just a loss of color in the countryside. Monarch Butterflies are indicators of a healthy environment and healthy ecosystems. Areas rich in butterflies are rich in other invertebrates. These collectively

provide a wide range of environmental benefits, including pollination and natural pest control.

The Ojai Police Station in partnership with Monarch Arc planted about ten different types of milkweed in various planter beds surrounding the station. Within a week the first monarch caterpillars appeared. Due to the successful efforts of Monarch Arc, the Ojai Police Station recently received official certification as a "Monarch Way-station #10146"! This project was done through local donations and there were no expenses paid from tax payer funds. We hope that this way-station serves a conservation model for other local citizens to follow and to learn more about sustainable landscaping that benefits the environment. We would like to thank the volunteers at Monarch Arc for their hard work and partnership throughout this project.

Warning of IRS Phone Scam in Ventura County

With tax season upon us a new scam in Ventura County involving the Internal Revenue Service is here.

Community members throughout the county are receiving fraudulent calls from 877-807-6988. The callers are identifying themselves as IRS members and threatening to block bank accounts and default assets unless the owed debt is paid using Green Dot pre-paid money cards. If the victim refuses to cooperate, they are then threatened with arrest, deportation or suspension of a business or driver's license. In many cases, the caller becomes hostile and insulting. THIS IS A SCAM.

According to the IRS they will never: Call to demand immediate payment, nor will the agency call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill; demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe; require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card; ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone; or threaten to bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.

What to do if you receive a suspicious call from the IRS:

- 1. Record the employee's name, badge number, call back number and caller ID if available.
- 2. Call the IRS at 1-800-829-1040. The IRS employees at that line can help you with a payment issue, if there really is such an issue.
- 3. If you know you don't owe taxes or have no reason to think that you owe any taxes (for example, you've never received a bill or the caller made some bogus threats as described above), then call and report the incident to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at 1-800-366-4484.
- 4. You can file a complaint using the FTC Complaint Assistant; choose 'Other' and then 'Imposter Scams.' If the complaint involves someone impersonating the IRS, include the words 'IRS Telephone Scam' in the notes.

5. Go to www.irs.gov or http://www.fbi.gov/scams-safety/fraud for further information on scams.

Remember, most scams have three things in common: They will ask you to pay with a Green Dot or money card, they will ask you to wire them the money, or they will ask you to send cash. If someone is emailing, texting, or calling you asking you to pay money in one of these ways it is most likely a SCAM. Always verify with any agency calling you for money by independently looking up a separate phone number for that agency and then call them directly.

Over the last several months, members of the Sheriff's Gang Unit and Sheriff's Headquarters Detectives began investigating a series of residential burglaries which occurred in the unincorporated community of Oxnard known as Nyeland Acres. Since the beginning of the year, there have been at least twelve reported residential burglaries which are believed to be linked to the same suspect(s). During one of these burglaries, the victim confronted the suspect as he attempted to leave. A struggled ensued until the suspect retrieved a knife, pointed it toward the victim, and threatened to get a gun and kill the victim. Fearing for his safety, the victim let the suspect leave.

Recently, with the assistance of the Ventura Police Street Crimes Unit, the Sheriff's Gang Unit was able to identify a suspect, (S) Ivan Ruiz Reyes. Ivan Ruiz Reyes is a criminal street gang member who has a violent criminal history.

On 04/18/2015, the Sheriff's Gang Unit contacted and arrested Ivan Ruiz Reyes. During the arrest, Ivan Ruiz Reyes was observed driving his white four-door Honda Civic which has been linked to several of the residential burglaries. Property believed to be stolen was located inside his vehicle, at his residence in Port Hueneme, and at his family's residence in Oak View. Ivan Ruiz Reyes also was found to be under the influence of a controlled substance and in possession of drug paraphernalia. He was arrested for drug offenses and transported to the Headquarters Station for further investigation.

Based on the evidence obtained during the lengthy investigation, the Sheriff's Gang Unit developed probable cause to arrest Ivan Ruiz Reyes for multiple counts of felony residential burglary, multiple counts of receiving stolen property, one count of assault with a deadly weapon, and one count of criminal threats. He was booked at the Ventura County Pre-Trial Detention Facility with a bail set at \$250,000.00.

During the investigation, Detectives also obtained information leading us to believe there are

additional suspects still outstanding and possible other residential burglaries which have occurred in other areas. The investigation is being handled as a potential 'Swatting' incident. Swatting is easily defined as the use of modern technology to trick law enforcement and other first responders. The process involves a fictitious communication which is intended to illicit a large emergency response.

During the investigation, approximately fifty deputies responded to various locations in the City of Moorpark which caused a drain on localized resources. The Sheriff's Office will aggressively pursue suspects in these cases as they clearly put the public and law enforcement officers at risk. In recent years, the Sheriff's Office has made arrests as far away as New Jersey and Maryland in unrelated Swatting cases. SUV Third Row Seat Thefts on the Rise

Narrative:

Thieves throughout Ventura County including Moorpark are targeting SUVs parked in driveways, streets, and parking lots. They are stealing the 'third row' seating from victims to sell them on various internet auctions and sales sites. Thieves can make over a \$1,000 per third row seat depending on the make and model of the vehicle and overall condition of the seat.

Now that many of us are becoming more security conscious about our vehicles by locking our cars and assuring that our valuables are out of sight or removed all together, we now have to take additional steps to protect our vehicle investment.

Keep in mind most car alarms do not cover the back window hatch of the vehicle and this is where most of the thefts are occurring. The thieves are capable of making entry into the back window, undetected, and stealing the third row seat in less than 40 seconds.

Even when Police recover the stolen seats, we have no way of knowing who the owner was. Because of this, the Moorpark Police Department and the Ventura County Sheriff's Office are encouraging vehicle owners to engrave their SUV's vehicle identification number in an inconspicuous location on the bottom of the seats. Make sure the engraving is on a permanent portion of attached metal, like the frame. We are also recommending if possible, to cable lock and secure your seat to the vehicle. To make it even more difficult to make entry into your SUV, park it in your driveway with the rear tailgate door as close as possible to your garage door.

Using these Crime Prevention techniques may not prevent the theft, but it will slow the thief down and possibly provide that additional time needed for someone to notice and call the police. It will also help the police identify stolen property during the recovery process. Remember if you see something suspicious, Call Law Enforcement.

Cinco de Mayo: Fiesta Time or Jail Time' Buzzed Driving Is Drunk Driving

Thousand Oaks, CA. 'In the United States, Cinco de Mayo 'like St. Patrick's Day 'is for many people just an occasion for having a good time with alcohol. Do you plan to join the fiesta on May 5th' The Thousand Oaks Police Department has planned a DUI Saturation Patrol and will deploy officers looking to identify and stop suspected drunk drivers. Additionally, every traffic and patrol officer assigned to duty will be on heightened alert to prevent a senseless tragedy due to alcohol or drugs.

The unfortunate truth is this: many people might be making party plans for Cinco de Mayo, but they aren't planning ahead for getting home. Only 64 percent of the drivers in fatal crashes on Cinco de Mayo weekend in 2013 had no alcohol in their systems. What about the other 36 percent' They were driving after drinking. Too many people are lying to themselves about the dangers of drinking and driving. Some fiesta-goers think that they can play it by ear, and wait until after they drink to decide whether they're 'okay to drive.' By then, it's too late.

Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol. Mixing medication or drugs - legal or illegal - is a dangerous cocktail. Specially trained drug recognition experts will be checking for drug impairment whenever suspected.

If you don't designate a sober driver ahead of time or have a solid plan for how you'll get home safely, you are setting yourself up for disaster. Buzzed Driving Is Drunk Driving, and when you

drive drunk, you run the risk of killing yourself or someone else. Even if you don't harm anyone, the average DUI costs about \$10,000. Wouldn't you rather pay for a taxi'

'Our main goal is to save lives,' said Assistant Chief Jim Fryhoff of the Thousand Oaks Police Department. 'Around the county, we want to debunk the myth that you can drink until you feel it and then get behind the wheel. You can't. Remember that *Buzzed Driving Is Drunk Driving.'* Cinco de Mayo can be a fun and festive time for those who choose to celebrate the right way: with a plan for a sober ride. If you make your plans when you're sober, you won't make a bad decision when you're drunk.

As you make your Cinco de Mayo plans, the California Office of Traffic Safety is offering a free mobile app ' DDVIP ' aimed at thanking the sober designated driver with perks and free offers at area bars and restaurants. And for those without a DD - make a sober ride home your priority; the new SaferRide app from NHTSA makes it easier than ever.

A final statistic to remember: drunk-driving deaths are 100 percent preventable.

Funding for this is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration who reminders every motorist to Report Drunk Drivers 'Call 911! Remember, *Buzzed Driving Is Drunk Driving*. Don't do it.

LAW ENFORCEMENT REMIND MOTORCYCLISTS TO 'SURVIVE THE RIDE'

'Share the Road' Campaign Aims to Increase Motorcycle Safety Awareness for All Road Users

As motorcycle fatalities and injuries have increased in California, law enforcement and the Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) have stepped up their efforts to promote safety and education, highlighted by Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month in May.

Nationwide, motorcyclists made up 14 percent of all vehicle-related fatalities in 2013, up from about 9 percent in 2004. This was despite motorcycle registrations representing only 3 percent of all vehicles in the United States in 2013, according to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) data. The fatality rate per miles traveled for motorcyclists is 16 times that of car or truck occupants.

In 2013, California's motorcycle collisions resulted in 475 fatalities and 13,143 injured victims. In 2012, 467 people were killed and 12,617 were injured.

'Motorcyclists are out in force as Californian's enjoy perfect weather conditions this time of year, which is why May is Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month,' said Assistant Chief Jim Fryhoff of the Thousand Oaks Police Department. 'Fatal crashes with motorcycles are on the rise. We all need to be more aware of motorcyclists in order to save lives.'

During Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month ' and throughout the year ' all road users are reminded to safely "share the road" with motorcyclists, and to be extra alert to help keep motorcyclists safe. That message is most important in California, which is home to more than 830,000 registered motorcycles ' the most of any state ' and more than 1.4 million motorcycle

riders.

'Californians increasingly get around by means other than cars and trucks. More are bicycling, walking, taking mass transit and motorcycling,' said OTS Director Rhonda Craft. 'That also means that everyone needs to be extra cautious and looking out for everyone else, no matter what their means of transportation is.'

The California Motorcyclist Safety Program (CMSP) trains approximately 65,000 motorcyclists every year. As of July 2014, nearly 945,000 motorcycle riders have received training at one of the authorized CMSP training sites since the program began in 1987. For more information or to find a training site near you, go to www.californiamotorcyclist.com.

Thousand Oaks PD offers tips to drivers on how to prevent a fatal crash with a motorcycle:

Driver's safety reminders:

- -Though a motorcycle is a small vehicle, its operator still has all the rights of the road as any other motorist
- -Always signal when changing lanes or merging with traffic
- -If you see a motorcycle with a signal on, be careful: motorcycle signals are often non-canceling and could have been forgotten
- -Always ensure that the motorcycle is turning before proceeding
- -Check all mirrors and blind spots for motorcycles before changing lanes or merging with traffic, especially at intersections
- -Lane Sharing is not illegal in California
- -Always allow more follow distance ' three to four seconds ' when behind a motorcycle. This gives them more time to maneuver or stop in an emergency.
- -Never drive distracted or impaired

Motorcyclists can increase their safety by following these steps:

- -Wear the proper safety gear at all times, including a DOT-compliant helmet
- -Obey all traffic laws and be properly licensed
- -Excessive speed is the most common rider-related factor in motorcycle related crashes
- -Follow at a safe distance 'three to four seconds
- -Ride within your own limits 'don't be a victim of peer pressure
- -Use turn signals at every lane change or turn.
- -Wear brightly colored clothes and reflective tape to increase visibility.
- -Never ride distracted or impaired
- -Ride defensively assume other drivers don't see you

'By following basic safety rules, we can all help prevent crashes,' concluded Assistant Chief Jim Fryhoff. 'Our message is for all drivers and riders: Share the responsibility of keeping our roads safe'always share the road.'

On 05/01/15, members of the Camarillo Special Enforcement Detail were conducting enforcement patrol in the City of Camarillo. They conducted an enforcement stop on a vehicle driven by William Hacker because the vehicle had false registration tabs on the license plate. Upon contact, the detectives discovered Hacker was on probation for burglary. They conducted a probation search on Hacker and on his vehicle and found a significant amount of property that belonged to other people.

The detectives discovered hundreds of pieces of mail, which included personal and business checks, bank account information, credit card information, passports, driver's licenses and other identification cards. The mail and checks belonged to people from nearly every city in Ventura County, from more than twenty other cities throughout southern California and from other states.

Detectives also discovered a printer and check paper in Hacker's car, and they located fraudulent checks that were made using checking account information from some of the mail and financial account information found in the car. Detectives found blank keys, twenty lock pick tools and several other sets of keys in Hacker's car. Detectives also found three iPads and an iPhone they believed were stolen. Finally, detectives located methamphetamine in Hacker's car they believed Hacker possessed with the intent to sell.

A subsequent probation search at Hacker's home, located in the City of Camarillo, revealed additional mail, checks, identification cards, methamphetamine and other items believed to be stolen.

Thus far in the investigation, detectives located mail, checks and identification cards in Hacker's possession from over one hundred twenty different people. Detectives will be attempting to contact victims and will also be contacting outside law enforcement agencies for assistance in locating victims.

Detectives arrested Hacker and prepared a case for filing with the District Attorney's Office. As a result of the initial investigation, the District Attorney's Office filed several charges, including identity theft, several counts of grand theft, possession for sale of a controlled substance, possession of burglary tools and possession of drug paraphernalia.

The Camarillo Police Department continues to offer the following tips so that you won't become a victim of identity theft: Stop your mail if you are going on vacation or will be gone for several days; Do not put your outgoing mail in your mailbox and lift up the flag, this will only alert thieves that there is outgoing mail in the box; Don't let your mail sit in the mailbox and pile up; If you need to mail something, take your mail to the post office or place your mail in a secure mailbox.

Narrative:

On May 13, 2015, Investigators from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit and the Health Quality Investigation Unit of the California Division of Investigation (formerly the California Medical Board) arrested Dr. Ellen Crowe and Paul McQuillan for multiple felonies relating to the death of an elderly patient.

Dr. Ellen Crowe and Paul McQuillan own and operate a business known as House Call Doctor Thousand Oaks (HCDTO). Polly Duntley was a patient of HCDTO. On July 31, 2014, McQuillan, who has no official medical training, responded to the home of Duntley in Camarillo. This was a follow-up visit from the day prior where a HCDTO doctor other than Ellen Crowe attended to Duntley. McQuillan injected Duntley with morphine, provided by Dr. Crowe, and ordered by the other doctor. This injection was done just prior to a planned x-ray and ultrasound that was to take place at the residence. Duntley fell into a deep sleep within minutes after the injection was given. McQuillan then left the residence to treat another patient in the neighborhood. In his absence, a technician from another company arrived at the residence and performed the ultrasound on Duntley. McQuillan returned to the residence while the ultrasound was being conducted. During the ultrasound, McQuillan realized Duntley no longer had a pulse and called 911. He then attempted to provide first aid. Emergency responders resuscitated Duntley, but she never regained consciousness. Duntley died in the hospital on August 2, 2014.

McQuillan was arrested at his home in the 100 block of Los Padres, Thousand Oaks. A search warrant was also served at his residence where evidence relating to the crime was located.

Dr. Crowe was located in Bakersfield and arrested.

McQuillan was booked into the Ventura County Jail for practicing medicine without a license and furnishing morphine.

Dr. Crowe was booked into the Ventura County Jail for conspiracy to practice medicine without a license and conspiracy to furnish morphine.

Additional charges and enhancements of elder abuse, great bodily injury or death occurring in the commission of a felony, and weapons violations are also possible.

An additional arrest is expected in this case.

Both Dr. Crowe and McQuillan secured bail and are scheduled to be arraigned in Ventura County Superior Court on May 27, 2015.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, and the California Highway Patrol. The primary mission of the task force is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use. Click It or Ticket Campaign Starts May 18th The Thousand Oaks Police Department Will Show Zero Tolerance

Thousand Oaks, CA 'Once again, the Thousand Oaks Police Department is reminding motorists to *Click It or Ticket*. As part of the national seat belt enforcement campaign, law enforcement agencies around the country will be stepping up enforcement May 18-31, including one of the busiest travel weekends of the year that kicks off the summer season.

'Every day, unbuckled motorists are losing their lives in motor vehicle crashes,' said Assistant Chief Jim Fryhoff of the Thousand Oaks Police Department. 'As we approach Memorial Day weekend and the summer vacation season, we want to make sure people are doing the one best thing that can save them in a crash, buckling up.'

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, nearly half of the 21,132 passenger vehicle occupants killed in crashes in 2013 were unrestrained. At night from 6 p.m. to 5:59 a.m., that number soared to 59 percent of those killed. That's why one focus of the *Click It or Ticket* campaign is nighttime enforcement. Participating law enforcement agencies will be taking a no-excuses approach to seat belt law enforcement, writing citations day and night. In California, the minimum penalty for a seat belt violation is \$161.00.

California statistics reveal that 500 unrestrained vehicle occupants died in 2013. Almost twice as many males were killed in crashes as compared to females, with lower belt use rates too. Of the males killed in crashes in 2013, more than half (54%) were unrestrained. For females killed in crashes, 41 percent were not buckled up.

'If you ask the family members of those unrestrained people who were killed in crashes,

they'll tell you'they wish their loved ones had buckled up,' added Assistant Chief Jim Fryhoff. 'The bottom line is that seat belts save lives. If these enforcement crackdowns get people's attention and get them to buckle up, then we've done our job.'

On May 19, 2015, members of the Fillmore Police Department, the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, and the California Department of Alcohol Beverage Control conducted an alcohol sting, using underage minor decoys, in an attempt to purchase alcohol from various on-sale and off-sale establishments in the city of Fillmore and the community of Piru. 'On-sale' generally means merchants are authorized to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises where sold, while 'off-sale' generally means merchants are authorized to sell alcohol that must be consumed elsewhere. The goal of this operation was to limit minors' access to alcohol and confirm establishments are abiding by the Business and Professions Code and rules set forth by the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control.

Three underage decoys were used in an attempt to purchase alcohol from 16 locations throughout Fillmore and Piru. The Fillmore Police Department, Ventura County Sheriff's Office, and California Alcohol Beverage Control will continue to conduct periodic sting operations in an effort to prevent minors' access to alcohol and remind the public that selling alcohol to, or purchasing alcohol for, minors is illegal. Alcohol is a factor in many homicides, suicides, and unintentional injuries which, along with car crashes, are the four leading causes of death of 15-20 year olds. The public is asked to report incidents of underage drinking and illegal purchasing of alcohol to law enforcement.

Narrative:

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is announcing the conclusion of their investigation into the October 2014 death of Moorpark resident Christina Blankenship. On March 25, 2015, the Ventura County District Attorney's Office formally charged Paul Giannotta with multiple felonies related to the death of his niece. An investigation revealed Giannotta supplied his niece with Methadone which resulted in her death.

On October 28, 2014, Moorpark Patrol Deputies responded to a residence in the 4500 block of South Moorpark Ave, Moorpark, for a person not breathing call. They discovered Christina Blankenship was deceased inside of her residence. Information gathered at the scene quickly identified Blankenship's uncle, Paul Giannotta, as the probable source of supply of methadone. Investigators from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit, East County Narcotics Street Team, and Moorpark Police Department Investigations Unit served search warrants at both Giannotta's home, in the 1600 block of Sweet Briar Place, Thousand Oaks, and Blankenship's home on Moorpark Avenue. They discovered evidence confirming Giannotta as the source of supply of methadone for Blankenship. An autopsy conducted by the Ventura County Medical Examiner's Office also determined methadone was a significant contributing factor in Blankenship's death. Giannotta was charged with involuntary manslaughter and furnishing methadone with a special enhancement of causing great bodily injury during the commission of a felony.

Giannotta will be arraigned in Ventura County Superior Court on June 25, 2015.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, the California Highway Patrol, and the Health Quality Investigation Unit of the California Division of Investigation. The primary mission of the task force

is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use. Anyone with information regarding these topics is encouraged to contact the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit at (805) 383-8700 or via e-mail at pharm.tip@ventura.org.

The task force investigates drug related overdose deaths in the County of Ventura and will continue to aggressively pursue all individuals involved in the furnishing of drugs resulting in another person's death. Arrests will be made and cases will be presented to the District Attorney's Office in investigations where investigators believe charges can and should be filed.

Suspects are popping vehicle hatches and stealing the vehicle's third-row seats within a minute's time.

According to investigators, suspects are selling third-row seats on websites like Craigslist.com or in salvage yards.

All three suspects were documented Los Angeles based gang members and arrested for 459PC (vehicle burglary), 664/459PC (attempted vehicle burglary), 182(a)(1)PC (conspiracy to commit a crime), 466PC (possession of burglary tools), and 186.22(a)PC (participation in a criminal street gang). Search warrants were served following the arrest of the three suspects and additional third-row seats were located during the investigation.

All three suspects are in custody at the Ventura County Jail, with their bail set at \$300,000.00. Their arraignments are scheduled for 06-03-2015.

Within the next couple of weeks, high schools will be holding graduation ceremonies and that means summer is right around the corner. The Camarillo Police Department would like to remind graduates, parents, and residents to celebrate responsibly. The Camarillo Police Department actively enforces all alcohol related laws in an effort to prevent underage drinking of alcoholic beverages as well as loud and unruly gatherings. The Camarillo Police Department would like to take this opportunity to remind residents about the Social Host Ordinance in Camarillo.

Camarillo Municipal Code section 10.32 makes it unlawful for any responsible person to conduct, aid, allow, permit, or condone a loud or unruly gathering at a residence or other private property involving minors and the unlawful consumption of alcohol.

Penalties for a violation of the ordinance are as follows:

- First violation is punishable by a \$500.00 dollar fine
- A second violation at the same residence or other private property, or by the same responsible person, within a 12 month period is punishable by a \$1000.00 dollar fine.
- A third or subsequent violation of this section at the same residence or other private property, or by the same responsible person, within a 12 month period is punishable by a fine of \$2500.00 dollars.

Since 2006, The Camarillo Police Department has issued 77 Social Host violation citations. If juveniles are cited the ordinance does not allow for community service as an option to pay the fine.

In addition, the unincorporated areas of Ventura County have a similar Social Host ordinance, Ventura County Code 6113-4, which makes it a civil violation for any responsible person to conduct or allow a loud or unruly gathering at a residence or other private property at which service to, or consumption of alcohol or alcoholic beverages by underage persons occurs. A violation of this code is one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).

Narrative:

Investigators have arrested four members of a violent assaultive home invasion robbery / burglary crew that committed multiple crimes in California and Nevada.

On March 31st, 2015, at about 10:30 a.m., Ventura County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a home invasion robbery in the 1000 block of Modesto Avenue, Camarillo. An initial investigation found two males forced their way into the residence and assaulted both homeowners who were in their 80's. Both suspects fled the residence without taking any property. The suspects were driven away by a third subject who was described as a female. Investigators believe the two suspects broke into the residence to steal property and were part of a burglary ring.

Over the next month, Ventura County Sheriff's investigators and crime analysts worked with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD), Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), Ventura County

District Attorney's Office and the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Department. Investigators were not only able to identify the three suspects in the home invasion robbery, but also tied the three into a burglary crew that was responsible for more than two dozen residential burglaries / robberies in California and Nevada. Investigators also identified a fourth suspect who was part of the burglary crew but was not present during the home invasion robbery in Camarillo.

Investigators believe that Rodrick Brumfield, Michael Bishop and Joy Williams were responsible for the home invasion robbery as well as numerous other residential burglaries. Mimouni was linked to the burglary crew and is responsible for committing numerous residential burglaries in Los Angeles County.

On April 23rd, Mimouni was arrested by LAPD for residential burglary and is currently in custody in the Los Angeles County Jail.

On May 6th, investigators from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Major Crimes Robbery / Burglary task force and investigators from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office arrested Joy Williams and Michael Bishop. Williams was arrested for using a stolen access card that was taken during a Santa Barbara County residential burglary. Bishop was arrested for the home invasion robbery and eventually transported to the Ventura County jail.

On May 15, investigators from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office learned that Brumfield was staying at a girlfriend's residence in the 43000 block of Park Avenue in Lancaster. During the service of a search warrant at the Park Avenue residence, Brumfield barricaded himself in the attic with two handguns. LASD SWAT responded and forced Brumfield out of the attic with chemical agents. He was taken into custody without further incident and later transferred to the Ventura County jail. The two handguns were recovered and found to have been stolen in a recent residential burglary in Henderson, Nevada.

On May 28th, Michael Bishop was housed at the Ventura County Main Jail and sharing a cell with another inmate. Deputies responded to a disturbance in his cell. An investigation found that Bishop had been using fear to take his cellmates commissary over the past week. The disturbance was caused when Bishop attempted to force the cellmate to orally copulate him. Sheriff's Major Crimes investigators arrested Brumfield for robbery and attempted forcible oral copulation.

Bishop was on Post Release Community Supervision at the time of the robberies. He has an extensive arrest history that includes burglary and weapons charges. He is currently in custody for residential burglary, attempted robbery, street terrorism, first degree residential robbery, criminal threats and

attempted forcible oral copulation. His bail has been set at \$1,540,000.

Rodrick Brumfield was on parole at the time of the burglaries. He has an extensive arrest history which includes a 12-year prison sentence for assault with a deadly weapon. He is currently in custody for attempted residential burglary, street terrorism, and multiple counts of residential burglary. His bail has been set at \$1,000,000.

Joy Williams is currently in custody in Santa Barbara County. She has a \$1 million Ventura County warrant for her arrest. Her charges include multiple counts of residential burglary. When her case is concluded in Santa Barbara County, she will be transported to the Ventura County jail.

Oussama Mimouni is currently in custody in Los Angeles. He has a \$1 million Ventura County warrant for his arrest. His charges include multiple counts of residential burglary. When his case is concluded in Los Angeles County, he will be transported to the Ventra County jail.

On May 28, 2015, the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) continued their investigation into a Simi Valley physician regarding claims of overprescribing opiate and other controlled substance medication.

A search warrant was served at Dr. Matzner's Simi Valley office. Numerous medical files and other items of evidentiary value were seized during the service of the warrant. The search was related to a several month investigation centered on the amount of prescription drugs coming from Dr. Matzner's office. The investigation revealed Dr. Matzner's office had become a source of supply for drug seeking and drug dealing patients. During the service of the warrant, Dr. Matzner resigned his DEA registration eliminating the possibility of him legally writing prescriptions for controlled substances.

A death related to his practice of medicine is also being investigated.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office East County Narcotic's Street Team assisted in the investigation.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from

the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, the California Highway Patrol, and the Health Quality Investigation Unit of the California Division of Investigation. The primary mission of the task force is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use.

Ryan West was arrested on 06/19/15 after the completion of a criminal investigation surrounding a fraudulent claim he submitted to the County of Ventura requesting \$900,000.00 dollars in damages.

In April of 2015, West submitted a claim for damages to the Ventura County Clerk alleging he was unlawfully 'tased' while serving jail time in 2014. Through his attorney who filed the claim, West submitted an alleged jail document describing the incident and identifying a Sheriff's employee as the individual who 'tased' West.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Major Crimes Bureau, initiated a criminal investigation surrounding the reported illegal use of force and quickly determined the incident never took place. The investigation revealed the jail document submitted by West was fictitious and created in an attempt to obtain money from the County of Ventura. The facts reported by West in his claim were also confirmed to have been fictitious.

The case was presented to the Ventura County District Attorney's Office who elected to file five felony counts against West. Those charges included 72 PC (Presentation of a Fraudulent Claim, 118(a) PC (Perjury), 470(d) PC (Forgery), 529 PC (False Personation), and 530.5 PC (Identity Theft). The false personation and identity theft charges stemmed from West using the Sheriff employee's personal information to generate the false claim.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office is committed to protecting the relationship of trust with the community and citizens we serve. Allegations of excessive force will be thoroughly investigated and the appropriate course of action will be taken at the conclusion of all investigations.

Thousand Oaks Police Investigators are asking for the public's help identifying a suspect who appears to have used his family to assist in distracting an elderly disabled female before stealing her wallet with money, credit cards and jewelry. The crime was captured on video and shows clear view of the crime, the suspect and his vehicle.

On June 10, 2015, an elderly female victim was getting gas at a local station in the City of Thousand Oaks. The suspect appeared to also be getting gas and was with an adult female and one or more children. The suspect told the victim he could fix scratches and other minor damage on her car and the video shows the suspect walking around the car for an extended period of time.

At one point, the suspect told the victim to give her telephone number to his wife, who was sitting in the suspect's car. When the victim went to do this, the video shows the suspect reaching into the victim's car and stealing her wallet. The video then shows the suspect crouching down beside the driver's side door before concealing the victim's wallet inside his pants. The suspect then quickly got in his own car and left the area with the female and children.

The attached videos show the crime occurring and clear footage of the suspect inside the store making a

purchase before committing the crime.

The suspect is described by witnesses at the scene as a middle-eastern man between 35-45 years old, heavy set and driving a black Kia Soul.

On June, 22, 2015, video surveillance was released to the public showing a male subject with his family stealing a disabled elderly lady's wallet. The crime took place at a gas station after the male subject distracted the elderly female and took the wallet out of her purse. The crime was captured on video surveillance.

As a result of the release of the video surveillance, Thousand Oaks Investigators received over 25 phone calls from callers identifying the same male in the video as having stolen or attempted to steal from them. The callers were from both Los Angeles and Ventura Counties and the crimes occurred over the past 8 months.

Some callers had very detailed information about the suspect who was identified as Steve Michael Stevens (age 30). This information helped lead to the whereabouts of Stevens and he was subsequently arrested on June, 24, 2015, at about 2:30 pm in the city of Oxnard.

Stevens' alleged scam involved telling victims he would do body work on their cars to fix minor damage or scratches. Stevens would then appear to do work on the damage and then cover it with a wax type substance. The victims were then told to wipe it off in 24 hours and the damage would be fixed The victims would pay Stevens and would later learn the damage was not fixed and was oftentimes worse.

Stevens seemed to target females and elderly individuals. Stevens was also involved in other scams that involved arrangements to fix damage and ask for money up front. He would say he was leaving to get replacement parts or supplies and not return. Some victims lost over \$1000.00 in the theft scams.

Stevens was booked into Ventura County Jail for Grand Theft and Financial Elder abuse charges. His bail was set at \$55,000.

On 6-30-15, the Ventura County District Attorney's Office filed one count of furnishing heroin and a special allegation of causing great bodily injury during the commission of a felony. Pending the result of Serna's autopsy, a charge of manslaughter is possible in the near future. Filkins is currently in custody with bail set at \$150,000.

Narrative:

On July 9, 2015, the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) with the assistance of the Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office concluded an investigation into the unlawful practice of medicine by a Northern California man with the service of search warrants and an arrest.

During the month of June 2015, an adult female with late stage cancer reported to deputies at the Thousand Oaks East County Sheriff's Station she had been harmed and scammed out of thousands of dollars from a man purporting to be able to treat her cancer. The victim had seen Gammill's website on the internet in 2009 and planned on seeking treatment from him as a last resort if all traditional medical efforts to cure her cancer had failed.

In June 2015, the victim traveled to Gammill's office located at 3065 Richmond Parkway Suite 101, in Richmond, California. While at the office, Gammill examined the victim and gave her an in-depth explanation of how he was going to treat her cancer. He also advised her to alter the dosing of the medication her primary physician had prescribed her. Gammill demanded payment of \$2,000.00 for his services (16 hours of consultation and treatment), which she paid to him. Gammill then provided the victim with multiple plastic "ziploc" baggies containing different powders, empty capsules, vials of liquids, commercially produced medications with expired shelf life dates (including medications labeled in

Russian) and a baggie of dirt. Gammill provided her with instructions on how to prepare the items for consumption. At one point in the visit Gammill brought out a large frying pan and commented that one of the compounds could burn a hole through the table. Gammill proceeded to instruct the victim how to mix the compound over the frying pan and she followed his instructions. The mixture was placed into a capsule and the victim ingested the substance. She began to get a burning sensation in her stomach and Gammill told the victim it was good her stomach was burning because that meant the ingredients were still active.

Based on the victim's statement, the PCU began an investigation into Gammill's practices. Investigators found Gammill's website at http://natural-oncology.org/ and learned he offered, 'alternative and complementary care for those with cancer, to communicate this knowledge to individuals and practitioners and to provide practical assistance and support to those with cancer.' Investigators did not locate a record of Gammill having any medical training.

On July 9, 2015, Investigators from the PCU and the Detectives from the Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office arrested Gammill at his business for practicing medicine without a license, dependent adult abuse, and furnishing dangerous drugs without a license. Investigators served search warrants at his office and his home located in the 2600 block of Tamalpais Avenue, in El Cerrito, California. Upon entering the business, Detectives found laboratory equipment and bottles labeled corrosive and poison. The Contra Costa County Hazardous Materials team was called out to inspect the scene and render it safe. Detectives located over 25,000 prescription pills including Morphine, Ambien, Steroids, and Mexican and Russian drugs at both locations. Gammill told Detectives he offered alternative options to the traditional treatment of cancer. He also initially stated he had no formal education beyond high school, but then 'remembered' he had obtained a doctor of science degree sometime in the 1990's.

Gammill was booked into custody at the Contra Costa County Jail and is scheduled to appear in Ventura County Superior Court on August 31, 2015.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit and the Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office are seeking any additional victims in this case. The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, the California Highway Patrol, and the Health Quality Investigation Unit of the California Division of Investigation. The primary mission of the task force is combating the transfer of legal

prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use.

Narrative:

Detectives with the Sheriff's Narcotics Unit concluded a month long investigation of a Moorpark resident, Michael Eastman, who was cultivating marijuana inside a residence in the exclusive gated community of Bell Canyon.

The investigation was initiated a month ago by a Sheriff's patrol deputy who responded to the residence for a call for service. While at the residence, the deputy noticed indicators the residence was possibly being used to cultivate marijuana. Narcotics detectives conducted an investigation and as a result, they were able to obtain a search warrant to search the residence.

On 7/15/2015, Detectives observed Eastman leaving a residence located on Hackamore Lane in Bell Canyon. Eastman left the location in a vehicle along with Anthony Morales and Jonathan Ghobrial. Deputies with the Thousand Oaks Directed Enforcement Team stopped Eastman's vehicle and detained all three subjects while detectives executed the search warrant on the Saddlebow Road residence.

Detectives located an active marijuana cultivation operation inside the house. The cultivation consisted of

a sophisticated growing system that included over 200 marijuana plants in various stages of growth. Detectives also located various locations inside the residence that were being used to dry the harvested marijuana.

Based on the investigation, detectives went to the residence on Hackamore Lane where they observed all three subjects leaving prior to being detained. They entered the residence and secured it pending the service of a search warrant. Once a search warrant was obtained, detectives located another active marijuana cultivation inside this residence. Over 250 marijuana plants in various stages of growth were seized from this location.

Eastman, Morales and Ghobrial were arrested for conspiracy and cultivation of marijuana. They were transported to the East Valley Sheriff's Station where they were booked into jail. Eastman and Morales posted \$20,000 bail and are scheduled for arraignment on 7/30/2015. Ghobrial is scheduled to appear in court on 7/17/2015. His bail is set at \$20,000.

Detectives continued their investigation and based on information gathered at the Saddlebow Road and Hackamore Lane residences, detectives were able to identify a third residence being used to cultivate marijuana.

On 7/16/2015, Sheriff's Narcotics Detectives and deputies with the Directed Enforcement Team served a search warrant at a residence located on the 4000 block of Canoga Drive in the city of Woodland Hills. Just like the other locations, there was an active grow operation with over 200 marijuana plants in various stages of growth.

All three residences had minimal living quarters and little to no appliances. Bedrooms and garages had been converted to growing or drying rooms. These locations were mainly being utilized for the growing and harvesting of marijuana.

At this time, additional charges are being considered for all three subjects.

Sheriff's deputies from the Fillmore station received an anonymous tip of a possible

Cockfighting event in the fields near the 3000 block of East Telegraph Road in Fillmore. Deputies located the operation on the property bordering the Santa Clara River bottom south of East Telegraph Road (SR126). When deputies arrived, multiple subjects fled the scene, running into the dense brush of the river bottom. The four subjects above were detained and ultimately arrested for being involved in the event. Approximately 39 roosters were located in small cages and confiscated. The event was stopped in the early stages and as a result, no birds were injured. Evidence was found relating to the event, including small sharp knives typically attached to the birds' legs for use during the fighting. Once attached to the legs, the knives cause severe damage to the opponent, including death. Over \$1,000, which was being used for illegal wagering, was also seized as evidence. Ventura Animal Services responded and took possession of the birds.

The Ventura Sheriff's Office would like to thank the public for being aware of the operation and notifying deputies. The tip led to a quick response and the birds were ultimately confiscated before any fighting occurred.

Thousand Oaks, CA ' The Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a Driver's License/DUI Checkpoint on August 1, 2015 at an undisclosed location within the city limits.

The deterrent effect of Driver's License/DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an unlicensed or impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized Driver's License/DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths and nearly 24,000 serious injuries in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. 'Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 6 lives and resulted in 93 injury crashes harming 131 of our friends and neighbors,' said Sergeant Barbara Payton.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving, which now accounts for a growing number of impaired driving crashes. Drugs which may impair driving not only include illegal narcotics, but many prescription drugs, marijuana, and even some over-the-counter medications.

Driver's License/DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests affording the greatest opportunity for achieving unlicensed and drunk/drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to Thousand Oaks Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver' Call 9-1-1'.

Detectives with the Ventura County Sheriff's Gang Unit, Thousand Oaks SED, Camarillo SED and Agents with the ATF conducted a search warrant and seized several assault weapons, short barreled rifles, assault weapon and silencer manufacturing components, and thousands of rounds of ammunition.

During the months of June and July 2015, the ATF and the Ventura County Sheriff's Gang Unit initiated an investigation into Nester Tovar. The investigation involved the possession and manufacture of assault weapons and fully automatic weapons. During a search warrant at Tovar's residence, detectives located thousands of live rounds of ammunition, body armor, high capacity ammunition magazines, and components used to manufacture assault weapons and firearm silencers. Ventura County Bomb Team operators were also called to the residence to investigate a suspicious device.

Detectives received information Tovar had stored a safe containing several assault weapons at a friend's residence in the city of Oxnard. Detectives recovered the safe and located 10 assault rifles, 3 short barreled rifles, and 2 bolt action rifles inside.

Tovar was booked into custody at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility for violations of California Penal Code sections 30600(a) ' Manufacturing assault weapons, 30605(a) ' Possession of assault weapons, 33215 ' Possession of a short barreled rifle, 33410 ' Possession of a silencer, 32310(a) ' Importation of high

capacity magazines, and 273.6(a) 'Violation of a domestic relations court order.

Operation Take Back the Pumps is a collaborative effort by Ventura County law enforcement agencies, businesses, and Federal agencies to combat credit/debit card fraud and identity theft facilitated through the illegal use of credit card skimming devices placed on gasoline/fuel pumps.

Identity theft is a national problem that is significantly affecting citizens in Ventura County. One way thieves are obtaining victim's credit and debit card information is through the use of illegal card skimming devices being surreptitiously placed in fuel pumps. When an unsuspecting customer swipes their debit or credit card into the pay station on the fuel pump, these illegal devices capture the card and pin information. The thieves then use this stolen information to commit identity theft and other fraud related crimes. Loses from a single illegal skimming device on a fuel pump usually averages between \$50,000 and \$100,000.

Operation Take Back the Pumps consists of multiple phases designed to combat identity theft perpetuated by the use of illegal card skimming devices on fuel pumps. The phases consists of training law enforcement and gasoline station personnel on prevention methods and the identification/detection of illegal skimming devices; Programs that promote regular inspections of the pumps for tampering and/or illegal card skimming devices, if the agency should decide; And finally, education of the public on practices that will help keep them from becoming victims of identity theft.

Operation Take Back the Pumps was coordinated by the Moorpark Police Department and launched on

August 13, 2015, beginning with a joint effort by all of the involved agencies/businesses coming together in an attempt to inspect all fuel pumps in Ventura County. This proved to be successful as 1,512 fuel pumps were inspected and three (3) illegal skimming devices were discovered and removed. These devices will be used as evidence in an attempt to identify and prosecute the suspect(s) responsible for these crimes.

The following is a breakdown by city of pumps inspected and the number of illegal card skimming devices found:

City of Camarillo - 155 pumps inspected and no devices found

City of Fillmore - 76 pumps inspected and no devices found

City of Moorpark - 72 pumps inspected and no devices found

City of Ojai - 44 pumps inspected and no devices found

City of Oxnard - 335 pumps inspected and no devices found

City of Port Hueneme - 8 pumps inspected and no devices found

City of Santa Paula - 42 pumps inspected and no devices found

City of Simi Valley - 173 pumps inspected and no devices found

City of Thousand Oaks - 272 pumps inspected and three (3) devices found

City of Ventura ' 335 pumps inspected and no devices found

Law enforcement and participants in this operation encourage the public to consider the following steps when purchasing fuel. Following these steps will significantly reduce the risk of being victimized by identity thieves.

Pay with cash whenever possible.

If paying with a credit/debit card, go inside the gas station instead of paying at the pump.

Look for security seals/stickers on fuel pumps. If the seals/stickers are broken, cut or read 'VOID,' do not use that pump and immediately report your observations to gas station personnel (See attached photographs).

Narrative:

On August 14, 2015, the Ventura County Sheriff's Office arrested three suspects regarding a sweepstakes scam that defrauded the victim out of a large amount of money.

On August 14, 2015, a local bank in Thousand Oaks reported having a female victim inside their branch requesting to withdraw a large sum of money. It was learned this same person had visited several local banks on August 13, 2015 and August 14, 2015 and made multiple cash withdrawals.

The victim made the withdrawals after being contacted by a person identifying himself as a representative for cash sweepstakes. She was told she won \$800,000 dollars, but could not collect the prize money until she paid the appropriate amount of taxes. The alleged spokesperson directed the victim to make withdrawals from her bank until she had enough money to pay the taxes in full.

On August 13, 2015, the victim was instructed to meet an employee of the cash sweepstakes at a business in Thousand Oaks. The victim did as instructed and gave this person all the money she had withdrawn from her account. On August 14, 2015, the victim was again contacted by the representative for the alleged cash sweepstakes and told she needed to pay additional taxes before she could collect her cash prize. The victim was in the process of withdrawing more money when she realized she was the victim of a scam.

Detectives with the Thousand Oaks Police Department immediately started investigating the matter and developed leads in the case. Three suspects were identified and arrested for grand theft and conspiracy to commit a crime. Nearly all the stolen money was recovered.

The three suspects were booked into Ventura County Jail with their bail sought at \$250,000 dollars. They will be arraigned in Superior Court on August 18, 2015.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department would like to remind all of its residents to be cautious of calls or notifications telling them they have won a grand prize but requiring them to pay money before they can collect it. The Police Department encourages residents to report all suspicious calls to determine the legitimacy of these organizations. Additionally, if you believe you have been targeted by a prize scam, report it to the Federal Trade Commission at www.ftc.gov

On July 31, 2015, the Ventura Police Department responded to an apartment in the 6700 block of Telephone Road, in the City of Ventura. They discovered Della Gleeson was deceased and suspected she died from a possible prescription drug overdose. Officers from the Ventura Police Department and personnel from the Medical Examiner's Office determined a possible source of supply of prescription medication to Gleeson was Sandra Rothweiler. The investigation revealed Rothweiler had previously taken care of Gleeson's mother in 2014 when she was on hospice and she and Gleeson became friends from that interaction. Rothweiler and Gleeson remained in contact after Gleeson's mother's death in the middle of 2014.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit (PCU) assumed the investigation when it was learned Rothweiler lived in Oxnard and worked for a hospice located in Thousand Oaks.

Investigators from the PCU gathered additional evidence relating Rothweiler to illegal activity regarding prescription medication and her employment. Specifically, investigators learned Rothweiler was hoarding medication that she acquired when a patient under her care died.

On August 14, 2015, a search warrant was served at Rothweiler's residence in the 500 block of

Roosevelt, Oxnard. A significant amount of medication was found in Rothweiler's residence. The medication included OxyContin, Alprazolam (Xanax), Morphine, and Methylphenidate (Ritalin). Evidence was obtained that also implicated Rothweiler in supplying Gleeson with prescription opiate medication.

Rothweiler was only arrested for possession for sale of the prescription medication found in her residence. She is currently in custody at the Ventura County Jail and is scheduled to appear in Ventura County Superior Court on August 18, 2015.

The investigation is continuing related to Rothweiler's possible role in Gleeson's death. A decision will be made as to potential separate charges such as manslaughter or drug dealing resulting in death once the autopsy is finalized.

The public may contact investigators from the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit at (805) 383-8700 or pharm.tip@ventura.org with additional information about this case, other cases involving hospice, or any other information related to narcotics.

The public may dispose of unwanted prescription medication by taking it to the Simi Valley Police Department, Port Hueneme Police Department, or any Ventura County Sheriff's Office station.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office East County Narcotics Street Team assisted in the investigation.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, Thousand Oaks Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, the California Highway Patrol, and the Health Quality Investigation Unit of the California Division of Investigation. The primary mission of the task force is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use.

School Bus Safety, Loading and Unloading Children

Back to school is upon us again and the Moorpark Police Department would like to remind drivers of the importance of paying attention to school buses that are stopped for the purpose of loading and unloading children.

Per California Vehicle Code section 22454(a), motorists are required by law to stop for school buses that are stopped and operating flashing red lights, with or without a stop sign displayed. This includes motorists that are approaching the stopped bus from behind and/or approaching the bus from the front.

With that being said, motorists are not required to stop for a school bus on a divided highway and or multiple-lane highway when the school bus is on the other side of the roadway. In Moorpark, two examples of divided highways would be Tierra Rejada Rd. from the 23 freeway to L.A. Ave. based on a raised center median and Spring Rd. from L.A. Ave. to Flynn Rd. based on multiple-lane divided by double yellow lines delineating a center median.

Assembly Bill 1297, known as the 'Thomas Edward Lanni School Bus Safety Act,' was enacted in January 1998 and makes it mandatory for school bus driver's to operate the flashing red lights and stop sign, if so equipped, when the bus is stopped for the purpose of loading or unloading children, even if the children will not be crossing the street. The Bill was put into place for the purpose of making it safer for school children in and around school buses that are loading or unloading.

It is every driver's responsibility to obey all traffic laws and to drive with courtesy and care in and around school buses and the locations they stop. Please help us start this school year right by keeping the safety of Moorpark's children in the forefront of our minds as they return to school. The Thousand Oaks Police Department Will Be Out In Full Force To Catch Drunk Drivers

As summer winds down, the Thousand Oaks Police Department is ramping up its enforcement efforts as part of a national crackdown on drunk driving. The 18-day, high-visibility campaign, *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*, is a partnership with the California Office of Traffic Safety to curb impaired driving and save lives. August 21-September 7 (Labor Day), law enforcement partners in Ventura County, across the state and nationwide will show zero tolerance for drunk driving. Increased state and national messaging about the dangers of driving drunk, coupled with checkpoints and increased officers on the road, aim to drastically reduce the toll of drunk driving.

And what a toll it is. In 2013, there were 10,076 people killed in drunk'driving crashes, almost a third of all traffic fatalities according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). In California, 867 died in drunk driving collisions according to NHTSA. Thirty-eight percent of crash fatalities on Labor Day weekend that year involved drunk drivers with a Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) of .08 percent or higher. And we're not just talking about a little bit of alcohol, either. More than a quarter (27 percent) of the crash fatalities that occurred on Labor Day weekend involved drivers with BACs of .15 or higher 'almost twice the illegal limit.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department kicks off Saturday night by deploying two (2) DUI/Drivers License checkpoint(s) during the first weekend along with special DUI Saturation Patrols the following Friday and Saturday nights. DUI enforcement will continue through Monday, September 7th with another DUI/Drivers License checkpoint on September 5, and more special DUI Saturation Patrols on September 4th and 6th.

NHTSA data shows that repeat offenders are an especially dangerous facet of the drunk-driving problem. In the month of August from 2009-2013, of the drunk drivers involved in fatal crashes, almost 1 out of 10 (8 percent) of them had already been convicted of at least one drunk-driving offense.

Law Enforcement emphasizes the preventable nature of drunk driving reminding everyone that all it takes is a little planning ahead. Designate a sober driver or call a cab. But whatever you do, don't drink and drive. The California Office of Traffic Safety DDVIP (Designated Driver VIP) mobile app is now available for free download on iOS and Android devices. Launched last year, the new DDVIP app offers enhanced features, allowing users to 'Map a Spot' with their current location to find DDVIP partnering establishments in their area or a 'List of Spots' to search all participating bars and restaurants throughout California. Users will be offered free incentives at each bar to celebrate their life saving role. They can stay up-to-date with the latest from DDVIP and see what other users are saying via its social tab. Also through the app, for those who want to imbibe but also make it a point to plan ahead, users can easily order a sober ride from Uber, Lyft or Curb ' all from one screen.

Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol. Everyone should be mindful that if you're taking medication ' whether prescription or over-the-counter ' drinking even small amounts of alcohol can greatly intensify the impairment affects.

So this August and year-round, remember that there's no excuse for drunk or impaired driving. If you choose to break the law, police sheriff and CHP officials will see you before you see them. *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over.*

On August 16th, 2015, the Ventura County Sheriff's Office received information from a recent victim of Identity Theft that the victim's personal information was currently being fraudulently used at a local business. Investigators from the Thousand Oaks Police Investigations Bureau immediately initiated an investigation and began developing additional suspect information and worked in cooperation with the local business to prevent any further fraudulent use of the victim's personal information.

On August 18, 2015, two suspects were detained in regards to this investigation. During a search of their vehicle, numerous items indicating these subjects were involved in a large scale identity theft operation were recovered, including over 35 fraudulent California Drivers licenses all bearing different names and identifying information. These fraudulent identifications were being actively used to commit crimes in Ventura County and other surrounding counties. The two suspects were arrested for conspiracy to commit a crime, commercial burglary and identity theft. They were booked into the Ventura County Jail

with a set bail of \$250,000.

Thousand Oaks Police investigators will be conducting follow-up investigations in an attempt to identify other possible victims of identity thefts perpetrated by these suspects. Also seized were a loaded shotgun and handgun as well as four rifles, one of which was an assault style rifle with numerous loaded high capacity magazines.

Homoki was arrested for violations of possession of marijuana for sale and manufacturing concentrated cannabis. He bailed out of jail and is scheduled to appear in court on 8/27/2015 at 1:30pm.

Bauer turned himself in on 8/19/2015 and he was arrested for possession of marijuana for sale and manufacturing concentrated cannabis. His bail is set at \$50,000 and is scheduled to appear in court on 8/21/2015 at 1:30pm.

Traffic Enforcement Operations Planned for Thousand Oaks

The Thousand Oaks Police Department will step up bicycle safety enforcement operations on Sunday, August 30, 2015, with focused enforcement on collision-causing factors involving motorists and bike riders. Special overtime patrols will be deployed to crackdown on drivers and bicyclists who violate basic traffic laws.

The department has mapped out locations over the past three years where bicycle involved collisions have occurred along with the violations that led to those crashes. Officers will be looking for violations made by drivers and bike riders alike that can lead to life changing injuries.

Bicycle fatalities are rising in California as more people use bicycling for commuting, exercise and recreation. Locally, the Thousand Oaks Police Department has investigated 112 fatal and injury collisions involving bike riders during the past three years. In 2012, California witnessed 124 bicyclist deaths that year while nationally 726 riders were killed.

Nationally, fatal bike crash patterns have changed markedly. The percentage involving adults age 20 and older increased from 21 percent in 1975 to 84 percent in 2012. The percentage involving males

increased from 82 percent to 88 percent during this period. Adult males comprised 74 percent of all bicyclist deaths in 2012. The percentage of deaths occurring in urban areas climbed from 50 percent in 1975 to 69 percent in 2012. The following safety tips can save lives and stop this tragedy witnessed far too often in Thousand Oaks:

Drivers:

- 'Share the road' with bicyclists
- Be courteous; California law now mandates at least three feet of clearance when passing a bike riders
- Look for cyclists before opening a car door or pulling out from a parking space
- Yield to cyclists at intersections and as directed by signs and signals
- Be especially watchful for riders when making turns, either left or right

Bicyclists:

- Wear properly fitted bicycle helmets every time they ride. If under 18 years of age, it's the law
- A helmet is the single most effective way to prevent head injury resulting from a bicycle crash
- Riders are considered vehicle operators; they are required to obey the same rules of the road as other vehicle operators, including obeying traffic signs, signals, and lane markings.
- When cycling in the street, cyclists must ride in the same direction as traffic.
- Bicyclists should increase their visibility to drivers by wearing fluorescent or brightly colored clothing during the day, and at dawn and dusk
- To be noticed when riding at night, the law requires a front light and a red reflector to the rear
- For additional safety, use a flashing rear light, and use retro-reflective tape or markings on equipment or clothing

Improving Motorcycle Safety Aim of Thousand Oaks Police Department Operation

Careless motorists as well as riders get special scrutiny

The Thousand Oaks Police Department will be conducting a specialized Motorcycle Safety Enforcement Operation on August 29, 2015, in an effort to lower deaths and injuries. Extra officers will be on duty patrolling areas frequented by motorcyclists and where motorcycle crashes occur. Officers will be looking for violations made by drivers and riders alike that can lead to motorcycle crashes. They will be cracking down on operators of both regular vehicles and motorcycles who are under the influence of drugs or alcohol, speeding, making illegal turns, or any other dangerous violation.

Motorcycle fatalities saw a phenomenal drop of 37 percent from 2008 to 2010, but then rose 23 percent by 2012. Operations like this are aimed at curbing any more rises in motorcycle deaths and sending the numbers back downward. Over the course of the past three years, motorcycle involved collisions have resulted in seven fatal and injury crashes.

California collision data reveals that primary causes of motorcycle-involved crashes include speeding,

unsafe turning and impairment due to alcohol and other drugs by both riders and drivers alike.

Safety tips for riders 'See and Be Seen:

Ride with lights on during daylight hours

Use your lane position to increase visibility; change lanes only when there is ample room

Match your speed to surrounding traffic

Always wear a DOT compliant helmet and brightly colored, protective clothing

Safety tips for drivers 'Share the Road:

Look twice for motorcyclists, especially when entering the roadway, turning or changing

lanes

Motorcyclist are allowed in HOV lanes unless prohibited by signage

Riders are urged to get training through the California Motorcyclist Safety Program. Information and training locations are available at http://www.californiamotorcyclist.com/ or 1-877-RIDE 411 (1-877-

743-3411).

On August 31, 2015, between the hours of 9:00 am and 1:00 pm, officers from the Thousand Oaks Police Department conducted an undercover 'Court operation' at the Ventura Hall of Justice, targeting suspected DUI drivers whose licenses where suspended/revoked or who were unlicensed drivers.

Police officers observed offenders who had been told by a judge not to drive and/or who had been told of their license suspension. Seven offenders were followed by officers from courtrooms to their vehicles to ensure that they were not driving. revoked or suspended by judge minutes earlier.

On October 5, 1991, Sheriff's patrol deputies responded to a call of a dead body that was reported at 10:30 AM in the 3800 block of Sturgis Road in the unincorporated area between Oxnard and Camarillo. Angela Fisher, 22 years, was found murdered lying next to her burned, smoldering car. It was determined that Fisher had been sexually assaulted and beaten to death with a piece of concrete. The Sheriff's Major Crimes Bureau investigated the murder; and after an exhaustive investigation, the investigation eventually went cold.

In 2002, DNA that was collected from the body of Fisher was submitted to the Combined DNA Index System (CODIS). Silverio Ambriz was identified as the person associated with this DNA. At that time, Ambriz was incarcerated in state prison, where he was serving a 47 year to life sentence for rape and sexual assaults that occurred in 1996 in the County of Ventura.

This information rekindled the murder investigation. Sheriff's detectives interviewed witnesses and submitted pieces of evidence that were re-examined using newer technology. District Attorney investigators joined in the investigation. The investigation eventually developed evidence that showed Ambriz was responsible for the death of Angela Fisher.

Sheriff's detectives submitted evidence to the Ventura County District Attorney's Office for review. On March 19, 2015, Ambriz was brought back to Ventura County and was arrested and charged with the murder of Angela Fisher. Ambriz appeared in court and pled not guilty. He is currently awaiting trial.

The Angela Fisher case is another excellent example of the collaboration between the Ventura County Sheriff's Office and the Ventura County District Attorney's Office. This investigative partnership continues to work together to bring closure to the families of homicide victims.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office has released its six-month 2015 Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) statistics for Part I Crimes in all Sheriff's jurisdictions. Overall, Part I Crimes are up 8%, specifically Violent Crime is up 30% and Property Crime is up 6%. Violent crime was up in all categories in the contract cities of Camarillo, Fillmore, Ojai and the unincorporated area, while the city of Moorpark had no increase and Thousand Oaks had a decline.

The cities of Camarillo, Fillmore, and Moorpark saw significant increases in burglaries, both residential and commercial type. Additionally, all jurisdictions saw an increase in stolen vehicles, with the exception of Ojai. The city of Ojai had significant declines in all property crimes with the exception of residential burglaries. Although the city of Thousand Oaks showed a decline in overall violent crimes, property crimes increased in the areas of grand/petty thefts and stolen vehicles. The unincorporated areas experienced increases in all violent and property crimes categories with the exception of Grand Thefts.

The Sheriff's jurisdictions are experiencing gang 'crew' members from outside Ventura County coming in and committing residential burglaries and other thefts. Several of these crews committed 'knock knock' burglaries and were apprehended after extensive investigations by investigators. Additionally, one person was arrested for approx. 8 robberies in Camarillo, Thousand Oaks and Los Angeles. Much of the increase in Aggravated Assaults was due to these robberies and Domestic Violence.

As a reminder, in January of 2014, the definition for Rape changed and the UCR Program started collecting uniform information from law enforcement agencies with the new definition which broadened the scope of the previously narrow definition. For more information about this change, visit http://www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/ucr/new-rape-fact-sheet.

This new definition redistributed currently captured crime information from the category Part II 'Sex

Offenses' to the category Part I 'Rape.' As predicted, this category in Part 1 showed a significant increase.

Although the Sheriff's Office has recorded an increase in Part 1 crimes for the first six months, Ventura County is still a very safe area to live in. From 2010 to 2014, total Part 1 crimes for Sheriff's jurisdictions have dropped almost 4%, a total of 1,291 less crimes. During the same time period, the crime rate per 1000 population went from 16.61 to 12.56. Listed below are the crime rates per 1000 for each of the Sheriff's jurisdictions for the past five years:

As to Proposition 47's consequences, both intended and unintended, they are only beginning to be evaluated. Early indications show that it has not reduced jail populations and has put offenders back out on the streets sooner without the requirement of being on probation or attending substance abuse classes. Sheriff Dean is coordinating on a statewide level through the California State Sheriff's Association on the identification, retention and collection of Proposition 47 related data and the results will be distributed.

Thousand Oaks, CA ' The Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a Driver's License/DUI Checkpoint on September 5, 2015, at an undisclosed location within the city limits.

The deterrent effect of Driver's License/DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an unlicensed or impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent when well-publicized Driver's License/DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely.

In California, this deadly crime led to 802 deaths and nearly 24,000 serious injuries in 2012 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows nearly 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. 'Over the course of the past three years, DUI collisions have claimed 3 lives and resulted in 102 injury traffic collisions harming 141 members of our community,' said Sergeant Barbara Payton.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving, which now accounts for a growing number of impaired driving crashes. Drugs which may impair driving not only include illegal narcotics, but many prescription drugs, marijuana, and even some over-the-counter medications.

Driver's License/DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests affording the greatest opportunity for achieving unlicensed and drunk/drugged driving

deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, other expenses that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to Thousand Oaks Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver' Call 9-1-1'.

Narrative:

On August 27, 2015, the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit concluded a forged prescription investigation with the arrest of Michael Shapiro.

During the second week of August 2015, Investigators from the PCU were notified of possible criminal activity at a Newbury Park pharmacy. Investigators learned Michael Shapiro was attempting to fill a forged prescription for controlled substances.

Detectives followed up on the information and learned Michael Shapiro had passed 160 forged prescriptions in the past year for Norco (hydrocodone), Xanax (alprazolam), Ritalin. (methylphenidate), and Ambien (Zolpidem Tartrate).

Search warrants were written and served at two locations in Los Angeles County where Michael Shapiro was living. Hundreds of blank and pre-filled out fraudulent prescriptions, as well as illegally obtained prescription drugs, were seized. Evidence was also recovered indicating Shapiro was manufacturing the prescription forms from his home.

The investigation revealed Shapiro had extensive knowledge regarding prescription drugs as he had

graduated from Yale medical school, but never obtained licensure as a physician.

Shapiro was arrested and booked into the Ventura County Jail for forging prescriptions and commercial burglary. He is scheduled to appear in Ventura County Superior Court on September 10, 2015.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force comprised of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, Thousand Oaks Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, the California Highway Patrol, and the Health Quality Investigation Unit of the California Division of Investigation. The primary mission of the task force is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use.

Narrative:

On September 3, 2015, at about 10:31 a.m., Camarillo patrol deputies responded with the Ventura County Fire Department and American Medical Response Paramedics to an address in the 1200 block of Mission Verde Drive, Camarillo for a report of a possible narcotics overdose.

Once on scene, deputies learned Shawn Grant had overdosed on heroin. Paramedics performed lifesaving treatment on Grant and resuscitated him. Grant was taken by ambulance to a local emergency room. Edward Michaud, who initially called 911, was also present at the residence. He admitted to attempting to conceal evidence by hiding in the trash can the syringe Grant used to inject the heroin. Michaud was also experiencing an adverse event due to heroin ingestion and he was transported to a local emergency room as well.

Narcotics detectives from the East County Sheriff's Street Team responded to the emergency room and began an investigation. They determined the source of supply for the heroin was Bronson Boyett.

Later in the day, detectives from the narcotics street team located Boyett in the city of Camarillo. He was a passenger in a vehicle with Hunter Wise, Hayden Clark, and Louis Merriken. Boyett was arrested for sales of heroin resulting in great bodily injury. Wise, Clark, and Merriken were all initially arrested for being under the influence of heroin. Merriken was subsequently arrested for possession for sale of heroin, methamphetamine, and Xanax (alprazolam) after it was discovered he had secreted over a hundred doses of the drugs on his person.

A search warrant was served at Boyett's residence in the 5200 block of Creekside Road, in Camarillo. Evidence related to the sales of narcotics was located at his house.

Bronson Boyett is currently in custody with a bail of \$500,000.

Louis Merriken is currently in custody with a bail of \$250,000.

Court dates for all of the arrested subjects are pending.

Deputies from the Camarillo Special Enforcement Detail as well as members of the Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit assisted on the investigation.

Camarillo Specific Statistics:

In 2014, there were 12 unintentional fatal drug overdoses in the city of Camarillo. Seven of those overdoses involved opiate medication or heroin. In 2015, of the possible four unintentional fatal drug overdoses in Camarillo, opiate medication or heroin is potentially involved in three of them. During 2012, 2013, and 2014, 45 individuals received Narcan from paramedics in the city of Camarillo. Narcan is administered as a lifesaving drug when there is evidence of opiate use and pronounced respiratory depression.

Thousand Oaks, CA ' Thousand Oaks Police Department Traffic Unit conducted a DUI/Driver's License checkpoint on September 5, 2015, on Moorpark Road south of Janss Road between the hours of 9:00 pm and 12:00 am, and Lynn Road west of McCloud Avenue between 12:00 am and 3:00 am. Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence and provide the greatest safety for officers and the public.

DUI/Driver's License checkpoints have been shown to lower DUI deaths and injuries. A major component of these checkpoints are the deterrent effects it has on those who might drive drunk or drugged impaired, bringing about more awareness and encouraging everyone to use sober designated drivers.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Ninety Percent of California drivers approve of checkpoints.

Medications should not be flushed down the toilet because the dissolved chemicals get into the water supply. Throwing them away puts the chemicals in the landfill.

The following items can be accepted: prescription medications, over-the-counter medications, medication samples, medications for pets, vitamins, medicated ointments/lotions, inhalers, or liquid medication in leak-proof containers. Dry medications should be placed in Ziploc bags, and liquid medications should be

in sealed containers.

Email is not the only way criminals try to attack and steal your identity.

Moorpark is experiencing an IRS phone scam involving people claiming to be Moorpark Police staff. They even adjust their caller-ID information to make it appear that they are legitimately calling from the Moorpark Police Department (805-532-2700). The scammers say that, you have an arrest warrant for unpaid tax bills owed to the treasury department. They state that you must repay this debt by using their specific instructions or they will be at your house in 20 minutes.

Beating this scam involves knowing what the IRS will and will not do. The IRS does not use telephone calls unless you have first received a bill for unpaid taxes, and the Agency will never force you to use specific payment methods -- especially those that happen to be untraceable. This would include the purchase of 'Green Dot' money cards and making payments through the cards, or send money via Western Union. Moreover, threatening tactics like bringing in law enforcement are not part of the IRS' arsenal of debt-collection capabilities.

In May of 2014, the Moorpark Police Department created a Phone Scam Hotline. This hotline was developed to provide Moorpark citizens with the latest information on various scams affecting residents of Moorpark. The hotline provides information in Spanish or English, and if residents wish to speak to an investigator, they can leave a message and their call will be returned promptly. The information on the hotline will be updated as changes occur in the types of scams occurring in Moorpark.

On 9/30/15, at about 11:30 PM, Ventura County Fire Department personnel were dispatched to a commercial fire alarm at the Planned Parenthood building, which is located at 1200 W. Hillcrest Drive in Thousand Oaks. Upon their arrival, Fire Department personnel found the building's fire sprinkler system activated. Thousand Oaks Patrol personnel were also dispatched to the location and arrived seconds later. During the initial inspection of the scene by patrol deputies and firefighters it was believed the fire was suspicious. At that time, arson investigators for both the Sheriff's Office and Ventura County Fire Department were summoned to the scene.

After a thorough inspection of the fire scene, investigators determined an unknown suspect wearing clothing to protect his identity crudely threw a large piece of masonry through a window on the south side of the building. The suspect then introduced a flammable liquid into the broken window and used an open flame to ignite the flammable liquid. Within a minute, the building's fire sprinkler system was activated and extinguished the fire. The fire was contained to a small area of one office, but there was a large amount of water damage to the floor area of the first floor. Based on the evidence at the scene, investigators have been able to establish the cause of the fire as arson.

On September 29, 2015, City of Thousand Oaks Patrol deputies were patrolling the area of Rolling Oaks Drive just west of Los Padres Drive when they located two stolen vehicles parked next to each other. Deputies located a 2012 Dodge Charger that was stolen out of San Bernadino County and a 2008 Maserati that was stolen out of Florida. Through the patrol deputies investigation they were able to link the two vehicles to Kenneth Lewis.

Lewis was contacted and arrested inside his residence. During a search of the residence, detectives located over \$65,000 in cash, a semi-automatic handgun, keys to multiple high end vehicles, and paperwork linking Lewis to a stolen Mercedes, stolen Jaguar, and a stolen Chevrolet Silverado. These additional three stolen vehicles and the Dodge Charger, mentioned above, were fraudulently obtained in cities throughout California. The Dodge Charger, Maserati, and Chevrolet Silverado were all recovered in the City of Thousand Oaks. The Mercedes and Jaguar were recovered at Los Angeles International Airport. Detectives with the San Bernadino County Sheriff's Office and the California Highway Patrol responded and assisted with the

investigation.

Kenneth Lewis was arrested for five counts of 10851(a) VC ' Possession of a Stolen Vehicle, 29800(a)(1) PC ' Felon in possession of a firearm, 11377(a) H&S ' Possession of a controlled substance, and 3056 PC ' Parole Hold. Rodriguez was currently out on bail for all three of the above mentioned cases.

On October 13, 2015, Manson was stopped driving his vehicle near his home in Oak View. He had his two young children with him. Manson was found to be under the influence of heroin and in possession of heroin. Manson was arrested for possession of heroin for sale, under the influence of heroin, and child endangerment. Investigators interviewed Manson and gained additional information connecting him to Wilson.

Manson was booked into the Ventura County Main Jail on the charges stemming from the traffic stop. His bail is currently set at \$55,000 and his court date for those charges is October 15, 2015 at 1:30 p.m.

Separate charges such as manslaughter and drug dealing resulting in great bodily injury are pending toxicology results from Wilson's autopsy.

The Ventura County Interagency Pharmaceutical Crimes Unit is a task force made up of members from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Simi Valley Police Department, Thousand Oaks Police Department, the District Attorney's Office Bureau of Investigation, the California Highway Patrol, and the Health Quality Investigation Unit of the California Division of Investigation. The primary mission of the task force is combating the transfer of legal prescription medication to the illegal market. In addition, the task force works to identify and stop new trends of abuse among the younger population and investigates overdose deaths due to both prescription medication and illicit drug use. DUI Enforcement Operations Planned this Weekend

Moorpark, CA - Officers from the Moorpark Police Department's DUI Enforcement Team will be deploying this weekend to stop and arrest alcohol and drug-impaired drivers in the Department's ongoing traffic safety campaign. DUI Saturation Patrols will deploy on October 31,2015 between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m. in areas with high frequencies of DUI collisions and/or arrests.

In California, this deadly crime led to 867 deaths and over 23,000 serious injuries in 2013 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows over 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. Over the course of the past three years Moorpark officers have investigated forty-eight DUI collisions which have claimed no lives but resulted in nineteen (19) injuries.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with officers checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving, which now accounts for a growing number of impaired driving crashes.

Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol. Everyone should be mindful that if you're taking medication ' whether prescription or over-the-counter ' drinking even small amounts of alcohol can greatly intensify the impairment affects.

Law Enforcement emphasizes the preventable nature of drunk driving reminding everyone that all it takes is a little planning ahead. Designate a sober driver or call a cab. But whatever you do, don't drink and drive. The California Office of Traffic Safety DDVIP (Designated Driver VIP) mobile app is now available for free download on iOS and Android devices. Launched last year, the new DDVIP app offers enhanced features, allowing users to 'Map a Spot' with their current location to find DDVIP partnering establishments in their

area or a 'List of Spots' to search all participating bars and restaurants throughout California. Users will be offered free incentives at each bar to celebrate their life saving role. They can stay up-to-date with the latest from DDVIP and see what other users are saying via its social tab. Also through the app, for those who want to imbibe but also make it a point to plan ahead, users can easily order a sober ride from Uber, Lyft or Curb ' all from one screen.

The cost of a ride home is cheap, nothing compared to a \$10,000 DUI conviction and the 'inconvenience' of not driving your own car home is nothing compared to the inconvenience of spending time behind bars.

Funding for this DUI operation is provided to Moorpark Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver' Call 9-1-1.

Over the last few months the unincorporated area of the County located at the East end of Simi Valley has seen an increase in mail thefts where the suspect(s) were targeting residential mailboxes. Derek Sakata was arrested for conspiracy, possession of stolen property, being under the influence of a controlled substance and providing false information to a peace officer. Alexsis Holdgrafer was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance. The female juvenile was arrested for conspiracy, mail theft, possession of stolen property and

being under the influence of a controlled substance.

Melkonyan, Sakata and Holdgrafer were booked into the Ventura County Jail and the female juvenile was lodged at Juvenile Hall.

On 10/23/2015, The Sheriff's Narcotic's Unit concluded a month long investigation into Bruce Kohler, a Simi Valley resident, who was selling marijuana from his residence. Kohler was stopped after leaving his Simi Valley residence and arrested for the sales of marijuana. A search warrant was served at Kohler's residence where detectives discovered Kohler had numerous marijuana plants in various stages of growth on the property. Numerous rooms of the residence were converted into processing rooms.

Detectives seized about 200 lbs of processed and unprocessed marijuana from the property. A majority of the marijuana was packaged for sales. Detectives seized several thousand dollars that was deemed to be proceeds from the marijuana sales. Additional money was later seized from Kohler's bank account.

Detectives also discovered evidence Kohler was processing 'Honey Oil' on the property which is a very dangerous method of extracting the Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) from the marijuana. This process involves the use of solvents such as compressed butane gas which can result in explosions causing significant property damage, serious injuries or death.

Kohler was arrested and booked into the County Jail for violations of Cultivating Marijuana, Possession of Marijuana for Sale, and Manufacturing Concentrated Cannabis. His bail was set at \$50,000. His next scheduled court appearance is on 11/4/2015.

THE VENTURA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE RECEIVES GRANT FOR SPECIAL TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT AND TRAFFIC ACCIDENT PREVENTION

In December 2014, the Ventura County Sheriff's Office on behalf of its five contract cities, applied for a traffic enforcement grant and has been awarded a \$375,000.00 grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS). The grant provides funding for a year-long program of special enforcements and public awareness efforts to prevent traffic related deaths and injuries. After careful consideration and analysis, OTS awarded funds to the cities of Thousand Oaks, Camarillo and Moorpark. These three cities will use the funding as part of their ongoing commitment to keep our roadways safe and improve the quality of life through both enforcement and education.

Thousand Oaks Assistant Police Chief Jim Fryhoff said, 'We are looking forward to another successful grant period of operations, and are proud to now be working with the cities of Camarillo and Moorpark in our continued effort to make our public streets as safe as possible.'

After falling dramatically between 2006 and 2010, the number of persons killed and injured in traffic collisions has been slowly rising. Particularly alarming are recent increases in pedestrian and bicycle fatalities, the growing dangers of distracting technologies, and the emergence of drugimpaired driving as a major problem. This grant funding will provide opportunities to combat these and other devastating problems such as drunk driving, speeding and crashes at intersections.

'Overall, California's roadways are among the safest in the nation,' said OTS Director Rhonda Craft. 'But to meet future mobility, safety, and accessible transportation objectives, we have to reverse this recent trend

in order to reach our common goal 'zero deaths on our roadways. The Office of Traffic Safety and the Ventura County Sheriff's Office want to work with everyone to create a culture of traffic safety across Ventura County and the state.'

Activities that the grant will fund include:

- Educational presentations
- DUI checkpoints
- DUI saturation patrols
- Motorcycle safety enforcement
- Distracted driving enforcement
- Seat belt and child safety seat enforcement
- Bicycle and pedestrian safety enforcement
- Warrant service operations targeting multiple DUI offenders
- Compilation of DUI 'Hot Sheets,' identifying worst-of-the-worst DUI offenders
- Specialized DUI and drugged driving training such as Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST), Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE), and Drug Recognition Evaluator (DRE)
- Court 'sting' operations to cite individuals driving from DUI court after ignoring their license suspension or revocation
- Stakeout operations to observe the 'worst-of-the-worst' repeat DUI offender probationers with suspended or revoked driver licenses

This Saturday, October 31, 2015, is Halloween. Most children will be out wearing their favorite costume and visiting homes in your neighborhood. We need to remind ourselves there are issues when you mix the darkness with children, costumes and vehicles.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department would like to offer the following safety tips to keep your children safe:

For Parents and Children:

- Children under 12 should trick-or-treat and cross streets with an adult.
- Children should never enter homes to get candy or go near a vehicle offering candy.
- Stay in a well-lit and well populated area.
- Set a time for your children to be home and have them check in frequently.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.
- Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Parents should remind children to watch for cars that are turning or backing up.
- Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross. Walk; don't run, across the street.

For Drivers:

Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.

- Anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic and turn your headlights on earlier in the day so you can spot children from greater distances.
- Remember that costumes can limit children's visibility and they may not be able to see your vehicle.
- Reduce any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.

Costumes and Treats

- Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and choose light colored costumes to improve visibility.
- Choose face paint and make-up instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision. Look for non-toxic designations when choosing Halloween makeup.
- Avoid carrying sticks, swords, or other sharp objects.
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights in order to see better, as well as to be seen by drivers.
- Check treats for signs of tampering before children are allowed to eat them. Candy should be thrown away if the wrapper is faded or torn, or if the candy is unwrapped.

On average, twice as many kids are killed or injured while walking on Halloween as compared to any other day of the year. This year let's not make your child one of them.

Chris was selected by a panel that included a Behavioral Health member (VCBH), a member from the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), and a member of the California Highway Patrol (CHP).

Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training provides law enforcement techniques in active listening, de-escalating a crisis, and providing appropriate community resources as needed. CIT training is used in domestic situations and contacts with troubled youth, elderly citizens, and the general public. CIT skills are used to de-escalate crisis situations, not diagnose mental illness in the consumer law enforcement comes in contact with. The successful implementation of the CIT Program in Ventura County has resulted in the reduction of risks and injuries to citizens and officers alike, resulting in increased public support and confidence in law enforcement. The original goal in 2001 was to train 20% of law enforcement. Currently 72% of Ventura County Law Enforcement is CIT trained, and 1,313 law enforcement personnel have completed the 40 hour CIT Academy since 2001.

An investigation into the possession of stolen mail in the unincorporated area of Camarillo led to the arrest of Monique Boyett for eight counts of identity theft, seven counts of grand theft, two counts of possession of stolen property, one count each of petty theft and possession of stolen mail and several enhancements.

In February, 2015, members of the Camarillo Special Enforcement Detail began conducting an investigation into the possession of stolen mail in the unincorporated area of Camarillo. Detectives learned a female subject who was arrested by the California Highway Patrol was in possession of a large amount of mail belonging to residents and businesses in Oxnard and Camarillo. Detectives located and interviewed several of the mail theft victims and discovered Monique Boyett attempted to cash checks stolen from the victims.

In March, a search warrant was conducted at Boyett's home in Oxnard. Detectives located additional stolen and forged checks. Their investigation also revealed that Boyett used bank account information from stolen checks to pay for purchases on her credit card. During a nine-month period, detectives discovered Boyett stole over \$270,000 from several different victims' bank accounts to pay for her credit card purchases.

Detectives obtained a warrant for Boyett's arrest for identity theft, grand theft, possession of stolen mail,

petty theft and excessive taking enhancements. On 10-27-15, she was arrested and booked into the Main Jail and her bail was set at \$120,000.

Detectives encourage residents to avoid using their mailbox for outgoing mail. It is common for thieves to drive around and look for an upright flag on a mailbox. This signals to thieves the possibility of outgoing checks in the mailbox. Additionally, residents are encouraged to remove mail from their mailbox as soon as possible. If residents plan to leave their homes for an extended period of time, they should contact their carrier to put a temporary stop on mail delivery.

Last, residents should be aware of anyone suspicious in their neighborhoods and contact police immediately if they see someone exhibiting suspicious behavior.

Investigators suspect additional fires were lit in the industrial areas adjacent to Calleguas Creek between Adolfo Road and Mission Oaks Boulevard during the same time period, but went unreported. In an effort to make our roads safer, the Moorpark Police Department is deploying extra traffic enforcement officers on November 13, 2015 to stop distracted driving. Moorpark PD is spreading the message that distracted drivers are not only a danger to themselves, but everyone else on the roadway.

Using an electronic device while driving is a serious safety problem. Most drivers know that texting while driving is a dangerous behavior, but many still use their cell phones and other mobile devices when they are behind the wheel, putting themselves and others at risk. Many drivers see distracted driving as risky when other drivers do it, but do not recognize how their own driving deteriorates.

In 2012, 3,328 people were killed and 421,000 were injured nationwide in crashes involving a distracted driver. That same year, eleven percent of fatal crashes were reported as distraction-affected crashes.

While anything that takes your eyes off the road, hands off the wheel, or mind off the task of driving is a hazard, there is heightened concern about the risks of texting while driving because it combines all three types of distraction ' visual, manual, and cognitive. In addition, most drivers aren't aware that just talking on a cell phone, hand held or hands free, can lead to 'inattention blindness' as critical brain functions needed for driving are used for cell phone talking.

At any given daylight moment across America, there are about 660,000 drivers using cell phones or manipulating electronic devices while driving. The Moorpark Police Department is focusing on ways to change the behavior of drivers through enforcement, public awareness, and education 'the same activities that have curbed drunk driving and increased seat belt use.

In a national survey, almost half (48%) of drivers say they answer their cell phones while driving at least some of the time, and more than half of those (58%) continue to drive after answering the call. Your Police Department recommends the following safety measures:

You can:

- turn off electronic devices and put them out of reach before starting to drive
- speak up when you are a passenger and your driver uses an electronic device while driving. Offer to make the call for the driver, so his or her full attention stays on the driving

task

Parents can:

- be good role models for young drivers and set a good example. Talk with your teens about responsible driving
- If you know your teen is on the road 'don't call or text them until you know they have reached their destination

Employers can:

Adopt, publicize, and enforce company policies that prohibit employees from texting or talking on hand-held cell phones while in a company vehicle, or in a personal vehicle while using a company issued cell phone.

Remember to lock your vehicles. Whether you are at the shopping mall or parked in your own driveway, lock your vehicle and hide or remove your valuables from your car.

Tell a security guard or store employee if you see an unattended bag or package. The same applies when taking mass transit: report any unattended packages to security or staff.

Be sure not to buy more than you can carry. If your packages are blocking your view and/or restricting freedom of motion, ask a store employee to help you carry your packages to your car.

Be extra cautious if you carry a wallet or purse. Do not leave your purse unattended in a shopping cart, or turn away from it while shopping.

Be aware of strangers approaching you for any reason. At this time of year, "con-artists" may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or belongings.

Upon learning about the developing El Ni�o condition in the Pacific Ocean, the Ventura County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services along with numerous other Federal, State, County and City agencies initiated a rigorous planning and preparedness campaign geared towards evaluating local response and recovery capabilities. One area that was unanimously identified as being difficult and time consuming was the filling and transportation of sandbags during flood conditions.

In an effort to alleviate the drain on first-responder labor and resources and more effectively build sandbags for flood fighting, the Office of Emergency Services has partnered with the Todd Road Jail staff to purchase a sandbag filling machine capable of filling bags at a rate of 1,000 bags per hour. Bulk materials including sand, sandbags and pallets have been pre-staged at the jail facility in Santa Paula and will be available for emergency use countywide. Several inmates at the facility have been trained on the safe operation of the machine and the production of sandbags. These inmates will serve as the primary workforce behind the mass production effort. The Ventura County Fire Department will be prepositioning the sandbags throughout the county for emergency flood fighting purposes by fire personnel only.

Narrative:

East County detectives are seeking the public's help in identifying burglary suspects captured on video.

On November 18th, 2015, deputies with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office responded to Oak Park High School in reference to a burglary. During the initial investigation, it was discovered five suspects broke a window and gained access to the computer lab and stole 17 computers.

During the early morning hours of November 18th, 2015, the five suspects were captured on Oak Park High School's video surveillance system entering the property on foot. All five suspects appeared to be wearing dark colored clothing and wore either hooded sweatshirts or beanie hats in an attempt to hide their identities. This video surveillance system showed the suspects enter the computer lab and later exit holding several computers. The suspects then left school property.

School officials confirmed 17 Apple IMac computers with 21.5 inch monitors were stolen from the computer lab. Numerous Oak Park High School students stored assignments, graphic designs, and portfolio information were on these stolen computers. The academic information stored on these computers is not retrievable and represented an enormous amount of work by the students.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office is requesting the public's assistance in identifying the suspects responsible for this burglary and recovering these stolen computers. For example, a national survey conducted in 2001-2003 found that only 48% of children ages 5-14 years wore bicycle helmets when riding. Further, older children were less likely to wear helmets than younger children. In 2010 in the U.S., 800 bicyclists were killed and an estimated 515,000 sustained bicycle-related injuries that required emergency department care. Roughly half of these cyclists were children and adolescents under the age of 20. The event, which is free to the public, will be held at Two Rivers Park (River St. at D St., Fillmore) and will feature safety instruction, an obstacle course, bicycle and skateboard safety inspections, and proper helmet fitment. The park also features a BMX track and a skate park for all to enjoy.

Thanks to the generous help of the Fillmore Fire Foundation, Fillmore Police Department's Citizens Patrol, First 5 Ventura County 'Fillmore, Fillmore Lions Club, Fillmore Rotary Club, Fillmore Women's Club, Ventura County Deputy Sheriff's Association, Ragatz Performance Bicycles of Santa Paula, and SkateLab of Simi Valley, there will be free helmets for children who do not have them and raffles for new bicycles and skateboards.

The City of Fillmore Municipal Code (14.60.020 FMC) also requires that all bicycles be properly licensed. Doing so aids law enforcement in identifying owners of lost or stolen bicycles and, to aid Fillmore residents in complying with this ordinance, free bicycle registration will be available (with proof of residency), as well.

Now, with the convenience of online shopping more people expose themselves to opportunistic criminals driving through neighborhoods looking for unattended packages and full mailboxes. We have received information about solicitors knocking on doors, possibly casing residents, while at the same time grabbing Christmas cards, checks and gifts cards from mailboxes. We also receive calls for suspicious vehicles following delivery services and stealing packages after porch delivery.

Here are a few tips to protect your deliveries during the holiday season:

Assure someone is at the residence if a delivery is expected. If this is not possible have the delivery sent to a place of employment or request the package is held at the Post Office for pickup.

Tracking numbers, most agencies will send you a tracking number to allow you to see where your package is and when it will be delivered.

Promptly retrieve packages and mail from your residence.

Drop off outgoing mail at the Post Office or hand the mail to the Postal Service delivery person.

Encourage your Neighborhood Watch group to call the police for any unusual activity in your area. People in your neighborhood usually know who resides and visits your residence. Neighbors should be calling law enforcement if unknown people are seen going through your mailbox or loitering around your residence. Most importantly be aware of your surroundings, protect yourself and your property by locking doors and

windows and making it harder for criminals to steal your valuables.

Careless motorists as well as riders get special scrutiny

The Moorpark Police Department will be conducting a specialized Motorcycle Safety Enforcement Operation on December 6, 2015 in an effort to lower deaths and injuries. Extra deputies will be on duty patrolling areas frequented by motorcyclists and where motorcycle crashes occur. Deputies will be looking for violations made by drivers and riders alike that can lead to motorcycle crashes. They will be cracking down on both those operating regular vehicles and motorcycles who are violating traffic safety laws.

Motorcycle fatalities jumped dramatically in California by over 28 percent from a decade low of 352 in 2010. In 2013, 453 motorcyclists lost their lives, which is at a 5 year high. California collision data reveals that primary causes of motorcycle-involved crashes include speeding, unsafe turning, and impairment due to alcohol and other drugs by both riders and drivers alike.

Operations like this are aimed at curbing increases in motorcycle deaths and sending the numbers back downward. Over the course of the past three years, motorcycle involved collisions have resulted in twelve injury crashes in the city of Moorpark.

On September 12, 2015, the Moorpark Police Department assisted CHP with a double fatality traffic collision on Moorpark Rd. south of Tierra Rejada Rd. just outside the Moorpark city limits. This traffic collision involved a passenger car colliding with a bicyclist in the bike lane then in turn colliding with a motorcyclist on the roadway. Both the bicyclist and motorcyclist were killed in this tragic traffic collision.

Safety tips for riders:

- See and Be Seen
- Use your lane position to increase visibility; change lanes only when there is ample room
- Match your speed to surrounding traffic
- Always wear a DOT compliant helmet and brightly colored, protective clothing
- Ride with lights on during daylight hours

Safety tips for drivers:

- Share the Road
- Look twice for motorcyclists, especially when entering the roadway, turning, or changing lanes
- Motorcyclist are allowed in HOV lanes unless prohibited by signage

Riders are urged to get training through the California Motorcyclist Safety Program. Information and training locations are available at http://www.californiamotorcyclist.com/ or 1-877 RIDE 411 (1-877-743-3411).

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The message to all drivers and motorcyclists is: share in the responsibility and do your part by safely 'sharing the road.'

Through the use of video surveillance cameras and other investigative techniques, detectives with the Thousand Oaks Police Special Enforcement Unit and East County Major Crimes Bureau were able to identify Martin and Coleman as the suspects in this crime. Detectives acted as quickly as possible to get the suspects in custody.

On November 25, 2015, a search warrant was served at Martin's residence. Evidence linking him to the crime was located.

On the morning of December 4, 2015, Detectives with the Special Enforcement Unit arrested Martin in the City of Thousand Oaks. Later the same afternoon, SEU arrested Coleman in the City of Santa Paula.

Martin and Coleman were both arrested for Robbery and Street Terrorism Step Act (Gang Crimes). Martin and Coleman were booked into the Ventura County Pre-Trial Detention Facility and are being held on \$100,000 bail. Martin and Coleman are scheduled to appear in Ventura County Superior Court on December 8, 2015, at 1:30 PM.

Narrative:

On December 5th, 2015, Dustin Beverford was arrested for attempted murder and other charges related to an incident that occurred in Camarillo on December 4th, 2015.

On December 4th, at approximately 10:00 PM, deputies assigned to the Camarillo station responded to a disturbance in the 100 block of West Calle La Sombra in Camarillo. Deputies on scene quickly determined that a male victim from Camarillo was struck in the head with a hatchet, causing a severe laceration on the top of his head. The initial investigation revealed the suspect was Dustin Beverford from Oxnard. The victim was transported to the Ventura County Medical Center where he was treated for the injury.

Beverford initially fled the scene on foot and despite a lengthy search, he was not apprehended. On December 5th, 2015, at approximately 7:00 PM, Beverford was located in Ventura, where he was arrested for attempted murder. During his arrest, Beverford resisted arrest and made threats to the arresting deputies. He was found to be in possession of prescription medication that was not prescribed to him, and he was in possession of tear gas.

Additionally, during the course of the attempted murder investigation, deputies discovered Beverford made

criminal threats to a witness in the original attempted murder investigation. Beverford was also arrested for the criminal threats.

Beverford was booked into the Ventura County Main Jail on charges of attempted murder, threats to a peace officer, possession of prescription medication without a prescription, possession of tear gas by an addict and criminal threats. His bail was set at \$2 million.

Police Aim to Save Lives with 'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over' Crackdown

Thousand Oaks **CA** - If you're enjoying the holidays with a drink, the Thousand Oaks Police Department has a message for you: *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*. Due to the increase in impaired-driving related fatalities around the holidays each year, law enforcement agencies across America will be actively searching for and arresting impaired-drivers from December 18 to January 3.

As part of the national *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* enforcement campaign period; police, sheriff, and the CHP will be deploying DUI Checkpoints and DUI Saturation Patrols during the upcoming 17 day DUI Enforcement Campaign throughout the region. The Thousand Oaks Police Department is conducting special DUI enforcement every weekend during this campaign starting off with a DUI Checkpoint December 19, 2015.

There are over 10,000 reasons to crackdown: in 2013, 10,076 people were killed in crashes involving a drunk driver. In December 2013 alone there were 733 people killed in crashes involving at least one driver or motorcycle operator with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08 or higher. Twenty-three of those deaths occurred on Christmas Day. California was witnessed to 98 deaths and another 1,852 injured in alcohol involved collisions in December 2013.

'It's time for all drivers to get the message,' said Assistant Chief Jim Fryhoff, of the Thousand Oaks Police

Department. 'Impaired-driving is a choice you make, and when you make that choice, people get hurt or die. That's why we're joining law enforcement nationwide to share the message: *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*.' 'The safest way to get home,' Assistant Chief Fryhoff said, 'is to drive sober or catch a ride with a sober designated driver.'

Recent statistics reveal that 30 percent of drivers in fatal crashes had one or more drugs in their systems. A study of active drivers showed more tested positive for drugs that may impair driving (14 percent) than did for alcohol (7.3 percent). Of the drugs, marijuana was most prevalent, at 7.4 percent, slightly more than alcohol. Everyone should be mindful that if you're taking medication 'whether prescription or over-the-counter' drinking even small amounts of alcohol can greatly intensify the impairment affects.

Law Enforcement emphasizes the preventable nature of impaired-driving reminding everyone that all it takes is a little planning by designating a sober driver or calling a cab. Whatever you do, don't drink and drive. The California Office of Traffic Safety DDVIP (Designated Driver VIP) mobile app is now available for free download on iOS and Android devices. Launched last year, the new DDVIP app offers enhanced features, allowing users to 'Map a Spot' with their current location to find DDVIP partnering establishments in their area or a 'List of Spots' to search all participating bars and restaurants throughout California. Users will be offered free incentives at each bar to celebrate their life saving role. They can stay up-to-date with the latest from DDVIP and see what other users are saying via its social tab. Also through the app, for those who want to imbibe but also make it a point to plan ahead, users can easily order a sober ride from Uber, Lyft, or Curb ' all from one screen.

The Thousand Oaks Police Department reminds everyone to follow these simple tips to stay safe:

- Plan a safe way to get home <u>before</u> you attend the party. Alcohol and drugs impair judgment, as well as reaction time. If you're impaired you're more likely to choose to drive impaired.
- Designate a sober driver; take public transportation, a car service, or a call a sober friend of family member to get home.
- Walking while impaired can be just as dangerous as impaired-driving. Designate a sober friend to walk you home.
- If you see someone you think is about to drive while impaired, take their keys and help them get home safely.

If you're caught impaired- driving you could face jail time, fines, loss of driver's license, towing fees, and other DUI expenses, totaling \$10,000 on average. That's not a small price, and that doesn't even count the heftier price you could pay: the price of your life or someone else's.

In addition to reminding all drivers to drive sober, Assistant Chief Fryhoff is calling on everyone to be alert and 'Report Drunk Drivers' Call 911! If you see a dangerous driver call immediately! If someone you know is about to drive after drinking, take their keys and help them get home safely. 'We've got to work together to make our roads safer this December and year-round,' Fryhoff said.

Remember, driving after drinking should never be an option. Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over.

Narrative:

Traditionally, thefts of packages from doorsteps and mailboxes tend to increase during the holiday season. Criminals are well aware of the increase in package deliveries and drive through neighborhoods looking for unattended packages and full mailboxes. The Fillmore Police Department and the Ventura County Sheriff's Office have received information about solicitors knocking on doors, possibly casing residences, while at the same time grabbing Christmas cards, checks and gifts cards from mailboxes. A recent incident occurred in the 400 block of Fillmore Street. A male suspect, wearing a dark-colored baseball cap, dark blue jeans, and a dark-colored sleeveless 'muscle' shirt was seen removing a UPS delivered package from a victim's front porch and leaving in a red 4-door sedan. There were also packages stolen from homes on Grand Avenue. There is no suspect information on those thefts.

Here are a few tips to protect your deliveries during the holiday season:

- Ensure someone is at the residence if a delivery is expected. If this is not possible, have the delivery sent to a place of employment or request that the package be held at the Post Office for pickup.
- Tracking numbers ' Most agencies will send you a tracking number to allow you to monitor where your package is and when it will be delivered.
- Promptly retrieve packages and mail from your residence.
- Prop off outgoing mail at the Post Office or hand the mail to the Postal Service delivery person.
- Encourage your neighbors to call the police to report any unusual activity in your area.

People in your neighborhood usually know who resides at and visits your residence. Neighbors should call law enforcement if unknown people are seen going through your mailbox or loitering around your residence.

Most importantly, be aware of your surroundings; protect yourself and your property by locking doors and windows and making it harder for criminals to steal your valuables.

Narrative:

The Moorpark Police Department will step up pedestrian safety enforcement operation on December 11, 2015 with focused enforcement on collision causing factors involving motorists and pedestrians within the City of Moorpark. Routine traffic patrols will focus efforts in trouble spots while special targeted patrols will also be deployed to crackdown on drivers and pedestrians who violate traffic laws meant to protect all roadway users.

The Department has mapped out locations over the past three years where pedestrian involved collisions have occurred along with the violations that led to those crashes. Officers will be looking for traffic offenses made by drivers and pedestrians alike that can lead to life changing injuries. Special attention will be directed toward drivers speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for signs and signals, failing to yield to pedestrians in crosswalks or any other dangerous violation. Additionally, enforcement will be taken for observed violations when pedestrians are running in the street and bike lanes, crossing the street illegally or failing to yield to drivers who have the right of way. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked crosswalks or intersections.

Pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use non-motorized means of transportation. Locally, the Moorpark Police Department has investigated one fatal and fourteen injury collisions involving pedestrians during the past three (3) years. The Moorpark Police Department Traffic Unit is currently investigating a vehicle vs pedestrian fatal traffic collision that occurred in Moorpark on November 24, 2015. In 2013, California witnessed 701 pedestrian deaths accounting for over 23 percent of all roadway fatalities, much higher than the national average of 15 percent.

A national study reveals that pedestrians and drivers do not obey laws and signals consistently and many often use cell phones, text and listen to music while walking, running, and driving. Only 60 percent of pedestrians said they expected drivers to stop when they were in crosswalks, even though they have the right-of-way.

The following safety tips can save lives and stop this tragedy witnessed far too often in Moorpark:

Drivers can:

- Look out for pedestrians, especially in hard-to-see conditions such as at night or in bad weather.
- Slow down and be prepared to stop when turning or entering a crosswalk where pedestrians are likely to be.
- Stop at the crosswalk stop line to give drivers in other lanes an opportunity to see and yield to the pedestrians too.
- Be cautious when backing up. Pedestrians, especially young children, can move across
 your path.

Pedestrians can:

- Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road, cross at crosswalks or intersections, and obey signs and signals.
- Walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible if there is no sidewalk.
- Pay attention to the traffic moving around you. This is not the time to be texting or talking on a cell phone.
- Make eye contact with drivers as they approach. Never assume a driver sees you.
- Wear bright clothing during the day and reflective materials (or use a flashlight) at night.
- Look left-right-left before crossing a street.

Narrative:

On 12/09/2015, Sheriff Narcotics Detectives concluded an investigation of a Simi Valley resident, Jose Melgoza, who was suspected of selling methamphetamine and heroin to customers in Ventura County. At 7:30 PM, detectives located Melgoza as he was leaving a business in the city of Moorpark. While detectives where around Melgoza's residence, Parks, Martinez and Baake arrived. They were contacted and after a brief investigation they

were arrested. Kristy Parks was arrested for an outstanding felony warrant for possession for sales of a controlled substance case related to an arrest by the Simi Valley Police Department, and Vanessa Martinez and Mathew Baake were arrested for possession of a controlled substance.

On 12-11-15, Melgoza was arraigned in Ventura County Superior Court for the following charges: Possession for sales of a controlled substance, person armed with a firearm during the commission of a felony, felon in possession of a firearm and a felon in possession of ammunition. Melgoza is currently in custody in the Ventura County Jail with bail set at \$135,000. His next court appearance is set for 12/15/2015.

The street value for the drugs found in Melgoza's possession was valued at about \$3,000.

Parks' has a no bail hold and is scheduled to appear in court on 12/17/2015. Martinez are both out of custody with pending court dates.

On December 14, 2015, Ventura County Sheriff's deputies from the Camarillo Patrol Station responded to the intersection of Las Posas Road and Daily Drive in reference to a stabbing victim. At the location, patrol deputies found a male victim with multiple stab wounds to the back and neck region. The male victim was transported to an area hospital and treated for his injuries.

Based on the severity of those injuries, Sheriff's Major Crimes and Camarillo Special Enforcement Unit detectives responded to the scene to assist in the investigation. Detectives located and identified a crime scene that contained evidence of the assault and were also able to quickly identify a suspect in the stabbing. The suspect was identified as 32 year old Bobby Arellano of Santa Maria, California.

Later that evening, detectives located a residence in Lompoc, California, where Arellano was staying. A search warrant was served and Arellano was located and arrested without incident. A search of the residence revealed evidence linking Arellano to the stabbing in Camarillo.

Based on the investigation, neither Arellano nor the victim had any ties to Camarillo or Ventura County. The crime occurred in a vehicle on northbound US 101 and the victim was dropped off in Camarillo.

Narrative:

Deputies from the Camarillo Police Department will be deploying during the holidays to stop and arrest alcohol and drug-impaired drivers in the Department's ongoing traffic safety campaign. DUI Saturation Patrols will deploy in areas with high frequencies of DUI collisions and/or arrests.

In California, this deadly crime led to 867 deaths and over 23,000 serious injuries in 2013 because someone failed to designate a sober driver. Nationally, the latest data shows over 10,000 were killed by an impaired driver. Over the course of the past three years deputies from the Camarillo Police Department have investigated 158 DUI collisions which have claimed 1 life and resulted in another 72 injuries.

Deputies will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment with deputies checking drivers for proper licensing delaying motorists only momentarily. Narrative:

Ventura County Sheriff's Deputies, the Sheriff's Aviation Unit, and the Ventura County Fire Department responded to a call from California State Parks that a group of people were trapped on a mountainside in La Jolla Canyon near Point Mugu.

On December 25, 2015 at about 4:15 PM, California State Parks responded to the La Jolla Canyon area after receiving a report of lost hikers on the Ray Miller Trailhead. State Parks Rangers located the vehicle associated with the missing subjects and later determined they were trapped near the La Jolla waterfall. This area and trail is currently closed with many warning signs posted to advise hikers to stay away due to the unstable conditions. State Parks Rangers summoned the Ventura County Sheriff's Aviation Unit for assistance. Once on scene, the pilot and crew chief of the helicopter determined a hoist rescue from the helicopter was not safe due to high winds.

At approximately 1900 hours, the Ventura County Sheriff's Search & Rescue along with the Ventura County Fire Urban Search & Rescue were called out to assist. Working together, the Ventura County Fire USAR team and the Ventura County Sheriff's East Valley SAR Teams conducted a technical high angle rescue to safely evacuate the two adults and two children from the trailhead. None of the victims sustained any injuries from this incident.

At the conclusion of the rescue the two adults were interviewed and admitted to seeing the warning signs that were posted with the intention to keep people away from the hazardous area. They also admitted that they were not properly prepared for the conditions, they lacked water, proper clothing, and a flashlight. The California State Parks Rangers issued a citation to the hikers for unsafe recreational activity within a State Park.

The Ventura County Sheriff's Office would like to remind day hikers of some simple steps to be better prepared when the unexpected happens. Carry extra water, food, matches, flashlight, and proper clothing. Always adhere to posted warning signs of potential dangers and closed areas.
